OAKLAND ATHLETICS (39-27) VS. KANSAS CITY ROYALS (30-33)

SUNDAY, JUNE 13, 2021 — OAKLAND COLISEUM — 1:07 PDT

ABOUT THE A'S: Have won two straight and four of the last five games and are now 8-2 (.800) in June...the June record is tied with the Angels and Brewers for the best in the majors...are a season-high 12 games over .500 at 39-27 (.591), which is the fourth best record in the American League and sixth best in the majors...with a win today, the A's would match their best record after 67 games over the last 29 years (were 40-27 in 2013 and 2014)...are in first place in the AL West for the 23rd consecutive day and have held at least a share of first for 53 of the last 54 days...have a two-game lead over second place Houston, which is one-half game short of the season high of 2½ (last on May 29)...have spent 51 days alone in first place, two days tied for first, one day in second, one day tied for second, three days in third, two days in fourth, three days tied for fourth and 10 days in fifth.

AGAINST THE CENTRAL: The A's are 11-2 against American League Central teams (4-0 vs. Detroit, 5-1 vs. Minnesota, 2-1 vs. Kansas City)...are batting .251 (104-for-414) and are averaging 5.8 runs per game (75 runs in 13 games) against teams from the Central compared to .228 with an average of 4.1 runs per game against all other teams...have a 2.95 ERA (37 er in 113.0 ip) against the Central, 4.04 against everyone else...went 25-8 against the AL Central in 2019 after going 26-8 in 2018...are now 76-22 (.776) against AL Central foes dating back to June 23, 2017.

OFFENSE: The A's had a season-high 14 hits yesterday and are now batting .273 (92-for-337) in June, which is fifth best in the American League...are hitting .376 (32-for-85) with runners in scoring position this month and are batting .266 (124-for-466) with RISP overall, which is third best in the AL...lead the American League in hit by pitches (33), rank second in sacrifice flies (23), tied for third in home runs (82), fourth in walks (235) and extra base hits (203) and tied for fourth in doubles (111) and triples (10)...A's pinch hitters lead the AL in hits (13) and plate appearances (57), are tied for the lead in home runs (2), rank second in RBI (10) and third in extra base hits (3)...the A's are 4-for-10 (.400) with two walks and eight RBI with the bases loaded in June after hitting .167 with four walks and 22 RBI with the bases full over the first two months of the season...rank last in the AL with a .225 (9-for-40) average with the bases loaded for the season.

PITCHING: A's pitchers have allowed just seven runs over the first six innings of the last nine games for a 1.17 ERA (7 er in 54.0 ip) and .178 (34-for-191) opponents batting average...have a 2.47 ERA (37 er in 134.2 ip), .222 (111-for-500) opponents batting average and three shutouts over the last 15 games...that has dropped the overall ERA to a season-low 3.83, which is fifth best in the American League...also have the fifth lowest opponents on-base percentage (.305), slugging percentage (.391) and OPS (.696)...have the second fewest walks (176) and home runs (66), but have the third most hits (557)...are tied for second in shutouts (7) and rank third in fewest pitches per inning (16.1).

STARTING PITCHING: A's starting pitchers have not allowed a run over the first six innings in each of the last four games...are 8-4 with a 2.20 ERA (24 er in 98.1 ip) over the last 16 games...are 25-23 with a 3.80 ERA (157 er in 371.2 ip) for the season...the wins are third most in the American League, the ERA is fifth lowest and the losses are tied for fifth most...lead the majors in innings pitched (371.2) and are tied with the White Sox for the most complete games (3)...the complete games are the most by an A's team since 2015 (5).

BULLPEN: The A's bullpen has four saves, six blown saves and a 4.58 ERA (39 er in 76.2 ip) over the last 26 games dating back to May 15...has converted 16-of-23 (69.6%) save opportunities for the season, which is the fourth best percentage in the American League...has four losses, which is the fewest in the majors...has allowed seven home runs in 10 games in June after yielding seven home runs over the previous 48 contests...has surrendered 21 home runs for the season, which are the fewest in the AL and fifth fewest in the majors...has issued the second fewest walks in the AL (78)...has the highest slugging percentage against first batters faced in the AL (.471), the second highest batting average (.279) and fourth highest on-base percentage (.357).

DEFENSIVE DOINGS: The A's have the fourth fewest errors in the American League (34)...are tied for the third fewest double plays (47)...A's outfielders have five assists, which is third fewest.

HOME AND AWAY: The A's are 4-1 on this nine-game homestand against Arizona (2-0), Kansas City (2-1) and Los Angeles-AL (three games)...went 3-4 on the last homestand against Seattle (1-2) and Los Angeles-AL (2-2) and are now 21-18 (.538) at home compared to 18-9 (.667) on the road...the 39 home games are three more than any other team in the majors (White Sox, 36)...are tied for the second best road record in the majors...went 4-2 on the last road trip to Seattle (2-1) and Colorado (2-1) and have now won eight road

series, lost none and split one...the season-opening streak of nine consecutive road series without a loss is the longest such streak in Athletics history (previous: won the first eight road series in 1988).

HOME AND AWAY SPLITS: The A's are batting .216 (261-for-1207) at home compared to .255 (238-for-932) on the road...have the second lowest home batting average in the American League...the road batting average is second best in the majors as is their .771 OPS...have the lowest road ERA in the AL (3.55).

WALK-OFFS AND OTHER CLOSE CALLS: The A's had their Major League leading sixth walk-off win Friday night...it was the 89th walk-off win in the Bob Melvin era, which are the most in the majors over that span...are 9-3 in games decided in the last at bat...are 12-7 (.632) in one-run games, which is the fourth best record in the American League...are 23-11 (.676) in games decided by three runs or fewer, which is the best record in the majors...are 16-16 (.500) in games decided by four runs or more...are 2-1 in extra inning games and are now 8-2 in extra innings over the last two years.

TEAMMATES: The A's are the only team in the majors with four pitchers with 13 or more starts...have used just seven starting pitchers this year, which is tied with the Reds and White Sox for second fewest in the majors to the Red Sox (6)...the A's are one of four teams (White Sox, Dodgers, Rays) with at least four five-game winners...are one of three teams (Indians, Giants) with two pitchers with six or more saves.

THIS AND THAT: Bob Melvin has 1,299 career wins as manager and needs one more to become the 35th manager in Major League history with 1,300 wins...the A's have out-scored the opposition 59-30 (+29) in June after being outscored 242-231 (-11) in April and May...are 25-14 (.641) in night games compared to 14-13 (.519) during the day...have the second best record at night in the American League...are 16-9 (.640) in games in which the opponent starts a left-handed pitcher compared to 23-18 (.561) when they start a right-hander...the mark against lefties is tied for second best in the AL...are 28-5 when out-homer the opposition, 5-17 when they are out-homered...are 30-9 (.769) when scoring first, which is second best in the AL...are 8-0 following a day off and are the only undefeated team in the majors following a day off...have used 63 different lineups over the first 66 games...went 16-11 in April and 15-14 in May and now have nine consecutive months with a winning record (min. 10 games).

THE INJURED LIST: The A's have used the injured list 14 times this year...used it just eight times last year, which was second fewest in the majors to Cleveland (4), and 18 times in 2019, which tied for second fewest...currently have four players on the IL (Fiers, Laureano Rosenthal, Wendelken)...began the year with two players on the IL but have had at least four every day since the fifth game of the season.

A's vs. ROYALS: The A's lead the season series 2-1 after winning the season series in 2019, 5-2...it was their second consecutive season series win and third in four years...won two of three in Oakland and three of four in Kansas City...have won 21 of their last 29 games against the Royals and have out-scored Kansas City 177-94 over that span (6.1 runs per game to 3.2 runs)...all-time, the A's are 329-268 (.551) against the Royals...the only American League team the A's have a better record against is Tampa Bay (.589)...are 179-120 in Oakland and 150-148 in Kansas City.

TODAY'S TIDBITS

Mark Canha leads the majors in hit by pitches (12)...ranks second in the American League in runs scored (49), tied for fourth in triples (3), tied for seventh in games (63) and 10th in on-base percentage (.373)...**Mitch Moreland** needs one hit for 1,000 career...**Sean Murphy** has 30 RBI as a catcher, which is tied with Perez (KC) for the most among Major League catchers...**Matt Olson** ranks third in the AL in slugging (.584) and OPS (.956), tied for third in home runs (16), tied for fourth in extra base hits (32), tied for sixth in doubles (16) and sacrifice flies (4), tied for eighth in RBI (45) and ninth in batting with runners in scoring position (348)...**Lou Trivino** has not allowed an earned run in his last 12 games (12.2 ip).

THIS DATE IN ATHLETICS HISTORY

In **1931** George Earnshaw goes 4 for 5 with a home run and three RBI and tosses a complete game five-hitter in the A's 14-1 win over St. Louis in the second game of a doubleheader...in **1968** Jim Nash, Paul Lindblad and Ed Sprague combine to shutout the Cleveland Indians 1-0 in 11 innings...it is the A's third straight shutout...in **1992** Carney Lansford homers off Texas pitcher Bobby Witt for the 2000th hit of his major league career.

TODAY'S STARTING PITCHER: Chris Bassitt (6-2, 3.44 ERA)

SIX-GAME WINNING STREAK: Extended his winning streak to six games in his last start, which is a new career high...his previous high was five from Aug. 11, 2019 to Aug. 12, 2020...it is tied for second longest streak in the American League this year (Petit, OAK 7)...has a 3.10 ERA (24 er in 69.2 ip) and .201 (51-for-254) opponents batting average during the streak, which spans 11 starts dating back April 12...has left with the lead in two of his five no decisions only to have the bullpen blow the save...went 0-2 with a 5.56 ERA and .289 opponents average over his first two starts...the A's are 10-3 (.769) in his starting assignments.

AMONG THE LEADERS: Ranks sixth in the American League in strikeouts (86), strikeout-to-walk ratio (4.78) and innings pitched (81.0), seventh in opponents OPS (.619), eighth in slugging percentage (.348) and on-base percentage (.271), tied for ninth in wins (6) and 10th in opponents batting average (.214)...has allowed seven home runs and his average of 0.78 home runs per nine innings is fifth lowest...is tied for second in hit by pitches (7) and ranks fourth in fewest pitches per inning (14.8)...is scheduled to make his 14th start today, which will tie him for the AL lead.

AGAINST THE CENTRAL: Has two no decisions in two starts against American League Central teams this year (6 er in 11.0 ip, 4.91 ERA)...however, has a six-game winning streak against the Central dating back to June 27, 2018 and has a 2.32 ERA (17 er in 66.0 ip) and .212 (52-for-245) opponents average over that 12 game, 11-start stretch...his last loss to a Central team was at Chicago on June 22, 2018.

FOUR RUNS OR FEWER: Has allowed four runs or fewer in each of his 24 starts over the last two years...that is the longest such streak by an A's starting pitcher since Dave Hamilton had a 25-start streak from May 12, 1974-June 15, 1979...has not allowed more than four runs in a start since yielding seven runs in his final start of 2019 (Sept. 13 at Texas).

HOME AND AWAY: Is 4-0 with a 3.98 ERA (18 er in 40.2 ip) in seven starts on the road compared to 2-2 with a 2.90 ERA (13 er in 40.1 ip) in six starts home... is tied for fourth in the American League in road wins...has an 11-12 career record in the Coliseum, but has a 2.52 ERA (64 er in 228.2 ip), which is fifth lowest in Coliseum history among pitchers with 200 or more innings pitched.

OPPONENTS BATTING: Has held left-handed hitters to a .194 (31-for-160) opponents batting average...had surrendered all six of his home runs to lefties until yielding a home run to the Diamondbacks Christian Walker in his last start...it was his first home run to a right-handed hitter since Aug. 12, 2020 (Rendon, LAA) and he has surrendered 24 of his 34 home runs over the last three years to lefties...has a .123 opponents batting average with two strikes, which is fourth lowest in the American League... has a .143 (5-for-35) batting average against the opponents number one hitter in the order but has issued six of his 18 walks to that batter (.286 on-base percentage).

DAYS REST: Is scheduled to start on four days rest today...is 1-1 with a 4.20 ERA (14 er in 30.0 ip) and five home runs in four starts on four days rest compared to 5-0 with a 2.76 ERA (14 er in 45.2 ip) and two home runs in seven starts on five days rest or more...is 4-0 with a 2.79 ERA (12 er in 38.2 ip) in six starts on exactly five days rest and now has a nine-game winning streak in those games dating back to July 19, 2019...has a 2.79 ERA (26 er in 84.0 ip) in 14 starts over that span...according to TruMedia, the longest winning streak in starts on five days rest in Oakland history is 10 by Mike Fiers (May 7-Aug. 27, 2019) and Mark Mulder (June 18, 2002-July 10, 2003).

THE LAST THREE YEARS: Is 21-9 (.700) with a 3.38 ERA (108 er in 288.0 ip) over the last three years...based on a minimum of 250 innings pitched, he ranks fourth in the American League in ERA over that span, tied for fourth in winning percentage and fifth in opponents OPS (.668)...is tied for 10th in wins... the A's are 33-16 (.673) in his starting assignments over the last three years... was 4-14 (.222) with a 3.86 ERA in 40 games, including 30 starts, over his first four seasons.

2021 HIGHLIGHTS: Was the A's Opening Day starting pitcher and took the loss in an 8-1 decision to Houston on April 1 in Oakland...became the A's 14th different Opening Day starting pitcher over the last 16 years (Zito, Haren, Blanton, Braden, Sheets, Cahill, McCarthy, Anderson, Gray twice, Hill, Graveman twice, Fiers, Montas)...allowed a run in the fourth inning to snap a 16.2-inning scoreless streak during the regular season and a 27.1-inning home scoreless streak, which was ninth longest in Oakland history...lost his

second start on April 6, a 5-1 loss to Los Angeles (NL) on April 6 in Oakland when he allowed a season-high four runs on a season-high nine hits in 6.0 innings...allowed two home runs in the third, which were his first home runs in the Coliseum since Aug. 24, 2019...that snapped a 10-game, 55.1-inning, 229-batter homerless streak in Oakland...that ran his record to 0-2 with a 5.56 ERA...then allowed exactly two runs in each of his next six starts to become the second pitcher in Athletic history to allow exactly two runs in six consecutive games...joins Bob Davis of the Kansas City A's, who did it all in relief from Aug. 8-26, 1960...went 3-0 with a 2.92 ERA over that stretch which ran from April 12 to May 11...allowed just two hits in 5.0 innings for the win on April 12 at Arizona but walked a season-high five batters...tied an Oakland record with three hit batters April 29 at Tampa Bay (12th time, last: Fiers, June 22, 2019, also against Tampa Bay)...left his start on May 5 against Toronto with a 3-2 lead but ended up win a no decision in the A's 9-4 loss... Trivino allowed five runs in the eighth inning for the blown save...it was the first of two times he left with a lead only to have the bullpen blow the save (also May 16 at Minnesota)...struck out a season-high 10 batters in a 3-2 win at Boston on May 11...it was his third career game of 10 or more strikeouts... did not walk a batter, the second time he has fanned 10 or more without issuing a free pass...is one of nine pitchers in Oakland history with two such games...allowed a season-high tying four runs in a no decision at Minnesota on May 16...tossed his first career complete game and shutout May 27 against Los Angeles (AL), a two-hitter in the A's 5-0 win...had a season-high 114 pitches, struck out nine and walked one...it came in his 77th career start, his 72nd with the A's...the 71 consecutive starts without a complete game is the second longest streak in Athletics history (113, Barry Zito, Aug. 22, 2003-Sept. 28, 2006)...finished May with a 3-0 record, a 2.52 ERA and .175 opponents batting average in five starts...struck out 38 and walked just four in 35.2 innings...allowed a season-high tying four runs in a season-low 4.0 innings June 1 at Seattle but had a no decision in the A's 12-6 win.

LAST START: He was the winning pitcher in the A's 5-2 win over Arizona on Tuesday in Oakland...allowed a solo home run to Walker to start the second inning, followed by a single and a walk...then retired 15 straight and the A's scored five times in the fourth inning to give him a 5-1 lead...allowed a sacrifice fly to Reddick in the seventh and was relieved by Petit to start the eighth.

LHP Sean Manaea (5-2, 3.09 ERA): Has not allowed a run in his last two starts and has a 15.0-inning scoreless streak...that is one-third of an inning short of his career high of 15.1 from Aug. 29 to Sept. 26, 2016...has now allowed one run or fewer in each of his last four starts and is 2-0 with a 0.68 ERA and .176 opponents batting average over that span...ranks seventh in the American League in ERA (3.09) and 10th in opponents slugging percentage (.363)...has won each of his first two starts in June and is now 6-0 with a 1.89 ERA over his last eight starts in June...has not lost in the month since June 21, 2017...was the winning pitcher in his last start, a 4-0 A's win over Arizona on Wednesday here in Oakland (6.0 ip, 2 h, 2 bb, 3 so)...is 2-4 with a 4.45 ERA (62.2 ip, 60 h, 33 r, 31 er, 20 bb, 48 so, 9 hr) in 12 career starts against the Angels...is 0-0 with a 1.54 ERA (11.2 ip, 10 h, 2 r, 2 er, 5 bb, 14 so, 0 hr) in two starts this year.
