ABOUT THE A'S: Have won three straight and five of the last six games to improve to a season-high 13 games over .500...the season-high last year was 14 games over .500 on Sept. 19 (33-19)...are 40-27 (.597), which is the third best record in the American League and fifth best in the majors...it matches the A's best record after 67 games over the last 31 years...were also 40-27 in 2013 and 2014 (won game 68 in both seasons)...are in first place in the AL West for the 24th consecutive day and have held at least a share of first for 54 of the last 55 days...have a two-game lead over second place Houston, which is one-half game short of the season high of 2½ (last on May 29)...have spent 52 days alone in first place, two days tied for first, one day in second, one day tied for second, three days in third, two days in fourth, three days tied for fourth and 10 days in fifth.

A'S IN JUNE: The A's are 9-2 (.818) in June, which is tied with the Angels and Brewers for the best record in the majors...have a 2.85 ERA (31 er in 98.0 ip), which is second lowest in the American League...starters have a 2.32 ERA (17 er in 66.0 ip), which is the lowest in the majors...are batting .274 (101-for-369) with 65 runs scored in 11 games (5.91 per game)...rank third in the AL in runs scored, fourth in OPS (.816) and fifth in batting...have out-scored the opposition 65-33 (+32) in June after being outscored 242-231 (-11) in April and May.

AGAINST THE WEST: The A's are 10-13 (.435) against American League West competition compared to 30-14 (.682) against all other teams...the 23 intradivision games are second fewest in the AL to Texas (22)...will play 16 of their final 25 games before the All-Star Break against AL West foes...10 of those games will come against Texas, who the A's have not faced this year...have a 4.46 ERA (102 er in 205.2 ip) against AL West teams, 3.48 against all other teams.

OFFENSE: The A's hit .307 (31-for-101) with 21 runs, eight doubles and seven home runs in the final three games against Kansas City to boost their overall batting average to a season-high .234...are tied for the American League lead in hit by pitches (33), rank second in sacrifice flies (23), third in home runs (85), tied for third in doubles (113), fourth in walks (239) and extra base hits (208) and tied for fourth in triples (10)...A's pinch hitters lead the AL in hits (13) and plate appearances (57), are tied for the lead in home runs (2), rank second in RBI (10) and third in extra base hits (3)...the A's are hitting .370 (34-for-92) with runners in scoring position in June and are batting .266 (126-for-473) with RISP overall, which is third best in the AL.

PITCHING: A's pitchers have allowed just nine runs over the first six innings of the last 10 games for a 1.35 ERA (9 er in 60.0 ip) and .182 (39-for-214) opponents batting average...have a 2.51 ERA (40 er in 143.2 ip), .220 (117-for-533) opponents batting average and three shutouts over the last 16 games...that has dropped the overall ERA to a season-low 3.82, which is fifth best in the American League...also have the fifth lowest opponents on-base percentage (.305), slugging percentage (.391) and OPS (.696)...have the second fewest walks (179) and third fewest home runs (68), but have the fourth most hits (563)...are tied for second in shutouts (7) and rank third in fewest pitches per inning (16.1).

STARTING PITCHING: A's starting pitchers are 3-1 with a 1.50 ERA (5 er in 30.0 ip) the last time through the rotation (five games) and are 9-4 with a 2.25 ERA (26 er in 104.0 ip) over the last 17 games dating back to May 26...are 26-23 with a 3.79 ERA (159 er in 377.1 ip) for the season...the wins are tied for second most in the American League, the ERA is fourth lowest and the losses are tied for fifth most...lead the majors in innings pitched (377.1) and are tied with the White Sox for the most complete games (3)...the complete games are the most by an A's team since 2015 (5).

BULLPEN: The A's bullpen converted 12-of-13 (92.3%) save opportunities and had a 3.50 ERA and .226 opponents batting average over the first 40 games through May 14...is 5-for-11 (.455%) in save chances with a 4.50 ERA (40 er in 80.0 ip) and .261 (80-for-306) opponents average in 27 games since then...has the fourth best save percentage in the American League overall (70.8%, 17-for-24) and is tied for fifth in saves...has the fewest losses in the majors (4)...is tied for the fewest home runs in the AL (22) and has issued the second fewest walks (70)...has the second highest batting average (.274) and slugging percentage (.463) against first batters faced in the AL and the fourth highest on-base percentage (.352).

DEFENSIVE DOINGS: The A's have the fourth fewest errors in the American League (34)...rank third in fewest double plays (47)...A's outfielders have five assists, which is third fewest.

HOME AND AWAY: The A's are 5-1 on this nine-game homestand against Arizona (2-0), Kansas City (3-1) and Los Angeles-AL (three games) and are now 22-18 (.550) at home, which is fifth best in the American League...the

40 home games are four more than any other team in the majors (White Sox and Red Sox, 36)...leave following the game Wednesday for a 10-game road trip to New York-AL (three games), Texas (four games) and San Francisco (three games) that begins on Friday...it is the first of three 10-game road trips...went 4-2 on the last road trip to Seattle (2-1) and Colorado (2-1) and are 18-9 (.667) on the road, which is tied for the second best road record in the majors...have won eight road series, lost none and split one...the season-opening streak of nine consecutive road series without a loss is the longest such streak in Athletics history (previous: won the first eight road series in 1988)...it matches the longest at any point during the season over the last 32 years (May 16-July 21, 2019).

HOME AND AWAY SPLITS: The A's are batting .218 (270-for-1239) at home compared to .255 (238-for-932) on the road...have the second lowest home batting average in the American League...the road batting average is third best in the AL and the road OPS is second best (.771)...have the lowest road ERA in the AL (3.55).

WALK-OFFS AND OTHER CLOSE CALLS: The A's had their Major League leading sixth walk-off win Friday night...it was the 89th walk-off win in the Bob Melvin era, which are the most in the majors over that span...are 9-3 in games decided in the last at bat...are 24-11 (.686) in games decided by three runs or fewer, which is the best record in the majors...are 16-16 (.500) in games decided by four runs or more...are 12-7 (.632) in one-run games, which is the fourth best record in the American League and the majors...are 2-1 in extra inning games and are now 8-2 in extra innings over the last two years.

TEAMMATES: The A's are one of three teams in the majors with four pitchers with 13 or more starts (Red Sox, Dodgers)...have used just seven starting pitchers this year, which is tied with the White Sox for second fewest in the majors to the Red Sox (6)...the A's are one of four teams (White Sox, Dodgers, Rays) with at least four five-game winners...are one of three teams (Indians, Giants) with two pitchers with six or more saves.

THIS AND THAT: Bob Melvin won his 1,300th game as manager yesterday to become the 35th manager in Major League history with 1,300 wins...the A's are 25-14 (.641) in night games compared to 15-13 (.536) during the day...have the second best record at night in the American League...are 17-9 (.654) in games in which the opponent starts a left-handed pitcher compared to 23-18 (.561) when they start a right-hander...the mark against lefties is tied for second best in the AL...have used 64 different lineups over the first 67 games.

THE INJURED LIST: The A's have used the injured list 14 times this year...used it just eight times last year, which was second fewest in the majors to Cleveland (4), and 18 times in 2019, which tied for second fewest...currently have four players on the IL (Fiers, Laureano Rosenthal, Wendelken)...began the year with two players on the IL but have had at least four every day since the fifth game of the season.

A's vs. ANGELS: The A's lead the season series 4-3...are 2-2 in Oakland and 2-1 in Anaheim...won the season series last year 6-4 after going 13-6 against the Angels in 2019...have won back-to-back season series for the first time since winning three straight from 2011-13...have won 18 of the last 25 games and 30 of the last 47...since moving to Oakland in 1968, the A's are 460-389 against the Angels...that includes 242-184 in Oakland and 218-205 in Anaheim...all-time, the A's are 509-465 against the Angels.

TODAY'S TIDBITS

Mark Canha leads the majors in hit by pitches (12)...is tied for second in the American League in runs scored (49), tied for fourth in triples (3) and tied for seventh in games (64)...**Mitch Moreland** needs one hit for 1,000 career...**Sean Murphy** has 30 RBI as a catcher, which is tied with Perez (KC) for the most among Major League catchers...**Matt Olson** ranks second in the American League in home runs (18), OPS (.984) and slugging (.610), tied for third in extra base hits (34), tied for fifth in RBI (47), tied for sixth in sacrifice flies (4), tied for seventh in doubles (16) and 10th in batting with runners in scoring position (.340)...**Lou Trivino** has not allowed an earned run in his last 13 games (13.2 ip).

THIS DATE IN ATHLETICS HISTORY

In **1964** Jim Gentile drives in four runs, including the game winning home run in the top of the 10th inning in a 6-5 win at Cleveland...in **1969** the A's defeat the Boston Red Sox 21-7, setting what was then a club record for most runs in a game...Oakland scores five times in the fifth, seventh and eighth innings...Reggie Jackson is 5 for 6 with two doubles, two homers and a club record 10 RBI...in **1975** Campy Campaneris steals his 500th career base in the A's 3-2 loss at Detroit.

TODAY'S STARTING PITCHER: Sean Manaea (5-2, 3.09 ERA)

FOR STARTERS: Has not allowed a run in his last two starts and has a 15.0-inning scoreless streak...that is one-third of an inning short of his career high of 15.1 from Aug. 29 to Sept. 26, 2016...it is the second time in his career he has not allowed a run in back-to-back starts (Sept. 14-20, 2016)...has now allowed one run or fewer in each of his last four starts and is 2-0 with a 0.68 ERA (2 er in 26.2 ip) and .176 (16-for-91) opponents batting average over that span...went 3-1 with a 2.83 ERA over his first five starts and was 0-1 with a 6.64 ERA in four starts in between (May 2-19).

AMONG THE LEADERS: Ranks seventh in the American League in ERA (3.09) and 10th in opponents slugging percentage (.363)...has allowed just seven home runs in 75.2 innings and his average of 0.83 home runs per nine innings is 10th lowest...is one of two pitchers in the majors with two shutouts (DeSclafani, SF) and one of three with two complete games (Marquez, COL and DeSclafani, SF)...is the first A's pitcher with two complete games in a season since Kendall Graveman in 2016 (2) and the first with two shutouts since Sonny Gray in 2015 (2)...has three of the A's seven complete games and shutouts over the last four years.

IN JUNE: Has won each of his first two starts in June and has not allowed a run (15.0 ip, 6 h, 4 bb, 11 so)...is now 6-0 with a 1.89 ERA (11 er in 52.1 ip) over his last eight starts in June and has not lost in the month since June 21, 2017...is 10-2 with a 2.78 ERA (31 er in 100.1 ip) in 16 career starts in June...the wins match his most in any month (September) and the ERA is second lowest to his 2.17 in September.

LEFT AND RIGHT: Left-handed hitters are 1-for-22 against him over his last four starts and they are batting .123 (9-for-73) for the season, which is second lowest in the American League (Montgomery, NYY .120)...has a .292 (63-for-216) mark against right-handers, which is third highest...has a .427 OPS against lefties (third lowest), .736 against righties.

SUPPORT: Has allowed one run or fewer in eight of his 13 starts but is 4-0 with four no decisions in those starts...has six no decisions overall, which is tied for sixth most in the American League...has received one run of support in three of his six no decisions and the bullpen blew the save in one other no decision...the A's are 5-1 in his no decisions and are 10-3 (.769) in his starting assignments...are 21-8 (.724) when he starts over the last three years...has received one run of support or fewer in five of his 13 starts and is 0-2 in those starts...is 5-0 in eight starts with two runs of support or more.

WALK/DON'T WALK: Has walked nine batters in his last four starts (26.2 ip) after walking just nine over his first nine starts (49.0 ip)...has three starts with no walks and four others with one...over the last four years, he has walked two batters or fewer in 50 of his 56 starts (17 with no walks, 21 with one)...has 65 walks in 320.0 innings over that span, an average of 1.83 per nine innings.

DAYS REST: Is scheduled to start on four days rest...is 2-0 with a 1.34 ERA (7 er in 47.0 ip) in seven starts on four days rest compared to 2-1 with a 7.00 ERA (14 er in 18.0 ip) in four starts on five days rest...over the last three years, he is 6-1 with a 2.48 ERA (24 er in 87.0 ip) in 15 starts on four days rest, 3-2 with a 6.11 ERA (19 er in 28.0 ip) in six starts on five days rest.

INNING BY INNING: Has a 4.50 ERA (13 er in 26.0 ip) over the first two innings of his two starts, a 3.00 ERA (8 er in 24.0 ip) in innings three and four and a 1.75 ERA (5 er in 25.2 ip) from the fifth inning on.

2021 HIGHLIGHTS: Allowed five runs on six hits and a season-high three walks in 4.2 innings for the loss in his first start on April 4 against Houston...then went 3-0 with a 1.50 ERA over his next four starts...picked up his first win of the season in the 100th game of his career, an 8-4 victory over Detroit on April 15...tossed a six-hit, seven-inning shutout in the A's 7-0 win over Minnesota in the first game of the doubleheader April 20...it was the 11th complete game shutout of fewer than eight innings in Oakland history (last: Mike Minor, Sept. 14, 2020 at Seattle)...it was his second career complete game and shutout, with the other being his no-hitter on April 21, 2018 against Boston...the start was the 100th of his career and he became the 25th pitcher in Oakland history to make 100 starts...went 0-1 with a 6.64 ERA and .326 opponents batting average over a four-start stretch from May 2 to 18...struck out a career-high tying 10 batters on May 7 against Tampa Bay, but had a no decision in the A's 2-1 win...it was his fourth career 10-strikeout game, his first since Sept. 8, 2019 against Detroit...retired each of the first 18 batters he faced before walking Arozarena to start the seventh...then retired the next three before Brosseau led off the eighth inning with a double...allowed a season-high seven runs on a season-high 10 hits in a season-low 2.0 innings for the loss at Boston on May 13...has allowed seven or more runs in a start three times in his career, all at Fenway Park (8 on May 10, 2016; 7 on Sept. 12, 2017)...also allowed 10 hits in his next start on May 18 against Houston to become the first A's pitcher to yield 10 hits in back-to-back starts since Kendall Graveman in 2016 (April 25-May 2)...is 2-0 with a 0.68 ERA (2 er in 26.2 ip) and .176 (16-for-91) opponents batting average in four starts

since then...had a no decision in the A's 6-5 loss at Los Angeles (AL) on May 23...left with a 4-1 lead but the bullpen blew the save...struck out Justin Upton to lead off the game for the 50,000 strikeout in Oakland history...fanned Taylor Ward to end the fourth inning for his 500th career strikeout...walked a season-high tying three batters May 28 against Los Angeles (AL)...finished May 0-1 with a 4.78 ERA and .300 opponents batting average in six starts...is now 5-9 with a 5.51 ERA in 21 career starts in May and the ERA is his highest for any month (5.22 in August)...tossed a four-hit shutout in the A's 6-0 win at Seattle on June 2...it was his third career complete game and shutout, his second this year...logged a season-high 111 pitches, which are his most in a game over the last four years.

LAST START: He combined with Petit, Trivino and Diekman on a two-hit shutout in the A's 4-0 win over Arizona last Wednesday in Oakland...tossed six of the innings and allowed both of the hits...had 111 pitches for the second consecutive start, which matches his season high...it was just the second time over the last 11 years an A's pitcher tossed at least 111 pitches in six innings or fewer without allowing a run...he did it the other time on Sept. 6, 2017.

MANAEA vs. LOS ANGELES: Is 2-4 with a 4.45 ERA (62.2 ip, 60 h, 33 r, 31 er, 20 bb, 48 so, 9 hr) in 12 career starts...is 0-2 with a 6.31 ERA (18 er in 25.2 ip) in six starts in Anaheim and 2-2 with a 3.16 ERA (13 er in 37.0 ip) in six starts in Oakland...is 0-0 with a 1.54 ERA (11.2 ip, 10 h, 2 r, 2 er, 5 bb, 14 so, 0 hr) in two starts this year...the first no decision came in the A's 6-5 loss at Los Angeles on May 23...had a 4-0 lead when he allowed a run to score on a Walsh ground out in the fourth inning...was relieved by Smith to start the sixth inning with the A's leading 4-1 but the pen allowed a run in the sixth and three in the seventh for the blown save...then had a no decision in his next start in Oakland on May 28, a 3-1 A's win...blanked the Angels on four hits and three walks over the first six innings...the A's scored their first run in the sixth inning but he allowed a RBI single to Fletcher in the seventh and left with two outs in the seventh and the scored tied 1-1...Oakland scored twice in the bottom of the seventh for the win.

RHP Frankie Montas (6-6, 4.37 ERA): Is 2-4 with a 3.18 ERA over his last six starts after going 4-2 with a 5.50 ERA over his first seven starts...his six wins are tied for 10th in the American League but his six losses are tied for seventh most...has a .200 opponents batting average the first time through the order, .321 the second time and .282 with six of his 11 home runs after that...is 3-1 with a 3.13 ERA in four starts on the road compared to 3-5 with a 4.98 ERA in nine starts at home...has allowed 13 of his 39 runs and 25 of his 77 hits in the third inning for a 9.24 ERA and .397 opponents batting average...was the losing pitcher in his last start, a 6-1 A's loss to Kansas City on Thursday here in Oakland (6.1 ip, 5 h, 3 r, 2 er, 8 so)...is 2-1 with a 3.02 ERA (41.2 ip, 39 h, 18 r, 14 er, 16 bb, 40 so, 4 hr) in 10 career appearances, including seven starts, against the Angels...was the losing pitcher in his only start this year, a 4-0 A's loss on May 29 in Oakland (5.2 ip, 6 h, 4 r, 0 er, 1 bb, 7 so).
