ABOUT THE A'S: Have a four-game winning streak, which matches their second longest winning streak of the season...also won four straight from June 1-5...the season-high is 13 from April 9-24...have won six of the last seven games and are season-high 14 games over .500, which matches the season high from last year (33-19 on Sept. 19)...have not been more than 14 games over .500 since finishing the 2019 season 97-65...are 41-27 (.603), which is the third best record in the American League and fifth best in the majors...it matches the A's best record after 68 games over the last 31 years...were also 41-27 in 2013 and 2014 (won game 68 in 2014, lost game 68 in 2013)...are in first place in the AL West for the 25th consecutive day and have held at least a share of first for 55 of the last 56 days...have a season-high tying 2½-game lead over second place Houston...have spent 53 days alone in first place, two days tied for first, one day in second, one day tied for second, three days in third, two days in fourth, three days tied for fourth and 10 days in fifth.

A'S IN JUNE: The A's are 10-2 (.833) in June, which is the best record in the majors (Brewers, Reds and Angels are 9-3)...have a 3.03 ERA (36 er in 107.0 ip), which is second lowest in the American League...starters have a 2.26 ERA (18 er in 71.2 ip), which is second lowest in the majors (Nationals, 1.97)...are batting .275 (110-for-400) with 73 runs scored in 12 games (6.08 per game)...rank third in the AL in runs scored and OPS (.827) and fourth in batting...have out-scored the opposition 73-38 (+35) in June after being outscored 242-231 (-11) in April and May.

AGAINST THE WEST: The A's are 11-13 (.458) against American League West competition compared to 30-14 (.682) against all other teams...the 24 intradivision games are second fewest in the AL to Texas (22)...will play 15 of their final 24 games before the All-Star Break against AL West foes...10 of those games will come against Texas, who the A's have not faced this year...have a 4.49 ERA (107 er in 214.2 ip) against AL West teams, 3.48 against all other teams.

OUCH: The A's were hit by a pitch four times last night, which fell one short of the Oakland record of five...have been hit by a pitch four or more times in a game five times in Oakland history, including three times over the last four years...now have 37 hit by pitches for the season, which is the most in the American League and fourth most in the majors...it is already more than the season total for 18 seasons in Oakland history, but is two short of the 39 in 60 games last year.

OFFENSE: The A's are hitting .303 (40-for-132) with 29 runs, 11 doubles and eight home runs over the last four games to boost their overall batting average to a season-high .235...rank second in the American League in sacrifice flies (24), third in home runs (86) and doubles (116), fourth in walks (245) and extra base hits (212), tied for fourth in triples (10) and fifth in on-base percentage (.319)...A's pinch hitters lead the AL in hits (14) and plate appearances (58), are tied for the lead in home runs (2) and RBI (11) and tied for second in extra base hits (4)...the A's are hitting .353 (36-for-102) with runners in scoring position in June and are batting .265 (128-for-483) with RISP overall, which is third best in the AL.

PITCHING: A's pitchers have allowed just 10 runs over the first six innings of the last 11 games for a 1.36 ERA (10 er in 66.0 ip) and .199 (48-for-241) opponents batting average...have a 2.65 ERA (45 er in 152.2 ip), .228 (131-for-574) opponents batting average and three shutouts over the last 17 games...that has dropped the overall ERA to 3.84, which is fifth lowest in the American League...also have the fifth lowest opponents on-base percentage (.307), slugging percentage (.393) and OPS (.699)...have the second fewest walks (182) and home runs (69), but have the fourth most hits (577)...are tied for second in shutouts (7) and rank third in fewest pitches per inning (16.1).

STARTING PITCHING: A's starting pitchers have allowed two earned runs or fewer in each of the last nine games, which is their longest such streak since a 10-game streak from May 11-22, 2014...are 6-2 with a 1.84 ERA (11 er in 53.2 ip) over that span and 27-23 with a 3.76 ERA (160 er in 383.0 ip) for the season...the wins are second most in the American League, the ERA is fourth lowest and the losses are tied for fifth most...lead the majors in innings pitched (383.0) and are tied with the White Sox for the most complete games (3)...the complete games are the most by an A's team since 2015 (5).

BULLPEN: The A's bullpen converted 12-of-13 (92.3%) save opportunities and had a 3.50 ERA and .226 opponents batting average over the first 40 games through May 14...is 6-for-12 (50.0%) in save chances with a 4.75 ERA (44 er in 83.1 ip) and .265 (85-for-321) opponents average in 28 games since then...has the fourth best save percentage in the American League overall (72.0%, 18-for-25) and is tied for fifth in saves...has the fewest losses in the majors (4)...has the fewest home runs in the AL (22) and the second fewest walks (80)...has the second highest batting average (.274) and slugging percentage (.458) against first batters faced in the AL and the fifth highest on-base percentage (.350).

DEFENSIVE DOINGS: The A's have committed just three errors in the last nine games and have 34 for the season, which is fourth fewest in the American League (34)...rank third in fewest double plays (47)...A's outfielders have five assists, which is third fewest.

HOME AND AWAY: The A's are 6-1 on this nine-game homestand against Arizona (2-0), Kansas City (3-1) and Los Angeles-AL (1-0) and are now 23-18 (.561) at home...the 41 home games are four more than any other team in the majors (White Sox and Red Sox, 37)...leave following the game tomorrow for a 10-game road trip to New York-AL (three games), Texas (four games) and San Francisco (three games) that begins on Friday...it is the first of three 10-game road trips...went 4-2 on the last road trip to Seattle (2-1) and Colorado (2-1) and are 18-9 (.667) on the road, which is tied for the second best road record in the majors...have won eight road series, lost none and split one...the season-opening streak of nine consecutive road series without a loss is the longest such streak in Athletics history (previous: won the first eight road series in 1988)...it matches the longest at any point during the season over the last 32 years (May 16-July 21, 2019).

HOME AND AWAY SPLITS: The A's are batting .220 (279-for-1270) at home compared to .255 (238-for-932) on the road...have the second lowest home batting average in the American League...have the second best road batting average and OPS (.771)...have the lowest road ERA in the AL (3.55).

WALK-OFFS AND OTHER CLOSE CALLS: The A's had their Major League leading sixth walk-off win Friday night...it was the 89th walk-off win in the Bob Melvin era, which are the most in the majors over that span...are 9-3 in games decided in the last at bat...are 25-11 (.694) in games decided by three runs or fewer, which is the best record in the majors...are 16-16 (.500) in games decided by four runs or more...are 12-7 (.632) in one-run games, which is the fourth best record in the American League and the majors...are 2-1 in extra inning games and are now 8-2 in extra innings over the last two years.

TEAMMATES: Sean Manaea won his sixth game of the season last night, giving the A's four pitchers with six or more wins (Bassitt and Petit, 7; Montas 6)...the only other team with four six-game winners is the Dodgers (Bauer, Buehler, Kershaw, Urias)...the A's are one of three teams in the majors with four pitchers with 13 or more starts (Red Sox, Dodgers)...have used just seven starting pitchers this year, which is tied with the White Sox for second fewest in the majors to the Red Sox (6)...are one of three teams (Indians, Giants) with two pitchers with six or more saves.

THIS AND THAT: The A's had four different right fielders last night, which matches the most right fielders in a game in Oakland history (sixth time, last: Sept 28, 2000 vs. Anaheim)...are 26-14 (.650) in night games compared to 15-13 (.536) during the day...have the second best record at night in the American League...are 17-9 (.654) in games in which the opponent starts a left-handed pitcher compared to 24-18 (.571) when they start a right-hander...the mark against lefties is tied for second best in the AL...have used 65 different lineups over the first 68 games.

A's vs. ANGELS: The A's lead the season series 5-3...are 3-2 in Oakland and 2-1 in Anaheim...won the season series last year 6-4 after going 13-6 against the Angels in 2019...have won back-to-back season series for the first time since winning three straight from 2011-13...have won 19 of the last 26 games and 31 of the last 48...since moving to Oakland in 1968, the A's are 461-389 against the Angels...that includes 243-184 in Oakland and 218-205 in Anaheim...all-time, the A's are 510-465 against the Angels.

TODAY'S TIDBITS

Mark Canha leads the majors in hit by pitches (13)...is tied for second in the American League in runs scored (50), tied for fourth in triples (3), tied for seventh in games (65) and ranks 10th in on-base percentage (.378)...**Sean Murphy** has 32 RBI as a catcher, which are the most among Major League catchers...**Matt Olson** ranks second in the American League in home runs (18), OPS (.981) and slugging (.606), fourth in extra base hits (34), tied for fourth in sacrifice flies (5), fifth in RBI (48) and tied for seventh in doubles (16)...**Lou Trivino** has not allowed an earned run in his last 14 games (14.2 ip).

THIS DATE IN ATHLETICS HISTORY

In **1925** the A's trail 15-3 entering the bottom of the seventh inning before scoring once in the seventh and 13 times in the eighth inning to defeat Cleveland 17-15...the 12 run deficit overcome to win is a Major League record...in **1983** Davey Lopes drives in seven runs and is a single short of the cycle in the A's 10-1 win at Toronto...in **2002** the A's go errorless for the 12th consecutive game, breaking the Oakland record of 11.

TODAY'S STARTING PITCHER: Frankie Montas (6-6, 4.37 ERA)

FOR STARTERS: Is 2-4 with a 3.18 ERA (12 er in 34.0 ip) over his last six starts after going 4-2 with a 5.50 ERA over his first seven starts...his six wins are tied for 10th in the American League but his six losses are tied for eighth most...the six losses are a career high as are his 39 runs and 11 home runs...the six wins are second only to his nine in 2019.

OPPONENTS BATTING: Has a .200 (21-for-105) opponents batting average the first time through the order, .321 (36-for-112) the second time and .282 (20-for-71) with six of his 11 home runs after that...has a .378 (28-for-74) opponents batting average against the opponents one and two hitters but has held the three, four and five hitters to a .216 (22-for-102) average.

HOME AND AWAY: Is 3-1 with a 3.13 ERA (8 er in 23.0 ip) in four starts on the road compared to 3-5 with a 4.98 ERA (26 er in 47.0 ip) in nine starts at home...is tied for second in the American League in losses at home...last year, he went 1-4 with a 10.13 ERA in five starts on the road, 2-1 with a 2.56 ERA in six starts at home.

DAYS REST: Is scheduled to start on four days rest today...is 4-2 with a 3.06 ERA (12 er in 35.1 ip) and .583 OPS in six starts on five days rest, 2-3 with a 4.22 ERA (15 er in 32.0 ip) and .875 OPS in six starts on four days rest...has allowed eight of his 11 home runs when pitching on four days rest.

THIS AND THAT: Has allowed 13 of his 39 runs and 25 of his 77 hits in the third inning for a 9.24 ERA (13 er in 12.2 ip) and .397 (25-for-63) opponents batting average...has allowed just one run in the fourth inning (12.0 ip, 0.75 ERA) and opponents are 7-for-44 (.159)...has tossed 6.1 innings or fewer in all 13 of his starts...has walked two batters or fewer 11 times...the A's are 7-6 (.538) in his starting assignments.

2021 HIGHLIGHTS: Took the loss in his first start on April 5 against Los Angeles (NL)...allowed a season-high seven runs in a season-low 2.2 innings and walked a season-high three batters...tossed 90 pitches, which were the most by an A's pitcher in an outing of fewer than three innings since pitch counts were tracked beginning in 1988...the loss extended his losing streak to a career-high three games dating back to Sept. 13, 2020...then picked up the win in each of his next two starts and allowed just one run on eight hits in 12.0 innings...won 7-3 at Houston on April 10 and then combined with Romo, Diekmann and Wendelken on a four-hit shutout in the A's 3-0 victory over Detroit on April 16...allowed six runs on a season-high nine hits in 4.0 innings against Minnesota on April 21 but had a no decision in the A's 13-12, 10-inning win...allowed three home runs in a start for the second time in his career (Sept. 22, 2020 vs. Los Angeles-NL)...had a season-high 105 pitches in a 4-3 loss at Tampa Bay on April 27...finished April 20-2 with a 6.20 ERA in five starts...then went 3-3 with a 3.18 ERA in six starts in May...the three wins matched his most ever in a month and he had 38 strikeouts, which tied for eighth in the American League...won each of his first three starts in May and posted a 3.12 ERA over that stretch from May 3-14...then went 0-3 with a 3.24 ERA over his next three starts from May 19-29...the losing streak matched his career high...struck out 11 batters in 6.0 innings in a 4-2 loss to Seattle on May 24...it was his fourth career games of 10 or more strikeouts and the second highest single-game total of his career to his 13 against the Mariners in the final game of the 2020 season...walked a season-high tying three.

LAST START: He was the losing pitcher in the A's 6-1 loss to Kansas City last Thursday in Oakland...tossed a season-high 6.1 innings...allowed a one-out single to Santana in the first and a two-out single to Gutierrez in the second...then retired 13 in a row and had a 1-0 lead entering the seventh inning...yielded a RBI double to Dozier and a two-run single to Gutierrez and left after 6.1 innings trailing 3-1.

MONTAS vs. LOS ANGELES: Is 2-1 with a 3.02 ERA (41.2 ip, 39 h, 18 r, 14 er, 16 bb, 40 so, 4 hr) in 10 career appearances, including seven starts...is 1-1 with a 3.29 ERA (10 er in 27.1 ip) in seven games in Oakland and 1-0 with a 2.51 ERA (4 er in 14.1 ip) in three appearances in Anaheim...was the losing pitcher in his only start this year, a 4-0 A's loss on May 29 in Oakland...blanked the Angels on two hits over the first four innings but then allowed four runs in the fourth inning, all unearned...the last A's pitcher with at least four unearned runs in a game was Montas on April 29, 2019 against Boston (6)...the A's were shutout on three hits by Cobb, Watson and Iglesias...was 0-0 with a 5.19 ERA (8.2 ip, 10 h, 5 r, 5 er, 6 bb, 10 so, 1 hr) in two starts last year, both extra inning A's wins.

2020 RECAP: Was off to a strong start as he was 2-1 with a 1.57 ERA, .175 opponents batting average and no home runs over his first four starts...was scratched from his scheduled start on Aug. 14 at San Francisco with upper back tightness and went 1-4 with an 8.70 ERA, .321 opponents average and 10 home runs over his final seven starts...went 3-5 with a 5.60 ERA in 11 starts overall...his ERA was eighth highest in the majors among pitchers with at least 50 innings pitched...had career highs in losses (5) and earned runs (33) and matched his high in home runs (10), runs (35) and walks (23)...led the A's in strikeouts (60), losses, runs, home runs and walks...his opponents batting average broke down to .198 (22-for-111) against right-handed hitters compared to .350 (35-for-100) against left-handers...surrendered six of his 10 home runs and issued 15 of his 23 walks to lefties for a 1.061 OPS (.572 against right-handers)...had a .306 opponents batting average the first time through the lineup, .264 the second time and .205 after that...allowed a .133 average with two strikes...was 2-1 with a 2.56 ERA and .225 opponents batting average in six starts in Oakland, 1-4 with a 10.13 ERA and .330 opponents average in five starts on the road...surrendered just two home runs in 31.2 innings in Oakland compared to eight in 21.1 innings on the road...made eight of his 11 starts during the day, which tied for the most in the majors...was 2-4 with a 6.16 ERA during the day, 1-1 with a 4.20 ERA at night...the A's were 6-5 (.545) in his starting assignments...had two starts of seven innings and five starts of fewer than five innings...went 2-2 with a 2.83 ERA in six starts on four days rest, 1-3 with an 11.00 ERA in five starts on five days rest or more...received two runs of support or fewer in nine of his 11 starts...had 10 of his 28 runs of support in one start on Aug. 3 at Seattle and had a 4.75 RSA for the season...won both of his starts with support of three or more runs and is now 17-1 in 21 career starts with at least three runs of support.

LHP Cole Irvin (4-7, 3.70 ERA): Has allowed one run in each of his last two starts and is 1-0 with a 1.50 ERA over that span...went 0-4 with a 5.40 ERA and .284 opponent batting average over his previous five starts...has walked two batters or fewer in each of his 13 starts, including eight starts with one walk and three starts with no walks...has issued just 12 free passes in 75.1 innings and his average of 1.43 walks per nine innings is second lowest in the American League...has allowed a .247 batting average against right-handed hitters compared to .321 against left-handers...is 0-5 with a 7.46 ERA in five starts against AL West competition, 4-2 with a 1.80 ERA in six starts against everyone else...had a no decision in his last start, a 4-3 A's win over Kansas City last Friday in Oakland (6.0 ip, 6 h, 2 r, 1 er, 0 bb, 4 so)...was the losing pitcher in his only career appearance against the Angels, a start in the A's 4-2 loss in Oakland earlier this year on May 30 (6.0 ip, 6 h, 4 r, 4 er, 0 b, 3 so).

- Has faced the Angels twice this year, throwing two scoreless innings with two strikeouts and one walk...were his first career outings against Los Angeles-AL...spent seven seasons with the Angles appearing in 285 games...went 17-13 with nine saves and a 3.70 ERA across 277.2 innings pitched.
- Was a non-roster invitee with Cincinnati this spring and made the Reds Opening Day roster...compiled an 11.12 ERA in six relief appearances before he was designated for assignment on April 17...signed a minor league deal with Oakland on April 29 and was assigned to Las Vegas...had a save and did not allow a run in four games with the Aviators (5.0 ip, 2 h, 1 bb, 5 so).

Last Year: *Compiled a 2.45 ERA and .196 opponents batting average in 11 relief appearances with the Angels...missed 25 games while on the injured list from Aug. 4-30 with a right adductor strain.*

- Has a save and a 2.38 ERA (3 er, 11.1 ip) over his last 11 games after going 2-0 with five saves, no blown saves and a 2.12 ERA over his first 17 contests...gave up three earned runs in 0.2 combined innings on May 15-16.
- Has yielded four home runs over his last 13 games and 12.0 innings after allowing six home runs over his previous 152 games and 126.1 innings from June 26, 2018 to May 12, 2021.
- Has held right-handed hitters to a .182 (12-for-66) average but they have hit all four of the home runs he has allowed.
- Has a 5.87 ERA (5 er in 7.2 ip) in eight outings on no days rest, a 1.31 ERA (3 er in 20.2 ip) in 20 appearances on one day of rest or more.
- Has faced the Angels three times this season, throwing 3.1 scoreless innings...owns a 2.00 ERA (6 er, 27.0 ip) in 30 career outings against Los Angeles-AL.
