OAKLAND ATHLETICS (42-27) VS. LOS ANGELES ANGELS (33-34)

WEDNESDAY, JUNE 16, 2021 — OAKLAND COLISEUM — 12:37 PDT

ABOUT THE A'S: Extended their winning streak to five games last night, which is second longest this year to the 13-game streak from April 9-24... have won seven of the last eight games and are 15 games over .500 for the first time since finishing the 2019 season 97-65...are 42-27 (.609), which is the third best record in the American League and fifth best in the majors... it matches the A's best record after 69 games over the last 31 years (also 2014)...with a win today, would have their best record after 70 games since 1990 when they were 45-25...are in first place in the AL West for the 26th consecutive day and have held at least a share of first for 56 of the last 57 days...have a season-high tying 2½-game lead over second place Houston... have spent 54 days alone in first place, two days tied for first, one day in second, one day tied for second, three days in third, two days in fourth, three days tied for fourth and 10 days in fifth.

A'S IN JUNE: The A's are 11-2 (.846) in June, which is the best record in the majors ahead of the Reds (10-3)...have a 3.10 ERA (40 er in 116.0 ip), which is third lowest in the American League...starters have a 2.29 ERA (20 er in 78.2 ip), which is second lowest in the majors (Nationals, 1.86)...are batting .274 (118-for-431) with 79 runs scored in 13 games (6.08 per game)...rank third in the AL in runs scored and OPS (.824) and fourth in batting...have out-scored the opposition 79-42 (+37) after being out-scored 242-231 (-11) in April and May.

HOME AND AWAY: The A's are 7-1 on this nine-game homestand against Arizona (2-0), Kansas City (3-1) and Los Angeles-AL (2-0)...have not won more than seven games on a homestand since going 8-2 against Tampa Bay, Texas and Houston from Aug. 30 to Sept. 8, 2013...are 24-18 (.571) at home...the 42 home games are four more than any other team in the majors (White Sox, 38)...leave following the game today for a 10-game road trip to New York-AL (three games), Texas (four games) and San Francisco (three games) that begins on Friday...it is the first of three 10-game road trips...went 4-2 on the last road trip to Seattle (2-1) and Colorado (2-1) and are 18-9 (.667) on the road, which is the third best road record in the majors...have won eight road series, lost none and split one...the season-opening streak of nine consecutive road series without a loss is the longest such streak in Athletics history (previous: won the first eight road series in 1988)...it matches the longest at any point during the season over the last 32 years (May 16-July 21, 2019).

HOME AND AWAY SPLITS: The A's are batting .221 (287-for-1301) at home compared to .255 (238-for-932) on the road...have the second lowest home batting average in the American League...have the second best road batting average and OPS (.771)...have the second lowest road ERA in the AL (3.55).

STARTING PITCHING: A's starting pitchers have allowed two earned runs or fewer in each of the last 10 games, which is their longest such streak since May 11-22, 2014 when they also had a 10-game streak...have not had a longer streak since May 28-June 10, 2007 when they had a 13-game streak...are 7-2 with a 1.93 ERA (13 er in 60.2 ip) over that span and 28-23 with a 3.74 ERA (162 er in 390.0 ip) for the season...rank second in the American League in wins and fourth in ERA...lead the majors in innings pitched (390.0) and are tied with the White Sox for the most complete games (3)...the complete games are the most by an A's team since 2015 (5).

IN THE PINCH: A's pinch hitters are 3-for-4 with a double, three RBI and a sacrifice fly in their last five plate appearances dating back to June 6...lead the American League in hits (14), RBI (12), sacrifice flies (2) and plate appearances (59), are tied for the lead in home runs (2) and tied for second in extra base hits (4).

AGAINST THE WEST: The A's are 12-13 (.480) against American League West competition compared to 30-14 (.682) against all other teams...the 25 intradivision games are tied for second fewest in the AL to Texas (23)...will play 14 of their final 23 games before the All-Star Break against AL West foes...10 of those games will come against Texas, who the A's have not faced this year...have a 4.47 ERA (111 er in 223.2 ip) against AL West teams, 3.48 against all other teams.

OFFENSE: The A's are hitting .294 (48-for-163) with 35 runs, 14 doubles and nine home runs over the last five games to boost their overall batting average to a season-high .235...lead the American League in hit by pitches (37), rank second in sacrifice flies (25), third in doubles (119), tied for third in home runs (87), fourth in on-base percentage (.319), walks (249) and extra base hits (216) and tied for fourth in triples (10)...the A's are hitting .355 (38-for-107) with runners in scoring position in June and are batting .266 (130-for-488) with RISP overall, which is third best in the AL.

PITCHING: A's pitchers have allowed just 12 runs over the first six innings of the last 12 games for a 1.50 ERA (12 er in 72.0 ip) and .202 (53-for-263) opponents batting average...have a 2.73 ERA (49 er in 161.2 ip), .227 (138-for-607) opponents batting average and three shutouts over the last 18 games...that has dropped the overall ERA to 3.84, which is fifth lowest in the American League...also have the fifth lowest opponents on-base percentage (.306) and OPS (.698)...have the second fewest walks (183) and third fewest home runs (71), but have allowed the fourth most hits (584)...rank third in shutouts (7) and fewest pitches per inning (16.1).

BULLPEN: The A's bullpen converted 12-of-13 (92.3%) save opportunities and had a 3.50 ERA and .226 opponents batting average over the first 40 games through May 14...is 7-for-13 (53.8%) in save chances with a 4.85 ERA (46 er in 85.1 ip) and .264 (87-for-329) opponents average in 29 games since then...has the fourth best save percentage in the American League overall (73.1%, 19-for-26) and is tied for fourth in saves...has the fewest losses in the majors (4)...has the second fewest walks in the AL (80) and is tied for the second fewest home runs (24)...has the highest slugging percentage against first batters faced in the AL (.475) and the second highest batting average (.276).

DEFENSIVE DOINGS: The A's have committed just three errors in the last 10 games and have 34 for the season, which is third fewest in the American League...rank third in fewest double plays (48)...A's outfielders have five assists, which is third fewest.

WALK-OFFS AND OTHER CLOSE CALLS: The A's lead the majors with six walk-off wins and now have 89 in the Bob Melvin era, which are the most in the majors over that span...are 9-3 in games decided in the last at bat...are 26-11 (.703) in games decided by three runs or fewer, which is the best record in the majors...are 16-16 (.500) in games decided by four runs or more...are 12-7 (.632) in one-run games, which is the fourth best record in the American League and the majors...are 2-1 in extra inning games and are now 8-2 in extra innings over the last two years.

TEAMMATES: Cole Irvin is scheduled to make his 14th start of the season today and the A's will become the first team in the majors with four pitchers with 14 or more starts...have used just seven starting pitchers this year, which is tied with the White Sox for second fewest in the majors to the Red Sox (6)...are one of two teams with four pitchers with six or more wins (Dodgers...are one of three teams with two pitchers with six or more saves (Indians, Giants).

THIS AND THAT: The A's are 27-14 (.659) in night games compared to 15-13 (.536) during the day...have the second best record at night in the American League...are 18-9 (.667) in games in which the opponent starts a left-handed pitcher compared to 24-18 (.571) when they start a right-hander...the mark against lefties is second best in the AL...have used 66 different lineups over the first 69 games.

A's vs. ANGELS: The A's lead the season series 6-3...are 4-2 in Oakland and 2-1 in Anaheim...won the season series last year 6-4 after going 13-6 against the Angels in 2019...have won back-to-back season series for the first time since winning three straight from 2011-13...have won 20 of the last 27 games and 32 of the last 49...since moving to Oakland in 1968, the A's are 462-389 against the Angels...that includes 244-184 in Oakland and 218-205 in Anaheim...all-time, the A's are 511-465 against the Angels.

TODAY'S TIDBITS

Mark Canha leads the majors in hit by pitches (13)...ranks second in the American League in runs scored (51), tied for fourth in triples (3) and tied for seventh in games (66)...**Sean Murphy** has 33 RBI as a catcher, which are the most among Major League catchers...**Matt Olson** ranks second in the American League in home runs (18) and OPS (.973), third in slugging (.600), fourth in extra base hits (34), tied for fourth in sacrifice flies (5), tied for fifth in RBI (48) and tied for eighth in doubles (16)...**Lou Trivino** has not allowed an earned run in his last 14 games (14.2 ip).

THIS DATE IN ATHLETICS HISTORY

In **1934** Bob Johnson collects six hits in the second game of a double-header against Chicago...in **1971** Mike Epstein homers in his first two at bats after homering in his final two at bats the day before to give him four home runs in four at bats, tying a major league record for consecutive home runs...in **1996** Mark McGwire ties an Oakland record with three doubles at Milwaukee and drives in his 790th career run, breaking Sal Bando's Oakland career RBI record.

TODAY'S STARTING PITCHER: Cole Irvin (4-7, 3.70 ERA)

FOR STARTERS: Has allowed one run in each of his last two starts and is 1-0 with a 1.50 ERA (2 er in 12.0 ip) over that span...went 0-4 with a 5.40 ERA and .284 opponent batting average over his previous five starts...the losing matched his career high and was the longest losing streak by an A's starting pitcher over the last three years...is tied for third in the American League in losses (7).

DON'T WALK: Has walked two batters or fewer in each of his 13 starts, including eight starts with one walk and three starts with no walks...has issued just 12 free passes in 75.1 innings and his average of 1.43 walks per nine innings is second lowest in the American League (Cole, NYY 1.21)...is averaging the third fewest strikeouts per nine innings (6.45), but ranks sixth in strikeout-to-walk ratio (4.50)...has walked one batter or fewer in 13 of his 16 career starts and has walked just 26 batters in 120.2 career innings (1.94 per nine innings).

LEFT AND RIGHT: Has allowed a .247 (54-for-219) batting average against right-handed hitters compared to .321 (25-for-78) against left-handers...the mark against lefties is second highest in the AL (Foltynewicz, TEX .339) and his .825 OPS is fourth highest...however, has allowed six of his eight home runs and issued 11 of his 12 walks to righties...his career splits are .252 (87-for-345) with a .708 OPS against right-handers, .356 (48-for-135) with a .908 OPS against lefties

HOME AND AWAY: Is 2-5 with a 4.30 ERA (22 er in 46.0 ip) in eight starts at home compared to 2-2 with a 2.76 ERA (9 er in 29.1 ip) in five starts at home...is tied for second in the American League in home losses...has the sixth lowest road ERA.

AGAINST THE WEST: Is 0-5 with a 7.46 ERA (21 er in 25.1 ip) and .327 (36-for-110) opponents batting average in five starts against American League West competition, 4-2 with a 1.80 ERA (10 er in 50.0 ip) and .230 (43-for-187) opponents average in six starts against everyone else.

DAYS REST: Is scheduled to start on four days rest today...is 0-6 with a 6.00 ERA (22 er in 33.0 ip) in six starts on four days rest compared to 4-0 with a 1.18 ERA (5 er in 38.0 ip) in six starts on five days rest or more.

THIS AND THAT: Is averaging 14.6 pitches per nine innings, which is the fewest in the American League and fifth fewest in the majors...six of the eight home runs he has allowed have been solo shots...is 4-1 in seven starts with more than two runs of support, 0-6 in five starts with support of two runs or fewer...has allowed one run or fewer in five of his 13 starts...the A's are 5-8 (.385) in his starting assignments.

2021 HIGHLIGHTS: Was on the A's Opening Day roster and lost each of his first two starts, allowing four runs in each contest for a 7.45 ERA...tossed 4.1 innings in his first start on April 3 against Houston, which was the shortest start of his career...also faced the Astros in his second start on April 8 but did not pitch again until April 17 against Detroit when he combined with Wendelken, Guerra and Weems on a five-hit shutout in a 7-0 win...it was his first win since May 17, 2019 against Colorado and it snapped a career-high four-game losing streak...that began a four-start stretch where he went 3-1 with a 1.42 ERA and .232 opponents batting average through May 4...tossed 6.0 scoreless innings in his start against the Tigers and then blanked the Orioles over the first five innings on April 23 for a career-high 11.0 inning scoreless streak...won back-to-back starts on the 17th and 23rd, marking the second time in his career he put together consecutive wins (May 12-17, 2019)...allowed just one run in 11. innings in the two starts...lost on April 28 at Tampa Bay but then picked up his third win on May 4 against Toronto...had career highs in innings pitched (8.0), strikeouts (9) and pitches (102) against the Blue Jays...then went 0-4 with a 5.40 ERA and .284 opponents batting average over his next five starts...the losing streak matched his career high (also May 22, 2019-April 8, 2021)...left with a 4-1 lead on May 15 at Minnesota but the pen allowed four runs in the eighth inning for the blown save...it was the first of two times the pen blew a save in one of his starts (June 11 vs. Kansas City)...allowed a season-high five runs in an 8-4 loss to Houston on May 20...allowed a career-high 10 hits in 4.2 innings of work in a 4-3 loss to Seattle on May 25...went 1-4 with a 4.46 ERA in six starts in May...tied for second in the American League in losses in May.

LAST START: He had a no decision in the A's 4-3 win over Kansas City last Friday in Oakland...retired each of the first 10 batters that he faced and shut out the Royals on three hits over the first six innings...that extended his scoreless streak to a career-high tying 11.0 innings...had a 3-0 lead when he allowed a leadoff home run to Perez in the seventh...was relieved by Petit with no outs and runners on first and second in the seventh inning and Petit allowed one of those runs to score...Diekman allowed a run in the eighth inning for the blown save.

2020 RECAP: Had two stints with Philadelphia and was 0-1 with a 17.18 ERA in three relief appearances...opponents went 11-for-21 (.524) but he walked just one and struck out four in 3.2 innings...allowed a .438 (7-for-16) average against right-handed hitters compared to .800 (4-for-5) against left-handers...was 2-0 with a 4.50 ERA in four spring training appearances...was optioned to Lehigh Valley March 26 but was recalled on July 23 and was on the Phillies Opening Day roster...made his 2020 debut on July 26 against Miami and allowed four runs on five hits in an inning of relief and was the losing pitcher in an 11-6 decision...tossed a scoreless inning of relief Aug. 9 against Atlanta but was optioned to Philadelphia's alternate site on Aug. 9...was recalled for a second time Aug. 20, pitched the next day at Atlanta (1.2 ip, 4 h, 3 r, 3 er, 1 bb, 3 so) and was optioned Aug. 22...did not pitch the remainder of the season.

FRIDAY'S PROBABLE STARTING PITCHER
RHP James Kaprielian (3-1, 2.51 ERA): Was recalled from Triple-A Las Vegas May 12 and is scheduled to make his seventh start of the season and his career...has allowed two runs or fewer in five of his six starts and five hits or fewer in all six starts...has three wins, which are tied for sixth among American League rookies...has the fifth lowest ERA among AL rookies with 30 or more innings (2.51)...was the winning pitcher in his last start, an 11-2 A's win over Kansas City last Saturday here in Oakland (6.0 ip, 2 h, 0 r, 0 er, 4 bb, 7 so)...has never faced the Yankees in his career...was the Yankees first round draft pick in 2015 but pitched in just eight games over his first four years as a professional...missed most of 2016 with an elbow injury and then missed the entire 2017 and 2018 seasons following April 18, 2017 "Tommy John" surgery...was traded to the A's with Dustin Fowler and Jorge Mateo at the 2017 trading deadline for Sonny Gray.

- Was selected from Triple-A Las Vegas May 21 and has pitched five times with the A's (6.1 ip, 5 h, 2 bb, 3 so).
- Has faced the Angels twice this year, throwing two scoreless innings with two strikeouts and one walk...were his first career outings against Los Angeles-AL...spent seven seasons with the Angles appearing in 285 games...went 17-13 with nine saves and a 3.70 ERA across 277.2 innings pitched.
- Was a non-roster invitee with Cincinnati this spring and made the Reds Opening Day roster...compiled an 11.12 ERA in six relief appearances before he was designated for assignment on April 17...signed a minor league deal with Oakland on April 29 and was assigned to Las Vegas...had a save and did not allow a run in four games with the Aviators (5.0 ip, 2 h, 1 bb, 5 so).

Last Year: Compiled a 2.45 ERA and .196 opponents batting average in 11 relief appearances with the Angels...missed 25 games while on the injured list from Aug. 4-30 with a right adductor strain.

35 LHP JAKE DIEKMAN

Inherited Runners/Scored: 6/3 **First Hitters:** 4-25, 4 bb, hbp

- Has a save and a 2.38 ERA (3 er, 11.1 ip) over his last 11 games after going 2-0 with five saves, no blown saves and a 2.12 ERA over his first 17 contests...gave up three earned runs in 0.2 combined innings on May 15-16.
- Has yielded four home runs over his last 13 games and 12.0 innings after allowing six home runs over his previous 152 games and 126.1 innings from June 26, 2018 to May 12, 2021.
- Has held right-handed hitters to a .182 (12-for-66) average but they have hit all four of the home runs he has allowed.
- Has a 5.87 ERA (5 er in 7.2 ip) in eight outings on no days rest, a 1.31 ERA (3 er in 20.2 ip) in 20 appearances on one day of rest or more.
- Has faced the Angels three times this season, throwing 3.1 scoreless innings...owns a 2.00 ERA (6 er, 27.0 ip) in 30 career outings against Los Angeles-AL.
- Has six saves, which surpasses his career high of four with Texas in 2016.

Last Year: Allowed just two runs in 21 appearances and only one was earned for a 0.42 ERA...ranked second among Major League relievers in ERA and opponents slugging percentage (.157), fifth in batting average (.114) and seventh in OPS (.410)

- Pitched 2.1 scoreless innings May 31 in his 99th career appearance...it was his sixth outing this year of at least two innings and four of those have been scoreless.
- Has not allowed a run in his last three games (4.2 ip, 1 h, 1 bb, 5 so).
- Has a .167 opponents batting average, which breaks down to .054 (2-for-37) against left-handed hitters compared to .255 (12-for-47) against right-handers...has issued all nine of his walks and yielded both of his home runs to righties for a .773 OPS...has a .108 OPS against lefties, which is the lowest mark in the majors among pitchers who have faced at least 10 lefties.
- Opponents are 2-for-17 (.118) with runners in scoring position.
- Was selected from the A's alternate site April 8.

Last Year: Was on the Opening Day roster and appeared in nine games for Philadelphia in 2020 and went 1-3 with an 8.59 ERA (7 er in 7.1 ip)...struck out eight batters and walked two.

44 LHP JESUS LUZARDO
