OAKLAND ATHLETICS (43-27) VS. NEW YORK YANKEES (36-32)

FRIDAY, JUNE 18, 2021 — YANKEE STADIUM — 7:05 EDT

ABOUT THE A'S: Have a six-game winning streak, which is the longest active streak in the majors and the A's second longest winning streak this year (13, April 9-24)...have won eight of the last nine games and are a season-high 16 games over .500 at 43-27 (.614)...that is tied for the second best record in the American League, tied for third best in the majors and is the A's best record after 70 games since 1990 (45-25)...are in first place in the AL West for the 28th consecutive day and have held at least a share of first for 58 of the last 59 days...have a two-game lead over second place Houston, which is one-half game short of the season high of 2½ (most recently on June 16)...have spent 56 days alone in first place, two days tied for first, one day in second, one day tied for second, three days in third, two days in fourth, three days tied for fourth and 10 days in fifth.

A'S IN JUNE: The A's are 12-2 (.857) in June, which is the best record in the majors ahead of the Astros and Reds (both 11-4)...have a 3.17 ERA (44 er in 125.0 ip), which is third lowest in the American League...starters have a 2.56 ERA (24 er in 84.1 ip), which is second lowest in the majors (Nationals, 1.73)...are batting .275 (128-for-465) with 87 runs scored in 14 games (6.21 per game)...rank third in the AL in runs scored, OPS (.818) and batting...have out-scored the opposition 87-46 (+41) after being out-scored 242-231 (-11) in April and May.

OFF DAYS AND FIRST GAMES OF SERIES: The A's had their ninth off day of the season yesterday...are 8-0 following a day off and are the only undefeated team in the majors following a day off...have a 3.09 ERA (24 er in 70.0 ip) following a day off and are batting .252 (65-for-258) with 50 runs scored (6.3 runs per game)...overall, have a 15-7 record in the first game of a series.

HOME AND AWAY: The A's begin a 10-game road trip to New York-AL (three games), Texas (four games) and San Francisco (three games) tonight...it is the first of three 10-game road trips...went 4-2 on the last road trip to Seattle (2-1) and Colorado (2-1) and are 18-9 (.667) on the road, which is the second best road record in the majors (Red Sox, 22-10/.688)...the 27 road games are two fewer than any other team (Braves, 29)...are scheduled to play 36 of their next 52 games on the road...have won eight road series, lost none and split one...the season-opening streak of nine consecutive road series without a loss is the longest such streak in Athletics history (previous: won the first eight road series in 1988)...it matches the longest at any point during the season over the last 32 years (May 16-July 21, 2019)...the last time the A's had a 10-series unbeaten streak on the road was Sept. 5, 1988 to May 11, 1989...went 8-1 on the last homestand against Arizona (2-0), Kansas City (3-1) and Los Angeles-AL (3-0)...it was the first time the A's won eight games on a homestand since going 8-2 against Tampa Bay, Texas and Houston from Aug. 30 to Sept. 8, 2013...are 25-18 (.581) at home.

HOME AND AWAY SPLITS: The A's are batting .255 (238-for-932) with a .771 OPS on the road compared to .222 with a .707 OPS at home...have the second best road batting average and OPS in the majors to the Astros (.283/.804)...have the third lowest home batting average...have a 3.55 ERA (93 er in 235.2 ip) on the road, which is the lowest in the American League and fourth lowest in the majors.

IN THE PINCH: A's pinch hitters are 5-for-6 with a double, four RBI and a sacrifice fly in their last seven plate appearances dating back to June 6...lead the American League in hits (16), RBI (13), sacrifice flies (2) and plate appearances (61), are tied for the lead in home runs (2) and tied for second in extra base hits (4).

OFFENSE: The A's are hitting .305 (50-for-164) with 39 runs, 10 doubles and nine home runs over the last five games to boost their overall batting average to a season-high .236...lead the American League in hit by pitches (38), rank second in sacrifice flies (25), fourth in doubles (119), walks (252), extra base hits (217) and on-base percentage (.320) and fifth in home runs (88)...are hitting .359 (42-for-117) with runners in scoring position in June and are batting .269 (134-for-498) with RISP overall, which is third best in the AL.

PITCHING: The A's have compiled a 2.79 ERA (53 er in 170.2 ip) over the last 19 games...now have a 3.84 ERA for the season, which is fifth lowest in the American League...also have the fifth lowest opponents on-base percentage (.305) and OPS (.698)...have walked 185 batters, which matches the Yankees for the fewest in the AL...have the second fewest home runs (72) but the fifth most hits (593)...rank third in shutouts (7) and fewest pitches per inning (16.0).

STARTING PITCHING: Cole Irvin allowed four runs on Wednesday, snapping a streak of 10 consecutive games with two earned runs or fewer by A's starting pitchers...starters are now 9-2 with a 2.24 ERA (20 er in 80.1 ip) over the last 13 games and have allowed just five home runs...are 28-23 with a 3.78

ERA (166 er in 395.2 ip) for the season...rank second in the American League in wins and fourth in ERA...lead the majors in innings pitched (395.2) and are tied with the White Sox for the most complete games (3)...the complete games are the most by an A's team since 2015 (5).

BULLPEN: The A's bullpen converted 12-of-13 (92.3%) save opportunities and had a 3.50 ERA and .226 opponents batting average over the first 40 games through May 14...is 7-for-13 (53.8%) in save chances with a 4.67 ERA (46 er in 88.2 ip) and .257 (87-for-339) opponents average in 30 games since then...has the third best save percentage in the American League overall (73.1%, 19-for-26) and ranks fifth in saves...has the fewest losses in the majors (4)...has the fewest home runs in the AL (24), the second fewest walks (80), the fourth lowest opponents OPS (.680) and on-base percentage (.305) and the fifth lowest slugging percentage (.375)...has the highest slugging percentage against first batters faced in the AL (.467), the second highest batting average (.272) and fifth highest on-base percentage (.346).

DEFENSIVE DOINGS: The A's have not committed an error in the last five games, which is their second longest errorless streak this year (6, April 13-20)...have 34 errors for the season, which is third fewest in the American League...rank third in fewest double plays (49)...A's outfielders have five assists, which is tied for second fewest.

CLOSE CALLS: The A's are 26-11 (.703) in games decided by three runs or fewer, which is the best record in the majors...are 17-16 (.515) in games decided by four runs or more...are 12-7 (.632) in one-run games, which is the fifth best record in the American League...are tied with the Rockies for the most walk-off wins in the majors (6)...have one walk-off loss, which is tied with the Red Sox and Angels for the fewest in the AL...are 9-3 in games decided in the last at bat...are 2-1 in extra inning games and are now 8-2 in extra innings over the last two years.

TEAMMATES: The A's are the only team in the majors with four pitchers with 14 or more starts...have used just seven starting pitchers this year, which is tied with the White Sox for second fewest in the majors to the Red Sox (6)...are one of two teams with four pitchers with six or more wins (Dodgers)...are one of three teams with two pitchers with six or more saves (Indians, Giants).

THIS AND THAT: The A's are 27-14 (.659) in night games compared to 16-13 (.552) during the day...are tied with the Yankees and White Sox for the best record at night in the majors...are 18-9 (.667) in games in which the opponent starts a left-handed pitcher compared to 25-18 (.581) when they start a right-hander...the mark against lefties is second best in the AL...are 31-9 (.775) when scoring first, which is second best in the AL...have used 67 different lineups over the first 70 games.

A's vs. YANKEES: The A's and Yankees meet for the first time since Sept. 1, 2019, a span of 656 days...the A's won the season series in 2019, 4-2...went 3-0 in Oakland and 1-2 in New York...it was their fifth season series win in seven seasons...are 28-17 (.622) dating back to 2013, which is the best record by an American League team against the Yankees over that stretch...have won 11 of the last 16 games but have dropped six of the last eight in New York...have won nine of the last 10 games and 21 of the last 28 in Oakland...since moving to Oakland in 1968, the A's are 254-283 against the Yankees...that includes 141-128 in Oakland and 113-155 in New York...are 16-24 at Yankee Stadium...all-time, the A's are 795-1149 against the Yankees/Orioles.

TODAY'S TIDBITS

Mark Canha leads the majors in hit by pitches (13) and is tied for second in the American League in runs scored (51)...**Sean Murphy** has 33 RBI as a catcher, which are the most among Major League catchers...**Matt Olson** ranks second in the AL in OPS (.981), third in home runs (18) and slugging (.603), tied for fourth in extra base hits (34) and sacrifice flies (5) and tied for fifth in RBI (49)...**Lou Trivino** not allowed a run in seven games in June (7.1 ip) and has not allowed an earned run over his last 15 games dating back to May 8 (15.2 ip, 2 r).

THIS DATE IN ATHLETICS HISTORY

In **1984** Davey Lopes hits an inside-the park home run in the A's 10-2 win over the Kansas City Royals...in **1993** the A's overcome a then club record eight-run deficit to defeat the Kansas City Royals 10-9...trailing 8-0 entering the bottom of the second, the A's score twice in the second and six times in the fifth before Craig Paquette's two-run seventh inning homer puts the A's ahead for good...in **1996** Mark McGwire homers in the fifth inning of the A's 8-5 win at Detroit to extend his Oakland record streak of consecutive games reaching base to 62.

TODAY'S STARTING PITCHER: James Kaprielian (3-1, 2.51 ERA)

FOR STARTERS: Was recalled from Triple-A Las Vegas May 12 and is scheduled to make his seventh start of the season and his career...has allowed two runs or fewer in five of his six starts and five hits or fewer in all six starts...however, has walked three or more four times...has three wins, which are tied for seventh among American League rookies...has the fifth lowest ERA among AL rookies with 30 or more innings (2.51).

OPPONENTS BATTING: Has held the opposition to a .188 (22-for-117) batting average but has walked 16 batters in 32.1 innings (4.45 walks per nine innings)...the batting average breaks down to .131 (8-for-61) with a .463 OPS against right-handed hitters compared to .250 (14-for-56) with an .802 OPS against left-handed hitters...opponents are 3-for-26 (.115) with runners in scoring position...has a .128 (6-for-47) opponents average the first time through the lineup, .295 (13-for-44) the second time and .115 (3-for-26) after that.

HOME AND AWAY: Is 1-1 with a 4.19 ERA (9 er in 19.1 ip) and .243 (18-for-74) opponents batting average in four starts on the road compared to 2-0 with a 0.00 ERA (0 er in 13.0 ip) and .093 (4-for-43) opponents average in two starts at home...has surrendered all three of his home runs on the road.

FIRST START: He earned his first Major League win in his first career start in the A's 4-1 victory at Boston on May 12...allowed a Gonzalez double, a Verdugo walk and a Martinez RBI single to the first three batters he faced...that would be the only run he would allow in five innings of work as he blanked the Red Sox on two hits and a walk over his final four innings.

SECOND START: He had a no decision in the A's 8-4 win at Los Angeles (AL) on May 21...Oakland scored once in the third and he allowed a solo home run to Iglesias in the bottom of the third...the A's then scored twice in the top of the sixth and he struck out the first two batters in the bottom of the sixth before allowing a solo home run to Walsh...was relieved by Petit following the home run with the A's leading 3-2 and Petit allowed a run for the blown save.

THIRD START: He was the winning pitcher in the A's 6-3 win over Seattle on May 26 in Oakland...did not allow a run in 7.0 innings, which matched his longest outing as a professional...also tossed 7.0 innings for Single-A Tampa at Charlotte on April 16, 2016, his second professional appearance...allowed two hits and two walks against the Mariners...retired each of the first eight batters and each of the final 10.

FOURTH START: He had a no decision in the A's 6-5, 10-inning loss at Seattle on May 31...had a 1-0 lead when he allowed four runs in the fourth inning...surrendered a three-run home run to Walton and a RBI double to Lewis...was relieved by Guerra with two outs in the fourth and a runner on second...Oakland scored once in the fifth and twice in the eighth to get him off the hook.

FIFTH START: He was charged with the first loss of his career in a 3-1 decision at Colorado June 6...allowed a RBI single to Tapia in the third inning and a sacrifice fly to Rodgers in the fourth...those were the only two runs he would allow in five innings of work but Marquez limited the A's to a run in six innings of work.

LAST START: He was the winning pitcher in the A's 11-2 win over Kansas City last Saturday in Oakland...did not allow a run in six innings of work and held the Royals to two hits while walking four...loaded the bases with two outs in the third inning and one out in the fourth inning...retired each of the final eight batters he faced and was relieved by Luzardo to start the seventh inning with the A's leading 6-0.

the losing pitcher in an 8-1 loss to Sacramento...allowed a RBI single to Thairo Estrada in the third...was relieved by Matt Blackham in the fifth inning with a runner on third and two outs and the Aviators trailing 1-0...Blackham allowed that runner to score plus one of his own.

2020 RECAP: Made his Major League debut and had two relief appearances over five stints with Oakland...compiled a 7.36 ERA and .267 opponents batting average...allowed two home runs in 3.2 innings, walked two and struck out four...was recalled for the first time Aug. 4 but did not pitch before he was optioned back to the A's alternate site on Aug. 6...joined the club a second time Aug. 16 and made his ML debut that day at San Francisco (2.0 ip, 1 h, 1 r, 1 er, 1 bb, 1 so)...relieved Fiers to start the seventh inning with the A's leading 13-2 and allowed a home run to the first batter he faced (Crawford)...walked the next batter (Dubon) before retiring each of the final six batters he faced...struck out Solano to end the seventh inning for his first strikeout...was optioned on Aug. 19...was recalled as the 29th man for doubleheaders on Sept. 8 and Sept. 14 but did not pitch...recalled for his fifth stint on Sept. 24 and made one appearance in the second game of the Sept. 26 doubleheader against Seattle (1.2 ip, 3 h, 2 r, 2 er, 1 bb, 3 so)...inherited a bases loaded situation in the third inning with the A's trailing 4-1 and allowed all three runs to score...was on the Taxi Squad for the postseason...was rated as the A's number 10 prospect by *Baseball America* following the season..

CAREER NOTES: Made his Major League debut with Oakland in 2020 after pitching in just 27 games over his first five professional seasons due to elbow problems...compiled a 7.36 ERA and .267 opponents batting average in two relief appearances with the A's...is 6-6 with a 3.00 ERA (34 er in 102.0 ip) in 28 games, including 23 starts, as a minor leaguer...has 116 strikeouts in 102.0 innings (10.24 per nine innings)...was the New York Yankees first round draft pick in 2015 but pitched in just eight games over his first four years as a professional...missed most of 2016 with an elbow injury and then missed the entire 2017 and 2018 seasons following April 18, 2017 "Tommy John" surgery...was traded to the A's at the 2017 trading deadline in the Sonny Gray deal and is the last remaining player from that deal that also netted the A's Dustin Fowler and Jorge Mateo...pitched for Scottsdale in the Arizona Fall League in 2016...was rated by *Baseball America* as the Yankees No. 4 prospect following the 2015 season and No. 5 following 2016...was the A's No. 8 prospect after the 2017 season and No. 10 following 2020.

TOMORROW'S PROBABLE STARTING PITCHER

RHP Chris Bassitt (7-2, 3.43 ERA): Lost each of his first two starts this year but is 7-0 with a 3.11 ERA and .203 opponents batting average in 12 starts since then...the winning streak is a career high and it matches teammate Yusmeiro Petit for the longest in the American League this year...is tied for third in the AL in wins (7), tied for fourth in winning percentage (.778) ranks sixth in OPS (.631) and innings pitched (86.2), seventh in strikeouts (91) and opponents slugging (.352), eighth in ERA (3.43) and ninth in opponents batting average (.215)...is 4-0 with a 3.98 ERA in seven starts on the road...has allowed four runs or fewer in each of his 25 starts over the last two years and is 12-4 with a 2.95 ERA over that span...was the winning pitcher in his last start, a 6-3 A's win over Kansas City last Sunday in Oakland (5.2 ip, 5 h, 2 r, 2 er, 3 bb, 5 so)...is scheduled to make the 94th appearance and 81st start of his career tomorrow but it will be the first time he has faced the Yankees.

- Is 0-1 with a save, three blown saves, a 4.50 ERA (6 er in 12.0 ip) and four home runs allowed in his last 13 games dating back to May 15...was 2-0, converted each of his five save opportunities, had a 2.12 ERA and allowed no home runs over his first 17 games (17.0 ip).
- Is tied for 10th among American League relievers in strikeouts (38).
- Has held right-handed hitters to a .182 (12-for-66) average but they have hit all four of the home runs he has allowed.
- Has a 5.87 ERA (5 er in 7.2 ip) and .313 (10-for-32) opponents batting average in eight outings on no days rest, a 1.31 ERA (3 er in 20.2 ip) and .127 (9-for-71) opponents average in 21 appearances on one day of rest or more.

- Pitched 2.1 scoreless innings May 31 in his 99th career appearance...it was his sixth outing this year of at least two innings and four of those have been scoreless...has not pitched since then.
- Has not allowed a run in his last three games (4.2 ip, 1 h, 1 bb, 5 so).
- Ranks sixth among American League relievers in opponents OPS (.495), seventh in on-base percentage (.245) and eighth in batting average (.167) and slugging percentage (.250).
- His opponents batting average breaks down to .054 (2-for-37) against left-handed hitters compared to .255 (12-for-47) against right-handers... has issued all nine of his walks and yielded both of his home runs to righties for a .773 OPS...has a .108 OPS against lefties, which is the lowest mark in the majors among pitchers who have faced at least 20 lefties.
