OAKLAND ATHLETICS (44-27) VS. NEW YORK YANKEES (36-33)

SATURDAY, JUNE 19, 2021 — YANKEE STADIUM — 1:05 EDT

ABOUT THE A'S: Have a seven-game winning streak, which is the longest active streak in the majors and the A's second longest winning streak this year (13, April 9-24)...have won nine of the last 10 games and are a season-high 17 games over .500 at 44-27 (.620)...that is the best record in the American League, second best in the majors and is the A's best record after 71 games...are in first place in the AL West for the 29th consecutive day and have held at least a share of first for 59 of the last 60 days...have a two-game lead over second place Houston, which is one-half game short of the season high of 2½ (most recently on June 16)...have spent 57 days alone in first place, two days tied for first, one day in second, one day tied for second, three days in third, two days in fourth, three days tied for fourth and 10 days in fifth.

A'S IN JUNE: The A's are 13-2 (.867) in June, which is the best record in the majors ahead of the Astros (12-4)...have a 3.16 ERA (47 er in 134.0 ip), which is second lowest in the American League...starters have a 2.70 ERA (27 er in 90.0 ip), which is third lowest in the majors and the lowest in the American League...are batting .273 (137-for-501) with 91 runs scored in 15 games (6.07 per game)...rank third in the AL in runs scored, OPS (.814) and batting...have out-scored the opposition 92-49 (+43) after being out-scored 242-231 (-11) in April and May.

OFF DAYS AND FIRST GAMES OF SERIES: The A's had their ninth off day of the season on Thursday...with yesterday's win, are now 9-0 following a day off and are the only undefeated team in the majors following a day off...have a 3.08 ERA (27 er in 79.0 ip) following a day off and are batting .252 (74-for-294) with 55 runs scored (6.11 runs per game)...overall, have a 16-7 record in the first game of a series.

HOME AND AWAY: The A's continue a 10-game road trip to New York-AL (1-0), Texas (four games) and San Francisco (three games) tonight...it is the first of three 10-game road trips...went 4-2 on the last road trip to Seattle (2-1) and Colorado (2-1) and are 19-9 (.679) on the road, which is the best road record in the majors...the 28 road games are one fewer than any other team (Braves, 29)...are scheduled to play 35 of their next 51 games on the road...have won eight road series, lost none and split one...the season-opening streak of nine consecutive road series without a loss is the longest such streak in Athletics history (previous: won the first eight road series in 1988)...it matches the longest at any point during the season over the last 32 years (May 16-July 21, 2019)...the last time the A's had a 10-series unbeaten streak on the road was Sept. 5, 1988 to May 11, 1989...went 8-1 on the last homestand against Arizona (2-0), Kansas City (3-1) and Los Angeles-AL (3-0)...it was the first time the A's won eight games on a homestand since going 8-2 against Tampa Bay, Texas and Houston from Aug. 30 to Sept. 8, 2013...are 25-18 (.581) at home.

HOME AND AWAY SPLITS: The A's are batting .255 (247-for-968) with a .770 OPS on the road compared to .222 with a .707 OPS at home...have the second best road batting average and OPS in the majors to the Astros (.283/.804)...have the fourth lowest home batting average...have a 3.53 ERA (96 er in 244.2 ip) on the road, which is the lowest in the American League and fourth lowest in the majors.

IN THE PINCH: A's pinch hitters are 5-for-7 with a double, four RBI and a sacrifice fly in their last eight plate appearances dating back to June 6...lead the American League in hits (16), RBI (13), sacrifice flies (2), and plate appearances (62), are tied for the lead in home runs (2) and tied for second in extra base hits (4).

OFFENSE: The A's are hitting .295 (59-for-200) with 44 runs, 11 doubles and 11 home runs over the last six games to boost their overall batting average to a season-high .236...lead the American League in hit by pitches (40), rank second in sacrifice flies (25), fourth in walks (253) and on-base percentage (.319), fifth in doubles (120), extra base hits (220) and fifth in home runs (90)...are hitting .358 (44-for-123) with runners in scoring position in June and are batting .270 (136-for-504) with RISP overall, which is second best in the AL.

PITCHING: The A's have compiled a 2.81 ERA (56 er in 179.2 ip) over the last 20 games...now have a 3.83 ERA for the season, which is fifth lowest in the American League...also have the fifth lowest opponents on-base percentage (.304) and OPS (.696)...have walked 187 batters, which is second to the Yankees (186) for the fewest in the AL...have allowed the second fewest home runs (74) but the fifth most hits (597)...rank third in shutouts (7) and fewest pitches per inning (16.0).

STARTING PITCHING: Cole Irvin allowed four runs on Wednesday, snapping a streak of 10 consecutive games with two earned runs or fewer by A's starting

pitchers...James Kaprielian got the win, allowing three earned runs in 5.2 IP yesterday...starters are now 10-2 with a 2.41 ERA (23 er in 86.0 ip) over the last 14 games and have allowed just seven home runs...are 29-23 with a 3.79 ERA (169 er in 401.1 ip) for the season...rank second in the American League in wins and fourth in ERA...lead the majors in innings pitched (401.1) and are tied with the White Sox for the most complete games (3)...the complete games are the most by an A's team since 2015 (5).

BULLPEN: The A's bullpen converted 12-of-13 (92.3%) save opportunities and had a 3.50 ERA and .226 opponents batting average over the first 40 games through May 14...is 8-for-14 (57.1%) in save chances with a 4.50 ERA (46 er in 92.0 ip) in 31 games since then...has the third best save percentage in the American League overall (73.1%, 19-for-26) and ranks tied for third in saves...has the fewest losses in the majors (4)...has the fewest home runs in the AL (24), the second fewest walks (81), the fourth lowest opponents OPS (.676), third lowest on-base percentage (.304) and the fifth lowest slugging percentage (.372).

DEFENSIVE DOINGS: The A's have not committed an error in the last six games, which matches their longest errorless streak this year (6, April 13-20)...have 34 errors for the season, which is third fewest in the American League...rank third in fewest double plays (50)...A's outfielders have five assists, which is tied for second fewest.

CLOSE CALLS: The A's are 27-11 (.711) in games decided by three runs or fewer, which is the best record in the majors...are 17-16 (.515) in games decided by four runs or more...are 12-7 (.632) in one-run games, which is the fifth best record in the American League...are tied with the Rockies for the most walk-off wins in the majors (6)...have one walk-off loss, which is tied with the Red Sox and Angels for the fewest in the AL...are 9-3 in games decided in the last at bat...are 2-1 in extra inning games and are now 8-2 in extra innings over the last two years.

TEAMMATES: The A's are the only team in the majors with four pitchers with 14 or more starts...have used just seven starting pitchers this year, which is tied with the White Sox for second fewest in the majors to the Red Sox (6)...are one of two teams with four pitchers with six or more wins (Dodgers)...are one of three teams with two pitchers with six or more saves (Indians, Giants).

THIS AND THAT: The A's are 28-14 (.667) in night games compared to 16-13 (.552) during the day...have the best record at night in the Majors...are 18-9 (.667) in games in which the opponent starts a left-handed pitcher compared to 26-18 (.591) when they start a right-hander...the mark against lefties is second best in the AL...are 32-9 (.780) when scoring first, which is second best in the AL...have used 68 different lineups over the first 71 games.

A's vs. YANKEES: The A's and Yankees meet for the first time since Sept. 1, 2019, a span of 656 days...the A's won the first game of the three-game set, 5-3...the A's won the season series in 2019, 4-2...went 3-0 in Oakland and 1-2 in New York...it was their fifth season series win in seven seasons...are 29-17 (.630) dating back to 2013, which is the best record by an American League team against the Yankees over that stretch...have won 12 of the last 17 games but have dropped six of the last nine in New York...have won nine of the last 10 games and 21 of the last 28 in Oakland...since moving to Oakland in 1968, the A's are 255-283 against the Yankees...that includes 141-128 in Oakland and 114-155 in New York...are 17-24 at Yankee Stadium...all-time, the A's are 796-1149 against the Yankees/Orioles.

TODAY'S TIDBITS

Mark Canha leads the majors in hit by pitches (13) and is tied for second in the American League in runs scored (51)...**Sean Murphy** has 33 RBI as a catcher, which are the most among Major League catchers...**Matt Olson** ranks third in the AL in OPS (.982), third in home runs (19) and slugging (.607), tied for third in extra base hits (35) and sacrifice flies (5) and tied for fourth in RBI (50)...**Lou Trivino** not allowed a run in eight games in June (8.1 ip) and has not allowed an earned run over his last 16 games dating back to May 8 (15.2 ip, 2 r).

THIS DATE IN ATHLETICS HISTORY

In **1979** Wayne Gross, Dave Revering and Mike Heath hit consecutive homers in the fourth inning of the A's 6-5 win against Kansas City...Gross, Mike Edwards and Revering also turn a triple play, the second of the A's major league recording tying three triple plays in 1979...in **2003** Miguel Tejada ties an Oakland record with five hits as the A's defeat Texas, 9-2.

TODAY'S STARTING PITCHER: Chris Bassitt (7-2, 3.43 ERA)

SEVEN-GAME WINNING STREAK: Lost each of his first two starts this year but is 7-0 with a 3.11 ERA (26 er in 75.1 ip) and .203 (56-for-275) opponents batting average in 12 starts since then...the winning streak is a career high and it matches teammate Yusmeiro Petit for the longest in the American League this year...has left with the lead in two of his five no decisions only to have the bullpen blow the save...the A's are 11-3 (.786) in his starting assignments.

AMONG THE LEADERS: Is tied for third in the American League in wins (7), tied for fourth in winning percentage (.778) ranks sixth in innings pitched (86.2), seventh in strikeouts (91), eighth in OPS (.631), opponents slugging (.352) and strikeout-to-walk ratio (4.33), 10th in ERA (3.43) and 11th in opponents batting average (.215)...has allowed eight home runs and his average of 0.83 home runs per nine innings is seventh lowest...is tied for the AL lead in hit by pitches (9) and ranks seventh in fewest pitches per inning (15.0)...is scheduled to make his 15th start today, which will tie him for the AL lead.

FOUR RUNS OR FEWER: Has allowed four runs or fewer in each of his 25 starts over the last two years and is 12-4 with a 2.95 ERA (49 er in 149.2 ip) over that span...has a streak of 25 consecutive games with four runs or fewer and 3.0 innings pitched or more, which ties Vida Blue (April 9-July 30, 1971) for the longest such streak in Athletics history...has not allowed more than four runs in a start since yielding seven runs in his final start of 2019 (Sept. 13 at Texas).

HOME AND AWAY: Is 4-0 with a 3.98 ERA (18 er in 40.2 ip) in seven starts on the road compared to 3-2 with a 2.93 ERA (15 er in 46.0 ip) in seven starts home...is tied for fifth in the American League in road wins...now has a five-game winning streak on the road dating back to Sept. 12, 2020 and has not lost on the road since Aug. 29, 2020 at Houston...has a 12-12 career record in the Coliseum, but has a 2.53 ERA (66 er in 234.1 ip), which is fifth lowest in Coliseum history among pitchers with 200 or more innings pitched.

OPPONENTS BATTING: Has held left-handed hitters to a .196 (33-for-168) batting average...however, has surrendered seven of his eight home runs this year and 25 of 35 over the last three years to lefties...six of his eight home runs this year have come with the bases empty...has a .126 opponents batting average with two strikes, which is sixth lowest in the American League.

DAYS REST: Is scheduled to start on five days rest today...is 4-0 with a 2.79 ERA (12 er in 38.2 ip) in six starts on exactly five days rest and now has a nine-game winning streak in those games dating back to July 19, 2019...has a 2.79 ERA (26 er in 84.0 ip) in 14 starts over that span...according to TruMedia, the longest winning streak in starts on five days rest in Oakland history is 10 by Mike Fiers (May 7-Aug. 27, 2019) and Mark Mulder (June 18, 2002-July 10, 2003)...is 2-1 with a 4.04 ERA (16 er in 35.2 ip) and six home runs in six starts on four days rest this year compared to 5-0 with a 2.76 ERA (14 er in 45.2 ip) and two home runs in seven starts on five days rest or more.

AGAINST THE EAST: Is 2-0 with a 2.77 ERA (8 er in 26.0 ip) and .219 (21-for-96) opponents batting average against American League East teams this year and 3-0 with a 2.13 ERA (11 er in 38.2 ip) and .184 (26-for-141) opponents average in six starts over the last three years.

THE LAST THREE YEARS: Is 22-9 (.710) with a 3.37 ERA (110 er in 293.2 ip) in 53 games (50 starts) over the last three years...based on a minimum of 250 innings pitched, he ranks fourth in the American League in ERA over that span, second in winning percentage and fifth in opponents OPS (.670)...is eighth in wins...the A's are 34-16 (.680) in his starting assignments over the last three years...was 4-14 (.222) with a 3.86 ERA in 40 games (30 starts) over his first four seasons.

2021 HIGHLIGHTS: Was the A's Opening Day starting pitcher and took the loss in an 8-1 decision to Houston on April 1 in Oakland...became the A's 14th different Opening Day starting pitcher over the last 16 years (Zito, Haren, Blanton, Braden, Sheets, Cahill, McCarthy, Anderson, Gray twice, Hill, Graveman twice, Fiers, Montas)...allowed a run in the fourth inning to snap a 16.2-inning scoreless streak during the regular season and a 27.1-inning home scoreless streak, which was ninth longest in Oakland history...lost his second start on April 6, a 5-1 loss to Los Angeles (NL) on April 6 in Oakland when he allowed a season-high four runs on a season-high nine hits in 6.0 innings...allowed two home runs in the third, which were his first home runs in the Coliseum since Aug. 24, 2019...that snapped a 10-game, 55.1-inning, 229-batter homerless streak in Oakland...that ran his record to 0-2 with a 5.56 ERA...then allowed exactly two runs in each of his next six starts to become the second pitcher in Athletic history to allow exactly two runs in six consecutive games...joins Bob Davis of the Kansas City A's, who did it all

in relief from Aug. 8-26, 1960...went 3-0 with a 2.92 ERA over that stretch which ran from April 12 to May 11...allowed just two hits in 5.0 innings for the win on April 12 at Arizona but walked a season-high five batters...tied an Oakland record with three hit batters April 29 at Tampa Bay (12th time, last: Fiers, June 22, 2019, also against Tampa Bay)...left his start on May 5 against Toronto with a 3-2 lead but ended up win a no decision in the A's 9-4 loss...Trivino allowed five runs in the eighth inning for the blown save...it was the first of two times he left with a lead only to have the bullpen blow the save (also May 16 at Minnesota)...struck out a season-high 10 batters in a 3-2 win at Boston on May 11...it was his third career game of 10 or more strikeouts...did not walk a batter, the second time he has fanned 10 or more without issuing a free pass...is one of nine pitchers in Oakland history with two such games...allowed a season-high tying four runs in a no decision at Minnesota on May 16...tossed his first career complete game and shutout May 27 against Los Angeles (AL), a two-hitter in the A's 5-0 win...had a season-high 114 pitches, struck out nine and walked one...it came in his 77th career start, his 72nd with the A's...the 71 consecutive starts without a complete games is the second longest streak in Athletics history (113, Barry Zito, Aug. 22, 2003-Sept. 28, 2006)...finished May with a 3-0 record, a 2.52 ERA and .175 opponents batting average in five starts...struck out 38 and walked just four in 35.2 innings...allowed a season-high tying four runs in a season-low 4.0 innings June 1 at Seattle but had a no decision in the A's 12-6 win.

LAST START: He was the winning pitcher in the A's 6-3 win over Kansas City last Sunday in Oakland...the A's scored once in the first but he allowed a RBI single to Lopez in the second...Oakland then scored twice in the bottom of the second to give him the lead for good...allowed a solo home run to Benintendi in the third and was relieved by Petit with two outs in the sixth inning and the A's leading 5-2.

2020 RECAP: Spent the entire season on the active roster for the first time in his six-year career and went 5-2 with a 2.29 ERA in 11 starts...his ERA ranked second among pitchers in the West divisions (Lamet, SD 2.09) and sixth in the majors...it was fifth lowest in Oakland history among pitchers with at least 10 starts...also tied for fifth in the West divisions in winning percentage (.714), ranked seventh in opponents OPS (.659), batting average (.233) and slugging percentage (.371), tied for seventh in wins and eighth in on-base percentage (.288)...had career lows in ERA and opponents on-base percentage...walked 17 batters in 63.0 innings for a career-low 2.43 walks per nine innings...struck out 55 for a career-best 3.24 strikeout-to-walk ratio.
