OAKLAND ATHLETICS (44-28) VS. NEW YORK YANKEES (37-33)

SUNDAY, JUNE 20, 2021 — YANKEE STADIUM — 1:05 EDT

ABOUT THE A'S: Yesterday's loss snapped a seven-game A's winning streak, which was the longest active streak in the majors and the A's second longest winning streak this year (13, April 9-24)...have won nine of the last 11 games and are 16 games over .500 at 44-28 (.611)...is one game shy of their season-high of 17 games over .500 (44-27)...they have the best record in the American League, third best in the majors...are in first place in the AL West for the 30th consecutive day and have held at least a share of first for 60 of the last 61 days...have a one-game lead over second place Houston, which is 1.5 games short of the season high of 2½ (most recently on June 16)...have spent 58 days alone in first place, two days tied for first, one day in second, one day tied for second, three days in third, two days in fourth, three days tied for fourth and 10 days in fifth.

A'S IN JUNE: The A's are 13-3 (.813) in June, which is the best record in the majors ahead of the Astros (13-4)...have a 3.42 ERA (54 er in 142.0 ip), which is third lowest in the American League...starters have a 2.72 ERA (29 er in 96.0 ip), which is third lowest in the majors and the lowest in the American League...are batting .273 (147-for-538) with 97 runs scored in 16 games (6.06 per game)...rank third in the AL in runs scored, OPS (.811) and batting... have out-scored the opposition 97-56 (+41) after being out-scored 242-231 (-11) in April and May.

OFF DAYS AND FIRST GAMES OF SERIES: The A's had their ninth off day of the season on Thursday...with Friday's win, are now 9-0 following a day off and are the only undefeated team in the majors following a day off...have a 3.08 ERA (27 er in 79.0 ip) following a day off and are batting .252 (74-for-294) with 55 runs scored (6.11 runs per game)...overall, have a 16-7 record in the first game of a series.

HOME AND AWAY: The A's continue a 10-game road trip to New York-AL (1-1), Texas (four games) and San Francisco (three games) tonight...it is the first of three 10-game road trips...went 4-2 on the last road trip to Seattle (2-1) and Colorado (2-1) and are 19-10 (.655) on the road, which is the second best road record in the majors (Baton Rouge, .676)...the 29 road games are tied with the Braves for fewest in the Majors...are scheduled to play 34 of their next 50 games on the road...have won eight road series, lost none and split one...the season-opening streak of nine consecutive road series without a loss is the longest such streak in Athletics history (previous: won the first eight road series in 1988)...it matches the longest at any point during the season over the last 32 years (May 16-July 21, 2019)...the last time the A's had a 10-series unbeaten streak on the road was Sept. 5, 1988 to May 11, 1989...went 8-1 on the last homestand against Arizona (2-0), Kansas City (3-1) and Los Angeles-AL (3-0)...it was the first time the A's won eight games on a homestand since going 8-2 against Tampa Bay, Texas and Houston from Aug. 30 to Sept. 8, 2013...are 25-18 (.581) at home.

HOME AND AWAY SPLITS: The A's are batting .256 (257-for-1005) with a .771 OPS on the road compared to .222 with a .707 OPS at home...have the second best road batting average and OPS in the majors to the Astros (.283/.804)... have the third lowest home batting average...have a 3.67 ERA (103 er in 252.2 ip) on the road, which is the lowest in the American League and fourth lowest in the majors.

IN THE PINCH: A's pinch hitters are 5-for-9 with a double, four RBI and a sacrifice fly in their last 10 plate appearances dating back to June 6...lead the American League in hits (16), RBI (13), sacrifice flies (2), and plate appearances (64), are tied for second in home runs (2), and tied for second in extra base hits (4).

OFFENSE: The A's are hitting .291 (69-for-237) with 49 runs, 11 doubles and 13 home runs over the last seven games to boost their overall batting average to a season-high .237...lead the American League in hit by pitches (40), rank second in sacrifice flies (25), fourth in walks (257), fifth in on-base percentage (.319), doubles (120), extra base hits (222), and home runs (92)... are hitting .346 (46-for-133) with runners in scoring position in June and are batting .268 (138-for-514) with RISP overall, which is fourth best in the AL.

PITCHING: The A's have compiled a 3.02 ERA (63 er in 187.2 ip) over the last 21 games...now have a 3.88 ERA for the season, which is fifth lowest in the American League...also have the fifth lowest opponents on-base percentage (.306) and OPS (.700)...have walked 192 batters, which is second to the Yankees (190) for the fewest in the AL...are tied for the second fewest home runs allowed (74) but the fifth most hits (608)...rank third in shutouts (7) and fewest pitches per inning (16.0).

STARTING PITCHING: Chris Bassitt received a no-decision yesterday, allowing just two runs over 6.0 innings pitched with seven strikeouts and two walks...starters are now 10-2 with a 2.45 ERA (25 er in 92.0 ip) over the last 15 games and have allowed just eight home runs...are 29-23 with a 3.78 ERA (171 er in 407.1 ip) for the season...lead the majors in innings pitched (407.1) and are tied with the White Sox for the most complete games (3)...the complete games are the most by an A's team since 2015 (5).

BULLPEN: The A's bullpen converted 12-of-13 (92.3%) save opportunities and had a 3.50 ERA and .226 opponents batting average over the first 40 games through May 14...is 8-for-15 (53.3%) in save chances with a 4.88 ERA (51 er in 94.0 ip) in 32 games since then...ranks tied for third in the AL in saves...has the fewest home runs in the AL (25), the second fewest walks (84), the fifth lowest opponents OPS (.687), fourth lowest on-base percentage (.308) and the sixth lowest slugging percentage (.378).

DEFENSIVE DOINGS: The A's have not committed an error in the last seven games, which is their longest errorless streak this year...have 34 errors for the season, which is third fewest in the American League...rank tied for third in fewest double plays (51)...A's outfielders have five assists, which is tied for second fewest.

CLOSE CALLS: The A's are 27-12 (.692) in games decided by three runs or fewer, which is the best record in the majors...are 17-16 (.515) in games decided by four runs or more...are 12-7 (.632) in one-run games, which is the fifth best record in the American League...are tied with the Rockies for the most walk-off wins in the majors (6)...have one walk-off loss, which is tied with the Red Sox and Angels for the fewest in the AL...are 9-3 in games decided in the last at bat...are 2-1 in extra inning games and are now 8-2 in extra innings over the last two years.

THIS AND THAT: The A's are 28-14 (.667) in night games compared to 16-14 (.533) during the day...have the best record at night in the Majors...are 18-9 (.667) in games in which the opponent starts a left-handed pitcher compared to 26-19 (.578) when they start a right-hander...the mark against lefties is second best in the AL...are 32-10 (.762) when scoring first...have used 69 different lineups over the first 72 games.

A's vs. YANKEES: The A's and Yankees meet for the first time since Sept. 1, 2019, a span of 656 days...the A's won the first game of the three-game set, 5-3 then dropped game two yesterday, 7-5...the A's won the season series in 2019, 4-2...went 3-0 in Oakland and 1-2 in New York...it was their fifth season series win in seven seasons...are 29-18 (.617) dating back to 2013, which is the best record by an American League team against the Yankees over that stretch...have won 12 of the last 18 games but have dropped seven of the last 10 in New York...have won nine of the last 10 games and 21 of the last 28 in Oakland...since moving to Oakland in 1968, the A's are 255-284 against the Yankees...that includes 141-128 in Oakland and 114-156 in New York...are 17-25 at Yankee Stadium...all-time, the A's are 796-1150 against the Yankees/Orioles.

TODAY'S TIDBITS

Mark Canha leads the majors in hit by pitches (13) and is tied for second in the American League in runs scored (53)...**Sean Murphy** has 33 RBI as a catcher, which are the most among Major League catchers...**Matt Olson** ranks third in the AL in OPS (.986), third in home runs (19) and slugging (.607), fourth in extra base hits (35), and tied for fourth in sacrifice flies (5) and RBI (52)...**Lou Trivino** not allowed a run in eight games in June (8.1 ip) and has not allowed an earned run over his last 16 games dating back to May 8 (15.2 ip, 2 r)...since May 25, **Elvis Andrus** is hitting .329 with a .833 OPS and two steals, seven walks, 11 runs, nine doubles, and eight RBI...is tied with Billy Hamilton for the most career stolen bases among active players (310).

THIS DATE IN ATHLETICS HISTORY

In **1932** Roger Cramer ties an American League record by collecting six hits in six at bats in a nine inning game...in **1972** Catfish Hunter pitches all 11 innings of the A's 3-2 win over Detroit...Joe Rudi has three hits including the game winning homer to lead off the bottom of the 11th...in **1990** Terry Steinbach drives in six runs on a grand slam and a two-run single as the A's defeat the Tigers at Detroit, 12-7...in **2002** Billy Koch records the save in a 5-3 win at Pittsburgh, giving him the save in all three games of the three-game series against Pittsburgh.

TODAY'S STARTING PITCHER: Sean Manaea (6-2, 2.99 ERA)

ONE RUN OR FEWER: Has allowed one run or fewer in each of his last five starts and is 3-0 with a 0.84 ERA (3 er in 32.1 ip) and .214 (25-for-117) opponents batting average over that span...is the first A's pitcher with five consecutive games of one run or fewer and five innings pitched or more since Trevor Cahill (April 17-May 9, 2011)...the longest such streak in Oakland history is six by Cory Lidle from Aug. 4-31, 2002...has allowed one run or fewer in nine of his 14 starts this year, including no runs three times.

AMONG THE LEADERS: Ranks eighth in the American League in ERA (2.99), tied for seventh in winning percentage (.750) and 11th in opponents slugging percentage (.375)...has allowed just eight home runs in 81.1 innings and his average of 0.89 home runs per nine innings is sixth lowest...is one of two pitchers in the majors with two shutouts (DeSclafani, SF) and one of three with two complete games (Marquez, COL and DeSclafani, SF)...is the first A's pitcher with two complete games in a season since Kendall Graveman in 2016 (2) and the first with two shutouts since Sonny Gray in 2015 (2)...has three of the A's seven complete games and shutouts over the last four years.

DON'T WALK: Has walked two batters or fewer in 12 of his 14 starts, including five starts with one walk and three with no walks...has walked just 19 batters in 81.1 innings and his average of 2.10 walks per nine innings is ninth lowest in the American League...over the last four years, he has walked two batters or fewer in 51 of his 57 starts (17 with no walks, 22 with one)...has 66 walks in 325.2 innings over that span, an average of 1.82 per nine innings.

IN JUNE: Is 3-0 with a 0.44 ERA (20.2 ip, 15 h, 1 r, 1 er, 5 bb, 16 so) in three starts in June...is now 7-0 with a 1.86 ERA (12 er in 58.0 ip) over his last nine starts in June and has not lost in the month since June 21, 2017...is 11-2 with a 2.72 ERA (32 er in 106.0 ip) in 17 career starts in June...the wins are his most in any month and the ERA is second lowest to his 2.17 in September.

LEFT AND RIGHT: Left-handed hitters are 2-for-28 (.071) against him over his last five starts and are batting .127 (10-for-79) for the season, which is second lowest in the American League (Montgomery, NYY .115)...has a .301 (71-for-236) mark against right-handers, which is third highest...has a .415 OPS against lefties (third lowest), .760 against righties.

SUPPORT: Has six no decisions, which is tied for sixth most in the American League...has allowed just one run in four of the no decisions...has received one run of support in three of his no decisions and the bullpen blew the save in one other no decision...the A's are 5-1 in his no decisions and are 11-3 (.786) in his starting assignments...are 22-8 (.733) when he starts over the last three years...has received one run of support or fewer in five of his 14 starts and is 0-2 in those starts...is 6-0 in nine starts with two runs of support or more.

DAYS REST: Is scheduled to start on five days rest...is 3-0 with a 1.37 ERA (8 er in 52.2 ip) in eight starts on four days rest compared to 2-1 with a 7.00 ERA (14 er in 18.0 ip) in four starts on five days rest...over the last three years, he is 7-1 with a 2.43 ERA (25 er in 92.2 ip) in 16 starts on four days rest, 3-2 with a 6.11 ERA (19 er in 28.0 ip) in six starts on five days rest.

INNING BY INNING: Has a 4.50 ERA (14 er in 28.0 ip) over the first two innings of his two starts, a 2.77 ERA (8 er in 26.0 ip) in innings three and four and a 1.64 ERA (5 er in 27.1 ip) from the fifth inning on.

2021 HIGHLIGHTS: Allowed five runs on six hits and a season-high three walks in 4.2 innings for the loss in his first start on April 4 against Houston...then went 3-0 with a 1.50 ERA over his next four starts...picked up his first win of the season in the 100th game of his career, an 8-4 victory over Detroit on April 15...tossed a six-hit, seven-inning shutout in the A's 7-0 win over Minnesota in the first game of the doubleheader April 20...it was the 11th complete game shutout of fewer than eight innings in Oakland history (last: Mike Minor, Sept. 14, 2020 at Seattle)...it was his second career complete game and shutout, with the first being his no-hitter on April 21, 2018 against Boston...the start was the 100th of his career and he became the 25th pitcher in Oakland history to make 100 starts...went 0-1 with a 6.64 ERA and .326 opponents batting average over a four-start stretch from May 2 to 18...struck out a career-high tying 10 batters on May 7 against Tampa Bay, but had a no decision in the A's 2-1 win...it was his fourth career 10-strikeout game, his first since Sept. 8, 2019 against Detroit...retired each of the first 18 batters he faced before walking Arozarena to start the seventh...then retired the next three before Brosseau led off the eighth inning with a double...allowed a season-high seven runs on a season-high 10 hits in a season-low 2.0 innings for the loss at Boston on May 13...has allowed seven or more runs in a start three times in his career, all at Fenway Park (8 on May 10, 2016; 7 on Sept. 12, 2017)...also allowed 10 hits in his next start on May 18 against Houston to become the first A's pitcher to yield 10 hits in back-to-back starts since Kendall Graveman in 2016 (April 25-May 2)...is 3-0 with a 0.84 ERA (3 er in 32.1 ip) and .214 (25-for-117) opponents batting average in five starts since then...had a no decision in the A's 6-5 loss at Los Angeles (AL) on May

23...left with a 4-1 lead but the bullpen blew the save...struck out Justin Upton to lead off the game for the 50,000 strikeout in Oakland history...fanned Taylor Ward to end the fourth inning for his 500th career strikeout...walked a season-high tying three batters May 28 against Los Angeles (AL)...finished May 0-1 with a 4.78 ERA and .300 opponents batting average in six starts...is now 5-9 with a 5.51 ERA in 21 career starts in May and the ERA is his highest for any month (5.22 in August)...tossed a four-hit shutout in the A's 6-0 win at Seattle on June 2...it was his third career complete game and shutout, his second this year...logged a season-high 111 pitches, which are his most in a game over the last four years...tossed 111 pitches in his next start on June 9 against Arizona when he combined with Petit, Trivino and Diekmann on a two-hit shutout in the A's 4-0 win...it was the second time in his career he did not allow a run in back-to-back starts (Sept. 14-20, 2016).

LAST START: He won his third consecutive start in the A's 8-5 win over Los Angeles (AL) last Monday in Oakland...allowed just one run in 5.2 innings but yielded nine hits...retired the side in order just once...allowed his only run on a Lagares one-out home run in the second innings...that snapped his scoreless streak at a career-high 16.0 innings (previous: 15.1, Aug. 29 to Sept. 26, 2016).

MANAEA vs. NEW YORK: Is 1-1 with a 3.65 ERA (24.2 ip, 19 h, 10 r, 10 er, 8 bb, 24 so, 2 hr) in four career starts...is 1-0 with a 0.00 ERA (0 er in 12.0 ip) in two starts in Yankee Stadium and 0-1 with a 7.11 ERA (4 er in 12.2 ip) in two starts in Oakland...had a no decision in his only start in 2019, a 5-4 A's loss at New York (AL) on Sept. 1...tossed five scoreless innings and allowed just one hit while walking three...retired each of the first nine batters before LeMahieu singled to lead off the fourth...was relieved by Petit to start the bottom of the sixth with the score tied 0-0.

2020 RECAP: Went 4-3 with a 4.50 ERA in 11 starts...the ERA was the highest of his career as was his .270 opponents batting average...his .427 slugging percentage matched his high...went 4-1 with a 2.65 ERA and .234 opponents batting average over his final six starts dating back to Aug. 20...the wins tied for fourth most in the majors over that span...went 0-2 with a 7.65 ERA and .325 opponents average over his first five starts...tied for the team lead in starts...walked just eight batters in 54.0 innings, an average of 1.33 walks per nine innings...that was the lowest mark of his career and was sixth lowest in the majors among pitchers with 50 or more innings pitched...struck out 45 for a career-best 5.63 strikeout-to-walk ratio...had five starts without a walk, five with one and three in his other.

TOMORROW'S PROBABLE STARTING PITCHER

RHP Frankie Montas (7-6, 4.21 ERA): Is 3-4 with a 3.07 ERA over his last seven starts after going 4-2 with a 5.50 ERA over his first seven starts...his seven wins are tied for third in the American League but his six losses are tied for 10th most...is scheduled to make his 15th start of the season tomorrow but just his fifth on the road...is 3-1 with a 3.13 ERA in four starts on the road compared to 4-5 with a 4.67 ERA in 10 starts at home...has a .195 opponents batting average the first time through the order, .331 the second time and .256 with six of his 11 home runs after that...was the winning pitcher in his last start, a 6-5 A's win over Los Angeles (AL) last Tuesday in Oakland (7.0 ip, 5 h, 2 r, 2 er, 1 bb, 8 so)...is 2-1 with a 4.10 ERA (26.1 ip, 32 h, 14 r, 12 er, 9 bb, 31 so, 4 hr) in seven career appearances, including four starts, against the Rangers...was the losing pitcher in his only start last year, a 6-3 A's loss at Texas on Sept. 13 (5.1 ip, 7 h, 4 r, 4 er, 1 bb, 7 so).

- Opponents are 2-for-16 (.125) with runners in scoring position, including 0-for-6 with the A's.
- Faced the Yankees twice in 2019 while pitching for the Angels (2.0 ip, 1 bb, 4 so)...has a 0.87 ERA (10.1 ip, 5 h, 1 r, 1 er, 4 bb, 14 so) in 11 career appearances against New York, including one start as an opener.
