OAKLAND ATHLETICS (44-29) VS. TEXAS RANGERS (25-46)

MONDAY, JUNE 21, 2021 — GLOBE LIFE FIELD — 5:05 CDT

ABOUT THE A'S: Yesterday's loss clinched Oakland's first road series loss of the season...have won nine of the last 12 games and are 15 games over .500 at 44-29 (.603)...is two games shy of their season-high of 17 games over .500 (44-27)...they are percentage points behind Houston (43-28, .606) for the best record in the American League...are tied for first place in the AL West for the 31st consecutive day and have held at least a share of first for 61 of the last 62 days...are zero games behind Houston but have played two more games, so the A's .603 winning percentage is slightly behind Houston's .606... have spent 58 days alone in first place, three days tied for first, one day in second, one day tied for second, three days in third, two days in fourth, three days tied for fourth and 10 days in fifth.

A'S IN JUNE: The A's are 13-4 (.765) in June, which is the second best record in the majors behind the Astros (14-4)...have a 3.36 ERA (56 er in 150.0 ip), which is second lowest in the American League (HOU, 2.87)...starters have a 2.75 ERA (31 er in 101.1 ip), which is third lowest in the majors and the lowest in the American League...are batting .266 (151-for-567) with 98 runs scored in 17 games (5.76 per game)...rank third in the AL in runs scored, OPS (.799) and are fourth in batting...are middle of the pack in hits (151, ninth) but are third in walks (62)...have out-scored the opposition 98-58 (+40) after being out-scored 242-231 (-11) in April and May.

OFF DAYS AND FIRST GAMES OF SERIES: The A's had their ninth off day of the season on Thursday...with Friday's win, are now 9-0 following a day off and are the only undefeated team in the majors following a day off...have a 3.08 ERA (27 er in 79.0 ip) following a day off and are batting .252 (74-for-294) with 55 runs scored (6.11 runs per game)...overall, have a 16-7 record in the first game of a series.

HOME AND AWAY: The A's continue a 10-game road trip to New York-AL (1-2), Texas (four games) and San Francisco (three games) tonight...it is the first of three 10-game road trips...went 4-2 on the last road trip to Seattle (2-1) and Colorado (2-1) and are 19-11 (.633) on the road, which is the second best road record in the majors (Baton Rouge, .657)...the 30 road games are second to the Braves (29) for fewest in the Majors...are scheduled to play 33 of their next 49 games on the road...have won eight road series, lost one and split one...lost their first road series of the year over the weekend, snapping a season-opening streak of nine consecutive road series without a loss which was the longest such streak in Athletics history (previous: won the first eight road series in 1988)...it matched the longest at any point during the season over the last 32 years (May 16-July 21, 2019)...the last time the A's had a 10-series unbeaten streak on the road was Sept. 5, 1988 to May 11, 1989...went 8-1 on the last homestand against Arizona (2-0), Kansas City (3-1) and Los Angeles-AL (3-0)...it was the first time the A's won eight games on a homestand since going 8-2 against Tampa Bay, Texas and Houston from Aug. 30 to Sept. 8, 2013...are 25-18 (.581) at home.

HOME AND AWAY SPLITS: The A's are batting .252 (261-for-1034) with a .765 OPS on the road compared to .222 with a .707 OPS at home...have the second best road OPS and the fourth best road batting average in the majors to the Astros (.283/.804)...have the third lowest home batting average...have a 3.63 ERA (105 er in 260.2 ip) on the road, which is the lowest in the American League and fourth lowest in the majors.

IN THE PINCH: A's pinch hitters are 5-for-1 with a double, four RBI and a sacrifice fly in their last 12 plate appearances dating back to June 6...lead the American League in hits (16), RBI (13), sacrifice flies (2), and plate appearances (66), are tied for second in home runs (2), and tied for second in extra base hits (4).

OFFENSE: The A's are hitting .274 (73-for-266) with 50 runs, 11 doubles and 14 home runs over the last eight games to boost their overall batting average to .236...lead the American League in hit by pitches (40), rank second in sacrifice flies (25), fourth in walks (262), fifth in on-base percentage (.319), extra base hits (224), and home runs (93)...are hitting .329 (46-for-140) with runners in scoring position in June and are batting .265 (138-for-521) with RISP overall, which is fifth best in the AL.

PITCHING: The A's have compiled a 2.99 ERA (65 er in 195.2 ip) over the last 22 games...now have a 3.86 ERA for the season, which is fifth lowest in the American League...also have the fifth lowest opponents on-base percentage (.304) and OPS (.697)...have walked 194 batters, which is the fewest in the AL...have the second fewest home runs allowed (76) but the fifth most hits allowed (611)...rank third in shutouts (7) and fewest pitches per inning (16.0).

STARTING PITCHING: Sean Manaea took a no-decision yesterday after allowing just two earned runs in 5.1 innings pitched, allowing three hits and two walks with a career-high 11 strikeouts...starters are now 10-2 with a 2.50 ERA (27 er in 97.1 ip) over the last 16 games and have allowed just eight home runs...are 29-23 with a 3.77 ERA (173 er in 412.2 ip) for the season...lead the majors in innings pitched (412.2) and are tied with the White Sox for the most complete games (3)...the complete games are the most by an A's team since 2015 (5).

BULLPEN: The A's bullpen converted 12-of-13 (92.3%) save opportunities and had a 3.50 ERA and .226 opponents batting average over the first 40 games through May 14...is 8-for-15 (53.3%) in save chances with a 4.80 ERA (51 er in 95.2 ip) in 33 games since then...ranks tied for fourth in the AL in saves...has the fewest home runs in the AL (25), the second fewest walks (84), the fourth lowest opponents OPS (.681), third lowest on-base percentage (.306) and the fifth lowest slugging percentage (.375).

DEFENSIVE DOINGS: The A's have not committed an error in the last eight games, which is their longest errorless streak this year...have 34 errors for the season, which is third fewest in the American League...rank third in fewest double plays (51)...A's outfielders have five assists, which is tied for the fewest.

CLOSE CALLS: The A's are 27-13 (.675) in games decided by three runs or fewer...are 17-16 (.515) in games decided by four or more...are 12-8 (.600) in one-run games...are tied with the Rockies for the most walk-off wins in the majors (6)...have one walk-off loss, which is tied with the Red Sox and Angels for the fewest in the AL...are 9-4 in games decided in the last at bat...are 2-1 in extra inning games and are now 8-2 in extra innings over the last two years.

THIS AND THAT: The A's are 28-14 (.667) in night games compared to 16-15 (.516) during the day...have the best record at night in the Majors...are 18-10 (.643) in games in which the opponent starts a left-handed pitcher compared to 26-19 (.578) when they start a right-hander...are 32-11 (.744) when scoring first...have used 70 different lineups over the first 73 games.

A'S vs. RANGERS: The A's meet the Rangers for the first time this year in game 74 for the A's...have already finished the season series with Baltimore, Minnesota and Tampa Bay and have played 10 of their 19 scheduled games against both Los Angeles and Seattle...are scheduled to play Texas 10 times over the next 19 games...won the season series last year, 7-3...it was their fourth consecutive season series victory over the Rangers, which is just the second time the A's have won four consecutive season series against Texas (2002-05)...went 4-3 in Arlington last year and 3-0 in Oakland...have won 14 of the last 18 games and are 29-10 over the last 39 contests...have won eight of the last 11 games and 14 of the last 20 in Texas...have won seven of the last eight and 25 of the last 31 in Oakland...are 44-23 (.657) against the Rangers over the previous four years...are 385-376 all-time against the Texas Rangers...that breaks down to 203-176 in Oakland and 182-200 in Texas...are 4-3 at Globe Life Field...went 111-109 at Globe Life Park, which was the second best record by a visiting American League team (Yankees, 57-48, .543)...have an all-time record of 482-458 against the Rangers/Senators franchise.

TODAY'S TIDBITS

Mark Canha leads the majors in hit by pitches (13) and is tied for third in the American League in runs scored (53)...**Sean Murphy** has 33 RBI as a catcher, which are tied for the most among Major League catchers...**Matt Olson** ranks third in the AL in OPS (.998), third in home runs (20) and slugging (.617), tied for fourth in extra base hits (36), sacrifice flies (5) and RBI (53)...**Lou Trivino** not allowed a run in eight games in June (8.1 ip) and has not allowed an earned run over his last 16 games dating back to May 8 (15.2 ip, 2 r)...since May 25, **Elvis Andrus** is hitting .316 with an .802 OPS, two steals, seven walks, 11 runs, nine doubles, and eight RBI...is tied with Billy Hamilton for the most career stolen bases among active players (310).

THIS DATE IN ATHLETICS HISTORY

In **1971** Vida Blue improves his record to 15-2 and strikes out 13 as the A's defeat the Twins at Minnesota, 3-2...in **1989** Rickey Henderson returns to Oakland when the A's send Greg Cadaret, Eric Plunk and Luis Polonia to the Yankees...in **2000** Eric Chavez becomes the first player to hit for the cycle in the Coliseum as the A's defeat Baltimore, 10-3...at the age of 22 years, 197 days, Chavez becomes the eighth youngest player in major league history to hit for the cycle...in **2002** Billy Koch records the save in the A's 5-3 win at Cincinnati, making him the first pitcher in Oakland history with five saves in five consecutive team games.

TODAY'S STARTING PITCHER: Frankie Montas (7-6, 4.21 ERA)

FOR STARTERS: Is 3-4 with a 3.07 ERA (14 er in 41.0 ip) over his last seven starts after going 4-2 with a 5.50 ERA over his first seven starts...his seven wins are tied for third in the American League but his six losses are tied for 10th most...the six losses are a career high as are his 41 runs and 11 home runs...the seven wins are second only to his nine in 2019.

HOME AND AWAY: Is scheduled to make his 15th start of the season today but just his fifth on the road...is 3-1 with a 3.13 ERA (8 er in 23.0 ip) in four starts on the road compared to 4-5 with a 4.67 ERA (28 er in 54.0 ip) in 10 starts at home...is tied for second in the American League in losses at home and is tied for the lead in starts at home...last year, he went 1-4 with a 10.13 ERA in five starts on the road, 2-1 with a 2.56 ERA in six starts at home.

OPPONENTS BATTING: Has a .195 (22-for-113) opponents batting average the first time through the order, .331 (40-for-121) the second time and .256 (20-for-78) with six of his 11 home runs after that...has a .363 (29-for-80) opponents batting average against the opponents one and two hitters but has held the three, four and five hitters to a .207 (23-for-111) average.

INNING BY INNING: Has a 2.89 ERA (9 er in 28.0 ip) over the first two innings of his starts...has yielded 14 of his 41 runs in the third inning for a 9.22 ERA (14 er in 13.2 ip) and .394 (26-for-66) opponents batting average...has allowed just one run in the fourth inning (13.0 ip, 0.69 ERA) and opponents are 7-for-47 (.149)

THIS AND THAT: Has walked one batter or fewer in each of his last four starts and nine of 14 for the season...has not allowed a home run in his last four starts after surrendering 11 over his first 10...tossed six innings or fewer in each of his first 12 starts but has logged more than six innings in each of his last two...the A's are 8-6 (.571) in his starting assignments.

2021 HIGHLIGHTS: Took the loss in his first start on April 5 against Los Angeles (NL)...allowed a season-high seven runs in a season-low 2.2 innings and walked a season-high three batters...tossed 90 pitches, which were the most by an A's pitcher in an outing of fewer than three innings since pitch counts were tracked beginning in 1988...the loss extended his losing streak to a career-high three games dating back to Sept. 13, 2020...then picked up the win in each of his next two starts and allowed just one run on eight hits in 12.0 innings...won 7-3 at Houston on April 10 and then combined with Romo, Diekmann and Wendelken on a four-hit shutout in the A's 3-0 victory over Detroit on April 16...allowed six runs on a season-high nine hits in 4.0 innings against Minnesota on April 21 but had a no decision in the A's 13-12, 10-inning win...allowed three home runs in a start for the second time in his career (Sept. 22, 2020 vs. Los Angeles-NL)...had a season-high 105 pitches in a 4-3 loss at Tampa Bay on April 27...finished April 2-2 with a 6.20 ERA in five starts...then went 3-3 with a 3.18 ERA in six starts in May...the three wins matched his most ever in a month and he had 38 strikeouts, which tied for eighth in the American League...won each of his first three starts in May and posted a 3.12 ERA over that stretch from May 3-14...then went 0-3 with a 3.24 ERA over his next three starts from May 19-29...the losing streak matched his career high...struck out 11 batters in 6.0 innings in a 4-2 loss to Seattle on May 24...it was his fourth career games of 10 or more strikeouts and the second highest single-game total of his career to his 13 against the Mariners in the final game of the 2020 season...walked a season-high tying three.

LAST START: He was the winning pitcher in the A's 6-4 win over Los Angeles (AL) last Tuesday in Oakland...tossed a season-high 7.0 innings...allowed a RBI single to Upton in the third inning but the A's came back with two in the bottom of the third...yielded a RBI single to Fletcher in the fifth to tie the game at 2-2 but the A's scored three times in the sixth to take the lead for good...was relieved by Luzardo to start the eighth with the A's leading 5-2.

MONTAS vs. TEXAS: Is 2-1 with a 4.10 ERA (26.1 ip, 32 h, 14 r, 12 er, 9 bb, 31 so, 4 hr) in seven career appearances, including four starts...is 1-0 with a 2.74 ERA (3 er in 7.2 ip) in two games in Oakland and 0-1 with a 6.75 ERA (4 er in 5.1 ip) in one start at Globe Life Field...was 1-0 with a 3.38 ERA (5 er in 13.1 ip) in four games at Globe Life Park...was the losing pitcher in his only start last year, a 6-3 A's loss at Texas on Sept. 13...Oakland scored a run in the first and he allowed a solo home run to Dietrich in the second...Tejeda followed with a double but he then retired 12 of the next 13 batters...the scored was tied 1-1 when he allowed a three-run home run to Odor in the sixth for the loss.

2020 RECAP: Was off to a strong start as he was 2-1 with a 1.57 ERA, .175 opponents batting average and no home runs over his first four starts...was scratched from his scheduled start on Aug. 14 at San Francisco with upper back tightness and went 1-4 with an 8.70 ERA, .321 opponents average and 10 home runs over his final seven starts...went 3-5 with a 5.60 ERA in 11 starts overall...his ERA was eighth highest in the majors among pitchers with at least 50 innings pitched...had career highs in losses (5) and earned runs (33) and matched his high in home runs (10), runs (35) and walks (23)...led the A's in strikeouts (60), losses, runs, home runs and walks...his opponents batting average broke down to .198 (22-for-111) against right-handed hitters compared to .350 (35-for-100) against left-handers...surrendered six of his 10 home runs and issued 15 of his 23 walks to lefties for a 1.061 OPS (.572 against right-handers)...had a .306 opponents batting average the first time through the lineup, .264 the second time and .205 after that...allowed a .133 average with two strikes...was 2-1 with a 2.56 ERA and .225 opponents batting average in six starts in Oakland, 1-4 with a 10.13 ERA and .330 opponents average in five starts on the road...surrendered just two home runs in 31.2 innings in Oakland compared to eight in 21.1 innings on the road...made eight of his 11 starts during the day, which tied for the most in the majors...was 2-4 with a 6.16 ERA during the day, 1-1 with a 4.20 ERA at night...the A's were 6-5 (.545) in his starting assignments...had two starts of seven innings and five starts of fewer than five innings...went 2-2 with a 2.83 ERA in six starts on four days rest, 1-3 with an 11.00 ERA in five starts on five days rest or more...received two runs of support or fewer in nine of his 11 starts...had 10 of his 28 runs of support in one start on Aug. 3 at Seattle and had a 4.75 RSA for the season...won both of his starts with support of three or more runs and is now 18-1 in 22 career starts with at least three runs of support.

TOMORROW'S PROBABLE STARTING PITCHER
