## OAKLAND ATHLETICS (44-30) VS. TEXAS RANGERS (26-46)

**ABOUT THE A'S:** The A's lost last night, 8-3 for their third loss in a row which is their longest road losing streak of the season...despite the losing streak, they have won nine of the last 13 games and are 14 games over .500 at 44-30 (.595)...is three games shy of their season-high of 17 games over .500 (44-27)...they are one game behind Houston (44-28, .611) for the best record in the American League...have fallen out of first place in AL West, snapping a streak of 31st consecutive days in first...have held at least a share of first for 61 of the last 63 days...have spent 58 days alone in first place, three days tied for first, two days in second, one day tied for second, three days in third, two days in fourth, three days tied for fourth and 10 days in fifth.

**A'S IN JUNE:** The A's are 13-5 (.722) in June, which is the second best record in the Majors behind only the Astros (15-4, .789)...have a 3.65 ERA (64 er in 158.0 ip), which is third lowest in the American League...starters have a 3.28 ERA (39 er in 107.0 ip), which is sixth lowest in the majors and second lowest in the American League...are batting .263 (158-for-601) with 101 runs scored in 18 games (5.61 per game)...rank third in the AL in runs scored, and are fourth in OPS (.791) and batting...are middle of the pack in hits (158, eighth) but are tied for second in walks (67)...have out-scored the opposition 101-66 (+35) after being out-scored 242-231 (-11) in April and May.

**OFF DAYS AND FIRST GAMES OF SERIES:** The A's had their ninth off day of the season on Thursday...with Friday's win, are now 9-0 following a day off and are the only undefeated team in the majors following a day off...have a 3.08 ERA (27 er in 79.0 ip) following a day off and are batting .252 (74-for-294) with 55 runs scored (6.11 runs per game)...overall, have a 16-8 record in the first game of a series.

**HOME AND AWAY:** The A's continue a 10-game road trip to New York-AL (1-2), Texas (0-1) and San Francisco (three games) tonight...it is the first of three 10-game road trips...went 4-2 on the last road trip to Seattle (2-1) and Colorado (2-1) and are 19-12 (.613) on the road, which is the second best road record in the majors (Boton, .657)...the 31 road games are tied for second to the Nationals (30) for fewest in the Majors...are scheduled to play 32 of their next 47 games on the road...have won eight road series, lost one and split one...lost their first road series of the year over the weekend, snapping a season-opening streak of nine consecutive road series without a loss which was the longest such streak in Athletics history (previous: won the first eight road series in 1988)...it matched the longest at any point during the season over the last 32 years (May 16-July 21, 2019)...the last time the A's had a 10-series unbeaten streak on the road was Sept. 5, 1988 to May 11, 1989...went 8-1 on the last homestand against Arizona (2-0), Kansas City (3-1) and Los Angeles-AL (3-0)...it was the first time the A's won eight games on a homestand since going 8-2 against Tampa Bay, Texas and Houston from Aug. 30 to Sept. 8, 2013...are 25-18 (.581) at home.

**HOME AND AWAY SPLITS:** The A's are batting .251 (268-for-1068) with a .762 OPS on the road compared to .222 with a .707 OPS at home...have the second best road OPS and the fifth best road batting average in the majors to the Astros (.285/.809)...have the third lowest home batting average...have a 3.79 ERA (113 er in 268.2 ip) on the road, which is the second lowest in the American League and sixth lowest in the majors.

**IN THE PINCH:** A's pinch hitters are 5-for-13 with a double, four RBI and a sacrifice fly in their last 14 plate appearances dating back to June 6...lead the American League in hits (16), RBI (13), sacrifice flies (2), and plate appearances (68), are tied for second in home runs (2), and tied for second in extra base hits (4).

**OFFENSE:** The A's are hitting .267 (80-for-300) with 53 runs, 13 doubles and 15 home runs over the last nine games to boost their overall batting average to .235...lead the American League in hit by pitches (40), rank second in sacrifice flies (25), fourth in walks (267), fifth in on-base percentage (.319), extra base hits (227), and home runs (94)...are hitting .324 (48-for-148) with runners in scoring position in June and are batting .265 (140-for-529) with RISP overall, which is fifth best in the AL.

**PITCHING:** The A's have compiled a 3.23 ERA (73 er in 203.2 ip) over the last 23 games...now have a 3.92 ERA for the season, which is fifth lowest in the American League...also have the fifth lowest opponents on-base percentage (.305) and OPS (.700)...have walked 197 batters, which is second fewest in the AL...have the third fewest home runs allowed (78) but the fifth most hits allowed (621)...rank third in shutouts (7) and fewest pitches per inning (16.0).

**STARTING PITCHING:** Frankie Montas took the loss yesterday, allowing eight earned runs in 5.2 innings pitched...gave up five in the first, none in innings

two through five, then three in the sixth...starters are now 10-3 with a 3.05 ERA (35 er in 103.0 ip) over the last 17 games and have allowed just 10 home runs...are 29-24 with a 3.89 ERA (181 er in 418.2 ip) for the season...lead the majors in innings pitched (418.2) and are tied with the White Sox for the most complete games (3)...the complete games are the most by an A's team since 2015 (5).

**BULLPEN:** The A's bullpen converted 12-of-13 (92.3%) save opportunities and had a 3.50 ERA and .226 opponents batting average over the first 40 games through May 14...is 8-for-15 (53.3%) in save chances with a 4.68 ERA (51 er in 98.0 ip) in 34 games since then...ranks tied for fourth in the AL in saves...has the fewest home runs in the AL (25), the second fewest walks (85), the fourth lowest opponents OPS (.678), third lowest on-base percentage (.305) and the fifth lowest slugging percentage (.373).

**DEFENSIVE DOINGS:** The A's have not committed an error in the last nine games, which is their longest errorless streak this year...have 34 errors for the season, which is third fewest in the American League...rank third in fewest double plays (52)...A's outfielders have five assists, which is tied for the fewest.

**CLOSE CALLS:** The A's are 27-13 (.675) in games decided by three runs or fewer...are 17-17 (.500) in games decided by four or more...are 12-8 (.600) in one-run games...are tied with the Rockies for the most walk-off wins in the majors (6)...have one walk-off loss, which is tied with the Red Sox and Angels for the fewest in the AL...are 9-4 in games decided in the last at bat...are 2-1 in extra inning games and are now 8-2 in extra innings over the last two years.

**THIS AND THAT:** The A's are 28-15 (.651) in night games compared to 16-15 (.516) during the day...have the best record at night in the Majors...are 18-10 (.643) in games in which the opponent starts a left-handed pitcher compared to 26-20 (.565) when they start a right-hander...are 32-11 (.744) when scoring first...have used 71 different lineups over the first 73 games.

**A's vs. RANGERS:** The A's dropped game one of this four-game series last night, 8-3...Oakland is meeting the Rangers for the first time this year...have already finished the season series with Baltimore, Minnesota and Tampa Bay and have played 10 of their 19 scheduled games against both Los Angeles and Seattle...are scheduled to play Texas 9 times over the next 18 games...won the season series last year, 7-3...it was their fourth consecutive season series victory over the Rangers, which is just the second time the A's have won four consecutive season series against Texas (2002-05)...went 4-3 in Arlington last year and 3-0 in Oakland...have won 14 of the last 19 games and are 29-11 over the last 40 contests...have won eight of the last 12 games and 14 of the last 21 in Texas...have won seven of the last eight and 25 of the last 31 in Oakland...are 44-23 (.657) against the Rangers over the previous four years...are 385-377 all-time against the Texas Rangers...that breaks down to 203-176 in Oakland and 182-201 in Texas...are 4-4 at Globe Life Field...went 111-109 at Globe Life Park, which was the second best record by a visiting American League team (Yankees, 57-48, .543)...have an all-time record of 482-459 against the Rangers/Senators franchise.

### TODAY'S TIDBITS

**Matt Olson** has reached base safely in a career-high 20 consecutive games, dating back to May 30, and is batting .413 (31-for-75) with a .477 on-base percentage over that span...ranks third in the AL in OPS (.997), third in home runs (20) and slugging (.615), tied for third in extra base hits (37), tied for fourth in sacrifice flies (5) and RBI (53)...**Mark Canha** leads the majors in hit by pitches (13) and is fourth in the American League in runs scored (53)...**Sean Murphy** has 34 RBI as a catcher, which are the most among Major League catchers...**Lou Trivino** not allowed a run in eight games in June (8.1 ip) and has not allowed an earned run over his last 16 games dating back to May 8 (15.2 ip, 2 r)...since May 25, **Elvis Andrus** is hitting .301 (25-for-83) with an .765 OPS, two steals, seven walks, 11 runs, nine doubles, and eight RBI...is tied with Billy Hamilton for the most career stolen bases among active players (310).

### THIS DATE IN ATHLETICS HISTORY

In **1969** Sal Bando, Ted Kubiak and Reggie Jackson all hit solo homers in the third inning of the A's 7-3 win against Minnesota in the first game of a doubleheader...it is the first three-homer inning in Oakland history...in **1979**, twelve days after Jim Essian's inside-the-park Grand Slam, Larry Murray hits an inside-the-park home run in the A's 6-5 win over the Texas Rangers.

## TODAY'S STARTING PITCHER: Cole Irvin (4-7, 3.89 ERA)

**FOR STARTERS:** Is 1-3 with a 4.50 ERA (19 er in 33.1 ip) and .324 (45-for-139) opponents batting average over his last six starts after going 3-4 with a 3.02 ERA and .235 opponents average over his first eight starts...has seven losses, which is tied for fourth most in the American League.

**DON'T WALK:** Has walked two batters or fewer in each of his 14 starts, including eight starts with one walk and three starts with no walks...has issued just 14 free passes in 81.0 innings and his average of 1.56 walks per nine innings is third lowest in the American League...is averaging the third fewest strikeouts per nine innings (6.22), but ranks 13th in strikeout-to-walk ratio (4.00)...has walked one batter or fewer in 13 of his 17 career starts and has walked just 28 batters in 126.1 career innings (1.99 per nine innings).

**HOME AND AWAY:** Is 2-2 with a 2.76 ERA (9 er in 29.1 ip) in five starts on the road compared to 2-5 with a 4.53 ERA (26 er in 51.2 ip) in nine starts at home compared to...has the sixth lowest road ERA in the American League and is tied for second in home losses.

**DAYS REST:** Is scheduled to start on five days rest today...is 4-0 with a 1.18 ERA (5 er in 38.0 ip) and .227 (32-for-141) opponents batting average in six starts on five days rest or more compared to 0-6 with a 6.05 ERA (26 er in 38.2 ip) and .302 (49-for-162) opponents average in seven starts on four days rest.

**LEFT AND RIGHT:** Has allowed a .256 (61-for-238) batting average against right-handed hitters compared to .321 (27-for-84) against left-handers...the mark against lefties is second highest in the American League (Foltynewicz, TEX .336) and his .849 OPS is fourth highest...however, has issued 13 of his 14 walks to righties...his career splits are .258 (94-for-364) with a .716 OPS against right-handers, .355 (50-for-141) with a .919 OPS against lefties

**AGAINST THE WEST:** Is 0-5 with a 7.26 ERA (25 er in 31.0 ip) and .333 (45-for-135) opponents batting average in six starts against American League West competition, 4-2 with a 1.80 ERA (10 er in 50.0 ip) and .230 (43-for-187) opponents average in six starts against everyone else.

**THIS AND THAT:** Is averaging 14.6 pitches per nine innings, which is eighth fewest in the American League...seven of the nine home runs he has allowed have been solo shots...is 4-1 in seven starts with more than two runs of support, 0-6 in six starts with support of two runs or fewer...has allowed one run or fewer in five of his 14 starts...the A's are 6-8 (.429) in his starting assignments.

**2021 HIGHLIGHTS:** Was on the A's Opening Day roster and lost each of his first two starts, allowing four runs in each contest for a 7.45 ERA...tossed 4.1 innings in his first start on April 3 against Houston, which was the shortest start of his career...also faced the Astros in his second start on April 8 but did not pitch again until April 17 against Detroit when he combined with Wendelken, Guerra and Weems on a five-hit shutout in a 7-0 win...it was his first win since May 17, 2019 against Colorado and it snapped a career-high four-game losing streak...that began a four-start stretch where he went 3-1 with a 1.42 ERA and .232 opponents batting average through May 4...tossed 6.0 scoreless innings in his start against the Tigers and then blanked the Orioles over the first five innings on April 23 for a career-high 11.0 inning scoreless streak...won back-to-back starts on the 17th and 23rd, marking the second time in his career he put together consecutive wins (May 12-17, 2019)...allowed just one run in 11. innings in the two starts...lost on April 28 at Tampa Bay but then picked up his third win on May 4 against Toronto...had career highs in innings pitched (8.0), strikeouts (9) and pitches (102) against the Blue Jays...then went 0-4 with a 5.40 ERA and .284 opponents batting average over his next five starts...the losing streak matched his career high (also May 22, 2019-April 8, 2021) and was the longest losing streak by an A's starting pitcher over the last three years...left with a 4-1 lead on May 15 at Minnesota but the pen allowed four runs in the eighth inning for the blown save...it was the first of two times the pen blew a save in one of his starts (June 11 vs. Kansas City)...allowed a season-high five runs in an 8-4 loss to Houston on May 20...allowed a career-high 10 hits in 4.2 innings of work in a 4-3 loss to Seattle on May 25...went 1-4 with a 4.46 ERA in six starts in May...tied for second in the American League in losses in May...allowed a run in the first inning on June 5 at Colorado and did not allow another run until the seventh inning of his next start on June 11 against Kansas City for a career-high tying 11.0-inning scoreless streak.

**LAST START:** He had his second consecutive no decision in the A's 8-4 win over Los Angeles (AL) last Wednesday in Oakland...allowed three runs in the first inning on RBI singles by Stassi, Ward and Gosselin, and one more run in the second on a solo home run by Ohtani...then retired 12 of the final 16 batters he faced and was relieved by Smith with two outs in the sixth inning, runners on first and third, and the A's trailing 4-2...Oakland scored six times in the bottom of the sixth for the win.

**2020 RECAP:** Had two stints with Philadelphia and was 0-1 with a 17.18 ERA in three relief appearances...opponents went 11-for-21 (.524) but he walked just one and struck out four in 3.2 innings...allowed a .438 (7-for-16) average against right-handed hitters compared to .800 (4-for-5) against left-handers...was 2-0 with a 4.50 ERA in four spring training appearances...was optioned to Lehigh Valley March 26 but was recalled on July 23 and was on the Phillies Opening Day roster...made his 2020 debut on July 26 against Miami and allowed four runs on five hits in an inning of relief and was the losing pitcher in an 11-6 decision...tossed a scoreless inning of relief Aug. 9 against Atlanta but was optioned to Philadelphia's alternate site on Aug. 9...was recalled for a second time Aug. 20, pitched the next day at Atlanta (1.2 ip, 4 h, 3 r, 3 er, 1 bb, 3 so) and was optioned Aug. 22...did not pitch the remainder of the season.

TOMORROW'S PROBABLE STARTING PITCHER
<b>RHP James Kaprielian (4-1, 2.84 ERA):</b> Was recalled from Triple-A Las Vegas May 12 and is scheduled to make his eighth start of the season and his career...has allowed two runs or fewer in five of his seven starts and five hits or fewer in all seven starts...has four wins, which are tied for fourth among American League rookies...has the seventh lowest ERA among AL rookies with 30 or more innings (2.84)...was the winning pitcher in his last start, a 5-3 A's win over the Yankees in which he allowed three earned runs in 5.2 innings pitched at Yankee Stadium...has never faced the Rangers in his career...was the Yankees first round draft pick in 2015 but pitched in just eight games over his first four years as a professional...missed most of 2016 with an elbow injury and then missed the entire 2017 and 2018 seasons following April 18, 2017 "Tommy John" surgery...was traded to the A's with Dustin Fowler and Jorge Mateo at the 2017 trading deadline for Sonny Gray.

- Opponents are 2-for-17 (.118) with runners in scoring position, including 0-for-7 with the A's.
- Is 2-3 with a 5.93 ERA (20 er in 30.1 ip) in 35 career outings against the Rangers.
- Was a non-roster invitee with Cincinnati this spring and made the Reds Opening Day roster...compiled an 11.12 ERA in six relief outings before he was designated for assignment on April 17...signed a minor league deal with Oakland on April 29 and was assigned to Las Vegas...had a save and did not allow a run in four games with the Aviators (5.0 ip, 2 h, 1 bb, 5 so).

**Last Year:** Compiled a 2.45 ERA and .196 opponents batting average in 11 relief appearances with the Angels...missed 25 games while on the injured list from Aug. 4-30 with a right adductor strain.

- Is 0-1 with a save, three blown saves, a 4.15 ERA (6 er in 13.0 ip) and four home runs allowed in his last 14 games dating back to May 15 but six of his last seven outings have been scoreless...was 2-0, converted each of his five save opportunities, had a 2.12 ERA and allowed no home runs over his first 17 games (17.0 ip).
- Is tied for 11th among American League relievers in strikeouts (40).
- Has held right-handed hitters to a .174 (12-for-69) average but they have hit all four of the home runs he has allowed.
- Has a 5.87 ERA (5 er in 7.2 ip) and .313 (10-for-32) opponents batting average in eight outings on no days rest, a 1.25 ERA (3 er in 21.2 ip) and .122 (9-for-74) opponents average in 22 appearances on one day of rest or more.
- Appeared in 150 games for the Rangers from 2015-18, going 5-3 with seven saves and a 3.18 ERA (44 er in 124.1 ip)...pitched one scoreless inning against Texas in 2020...in his career, has allowed six runs over 6.1 innings to the Rangers.
- Has six saves, which surpasses his career high of four with Texas in 2016.
