OAKLAND ATHLETICS (45-31) VS. TEXAS RANGERS (27-47)

ABOUT THE A'S: The A's fell to the Rangers by a score of 5-3...they have won 10 of the last 15 games and are 14 games over .500 at 45-31 (.592)...are three games shy of their season-high of 17 games over .500 (44-27)...they are two games behind Houston (46-28, .622) for the best record in the American League...have fallen out of first place in AL West, snapping a streak of 31st consecutive days in first...have held at least a share of first for 61 of the last 65 days...have spent 58 days alone in first place, three days tied for first, four days in second, one day tied for second, three days in third, two days in fourth, three days tied for fourth and 10 days in fifth.

A'S IN JUNE: The A's are 14-6 (.700) in June, which is the second best record in the Majors behind only the Astros (17-4, .810)...have a 3.81 ERA (74 er in 175.0 ip), which is fourth lowest in the American League...starters have a 3.36 ERA (44 er in 118.0 ip), which is sixth lowest in the majors and second lowest in the American League...are batting .270 (183-for-678) with 117 runs scored in 20 games (5.85 per game)...rank third in the Majors in runs scored, and are fourth in OPS (.805) and fifth in batting...have out-scored the opposition 117-77 (+40) after being out-scored 242-231 (-11) in the months of April and May.

OFF DAYS AND FIRST GAMES OF SERIES: The A's had their ninth off day of the season on Thursday...with Friday's win, are now 9-0 following a day off and are the only undefeated team in the majors following a day off...have a 3.08 ERA (27 er in 79.0 ip) following a day off and are batting .252 (74-for-294) with 55 runs scored (6.11 runs per game)...overall, have a 16-8 record in the first game of a series.

HOME AND AWAY: The A's continue a 10-game road trip to New York-AL (1-2), Texas (1-2) and San Francisco (three games) tonight...it is the first of three 10-game road trips...went 4-2 on the last road trip to Seattle (2-1) and Colorado (2-1) and are 20-13 (.606) on the road, which is the second best road record in the majors (Baton, .649)...the 33 road games are tied for the second fewest in baseball...are scheduled to play 30 of their next 45 games on the road...have won eight road series, lost one and split one...lost their first road series of the year over the weekend, snapping a season-opening streak of nine consecutive road series without a loss which was the longest such streak in Athletics history (previous: won the first eight road series in 1988)...it matched the longest at any point during the season over the last 32 years (May 16-July 21, 2019)...the last time the A's had a 10-series unbeaten streak on the road was Sept. 5, 1988 to May 11, 1989...went 8-1 on the last homestand against Arizona (2-0), Kansas City (3-1) and Los Angeles-AL (3-0)...it was the first time the A's won eight games on a homestand since going 8-2 against Tampa Bay, Texas and Houston from Aug. 30 to Sept. 8, 2013...are 25-18 (.581) at home.

HOME AND AWAY SPLITS: The A's are batting .256 (293-for-1145) with a .772 OPS on the road compared to .222 with a .707 OPS at home...have the second best road OPS and batting average in the majors to the Astros (.288/.820)...have the fourth lowest home batting average...have a 3.88 ERA (123 er in 285.2 ip) on the road, which is the fourth lowest in the American League and eighth lowest in the majors.

IN THE PINCH: A's pinch hitters are 6-for-16 with a double, four RBI and a sacrifice fly in their last 17 plate appearances dating back to June 6...lead the American League in hits (17), RBI (13), sacrifice flies (2), and plate appearances (71), are tied for third in home runs (2), and tied for second in extra base hits (4).

OFFENSE: The A's are hitting .279 (105-for-377) with 69 runs, 19 doubles and 18 home runs over the last 11 games to boost their overall batting average to .238...lead the American League in hit by pitches (41), rank second in sacrifice flies (25), fourth in walks (272) and on-base percentage (.320), tied for fourth in extra base hits (237), and fifth in home runs (97)...are hitting .327 (56-for-171) with runners in scoring position in the month of June and are now batting .268 (148-for-552) with RISP overall, which ranks fifth best in the AL.

PITCHING: The A's have compiled a 3.29 ERA (81 er in 221.2 ip) over the last 25 games...now have a 3.96 ERA for the season, which is fifth lowest in the American League...also have the fifth lowest opponents on-base percentage (.307) and OPS (.706)...have walked 203 batters, which is tied with the Yankees for the fewest in the AL...have the fifth fewest home runs allowed (83) but the fifth most hits allowed (640)...rank third in shutouts (7) and fewest pitches per inning (16.0).

STARTING PITCHING: James Kaprielian took a no-decision, allowing two earned runs on five hits and two walks in six innings of work...starters are now 11-3 with a 3.16 ERA (40 er in 114.0 ip) over the last 19 games and have allowed just 11 home runs...are 30-24 with a 3.90 ERA (186 er in 429.1 ip) for the season...lead the majors in innings pitched (429.1) and are tied with the White Sox for the most complete games (3)...the complete games are the most by an A's team since 2015 (5).

BULLPEN: The A's bullpen converted 12-of-13 (92.3%) save opportunities and had a 3.50 ERA and .226 opponents batting average over the first 40 games through May 14...is 8-for-16 (50.0%) in save chances with a 4.68 ERA (56 er in 104.0 ip) in 36 games since then...ranks fifth in the AL in saves...has the third fewest home runs in the AL (29), the second fewest walks (88), the sixth lowest opponents OPS (.692), fourth lowest on-base percentage (.307) and the eighth lowest slugging percentage (.385).

DEFENSIVE DOINGS: The A's snapped a season-long nine-game errorless streak Tuesday night...have 35 errors for the season, which is third fewest in the American League...rank third in fewest double plays (54)...A's outfielders have six assists, which is tied for third fewest.

CLOSE CALLS: The A's are 27-14 (.659) in games decided by three runs or fewer...are 18-17 (.514) in games decided by four or more...are 12-8 (.600) in one-run games...are tied with the Rockies for the most walk-off wins in the majors (6)...have one walk-off loss, which is tied with the Red Sox and Angels for the fewest in the AL...are 9-4 in games decided in the last at bat...are 2-1 in extra inning games and are now 8-2 in extra innings over the last two years.

THIS AND THAT: The A's are 29-16 (.644) in night games compared to 16-15 (.516) during the day...have the second best record at night in the Majors (Houston, .653)...are 19-10 (.655) in games in which the opponent starts a left-handed pitcher compared to 26-21 (.553) when they start a right-hander...are 33-11 (.750) when scoring first...have used 73 different lineups over the first 74 games.

A's vs. RANGERS: The A's lost last night by a score of 5-3...Oakland is meeting the Rangers for the first time this year...have already finished the season series with Baltimore, Minnesota and Tampa Bay and have played 10 of their 19 scheduled games against both Los Angeles and Seattle...are scheduled to play Texas seven times over the next 16 games...won the season series last year, 7-3...it was their fourth consecutive season series victory over the Rangers, which is just the second time the A's have won four consecutive season series against Texas (2002-05)...went 4-3 in Arlington last year and 3-0 in Oakland...have won 15 of the last 21 games and are 30-12 over the last 42 contests...have won nine of the last 14 games and 15 of the last 23 in Texas...have won seven of the last eight and 25 of the last 31 in Oakland...are 45-24 (.652) against the Rangers over the previous four years...are 386-378 all-time against the Texas Rangers...that breaks down to 203-176 in Oakland and 183-202 in Texas...are 5-5 at Globe Life Field...went 111-109 at Globe Life Park, which was the second best record by a visiting American League team (Yankees, 57-48, .543)...have an all-time record of 483-460 against the Rangers/Senators franchise.

TODAY'S TIDBITS

Matt Olson ranks third in the American League in OPS (.980), third in slugging (.604), tied for third in home runs (20) and extra base hits (38), tied for fourth in sacrifice flies (5) and RBI (53)...**Mark Canha** leads the majors in hit by pitches (13) and is tied for third in the American League in runs scored (55)...**Sean Murphy** has 37 RBI as a catcher, which are the most among Major League catchers...**Lou Trivino** has not allowed a run in nine games in June (8.2 ip) and has not allowed an earned run over his last 17 games dating back to May 8 (16.0 ip, 2 r)...since May 25, **Elvis Andrus** is hitting .315 (29-for-92) with a .798 OPS, two steals, seven walks, 12 runs, 11 doubles, and 10 RBI.

THIS DATE IN ATHLETICS HISTORY

In **1979** Rickey Henderson steals the first base of his career in his Major League debut in the first game of a doubleheader against Texas...he doubles in his first big league at bat and adds a single in three other at bats...in **2012** Derek Norris hits his first Major League home run, a walk-off three-run blast in the A's 4-2 win over San Francisco.

TODAY'S STARTING PITCHER: Chris Bassitt (7-2, 3.40 ERA)

SEVEN-GAME WINNING STREAK: Lost each of his first two starts this year but is 7-0 with a 3.10 ERA (28 er in 81.1 ip) and .207 (62-for-299) opponents batting average in 13 starts since then...the winning streak is a career high and it matches teammate Yusmeiro Petit for the longest in the American League this year...the A's are 11-4 (.733) in his starting assignments.

AMONG THE LEADERS: Is tied for fourth in the American League in wins (7) and winning percentage (.778), ranks fourth in innings pitched (92.2), seventh in strikeouts (98) and OPS (.639), eighth in opponents slugging (.358), sixth in strikeout-to-walk ratio (4.26), ninth in opponents batting average (.215), and 11th in ERA (3.40)...has allowed nine home runs and his average of 0.87 home runs per nine innings is fifth lowest...is tied for the AL lead in hit by pitches (9) and ranks sixth in fewest pitches per inning (15.0)...is scheduled to make his 16th start today, which will tie him for the AL lead.

FOUR RUNS OR FEWER: Has allowed four runs or fewer in each of his 26 starts over the last two years and is 12-4 with a 2.95 ERA (51 er in 155.2 ip) over that span...has a streak of 26 consecutive games with four runs or fewer and 3.0 innings pitched or more, which ties Vida Blue (April 9-July 30, 1971) for the longest such streak in Athletics history...has not allowed more than four runs in a start since yielding seven runs in his final start of 2019 (Sept. 13 at Texas).

HOME AND AWAY: Is 4-0 with a 3.86 ERA (20 er in 46.2 ip) in seven starts on the road compared to 3-2 with a 2.93 ERA (15 er in 46.0 ip) in seven starts home...is tied for fifth in the American League in road wins...now has a five-game winning streak on the road dating back to Sept. 12, 2020 and has not lost on the road since Aug. 29, 2020 at Houston...has a 12-12 career record in the Coliseum, but has a 2.53 ERA (66 er in 234.1 ip), which is fifth lowest in Coliseum history among pitchers with 200 or more innings pitched.

OPPONENTS BATTING: Has held left-handed hitters to a .191 (33-for-173) batting average...however, has surrendered seven of his nine home runs this year and 25 of 36 over the last three years to lefties...seven of his nine home runs this year have come with the bases empty...has a .128 opponents batting average with two strikes, which is sixth lowest in the American League.

THE LAST THREE YEARS: Is 22-9 (.710) with a 3.36 ERA (112 er in 299.2 ip) in 54 games (51 starts) over the last three years...based on a minimum of 250 innings pitched, he ranks fourth in the American League in ERA over that span, second in winning percentage and sixth in opponents OPS (.672)...is eighth in wins...the A's are 34-17 (.667) in his starting assignments over the last three years...was 4-14 (.222) with a 3.86 ERA in 40 games (30 starts) over his first four seasons.

2021 HIGHLIGHTS: Was the A's Opening Day starting pitcher and took the loss in an 8-1 decision to Houston on April 1 in Oakland...became the A's 14th different Opening Day starting pitcher over the last 16 years (Zito, Haren, Blanton, Braden, Sheets, Cahill, McCarthy, Anderson, Gray twice, Hill, Graveman twice, Fiers, Montas)...allowed a run in the fourth inning to snap a 16.2-inning scoreless streak during the regular season and a 27.1-inning home scoreless streak, which was ninth longest in Oakland history...lost his second start on April 6, a 5-1 loss to Los Angeles (NL) on April 6 in Oakland when he allowed a season-high four runs on a season-high nine hits in 6.0 innings...allowed two home runs in the third, which were his first home runs in the Coliseum since Aug. 24, 2019...that snapped a 10-game, 55.1-inning, 229-batter homerless streak in Oakland...that ran his record to 0-2 with a 5.56 ERA...then allowed exactly two runs in each of his next six starts to become the second pitcher in Athletic history to allow exactly two runs in six consecutive games...joins Bob Davis of the Kansas City A's, who did it all in relief from Aug. 8-26, 1960...went 3-0 with a 2.92 ERA over that stretch which ran from April 12 to May 11...allowed just two hits in 5.0 innings for the win on April 12 at Arizona but walked a season-high five batters...tied an Oakland record with three hit batters April 29 at Tampa Bay (12th time, last: Fiers, June 22, 2019, also against Tampa Bay)...left his start on May 5 against Toronto with a 3-2 lead but ended up win a no decision in the A's 9-4 loss...Trivino allowed five runs in the eighth inning for the blown save...it was the first of three times he left with a lead only to have the bullpen blow the save (also May 16 at Minnesota & June 19 at New York-AL)...struck out a season-high 10 batters in a 3-2 win at Boston on May 11...it was his third career game of 10 or more strikeouts...did not walk a batter, the second time he has fanned 10 or more without issuing a free pass...is one of nine pitchers in Oakland history with two such games...allowed a season-high tying four runs in a no decision at Minnesota on May 16...tossed his first career complete game and shutout May 27 against Los Angeles (AL), a two-hitter in the A's 5-0 win...had a season-high 114 pitches, struck out nine and walked one...it came in his 77th career start, his 72nd with the A's...the 71 consecutive starts without a complete games is the second longest streak in Athletics history (113, Barry Zito, Aug. 22, 2003-Sept. 28, 2006)...finished May with a 3-0 record, a 2.52 ERA and .175 opponents batting average in five starts...struck out 38 and walked just four in 35.2 innings...allowed a season-high

tying four runs in a season-low 4.0 innings June 1 at Seattle but had a no decision in the A's 12-6 win.

LAST START: Took a no-decision against New York-AL at Yankee Stadium...the A's scored one in the first and one in the fourth before he allowed an RBI single in the bottom of the fourth...the A's then scored two more in the fifth to go ahead 4-1...he allowed another run in the bottom of the sixth on a home run to Gary Sanchez before exiting with a 4-2 lead after six innings...the Yankees would go on to score twice in the seventh and three times in the eighth, ultimately winning 7-5.

Globe Life Park...went 1-1 with a 4.58 ERA (17.2 ip, 13 h, 10 r, 9 er, 7 bb, 22 so) in five games, including three starts last year...the win came in a 6-1 A's victory in Oakland on April 22...tossed 5.0 scoreless innings and allowed just two hits while walking four...then took the loss in a 3-1 decision at Texas in the night game of the day/night doubleheader on June 8...allowed two runs in the fifth on a Mathis RBI single and a DeShields sacrifice fly...Sampson tossed a complete game for Texas, holding the A's to four hits...then had a decision in the A's 14-9 win at Texas on Sept. 13...allowed a career-high tying seven runs in 3.0 innings...allowed four runs in the second on a Guzman RBI double and a Choo three-run home run, and three more in the third on a Santana three-run home run...the pitched in relief in Oakland on Sept. 22 (1.0 ip, 2 so) and Sept. 22 (3.0 ip, 1 h, 5 so).

LAST START: He won his second consecutive start in the A's 10-1 win at Texas in the first game of the doubleheader last Saturday...blanked the Rangers on six hits and two walks over the first five innings to extend his scoreless streak to 12.0 innings...then allowed his only run in six innings of work on a Gallo solo home run in the sixth.

2020 RECAP: Spent the entire season on the active roster for the first time in his six-year career and went 5-2 with a 2.29 ERA in 11 starts...his ERA ranked second among pitchers in the West divisions (Lamet, SD 2.09) and sixth in the majors...it was fifth lowest in Oakland history among pitchers with at least 10 starts...also tied for fifth in the West divisions in winning percentage (.714), ranked seventh in opponents OPS (.659), batting average (.233) and slugging percentage (.371), tied for seventh in wins and eighth in on-base percentage (.288)...had career lows in ERA and opponents on-base percentage...walked 17 batters in 63.0 innings for a career-low 2.43 walks per nine innings...struck out 55 for a career-best 3.24 strikeout-to-walk ratio.

TOMORROW'S PROBABLE STARTING PITCHER
LHP Sean Manaea (6-3, 3.01 ERA): Has allowed two runs or fewer in each of his last six starts and is 3-0 with a 1.19 ERA and .206 opponents batting average over that span...is the first A's pitcher with five consecutive games of one run or fewer and five innings pitched or more (May 23-June 14) since Trevor Cahill (April 17-May 9, 2011)...ranks fifth in the American League in ERA (3.01), tied for 12th in winning percentage (.667) and ninth in opponents slugging percentage (.371)...is one of two pitchers in the majors with two shutouts and one of three with two complete games...took the loss in his last outing despite allowing just two earned runs in 5.1 innings against the Yankees...has faced the Giants five times in his career and is 2-1 with a 2.73 ERA (8 er, 26.1 ip)...faced San Francisco once last season, allowing three runs, two earned, in 5.0 innings of work in a 7-6 A's win...is 1-0 with a 3.27 ERA in two career starts at San Francisco.
