## OAKLAND ATHLETICS (46-32) VS. SAN FRANCISCO GIANTS (49-26)

SATURDAY, JUNE 26, 2021 — ORACLE PARK — 7:05 PT

**ABOUT THE A'S:** The A's fell to the Giants by a score of 0-2 last night...they have won 11 of the last 17 games and are 14 games over .500 at 46-32 (.590)...are three games shy of their season-high of 17 games over .500 (44-27)...they are two-and-a-half games behind Houston (47-28, .627) for the best record in the American League...have fallen out of first place in AL West, snapping a streak of 31st consecutive days in first...have held at least a share of first for 61 of the last 67 days...have spent 58 days alone in first place, three days tied for first, six days in second, one day tied for second, three days in third, two days in fourth, three days tied for fourth and 10 days in fifth.

**A'S IN JUNE:** The A's are 15-7 (.682) in June, which is the third best record in the Majors behind only the Astros (18-4, .818) and Giants (15-6, .714)...have a 3.61 ERA (77 er in 192.0 ip), which is third lowest in the American League...starters have a 3.16 ERA (46 er in 131.0 ip), which is fifth lowest in the majors and second lowest in the American League...are batting .266 (199-for-749) with 122 runs scored in 22 games (5.55 per game)...rank third in the Majors in runs scored, are fifth in OPS (.801) and sixth in batting...have out-scored the opposition 122-80 (+42) after being out-scored 242-231 (-11) in the months of April and May.

**OFF DAYS AND FIRST GAMES OF SERIES:** The A's had their ninth off day of the season last Thursday...with last Friday's win, are now 9-0 following a day off and are the only undefeated team in the majors following a day off...have a 3.08 ERA (27 er in 79.0 ip) following a day off and are batting .252 (74-for-294) with 55 runs scored (6.11 runs per game)...overall, have a 16-9 record in the first game of a series.

**HOME AND AWAY:** The A's continue a 10-game road trip to New York-AL (1-2), Texas (2-2) and San Francisco (0-1 + two games) tonight...it is the first of three 10-game road trips...went 4-2 on the last road trip to Seattle (2-1) and Colorado (2-1) and are 21-13 (.618) on the road, which is the second best road record in the majors (Boston, .632)...the 35 road games are tied for the second fewest in baseball...are scheduled to play 28 of their next 43 games on the road...have won eight road series, lost one and split two...lost their first road series of the year over the weekend, snapping a season-opening streak of nine consecutive road series without a loss which was the longest such streak in Athletics history (previous: won the first eight road series in 1988)...it matched the longest at any point during the season over the last 32 years (May 16-July 21, 2019)...the last time the A's had a 10-series unbeaten streak on the road was Sept. 5, 1988 to May 11, 1989...went 8-1 on the last homestand against Arizona (2-0), Kansas City (3-1) and Los Angeles-AL (3-0)...it was the first time the A's won eight games on a homestand since going 8-2 against Tampa Bay, Texas and Houston from Aug. 30 to Sept. 8, 2013...are 25-18 (.581) at home.

**HOME AND AWAY SPLITS:** The A's are batting .254 (309-for-1216) with a .761 OPS on the road compared to .222 with a .707 OPS at home...have the second best road OPS and batting average in the majors to the Astros (.292/.826)...have the fourth lowest home batting average...have a 3.75 ERA (124 er in 294.2 ip) on the road, which is the fourth lowest in the American League and eighth lowest in the majors.

**IN THE PINCH:** A's pinch hitters are 6-for-18 with a double, four RBI and a sacrifice fly in their last 19 plate appearances dating back to June 6...lead the American League in hits (17), sacrifice flies (2), and plate appearances (71), are tied for first in RBI (13), tied for third in home runs (2), and tied for second in extra base hits (4).

**OFFENSE:** The A's are hitting .270 (121-for-448) with 74 runs, 22 doubles and 19 home runs over the last 13 games to boost their overall batting average to .238...lead the American League in hit by pitches (41), rank second in sacrifice flies (25), fourth in in walks (275), tied for fourth in extra base hits (240), fifth in on-base percentage (.319) and tied for fifth in home runs (98)...are hitting .326 (60-for-184) with runners in scoring position in the month of June, which is second in the American League, and are now batting .269 (152-for-565) with RISP overall, which ranks fifth best in the AL.

**PITCHING:** The A's have compiled a 3.26 ERA (86 er in 237.2 ip) over the last 27 games...now have a 3.90 ERA for the season, which is fifth lowest in the American League...also have the fifth lowest opponents on-base percentage (.306) and OPS (.703)...have walked 209 batters, which is the fewest in the AL...have the fifth fewest home runs allowed (84) but the fifth most hits allowed (652)...rank third in shutouts (7) and second in fewest pitches per inning (16.0).

**STARTING PITCHING:** Sean Manaea took the loss despite allowing just one run on three hits and three walks over 6.0 innings while striking out seven...

starters are now 12-4 with a 2.98 ERA (42 er in 127.0 ip) over the last 21 games and have allowed just 11 home runs...are 31-25 with a 3.83 ERA (188 er in 442.1 ip) for the season...lead the majors in innings pitched (442.1) and are tied with the White Sox for the most complete games (3)...the complete games are the most by an A's team since 2015 (5).

**BULLPEN:** The A's bullpen converted 12-of-13 (92.3%) save opportunities and had a 3.50 ERA and .226 opponents batting average over the first 40 games through May 14...is 8-for-16 (50.0%) in save chances with a 4.71 ERA (57 er in 109.0 ip) in 38 games since then...is tied for fifth in the AL in saves...is tied for the third fewest home runs in the AL (30), the second fewest walks (88), the sixth lowest opponents OPS (.693), third lowest on-base percentage (.306) and the seventh lowest slugging percentage (.387).

**DEFENSIVE DOINGS:** The A's snapped a season-long nine-game errorless streak Tuesday night...have 35 errors for the season, which is third fewest in the American League...rank third in fewest double plays (57)...A's outfielders have six assists, which is tied for fewest in the AL.

**CLOSE CALLS:** The A's are 27-15 (.643) in games decided by three runs or fewer...are 19-17 (.528) in games decided by four or more...are 12-8 (.600) in one-run games...are tied with the Yankees and Mariners for the second most walk-off wins in the majors (6)...have one walk-off loss, which is tied with the Angels for the fewest in the AL...are 9-4 in games decided in the last at bat...are 2-1 in extra inning games and are now 8-2 in extra innings over the last two years.

**THIS AND THAT:** The A's are 29-17 (.630) in night games compared to 17-15 (.531) during the day...have the fourth best record at night in the Majors...are 20-10 (.667) in games in which the opponent starts a left-handed pitcher compared to 26-22 (.542) when they start a right-hander...are 34-11 (.756) when scoring first...have used 75 different lineups over the first 76 games.

**INTERLEAGUE PLAY:** The A's are 7-4 (.636) in interleague play, which is the eighth best record in the majors...have 8 games remaining after today...after the current series in San Francisco (0-1 + two games), will travel to San Diego (July 27-28) and host San Diego (Aug. 3-4) and San Francisco (Aug. 20-22)...went 10-10 (.500) in interleague play last year and finished with a .500 record or better against the National League for the third consecutive season and 17th time in 24 years of interleague play...are 245-210 (.538) all-time in interleague games, which is fourth best in Major League history.

**A's vs. GIANTS:** The A's dropped the first game against the Giants last night...won the season series last year, 5-1...it matched their best record against the Giants (2007)...won two of three in Oakland and swept a three-game series in San Francisco...in 24 seasons of interleague play, the A's have won nine season series, lost five and split 10...are 69-62 all-time against the Giants during interleague play...that breaks down to 38-27 in Oakland and 31-35 in San Francisco...are 27-32 at Oracle Park.

### TODAY'S TIDBITS

**Tony Kemp** has reached base safely in a career-high 14 straight contests (June 9 to present) and has a .410 on-base percentage, which is second best in the American League among players with 150 or more plate appearances...**Matt Olson** leads Major League first basemen in home runs (20) and RBI (53) and is batting .381 (32-for-84) with 18 runs, six doubles, seven home runs and 20 RBI in 22 games in June...**Matt Chapman** has hit safely in each of his last 13 games and is 17-for-53 (.321) with 12 runs, four doubles, a triple, four home runs and 12 RBI over that span...**Elvis Andrus** is batting .285 (41-for-144) over his last 44 games dating back to May 7 after hitting .143 over his first 31 contests...**Deolis Guerra** has a .095 OPS against lefties, which is the lowest mark in the majors.

### THIS DATE IN ATHLETICS HISTORY

In **1974** Campy Campaneris has two hits in the A's 5-0 win over California, giving him 1000 in his Oakland career...in **1997** Mark McGwire hits his ninth career grand slam in a 6-3 win over Texas, tying the franchise record held by Jimmie Foxx, Sam Chapman and Gus Zernial...in **2005** the A's set an Oakland record for margin of victory in a shutout with a 16-0 win over San Francisco...switch-hitter Nick Swisher becomes just the second player in Oakland history to homer from both side of the plate in the same game.

## TODAY'S STARTING PITCHER: Frankie Montas (7-7, 4.79 ERA)

**FOR STARTERS:** Is 3-5 with a 4.24 ERA (22 er in 46.2 ip) over his last eight starts after going 4-2 with a 5.50 ERA over his first seven starts...his seven wins are tied for fifth in the American League but his seven losses are tied for seventh most...the seven losses are a career high as are his 49 runs and 13 home runs...the seven wins are second only to his nine in 2019.

**HOME AND AWAY:** Is scheduled to make his 16th start of the season today but just his sixth on the road...is 3-2 with a 5.02 ERA (16 er in 28.2 ip) in five starts on the road compared to 4-5 with a 4.67 ERA (28 er in 54.0 ip) in 10 starts at home...is tied for second in the American League in losses at home and is tied for the lead in starts at home...last year, he went 1-4 with a 10.13 ERA in five starts on the road, 2-1 with a 2.56 ERA in six starts at home.

**OPPONENTS BATTING:** Has a .223 (27-for-121) opponents batting average the first time through the order, .318 (41-for-129) the second time and .261 (23-for-88) with seven of his 13 home runs after that...has a .356 (31-for-87) opponents batting average against the opponents one and two hitters but has held the three, four and five hitters to a .212 (25-for-118) average.

**INNING BY INNING:** Has a 4.20 ERA (14 er in 30.0 ip) over the first two innings of his starts...has yielded 14 of his 49 runs in the third inning for a 8.59 ERA (14 er in 14.2 ip) and .377 (26-for-69) opponents batting average...has allowed just one run in the fourth inning (14.0 ip, 0.64 ERA) and opponents are 8-for-50 (.160).

**THIS AND THAT:** Has walked one batter or fewer in four of his last five starts and nine of 15 for the season...allowed two home runs in his last start after a four-game stretch without giving up a homer...has allowed 13 home runs this season...tossed six innings or fewer in each of his first 12 starts but has logged more than six innings in two of his last three...the A's are 8-7 (.533) in his starting assignments.

**2021 HIGHLIGHTS:** Took the loss in his first start on April 5 against Los Angeles (NL)...allowed seven runs in a season-low 2.2 innings and walked a season-high three batters...tossed 90 pitches, which were the most by an A's pitcher in an outing of fewer than three innings since pitch counts were tracked beginning in 1988...the loss extended his losing streak to a career-high three games dating back to Sept. 13, 2020...then picked up the win in each of his next two starts and allowed just one run on eight hits in 12.0 innings...won 7-3 at Houston on April 10 and then combined with Romo, Diekmann and Wendelken on a four-hit shutout in the A's 3-0 victory over Detroit on April 16...allowed six runs on a season-high nine hits in 4.0 innings against Minnesota on April 21 but had a no decision in the A's 13-12, 10-inning win...allowed three home runs in a start for the second time in his career (Sept. 22, 2020 vs. Los Angeles-NL)...had a season-high 105 pitches in a 4-3 loss at Tampa Bay on April 27...finished April 2-2 with a 6.20 ERA in five starts...then went 3-3 with a 3.18 ERA in six starts in May...the three wins matched his most ever in a month and he had 38 strikeouts, which tied for eighth in the American League...won each of his first three starts in May and posted a 3.12 ERA over that stretch from May 3-14...then went 0-3 with a 3.24 ERA over his next three starts from May 19-29...the losing streak matched his career high...struck out 11 batters in 6.0 innings in a 4-2 loss to Seattle on May 24...it was his fourth career games of 10 or more strikeouts and the second highest single-game total of his career to his 13 against the Mariners in the final game of the 2020 season...walked a season-high tying three...tossed a season-high 7.0 innings and earned the win in a 6-4 A's victory over Los Angeles (AL) on June 15.

**LAST START:** Took the loss in the A's 3-8 loss to Texas on Monday...allowed a season-high-tying nine runs on a season-high eight hits and surrendered two home runs...five of the Rangers eight runs came in the first inning, as Montas issued five hits and a walk before Trevino grounded out to end the inning...did not allow a run in the second through fourth innings, but allowed three more runs to score in the fifth inning on a single, hit by pitch, and three-run home run (Trevino)...was relieved by Cam Bedrosian with one on and two out in the fifth inning.

**2020 RECAP:** Was off to a strong start as he was 2-1 with a 1.57 ERA, .175 opponents batting average and no home runs over his first four starts...was scratched from his scheduled start on Aug. 14 at San Francisco with upper back tightness and went 1-4 with an 8.70 ERA, .321 opponents average and 10 home runs over his final seven starts...went 3-5 with a 5.60 ERA in 11 starts overall...his ERA was eighth highest in the majors among pitchers with at least 50 innings pitched...had career highs in losses (5) and earned runs (33) and matched his high in home runs (10), runs (35) and walks (23)...led the A's in strikeouts (60), losses, runs, home runs and walks...his opponents batting average broke down to .198 (22-for-111) against right-handed hitters compared to .350 (35-for-100) against left-handers...surrendered six of his 10 home runs and issued 15 of his 23 walks to lefties for a 1.061 OPS (.572 against right-handers)...had a .306 opponents batting average the first time through the lineup, .264 the second time and .205 after that...allowed a .133 average with two strikes...was 2-1 with a 2.56 ERA and .225 opponents batting average in six starts in Oakland, 1-4 with a 10.13 ERA and .330 opponents average in five starts on the road...surrendered just two home runs in 31.2 innings in Oakland compared to eight in 21.1 innings on the road...made eight of his 11 starts during the day, which tied for the most in the majors...was 2-4 with a 6.16 ERA during the day, 1-1 with a 4.20 ERA at night...the A's were 6-5 (.545) in his starting assignments...had two starts of seven innings and five starts of fewer than five innings...went 2-2 with a 2.83 ERA in six starts on four days rest, 1-3 with an 11.00 ERA in five starts on five days rest or more...received two runs of support or fewer in nine of his 11 starts...had 10 of his 28 runs of support in one start on Aug. 3 at Seattle and had a 4.75 RSA for the season...won both of his starts with support of three or more runs.

- Faced the Giants once this season with the Reds, throwing one scoreless inning with one hit, two walks, and two strikeouts...has opposed San Francisco four times in his career, allowing one run in 4.0 innings of work.
