ABOUT THE A'S: The A's fell to the Giants 4-5 in 10 innings last night...they have won 11 of the last 18 games and are 13 games over .500 at 46-33 (.582)...are four games shy of their season-high of 17 games over .500 (44-27)...they are three games behind Houston (48-29, .623) for the best record in the American League...have fallen out of first place in AL West, snapping a streak of 31st consecutive days in first...have held at least a share of first for 61 of the last 67 days...have spent 58 days alone in first place, three days tied for first, seven days in second, one day tied for second, three days in third, two days in fourth, three days tied for fourth and 10 days in fifth.

A'S IN JUNE: The A's are 15-8 (.652) in June, which is tied for the third best record in the Majors behind only the Astros (19-5, .792) and Giants (16-6, .727)...have a 3.67 ERA (82 er in 201.1 ip), which is third lowest in the American League...starters have a 3.18 ERA (48 er in 136.0 ip), which is sixth lowest in the majors and second lowest in the American League...are batting .261 (205-for-784) with 127 runs scored in 23 games (5.52 per game)...are tied for second in the Majors in runs scored, are seventh in OPS (.772) and batting...have out-scored the opposition 126-85 (+41) after being out-scored 242-231 (-11) in the months of April and May.

OFF DAYS AND FIRST GAMES OF SERIES: The A's had their ninth off day of the season June 17...with the win on June 18, are now 9-0 following a day off and are the only undefeated team in the majors following a day off...have a 3.08 ERA (27 er in 79.0 ip) following a day off and are batting .252 (74-for-294) with 55 runs scored (6.11 runs per game)...overall, have a 16-9 record in the first game of a series.

HOME AND AWAY: The A's continue a 10-game road trip to New York-AL (1-2), Texas (2-2) and San Francisco (0-2 + one game) today...it is the first of three 10-game road trips...went 4-2 on the last road trip to Seattle (2-1) and Colorado (2-1) and are 21-15 (.583) on the road, which is the fifth best road record in the majors...the 36 road games are tied for the fourth fewest in baseball...are scheduled to play 27 of their next 42 games on the road...have won eight road series, lost two and split two...lost their first road series of the year over the weekend, snapping a season-opening streak of nine consecutive road series without a loss which was the longest such streak in Athletics history (previous: won the first eight road series in 1988)...it matched the longest at any point during the season over the last 32 years (May 16-July 21, 2019)...the last time the A's had a 10-series unbeaten streak on the road was Sept. 5, 1988 to May 11, 1989...went 8-1 on the last homestand against Arizona (2-0), Kansas City (3-1) and Los Angeles-AL (3-0)...it was the first time the A's won eight games on a homestand since going 8-2 against Tampa Bay, Texas and Houston from Aug. 30 to Sept. 8, 2013...are 25-18 (.581) at home.

HOME AND AWAY SPLITS: The A's are batting .252 (315-for-1251) with a .754 OPS on the road compared to .222 with a .707 OPS at home...have the third best road OPS and batting average in the majors...have the third lowest home batting average...have a 3.78 ERA (131 er in 312.0 ip) on the road, which is the fourth lowest in the American League and eighth lowest in the majors.

IN THE PINCH: A's pinch hitters are 7-for-20 with a double, five RBI and a sacrifice fly in their last 21 plate appearances dating back to June 6...lead the American League in hits (18), sacrifice flies (2), plate appearances (75) and RBI (13), are tied for third in home runs (2), and tied for second in extra base hits (4).

OFFENSE: The A's are hitting .263 (127-for-483) with 79 runs, 22 doubles and 20 home runs over the last 14 games, dating back to June 12, to boost their overall batting average to .237...lead the American League in hit by pitches (43), rank second in sacrifice flies (26), fifth in in walks (275), sixth in extra base hits (242), fifth in on-base percentage (.318) and tied for fifth in home runs (99)...are hitting .319 (61-for-191) with runners in scoring position in the month of June, which is second in the American League, and are now batting .267 (153-for-572) with RISP overall, which ranks fifth best in the AL.

PITCHING: The A's have compiled a 3.32 ERA (91 er in 247.0 ip) over the last 28 games...now have a 3.91 ERA for the season, which is fifth lowest in the American League...also have the fifth lowest opponents on-base percentage (.308) and OPS (.705)...have walked 216 batters, which is tied for second fewest in the AL...have the fifth fewest home runs allowed (86) but the fifth most hits allowed (661)...rank third in shutouts (7) and fewest pitches per inning (16.0).

STARTING PITCHING: Frankie Montas held the Giants scoreless before allowing a two-out, two-run home run in the fifth inning but did not factor into

the decision...starters are now 12-4 with a 3.00 ERA (44 er in 132.0 ip) over the last 21 games and have allowed just 12 home runs...are 31-25 with a 3.82 ERA (190 er in 447.1 ip) for the season...lead the majors in innings pitched (447.1) and are tied with the White Sox for the most complete games (3)...the complete games are the most by an A's team since 2015 (5).

BULLPEN: The A's bullpen converted 12-of-13 (92.3%) save opportunities and had a 3.50 ERA and .226 opponents batting average over the first 40 games through May 14...is 8-for-18 (44.4%) in save chances with a 4.90 ERA (60 er in 113.1 ip) in 39 games since then...is tied for fifth in the AL in saves...has the fifth fewest home runs in the AL (31), the second fewest walks (92), the seventh lowest opponents OPS (.701), fourth lowest on-base percentage (.311) and the eighth lowest slugging percentage (.390).

DEFENSIVE DOINGS: The A's snapped a season-long nine-game errorless streak Tuesday night...have 35 errors for the season, which is third fewest in the American League...rank third in fewest double plays (57)...A's outfielders have seven assists, which is sixth fewest in the AL.

CLOSE CALLS: The A's are 27-16 (.628) in games decided by three runs or fewer...are 19-17 (.528) in games decided by four or more...are 12-9 (.571) in one-run games...are tied with the Yankees and Mariners for the second most walk-off wins in the majors (6)...have two walk-off losses, tied for second fewest in the AL...are 9-5 in games decided in the last at bat...are 2-2 in extra inning games and are now 8-3 in extra innings over the last two years.

THIS AND THAT: The A's are 29-18 (.617) in night games compared to 17-15 (.531) during the day...have the fifth best record at night in the Majors...are 20-11 (.645) in games in which the opponent starts a left-handed pitcher compared to 26-22 (.542) when they start a right-hander...are 34-12 (.739) when scoring first...have used 76 different lineups over the first 77 games.

INTERLEAGUE PLAY: The A's are 7-5 (.583) in interleague play, which is the 11th best record in the majors...have 7 games remaining after today...after the current series in San Francisco (0-2 + one game), will travel to San Diego (July 27-28) and host San Diego (Aug. 3-4) and San Francisco (Aug. 20-22)...went 10-10 (.500) in interleague play last year and finished with a .500 record or better against the National League for the third consecutive season and 17th time in 24 years of interleague play...are 245-211 (.537) all-time in interleague games, which is fourth best in Major League history.

A's vs. GIANTS: The A's have dropped the two games against the Giants...won the season series last year, 5-1...it matched their best record against the Giants (2007)...won two of three in Oakland and swept a three-game series in San Francisco...in 24 seasons of interleague play, the A's have won nine season series, lost five and split 10...are 69-63 all-time against the Giants during interleague play...that breaks down to 38-27 in Oakland and 31-36 in San Francisco...are 27-33 at Oracle Park.

TODAY'S TIDBITS

Matt Olson is hitting .422 (43-for-102) with 12 home runs and 31 RBI in 29 day games...leads the AL in batting, OPS (1.336), slugging (.853), on-base percentage (.483) and RBI during the day and is tied for first in home runs...**Matt Chapman** has hit safely in each of his last 14 games and is 18-for-56 (.321) with 13 runs, four doubles, a triple, five home runs and 15 RBI over that span...is batting .278 (23-for-83) in June...**Mitch Moreland** is 4-for-9 (.444) as a pinch hitter and is third in the AL in pinch hits...**Deolis Guerra** has a .095 OPS against lefties, which is the lowest mark in the majors.

THIS DATE IN ATHLETICS HISTORY

In **1987** Mark McGwire ties a pair of Oakland records by hitting three home runs and scoring five runs in the A's 13-3 win at Cleveland...McGwire has four hits and drives in five runs...in **1996** the A's hit a franchise record eight home runs in a 18-2 win at California...the A's also collect an Oakland record 44 total bases and 11 extra base hits and score in eight different innings, tying an American League record...in **2002** Miguel Tejada plays in his 348th consecutive game, breaking Alfredo Griffin's Oakland record for consecutive games played...Tejada's streak reached 594 before signing with Baltimore as a free agent.

TODAY'S STARTING PITCHER: Cole Irvin (5-7, 3.98 ERA)

FOR STARTERS: Is 2-2 with a 4.59 ERA (17 er in 33.1 ip) and a .319 (44-for-138) opponents batting average over his last six starts after going 3-4 with a 3.02 ERA and .235 opponents average over his first eight starts...has seven losses, which is tied for sixth most in the American League.

DON'T WALK: Has walked two batters or fewer in each of his 15 starts, including nine starts with one walk and three starts with no walks...has issued just 15 free passes in 86.0 innings and his average of 1.57 walks per nine innings is third lowest in the American League (Cole, NYY 1.40; Yarbrough, TB 1.57)...is averaging the second fewest strikeouts per nine innings (6.28), but is tied for ninth in strikeout-to-walk ratio (4.00)...has walked one batter or fewer in 14 of his 18 career starts and has walked just 29 batters in 131.1 career innings (1.99 per nine innings).

HOME AND AWAY: Is 3-2 with a 3.15 ERA (12 er in 34.1 ip) in six starts on the road compared to 2-5 with a 4.53 ERA (26 er in 51.2 ip) in nine starts at home...is tied for second in home losses.

DAYS REST: Is 5-0 with a 1.67 ERA (8 er in 43.0 ip) and .241 (39-for-162) opponents batting average in seven starts on five days rest or more compared to 0-6 with a 6.05 ERA (26 er in 38.2 ip) and .302 (49-for-162) opponents average in seven starts on four days rest.

LEFT AND RIGHT: Has allowed a .263 (67-for-255) batting average against right-handed hitters compared to .318 (28-for-88) against left-handers...the mark against lefties is second highest in the American League (Foltynewicz, TEX .328) and his .852 OPS is fourth highest...however, has issued 13 of his 15 walks to righties...his career splits are .262 (100-for-381) with a .720 OPS against right-handers, .352 (51-for-145) with a .919 OPS against lefties.

INTERLEAGUE PLAY: Is scheduled to make his second interleague start of the season...earned the win in his start against Colorado on June 5 (6.0 ip, 6 h, 1 r, 1 bb, 5 so)...he is 2-0 with a 1.76 ERA (3 er for 15.1 ip) over four career interleague games (two starts)...went 1-for-2 at the plate with a sacrifice bunt on June 5...is 2-for-6 with two walks and a sacrifice in 15 career games with a plate appearance.

THIS AND THAT: Is averaging 14.5 pitches per inning, which is the fewest in the American League and fifth fewest in the majors...seven of the nine home runs he has allowed have been solo shots...is 5-1 in seven starts with more than two runs of support, 0-6 in six starts with support of two runs or fewer...has allowed one run or fewer in five of his 15 starts...the A's are 7-8 (.467) in his starting assignments.

2021 HIGHLIGHTS: Was on the A's Opening Day roster and lost each of his first two starts, allowing four runs in each contest for a 7.45 ERA...tossed 4.1 innings in his first start on April 3 against Houston, which was the shortest start of his career...also faced the Astros in his second start on April 8 but did not pitch again until April 17 against Detroit when he combined with Wendelken, Guerra and Weems on a five-hit shutout in a 7-0 win...it was his first win since May 17, 2019 against Colorado and it snapped a career-high four-game losing streak...that began a four-start stretch where he went 3-1 with a 1.42 ERA and .232 opponents batting average through May 4...tossed 6.0 scoreless innings in his start against the Tigers and then blanked the Orioles over the first five innings on April 23 for a career-high 11.0 inning scoreless streak...won back-to-back starts on the 17th and 23rd, marking the second time in his career he put together consecutive wins (May 12-17, 2019)...allowed just one run in 11. innings in the two starts...lost on April 28 at Tampa Bay but then picked up his third win on May 4 against Toronto...had career highs in innings pitched (8.0), strikeouts (9) and pitches (102) against the Blue Jays...then went 0-4 with a 5.40 ERA and .284 opponents batting average over his next five starts...the losing streak matched his career high (also May 22, 2019-April 8, 2021) and was the longest losing streak by an A's starting pitcher over the last three years...left with a 4-1 lead on May 15 at Minnesota but the pen allowed four runs in the eighth inning for the blown save...it was the first of two times the pen blew a save in one of his starts (June 11 vs. Kansas City)...allowed a season-high five runs in an 8-4 loss to Houston on May 20...allowed a career-high 10 hits in 4.2 innings of work in a 4-3 loss to Seattle on May 25...went 1-4 with a 4.46 ERA in six starts in May...tied for second in the American League in losses in May...allowed a run in the first inning on June 5 at Colorado and did not allow another run until the seventh inning of his next start on June 11 against Kansas City for a career-high tying 11.0-inning scoreless streak...allowed four runs for seventh time this season on June 22 at Texas.

LAST START: Picked up his fifth win of the season in the A's 13-6 victory over the Rangers last Tuesday in Texas...tossed four scoreless innngs before allowing four runs in the bottom of the fifth inning...allowed RBI doubles to Willie Calhoun and Charlie Culberson and RBI singles to Eli White and Adolis Garcia...was relieved by Smith to start the sixth inning with the A's leading 9-4...Oakland scored four times in the top of the ninth and won 13-6.

2020 RECAP: Had two stints with Philadelphia and was 0-1 with a 17.18 ERA in three relief appearances...opponents went 11-for-21 (.524) but he walked just one and struck out four in 3.2 innings...allowed a .438 (7-for-16) average against right-handed hitters compared to .800 (4-for-5) against left-handers...was 2-0 with a 4.50 ERA in four spring training appearances...was optioned to Lehigh Valley March 26 but was recalled on July 23 and was on the Phillies Opening Day roster...made his 2020 debut on July 26 against Miami and allowed four runs on five hits in an inning of relief and was the losing pitcher in an 11-6 decision...tossed a scoreless inning of relief Aug. 9 against Atlanta but was optioned to Philadelphia's alternate site on Aug. 9...was recalled for a second time Aug. 20, pitched the next day at Atlanta (1.2 ip, 4 h, 3 r, 3 er, 1 bb, 3 so) and was optioned Aug. 22...did not pitch the remainder of the season.

TOMORROW'S PROBABLE STARTING PITCHER
RHP James Kaprielian (4-1, 2.86 ERA): Was recalled from Triple-A Las Vegas May 12 and is scheduled to make his ninth start of the season and his career...has allowed two runs or fewer in six of his eight starts and five hits or fewer in all eight starts...has four wins, which are tied for fifth among American League rookies...has the third lowest ERA among AL rookies with 40 or more innings (2.86)...recieved a no decision in his last start, an 3-5 A's loss to Texas last Wednesday in Arlington (6.0 ip, 5 h, 2 r, 0 er, 2 bb, 4 so)...has never faced the Giants in his career...was the Yankees first round draft pick in 2015 but pitched in just eight games over his first four years as a professional...missed most of 2016 with an elbow injury and then missed the entire 2017 and 2018 seasons following April 18, 2017 "Tommy John" surgery...was traded to the A's with Dustin Fowler and Jorge Mateo at the 2017 trading deadline for Sonny Gray.

- Opponents are 2-for-19 (.105) with runners in scoring position, including 0-for-9 with the A's.
- Faced the Giants once this season with the Reds, throwing one scoreless inning with one hit, two walks, and two strikeouts...has opposed San Francisco four times in his career, allowing one run in 4.0 innings of work.
