## OAKLAND ATHLETICS (47-33) VS. TEXAS RANGERS (30-48)

TUESDAY, JUNE 29, 2021 — OAKLAND COLISEUM — 6:40 PDT

**ABOUT THE A'S:** Are 3-3 over the last six games but have lost six of the last night games after winning seven in a row...are 47-33 (.588) overall, which is the fourth best record in the American League and tied for sixth best in the majors...are in second place in the AL West for the eighth consecutive day and trail first place Houston by 1½ games...held at least a share of first for 61 of 62 days from April 20 to June 20...have spent 58 days alone in first place, three days tied for first, nine days in second, one day tied for second, three days in third, two days in fourth, three days tied for fourth and 10 days in fifth.

**THE HALFWAY POINT:** The A's are scheduled to play their 81st game today, which is the halfway point of the season...are on pace for 95 wins and a .588 winning percentage...had a .599 winning percentage or better in each of the previous three seasons and have not had a winning percentage of .566 or better in four consecutive seasons since 1927-32 when they did it six straight years...the pitching staff has 656 strikeouts and is on pace for 1,328, which would break the Athletics record of 1,299 set in 2019...the A's have been hit by a pitch 45 times, which puts them on pace to break the franchise record of 88 set in 2001...the defense has committed 35 errors and the fewest in a full season in Athletics history is 80 in 2019...individually, Matt Olson is slugging .585 and the A's have not had a player slug more than .549 since Jason Giambi in 2001 (.660)...has a .964 OPS, which would be the best since Giambi in 2001 (1.137)...Mark Canha has been hit by a pitch 13 times, which is seven short of the franchise record of 20 set by Don Baylor in 1976 and matched by Jason Kendall in 2005...Matt Chapman has 99 strikeouts and is on pace to break the franchise record of 197 by Jack Cust in 2008...Chris Bassitt has 102 strikeouts and only four pitchers in Oakland history have fanned 200 or more in a season (Blue, Stewart, Stottlemeyer, Zito)...he has hit 10 batters, which is three short of the Oakland record of 13 that he already shares with Barry Zito

**AFTER AN OFF DAY:** The A's are 9-0 following a day off and are the only undefeated team in the majors following a day off...have a 3.08 ERA (27 er in 79.0 ip) following a day off and are batting .252 (74-for-294) with 55 runs scored (6.1 runs per game).

**A'S IN JUNE:** The A's have clinched their third consecutive winning June as they are 16-8 (.667) with two games remaining...that is the second best record in the American League and tied for third best in the majors...went 16-11 in April and 15-14 in May...now have 10 consecutive months with a winning record (min. 10 games) and have just one losing month dating back to 2018 (11-15 in April of 2019)...have the third lowest ERA (3.59) and OPS (.698) in the AL this month and have issued the fewest walks (64)...starters have a 3.00 ERA, which is second lowest to the Astros (2.93)...the offense leads the AL in hit by pitches (14), ranks third in runs (133) and fourth in on-base percentage (.333)...are hitting .323 (64-for-198) with runners in scoring position, which is second best in the majors (Cleveland, .357)...over the last 26 years, the only time the A's have hit better than .320 with RISP in a month was in June, 2004 (.328)...have grounded into six double plays, which is the fewest in the majors...the last time the A's grounded into fewer than 10 double plays in a month with 12 or more games was in April, 1987 (5 in 23 games)...have out-scored the opposition 133-88 (+45) after being out-scored 242-231 (-11) in April and May.

**1,999 ATHLETICS:** Frank Schwindel was selected from Triple-A Las Vegas today and should he appear in a game, he will become the 2,000th player in Athletics history...the A's played their first game on April 26, 1901, hosting the Washington Senators...the first nine players in Athletics history were Jack Hayden (RF), Phil Geier (CF), Dave Fultz (SS), Nap Lajoie (2B), Socks Seybold (LF), Lave Cross (3B), Charlie Carr (1B), Doc Powers (C) and Chick Fraser (P)...Schwindel would become the 992nd player in Oakland history.

**OFFENSE:** The A's hit .184 (19-for-103) with two extra base hits (double, home run) and 11 runs scored in the three-game series at San Francisco over the weekend...lead the American League in hit by pitches (45), rank second in sacrifice flies (27), tied for fourth in triples (12) and fifth in doubles (131) and walks (282)...are fifth in batting with runners in scoring position (.269)...A's pinch hitters lead the AL in hits (18), RBI (14), sacrifice flies (2) and plate appearances (75) and are tied for second in extra base hits (4).

**PITCHING:** The A's have compiled a 3.27 ERA (93 er in 256.0 ip) over the last 29 games after logging a 4.24 ERA over the first 51 contests...have a 3.89 ERA for the season, which is fifth lowest in the American League...also have the fifth lowest opponents on-base percentage (.307), slugging percentage (.395) and OPS (.703)...have the second fewest walks (218) and the fourth fewest home runs (86)...rank second in fewest pitches per inning (16.0) and third in shutouts (7).

**STARTING PITCHING:** A's starting pitchers have allowed two runs or fewer in each of the last five games (6 er in 32.0 ip, 1.69 ERA) and are now 13-5 with a

2.83 ERA (44 er in 140.0 ip) in 23 games dating back to June 2...are 32-26 with a 3.76 ERA (190 er in 455.1 ip) for the season...rank second in the American League in wins and fourth in ERA...lead the majors in innings pitched (455.1) and are tied with the White Sox for the most complete games (3)...the complete games are the most by an A's team since 2015 (5).

**BULLPEN:** The A's bullpen has no saves, four blown saves, a 6.45 ERA (16 er in 22.1 ip) and .310 (27-for-87) opponents batting average over the last nine games...has converted 20-of-31 (64.5%) save opportunities overall, which is the fifth best percentage in the American League...has three losses over the last nine games after taking just four losses over the first 71 contests...the seven losses are the fewest in the majors...ranks second in the AL in fewest walks (92) and tied for second in fewest home runs (31)...has allowed 31-of-91 (34.1%) inherited runners to score, which is fifth highest in the AL...has the highest slugging percentage against first batters faced in the AL (.512), the second highest batting average (.280) and fourth highest on-base percentage (.353).

**DEFENSIVE DOINGS:** The A's have not committed an error over the last five games and have just one miscue over the last 15 contests...have 35 errors for the season, which is third fewest in the American League...are tied for third in fewest double plays (59).

**HOME AND AWAY:** The A's begin a six-game homestand against Texas (three games) and Boston (three games) tonight...went 8-1 on the last homestand against Arizona (2-0), Kansas City (3-1) and Los Angeles-AL (3-0)...it was the first time the A's won eight games on a homestand since going 8-2 against Tampa Bay, Texas and Houston from Aug. 30 to Sept. 8, 2013...are 25-18 (.581) at home compared to 22-15 (.595) on the road...the 43 home games are second most in the majors (Padres, 45)...have the third best road record in the American League...went 4-6 on the last road trip to New York-AL (1-2), Texas (2-2) and San Francisco (1-2)...following this homestand, the A's will play 26 of their next 36 games on the road.

**CLOSE CALLS:** The A's have six walk-off wins, which is tied for the most in the American League and tied for second most in the majors...now have 89 in the Bob Melvin era, which are the most in the majors over that span...are 12-9 (.571) in one-run games and the 12 wins are tied for third most in the AL...are 9-5 in games decided in the last at bat...are 2-2 in extra inning games and the four games are second fewest in the AL to the Royals (2).

**A'S vs. RANGERS:** The season series is even at two games each after the two clubs split a four-game series in Arlington last week...the A's did not play the Rangers over the first 73 games this year, but today is the fifth of 10 meetings with Texas over a 19-game stretch from June 21 to July 11...won the season series last year, 7-3...it was their fourth consecutive season series victory over the Rangers, which is just the second time the A's have won four consecutive season series against Texas (2002-05)...went 4-3 in Arlington last year and 3-0 in Oakland...have won 16 of the last 20 games and are 31-12 over the last 43 contests...have won seven of the last eight games and 25 of the last 31 in Oakland...are 46-25 (.648) against the Rangers over the last five years...are 387-378 all-time against the Texas Rangers...that breaks down to 203-176 in Oakland and 184-202 in Texas...are 6-5 at Globe Life Field...have an all-time record of 484-462 against the Rangers/Senators franchise.

### TODAY'S TIDBITS

**Matt Chapman** extended his hitting streak to 15 games on Sunday, which is a new career high, the longest active hitting streak in the majors and the second longest in the American League this year...is batting .328 (20-for-61) with 14 runs, four doubles, a triple, five home runs and 17 RBI during the streak...**Sean Murphy** has 37 of his 39 RBI as a catcher and he leads Major League catchers in RBI...**Matt Olson** ranks third in the American League in OPS (.964) and slugging (.585), tied for third in home runs (20), fifth in extra base hits (38), tied for fifth in sacrifice flies (5), tied for sixth in RBI (53) and 10th in on-base percentage (.379)...**Lou Trivino** has not allowed a run in 12 games in June (11.2 ip) and has not allowed an earned run over his last 20 games dating back to May 8 (20.0 ip, 2 r).

### THIS DATE IN ATHLETICS HISTORY

In **1925** Bill Lamar extends his hitting streak to an Athletics franchise record 29 consecutive games...in **1990** Dave Stewart pitches the fifth no-hitter in Oakland history in the A's 5-0 win at Toronto...after walking the first two hitters he faced, Stewart retired 25 in a row before a two-out walk in the ninth...in **1996** the A's hit three home runs at California, giving Oakland 18 home runs in their last four games, which ties the American League record...in **2003** Eric Byrnes becomes the fifth player in Oakland history to hit for the cycle and ties an Oakland record with five hits in a 5-2 win at San Francisco.

# TODAY'S STARTING PITCHER: James Kaprielian (4-1, 2.86 ERA)

**FOR STARTERS:** Was recalled from Triple-A Las Vegas May 12 and is scheduled to make his ninth start of the season and his career...has allowed two runs or fewer in six of his eight starts and has a 2.86 ERA, which is fifth lowest among American League rookies with 35 or more innings...his four wins are tied for fifth among AL rookies...is 2-0 with a 2.55 ERA (5 er in 17.2 ip) over his last three starts...went 2-0 with a 1.53 ERA over his first three starts and was 0-1 with a 6.23 ERA in two starts in between.

**FIVE HITS OR FEWER:** Has allowed five hits or fewer in each of his eight starts and has held the opposition to a .191 (30-for-157) batting average...that is 10th lowest among American League pitchers with 40 or more innings...has not allowed more than five hits in 10 career appearances...his shortest career outing is 1.2 innings and his career-opening streak of 10 consecutive games with five hits or fewer and 1.2 innings pitched or more is the longest in Athletics history...since 1901, the only American League or National League pitchers with longer such streaks are the Dodgers Caleb Ferguson (June 6-July 28, 2018) and the Yankees Bill Burbach (April 11-June 1, 1969).

**OPPONENTS BATTING:** His opponents batting average breaks down to .138 (12-for-87) with a .496 OPS against right-handed pitchers compared to .257 (18-for-70) with an .831 OPS against left-handers...has allowed a .111 (3-for-27) batting average with runners in scoring position and opponents are 0-for-9 with the bases loaded...has a .109 (7-for-64) opponents average the first time through the lineup, .300 (18-for-60) the second time and .152 (5-for-33) after that.

**HOME AND AWAY:** Is 2-0 with a 0.00 ERA (0 er in 13.0 ip) and .093 (4-for-43) opponents average in two starts at home compared to 2-1 with a 4.06 ERA (14 er in 31.0 ip) and .228 (26-for-114) opponents batting average in six starts on the road...has surrendered all six of his home runs on the road.

**BY INNING:** Has allowed one run in the first inning and none in the second inning and has a 0.56 ERA (1 er in 16.0 ip) and .113 (6-for-53) opponents average over innings one and two...has a 5.17 ERA (9 er in 15.2 ip) and .279 (17-for-61) in innings three and four and a 2.92 ERA (4 er in 12.1 ip) and .163 (7-for-43) from the fifth inning on.

**2021 HIGHLIGHTS:** Began the year at Triple-A Las Vegas and went 0-1 with a 3.86 ERA in one start...was the Aviators Opening Day starter on May 6 at Las Vegas and was the losing pitcher in an 8-1 loss to Sacramento (4.2 ip, 8 h, 2 r, 2 er, 1 bb, 5 so, 0 hr, 76 pitches)...was recalled by Oakland on May 12 and made his first Major League start that day at Boston...allowed a run on four hits in 5.0 innings to earn his first ML win in the A's 4-1 victory over the Red Sox...struck out a career-high nine batters and had a career-high 99 pitches in his second start on May 21 at Los Angeles (AL)...had a no decision in an 8-4 A's win...left with a 3-2 lead and two outs in the bottom of the sixth but Petit allowed a run for the blown save...it was the first of two starts in which he left with the lead only to have the bullpen blow the save (June 23 at Texas)...tossed 7.0 scoreless innings May 26 against Seattle for his second win...that matched his longest outing as a professional...also tossed 7.0 innings for Single-A Tampa at Charlotte on April 16, 2016, his second professional appearance...logged a season-low 3.2 innings May 31 at Seattle but had a no decision in the A's 6-5, 10-inning loss...allowed a career-high four runs on a career-high five hits (also had five hits June 6 at Colorado and June 23 at Texas)...was charged with the first loss of his career when he allowed two runs in 5.0 innings on June 6 at Colorado, a 3-1 A's loss...pitched 6.0 scoreless innings and allowed just two hits on June 12 to defeat Kansas City 11-2...walked a career-high four.

**LAST START:** He had a no decision in the A's 5-3 loss at Texas last Wednesday...blanked the Rangers on two hits and a walk over the first four innings before allowing a RBI double to Heim with two outs in the fifth...also surrendered a solo home run to Garcia in the sixth to give Texas a 2-0 lead...Oakland then scored three times in the seventh and he was relieved by Petit to start the bottom of the seventh...Petit allowed two runs for the blown save.

**2020 RECAP:** Made his Major League debut and had two relief appearances over five stints with Oakland...compiled a 7.36 ERA and .267 opponents batting average...allowed two home runs in 3.2 innings, walked two and struck out four...was recalled for the first time Aug. 4 but did not pitch before he was optioned back to the A's alternate site on Aug. 6...joined the club a second time Aug. 16 and made his ML debut that day at San Francisco (2.0 ip, 1 h, 1 r, 1 er, 1 bb, 1 so)...relieved Fiers to start the seventh inning with the A's leading 13-2 and allowed a home run to the first batter he faced (Crawford)...walked the next batter (Dubon) before retiring each of the final six batters he faced...struck out Solano to end the seventh inning for his first strikeout...was optioned on Aug. 19...was recalled as the 29th man for doubleheaders on Sept. 8 and Sept. 14 but did not pitch...recalled for his fifth stint on Sept. 24 and made one appearance in the second game of the Sept. 26 double-header against Seattle (1.2 ip, 3 h, 2 r, 2 er, 1 bb, 3 so)...inherited a bases loaded situation in the third inning with the A's trailing 4-1 and allowed all three runs to score...was on the Taxi Squad for the postseason...was rated as the A's number 10 prospect by *Baseball America* following the season.

**CAREER NOTES:** Made his Major League debut with Oakland in 2020 after pitching in just 27 games over his first five professional seasons due to elbow problems...compiled a 7.36 ERA and .267 opponents batting average in two relief appearances with the A's...is 6-6 with a 3.00 ERA (34 er in 102.0 ip) in 28 games, including 23 starts, as a minor leaguer...has 116 strikeouts in 102.0 innings (10.24 per nine innings)...was the New York Yankees first round draft pick in 2015 but pitched in just eight games over his first four years as a professional...missed most of 2016 with an elbow injury and then missed the entire 2017 and 2018 seasons following April 18, 2017 "Tommy John" surgery...was traded to the A's at the 2017 trading deadline in the Sonny Gray deal and is the last remaining player from that deal that also netted the A's Dustin Fowler and Jorge Mateo...pitched for Scottsdale in the Arizona Fall League in 2016...was rated by *Baseball America* as the Yankees No. 4 prospect following the 2015 season and No. 5 following 2016...was the A's No. 8 prospect after the 2017 season and No. 10 following 2020.

**TOMORROW'S PROBABLE STARTING PITCHER**  
**RHP Chris Bassitt (8-2, 3.25 ERA):** Lost each of his first two starts this year but is 8-0 with a 2.95 ERA and .207 opponents batting average in 14 starts since then...the winning streak is an on-going career high...is tied for second in the American League in wins (8), ranks third in innings pitched (99.2), tied for third in winning percentage (.800), fifth in opponents slugging percentage (.348), seventh in ERA (3.25), opponents OPS (.632) and strikeouts (102) and ninth in opponents batting average (.217)... has allowed four runs or fewer in each of his 27 starts over the last two years and is 13-4 with a 2.88 ERA over that span...has a 2.53 ERA in his career in Oakland, which is fifth lowest in Coliseum history among pitchers with 200 or more innings...was the winning pitcher in his last start, a 5-1 A's win at Texas last Thursday (7.0 ip, 5 h, 1 r, 1 er, 3 bb, 4 so)...is 3-2 with a 4.30 ERA (37.2 ip, 36 h, 19 r, 18 er, 16 bb, 40 so, 4 hr) in 10 career appearances, including six starts, against the Rangers.

- Is 0-1 with a save, four blown saves, a 4.70 ERA (8 er in 15.1 ip) and six home runs allowed in his last 17 games dating back to May 15 but seven of his last 10 outings have been scoreless...was 2-0, converted each of his five save opportunities, had a 2.12 ERA and allowed no home runs over his first 17 games (17.0 ip).
- Ranks tied for eighth among American League relievers in strikeouts (45).
- Has held right-handed hitters to a .187 (14-for-75) average but they have hit five of the six of the home runs he has allowed.
- Has a 5.87 ERA (5 er in 7.2 ip) and .313 (10-for-32) opponents batting average in eight outings on no days rest, a 1.88 ERA (5 er in 24.0 ip) and .155 (13-for-84) opponents average in 25 appearances on one day of rest or more.
- Faced Texas twice last week, allowing one earned run in 1.2 innings pitched across two outings...has faced them nine times in his career, logging a 7.88 ERA (7 er, 8.0 ip) in nine appearances.
- Has six saves, which surpasses his career high of four with Texas in 2016.

**Last Year:** Allowed just two runs in 21 appearances and only one was earned for a 0.42 ERA...ranked second among Major League relievers in ERA and opponents slugging percentage (.157), fifth in batting average (.114) and seventh in OPS (.410)
