OAKLAND ATHLETICS (47-34) VS. TEXAS RANGERS (31-48)

WEDNESDAY, JUNE 30, 2021 — OAKLAND COLISEUM — 6:40 PDT

ABOUT THE A'S: Have lost three of the last four games and seven of the last 10 after winning seven in a row...are 47-34 (.580) overall, which is the fifth best record in the American League...are in second place in the AL West for the ninth consecutive day and trail first place Houston by 1½ games for the second consecutive day...held at least a share of first for 61 of 62 days from April 20 to June 20...have spent 58 days alone in first place, three days tied for first, 10 days in second, one day tied for second, three days in third, two days in fourth, three days tied for fourth and 10 days in fifth.

A'S IN JUNE: The A's have clinched their third consecutive winning June as they are 16-9 (.640) entering the final game today...that is the second best record in the American League (Astros, 19-8) and tied for fifth best in the majors...went 16-11 in April and 15-14 in May...now have 10 consecutive months with a winning record (min. 10 games) and have just one losing month dating back to 2018 (11-15 in April of 2019)...have the third lowest ERA (3.65) and OPS (.703) in the AL this month and have issued the fewest walks (65)...starters have a 3.06 ERA, which is second lowest to the Astros (2.96)...the offense ranks second in the AL in hit by pitches (14), third in runs (137) and fifth in on-base percentage (.330), walks (84) and doubles (45)...are hitting .318 (64-for-201) with runners in scoring position, which is second best in the majors (Cleveland, .357)...have grounded into six double plays, which is the fewest in the majors...the last time the A's grounded into fewer than 10 double plays in a month with 12 or more games was in April, 1987 (5 in 23 games)...have out-scored the opposition 137-93 (+44) after being out-scored 242-231 (-11) in April and May.

CLOSE CALLS: The A's lost 5-4 last night and six of their last seven losses have been by two runs or fewer...are 18-17 (.514) in games decided by two runs or fewer compared to 29-17 (.630) in games decided by three runs or more...are 12-10 (.545) in one-run games and the 12 wins are tied for third most in the American League...have six walk-off wins, which is tied for the most in the AL and tied for second most in the majors (Rockies, 7)...now have 89 in the Bob Melvin era, which are the most in the majors over that span...are 9-5 in games decided in the last at bat...are 2-2 in extra inning games and the four games are second fewest in the AL to the Royals (2).

THE HALFWAY POINT: The A's played their 81st game yesterday, which is the halfway point of the season...are on pace for 94 wins and a .580 winning percentage...had a .599 winning percentage or better in each of the previous three seasons and have not had a winning percentage of .566 or better in four consecutive seasons since 1927-32 when they did it six straight years...the pitching staff has 663 strikeouts and is on pace for 1,326, which would break the Athletics record of 1,299 set in 2019...the A's have been hit by a pitch 45 times, which puts them on pace to break the franchise record of 88 set in 2001...the defense has committed 36 errors and the fewest in a full season in Athletics history is 80 in 2019...individually, Matt Olson is slugging .577 and the A's have not had a player slug more than .549 since Jason Giambi in 2001 (.660)...has a .951 OPS, which would be the best since Giambi in 2001 (1.137)...Mark Canha has been hit by a pitch 13 times, which is seven short of the franchise record of 20 set by Don Baylor in 1976 and matched by Jason Kendall in 2005...Matt Chapman has 100 strikeouts and is on pace to break the franchise record of 197 by Jack Cust in 2008...Chris Bassitt has 102 strikeouts and only four pitchers in Oakland history have fanned 200 or more in a season (Blue, Stewart, Stottlenmyre, Zito)...he has hit 10 batters, which is three short of the Oakland record of 13 that he already shares with Barry Zito.

1,999 ATHLETICS: Frank Schwindel was selected from Triple-A Las Vegas yesterday and should he appear in a game, he will become the 2,000th player in Athletics history...the A's played their first game on April 26, 1901, hosting the Washington Senators...the first nine players in Athletics history were Jack Hayden (RF), Phil Geier (CF), Dave Fultz (SS), Nap Lajoie (2B), Socks Seybold (LF), Lave Cross (3B), Charlie Carr (1B), Doc Powers (C) and Chick Fraser (P)...Schwindel would become the 992nd player in Oakland history.

OFFENSE: The A's are batting .251 (344-for-1369) with 204 runs scored over the last 41 games (4.98 runs per game) after hitting .219 with 164 runs scored over the first 40 contests (4.10 runs per game)...lead the American League in hit by pitches (45), rank second in sacrifice flies (27), tied for fourth in triples (12) and fifth in doubles (133) and walks (284)...A's pinch hitters lead the AL in hits (18), RBI (14), sacrifice flies (2) and plate appearances (76) and are tied for second in extra base hits (4).

PITCHING: The A's have compiled a 3.33 ERA (98 er in 265.0 ip) over the last 30 games after logging a 4.24 ERA over the first 51 contests...have a 3.90 ERA for the season, which is fifth lowest in the American League...also have

the fifth lowest opponents on-base percentage (.307), slugging percentage (.397) and OPS (.704)...are tied with the Yankees for the fewest walks (219) and have the fourth fewest home runs (89)...rank second in fewest pitches per inning (16.0) and third in shutouts (7).

STARTING PITCHING: A's starting pitchers are 13-6 with a 2.90 ERA (47 er in 146.0 ip) over the last 24 games dating back to June 2...are 32-27 with a 3.77 ERA (193 er in 461.1 ip) for the season...rank second in the American League in wins and fourth in ERA...lead the majors in innings pitched (461.1) and are tied with the White Sox for the most complete games (3)...the complete games are the most by an A's team since 2015 (5).

BULLPEN: The A's bullpen has no saves, four blown saves, a 6.39 ERA (18 er in 25.1 ip) and .303 (30-for-99) opponents batting average over the last nine games...has converted 20-of-31 (64.5%) save opportunities overall, which is the fifth best percentage in the American League...has three losses over the last 10 games after taking just four losses over the first 71 contests...the seven losses are the fewest in the majors...ranks second in the AL in fewest walks (93) and tied for third in fewest home runs (32)...has allowed 31-of-91 (34.1%) inherited runners to score, which is fifth highest in the AL...has the highest slugging percentage against first batters faced in the AL (.509), the second highest batting average (.280) and fourth highest on-base percentage (.353).

DEFENSIVE DOINGS: The A's committed just their second error over the last 16 games last night...have 36 errors for the season, which is third fewest in the American League...have the third fewest double plays (59).

HOME AND AWAY: The A's are 0-1 on this six-game homestand against Texas (0-1) and Boston (three games)...went 8-1 on the last homestand against Arizona (2-0), Kansas City (3-1) and Los Angeles-AL (3-0)...it was the first time the A's won eight games on a homestand since going 8-2 against Tampa Bay, Texas and Houston from Aug. 30 to Sept. 8, 2013...are 25-19 (.568) at home compared to 22-15 (.595) on the road...the 44 home games are tied for second most in the majors (Padres, 45)...have the second best road record in the American League...went 4-6 on the last road trip to New York-AL (1-2), Texas (2-2) and San Francisco (1-2)...following this homestand, the A's will play 26 of their next 36 games on the road.

A's vs. RANGERS: The A's are 2-3 against the Rangers...lost the first game in Oakland last night after splitting a four-game series in Texas last week...the A's did not play the Rangers over the first 73 games this year, but today is the sixth of 10 meetings with Texas over a 19-game stretch from June 21 to July 11...won the season series last year, 7-3...it was their fourth consecutive season series victory over the Rangers, which is just the second time the A's have won four consecutive season series against Texas (2002-05)...went 4-3 in Arlington last year and 3-0 in Oakland...have won 16 of the last 21 games and are 31-13 over the last 44 contests...have won seven of the last nine games and 25 of the last 32 in Oakland...are 46-26 (.639) against the Rangers over the last five years...are 387-379 all-time against the Texas Rangers...that breaks down to 203-177 in Oakland and 184-202 in Texas...are 6-5 at Globe Life Field...have an all-time record of 484-463 against the Rangers/Senators franchise.

TODAY'S TIDBITS

Matt Chapman extended his hitting streak to 16 games yesterday, which is a career high, the longest active hitting streak in the majors and the second longest in the American League this year (Altuve, 17)...it is the longest by an A's third baseman since Carney Lansford had a 24-game streak from July 26-Aug. 23, 1989...is batting .323 (21-for-65) with 15 runs, four doubles, a triple, six home runs and 18 RBI during the streak...**Sean Murphy** has 37 of his 39 RBI as a catcher and he leads Major League catchers in RBI...**Matt Olson** ranks third in the AL in OPS (.951) and slugging (.577), tied for third in home runs (20), tied for fifth in sacrifice flies (5), tied for sixth in RBI (53) and seventh in extra base hits (38)...**Lou Trivino** has not allowed a run in 12 games in June (11.2 ip)...over the last 44 years, the only A's pitcher with more innings in June without allowing a run is Brad Ziegler (12.2 in 2008)...has not allowed an earned run over his last 20 games dating back to May 8 (20.0 ip, 2 r).

THIS DATE IN ATHLETICS HISTORY

In **1995** Mark McGwire hits a two-out grand slam in the bottom of the ninth inning off California's Lee Smith to lift the A's to an 8-5 victory over the Angels...in **2001** Miguel Tejada has three home runs and eight RBI in the A's 15-4 win at Texas.

TODAY'S STARTING PITCHER: Chris Bassitt (8-2, 3.25 ERA)

EIGHT-GAME WINNING STREAK: Lost each of his first two starts this year but is 8-0 with a 2.95 ERA (29 er in 88.1 ip) and .207 (67-for-323) opponents batting average in 14 starts since then...the winning streak is an on-going career high and is tied for the longest streak in the majors this year (Hendricks, CHC and Flaherty, STL)...has left with the lead in three of his six no decisions only to have the bullpen blow the save...the A's are 12-4 (.750) in his starting assignments.

AMONG THE LEADERS: Is tied for second in the American League in wins (8), ranks third in innings pitched (99.2), tied for third in winning percentage (.800), fifth in opponents slugging percentage (.348), seventh in ERA (3.25), opponents OPS (.632) and strikeouts (102) and ninth in opponents batting average (.217)...has allowed nine home runs and his average of 0.81 home runs per nine innings is fifth lowest...has hit 10 batters, which is the most in the AL and three short of the Oakland record of 13...he also hit 13 batters in 2019, which tied the record set by Barry Zito (2001, 2005 and 2006)...ranks fifth in the AL in fewest pitches per inning (15.0)...is scheduled to make his 17th start today, which will tie him for the AL lead.

FOUR RUNS OR FEWER: Has allowed four runs or fewer in each of his 27 starts over the last two years and is 13-4 with a 2.88 ERA (52 er in 162.2 ip) over that span...has a streak of 27 consecutive games with four runs or fewer and 3.0 innings pitched or more, which is the longest such streak in Athletics history (previous: 25 by Vida Blue from April 9-July 30, 1971)...has not allowed more than four runs in a start since yielding seven runs in his final start of 2019 (Sept. 13 at Texas).

HOME AND AWAY: Is 3-2 with a 2.93 ERA (15 er in 46.0 ip) in seven starts home compared to 5-0 with a 3.52 ERA (21 er in 53.2 ip) in nine starts on the road...is tied for second in the American League in road wins...now has a six-game winning streak on the road dating back to Sept. 12, 2020 and has not lost on the road since Aug. 29, 2020 at Houston...has a 12-12 career record in the Coliseum, but has a 2.53 ERA (66 er in 234.1 ip), which is fifth lowest in Coliseum history among pitchers with 200 or more innings pitched.

OPPONENTS BATTING: Has held left-handed hitters to a .189 (34-for-180) batting average...however, has surrendered seven of his nine home runs this year and 25 of 36 over the last three years to lefties...seven of his nine home runs this year have come with the bases empty...opponents are 2-for-25 (.080) with runners in scoring position over his last four starts and are hitting .181 (15-for-83) with RISP overall, which ranks eighth in the American League.

DAYS REST: Is scheduled to start on five days rest today...is 4-0 with a 2.82 ERA (14 er in 44.2 ip) in seven starts on exactly five days rest and now has a nine-game winning streak in those games dating back to July 19, 2019...has a 2.80 ERA (28 er in 90.0 ip) in 15 starts over that span...according to TruMedia, the longest winning streak in starts on five days rest in Oakland history is 10 by Mike Fiers (May 7-Aug. 27, 2019) and Mark Mulder (June 18, 2002-July 10, 2003)...is 3-1 with a 3.59 ERA (17 er in 42.2 ip) and six home runs in seven starts on four days rest this year compared to 5-0 with a 2.79 ERA (16 er in 51.2 ip) and three home runs in eight starts on five days rest or more.

IN JUNE: Is 3-0 with a 3.34 ERA (11 er in 29.2 ip) in five starts after going 3-0 with a 2.52 ERA in five starts in May...also won three games in September of 2020 but has never won four games in a month.

THE LAST THREE YEARS: Is 23-9 (.719) with a 3.32 ERA (113 er in 306.2 ip) in 55 games (52 starts) over the last three years...based on a minimum of 250 innings pitched, he ranks second in the American League in winning percentage over that span, fourth in ERA and fifth in opponents OPS (.669)...is eighth in wins...the A's are 35-17 (.673) in his starting assignments over the last three years...was 4-14 (.222) with a 3.86 ERA in 40 games (30 starts) over his first four seasons.

2021 HIGHLIGHTS: Was the A's Opening Day starting pitcher and took the loss in an 8-1 decision to Houston on April 1 in Oakland...became the A's 14th different Opening Day starting pitcher over the last 16 years (Zito, Haren, Blanton, Braden, Sheets, Cahill, McCarthy, Anderson, Gray twice, Hill, Graveman twice, Fiers, Montas)...allowed a run in the fourth inning to snap a 16.2-inning scoreless streak during the regular season and a 27.1-inning home scoreless streak, which was ninth longest in Oakland history...lost his second start on April 6, a 5-1 loss to Los Angeles (NL) on April 6 in Oakland when he allowed a season-high four runs on a season-high nine hits in 6.0 innings...allowed two home runs in the third, which were his first home runs

in the Coliseum since Aug. 24, 2019...that snapped a 10-game, 55.1-inning, 229-batter homerless streak in Oakland...that ran his record to 0-2 with a 5.56 ERA...then allowed exactly two runs in each of his next six starts to become the second pitcher in Athletic history to allow exactly two runs in six consecutive games...joins Bob Davis of the Kansas City A's, who did it all in relief from Aug. 8-26, 1960...went 3-0 with a 2.92 ERA over that stretch which ran from April 12 to May 11...allowed just two hits in 5.0 innings for the win on April 12 at Arizona but walked a season-high five batters...tied an Oakland record with three hit batters April 29 at Tampa Bay (12th time, last: Fiers, June 22, 2019, also against Tampa Bay)...left his start on May 5 against Toronto with a 3-2 lead but ended up win a no decision in the A's 9-4 loss...Trivino allowed five runs in the eighth inning for the blown save...it was the first of three times he left with a lead only to have the bullpen blow the save (also May 16 at Minnesota and June 19 at New York-AL)...struck out a season-high 10 batters in a 3-2 win at Boston on May 11...it was his third career game of 10 or more strikeouts...did not walk a batter, the second time he has fanned 10 or more without issuing a free pass...is one of nine pitchers in Oakland history with two such games...allowed a season-high tying four runs in a no decision at Minnesota on May 16...tossed his first career complete game and shutout May 27 against Los Angeles (AL), a two-hitter in the A's 5-0 win...had a season-high 114 pitches, struck out nine and walked one...it came in his 77th career start, his 72nd with the A's...the 71 consecutive starts without a complete games is the second longest streak in Athletics history (113, Barry Zito, Aug. 22, 2003-Sept. 28, 2006)...finished May with a 3-0 record, a 2.52 ERA and .175 opponents batting average in five starts...struck out 38 and walked just four in 35.2 innings...allowed a season-high tying four runs in a season-low 4.0 innings June 1 at Seattle but had a no decision in the A's 12-6 win.

LAST START: He was the winning pitcher in the A's 5-1 win over Texas last Thursday at Arlington...Oakland scored three times in the first inning and he allowed a run in the second on a Solak RBI ground out...that would be the only run he would surrender in seven innings of work...was relieved by Diekmann to start the eighth with the A's leading 5-1.

BASSITT vs. TEXAS: Is 3-2 with a 4.30 ERA (37.2 ip, 36 h, 19 r, 18 er, 16 bb, 40 so, 4 hr) in 10 career appearances, including six starts...is 1-1 with a 3.00 ERA (5 er in 15.0 ip) in five games in Oakland and 2-0 with a 1.38 ERA (2 er in 13.0 ip) in two starts at Globe Life Field...went 0-1 with a 10.24 ERA (11 er in 9.2 ip) in three games at Globe Life Park...was the winning pitcher in his only start this year, a 5-1 A's win at Texas last Thursday (see last start above)...was 1-0 with a 1.50 ERA (6.0 ip, 8 h, 1 r, 1 er, 2 bb, 8 so, 1 hr) in one start last year.
