OAKLAND ATHLETICS (48-36) VS. BOSTON RED SOX (52-31)

ABOUT THE A'S: Have lost two straight, five of the last seven and nine of the last 13 games...are 48-36 (.571) overall, which is the fifth best record in the American League...are in second place in the AL West for the 12th consecutive day and trail first place Houston by 2½ games...held at least a share of first for 61 of 62 days from April 20 to June 20...have spent 58 days alone in first place, three days tied for first, 13 days in second, one day tied for second, three days in third, two days in fourth, three days tied for fourth and 10 days in fifth.

CLOSE CALLS: The A's lost 3-2 in 10 innings last night and have now dropped each of their last three extra inning games...are 2-3 in extra innings and the five extra inning games are tied for second fewest in the American League (Royals, 2)...all five games have lasted 10 innings...have a four-game losing streak in one-run games and are 12-11 (.522) in one-run games for the season...are tied for third in the AL in one-run wins...are 19-18 (.514) in games decided by two runs or fewer compared to 29-18 (.617) in games decided by three runs or more...have six walk-off wins, which is tied for second most in the AL (Mariners, 8)...now have 89 in the Bob Melvin era, which are the most in the majors over that span...are 9-6 in games decided in the last at bat.

OFFENSE: The A's are batting .174 (40-for-230) with 23 runs scored (3.3 per game) over the last seven games...A's leadoff hitters are 2-for-25 (.080) with no runs, two walks and four hit by pitches over that span, which coincides with the date Mark Canha went on the injured list (June 25)...the A's lead the American League in hit by pitches (48), rank second in sacrifice flies (28), fourth in fewest grounded into double plays (52) and fifth in walks (290)...are batting .250 (12-for-48) with the bases loaded, which is second lowest in the AL (Twins, .203)...A's right fielders have the second lowest batting average in the AL (.199) as do their designated hitters (.220).

IN THE PINCH: A's pinch hitters lead the American League in hits (18), RBI (14), sacrifice flies (2) and plate appearances (79) and are tied for second in extra base hits (4).

PITCHING: The A's have compiled a 3.35 ERA (109 er in 293.0 ip) over the last 33 games after logging a 4.24 ERA over the first 51 contests...have a 3.89 ERA for the season, which is fifth lowest in the American League...also have the fifth lowest opponents on-base percentage (.307), slugging percentage (.398) and OPS (.705)...are tied with the Yankees for the fewest walks (226), rank second in fewest pitches per inning (16.0), third in shutouts (7) and tied for fourth in fewest home runs (94).

STARTING PITCHING: A's starting pitchers are 14-7 with a 2.91 ERA (53 er in 163.2 ip) over the last 27 games dating back to June 2...are 33-28 with a 3.74 ERA (199 er in 479.0 ip) for the season...rank third in the American League in ERA and wins...lead the majors in innings pitched (479.0) and are tied with the White Sox and Rockies for the most complete games (3)...the complete games are the most by an A's team since 2015 (5)...Cole Irvin is scheduled to make his 17th start of the season today and the A's will become the first team in the majors with four pitchers with 17 or more starts...have used just seven starting pitchers this year, which is second fewest in the majors to the Red Sox (6)...are one of two teams with five pitchers with six or more wins (White Sox).

BULLPEN: The A's bullpen has one save, four blown saves, a 5.80 ERA (23 er in 35.2 ip) and .297 (41-for-138) opponents batting average over the last 13 games...has converted 21-of-32 (65.6%) save opportunities overall, which is the fifth best percentage in the American League...has four losses over the last 13 games after taking just four losses over the first 71 contests...the eight losses are tied with the Brewers for the fewest in the majors...has the highest slugging percentage against first batters faced in the AL (.516), the second highest batting average (.283) and fourth highest on-base percentage (.352).

DEFENSIVE DOINGS: The A's have committed just two errors over the last 19 games and have 36 errors for the season, which is third fewest in the American League...are tied for the third fewest double plays (62)...A's pitchers have five pickoffs, which is tied for third most.

HOME AND AWAY: The A's are 1-3 on this six-game homestand against Texas (1-2) and Boston (0-1)...went 8-1 on the last homestand against Arizona (2-0), Kansas City (3-1) and Los Angeles-AL (3-0)...it was the first time the A's won eight games on a homestand since going 8-2 against Tampa Bay, Texas and Houston from Aug. 30 to Sept. 8, 2013...are 26-21 (.553) at home and the 47 home games are the most in the majors...following this homestand, the A's will play 26 of their next 36 games on the road...that begins with a

six-game road trip to Houston (three games) and Texas (three games) starting Tuesday that will take the A's into the All-Star Break...went 4-6 on the last road trip to New York-AL (1-2), Texas (2-2) and San Francisco (1-2) and are 22-15 (.595) on the road...have the second best road record in the American League.

THIS AND THAT: The A's are 22-12 (.647) in games in which the opponent starts a left-handed pitcher compared to 26-24 (.520) when they start a right-hander...the mark against lefties is second best in the American League (White Sox, 18-7/.720) and the 34 games are second most (Astros, 36)...are 36-13 (.735) when scoring first, which is third best in the AL...are 30-20 (.600) in night games, 18-16 (.529) during the day...are 30-7 when out-homering the opposition, 6-22 when they are out-homered...have used 81 different lineups over the first 84 games...have an average time of game of 3:04, which is fastest in the AL and third in the majors...Frank Schwindel made his A's debut on Wednesday to become the 2,000th player in Athletics history.

A'S IN JUNE: The A's finished the month of June with a 17-9 record (.654) record, which was second best in the American League (Astros, 19-9) and tied for fourth best in the majors...it was their third consecutive winning June and have won 17 games in each of those Junes...went 16-11 in April and 15-14 in May and now have 10 consecutive months with a winning record (min. 10 games)...have just one losing month dating back to 2018 (11-15 in April of 2019)...had the second lowest ERA (3.55) and OPS (.697) in the AL and issued the fewest walks (66)...starters had a 2.92 ERA, which was the lowest in the majors...the offense tied for second in the AL in hit by pitches (14) and ranked fifth in runs (140) and on-base percentage (.326)...hit .314 with runners in scoring position, which was second best in the majors (Cleveland, .347)...grounded into six double plays, which was the fewest in the majors...the last time the A's grounded into fewer than 10 double plays in a month with 12 or more games was in April, 1987 (5 in 23 games)...out-scored the opposition 140-94 (+46) after being out-scored 242-231 (-11) in April and May.

THE INJURED LIST: The A's have used the injured list 16 times this year...used it just eight times last year, which was second fewest in the majors to Cleveland (4), and 18 times in 2019, which tied for second fewest...currently have four players on the IL (Canha, Fiers, Piscotty, Rosenthal)...began the year with two players on the IL but have had at least four all but one day since the fifth game of the season (three on June 16).

A's vs. RED SOX: The season series is even at two games each...the A's lost the first game in Oakland last night after winning two of three in Boston May 11-13...went 3-4 against the Red Sox in 2019...won three of four in Oakland but were swept in a three-game series at Fenway...are 15-21 against Boston dating back to 2015, which includes 10-8 at home and 5-13 on the road...have won nine of the last 13 games in the Coliseum...are 249-302 against Boston since moving to Oakland in 1968...that includes 150-124 in Oakland, 98-177 in Boston and 1-1 in Tokyo...all-time, the A's are 891-1083 against the Red Sox.

TODAY'S TIDBITS

Elvis Andrus is batting .280 (47-for-168) over his last 50 games dating back to May 7 after hitting .143 over his first 31 contests...**Matt Chapman** reached base safely in each of his last 19 games and is batting .288 (21-for-73) with 17 runs, six home runs and 18 RBI over that span...also has nine walks, a hit by pitch and sacrifice fly for a .369 on-base percentage...has a career-high 43-game errorless streak...**Sean Murphy** has 38 of his 40 RBI as a catcher and he leads Major League catchers in RBI...**Matt Olson** is tied for fourth in the American League in home runs (20), ranks sixth in OPS (.931), seventh in slugging (.560) and tied for eighth in extra base hits (38) and sacrifice flies (5)...**Lou Trivino** was named AL Reliever of the Month for June yesterday after compiling a 0.71 ERA and six saves in 13 appearances.

THIS DATE IN ATHLETICS HISTORY

In **1983** Carney Lansford hits the 7000th home run in the history of the A's franchise, but the A's lose to Texas 16-4 when the Rangers score 12 times in the top of the 15th inning...in **1988** Jose Canseco hits three home runs but it's Mark McGwire's 16th inning solo home run that lifts the A's to a 9-8 victory at Toronto...the following day, McGwire again homers in the 16th inning of the A's 4-2 win at Cleveland...in **1994** Bobby Witt ties Mike Torrez' club record with his third consecutive shutout, a six-hit, 10-0 win at Boston.

TODAY'S STARTING PITCHER: Cole Irvin (6-7, 3.64 ERA)

THREE-GAME WINNING STREAK: Went 3-0 with a 2.64 ERA (9 er in 30.2 ip) in five starts in the month of June...the ERA was fourth lowest in the American League and the three-game winning streak is the longest of his career...went 3-7 with a 4.12 ERA in 11 starts in April and May...his seven losses are tied for sixth most in the American League.

DON'T WALK: Has walked two batters or fewer in each of his 16 starts, including nine starts with one walk and three starts with no walks...has issued just 17 free passes in 94.0 innings and his average of 1.63 walks per nine innings is third lowest in the American League...is averaging the fourth fewest strikeouts per nine innings (6.51), but is tied for 10th in strikeout-to-walk ratio (4.00)...has walked one batter or fewer in 14 of his 18 career starts and has walked just 31 batters in 139.1 career innings (2.00 per nine innings).

DAYS REST: Is scheduled to start on five days rest today...is 4-0 with a 1.67 ERA (8 er in 43.0 ip) in seven starts on five days rest or more compared to 1-6 with a 5.01 ERA (26 er in 46.2 ip) in eight starts on four days rest...eight of the nine home runs he has allowed have come on four days rest.

HOME AND AWAY: Is 4-2 with a 2.55 ERA (12 er in 42.1 ip) in seven starts on the road compared to 2-5 with a 4.53 ERA (26 er in 51.2 ip) in nine starts at home compared to...has the fourth lowest road ERA in the American League and is tied for second in home losses.

THIS AND THAT: Is averaging 14.4 pitches per nine innings, which is the fewest in the American League and second fewest in the majors (DeGrom, NYM 13.4)...seven of the nine home runs he has allowed have been solo shots...is 6-1 in nine starts with more than two runs of support, 0-6 in six starts with support of two runs or fewer...has allowed one run or fewer in six of his 16 starts...the A's are 8-8 (.500) in his starting assignments.

2021 HIGHLIGHTS: Was on the A's Opening Day roster and lost each of his first two starts, allowing four runs in each contest for a 7.45 ERA...tossed 4.1 innings in his first start on April 3 against Houston, which was the shortest start of his career...also faced the Astros in his second start on April 8 but did not pitch again until April 17 against Detroit when he combined with Wendelken, Guerra and Weems on a five-hit shutout in a 7-0 win...it was his first win since May 17, 2019 against Colorado and it snapped a career-high four-game losing streak...that began a four-start stretch where he went 3-1 with a 1.42 ERA and .232 opponents batting average through May 4...tossed 6.0 scoreless innings in his start against the Tigers and then blanked the Orioles over the first five innings on April 23 for a career-high 11.0 inning scoreless streak...lost on April 28 at Tampa Bay but then picked up his third win on May 4 against Toronto...had career highs in innings pitched (8.0), strikeouts (9) and pitches (102) against the Blue Jays...then went 0-4 with a 5.40 ERA and .284 opponents batting average over his next five starts from May 9 to 30...the losing streak matched his career high (also May 22, 2019-April 8, 2021)...left with a 4-1 lead on May 15 at Minnesota but the pen allowed four runs in the eighth inning for the blown save...it was the first of two times the pen blew a save in one of his starts (June 11 vs. Kansas City)...allowed a season-high five runs in an 8-4 loss to Houston on May 20...allowed a career-high 10 hits in 4.2 innings of work in a 4-3 loss to Seattle on May 25...went 1-4 with a 4.46 ERA in six starts in May...tied for second in the American League in losses in May...then went 3-0 with a 2.64 ERA (9 er in 30.2 ip) in five starts in the month of June...the ERA was fourth lowest in the American League...allowed a run in the first inning on June 5 at Colorado and did not allow another run until the seventh inning of his next start on June 11 against Kansas City for a career-high tying 11.0-inning scoreless streak.

LAST START: He was the winning pitcher in the A's 6-2 victory at San Francisco last Sunday...tossed a career-high tying 8.0 innings and did not allow a run...allowed just three hits, walked two batters and hit one...did not allow a base runner past first base until the eighth inning when Duggar walked and went to second two outs later when Slater was hit by a pitch.

2020 RECAP: Had two stints with Philadelphia and was 0-1 with a 17.18 ERA in three relief appearances...opponents went 11-for-21 (.524) but he walked just one and struck out four in 3.2 innings...allowed a .438 (7-for-16) average against right-handed hitters compared to .800 (4-for-5) against left-handers...was 2-0 with a 4.50 ERA in four spring training appearances...was optioned to Lehigh Valley March 26 but was recalled on July 23 and was on the Phillies Opening Day roster...made his 2020 debut on July 26 against Miami and allowed four runs on five hits in an inning of relief and was the losing pitcher in an 11-6 decision...tossed a scoreless inning of relief Aug. 9 against Atlanta but was optioned to Philadelphia's alternate site on Aug. 9...was recalled for a second time Aug. 20, pitched the next day at Atlanta (1.2 ip, 4 h, 3 r, 3 er, 1 bb, 3 so) and was optioned Aug. 22...did not pitch the remainder of the season.

TOMORROW'S PROBABLE STARTING PITCHER
RHP James Kaprielian (4-1, 3.06 ERA): Was recalled from Triple-A Las Vegas May 12 and is scheduled to make his 10th start of the season and his career...has allowed two runs or fewer in six of his nine starts and has a 3.06 ERA, which is third lowest among American League rookies with 40 or more innings...his four wins are tied for fifth among AL rookies...has allowed six hits or fewer in each of his nine starts and has held the opposition to a .199 batting average...that is ninth lowest among AL pitchers with 50 or more innings...his a .140 average with a .472 OPS against right-handed pitchers compared to .272 with a .903 OPS against left-handers...was the losing pitcher in his last start, a 5-4 A's loss to Texas last Tuesday here in Oakland (6.0 ip, 6 h, 3 r 3 er, 0 bb, 6 so)...made his only career appearance against Boston earlier this year on May 12 and earned his first Major League win in his first career start in the A's 4-1 victory at Boston (5.0 ip, 4 h, 1 r, 1 er, 3 bb, 6 so).

- Is 0-1 with a save, four blown saves, a 4.41 ERA (8 er in 16.1 ip) and six home runs allowed in his last 18 games dating back to May 15 but eight of his last 11 outings have been scoreless...was 2-0, converted each of his five save opportunities, had a 2.12 ERA and allowed no home runs over his first 17 games (17.0 ip).
- Ranks 11th among American League relievers in strikeouts (45).
- Has held right-handed hitters to a .182 (14-for-77) average but they have hit five of the six of the home runs he has allowed.
- Has a 5.87 ERA (5 er in 7.2 ip) and .313 (10-for-32) opponents batting average in eight outings on no days rest, a 1.80 ERA (5 er in 25.0 ip) and .149 (13-for-87) opponents average in 26 appearances on one day of rest or more.
- Has faced Boston three times this year, throwing three scoreless innings with two saves...has made 12 career appearances against the Red Sox, logging a 8.71 ERA (10 er, 10.1 ip) with 14 strikeouts and seven walks.
- Has six saves, which surpasses his career high of four with Texas in 2016.

- Was acquired yesterday from Arizona in exchange for cash considerations...was selected today...did not pitch for Triple-A Las Vegas.
- Has spent all of 2021 with Triple-A Reno, logging a 5.82 ERA with 30 strikeouts and 15 walks in 21.2 innings of work.
- Has allowed a .116 batting average (5-for-43) to left handers, compared to a .341 average (14-for-41) to righties this year with Reno.
- Made his Major League debut with Oakland in 2017, appearing in 11 games...he earned a 10.80 ERA (8 er, 6.2 ip) while striking out seven and walking three...has not pitched in a Major League game since.

Last Year: Signed a minor league deal with San Francisco in January of 2020 but never appeared in a game following the cancelation of the 2020 minor league season.

- Has a 6.16 ERA (13 er in 19.0 ip) over his last 19 games but has allowed just 2-of-13 (15.4%) inherited runners to score over that span... posted a 0.79 ERA over his first 20 contests.
- Is tied for second in the Majors in games pitched (39) and is tied for seventh in the American League in wins (7)...is third among AL relievers in innings (41.2).
- Has walked just one batter in his last 18 games (17.0 innings) and has issued just six walks in 41.2 innings overall...his average of 1.30 walks per nine innings is second lowest among AL relievers.
- Has held left-handed hitters to a .213 (13-for-61) average.
- Opponents are 8-for-45 (.178) with runners in scoring position.
