OAKLAND ATHLETICS (49-36) VS. BOSTON RED SOX (52-32)

ABOUT THE A'S: Are 3-3 over the last six games and 5-9 over the last 14 contests...are 49-36 (.576) overall, which is the fourth best record in the American League...it matches the second best record by an A's team after 85 games over the last 31 years and is the best since they were 52-33 in 2014...are in second place in the AL West for the 13th consecutive day and trail first place Houston by 2½ games for the second consecutive day...held at least a share of first for 61 of 62 days from April 20 to June 20...have spent 58 days alone in first place, three days tied for first, 14 days in second, one day tied for second, three days in third, two days in fourth, three days tied for fourth and 10 days in fifth.

A's ONTHE FOURTH: The A's have an eight-game winning streak on the Fourth of July and have not lost since a 2-1 decision at Seattle in 2011...are 31-19 on the Fourth since moving to Oakland in 1968...are 18-7 in the Coliseum and 13-12 on the road...last faced the Red Sox on July 4 in 2012, a 3-2 win in Oakland...are 2-2 against the Red Sox since 1968 and are 22-32 against Boston all-time.

CLOSE CALLS: The A's had their seventh walk-off win of the season last night, which ties the Mariners for second most in the majors to the Rockies (8)... now have 90 walk-off wins in the Bob Melvin era, which are the most in the majors over that span...improved to 3-3 in extra innings and have played back-to-back extra inning games...each of the first five extra inning games went 10 innings and yesterday's 12-inning contest marked just the second time over the last two years the A's have played more than 10 inning (13, Aug. 7, 2020 vs. Houston)...are 10-6 in games decided in the last at bat...are 13-11 (.542) in one-run games and rank third in the American League in one-run wins...are 20-18 (.526) in games decided by two runs or fewer compared to 29-18 (.617) in games decided by three runs or more.

OFFENSE: The A's reached base safely a season-high 23 times yesterday and matched their season high with 15 hits (June 22 at Texas)...stranded at least one base runner in every inning, which marks the first time in Oakland history the A's stranded at least one base runner in every inning of a game of 12 or more innings (credit: Elias)...had 17 left on base total...struck out just four times, which were their fewest in a game of 12 or more innings since May 5, 2011 against Cleveland (3 in 12 innings)...are now batting .200 (55-for-275) with 30 runs scored (3.8 per game) over the last eight games...A's leadoff hitters are 2-for-29 (.069) with no runs, four walks and four hit by pitches over that span, which coincides with the date Mark Canha went on the injured list (June 25)...the A's lead the American League in hit by pitches (49), rank second in sacrifice flies (29), tied for third in fewest grounded into double plays (52), tied for fourth in triples (13) and fifth in walks (297)...A's pinch hitters lead the American League in hits (18), RBI (14), sacrifice flies (2) and plate appearances (82) and are tied for second in extra base hits (4)

PITCHING: The A's have compiled a 3.30 ERA (112 er in 305.0 ip) over the last 34 games after logging a 4.24 ERA over the first 51 contests...have a 3.86 ERA for the season, which is fifth lowest in the American League...also have the fifth lowest opponents on-base percentage (.306), slugging percentage (.396) and OPS (.703)...have the fewest walks (229), rank second in fewest pitches per inning (16.0), third in shutouts (7) and fourth in fewest home

STARTING PITCHING: A's starting pitchers are 14-7 with a 2.90 ERA (55 er in 170.2 ip) over the last 28 games dating back to June 2...are 33-28 with a 3.72 ERA (201 er in 486.0 ip) for the season...rank third in the American League in ERA and wins...lead the majors in innings pitched (486.0) and are tied with the White Sox and Rockies for the most complete games (3)...the complete games are the most by an A's team since 2015 (5)...the A's are the only team in the majors with four pitchers with 17 or more starts...have used just seven starting pitchers this year, which is second fewest to the Red Sox (6)...are one of two teams with five pitchers with six or more wins (White Sox).

BULLPEN: The A's bullpen has one save, four blown saves, a 5.31 ERA (24 er in 40.2 ip) and .290 (45-for-155) opponents batting average over the last 14 games...has converted 21-of-32 (65.6%) save opportunities overall, which is the fifth best percentage in the American League...has four losses over the last 14 games after taking just four losses over the first 71 contests...the eight losses are tied with the Brewers for the fewest in the majors...has the highest slugging percentage against first batters faced in the AL (.504), the second highest batting average (.276) and fifth highest on-base percentage (.345).

DEFENSIVE DOINGS: The A's committed a season-high tying two errors yesterday (sixth time) after making just two errors over the previous 19 games... now have 38 errors for the season, which is tied for second fewest in the American League...had two caught stealings yesterday for the first time

since Aug. 27, 2019...are tied for the third in the AL in fewest double plays (62)...A's pitchers have five pickoffs, which is tied for third most.

HOME AND AWAY: The A's are 2-3 on this six-game homestand against Texas (1-2) and Boston (1-1)...went 8-1 on the last homestand against Arizona (2-0), Kansas City (3-1) and Los Angeles-AL (3-0)...it was the first time the A's won eight games on a homestand since going 8-2 against Tampa Bay, Texas and Houston from Aug. 30 to Sept. 8, 2013...are 27-21 (.563) at home and the 48 home games are the most in the majors...following today's game, the A's will play 26 of their next 36 games on the road...that begins with a six-game road trip to Houston (three games) and Texas (three games) starting Tuesday that will take the A's into the All-Star Break...went 4-6 on the last road trip to New York-AL (1-2), Texas (2-2) and San Francisco (1-2) and are 22-15 (.595) on the road...have the third best road record in the American League.

THIS AND THAT: The A's are 22-12 (.647) in games in which the opponent starts a left-handed pitcher compared to 27-24 (.529) when they start a right-hander...the mark against lefties is second best in the American League (White Sox, 18-8/.692) and the 34 games are second most (Astros, 36)...are 37-13 (.740) when scoring first, which is the best record in the AL and fifth best in the majors...are 30-20 (.600) in night games, 19-16 (.543) during the day...are 30-7 when out-homering the opposition, 7-22 when they are out-homered...have used 82 different lineups over the first 85 games.

A'S IN JUNE: The A's finished the month of June with a 17-9 record (.654) record, which was second best in the American League (Astros, 19-9) and tied for fourth best in the majors...went 16-11 in April and 15-14 in May and now have 10 consecutive months with a winning record (min. 10 games)... have just one losing month dating back to 2018 (11-15 in April of 2019)...had the second lowest ERA (3.55) and OPS (.697) in the AL and issued the fewest walks (66)...starters had a 2.92 ERA, which was the lowest in the majors...hit .314 with runners in scoring position, which was second best in the majors (Cleveland, .347)...out-scored the opposition 140-94 (+46) after being out-scored 242-231 (-11) in April and May.

THE INJURED LIST: The A's have used the injured list 17 times this year...used it just eight times last year, which was second fewest in the majors to Cleveland (4), and 18 times in 2019, which tied for second fewest...currently have four players on the IL (Canha, Fiers, Moreland, Rosenthal)...began the year with two players on the IL but have had at least four all but one day since the fifth game of the season (three on June 16).

A's vs. RED SOX: The A's lead the season series 3-2 entering the final game today...have split the first two games in Oakland after winning two of three in Boston May 11-13...with a win today, would have their third season series win in their last four season series dating back to 2017...are 14-11 over that span, including 9-4 in Oakland and 5-7 in Boston...are 250-302 against Boston since moving to Oakland in 1968...that includes 151-124 in Oakland, 98-177 in Boston and 1-1 in Tokyo...all-time, the A's are 892-1083 against the Red Sox.

TODAY'S TIDBITS

Elvis Andrus is batting .285 (49-for-172) over his last 51 games dating back to May 7 after hitting .143 over his first 31 contests...Matt Chapman has reached base safely in each of his last 20 games and is batting .304 (24-for-79) with 18 runs, six home runs and 18 RBI over that span...also has nine walks, a hit by pitch and sacrifice fly for a .378 on-base percentage... has a career-high 44-game errorless streak...Sean Murphy has 38 of his 40 RBI as a catcher and is tied for the lead among Major League catchers in RBI...Matt Olson is tied for fourth in the American League in home runs (20), ranks seventh in slugging (.554), eighth in OPS (.924) and tied for eighth in extra base hits (38) and sacrifice flies (5)....Lou Trivino was named AL Reliever of the Month for June after compiling a 0.71 ERA and six saves in 13 appearances.

THIS DATE IN ATHLETICS HISTORY

In 1905 Rube Waddell defeats Boston's Cy Young in a 20-inning marathon in the afternoon game of a doubleheader, 4-2...A's catcher Ossee Schreckengost works all 29 innings of the doubleheader to set a major league record...in 1974 California's Winston Llenas hits a pinch hit home run off Vida Blue in the sixth inning to end Oakland's club record streak of 136 2/3 innings without allowing a home run...in 1988 Mark McGwire homers in the 16th inning for the second consecutive day as the A's defeat the Cleveland Indians 4-2...McGwire has a solo shot in the 16th inning the day before at Toronto as the A's have a two-day span where they play 32 innings and 9 hours and 54 minutes of baseball in two cities.

TODAY'S STARTING PITCHER: James Kaprielian (4-2, 3.06 ERA)

FOR STARTERS: Was recalled from Triple-A Las Vegas May 12 and is scheduled to make his 10th start of the season and his career...has allowed two runs or fewer in six of his nine starts and has a 3.06 ERA, which is third lowest among American League rookies with 40 or more innings...his four wins are tied for sixth among AL rookies...is 2-1 with a 3.04 ERA (8 er in 23.2 ip) over his last four starts...went 2-0 with a 1.53 ERA over his first three starts and was 0-1 with a 6.23 ERA in two starts in between.

SIX HITS OR FEWER: Has allowed six hits or fewer in each of his nine starts and has held the opposition to a .199 (36-for-181) batting average...that is ninth lowest among American League pitchers with 50 or more innings... has not allowed more than six hits in 11 career appearances...his shortest career outing is 1.2 innings and his career-opening streak of 11 consecutive games with six hits or fewer and 1.2 innings pitched or more is the longest in Athletics history.

OPPONENTS BATTING: His opponents batting average breaks down to .140 (14-for-100) with a .472 OPS against right-handed pitchers compared to .272 (22-for-81) with a .903 OPS against left-handers...has allowed a .129 (4-for-31) batting average with runners in scoring position and opponents are 0-for-9 with the bases loaded...six of the eight home runs he has allowed have been solo shots...has a .110 (8-for-73) opponents average the first time through the lineup, .319 (22-for-69) the second time and .154 (6-for-39) after that.

HOME AND AWAY: Is 2-1 with a 1.42 ERA (3 er in 19.0 ip) and .149 (10-for-67) opponents average in three starts at home compared to 2-1 with a 4.06 ERA (14 er in 31.0 ip) and .228 (26-for-114) opponents batting average in six starts on the road.

BY INNING: Has allowed one run in the first inning and none in the second inning and has a 0.50 ERA (1 er in 18.0 ip) and .117 (7-for-60) opponents average over innings one and two...has a 5.09 ERA (10 er in 17.2 ip) and .265 (18-for-68) in innings three and four and a 3.77 ERA (6 er in 14.1 ip) and .208 (11-for-53) from the fifth inning on.

2021 HIGHLIGHTS: Began the year at Triple-A Las Vegas and went 0-1 with a 3.86 ERA in one start...was the Aviators Opening Day starter on May 6 at Las Vegas and was the losing pitcher in an 8-1 loss to Sacramento (4.2 ip, 8 h, 2 r, 2 er, 1 bb, 5 so, 0 hr, 76 pitches)...was recalled by Oakland on May 12 and made his first Major League start that day at Boston...allowed a run on four hits in 5.0 innings to earn his first ML win in the A's 4-1 victory over the Red Sox...struck out a career-high nine batters in his second start on May 21 at Los Angeles (AL)...had a no decision in an 8-4 A's win...left with a 3-2 lead and two outs in the bottom of the sixth but Petit allowed a run for the blown save...it was the first of two starts in which he left with the lead only to have the bullpen blow the save (June 23 at Texas)...tossed 7.0 scoreless innings May 26 against Seattle for his second win...that matched his longest outing as a professional...also tossed 7.0 innings for Single-A Tampa at Charlotte on April 16, 2016, his second professional appearance...logged a season-low 3.2 innings May 31 at Seattle but had a no decision in the A's 6-5, 10-inning loss...allowed a career-high four runs...was charged with the first loss of his career when he allowed two runs in 5.0 innings on June 6 at Colorado, a 3-1 A's loss...pitched 6.0 scoreless innings and allowed just two hits on June 12 to defeat Kansas City 11-2...walked a career-high four.

LAST START: He was the losing pitcher in the A's 5-4 loss to Texas last Tuesday in Oakland...allowed a career-high six hits and tossed 105 pitches, which were his most as a professional...the A's scored a run in the first and he retired 11 of the first 12 batters before allowing a two-out solo home run to Gallo in the fourth...Oakland regained the lead with a run in the bottom of the fourth but he allowed a RBI double to Heim in the sixth and another solo home run to Gallo in the sixth.

2020 RECAP: Made his Major League debut and had two relief appearances over five stints with Oakland...compiled a 7.36 ERA and .267 opponents batting average...allowed two home runs in 3.2 innings, walked two and struck out four...was recalled for the first time Aug. 4 but did not pitch before he was optioned back to the A's alternate site on Aug. 6...joined the club a second time Aug. 16 and made his ML debut that day at San Francisco (2.0 ip, 1 $\,$ h, 1 r, 1 er, 1 bb, 1 so)...relieved Fiers to start the seventh inning with the A's leading 13-2 and allowed a home run to the first batter he faced (Crawford)... walked the next batter (Dubon) before retiring each of the final six batters he faced...struck out Solano to end the seventh inning for his first strikeout... was optioned on Aug. 19...was recalled as the 29th man for doubleheaders on Sept. 8 and Sept. 14 but did not pitch...recalled for his fifth stint on Sept. 24 and made one appearance in the second game of the Sept. 26 doubleheader against Seattle (1.2 ip, 3 h, 2 r, 2 er, 1 bb, 3 so)...inherited a bases loaded situation in the third inning with the A's trailing 4-1 and allowed all three runs to score...was on the Taxi Squad for the postseason...was rated as the A's number 10 prospect by Baseball America following the season.

CAREER NOTES: Made his Major League debut with Oakland in 2020 after pitching in just 27 games over his first five professional seasons due to elbow problems...compiled a 7.36 ERA and .267 opponents batting average in two relief appearances with the A's...is 6-6 with a 3.00 ERA (34 er in 102.0 ip) in 28 games, including 23 starts, as a minor leaguer...has 116 strikeouts in 102.0 innings (10.24 per nine innings)...was the New York Yankees first round draft pick in 2015 but pitched in just eight games over his first four years as a professional...missed most of 2016 with an elbow injury and then missed the entire 2017 and 2018 seasons following April 18, 2017 "Tommy John" surgery...was traded to the A's at the 2017 trading deadline in the Sonny Gray deal and is the last remaining player from that deal that also netted the A's Dustin Fowler and Jorge Mateo...pitched for Scottsdale in the Arizona Fall League in 2016...was rated by Baseball America as the Yankees No. 4 prospect following the 2015 season and No. 5 following 2016...was the A's No. 8 prospect after the 2017 season and No. 10 following 2020.

TUESDAY'S PROBABLE STARTING PITCHER

RHP Chris Bassitt (9-2, 3.04 ERA): Is 9-0 with a 2.74 ERA and .202 opponents batting average over his last 15 starts...the winning streak is an on-going career high, the longest in the majors this year, and tied for ninth longest in Oakland history...leads the American League in innings pitched (106.2), is tied for second in wins (9), ranks third in winning percentage (.818), fifth in opponents slugging percentage (.337), sixth in ERA (3.04) and opponents OPS (.614), seventh in strikeouts (109) and eighth in opponents batting average (.212) and on-base percentage (.277)...was the winning pitcher in his last start, a 3-1 A's win over Texas last Wednesday in Oakland (7.0 ip, 3 h, 1 bb, 7 so)...is 3-3 with a 3.67 ERA (56.1 ip, 49 h, 25 r, 23 er, 17 bb, 38 so, 7 hr) in 10 career appearances, including nine starts, during the regular season against Houston...was the losing pitcher in his only start this year, an 8-1 A's loss in Oakland on Opening Day (5.1 ip, 4 h, 3 r, 3 er, 2 bb, 3 so).

- Is tied for 11th among American League relievers in strikeouts (45).
- Has held right-handed hitters to a .182 (14-for-77) average but they have hit five of the six of the home runs he has allowed.
