OAKLAND ATHLETICS (49-37) VS. HOUSTON ASTROS (52-33)

TUESDAY, JULY 6, 2021 — MINUTE MAID PARK — 7:10 CDT

ABOUT THE A'S: Lost two of three to Boston to close out the last homestand and are now 0-4-1 over the last five series...it is the first time the A's have gone winless over five consecutive series in a single season since they started the 2017 season by going 0-3-2 over their first five series...have lost 10 of the last 15 games but are 49-37 (570) overall, which is the fifth best record in the American League...are in second place in the AL West for the 15th consecutive day...fell 3½ games back of Houston with the loss on Sunday, which was the first time they were 3½ back in the West since April 11...have not been 4½ back since April 9...have spent 58 days alone in first place, three days tied for first, 16 days in second, one day tied for second, three days in third, two days in fourth, three days tied for fourth and 10 days in fifth...held at least a share of first for 61 of 62 days from April 20 to June 20.

ALL-STAR: Matt Olson was named to his first American League All-Star team on Sunday as the A's lone representative...it is the first time the A's have one All-Star since 2017 (Alonso)...had two in both 2018 (Lowrie, Treinen) and 2019 (Chapman, Hendriks)...Olson announced today that he will be participating in the Home Run Derby...this is the second consecutive Derby with an Athletic (Chapman, 2019) and Olson is the ninth Athletic to participate in the Derby.

AFTER AN OFF DAY: The A's won each of their first nine games this year following an off day before losing to Texas to start the last homestand...are now 9-1 following a day off, which is the best record in the majors (Giants, 11-3/.786)...have a 3.27 ERA (32 er in 88.0 ip) following a day off and are batting .247 (81-for-328) with 59 runs scored (5.9 runs per game).

HOME AND AWAY: The A's begin a six-game road trip to Houston (three games) and Texas (three games) tonight...tonight's game starts a stretch where the A's are scheduled to play 26 of their next 36 games on the road... went 4-6 on the last road trip to New York-AL (1-2), Texas (2-2) and San Francisco (1-2) but are 22-15 (.595) on the road overall, which is the third best road record in the American League...the 37 road games are tied with the Rockies and Nationals for the fewest in the majors...went 2-4 on the last homestand against Texas (1-2) and Boston (1-1) and are 27-22 (.551) at home...are batting .251 (322-for-1285) and are averaging 4.84 runs per game on the road (179 r in 37 g) compared to .219 with an average of 4.16 runs per game at home...have the third best road batting average and OPS (.748) in the AL and the second lowest home batting average.

AGAINST THE WEST: The A's are 16-17 (.484) against American League West competition compared to 33-20 (.623) against all other teams...are scheduled to play 12 of their next 15 games against divisional foes...will play their final two series before the All-Star Break against the Astros and Rangers... open post-break play by hosting Cleveland but then have two games with the Angels and four with Seattle.

CLOSE CALLS: Each of the A's three games against Boston were decided by one run and the first two games were extra inning affairs...are 13-12 (.520) in one-run games...the 25 one-run decisions are tied for second most in the American League (Mariners, 26) and the wins are tied for third...are 20-19 (.513) in games decided by two runs or fewer compared to 29-18 (.617) in games decided by three runs or more...are 3-3 in extra innings...are 10-6 in games decided in the last at bat...have seven walk-off wins, which is tied with the Mariners for second most in the majors to the Rockies (8)...now have 90 walk-off wins in the Bob Melvin era, which are the most in the majors over that span.

OFFENSE: The A's were shut out for the second time in the last nine games on Sunday and are batting .193 (59-for-306) with 30 runs scored (3.3 per game) over that span...A's leadoff hitters are 3-for-33 (.091) with no runs, four walks and four hit by pitches over that stretch, which coincides with the date Mark Canha went on the injured list (June 25)...the A's lead the American League in hit by pitches (49), rank second in sacrifice flies (29), tied for third in fewest grounded into double plays (52), tied for fourth in triples (13) and fifth in walks (300)...have been successful in each of their last 11 stolen base attempts dating back to May 30 and are 33-for-41 (80.5%) for the season, which is the fourth best percentage in the AL...A's pinch hitters lead the American League in hits (19), RBI (14), sacrifice flies (2) and plate appearances (83) and are tied for second in extra base hits (4).

PITCHING: The A's have compiled a 3.24 ERA (113 er in 314.0 ip) over the last 35 games after logging a 4.24 ERA over the first 51 contests...have a 3.83 ERA for the season, which is fourth lowest in the American League...have the fifth lowest opponents on-base percentage (.305), slugging percentage (.395) and OPS (.700)...have the fewest walks (230), rank second in fewest pitches per inning (15.9) and third in shutouts (7) and fewest home runs (95).

STARTING PITCHING: A's starting pitchers are 14-8 with a 2.84 ERA (56 er in 177.2 ip) over the last 29 games dating back to June 2...are 33-29 with a 3.69

ERA (202 er in 493.0 ip) for the season...rank third in the American League in ERA and tied for third in wins...lead the majors in innings pitched (493.0) and are tied with the White Sox and Rockies for the most complete games (3)... the complete games are the most by an A's team since 2015 (5)...the A's are one of three teams in the majors with four pitchers with 17 or more starts (Dodgers, Red Sox)...have used just seven starting pitchers this year, which is second fewest to the Red Sox (6)...are one of two teams with five pitchers with six or more wins (White Sox).

BULLPEN: The A's bullpen has one save, four blown saves, a 5.06 ERA (24 er in 42.2 ip) and .284 (46-for-162) opponents batting average over the last 15 games...has converted 21-of-32 (65.6%) save opportunities overall, which is the fifth best percentage in the American League...has four losses over the last 15 games after taking just four losses over the first 71 contests...the eight losses are tied with the Brewers for the fewest in the majors...has the highest slugging percentage against first batters faced in the AL (.506), the second highest batting average (.277) and fifth highest on-base percentage (.345).

DEFENSIVE DOINGS: The A's have committed three errors in the last two games after making just two errors over the previous 19 contests...now have 39 errors for the season, which is second fewest in the American League to the Astros (32)...ranks fourth in fewest double plays (63)...A's pitchers have five pickoffs, which is tied for third most.

THIS AND THAT: The A's are 22-12 (.647) in games in which the opponent starts a left-handed pitcher compared to 27-25 (.519) when they start a right-hander...the mark against lefties is second best in the American League (White Sox, 18-8/.692) and the 34 games are tied for second most to the Astros (36)...are 37-13 (.740) when scoring first, which is the second best record in the AL (Rays, 32-11/.744)...are 30-20 (.600) in night games, 19-17 (.528) during the day...are 30-7 when out-homering the opposition, 7-22 when they are out-homered...have used 83 different lineups over the first 86 games...the A's finished the month of June with a 17-9 record (.654) record, which was second best in the American League (Astros, 19-9) and tied for fourth best in the majors...went 16-11 in April and 15-14 in May and now have 10 consecutive months with a winning record (min. 10 games)...have just one losing month dating back to 2018 (11-15 in April of 2019).

THE INJURED LIST: The A's have used the injured list 17 times this year...used it just eight times last year, which was second fewest in the majors to Cleveland (4), and 18 times in 2019, which tied for second fewest...currently have four players on the IL (Canha, Fiers, Moreland, Rosenthal)...began the year with two players on the IL but have had at least four all but one day since the fifth game of the season (three on June 16).

A's vs. ASTROS: The A's are 3-7 against the Astros...are 1-6 in Oakland and 2-1 in Houston...won the season series last year, 7-3...it was their first season series win since going 11-8 in 2014...went 7-1 in Oakland and 0-2 in Houston...then lost to the Astros in the ALDS, 3 games to 1...are now 47-68 (.409) against Houston over the last seven years after winning each of their first four season series against the Astros (31-13)...are 78-81 all-time, including 43-41 in Oakland and 35-40 in Houston.

TODAY'S TIDBITS

Matt Chapman has reached base safely in each of his last 21 games and is batting .301 (25-for-83) with 18 runs, six home runs and 18 RBI over that span...also has nine walks, a hit by pitch and sacrifice fly for a .372 on-base percentage...has a career-high 45-game errorless streak...*Sean Murphy* has 38 of his 40 RBI as a catcher and is tied for the lead among Major League catchers in RBI...*Matt Olson* ranks sixth in the American League in slugging (.552), tied for sixth in home runs (20), seventh in OPS (.923), tied for eighth in sacrifice flies (5) and tied for ninth in extra base hits (38)...*Sergio Romo* has not allowed a run in 14 of his last 16 games for a 1.26 ERA (14.1 ip, 8 h, 2 r, 2 er, 1 bb, 15 so, 1 hr)...*Lou Trivino* has a 0.39 ERA (1 er in 23.0 ip) and .195 (15-for-77) opponents batting average over his last 23 games dating back to May 8...has converted 8-of-9 save opportunities over that span and stranded all seven of his inherited runners

THIS DATE IN ATHLETICS HISTORY


In **1990** the A's hit seven home runs in the second game of a doubleheader to defeat the Cleveland Indians 12-1...Mark McGwire and Rickey Henderson hit two each and Carney Lansford, Jose Canseco and Jamie Quirk chip in one each...in **2001** Mark Mulder takes a perfect game into the eighth inning and finishes with a complete game one-hitter in the A's 3-0 win at Arizona...in **2009** Brett Anderson tosses a two-hit shutout at Fenway Park in a 6-0 A's win and Nomar Garciaparra drives in the go-ahead run in his return to Boston.

TODAY'S STARTING PITCHER: Chris Bassitt (9-2, 3.04 ERA)

NINE-GAME WINNING STREAK: Lost each of his first two starts this year but is 9-0 with a 2.74 ERA (29 er in 95.1 ip) and .202 (70-for-347) opponents batting average in 15 starts since then...the winning streak is an on-going career high, the longest streak in the majors this year and tied for ninth longest in Oakland history...over the last 14 years, the only Athletic with a longer winning streak is Mike Fiers (12, May 7-Aug. 27, 2019)...has left with the lead in three of his six no decisions only to have the bullpen blow the save...the nine wins are one short of his career high of 10 in 2019...the A's are 13-4 (.764) in his starting assignments.

AMONG THE LEADERS: Ranks second in the American League in innings pitched (106.2), tied for second in wins (9), third in winning percentage (.818), fourth in opponents slugging percentage (.337), fifth in ERA (3.04) and opponents OPS (.614), sixth in opponents batting average (.212), seventh in opponents on-base percentage (.277) and tied for eighth in strikeouts (109)...has allowed nine home runs and his average of 0.76 home runs per nine innings is third lowest...has hit 10 batters, which is the most in the AL and three short of the Oakland record of 13...he also hit 13 batters in 2019, which



tied the record set by Barry Zito (2001, 2005 and 2006)...ranks fifth in the AL in fewest pitches per inning (15.0)...is scheduled to make his 18th start today, which will tie him for the AL lead.

FOUR RUNS OR FEWER: Has allowed four runs or fewer in each of his 28 starts over the last two years and is 14-4 with a 2.76 ERA (52 er in 169.2 ip) over that span...has a streak of 28 consecutive games with four runs or fewer and 3.0 innings pitched or more, which is the longest such streak in Athletics history (previous: 25 by Vida Blue from April 9-July 30, 1971)...has not allowed more than four runs in a start since yielding seven runs in his final start of 2019 (Sept. 13 at Texas).

HOME AND AWAY: IS 5-0 with a 3.52 ERA (21 er in 53.2 ip) in nine starts on the road compared to 4-2 with a 2.55 ERA (15 er in 53.0 ip) in eight starts at home...is tied for second in the American League in road wins and ranks sixth in home ERA...now has a six-game winning streak on the road dating back to Sept. 12, 2020 and has not lost on the road since Aug. 29, 2020 at Houston.

OPPONENTS BATTING: His opponents batting average breaks down to .178 (34-for-191) against left-handed hitters compared to .244 (49-for-201) against right-handers...the mark against lefties is fifth lowest in the American League...however, has surrendered seven of his nine home runs this year and 25 of 36 over the last three years to lefties...seven of his nine home runs this year have come with the bases empty...opponents are 2-for-29 (.069) with runners in scoring position over his last five starts and are hitting .172 (15-for-87) with RISP overall, which ranks fifth in the American League.

FIVE DAYS REST: Is scheduled to start on five days rest today...is 5-0 with a 2.44 ERA (14 er in 51.2 ip) in eight starts on exactly five days rest and now has a 10-game winning streak in those games dating back to July 19, 2019... has a 2.60 ERA (28 er in 97.0 ip) in 16 starts over that span...according to Tru-Media, that matches the longest winning streak in starts on five days rest in Oakland history...the others are Mike Fiers (May 7-Aug. 27, 2019) and Mark Mulder (June 18, 2002-July 10, 2003)...has not lost when pitching on five days rest since July 6, 2019.

AGAINST THE WEST: Is 4-1 with a 2.25 ERA (10 er in 40.0 ip) and .176 (25for-142) opponents batting average in six starts against American League West competition compared to 5-1 with a 3.51 ERA (26 er in 66.2 ip) and .232 (58-for-250) opponents average in 11 starts against all other teams...is 8-3 with a 2.27 ERA (23 er in 91.0 ip) in 15 starts against AL West foes over the last two years.

IN JUNE: Went 4-0 with a 2.70 ERA in six starts in June...it was the first time in his career he won four games in a month...was one of four American League pitchers to win four games in June and his ERA tied for fifth.

THE LAST THREE YEARS: IS 24-9 (.727) with a 3.24 ERA (113 er in 313.2 ip) in 56 games (53 starts) over the last three years...based on a minium of 250 innings pitched, he ranks second in the American League in winning percentage over that span, fourth in ERA and fifth in opponents OPS (.669)...is tied for sixth in wins...the A's are 36-17 (.679) in his starting assignments over the last three years...was 4-14 (.222) with a 3.86 ERA in 40 games (30 starts) over his first four seasons.

2021 HIGHLIGHTS: Was the A's Opening Day starting pitcher and took the loss in an 8-1 decision to Houston on April 1 in Oakland...became the A's 14th different Opening Day starting pitcher over the last 16 years...allowed a run in the fourth inning to snap a 16.2-inning scoreless streak during the regular season and a 27.1-inning home scoreless streak, which was ninth longest in Oakland history...allowed exactly two runs in six consecutive starts from April 12 to May 11 to become the second pitcher in Athletic history to allow

exactly two runs in six consecutive games...joins Bob Davis of the Kansas City A's, who did it all in relief from Aug. 8-26, 1960...went 3-0 with a 2.92 ERA over that stretch...tied an Oakland record with three hit batters April 29 at Tampa Bay (12th time, last: Fiers, June 22, 2019, also against Tampa Bay)... left his start on May 5 against Toronto with a 3-2 lead but ended up win a no decision in the A's 9-4 loss...Trivino allowed five runs in the eighth inning for the blown save...it was the first of three times he left with a lead only to have the bullpen blow the save (also May 16 at Minnesota and June 19 at New York-AL)...struck out a season-high 10 batters in a 3-2 win at Boston on May 11...it was his third career game of 10 or more strikeouts...did not walk a batter, the second time he has fanned 10 or more without issuing a free pass... is one of nine pitchers in Oakland history with two such games...tossed his first career complete game and shutout May 27 against Los Angeles (AL), a two-hitter in the A's 5-0 win...had a season-high 114 pitches, struck out nine and walked one...it came in his 77th career start, his 72nd with the A's...the 71 consecutive starts without a complete games is the second longest streak in Athletics history (113, Barry Zito, Aug. 22, 2003-Sept. 28, 2006)...finished May with a 3-0 record, a 2.52 ERA and .175 opponents batting average in five starts...struck out 38 and walked just four in 35.2 innings.

LAST START: He was the winning pitcher in the A's 3-1 win over Texas last Wednesday in Oakland...retired the side in order in each of the first two innings to bring his career innings pitched total to 500.0...logged 7.0 scoreless innings to extend his scoreless streak to 12.0 innings.

BASSITT vs. HOUSTON: Is 3-3 with a 3.67 ERA (56.1 ip, 49 h, 25 r, 23 er, 17 bb, 38 so, 7 hr) in 10 career appearances, including nine starts, during the regular season...also had a no decision in Game 1 of the 2020 ALDS at Dodger Stadium, a 10-5 A's loss (4.0 ip, 9 h, 3 r, 3 er, 4 so)...is 1-2 with a 7.07 ERA (11 er in 14.0 ip) in three starts in Houston and 2-1 with a 2.55 ERA (12 er in 42.1 ip) in seven games in Oakland...was the losing pitcher in his only start this

year, an 8-1 A's loss in Oakland on Opening Day, April 1...blanked the Astros on one hit over the first three innings before allowing a run in the fourth when Altuve walked, went to third on a Brantley double and scored on a Bregman ground out...was relieved by Petit with one out in the sixth inning, runners on first and second and the A's trailing 1-0...Petit allowed both runners to score...went 1-1 with a 2.65 ERA (17.0 ip, 16 h, 5 r, 5 er, 6 bb, 9 so, 2 hr) in three regular season starts last year.

TOMORROW'S PROBABLE STARTING PITCHER

LHP Sean Manaea (6-5, 3.13 ERA): Is 0-3 with a 3.86 ERA and .234 opponents batting average over his last three starts...has received one run of support total in those three starts...the three-game losing streak matches the longest of his career...has allowed one run or fewer in six of his last eight starts dating back to May 23 and is 3-3 with a 1.85 ERA and .221 opponents batting average over that span...ranks sixth in the American League in ERA (3.13) and strikeout-to-walk ratio (4.08), ninth in opponents OPS (680) and 10th in opponents slugging percentage (.380) and strikeouts (102)...was the losing pitcher in his last start, an 8-3 A's loss to Texas last Thursday in Oakland (5.0 ip, 9 h, 4 r, 4 er, 1 bb, 6 so)...is 3-6 with a 3.57 ERA (88.1 ip, 86 h, 39 r, 35 er, 25 bb, 73 so, 10 hr) in 16 career regular season starts aganst Houston... is 0-1 with a 4.86 ERA (16.2 ip, 22 h, 9 r, 9 er, 4 bb, 11 so, 3 hr) in three starts this year.

- Is 0-1 with a save, four blown saves, a 4.32 ERA (8 er in 16.2 ip) and six home runs allowed in his last 19 games dating back to May 15...was 2-0, converted each of his five save opportunities, had a 2.12 ERA and allowed no home runs over his first 17 games (17.0 ip).
- Has held right-handed hitters to a .182 (14-for-77) average but they have hit five of the career-high six home runs he has allowed.
