OAKLAND ATHLETICS (49-37) VS. HOUSTON ASTROS (52-33)

TUESDAY, JULY 6, 2021 — MINUTE MAID PARK — 7:10 CDT

ABOUT THE A'S: Lost two of three to Boston to close out the last homestand and are now 0-4-1 over the last five series...it is the first time the A's have gone winless over five consecutive series in a single season since they started the 2017 season by going 0-3-2 over their first five series...have lost 10 of the last 15 games but are 49-37 (570) overall, which is the fifth best record in the American League...are in second place in the AL West for the 15th consecutive day...fell 3½ games back of Houston with the loss on Sunday, which was the first time they were 3½ back in the West since April 11...have not been 4½ back since April 9...have spent 58 days alone in first place, three days tied for first, 16 days in second, one day tied for second, three days in third, two days in fourth, three days tied for fourth and 10 days in fifth...held at least a share of first for 61 of 62 days from April 20 to June 20.

ALL-STAR: Matt Olson was named to his first American League All-Star team on Sunday as the A's lone representative...it is the first time the A's have one All-Star since 2017 (Alonso)...had two in both 2018 (Lowrie, Treinen) and 2019 (Chapman, Hendriks)...Olson announced today that he will be participating in the Home Run Derby...this is the second consecutive Derby with an Athletic (Chapman, 2019) and Olson is the ninth Athletic to participate in the Derby.

AFTER AN OFF DAY: The A's won each of their first nine games this year following an off day before losing to Texas to start the last homestand...are now 9-1 following a day off, which is the best record in the majors (Giants, 11-3/.786)...have a 3.27 ERA (32 er in 88.0 ip) following a day off and are batting .247 (81-for-328) with 59 runs scored (5.9 runs per game).

HOME AND AWAY: The A's begin a six-game road trip to Houston (three games) and Texas (three games) tonight...tonight's game starts a stretch where the A's are scheduled to play 26 of their next 36 games on the road...went 4-6 on the last road trip to New York-AL (1-2), Texas (2-2) and San Francisco (1-2) but are 22-15 (.595) on the road overall, which is the third best road record in the American League...the 37 road games are tied with the Rockies and Nationals for the fewest in the majors...went 2-4 on the last homestand against Texas (1-2) and Boston (1-1) and are 27-22 (.551) at home...are batting .251 (322-for-1285) and are averaging 4.84 runs per game on the road (179 r in 37 g) compared to .219 with an average of 4.16 runs per game at home...have the third best road batting average and OPS (.748) in the AL and the second lowest home batting average.

AGAINST THE WEST: The A's are 16-17 (.484) against American League West competition compared to 33-20 (.623) against all other teams...are scheduled to play 12 of their next 15 games against divisional foes...will play their final two series before the All-Star Break against the Astros and Rangers...open post-break play by hosting Cleveland but then have two games with the Angels and four with Seattle.

CLOSE CALLS: Each of the A's three games against Boston were decided by one run and the first two games were extra inning affairs...are 13-12 (.520) in one-run games...the 25 one-run decisions are tied for second most in the American League (Mariners, 26) and the wins are tied for third...are 20-19 (.513) in games decided by two runs or fewer compared to 29-18 (.617) in games decided by three runs or more...are 3-3 in extra innings...are 10-6 in games decided in the last at bat...have seven walk-off wins, which is tied with the Mariners for second most in the majors to the Rockies (8)...now have 90 walk-off wins in the Bob Melvin era, which are the most in the majors over that span.

OFFENSE: The A's were shut out for the second time in the last nine games on Sunday and are batting .193 (59-for-306) with 30 runs scored (3.3 per game) over that span...A's leadoff hitters are 3-for-33 (.091) with no runs, four walks and four hit by pitches over that stretch, which coincides with the date Mark Canha went on the injured list (June 25)...the A's lead the American League in hit by pitches (49), rank second in sacrifice flies (29), tied for third in fewest grounded into double plays (52), tied for fourth in triples (13) and fifth in walks (300)...have been successful in each of their last 11 stolen base attempts dating back to May 30 and are 33-for-41 (80.5%) for the season, which is the fourth best percentage in the AL...A's pinch hitters lead the American League in hits (19), RBI (14), sacrifice flies (2) and plate appearances (83) and are tied for second in extra base hits (4).

PITCHING: The A's have compiled a 3.24 ERA (113 er in 314.0 ip) over the last 35 games after logging a 4.24 ERA over the first 51 contests...have a 3.83 ERA for the season, which is fourth lowest in the American League...have the fifth lowest opponents on-base percentage (.305), slugging percentage (.395) and OPS (.700)...have the fewest walks (230), rank second in fewest pitches per inning (15.9) and third in shutouts (7) and fewest home runs (95).

STARTING PITCHING: A's starting pitchers are 14-8 with a 2.84 ERA (56 er in 177.2 ip) over the last 29 games dating back to June 2...are 33-29 with a 3.69

ERA (202 er in 493.0 ip) for the season...rank third in the American League in ERA and tied for third in wins...lead the majors in innings pitched (493.0) and are tied with the White Sox and Rockies for the most complete games (3)...the complete games are the most by an A's team since 2015 (5)...the A's are one of three teams in the majors with four pitchers with 17 or more starts (Dodgers, Red Sox)...have used just seven starting pitchers this year, which is second fewest to the Red Sox (6)...are one of two teams with five pitchers with six or more wins (White Sox).

BULLPEN: The A's bullpen has one save, four blown saves, a 5.06 ERA (24 er in 42.2 ip) and .284 (46-for-162) opponents batting average over the last 15 games...has converted 21-of-32 (65.6%) save opportunities overall, which is the fifth best percentage in the American League...has four losses over the last 15 games after taking just four losses over the first 71 contests...the eight losses are tied with the Brewers for the fewest in the majors...has the highest slugging percentage against first batters faced in the AL (.506), the second highest batting average (.277) and fifth highest on-base percentage (.345).

DEFENSIVE DOINGS: The A's have committed three errors in the last two games after making just two errors over the previous 19 contests...now have 39 errors for the season, which is second fewest in the American League to the Astros (32)...ranks fourth in fewest double plays (63)...A's pitchers have five pickoffs, which is tied for third most.

THIS AND THAT: The A's are 22-12 (.647) in games in which the opponent starts a left-handed pitcher compared to 27-25 (.519) when they start a right-hander...the mark against lefties is second best in the American League (White Sox, 18-8/.692) and the 34 games are tied for second most to the Astros (36)...are 37-13 (.740) when scoring first, which is the second best record in the AL (Rays, 32-11/.744)...are 30-20 (.600) in night games, 19-17 (.528) during the day...are 30-7 when out-homering the opposition, 7-22 when they are out-homered...have used 83 different lineups over the first 86 games...the A's finished the month of June with a 17-9 record (.654) record, which was second best in the American League (Astros, 19-9) and tied for fourth best in the majors...went 16-11 in April and 15-14 in May and now have 10 consecutive months with a winning record (min. 10 games)...have just one losing month dating back to 2018 (11-15 in April of 2019).

THE INJURED LIST: The A's have used the injured list 17 times this year...used it just eight times last year, which was second fewest in the majors to Cleveland (4), and 18 times in 2019, which tied for second fewest...currently have four players on the IL (Canha, Fiers, Moreland, Rosenthal)...began the year with two players on the IL but have had at least four all but one day since the fifth game of the season (three on June 16).

A's vs. ASTROS: The A's are 3-7 against the Astros...are 1-6 in Oakland and 2-1 in Houston...won the season series last year, 7-3...it was their first season series win since going 11-8 in 2014...went 7-1 in Oakland and 0-2 in Houston...then lost to the Astros in the ALDS, 3 games to 1...are now 47-68 (.409) against Houston over the last seven years after winning each of their first four season series against the Astros (31-13)...are 78-81 all-time, including 43-41 in Oakland and 35-40 in Houston.

TODAY'S TIDBITS

Matt Chapman has reached base safely in each of his last 21 games and is batting .301 (25-for-83) with 18 runs, six home runs and 18 RBI over that span...also has nine walks, a hit by pitch and sacrifice fly for a .372 on-base percentage...has a career-high 45-game errorless streak...**Sean Murphy** has 38 of his 40 RBI as a catcher and is tied for the lead among Major League catchers in RBI...**Matt Olson** ranks sixth in the American League in slugging (.552), tied for sixth in home runs (20), seventh in OPS (.923), tied for eighth in sacrifice flies (5) and tied for ninth in extra base hits (38)...**Sergio Romo** has not allowed a run in 14 of his last 16 games for a 1.26 ERA (14.1 ip, 8 h, 2 r, 2 er, 1 bb, 15 so, 1 hr)...**Lou Trivino** has a 0.39 ERA (1 er in 23.0 ip) and .195 (15-for-77) opponents batting average over his last 23 games dating back to May 8...has converted 8-of-9 save opportunities over that span and stranded all seven of his inherited runners

THIS DATE IN ATHLETICS HISTORY

In **1990** the A's hit seven home runs in the second game of a doubleheader to defeat the Cleveland Indians 12-1...Mark McGwire and Rickey Henderson hit two each and Carney Lansford, Jose Canseco and Jamie Quirk chip in one each...in **2001** Mark Mulder takes a perfect game into the eighth inning and finishes with a complete game one-hitter in the A's 3-0 win at Arizona...in **2009** Brett Anderson tosses a two-hit shutout at Fenway Park in a 6-0 A's win and Nomar Garciaparra drives in the go-ahead run in his return to Boston.

- Is 0-1 with a save, four blown saves, a 4.32 ERA (8 er in 16.2 ip) and six home runs allowed in his last 19 games dating back to May 15...was 2-0, converted each of his five save opportunities, had a 2.12 ERA and allowed no home runs over his first 17 games (17.0 ip).
- Has held right-handed hitters to a .182 (14-for-77) average but they have hit five of the career-high six home runs he has allowed.
- Has a 5.63 ERA (5 er in 8.0 ip) and .303 (10-for-33) opponents batting average in nine outings on no days rest, a 1.80 ERA (5 er in 25.0 ip) and .149 (13-for-87) opponents average in 26 appearances on one day of rest or more.
- Has faced the Astros three times (3.0 ip, 6 h, 4 r, 3 er, 2 bb, 2 so, 9.00 ERA)... has a 1.29 ERA (5 er in 35.0 ip) in 40 career appearances against the Astros.

- Has a .181 opponents batting average, which breaks down to .109 (5-for-46) against left-handed hitters compared to .237 (14-for-59) against right-handers...has issued nine of his 10 walks and yielded two of his three homers to righties for a .706 OPS...has a .363 OPS against lefties.

- Made his Major League debut with Oakland in 2017, appearing in 11 games...compiled a 10.80 ERA but has not pitched in the majors since then.
- Was signed by the Diamondbacks to a minor league contract following the 2020 season and has spent the entire year at Triple-A Reno...had a .226 opponents batting average with the Aces, which broke down to .116 (5-for-43) against left-handed hitters compared to .341 (14-for-41) with all three of his home runs against right-handed hitters...had 23 of his 30 strikeouts against lefties...his complete 2021 stats with Reno:

- Has not allowed a run in six of his last seven appearances (6.2 ip, 8 h, 2 r, 2 er, 1 bb, 2 so, 1 hr, 2.70 ERA).
- Is tied for the Major League lead in games pitched (41) and ranks third among American League relievers in innings pitched (43.2).
- Has walked just one batter in his last 20 games (20.0 innings) and has issued just six walks in 43.2 innings overall...his average of 1.24 walks per nine innings is second lowest among AL relievers...however, is averaging the fewest strikeouts per nine innings in the majors (4.74).
- Has seven wins, which is tied for the most among AL relievers and tied for seventh among all AL pitchers
- Opponents are hitting .178 (8-for-45) with runners in scoring position.
- Has a 6.94 ERA (9 er in 11.2 ip) and .340 (17-for-50) opponents batting average in 12 games against AL West competition, a 1.69 ERA (6 er in 32.0 ip) and .191 (22-for-115) average against all other teams.

- Is tied for fifth in the American League games pitched (39), ranks fifth in save percentage (86.7%) and seventh in saves (13)...ranks eighth among AL relievers in ERA (2.01) and ninth in innings pitched (40.1).
- Has a .157 (13-for-83) opponents batting average against right-handed hitters compared to .276 (16-for-58) against left-handers.
- Has not allowed an earned run in 16 games on the road (15.1 ip).
- Has a 3.00 ERA (8 er in 24.0 ip) in 22 appearances on zero or one day of rest, a 0.59 ERA (1 er in 15.1 ip) in 16 games on two days rest or more.

- Is batting .278 (49-for-176) over his last 52 games dating back to May 7 after hitting .143 over his first 31 contests.
- Has the second lowest OPS (.574), on-base percentage (.272), and slugging percentage (.302) in the American League...is tied for ninth in games (83).
- Is hitting .268 (48-for-179) against right-handed pitchers, .157 (16-for-102) against left-handers.
- Has played 153 games against the Astros in his career and is hitting .284 (166-for-585) with eight home runs.
- Hit his first home run as an Athletic Friday night, a game-tying lead-off home run in the bottom of the ninth...it was his first home run since Sept. 11, 2020 against the A's (Fiers) and it snapped a 79-game homerless streak.
- Stole his seventh base of the season last Wednesday and now has 312 in his career, which is the most among active players (Hamilton, CWS 311).

Last Year: Was hampered by a back injury for much of the season and batted .194 with three home runs and seven RBI in 29 games with Texas...had two stints on the 10-day injured list with the back injury (Aug. 20-30 and Sept. 12-end of season).

- Was recalled from Triple-A Las Vegas June 19 for his second stint with the A's this year...is 4-for-27 (.148) in 10 games, including six starts (four in center field, two in right field), since his return.
- Is 4-for-23 (.174) against right-handed pitchers, 1-for-17 (.059) against left-handers.
- Was recalled for the first time on June 1 and went 1-for-13 (.077) in nine games...was optioned back to Las Vegas June 16 but did not appear in a game with the Aviators before returning to Oakland.
- Was with the A's this spring and was designated for assignment April 1...was claimed off waivers by San Francisco April 5 and went 0-for-1 in a two-game stint with the Giants from April 27-28...was traded back to Oakland for cash on May 5 and was assigned to Las Vegas.
- Hit .375 with three home runs, 11 RBI and a .488 on-base percentage in 20 games with the Aviators...started nine games in center field, four in left field and three in right field.

Last Year: Hit .222 and walked five times in 11 games during the spring for a .391 on-base percentage...was optioned to Triple-A Las Vegas March 7 and added to the A's 60-man player pool on June 29...was never on the Taxi Squad and did not play in 2020.

- Went 3-for-5 with three RBI Saturday night after going 5-for-54 (.093) with three RBI over his previous 23 games.
- Is now batting .150 (16-for-107) over his last 41 games dating back to May 9 after hitting .273 over his first 23 contests.
- Has made 40 of his 41 starts this year and 57 of 59 in his career in games in which the opponent starts a right-handed pitcher.
- Is 3-for-12 (.250) with three RBI, a walk and a sacrifice fly as a pinch hitter...is tied for second among AL pinch hitters in plate appearances (14), tied for fourth in hits and tied for fifth in RBI.
