OAKLAND ATHLETICS (49-39) VS. HOUSTON ASTROS (54-33)

THURSDAY, JULY 8, 2021 — MINUTE MAID PARK — 1:10 CDT

RHP FRANKIE MONTAS (7-7, 4.63) VS. RHP LANCE MCCULLERS JR. (6-1, 2.97)

ABOUT THE A'S: Have lost five of the last six games and 12 of the last 17... lost the first two games of this series and are now 0-5-1 over the previous six series...it is the first time the A's have gone winless over six consecutive series in a single season since June 3-22, 2016 when they went 0-5-1...are 49-39 (.557) overall, which is the fifth best record in the American League... are in second place in the AL West for the 17th consecutive day and trail first place Houston by 5½ games...that matches the season high of 5½ games back on April 8...have spent 58 days alone in first place, three days tied for first, 18 days in second, one day tied for second, three days in third, two days in fourth, three days tied for fourth and 10 days in fifth...held at least a share of first for 61 of 62 days from April 20 to June 20.

AGAINST THE WEST: The A's are 16-19 (.457) against American League West competition compared to 33-20 (.623) against all other teams...this series with the Astros begins a stretch where Oakland is scheduled to play 12 of its 15 games against divisional foes...travel to Texas following this series, open post-break play by hosting Cleveland, and then have two games with the Angels and four with Seattle.

HOME AND AWAY: The A's are 0-2 on this six-game road trip to Houston (0-2) and Texas (three games)...this trip starts a stretch where the A's are scheduled to play 26 of their 36 games on the road...went 4-6 on the last road trip to New York-AL (1-2), Texas (2-2) and San Francisco (1-2) but are 22-17 (.564) on the road overall, which is the third best road record in the American League...the 39 road games are tied with the Rockies and Nationals for the fewest in the majors...went 2-4 on the last homestand against Texas (1-2) and Boston (1-2) and are 27-22 (.551) at home...are batting .250 (338-for-1353) and are averaging 4.82 runs per game on the road (188 runs in 39 games) compared to .219 with an average of 4.16 runs per game at home... have the third best road batting average and OPS (.745) in the AL and the third lowest home batting average.

ON THE BASES: The A's have five steals in their last three games and now have 12 stolen bases in their last 17 games after stealing just two bases over the previous 36 contests...have been successful in each of their last 14 stolen base attempts dating back to May 30 and are 36-for-44 (81.8%) for the season, which is the third best percentage in the American League.

OFFENSE: The A's are batting .201 (75-for-374) with 39 runs scored (3.55 per game) over the last 11 games...A's leadoff hitters are 5-for-41 (.122) with two runs, five walks and four hit by pitches over that stretch, which coincides with the date Mark Canha went on the injured list (June 25)...the A's lead the American League in hit by pitches (49), rank second in sacrifice flies (29), tied for third in fewest grounded into double plays (53), tied for fourth in triples (13) and fifth in walks (306)...A's pinch hitters lead the AL in hits (19), RBI (14), sacrifice flies (2) and plate appearances (86) and are tied for second in extra base hits (4).

PITCHING: The A's have compiled a 3.41 ERA (125 er in 330.0 ip) over the last 37 games after logging a 4.24 ERA over the first 51 contests...have a 3.89 ERA for the season, which is fifth lowest in the American League...have the fifth lowest opponents on-base percentage (.305), slugging percentage (.396) and OPS (.701)...have the fewest walks (233), rank second in fewest pitches per inning (16.0), third in shutouts (7) and tied for fourth in fewest home runs (99).

STARTING PITCHING: A's starting pitchers are 14-9 with a 3.10 ERA (65 er in 188.2 ip) over the last 31 games dating back to June 2...are 33-30 with a 3.77 ERA (211 er in 504.0 ip) for the season...rank fourth in the American League in ERA...lead the majors in innings pitched (504.0) and are tied with the White Sox and Rockies for the most complete games (3)...the complete games are the most by an A's team since 2015 (5)...the A's are one of three teams in the majors with four pitchers with 17 or more starts (Dodgers, Red Sox)...have used just seven starting pitchers this year, which is second fewest to the Red Sox (6)...are one of two teams with five pitchers with six or more wins (White Sox).

BULLPEN: The A's bullpen has one save, four blown saves, a 5.10 ERA (27 er in 47.2 ip) and .276 (50-for-181) opponents batting average over the last 17 games...has converted 21-of-32 (65.6%) save opportunities overall, which is the fifth best percentage in the American League...has five losses over the last 17 games after taking just four losses over the first 71 contests...the nine losses are the fewest in the AL...has the highest slugging percentage against first batters faced in the AL (.506), the second highest batting average (.281) and fifth highest on-base percentage (.347).

DEFENSIVE DOINGS: The A's have committed five errors in the last four games after making just two errors over the previous 19 contests...now have 41 errors for the season, which is tied for second fewest in the American League to the Astros (35)...ranks fourth in fewest double plays (64)...A's pitchers have five pickoffs, which is tied for third most.

CLOSE CALLS: The A's are 13-123 (.500) in one-run games...are tied for third in the American League in one-run wins and one-run games (26)...are 20-20 (.500) in games decided by two runs or fewer compared to 29-19 (.604) in games decided by three runs or more...are 3-3 in extra innings...are 10-6 in games decided in the last at bat...have seven walk-off wins, which is tied with the Mariners for second most in the majors to the Rockies (9)...now have 90 walk-off wins in the Bob Melvin era, which are the most in the majors over that span.

ALL-STAR: Matt Olson was named to his first American League All-Star team on Sunday as the A's lone representative...it is the first time the A's have one All-Star since 2017 (Alonso)...had two in both 2018 (Lowrie, Treinen) and 2019 (Chapman, Hendriks)...Olson will also be participating in the Home Run Derby...this is the second consecutive Derby with an Athletic (Chapman, 2019) and Olson is the ninth Athletic to participate in the Derby.

THIS AND THAT: The A's are 22-13 (.629) in games in which the opponent starts a left-handed pitcher compared to 27-26 (.509) when they start a right-hander...the mark against lefties is second best in the American League (White Sox, 18-8/.692) and the 35 games are second most to the Astros (37)...are 30-7 (.811) when out-homering the opposition, 7-23 (.233) when they are out-homered...have used 85 different lineups over the first 88 games...the A's finished the month of June with a 17-9 record (.654) record, which was second best in the American League (Astros, 19-9) and tied for fourth best in the majors...went 16-11 in April and 15-14 in May and now have 10 consecutive months with a winning record (min. 10 games)...have just one losing month dating back to 2018 (11-15 in April of 2019).

THE INJURED LIST: The A's have used the injured list 18 times this year...used it just eight times last year, which was second fewest in the majors to Cleveland (4), and 18 times in 2019, which tied for second fewest...currently have five players on the IL (Canha, Fiers, Moreland, Pinder, Rosenthal)...began the year with two players on the IL but have had at least four all but one day since the fifth game of the season (three on June 16).

A's vs. ASTROS: The A's are 3-9 against the Astros...are 1-6 in Oakland and 2-3 in Houston...won the season series last year, 7-3...it was their first season series win since going 11-8 in 2014...went 7-1 in Oakland and 0-2 in Houston...then lost to the Astros in the ALDS, 3 games to 1...are now 47-70 (.402) against Houston over the last seven years after winning each of their first four season series against the Astros (31-13)...are 78-83 all-time, including 43-41 in Oakland and 35-42 in Houston.

TODAY'S TIDBITS

Matt Chapman has reached base safely in each of his last 22 games and is batting .299 (26-for-87) with 18 runs, six home runs and 18 RBI over that span...also has nine walks, a hit by pitch and sacrifice fly for a .367 on-base percentage...has a career-high 46-game errorless streak...**Sean Murphy** has 38 of his 40 RBI as a catcher and leads American League catchers in RBI...**Matt Olson** ranks fifth in the AL in OPS (.932), tied for fifth in home runs (21), sixth in slugging (.557), tied for eighth in sacrifice flies (5) and is 10th in extra base hits (39)...**Sergio Romo** has not allowed a run in 15 of his last 17 games for a 1.15 ERA (15.2 ip, 8 h, 2 r, 2 er, 1 bb, 15 so, 1 hr)...**Lou Trivino** has a 0.39 ERA (1 er in 23.0 ip) and .195 (15-for-77) opponents batting average over his last 23 games dating back to May 8...has converted 8-of-9 save opportunities over that span and stranded all seven of his inherited runners

THIS DATE IN ATHLETICS HISTORY

In **1902** Danny Murphy goes 6-for-6 with a home run in his A's debut as Philadelphia defeats Boston 22-9...in **1935** Jimmie Foxx homers and drives in three runs in a 4-1 American League victory in the third All-Star game at Cleveland...in **1955** Joe DeMaestri is a perfect 6-for-6 in an 11-8, 11 inning loss to Detroit...in **1993** Troy Neel homers twice and drives in seven runs but the A's still lose 11-9 to Boston...in **2013** Grant Balfour records his 41st consecutive save in the A's 2-1 win at Pittsburgh to break Dennis Eckersley's club record for consecutive saves.

TODAY'S STARTING PITCHER: Frankie Montas (7-7, 4.63 ERA)

FOR STARTERS: Is 2-5 with a 4.38 ERA (25 er in 51.1 ip) over his last nine starts after going 5-2 with a 4.93 ERA over his first eight starts...his seven wins are tied for eighth in the American League and his seven losses are also tied for eighth most...has career highs in games started (17), losses (7), hits (98), runs (53), walks (27) and home runs (14)...is eight strikeouts away from his best of 103 in 2019 and his seven wins are second only to his nine in 2019.

OPPONENTS BATTING: Has a .206 (28-for-136) opponents batting average the first time through the order, .290 (69-for-238) with 11 of his 14 home runs after that...has a .337 (33-for-98) opponents batting average against the opponents one and two hitters but has held the three and four hitters to a .205 (18-for-88) average.

EXTRA INNINGS: Each of his last two starts have gone extra innings and he has no decisions, a 3.38 ERA (4 er in 10.2 ip) and .184 (7-for-38) opponents batting average in those two starts...three of his 17 starts have gone into extra innings.

THAT'S ODD: Has a 6.12 ERA (34 er in 50.0 ip) and .291 (62-for-213) opponents batting average in odd numbered innings and a 2.91 ERA (14 er in 43.1 ip) and .221 (36-for-163) opponents average in even numbered innings.

BY MONTH: Went 2-2 in five starts in April, 3-3 in six starts in May and 2-2 in five starts in June...however, had a 6.20 ERA in April, 3.18 in May and 5.28 in June...is 0-0 with a 3.18 ERA (2 er in 5.2 ip) in one start in July.

2021 HIGHLIGHTS: Took the loss in his first start on April 5 against Los Angeles (NL)...allowed seven runs in a season-low 2.2 innings and walked a season-high three batters...tossed 90 pitches, which were the most by an A's pitcher in an outing of fewer than three innings since pitch counts were tracked beginning in 1988...the loss extended his losing streak to a career-high three games dating back to Sept. 13, 2020...then picked up the win in each of his next two starts and allowed just one run on eight hits in 12.0 innings...won 7-3 at Houston on April 10 and then combined with Romo, Diekmann and Wendelken on a four-hit shutout in the A's 3-0 victory over Detroit on April 16...allowed six runs on a season-high nine hits in 4.0 innings against Minnesota on April 21 but had a no decision in the A's 13-12, 10-inning win...allowed three home runs in a start for the second time in his career (Sept. 22, 2020 vs. Los Angeles-NL)...had a season-high 105 pitches in a 4-3 loss at Tampa Bay on April 27...finished April 2-2 with a 6.20 ERA in five starts...then went 3-3 with a 3.18 ERA in six starts in May...the three wins matched his most ever in a month and he had 38 strikeouts, which tied for eighth in the American League...won each of his first three starts in May and posted a 3.12 ERA over that stretch from May 3-14...then went 0-3 with a 3.24 ERA over his next three starts from May 19-29...the losing streak matched his career high...struck out 11 batters in 6.0 innings in a 4-2 loss to Seattle on May 24...it was his fourth career game of 10 or more strikeouts and the second highest single-game total of his career to his 13 against the Mariners in the final game of the 2020 season...walked a season-high tying three...tossed a season-high 7.0 innings June 15 against Los Angeles (AL) and allowed just two runs for the win...then surrendered a season-high eight runs on a season-high tying nine hits in 5.2 innings at Texas on June 21 for the loss.

LAST START: He had his second consecutive no decision in an extra inning loss, a 3-2 decision to Boston last Friday in Oakland...issued a season-high tying three walks...retired nine of 11 batters over the first three innings...then walked Bogaerts to start the fourth and Devers followed with a RBI double...also allowed a RBI single to Verdugo in the fifth...was relieved by Wendelken with the bases loaded and two outs in the sixth inning with the A's trailing 2-0...Wendelken got the final out and Oakland scored once in the seventh and once in the ninth to get him off the hook.

MONTAS vs. HOUSTON: Is 5-4 with a 4.06 ERA (51.0 ip, 56 h, 25 r, 23 er, 18 bb, 41 so, 7 hr) in 11 career appearances, including nine starts, during the regular season...also has a loss in one postseason start (5 er in 3.2 ip)...is 2-2 with a 4.64 ERA (11 er in 21.1 ip) in five games at Minute Maid Park and 3-2 with a 3.64 ERA (12 er in 29.2 ip) in six games in the Coliseum...is 1-1 with a 2.45 ERA (11.0 ip, 13 h, 3 r, 3 er, 3 bb, 11 so, 2 hr) in two starts this year...the win came in a 7-3 A's victory at Houston on April 10...then took the loss in an 8-1 decision in Oakland on May 19...allowed a home run to Altuve to start the game and Correa added a RBI single later in the inning...then blanked the Astros on four hits and a walk over his final four innings...was relieved by Guerra to start the sixth with the A's trailing 2-1.

2020 RECAP: Was off to a strong start as he was 2-1 with a 1.57 ERA, .175 opponents batting average and no home runs over his first four starts...was scratched from his scheduled start on Aug. 14 at San Francisco with upper back tightness and went 1-4 with an 8.70 ERA, .321 opponents average and 10 home runs over his final seven starts...went 3-5 with a 5.60 ERA in 11 starts overall...his ERA was eighth highest in the majors among pitchers with at least 50 innings pitched...had career highs in losses (5) and earned runs (33) and matched his high in home runs (10), runs (35) and walks (23)...led the A's in strikeouts (60), losses, runs, home runs and walks...his opponents batting average broke down to .198 (22-for-111) against right-handed hitters compared to .350 (35-for-100) against left-handers...surrendered six of his 10 home runs and issued 15 of his 23 walks to lefties for a 1.061 OPS (.572 against right-handers).

TOMORROW'S PROBABLE STARTING PITCHER
LHP Cole Irvin (6-7, 3.56 ERA): Is 3-0 with a 2.63 ERA over his last six starts...the three-game winning streak is the longest of his career...the A's have won all three of his no decisions during the streak...went 3-7 with a 4.12 ERA over his first 11 starts...his seven losses are tied for eighth most in the American League...has walked two batters or fewer in each of his 17 starts, including nine starts with one walk and three starts with no walks...has issued just 19 free passes in 101.0 innings and his average of 1.69 walks per nine innings is second lowest in the AL...is 4-2 with a 2.55 ERA in seven starts on the road and has the fourth lowest road ERA in the AL...had a no decision in his last start, a 7-6 A's win over Boston in 12 innings last Saturday in Oakland (7.0 ip, 5 h, 4 r, 2 er, 2 bb, 5 so)...was the winning pitcher in his only career appearance against the Rangers, a start in the A's 13-6 win at Texas on June 22 (5.0 ip, 7 h, 4 r, 3 er, 1 bb, 4 so).

- Is 0-1 with a save, four blown saves, a 4.32 ERA (8 er in 16.2 ip) and six home runs allowed in his last 19 games dating back to May 15...was 2-0, converted each of his five save opportunities, had a 2.12 ERA and allowed no home runs over his first 17 games (17.0 ip).
- Has held right-handed hitters to a .182 (14-for-77) average but they have hit five of the career-high six home runs he has allowed.
- Has a 5.63 ERA (5 er in 8.0 ip) and .303 (10-for-33) opponents batting average in nine outings on no days rest, a 1.80 ERA (5 er in 25.0 ip) and .149 (13-for-87) opponents average in 26 appearances on one day of rest or more.
- Has faced the Astros three times (3.0 ip, 6 h, 4 r, 3 er, 2 bb, 2 so, 9.00 ERA)...has a 1.29 ERA (5 er in 35.0 ip) in 40 career appearances against the Astros.

Last Year: Allowed just two runs in 21 appearances and only one was earned for a 0.42 ERA...ranked second among Major League relievers in ERA and opponents slugging percentage (.157), fifth in batting average (.114) and seventh in OPS (.410)

- Has allowed four runs over his last four games (3.1 ip, 10.80 ERA) after six consecutive scoreless appearances from May 24-June 25 (8.1 ip, 1 h, 1 bb, 6 so).
- Has a .183 opponents batting average, which breaks down to .125 (6-for-48) against left-handed hitters compared to .230 (14-for-61) against right-handers...has issued nine of his 10 walks and yielded two of his three homers to righties for a .685 OPS...has a .389 OPS against lefties.
- Opponents are batting .143 (3-for-21) with runners in scoring position.
- Has pitched against Houston three times this year (4.2 ip, 5 h, 4 r, 4 er, 1 bb, 4 so, 1 hr, 7.71 ERA).
