



OAKLAND ATHLETICS (50-40) VS. TEXAS RANGERS (35-53)

ABOUT THE A'S: The A's dropped game one of this three-game set last night, 3-2...won their 50th game of the season Thursday, marking just the fifth time in the last 29 years the A's have won their 50th game in 89 games or fewer (2002, 03, 14, 15)...lost two of three at Houston to start the road trip and are now 0-5-1 over the last six series...it is the first time the A's have gone winless over six consecutive series in a single season since they went 0-5-1 over a six-series stretch from June 3-22, 2016...have lost six of the last eight games and 13 of the last 19...are 50-40 (.556) overall, which is the fifth best record in the American League...are in second place in the AL West for the 19th consecutive day and trail first place Houston by 4½ games...that is one game short of the season high of 5½ (April 8 and July 7)...have spent 58 days alone in first place, three days tied for first, 20 days in second, one day tied for second, three days in third, two days in fourth, three days tied for fourth and 10 days in fifth...held at least a share of first for 61 of 62 days from April 20 to June 20.

THE ALL-STAR BREAK: The A's will go into the All-Star Break with a winning record for the third consecutive season as they are 50-40 entering the final two games before the break...were 51-41 in 2019 (2nd place, seven games behind Houston) and 55-42 in 2018 (3rd place, -8)...A's pitchers have 741 strikeouts, which is already an Athletics Pre All-Star Break record (728 in 2014)...have a 3.85 ERA and have not had an ERA under 4.00 since 2015 (3.37)...the offense is batting .233 and has went into the break with a mark under .233 twice in Oakland history (.225 in 2012, .231 in 1982).

ONE-RUN GAMES AND OTHER CLOSE CALLS: Sox of the A's last seven games have been decided by one run and Oakland is 14-14 (.500) in one-run games...have the most one-run games in the American League and are third in wins...are 21-21 (.500) in games decided by two runs or fewer compared to 29-19 (.604) in games decided by three runs or more...are 3-3 in extra innings...are 10-6 in games decided in the last at bat...have seven walk-off wins, which is tied with the Mariners for the most in the AL and tied for second most in the majors (Rockies, 9)...now have 90 walk-off wins in the Bob Melvin era, which are the most in the majors over that span.

AGAINST THE WEST: The A's are 17-20 (.459) against American League West competition compared to 33-20 (.623) against all other teams...lost two of three at Houston to start the week and begin a stretch of 12 of 15 games against divisional foes...after this three-game series with Texas, the A's open post-break play by hosting Cleveland, and then have two games with the Angels and four with Seattle.

HOME AND AWAY: The A's are 1-3 on this six-game road trip to Houston (1-2) and Texas (0-1)...this trip starts a stretch where the A's are scheduled to play 26 of their 36 games on the road...went 4-6 on the last road trip to New York-AL (1-2), Texas (2-2) and San Francisco (1-2) but are 23-18 (.561) on the road overall, which is the third best road record in the American League...the 41 road games are tied for the fewest in the majors...went 2-4 on the last homestand against Texas (1-2) and Boston (1-2) and are 27-22 (.551) at home...begin post-break play with a five-game homestand against Cleveland (three-games) and Los Angeles-AL (two games).

ON THE BASES: The A's have 12 stolen bases in their last 19 games after stealing just two bases over the previous 36 contests...have been successful in each of their last 14 stolen base attempts dating back to May 30 and are 36-for-44 (81.8%) for the season, which is the third best percentage in the American League.

OFFENSE: The A's are batting .204 (90-for-442) with 43 runs scored (3.31 per game) over the last 13 games...A's leadoff hitters are 8-for-49 (.163) with a run, six walks and four hit by pitches over that stretch, which coincides with the date Mark Canha went on the injured list (June 25)...the A's lead the American League in hit by pitches (49), rank second in sacrifice flies (29), third in fewest grounded into double plays (53), tied for fourth in triples (13) and fifth in walks (312)...A's pinch hitters lead the AL in hits (19), RBI (14), sacrifice flies (2) and plate appearances (87) and are tied for second in extra base hits (4).

PITCHING: The A's have compiled a 3.34 ERA (132 er in 356.0 ip) over the last 40 games after logging a 4.27 ERA over the first 50 contests...have a 3.85 ERA for the season, which is fifth lowest in the American League...also have the fifth lowest opponents on-base percentage (.304), slugging percentage (.393) and OPS (.697)...have the fewest walks (237), rank second in fewest pitches per inning (16.0) and tied for third in shutouts (7) and fewest home runs (99).

STARTING PITCHING: A's starting pitchers are 15-10 with a 3.10 ERA (69 er in 200.1 ip) over the last 33 games dating back to June 2...are 34-31 with a 3.75 ERA (215 er in 515.2 ip) for the season...rank third in the American League in wins and fourth in ERA...lead the majors in innings pitched (515.2) and

are tied with the White Sox and Rockies for the most complete games (3)...the complete games are the most by an A's team since 2015 (5)...the A's are the first team in the majors with four pitchers with 18 or more starts...have used just seven starting pitchers, which is second fewest to the Red Sox (6)...are one of two teams with five pitchers with six or more wins (White Sox).

BULLPEN: The A's bullpen is 1-2 with a save, a blown save, a 1.66 ERA (4 er in 21.2 ip) and .178 (13-for-73) opponents batting average over the last seven games but is 8-8 with 10 saves, 11 blown saves and a 4.53 ERA (73 er in 145.0 ip) over the last 50 contests...has converted 22-of-34 (64.7%) save opportunities overall...has five losses over the last 17 games after taking just four losses over the first 71 contests.

DEFENSIVE DOINGS: The A's have committed five errors in the last six games after making just two errors over the previous 19 contests...now have 41 errors for the season, which is second fewest in the American League...ranks tied for fourth in fewest double plays (67)...A's pitchers have five pickoffs, which is tied for third most.

ALL-STAR: Matt Olson was named to his first American League All-Star team on Sunday as the A's lone representative...it is the first time the A's have one All-Star since 2017 (Alonso)...had two in both 2018 (Lowrie, Treinen) and 2019 (Chapman, Hendriks)...Olson will also be participating in the Home Run Derby...this is the second consecutive Derby with an Athletic (Chapman, 2019) and Olson is the ninth Athletic to participate in the Derby...Chris Bassitt was named to the All-Star team today...is his first career All-Star appearance.

THIS AND THAT: The A's are 22-13 (.629) in games in which the opponent starts a left-handed pitcher compared to 28-27 (.509) when they start a right-hander...are 30-7 (.811) when out-homering the opposition, 7-23 (.233) when they are out-homered...have used 87 different lineups over the first 89 games.

THE INJURED LIST: The A's have used the injured list 18 times this year...used it just eight times last year, which was second fewest in the majors to Cleveland (4), and 18 times in 2019, which tied for second fewest...currently have five players on the IL (Canha, Fiers, Moreland, Pinder, Rosenthal)...began the year with two players on the IL but have had at least four all but one day since the fifth game of the season (three on June 16).

A's vs. RANGERS: The A's are 3-5 against the Rangers...are 1-2 in Oakland and 2-3 in Texas...today is the A's ninth game against the Rangers in their last 17 games...won the season series last year, 7-3...it was their fourth consecutive season series victory over the Rangers, which is just the second time the A's have won four consecutive season series against Texas (2002-05)...went 4-3 in Arlington last year and 3-0 in Oakland...have won 17 of the last 24 games and are 32-15 over the last 47 contests...have won eight of the last 11 games and 26 of the last 34 in Oakland...are 47-28 (.627) against the Rangers over the last five years...are 388-381 all-time against the Texas Rangers...that breaks down to 204-178 in Oakland and 184-203 in Texas...are 6-6 at Globe Life Field...have an all-time record of 485-465 against the Rangers/Senators franchise.

TODAY'S TIDBITS

Matt Chapman has reached base safely in each of his last 24 games and is batting .305 (29-for-95) with 19 runs, six home runs and 18 RBI over that span...also has nine walks, a hit by pitch and sacrifice fly for a .368 on-base percentage...has a career-high 48-game errorless streak...**Matt Olson** ranks fifth in the AL in OPS (.928), sixth in slugging (.556), tied for sixth in home runs (21), tied for ninth in RBI (57), and tied for seventh in extra base hits (41)...**Sergio Romo** has not allowed a run in 16 of his last 18 games for a 1.08 ERA (16.2 ip, 8 h, 2 r, 2 er, 1 bb, 16 so, 1 hr)...**Lou Trivino** has a 0.38 ERA (1 er in 23.0 ip) and .188 (15-for-80) opponents batting average over his last 24 games dating back to May 8...has converted 8-of-9 save opportunities over that span and stranded all seven of his inherited runners

THIS DATE IN ATHLETICS HISTORY

In **1901** Harry Davis becomes the first player in American League history to hit for the cycle...in **1932** Jimmie Foxx ties the American League record for most total bases in a game with 16...he hits three home runs and adds a double and two singles while driving in eight runs in the A's 18-17, 18 inning win at Cleveland...Eddie Rommel pitches 17 innings of relief and allows 29 hits...in **1990** five Oakland A's play in the All-Star Game at Wrigley Field...Bob Welch starts the game and pitches two innings and Dennis Eckersley pitches a scoreless ninth to save the American League's 2-0 victory...in **2004** Erubiel Durazo has a pinch hit grand slam and drives in five runs as the A's win at Cleveland, 16-7.

TODAY'S STARTING PITCHER: James Kaprielian (4-3, 2.84 ERA)

FOR STARTERS: Was recalled from Triple-A Las Vegas May 12 and is scheduled to make his 11th start of the season and his career...it will be the third time in his last four starts he has faced the Rangers...has allowed two runs or fewer in seven of his 10 starts and has a 2.84 ERA, which is second lowest among American League rookies with 40 or more innings...his four wins are tied for sixth among AL rookies.

SIX HITS OR FEWER: Has allowed six hits or fewer in each of his 10 starts and has held the opposition to a .198 (41-for-207) batting average...that is eighth lowest among American League pitchers with 50 or more innings...has not allowed more than six hits in 12 career appearances...his shortest career outing is 1.2 innings and his career-opening streak of 12 consecutive games with six hits or fewer and 1.2 innings pitched or more is the longest in Athletics history.

OPPONENTS BATTING: His opponents batting average breaks down to .148 (17-for-115) with a .462 OPS against right-handed hitters compared to .261 (24-for-92) with a .869 OPS against left-handers...has allowed a .147 (5-for-34) batting average with runners in scoring position and opponents are 0-for-9 with the bases loaded...six of the eight home runs he has allowed have been solo shots...has a .099 (8-for-81) opponents average the first time through the lineup, .308 (24-for-78) the second time and .188 (9-for-48) after that.

BY INNING: Has allowed one run in the first inning and none in the second inning and has a 0.45 ERA (1 er in 20.0 ip) and .106 (7-for-66) opponents average over innings one and two...has a 4.58 ERA (10 er in 19.2 ip) and .260 (20-for-77) in innings three and four and a 3.63 ERA (7 er in 17.1 ip) and .219 (14-for-64) from the fifth inning on.

HOME AND AWAY: Is 2-1 with a 4.06 ERA (14 er in 31.0 ip) and .228 (26-for-114) opponents batting average in six starts on the road compared to 2-2 with a 1.38 ERA (4 er in 26.0 ip) and .161 (15-for-93) opponents average in four starts at home.

2021 HIGHLIGHTS: Began the year at Triple-A Las Vegas and went 0-1 with a 3.86 ERA in one start...was the Aviators Opening Day starter on May 6 at Las Vegas and was the losing pitcher in an 8-1 loss to Sacramento (4.2 ip, 8 h, 2 r, 2 er, 1 bb, 5 so, 0 hr, 76 pitches)...was recalled by Oakland on May 12 and made his first Major League start that day at Boston...allowed a run on four hits in 5.0 innings to earn his first ML win in the A's 4-1 victory over the Red Sox...struck out nine batters in 5.2 innings in his second start on May 21 at Los Angeles (AL) but had a no decision in an 8-4 A's win...left with a 3-2 lead and two outs in the bottom of the sixth but Petit allowed a run for the blown save...it was the first of two starts in which he left with the lead only to have the bullpen blow the save (June 23 at Texas)...tossed 7.0 scoreless innings May 26 against Seattle for his second win...that matched his longest outing as a professional...also tossed 7.0 innings for Single-A Tampa at Charlotte on April 16, 2016, his second professional appearance...logged a season-low 3.2 innings May 31 at Seattle but had a no decision in the A's 6-5, 10-inning loss...allowed a career-high four runs...was charged with the first loss of his career when he allowed two runs in 5.0 innings on June 6 at Colorado, a 3-1 A's loss...pitched 6.0 scoreless innings and allowed just two hits on June 12 to defeat Kansas City 11-2...walked a career-high four...allowed a career-high six hits and tossed 105 pitches, which were his most as a professional, in a 5-4 loss to Texas on June 29

LAST START: He lost his second consecutive start in the A's 1-0 loss to Boston last Sunday in Oakland...struck out a career-high 10 batters in a career-high tying 7.0 innings...it was the first 10-strikeout game by an A's rookie since Chris Bassitt on Aug. 9, 2015 against Houston (also 10)...blanked the Red Sox on two hits and a walk over the first five innings before putting runners on first and third to start the sixth inning...got Devers to ground into a double play, but that allowed the only run of the game to score...Pivetta, Whitlock and Barnes shut out the A's on four hits.

over the first four innings before allowing a RBI double to Heim with two outs in the fifth...also surrendered a solo home run to Garcia in the sixth to give Texas a 2-0 lead...Oakland then scored three times in the seventh and he was relieved by Petit to start the bottom of the seventh...Petit allowed two runs for the blown save...then took the loss in a 5-4 A's loss in Oakland on June 29...tossed 105 pitches, which were his most as a professional...the A's scored a run in the first and he retired 11 of the first 12 batters before allowing a two-out solo home run to Gallo in the fourth...Oakland regained the lead with a run in the bottom of the fourth but he allowed a RBI double to Heim in the sixth and another solo home run to Gallo in the sixth.

2020 RECAP: Made his Major League debut and had two relief appearances over five stints with Oakland...compiled a 7.36 ERA and .267 opponents batting average...allowed two home runs in 3.2 innings, walked two and struck out four...was recalled for the first time Aug. 4 but did not pitch before he was optioned back to the A's alternate site on Aug. 6...joined the club a second time Aug. 16 and made his ML debut that day at San Francisco (2.0 ip, 1 h, 1 r, 1 er, 1 bb, 1 so)...relieved Fiers to start the seventh inning with the A's leading 13-2 and allowed a home run to the first batter he faced (Crawford)...walked the next batter (Dubon) before retiring each of the final six batters he faced...struck out Solano to end the seventh inning for his first strikeout...was optioned on Aug. 19...was recalled as the 29th man for doubleheaders on Sept. 8 and Sept. 14 but did not pitch...recalled for his fifth stint on Sept. 24 and made one appearance in the second game of the Sept. 26 double-header against Seattle (1.2 ip, 3 h, 2 r, 2 er, 1 bb, 3 so)...inherited a bases loaded situation in the third inning with the A's trailing 4-1 and allowed all three runs to score...was on the Taxi Squad for the postseason...was rated as the A's number 10 prospect by *Baseball America* following the season..

CAREER NOTES: Made his Major League debut with Oakland in 2020 after pitching in just 27 games over his first five professional seasons due to elbow problems...compiled a 7.36 ERA and .267 opponents batting average in two relief appearances with the A's...is 6-6 with a 3.00 ERA (34 er in 102.0 ip) in 28 games, including 23 starts, as a minor leaguer...has 116 strikeouts in 102.0 innings (10.24 per nine innings)...was the New York Yankees first round draft pick in 2015 but pitched in just eight games over his first four years as a professional...missed most of 2016 with an elbow injury and then missed the entire 2017 and 2018 seasons following April 18, 2017 "Tommy John" surgery...was traded to the A's at the 2017 trading deadline in the Sonny Gray deal and is the last remaining player from that deal that also netted the A's Dustin Fowler and Jorge Mateo...pitched for Scottsdale in the Arizona Fall League in 2016...was rated by *Baseball America* as the Yankees No. 4 prospect following the 2015 season and No. 5 following 2016...was the A's No. 8 prospect after the 2017 season and No. 10 following 2020.

TOMORROW'S PROBABLE STARTING PITCHER

RHP Chris Bassitt (9-2, 3.04 ERA): Is 9-0 with a 3.16 ERA and .212 opponents batting average over his last 16 starts...the winning streak is an on-going career high, the longest streak in the majors this year and tied for ninth longest in Oakland history...ranks second in the American League in innings pitched (111.0), tied for second in wins (9), third in winning percentage (.818), fifth in opponents slugging percentage (.356), sixth in opponents OPS (.639), seventh in strikeouts (115), eighth in opponents batting average (.220) and ninth in opponents on-base percentage (.284)...is 5-0 in 10 starts on the road and now has a six-game winning streak on the road...had a no decision in his last start, a 9-6 A's loss at Houston on Tuesday (4.1 ip, 8 h, 6 r, 6 er, 1 bb, 6 so)...is 4-2 with a 3.63 ERA (44.2 ip, 39 h, 19 r, 18 er, 17 bb, 47 so, 4 hr) in 11 career appearances, including seven starts, against Texas...is 2-0 with a 0.64 ERA (14.0 ip, 8 h, 1 r, 1 er, 4 bb, 11 so, 0 hr) in two starts this year.

- Tossed a scoreless ninth inning yesterday at Houston for his seventh save of the season...it was his first since May 26 and the seven saves match his career total entering the season.
- Thursday was the 499th appearance of his career and he needs one more to become one of 21 active pitchers with 500 or more games pitched.
- Has a 2.38 ERA (3 er in 11.1 ip) and .205 (8-for-39) opponents batting average over his last 13 games dating back to June 4.
- Has held right-handed hitters to a .179 (14-for-78) average but they have hit five of the career-high six home runs he has allowed.
- Has a 5.63 ERA (5 er in 8.0 ip) and .303 (10-for-33) opponents batting average in nine outings on no days rest, a 1.73 ERA (5 er in 26.0 ip) and .156 (14-for-90) opponents average in 27 appearances on one day of rest or more.
- Has faced Texas twice this year (1.2 ip, 2 h, 1 r, 1 r, 2 bb, 4 so, 5.40 ERA)...has a 7.88 ERA (7 er in 8.0 ip) in nine career appearances against the Rangers.

Last Year: Allowed just two runs in 21 appearances and only one was earned for a 0.42 ERA...ranked second among Major League relievers in ERA and opponents slugging percentage (.157), fifth in batting average (.114) and seventh in OPS (.410)
