OAKLAND ATHLETICS (51-40) VS. TEXAS RANGERS (35-54)

ABOUT THE A'S: The A's won game two of the series yesterday in 11 innings by a score of 8-4...won their 50th game of the season Thursday, marking just the fifth time in the last 29 years the A's have won their 50th game in 89 games or fewer (2002, 03, 14, 15)...lost two of three at Houston to start the road trip and are now 0-5-1 over the last six series...it is the first time the A's have gone winless over six consecutive series in a single season since they went 0-5-1 over a six-series stretch from June 3-22, 2016...have lost six of the last nine games and 14 of the last 20...are 51-40 (.560) overall, which is the fifth best record in the American League...are in second place in the AL West for the 20th consecutive day and trail first place Houston by 3½ games...that is two games short of the season high of 5½ (April 8 and July 7)...have spent 58 days alone in first place, three days tied for first, 21 days in second, one day tied for second, three days in third, two days in fourth, three days tied for fourth and 10 days in fifth...held at least a share of first for 61 of 62 days from April 20 to June 20.

THE ALL-STAR BREAK: The A's will go into the All-Star Break with a winning record for the third consecutive season as they are 51-40 entering the final game before the break...were 51-41 in 2019 (2nd place, seven games behind Houston) and 55-42 in 2018 (3rd place, -8)...A's pitchers have 751 strikeouts, which is already an Athletics Pre All-Star Break record (728 in 2014)...have a 3.83 ERA and have not had an ERA under 4.00 since 2015 (3.37)...the offense is batting .233 and has went into the break with a mark under .233 twice in Oakland history (.225 in 2012, .231 in 1982).

ONE-RUN GAMES AND OTHER CLOSE CALLS: Six of the A's last eight games have been decided by one run and Oakland is 14-14 (.500) in one-run games...have the most one-run games in the American League and are third in wins...are 21-21 (.500) in games decided by two runs or fewer compared to 30-19 (.612) in games decided by three runs or more...are 4-3 in extra innings...are 10-6 in games decided in the last at bat...have seven walk-off wins, which is tied with the Mariners for the most in the AL and tied for second most in the majors (Rockies, 9)...now have 90 walk-off wins in the Bob Melvin era, which are the most in the majors over that span.

AGAINST THE WEST: The A's are 18-20 (.474) against American League West competition compared to 33-20 (.623) against all other teams...lost two of three at Houston to start the week and begin a stretch of 10 of 13 games against divisional foes...after this three-game series with Texas, the A's open post-break play by hosting Cleveland, and then have two games with the Angels and four with Seattle.

HOME AND AWAY: The A's are 2-3 on this six-game road trip to Houston (1-2) and Texas (1-1)...this trip starts a stretch where the A's are scheduled to play 26 of their 36 games on the road...went 4-6 on the last road trip to New York-AL (1-2), Texas (2-2) and San Francisco (1-2) but are 24-18 (.571) on the road overall, which is the third best road record in the American League...the 42 road games are tied for the fewest in the majors...went 2-4 on the last homestand against Texas (1-2) and Boston (1-2) and are 27-22 (.551) at home...begin post-break play with a five-game homestand against Cleveland (three-games) and Los Angeles-AL (two games).

ON THE BASES: The A's have 13 stolen bases in their last 20 games after stealing just two bases over the previous 36 contests...have been successful in each of their last 15 stolen base attempts dating back to May 30 and are 37-for-45 (82.2%) for the season, which is the third best percentage in the American League.

OFFENSE: The A's are batting .205 (99-for-483) with 51 runs scored (3.64 per game) over the last 14 games...A's leadoff hitters are 10-for-54 (.185) with a run, six walks and four hit by pitches over that stretch, which coincides with the date Mark Canha went on the injured list (June 25)...the A's lead the American League in hit by pitches (50), rank second in sacrifice flies (29), third in fewest grounded into double plays (54), tied for fourth in triples (13) and are fifth in walks (313)...A's pinch hitters lead the AL in hits (19), RBI (14), sacrifice flies (2) and plate appearances (89), and are tied for second in extra base hits (4).

PITCHING: The A's have compiled a 3.31 ERA (135 er in 367.0 ip) over the last 41 games after logging a 4.27 ERA over the first 50 contests...have a 3.83 ERA for the season, which is fifth lowest in the American League...also have the fifth lowest opponents on-base percentage (.305), slugging percentage (.392) and OPS (.697)...have the second fewest walks (246), rank second in fewest pitches per inning (16.0) and tied for third in shutouts (7) and tied for fourth in fewest home runs (101).

STARTING PITCHING: A's starting pitchers are 15-10 with a 3.11 ERA (71 er in 205.1 ip) over the last 34 games dating back to June 2...are 34-31 with a 3.75 ERA (217 er in 520.2 ip) for the season...rank third in the American League in wins and fourth in ERA...lead the majors in innings pitched (520.2) and

are tied with the White Sox and Rockies for the most complete games (3)...the complete games are the most by an A's team since 2015 (5)...the A's are the first team in the majors with four pitchers with 18 or more starts...have used just seven starting pitchers, which is second fewest to the Red Sox (6)...are one of two teams with five pitchers with six or more wins (White Sox).

BULLPEN: The A's bullpen is 2-2 with a save, three blown saves, a 1.63 ERA (5 er in 27.2 ip) over the last eight games but is 9-8 with 10 saves, 13 blown saves and a 4.41 ERA (74 er in 151.0 ip) over the last 51 contests...has converted 22-of-36 (61.1%) save opportunities overall...has five losses over the last 18 games after taking just four losses over the first 71 contests.

DEFENSIVE DOINGS: The A's have committed five errors in the last seven games after making just two errors over the previous 19 contests...now have 41 errors for the season, which is second fewest in the American League...ranks tied for fifth in fewest double plays (69)...A's pitchers have five pickoffs, which is tied for third most.

ALL-STAR: Matt Olson was named to his first American League All-Star team on Sunday as the A's lone representative...it is the first time the A's have one All-Star since 2017 (Alonso)...had two in both 2018 (Lowrie, Treinen) and 2019 (Chapman, Hendriks)...Olson will also be participating in the Home Run Derby...this is the second consecutive Derby with an Athletic (Chapman, 2019) and Olson is the ninth Athletic to participate in the Derby...Chris Bassitt was named to the All-Star team yesterday as a replacement...is his first career All-Star appearance...the A's have sent one pitcher and one position player to each of the last three All-Star Games (Jed Lowrie & Blake Treinen in 2018; Matt Chapman and Liam Hendriks in 2019).

THIS AND THAT: The A's are 22-13 (.629) in games in which the opponent starts a left-handed pitcher compared to 29-27 (.518) when they start a right-hander...are 31-7 (.816) when out-homer the opposition, 7-23 (.233) when they are out-homered...have used 88 different lineups over the first 89 games.

THE INJURED LIST: The A's have used the injured list 18 times this year...used it just eight times last year, which was second fewest in the majors to Cleveland (4), and 18 times in 2019, which tied for second fewest...currently have five players on the IL (Canha, Fiers, Moreland, Pinder, Rosenthal)...began the year with two players on the IL but have had at least four all but one day since the fifth game of the season (three on June 16).

A's vs. RANGERS: The A's are 4-5 against the Rangers...are 1-2 in Oakland and 3-3 in Texas...today is the A's 10th game against the Rangers in their last 18 games...won the season series last year, 7-3...it was their fourth consecutive season series victory over the Rangers, which is just the second time the A's have won four consecutive season series against Texas (2002-05)...went 4-3 in Arlington last year and 3-0 in Oakland...have won 18 of the last 25 games and are 33-15 over the last 48 contests...have won eight of the last 11 games and 26 of the last 34 in Oakland...are 48-28 (.632) against the Rangers over the last five years...are 389-381 all-time against the Texas Rangers...that breaks down to 204-178 in Oakland and 185-203 in Texas...are 7-6 at Globe Life Field...have an all-time record of 486-465 against the Rangers/Senators franchise.

TODAY'S TIDBITS

Jed Lowrie is hitting .385 (20-for-52) with a 1.091 OPS over his last 14 games dating back to June 24...eight of the 14 games have been multi-hit efforts...is hitting .405 (30-for-74) with runners in scoring position which is third best in the Majors behind only Vlad Guerrero Jr. (.413) and Manny Machado (.412)...**Matt Olson** ranks ninth in the AL in OPS (.918), seventh in slugging (.549), tied for eighth in home runs (21), tied for ninth in RBI (57), and tied for eighth in extra base hits (41) ...**Sergio Romo** has not allowed a run in 16 of his last 18 games for a 1.08 ERA (16.2 ip, 8 h, 2 r, 2 er, 1 bb, 16 so, 1 hr)...**Lou Trivino** has a 0.36 ERA (1 er in 24.2 ip) and .176 (15-for-85) opponents batting average over his last 25 games dating back to May 8...has converted 8-of-9 save opportunities over that span and stranded all nine of his inherited runners

THIS DATE IN ATHLETICS HISTORY

In **1960** Kansas City's Municipal Stadium is the host of the first of baseball's two All-Star game, a 5-4 National League win...in **1991** Dave Stewart wins his 100th game as an Athletic in the A's 8-1 win over Baltimore...along with Catfish Hunter, Vida Blue and Barry Zito, he is one of four 100-game winners in Oakland history...in **2003** Tim Hudson tosses a three-hit shutout and strikes out nine in a 2-0 A's win over Baltimore...in **2017** Yonder Alonso is 2-for-2 with a stolen base for the American League in the All-Star Game at Miami.

Last Outing: 7/10 at Texas (BS, 0.1 ip, h, r, er, 2 bb, so)

Saves/Opportunities: 7-12

Inherited Runners/Scored: 8/4 **First Hitters:** 8-31, 5 bb, 2 hbp

- Tossed a scoreless ninth inning Thursday at Houston for his seventh save of the season...it was his first since May 26 and the seven saves match his career total entering the season.
- Yesterday was the 500th appearance of his career...is now one of 21 active pitchers with 500 or more games pitched.
- Has a 3.09 ERA (4 er in 11.2 ip) and .220 (9-for-41) opponents batting average over his last 14 games dating back to June 4.
- Has held right-handed hitters to a .188 (15-for-80) average but they have hit five of the career-high six home runs he has allowed.
- Has a 5.63 ERA (5 er in 8.0 ip) and .303 (10-for-33) opponents batting average in nine outings on no days rest, a 2.05 ERA (6 er in 26.1 ip) and .163 (15-for-92) opponents average in 28 appearances on one day of rest or more.
- Has faced Texas twice this year (2.0 ip, 3 h, 2 r, 4 bb, 5 so, 9.00 ERA)...has a 8.64 ERA (8 er in 8.1 ip) in 10 career appearances against the Rangers.

Last Year: Allowed just two runs in 21 appearances and only one was earned for a 0.42 ERA...ranked second among Major League relievers in ERA and opponents slugging percentage (.157), fifth in batting average (.114) and seventh in OPS (.410)

- Has allowed four runs over his last six games (5.1 ip, 6.75 ERA) after six consecutive scoreless appearances from May 24-June 25 (8.1 ip, 1 h, 1 bb, 6 so).
- Has a .175 opponents batting average, which breaks down to .118 (6-for-51) against left-handed hitters compared to .222 (14-for-63) against right-handers...has issued nine of his 10 walks and yielded two of his three homers to righties for a .664 OPS...has a .382 OPS against lefties.
- Opponents are batting .143 (3-for-21) with runners in scoring position.

- Was acquired from Arizona a week ago today in exchange for cash considerations in a minor league deal...was selected from Triple-A Las Vegas on Saturday but has yet to appear in a game.
- His last Major League appearance came on Sept. 30, 2017 against Texas (0.2 ip, 2 h, 1 r, 1 er, 1 so).
- Has faced the Rangers twice in his career (2.0 ip, 5 h, 2 r, 2 er, 0 bb, 2 so, 9.00 ERA).
- Made his ML debut with Oakland in 2017, appearing in 11 games...compiled a 10.80 ERA but has not pitched in the majors since then.
- Was signed by the Diamondbacks to a minor league contract following the 2020 season and spent the entire year at Triple-A Reno prior to the trade...had a .226 opponents batting average with the Aces, which broke down to .116 (5-for-43) against left-handed hitters compared to .341 (14-for-41) with all three of his home runs against right-handed hitters...had 23 of his 30 strikeouts against lefties...his complete 2021 stats with Reno:

- Has a 5.48 ERA (14 er in 23.0 ip) and .272 (25-for-92) opponents batting average over his last 24 games dating back to May 15...had a 0.79 ERA and .198 opponents average over his first 20 contests.
- Tied for the Major League lead in games pitched (44) and ranks fifth among American League relievers in innings pitched (45.2).
- Has seven wins, which is tied for the most among AL relievers and tied for 10th among all AL pitchers
- Opponents are hitting .184 (9-for-49) with runners in scoring position.

Last Year: Compiled a career-low 1.66 ERA in a team-leading 26 relief appearances...opponents hit .232 and he walked just five batters for a .273 on-base percentage...yielded four runs, three of which scored on solo home runs.

- Has not allowed a run in 16 of his last 18 games for a 1.08 ERA (16.2 ip, 8 h, 2 r, 2 er, 1 bb, 16 so, 1 hr)...has a .158 (9-for-57) opponents batting average over that span.
- Has a 2.20 ERA (4 er in 16.1 ip) in 16 games on zero or one day of rest, a 6.75 ERA (11 er in 14.2 ip) in 18 outings on two days rest or more.
- First batters faced are hitting .394, which is fourth highest in the American League.

- Has a 9.64 ERA (9.1 ip, 14 h, 11 r, 10 er, 3 bb, 5 so) and .341 (14-for-41) opponents batting average over his last nine games after logging a 2.93 ERA and .232 opponent average over his first 11 contests.
- Has a 3.75 ERA (5 er in 12.0 ip) in nine day games, a 7.11 ERA (10 er in 12.2 ip) in 11 contests at night.
- Has appeared in two games against Texas (3.0 ip, 3 h, 1 r, 1 er, 1 bb, 1 so, 3.00 ERA)...now has a 1.08 ERA (1 er in 8.1 ip) in four career appearances against the Rangers.

- Has a 0.35 ERA (1 er in 25.2 ip) and .176 (15-for-85) opponents batting average over his last 25 games dating back to May 8...has converted 8-of-9 save opportunities over that span and stranded all nine of his inherited runners.
- Ranks fourth in the American League in save percentage (86.7%), tied for seventh in saves (13) and is tied for sixth in games pitched (41)...ranks sixth among AL relievers in ERA (1.88) and tied for seventh in innings pitched (43.0).
- Has a .148 (13-for-88) opponents batting average against right-handed hitters compared to .267 (16-for-60) against left-handers.
- Has not allowed an earned run in 16 games on the road (18.0 ip).

- Was placed on the 10-day IL May 2 with a strained left oblique and had a four-game rehab assignment with Triple-A Las Vegas from June 17-28 (5.0 ip, 2 h, 2 r, 2 er, 1 bb, 1 so, 1 hr, 3.60 ERA)...missed 52 games.
- Has allowed a .174 (8-for-46) average against right-handed hitters, .400 (14-for-35) against left-handers.

- Is batting .283 (56-for-198) over his last 57 games dating back to May 7 after hitting .143 over his first 31 contests.
- Has the second lowest OPS (.597), third lowest slugging percentage (.320), and third lowest on-base percentage (.277) in the American League...is tied for seventh in games (87).
- Is hitting .272 (53-for-195) against right-handed pitchers, .167 (18-for-108) against left-handers.
- Hit his first home run as an Athletic last Friday night, a game-tying lead-off home run in the bottom of the ninth...it was his first home run since Sept. 11, 2020 against the A's (Fiers) and it snapped a 79-game homerless streak...went deep again Wednesday night for his second home run in the last week.
- Stole his eighth base of the season Friday night and now has 313 in his career, which is the most among active players (Hamilton, CWS 311).

Last Year: Was hampered by a back injury for much of the season and batted .194 with three home runs and seven RBI in 29 games with Texas...had two stints on the 10-day injured list with the back injury (Aug. 20-30 and Sept. 12-end of season).

- Was recalled from Triple-A Las Vegas June 19 for his second stint with the A's this year...is 4-for-33 (.121) in 13 games, including seven starts (four in center field, two in right field, one in left field), since his return.
- Was recalled for the first time on June 1 and went 1-for-13 (.077) in nine games...was optioned back to Las Vegas June 16 but did not appear in a game with the Aviators before returning to Oakland.
- Was with the A's this spring and was designated for assignment April 1...was claimed off waivers by San Francisco April 5 and went 0-for-1 in a two-game stint with the Giants from April 27-28...was traded back to Oakland for cash on May 5 and was assigned to Las Vegas.
- Hit .375 with three home runs, 11 RBI and a .488 on-base percentage in 20 games with the Aviators...started nine games in center field, four in left field and three in right field.

Last Year: Hit .222 and walked five times in 11 games during the spring for a .391 on-base percentage...was optioned to Triple-A Las Vegas March 7 and added to the A's 60-man player pool on June 29...was never on the Taxi Squad and did not play in 2020.

- Went 3-for-5 with three RBI Saturday night after going 5-for-54 (.093) with three RBI over his previous 23 games.
- Is now batting .154 (18-for-117) over his last 46 games dating back to May 9 after hitting .273 over his first 23 contests.
- Has made 44 of his 45 starts this year and 61 of 63 in his career in games in which the opponent starts a right-handed pitcher.
- Is 3-for-13 (.231) with three RBI, a walk and a sacrifice fly as a pinch hitter...is tied for first among AL pinch hitters in plate appearances (15), tied for fourth in hits and tied for fifth in RBI.
- Is batting .242 (22-for-91) at home, .136 (11-for-81) on the road.
