OAKLAND ATHLETICS (51-40) VS. TEXAS RANGERS (35-54)

ABOUT THE A'S: The A's won game two of the series yesterday in 11 innings by a score of 8-4...won their 50th game of the season Thursday, marking just the fifth time in the last 29 years the A's have won their 50th game in 89 games or fewer (2002, 03, 14, 15)...lost two of three at Houston to start the road trip and are now 0-5-1 over the last six series...it is the first time the A's have gone winless over six consecutive series in a single season since they went 0-5-1 over a six-series stretch from June 3-22, 2016...have lost six of the last nine games and 14 of the last 20...are 51-40 (.560) overall, which is the fifth best record in the American League...are in second place in the AL West for the 20th consecutive day and trail first place Houston by 3½ games...that is two games short of the season high of 5½ (April 8 and July 7)...have spent 58 days alone in first place, three days tied for first, 21 days in second, one day tied for second, three days in third, two days in fourth, three days tied for fourth and 10 days in fifth...held at least a share of first for 61 of 62 days from April 20 to June 20.

THE ALL-STAR BREAK: The A's will go into the All-Star Break with a winning record for the third consecutive season as they are 51-40 entering the final game before the break...were 51-41 in 2019 (2nd place, seven games behind Houston) and 55-42 in 2018 (3rd place, -8)...A's pitchers have 751 strikeouts, which is already an Athletics Pre All-Star Break record (728 in 2014)...have a 3.83 ERA and have not had an ERA under 4.00 since 2015 (3.37)...the offense is batting .233 and has went into the break with a mark under .233 twice in Oakland history (.225 in 2012, .231 in 1982).

ONE-RUN GAMES AND OTHER CLOSE CALLS: Six of the A's last eight games have been decided by one run and Oakland is 14-14 (.500) in one-run games... have the most one-run games in the American League and are third in wins... are 21-21 (.500) in games decided by two runs or fewer compared to 30-19 (.612) in games decided by three runs or more...are 4-3 in extra innings...are 10-6 in games decided in the last at bat...have seven walk-off wins, which is tied with the Mariners for the most in the AL and tied for second most in the majors (Rockies, 9)...now have 90 walk-off wins in the Bob Melvin era, which are the most in the majors over that span.

AGAINST THE WEST: The A's are 18-20 (.474) against American League West competition compared to 33-20 (.623) against all other teams...lost two of three at Houston to start the week and begin a stretch of 10 of 13 games against divisional foes...after this three-game series with Texas, the A's open post-break play by hosting Cleveland, and then have two games with the Angels and four with Seattle.

HOME AND AWAY: The A's are 2-3 on this six-game road trip to Houston (1-2) and Texas (1-1)...this trip starts a stretch where the A's are scheduled to play 26 of their 36 games on the road...went 4-6 on the last road trip to New York-AL (1-2), Texas (2-2) and San Francisco (1-2) but are 24-18 (.571) on the road overall, which is the third best road record in the American League... the 42 road games are tied for the fewest in the majors...went 2-4 on the last homestand against Texas (1-2) and Boston (1-2) and are 27-22 (.551) at home...begin post-break play with a five-game homestand against Cleveland (three-games) and Los Angeles-AL (two games).

ON THE BASES: The A's have 13 stolen bases in their last 20 games after stealing just two bases over the previous 36 contests...have been successful in each of their last 15 stolen base attempts dating back to May 30 and are 37-for-45 (82.2%) for the season, which is the third best percentage in the American League.

OFFENSE: The A's are batting .205 (99-for-483) with 51 runs scored (3.64 per game) over the last 14 games...A's leadoff hitters are 10-for-54 (.185) with a run, six walks and four hit by pitches over that stretch, which coincides with the date Mark Canha went on the injured list (June 25)...the A's lead the American League in hit by pitches (50), rank second in sacrifice flies (29), third in fewest grounded into double plays (54), tied for fourth in triples (13) and are fifth in walks (313)...A's pinch hitters lead the AL in hits (19), RBI (14), sacrifice flies (2) and plate appearances (89), and are tied for second in extra base hits (4).

PITCHING: The A's have compiled a 3.31 ERA (135 er in 367.0 ip) over the last 41 games after logging a 4.27 ERA over the first 50 contests...have a 3.83 ERA for the season, which is fifth lowest in the American League...also have the fifth lowest opponents on-base percentage (.305), slugging percentage (.392) and OPS (.697)...have the second fewest walks (246), rank second in fewest pitches per inning (16.0) and tied for third in shutouts (7) and tied for fourth in fewest home runs (101).

STARTING PITCHING: A's starting pitchers are 15-10 with a 3.11 ERA (71 er in 205.1 ip) over the last 34 games dating back to June 2...are 34-31 with a 3.75 ERA (217 er in 520.2 ip) for the season...rank third in the American League in wins and fourth in ERA...lead the majors in innings pitched (520.2) and

are tied with the White Sox and Rockies for the most complete games (3)... the complete games are the most by an A's team since 2015 (5)...the A's are the first team in the majors with four pitchers with 18 or more starts...have used just seven starting pitchers, which is second fewest to the Red Sox (6)... are one of two teams with five pitchers with six or more wins (White Sox).

BULLPEN: The A's bullpen is 2-2 with a save, three blown saves, a 1.63 ERA (5 er in 27.2 ip) over the last eight games but is 9-8 with 10 saves, 13 blown saves and a 4.41 ERA (74 er in 151.0 ip) over the last 51 contests...has converted 22-of-36 (61.1%) save opportunities overall...has five losses over the last 18 games after taking just four losses over the first 71 contests.

DEFENSIVE DOINGS: The A's have committed five errors in the last seven games after making just two errors over the previous 19 contests...now have 41 errors for the season, which is second fewest in the American League... ranks tied for fifth in fewest double plays (69)...A's pitchers have five pickoffs, which is tied for third most.

ALL-STAR: Matt Olson was named to his first American League All-Star team on Sunday as the A's lone representative...it is the first time the A's have one All-Star since 2017 (Alonso)...had two in both 2018 (Lowrie, Treinen) and 2019 (Chapman, Hendriks)...Olson will also be participating in the Home Run Derby...this is the second consecutive Derby with an Athletic (Chapman, 2019) and Olson is the ninth Athletic to participate in the Derby...Chris Bassitt was named to the All-Star team yesterday as a replacement...is his first career All-Star appearance...the A's have sent one pitcher and one postion player to each of the last three All-Star Games (Jed Lowrie & Blake Treinen in 2018; Matt Chapman and Liam Hendriks in 2019).

THIS AND THAT: The A's are 22-13 (.629) in games in which the opponent starts a left-handed pitcher compared to 29-27 (.518) when they start a right-hander...are 31-7 (.816) when out-homering the opposition, 7-23 (.233) when they are out-homered...have used 88 different lineups over the first 89 games.

THE INJURED LIST: The A's have used the injured list 18 times this year...used it just eight times last year, which was second fewest in the majors to Cleveland (4), and 18 times in 2019, which tied for second fewest...currently have five players on the IL (Canha, Fiers, Moreland, Pinder, Rosenthal)...began the year with two players on the IL but have had at least four all but one day since the fifth game of the season (three on June 16).

A's vs. RANGERS: The A's are 4-5 against the Rangers...are 1-2 in Oakland and 3-3 in Texas...today is the A's 10th game against the Rangers in their last 18 games...won the season series last year, 7-3...it was their fourth consecutive season series victory over the Rangers, which is just the second time the A's have won four consecutive season series against Texas (2002-05)...went 4-3 in Arlington last year and 3-0 in Oakland...have won 18 of the last 25 games and are 33-15 over the last 48 contests...have won eight of the last 11 games and 26 of the last 34 in Oakland...are 48-28 (.632) against the Rangers over the last five years...are 389-381 all-time against the Texas Rangers...that breaks down to 204-178 in Oakland and 185-203 in Texas...are 7-6 at Globe Life Field...have an all-time record of 486-465 against the Rangers/Senators franchise.

TODAY'S TIDBITS

Jed Lowrie is hitting .385 20-for-52) with a 1.091 OPS over his last 14 games dating back to June 24...eight of the 14 games have been multi-hit efforts...is hitting .405 (30-for-74) with runners in scoring position which is third best in the Majors behind only Vlad Guerrero Jr. (.413) and Manny Machado (.412)...*Matt Olson* ranks ninth in the AL in OPS (.918), seventh in slugging (.549), tied for eighth in home runs (21), tied for ninth in RBI (57), and tied for eighth in extra base hits (41) ...*Sergio Romo* has not allowed a run in 16 of his last 18 games for a 1.08 ERA (16.2 ip, 8 h, 2 r, 2 er, 1 bb, 16 so, 1 hr)...*Lou Trivino* has a 0.36 ERA (1 er in 24.2 ip) and .176 (15-for-85) opponents batting average over his last 25 games dating back to May 8... has converted 8-of-9 save opportunities over that span and stranded all nine of his inherited runners

THIS DATE IN ATHLETICS HISTORY

In **1960** Kansas City's Municipal Stadium is the host of the first of baseball's two All-Star game, a 5-4 National League win...in **1991** Dave Stewart wins his 100th game as an Athletic in the A's 8-1 win over Baltimore... along with Catfish Hunter, Vida Blue and Barry Zito, he is one of four 100game winners in Oakland history...in **2003** Tim Hudson tosses a three-hit shutout and strikes out nine in a 2-0 A's win over Baltimore...in **2017** Yonder Alonso is 2-for-2 with a stolen base for the American League in the All-Star Game at Miami.


PITCHING PROBABLES

TODAY'S STARTING PITCHER: Chris Bassitt (9-2, 3.41 ERA)

NINE-GAME WINNING STREAK: Lost each of his first two starts this year but is 9-0 with a 3.16 ERA (35 er in 99.2 ip) and .212 (78-for-368) opponents batting average in 16 starts since then...the winning streak is an on-going career high, the longest streak in the majors this year and tied for ninth longest in Oakland history...over the last 14 years, the only Athletic with a longer winning streak is Mike Fiers (12, May 7-Aug. 27, 2019)...has left with the lead in three of his seven no decisions only to have the bullpen blow the save... the nine wins are one short of his career high of 10 in 2019...the A's are 13-5 (.722) in his starting assignments.

AMERICAN LEAGUE ALL-STAR: Was named to the American League All-Star Team on Saturday as a replacement...this will be his first All-Star Game...he is the first A's starting pitcher to be named to the AL All-Star Team since Sonny Gray in 2015.

AMONG THE LEADERS: Ranks third in the American League in innings pitched (111.0), tied for second in wins (9), third in winning percentage (.818), fifth in opponents slugging percentage (.356) and opponents OPS (.639), seventh in strikeouts (115) and opponents batting average (.220) and eighth in opponents on-base percentage (.284)...has allowed 11 home runs and his average of 0.89 home runs per nine innings is sixth lowest...has hit 10 batters, which is the most in the AL and three short of the



Oakland record of 13...he also hit 13 batters in 2019, which tied the record set by Barry Zito (2001, 2005 and 2006)...ranks fifth in the AL in fewest pitches per inning (15.2)...is scheduled to make his 19th start today, which will tie him for the AL lead.

FOUR RUNS OR FEWER: Allowed six runs in his last start, which marks the first time he has allowed more than four runs in a start over the last two years...prior to last Tuesday, he had not surrendered more than four runs in a start since Sept. 13, 2019 at Texas, when he allowed seven runs...had a streak of 28 consecutive games with four runs or fewer and 3.0 innings pitched or more, which is the longest such streak in Athletics history (previous: 25 by Vida Blue from April 9-July 30, 1971)...went 14-4 with a 2.76 ERA over that span.

HOME AND AWAY: Is 5-0 with a 4.19 ERA (27 er in 58.0 ip) and .241 (53-for-220) opponents batting average in 10 starts on the road compared to 4-2 with a 2.55 ERA (15 er in 53.0 ip) and .197 (38-for-193) opponents average in eight starts at home...is tied for third in the American League in road wins and ranks seventh in home ERA...now has a six-game winning streak on the road dating back to Sept. 12, 2020 and has not lost on the road since Aug. 29, 2020 at Houston.

OPPONENTS BATTING: Has held left-handed hitters to a .190 (38-for-200) batting average, which is fourth lowest in the American League...however, has surrendered nine of his 11 home runs this year and 27 of 38 over the last three years to lefties...opponents are hitting .202 (19-for-94) with runners in scoring position, which ranks ninth in the AL...has a .142 opponents average with two strikes, which is eighth best.

THE LAST THREE YEARS: Is 24-9 (.727) with a 3.36 ERA (119 er in 318.1 ip) in 57 games (54 starts) over the last three years...based on a minium of 250 innings pitched, he ranks second in the American League in winning percentage over that span, fourth in ERA and fifth in opponents OPS (.670)...is tied for seventh in wins...the A's are 36-18 (.667) in his starting assignments over the last three years...was 4-14 (.222) with a 3.86 ERA in 40 games (30 starts) over his first four seasons.

2021 HIGHLIGHTS: Was the A's Opening Day starting pitcher and took the loss in an 8-1 decision to Houston on April 1 in Oakland...became the A's 14th different Opening Day starting pitcher over the last 16 years...allowed a run in the fourth inning to snap a 16.2-inning scoreless streak during the regular season and a 27.1-inning home scoreless streak, which was ninth longest in Oakland history...lost his second start on April 6, a 5-1 loss to Los Angeles (NL) on April 6 in Oakland when he allowed a season-high nine hits in 6.0 innings...allowed two home runs in the third, which were his first home runs in the Coliseum since Aug. 24, 2019...that snapped a 10-game, 55.1-inning, 229-batter homerless streak in Oakland...that ran his record to 0-2 with a 5.56 ERA...then allowed exactly two runs in each of his next six starts to become the second pitcher in Athletic history to allow exactly two runs in six consecutive games...joins Bob Davis of the Kansas City A's, who did it all in relief from Aug. 8-26, 1960...went 3-0 with a 2.92 ERA over that stretch which ran from April 12 to May 11...tied an Oakland record with three hit batters April 29 at Tampa Bay (12th time, last: Fiers, June 22, 2019, also against Tampa Bay)...left his start on May 5 against Toronto with a 3-2 lead but ended up win a no decision in the A's 9-4 loss...Trivino allowed five runs in the eighth inning for the blown save…it was the first of three times he left with a lead only to have the bullpen blow the save (also May 16 at

Minnesota and June 19 at New York-AL)...struck out a season-high 10 batters in a 3-2 win at Boston on May 11...it was his third career game of 10 or more strikeouts...did not walk a batter, the second time he has fanned 10 or more without issuing a free pass...is one of nine pitchers in Oakland history with two such games...tossed his first career complete game and shutout May 27 against Los Angeles (AL), a two-hitter in the A's 5-0 win...had a seasonhigh 114 pitches, struck out nine and walked one...it came in his 77th career start, his 72nd with the A's...the 71 consecutive starts without a complete games is the second longest streak in Athletics history (113, Barry Zito, Aug. 22, 2003-Sept. 28, 2006)...finished May with a 3-0 record, a 2.52 ERA and .175 opponents batting average in five starts...struck out 38 and walked just four in 35.2 innings...then went 4-0 with a 2.70 ERA in six starts in June...it was the first time in his career he won four games in a month...was one of four American League pitchers to win four games in June and his ERA tied for fifth...allowed two runs or fewer in five consecutive starts from June 8 to 30 and was 4-0 with a 1.93 ERA and .197 opponents batting average over that span...went over the 500 career innings pitched mark June 30 against Texas when he tossed 7.0 scoreless innings.

LAST START: He had a no decision in the A's 9-6 loss at Houston on Tuesday... allowed a season-high six runs in 4.1 innings...Oakland scored three times in the first but he allowed a two-run home run to Alvarez in the bottom of the first...the A's added three more in the second to take a 6-2 lead...he then allowed a Straw RBI single in the fourth and a three-run home run to Alvarez in the fifth...left with one out in the fifth and the scored tied 6-6.

- Tossed a scoreless ninth inning Thursday at Houston for his seventh save
 of the season...it was his first since May 26 and the seven saves match his
 career total entering the season.
- Yesterday was the 500th appearance of his career...is now one of 21 active pitchers with 500 or more games pitched.
- Has a 3.09 ERA (4 er in 11.2 ip) and .220 (9-for-41) opponents batting average over his last 14 games dating back to June 4.
- Has held right-handed hitters to a .188 (15-for-80) average but they have hit five of the career-high six home runs he has allowed.
- Has a 5.63 ERA (5 er in 8.0 ip) and .303 (10-for-33) opponents batting average in nine outings on no days rest, a 2.05 ERA (6 er in 26.1 ip) and .163 (15-for-92) opponents average in 28 appearances on one day of rest or more.
- Has faced Texas twice this year (2.0 ip, 3 h, 2 r, 2 r, 4 bb, 5 so, 9.00 ERA)...has a 8.64 ERA (8 er in 8.1 ip) in 10 career appearances against the Rangers.

Last Year: Allowed just two runs in 21 appearances and only one was earned for a 0.42 ERA...ranked second among Major League relievers in ERA and opponents slugging percentage (.157), fifth in batting average (.114) and seventh in OPS (.410)

- Has allowed four runs over his last six games (5.1 ip, 6.75 ERA) after six consecutive scoreless appearances from May 24-June 25 (8.1 ip, 1 h, 1 bb, 6 so).
- Has a .175 opponents batting average, which breaks down to .118 (6for-51) against left-handed hitters compared to .222 (14-for-63) against right-handers...has issued nine of his 10 walks and yielded two of his three homers to righties for a .664 OPS...has a .382 OPS against lefties.
- Opponents are batting .143 (3-for-21) with runners in scoring position.
