## OAKLAND ATHLETICS (52-40) VS. CLEVELAND INDIANS (45-42)

FRIDAY, JULY 16, 2021 — OAKLAND COLISEUM — 6:40 PDT

**ABOUT THE A'S:** Won two of three at Texas in the final series before the All-Star Break for their first series win since sweeping a three-game series from Los Angeles (AL) from June 14-16...had gone 0-5-1 over the previous six series, which was the first time the A's went winless over six consecutive series in a single season since they went 0-5-1 over a six-series stretch from June 3-22, 2016...have won three of the last four games but are 8-13 over the last 21...are 52-40 (.565) overall, which is the fifth best record in the American League...are in second place in the AL West for the 21st consecutive day and trail first place Houston by 3½ games...are in second place in the AL Wild Card, two games behind Tampa Bay and 3½ games ahead of the third place team, Seattle...have spent 58 days alone in first place in the West, three days tied for first, 22 days in second, one day tied for second, three days in third, two days in fourth, three days tied for fourth and 10 days in fifth...held at least a share of first for 61 of 62 days from April 20 to June 20.

**THE ALL-STAR BREAK:** The A's went into the All-Star Break with a 52-40 record, marking their third consecutive season with a winning record at the break (51-41 in 2019, 55-42 in 2018)...the last time the A's had three straight winning records at the break was from 2000-06 when they had seven straight...it is the first time the A's have been at least 10 games over .500 at the break in three straight years since 1988-90...were in second place and trailed first place Houston by 3½ games, which is the closest they have been to first at the break since 2014 when they were in first with a 1½ game lead...the pitching staff set an Athletics record with 755 strikeouts (previous: 728 in 2014)...had a 3.80 ERA, which was their lowest since 2015 (3.37)...the offense hit .232, which was third lowest in Oakland history (.225 in 2012, .231 in 1982).

**AGAINST THE CENTRAL:** The A's are 12-2 against American League Central teams, which is the best record in the majors...are batting .256 (114-for-446) and are averaging 5.8 runs per game (81 runs in 14 games) against teams from the Central compared to .228 with an average of 4.2 runs per game against all other teams...have a 2.95 ERA (40 er in 122.0 ip) against the Central, 3.95 against everyone else...went 25-8 against the AL Central in 2019 after going 26-8 in 2018...are now 77-22 (.778) against AL Central foes dating back to June 23, 2017.

**SEVEN WITH 10:** Jed Lowrie hit his 10th home run of the season last Sunday to become the seventh Athletic with 10 or more home runs...the A's are the only team in the majors with seven players with at least 10 home runs...the Athletics record for most player with 10 or more home runs is 10 in 2019.

**OFFENSE:** The A's hit eight home runs over the final two games before the All-Star Break after homering just four times over the previous eight contests...are batting .203 (105-for-516) with 55 runs scored (3.7 per game) over the last 15 games...were caught stealing on Sunday for the first time since May 28, snapping a streak of 15 consecutive stolen base attempts without being caught...the A's lead the American League in hit by pitches (50), rank second in sacrifice flies (29), third in stolen base percentage (80.4%) and fewest grounded into double plays (54), tied for fourth in triples (13) and fifth in walks (313) and plate appearances per strikeout (4.35)...have the fourth lowest batting average (.232)...A's pinch hitters lead the AL in hits (19), RBI (14), sacrifice flies (2) and plate appearances (90) and are tied for second in extra base hits (4).

**PITCHING:** The A's had a 2.20 ERA (11 er in 45.0 ip) and .169 (26-for-154) opponents batting average over the final five games before the All-Star Break...now have a 3.26 ERA (136 er in 376.0 ip) over the last 42 games after logging a 4.27 ERA over the first 50 contests...have a 3.80 ERA for the season, which is fifth lowest in the American League...also have the fifth lowest opponents on-base percentage (.304), slugging percentage (.391) and OPS (.695)...are tied for the fewest walks (248), rank second in fewest pitches per inning (15.9) and tied for third in shutouts (7) and fewest home runs (101).

**STARTING PITCHING:** A's starting pitchers are 16-10 with a 3.05 ERA (72 er in 212.1 ip) over the last 35 games dating back to June 2...are 35-31 with a 3.72 ERA (218 er in 527.2 ip) for the season...rank third in the American League in wins and ERA...lead the majors in innings pitched (527.2) and are tied with the White Sox and Rockies for the most complete games (3)...have used just seven starting pitchers, which is second fewest in the majors to the Red Sox (6).

**BULLPEN:** The A's bullpen was charged with three blown saves in the three-game series at Texas last weekend and now has three saves, seven blown saves and a 2-5 record over the last 21 games...is tied for fifth in the American League in saves (23) and most blown saves (14) but has just nine losses, which is the fewest in the majors...has a 1.52 ERA (5 er in 29.2 ip) and .163 (16-for-98) opponents batting average over the last nine contests and has not allowed a home run...has the highest slugging percentage against first

batters faced in the AL (.490), the third highest batting average (.275) and fourth highest on-base percentage (.344).

**DEFENSIVE DOINGS:** The A's have not committed an error in the last four games and have just seven over the last 27 contests...have 41 errors for the season, which is second fewest in the American League (Astros, 38)...A's pitchers have five pickoffs, which is tied for third most...A's outfielders have seven assists, which is tied for second fewest.

**HOME AND AWAY:** The A's begin a five-game homestand against Cleveland (three-games) and Los Angeles-AL (two games) tonight...this is one of two five-game homestands over a stretch from July 6 to Aug. 19 where the A's are scheduled to play 26 of 36 games on the road...went 2-4 on the last homestand against Texas (1-2) and Boston (1-2) and are 27-22 (.551) at home...the 49 home games are tied with Seattle for the most in the American League...went 3-3 on the last road trip to Houston (1-2) and Texas (2-1) and are 25-18 (.581) on the road, which is the third best road record in the AL.

**ONE-RUN GAMES AND OTHER CLOSE CALLS:** Six of the A's last nine games have been decided by one run and Oakland is 14-14 (.500) in one-run games...have the most one-run games in the American League (28) and are tied for third in wins...are tied for the second most losses (Royals, 16)...are 21-21 (.500) in games decided by two runs or fewer compared to 31-19 (.620) in games decided by three runs or more...have seven walk-off wins, which is tied with Cleveland and Seattle for the most in the AL and tied for second most in the majors (Rockies, 9)...now have 90 walk-off wins in the Bob Melvin era, which are the most in the majors over that span...are 4-3 in extra innings and the seven extra inning games are tied for third fewest in the AL...are 11-6 in games decided in the last at bat.

**BOB MELVIN:** A's manager Bob Melvin has 1,312 career wins which ranks 35th in Major League history according to Baseball Reference...he needs one more win to tie Hall of Famer Ned Hanlon for 34th...Hanlon won 1,313 games from 1889-1907...Melvin has 819 wins with the A's, which is the most in Oakland history and second most in franchise history to Connie Mack's 3,582.

**THE INJURED LIST:** The A's have used the injured list 18 times this year...used it just eight times last year, which was second fewest in the majors to Cleveland (4), and 18 times in 2019, which tied for second fewest...currently have four players on the IL (Canha, Fiers, Pinder, Rosenthal)...began the year with two players on the IL but have had at least four all but one day since the fifth game of the season (three on June 16).

**A's vs. INDIANS:** The A's and Indians will meet for the first time since May 22, 2019, a span of 786 days...that is the longest the A's have gone without playing an American League team...Oakland won the season series in 2019, 5-1...went 2-1 in Oakland and 3-0 in Cleveland...have won seven of the last eight games and 12 of the last 15...have won nine of the last 11 in Oakland and have a five-game winning streak at Progressive Field...have won five of the previous six season series and are 23-15 against the Indians dating back to the start of the 2014 season...since moving to Oakland in 1968, the A's are 283-242 against the Indians...that breaks down to 150-106 in Oakland and 133-136 in Cleveland...including 49-67 at Progressive Field...all-time, the A's are 918-1035 against the Indians.

### TODAY'S TIDBITS

**Elvis Andrus** is a .367 (102-for-278) career hitter against Cleveland, which is the best mark ever against the Indians by a player with at least 300 plate appearances...**Matt Chapman** has a career-high 50-game errorless streak and leads Major League third basemen with a .989 fielding percentage...**Matt Olson** ranks third in the American League in OPS (.938) and slugging (.567), fourth in home runs (23), seventh in extra base hits (43), eighth in RBI (59), tied for eighth in sacrifice flies (5) and tied for 10th in runs (58)...**Sergio Romo** has not allowed a run in 16 of his last 18 games for a 1.08 ERA (16.2 ip, 9 h, 2 r, 2 er, 2 bb, 18 so, 1 hr)...**Lou Trivino** has a 0.34 ERA (1 er in 26.2 ip) and .182 (16-for-88) opponents batting average over his last 26 games dating back to May 8...has converted 9-of-10 save opportunities over that span and stranded all nine of his inherited runners

### THIS DATE IN ATHLETICS HISTORY

In **1971** Vida Blue tosses a one-hitter as the A's defeat Detroit 4-0...Blue improves to 18-3 with the victory and would go on to win both the MVP and the Cy Young Award...in **1991** the A's score three times in the bottom of the 13<sup>th</sup> inning after Cleveland scores twice in the top of the 13<sup>th</sup> for a 7-6 win...Mike Gallego has a two-run triple to tie the game and scores the winning run when Terry Steinbach walks with the bases loaded.

## TODAY'S STARTING PITCHER: Sean Manaea (6-6, 3.19 ERA)

**FOUR-GAME LOSING STREAK:** Is 0-4 over his last four starts despite a 3.91 ERA (10 er in 23.0 ip) and .213 (19-for-89) opponents batting average...has received four runs of support total in those four starts, including no runs twice and one run once...the four-game losing streak is a career-high (previous: 3, Aug. 1-18, 2017).

**LAST NINE STARTS:** Has allowed one run or fewer in six of his last nine starts dating back to May 23 and is 3-4 with a 2.11 ERA (13 er in 55.1 ip) and .214 (44-for-206) opponents batting average over that span...has a total of four runs of support in his four losses...allowed one run in each of his two no decisions...for the season, has allowed one run or fewer in 10 of his 18 starts.

**AMONG THE LEADERS:** Ranks sixth in the American League in ERA (3.19) and strikeout-to-walk ratio (4.32), seventh in innings pitched (104.1) and ninth in opponents OPS (.674)...has allowed 12 home runs in 104.1 innings and his average of 1.04 home runs per nine innings is ninth lowest...is one of two pitchers in the majors with two shutouts (DeSclafani, SF) and one of four with two or more complete games (Marquez, COL 3; Wainwright, STL 2; DeSclafani, SF 2)...is the first A's pitcher with two complete games in a season since Kendall Graveman in 2016 (2) and the first with two shutouts since Sonny Gray in 2015 (2)...has three of the A's seven complete games and shutouts over the last four years.

**AGAINST THE CENTRAL:** Is 2-0 with a 1.38 ERA (2 er in 13.0 ip) in two starts against American League Central teams this year and now has a 10-game winning streak against the Central dating back to Aug. 23, 2016...has a 1.51 ERA (12 er in 71.1 ip) and .188 (48-for-256) opponents batting average during the streak, which spans 11 starts...his last loss came on July 5, 2016 at Minnesota...is 11-2 with a 2.24 ERA (22 er in 88.1 ip) in 14 career starts vs. AL Central teams.

**LEFT AND RIGHT:** Has allowed a .182 (16-for-99) batting average against left-handed hitters compared to .269 (82-for-305) against right-handers...the mark against lefties is fifth lowest in the American League...has surrendered six home runs in 99 at bats against lefties and six in 305 at bats against righties.

**DON'T WALK:** Has walked two batters or fewer in 15 of his 18 starts, including six starts with one walk and four with no walks...has walked just 25 batters in 104.1 innings for an average of 2.16 walks per nine innings...over the last four years, he has walked two batters or fewer in 54 of his 61 starts (18 with no walks, 23 with one)...has 72 walks in 348.2 innings over that span, an average of 1.86 per nine innings.

**SUPPORT:** Has received one run of support or fewer in eight of his 18 starts and is 0-5 in those starts...is 6-1 in 10 starts with two runs of support or more...has six no decisions and has allowed just one run in four of the no decisions...has received one run of support in three of his no decisions and the bullpen blew the save in one other no decision...the A's are 5-1 in his no decisions and are 11-7 (.611) in his starting assignments...are 22-12 (.647) when he starts over the last three years.

**DAYS REST:** Is scheduled to start on eight days rest...is 3-1 with a 1.38 ERA (9 er in 58.2 ip) and .228 (50-for-219) opponents batting average in nine starts on four days rest compared to 2-4 with a 5.91 ERA (23 er in 35.0 ip) and .288 (42-for-146) opponents average in seven starts on five days rest...over the last three years, he is 7-2 with a 2.37 ERA (26 er in 98.2 ip) in 17 starts on four days rest, 3-5 with a 5.60 ERA (28 er in 45.0 ip) in nine starts on five days rest.

**JUNE AND JULY:** Is 0-2 with a 5.40 ERA (7 er in 11.2 ip) over his first two starts in July after going 3-2 with a 1.13 ERA and .181 opponents batting average in five starts in June...is now 2-7 with a 3.99 ERA (51 er in 115.0 ip) in 18 career starts in July compared to 11-4 with a 2.68 ERA in 19 career starts in June...the June wins are his most in any month and his June ERA is second lowest to his 2.17 in September...earned American League Pitcher of the Month honors this June...struck out 34 batters in 32.0 innings and allowed just one home run...it was the second time he was named Pitcher of the Month (April, 2018)...based on a minimum of 30 innings, his ERA was the lowest by an A's pitcher in June since Lefty Grove had a 0.51 ERA in June of 1926...had the lowest ERA in the majors in June...had the lowest opponents OPS (.496), slugging percentage (.250), on-base percentage (.246) and batting average in the AL.

**2021 HIGHLIGHTS:** Took the loss in his first start but then went 3-0 with a 1.50 ERA over his next four starts...picked up his first win of the season in the 100th game of his career, an 8-4 victory over Detroit on April 15...tossed a six-hit, seven-inning shutout in the A's 7-0 win over Minnesota in the first game of the doubleheader April 20...it was the 11th complete game shutout of fewer than eight innings in Oakland history and his second career complete game and shutout...the start was the 100th of his career and he became the 25th pitcher in Oakland history to make 100 starts...had 10 strikeouts on May 7 against Tampa Bay, but had a no decision in the A's 2-1 win...

retired each of the first 18 batters he faced before walking Arozarena to start the seventh...allowed one run or fewer in five consecutive starts from May 23 to June 14 and went 3-0 with a 0.84 ERA over that span...became the first A's pitcher with five consecutive games of one run or fewer and five innings pitched or more since Trevor Cahill (April 17-May 9, 2011)...had a no decision in the A's 6-5 loss at Los Angeles (AL) on May 23...left with a 4-1 lead but the bullpen blew the save...struck out Justin Upton to lead off the game for the 50,000th strikeout in Oakland history...fanned Taylor Ward to end the fourth inning for his 500th career strikeout...tossed a four-hit shutout in the A's 6-0 win at Seattle on June 2...it was his third career complete game and shutout, his second this year...logged a season-high 111 pitches, which are his most in a game over the last four years...then tossed 111 pitches in his next start on June 9 against Arizona when he combined with Petit, Trivino and Diekmann on a two-hit shutout in the A's 4-0 win...it was the second time in his career he did not allow a run in back-to-back starts (Sept. 14-20, 2016)...had a career-high 16.0-inning scoreless streak from June 2 to 14...struck out a career-high 11 batters in 5.1 innings June 20 at New York (AL) but was the losing pitcher in the A's 2-1 loss...the 11 strikeouts match the most in Athletics history by a pitcher with fewer than six innings pitched (Kirk Saarloos on Sept. 19, 2006 and Tim Hudson on June 8, 1999)...it was his second game of 10 or more strikeouts this year and the fifth of his career...went 2-for-2 with a double June 25 at San Francisco...it was the first extra base hit by an A's pitcher since Joe Kennedy doubled on June 12, 2007 at Houston.

**LAST START:** He lost his fourth consecutive start in the A's 4-3 loss at Houston on July 7...allowed just four hits and did not walk a batter in 6.2 innings but yielded four runs...had a 1-0 lead when he allowed a three-run home run to Altuve in the third...Oakland came back to tie the game with two runs in the sixth but he allowed a solo home run to Tucker in the seventh for the loss.

**MANAEA vs. CLEVELAND:** Is 3-0 with a 1.71 ERA (21.0 ip, 11 h, 4 r, 4 er, 6 bb, 25 so, 2 hr) in three career starts...is 2-0 with a 1.93 ERA (3 er in 14.0 ip) in two starts in Oakland and 1-0 with a 1.29 ERA (1 er in 7.0 ip) in one start at Cleveland...has not faced the Indians since July 16, 2017 when he was the winning pitcher in the A's 7-3 win in Oakland...had a 5-0 lead when he allowed his only two runs in the fourth inning on a two-run single by Brantley...was relieved by Coulombe to start the eighth inning with the A's leading 5-2.

### TOMORROW'S PROBABLE STARTING PITCHER

**RHP Frankie Montas (8-7, 4.41 ERA):** Is 1-0 with a 2.60 ERA and .194 opponents batting average over his last three starts...is 3-3 with a 3.83 ERA, .238 opponents average and three home runs allowed over his last eight starts dating back to May 29 after going 5-4 with a 4.92 ERA, .274 opponents average and 11 home runs over his first 10 starts...has eight wins, which is tied for sixth in the American League and is one short of his career high of nine in 2019...has a .201 opponents batting average the first time through the order, .289 with 11 of his 14 home runs after that...was the winning pitcher in his last start, a 2-1 A's win at Houston on July 8 (6.2 ip, 5 h, 1 r, 1 er, 1 bb, 10 so)...is 1-1 with a 2.82 ERA (22.1 ip, 26 h, 7 r, 7 er, 5 bb, 25 so, 1 hr) in six career appearances, including three starts, against Cleveland...last faced the Indians in 2019 when he went 1-0 with a 1.50 ERA (12.0 ip, 13 h, 2 r, 2 er, 3 bb, 16 so, 0 hr) in two starts.

### MANAEA BY THE NUMBERS
