## OAKLAND ATHLETICS (53-40) VS. CLEVELAND INDIANS (45-43)

SATURDAY, JULY 17, 2021 — OAKLAND COLISEUM — 1:07 PDT

**ABOUT THE A'S:** Improved to 7-3 in the first game after the All-Star Break in the Bob Melvin era with the win last night...have a three-game winning streak, which is the first time the A's have put together consecutive wins since a seven-game winning streak from June 11-18...have won four of the last five games but are 9-13 over the last 22...are 53-40 (.565) overall, which is the fifth best record in the American League...are in second place in the AL West for the 22nd consecutive day and trail first place Houston by 3½ games...are in second place in the AL Wild Card, two games behind Tampa Bay and 3½ games ahead of the third place team, Seattle...have spent 58 days alone in first place in the West, three days tied for first, 23 days in second, one day tied for second, three days in third, two days in fourth, three days tied for fourth and 10 days in fifth...held at least a share of first for 61 of 62 days from April 20 to June 20...won two of three at Texas in the final series before the All-Star Break for their first series win since sweeping a three-game series from Los Angeles (AL) from June 14-16...had gone 0-5-1 over the previous six series, which was the first time the A's went winless over six consecutive series in a single season since they went 0-5-1 over a six-series stretch from June 3-22, 2016.

**WALK-OFFS AND OTHER CLOSE CALLS:** The A's had their eighth walk-off win of the season last night, which is second most in the majors to the Rockies (9)...now have 91 walk-off wins in the Bob Melvin era, which are the most in the majors over that span...the win last night was the A's sixth when trailing after seven innings and third when trailing after eight, both of which are tied for the most in the majors...seven of the A's last 10 games have been decided by one run and Oakland is 15-14 (.517) in one-run games...have the most one-run games in the American League (29) and rank third in wins...are tied for the second most losses (Royals, 16)...are 22-21 (.512) in games decided by two runs or fewer compared to 31-19 (.620) in games decided by three runs or more...are 4-3 in extra innings and the seven extra inning games are tied for third fewest in the AL...are 12-6 in games decided in the last at bat.

**BOB MELVIN:** A's manager Bob Melvin has 1,313 career wins, which is tied with Hall of Famer Ned Hanlon for 34th in Major League history according to Baseball Reference...Joe Maddon (1,323) is 33rd and Chuck Tanner (1,352) is 32nd...Melvin has 820 wins with the A's, which is the most in Oakland history and second most in franchise history to Connie Mack's 3,582.

**AGAINST THE CENTRAL:** The A's are 13-2 (.867) against American League Central teams, which is the best record in the majors...are batting .261 (126-for-483) and are averaging 5.7 runs per game (86 runs in 15 games) against teams from the Central compared to .228 with an average of 4.2 runs per game against all other teams...have a 3.03 ERA (44 er in 131.0 ip) against the Central, 3.95 against everyone else...went 25-8 against the AL Central in 2019 after going 26-8 in 2018...are now 78-22 (.780) against AL Central foes dating back to June 23, 2017.

**OFFENSE:** The A's have hit 10 home runs over the last three games after homering just four times over the previous eight contests...are the only team in the majors with seven players with 10 or more home runs...are batting .212 (117-for-553) with 60 runs scored (3.8 per game) over the last 16 games...the A's lead the American League in hit by pitches (50), rank second in sacrifice flies (29), third in stolen base percentage (80.4%) and fewest grounded into double plays (54), tied for fourth in triples (13) and home runs (117) and fifth in walks (316)...A's pinch hitters lead the AL in hits (19), RBI (14), sacrifice flies (2) and plate appearances (91) and are tied for second in extra base hits (4).

**PITCHING:** The A's have a 3.27 ERA (140 er in 385.0 ip) over the last 43 games after logging a 4.27 ERA over the first 50 contests...have a 3.80 ERA for the season, which is fourth lowest in the American League...have the fifth lowest opponents on-base percentage (.304), slugging percentage (.391) and OPS (.695)...have issued the fewest walks (248), rank second in fewest pitches per inning (15.9) and tied for third in shutouts (7) and fewest home runs (103).

**STARTING PITCHING:** A's starting pitchers are 16-10 with a 3.10 ERA (75 er in 217.2 ip) over the last 36 games dating back to June 2...are 35-31 with a 3.73 ERA (221 er in 533.0 ip) for the season...rank third in the American League in ERA and tied for third in wins (35)...lead the majors in innings pitched (533.0) and are tied with the White Sox and Rockies for the most complete games (3)...have used just seven starting pitchers, which is second fewest in the majors to the Red Sox (6).

**BULLPEN:** The A's bullpen was charged with its fourth blown save in the last four games last night and now has three saves, eight blown saves and a 3-5 record over the last 22 games...is tied for third in the American League in most blown saves (15) but has just nine losses, which is the fewest in the majors...has a 1.62 ERA (6 er in 33.1 ip) and .156 (17-for-109) opponents batting average over the last 10 contests and has allowed just one home run...now has a 3.93 ERA for the season, which is fifth lowest in the AL...has the

third lowest opponents on-base percentage (.308)...has the highest slugging percentage against first batters faced in the AL (.486) and the third highest batting average (.273).

**DEFENSIVE DOINGS:** The A's have not committed an error in the last five games and have just seven over the last 28 contests...have 41 errors for the season, which is second fewest in the American League (Astros, 39)...A's pitchers have five pickoffs, which is tied for fourth most...A's outfielders have seven assists, which is tied for second fewest.

**HOME AND AWAY:** The A's are 1-0 on this five-game homestand against Cleveland (1-0) and Los Angeles-AL (two games) ...this is one of two five-game homestands over a stretch from July 6 to Aug. 19 where the A's are scheduled to play 26 of 36 games on the road...went 2-4 on the last homestand against Texas (1-2) and Boston (1-2) and are 28-22 (.560) at home...the 50 home games are second most in the majors (Padres, 52)...went 3-3 on the last road trip to Houston (1-2) and Texas (2-1) and are 25-18 (.581) on the road, which is the third best road record in the AL.

**THIS AND THAT:** The A's are 23-13 (.639) in games in which the opponent starts a left-handed pitcher compared to 30-27 (.526) when they start a right-hander...the mark against lefties is second best in the American League (White Sox, 18-8/.692) and the 36 games are tied for second most...are 32-7 (.821) when out-homering the opposition, 7-23 (.233) when they are out-homered...have used a different lineup in each of the last 30 games and have 90 different lineups over the first 93 contests.

**THE INJURED LIST:** The A's have used the injured list 18 times this year...used it just eight times last year, which was second fewest in the majors to Cleveland (4), and 18 times in 2019, which tied for second fewest...currently have three players on the IL (Fiers, Pinder, Rosenthal)...began the year with two players on the IL but this is just the second time since the fifth game of the season the A's have had fewer than four players on the IL (three on June 16).

**THE ALL-STAR BREAK:** The A's went into the All-Star Break with a 52-40 record, marking their third consecutive season with a winning record at the break (51-41 in 2019, 55-42 in 2018)...the last time the A's had three straight winning records at the break was from 2000-06 when they had seven straight...it is the first time the A's have been at least 10 games over .500 at the break in three straight years since 1988-90...were in second place and trailed first place Houston by 3½ games, which is the closest they have been to first at the break since 2014 when they were in first with a 1½ game lead...the pitching staff set an Athletics record with 755 strikeouts (previous: 728 in 2014)...had a 3.80 ERA, which was their lowest since 2015 (3.37)...the offense hit .232, which was third lowest in Oakland history (.225 in 2012, .231 in 1982).

**A's vs. INDIANS:** The A's won last night in the first meeting between the two clubs in over two years (May 22, 2019)...won the season series in 2019, 5-1...went 2-1 in Oakland and 3-0 in Cleveland...have won eight of the last nine games and 13 of the last 16...have won 10 of the last 12 in Oakland and have a five-game winning streak at Progressive Field...have won five of the previous six season series and are 24-15 against the Indians dating back to the start of the 2014 season...since moving to Oakland in 1968, the A's are 284-242 against the Indians...that breaks down to 151-106 in Oakland and 133-136 in Cleveland...including 49-67 at Progressive Field...all-time, the A's are 919-1035 against the Indians.

### TODAY'S TIDBITS

**Elvis Andrus** is a .371 (105-for-283) career hitter against Cleveland, which is the best mark ever against the Indians by a player with at least 300 plate appearances...**Matt Chapman** has a career-high 51-game errorless streak and leads Major League third basemen with a .989 fielding percentage...**Matt Olson** ranks third in the AL in OPS (.948) and slugging (.574), tied for fourth in home runs (23), tied for fifth in extra base hits (45), tied for seventh in doubles (22), tied for eighth in sacrifice flies (5) and ninth in RBI (60)...**Sergio Romo** has not allowed a run in 17 of his last 19 games for a 1.02 ERA (17.2 ip, 9 h, 2 r, 2 er, 2 bb, 20 so, 1 hr)...**Lou Trivino** has a 0.34 ERA (1 er in 26.2 ip) and .182 (16-for-88) opponents batting average over his last 26 games dating back to May 8...has converted 9-of-10 save opportunities over that span and stranded all nine of his inherited runners.

### THIS DATE IN ATHLETICS HISTORY

In 1934 Bob Johnson, Jimmie Foxx and Pinky Higgins hit consecutive home runs in the fourth inning but the A's lose to St. Louis, 7-4...in 1969 Sal Bando is a perfect 5 for 5 in an 8-2 A's win at Seattle against the Pilots...he would duplicate the feat later in the season on September 30, also against Seattle...in 1974 Sal Bando singles in the A's 2-0 win at Baltimore for the 1000th hit of his major league career.

## TODAY'S STARTING PITCHER: Frankie Montas (8-7, 4.41 ERA)

**FOR STARTERS:** Is 1-0 with a 2.60 ERA (5 er in 17.1 ip) and .194 (12-for-62) opponents batting average over his last three starts...is 3-3 with a 3.83 ERA (20 er in 47.0 ip), .238 (43-for-181) opponents average and three home runs allowed over his last eight starts dating back to May 29 after going 5-4 with a 4.92 ERA, .274 opponents average and 11 home runs over his first 10 starts...has eight wins, which is tied for seventh in the American League and is one short of his career high of nine in 2019...has career highs in nearly every other category including games started (18), innings pitched (100.0), strikeouts (105), losses (7), hits (103), runs (54), earned runs (49), walks (28) and home runs (14).

**BY MONTH:** Has had a roller coaster season with his ERA as he posted a mark of 6.20 in April, 3.18 in May and 5.28 in June...currently has a 2.19 ERA (3 er in 12.1 ip) in two starts in July...posted a 2-2 record in April, 3-3 in May and 2-2 in June...is 1-0 in July.

**OPPONENTS BATTING:** Has a .201 (29-for-144) opponents batting average the first time through the order, .289 (74-for-256) with 11 of his 14 home runs after that...has a .317 (33-for-104) opponents batting average against the opponents one and two hitters but has held the three and four hitters to a .191 (18-for-94) average.

**AGAINST THE CENTRAL:** Is 2-1 with a 3.63 ERA (9 er in 22.1 ip) in four starts against American League Central teams this year compared to 6-6 with a 4.64 ERA (40 er in 77.2 ip) in 14 starts against all other teams...is now 7-4 with a 3.94 ERA (39 er in 89.0 ip) in 23 career appearances against the AL Central, 19-17 with a 4.37 ERA (132 er in 272.0.) in 65 games against everyone else.

**THIS AND THAT:** Has three no decisions this year, all in extra inning games...the A's won one of those games and are 9-9 (.500) in his starting assignments...has tossed seven innings or fewer in all 18 of his starts, including six innings or fewer 15 times...has received two runs of support or fewer in 10 of his 18 starts, including eight of his last 10.

**2021 HIGHLIGHTS:** Took the loss in his first start on April 5 against Los Angeles (NL)...allowed seven runs in a season-low 2.2 innings and walked a season-high three batters...tossed 90 pitches, which were the most by an A's pitcher in an outing of fewer than three innings since pitch counts were tracked beginning in 1988...the loss extended his losing streak to a career-high three games dating back to Sept. 13, 2020...then picked up the win in each of his next two starts and allowed just one run on eight hits in 12.0 innings...won 7-3 at Houston on April 10 and then combined with Romo, Diekmann and Wendelken on a four-hit shutout in the A's 3-0 victory over Detroit on April 16...allowed six runs on a season-high nine hits in 4.0 innings against Minnesota on April 21 but had a no decision in the A's 13-12, 10-inning win...allowed three home runs in a start for the second time in his career (Sept. 22, 2020 vs. Los Angeles-NL)...had a season-high 105 pitches in a 4-3 loss at Tampa Bay on April 27...finished April 2-2 with a 6.20 ERA in five starts...then went 3-3 with a 3.18 ERA in six starts in May...the three wins matched his most ever in a month and he had 38 strikeouts, which tied for eighth in the American League...won each of his first three starts in May and posted a 3.12 ERA over that stretch from May 3-14...then went 0-3 with a 3.24 ERA over his next three starts from May 19-29...the losing streak matched his career high...struck out 11 batters in 6.0 innings in a 4-2 loss to Seattle on May 24...it was his fourth career game of 10 or more strikeouts and the second highest single-game total of his career to his 13 against the Mariners in the final game of the 2020 season...walked a season-high tying three...tossed a season-high 7.0 innings June 15 against Los Angeles (AL) and allowed just two runs for the win...then surrendered a season-high eight runs on a season-high tying nine hits in 5.2 innings at Texas on June 21 for the loss...started consecutive games that went extra innings on June 26 at San Francisco and July 2 against Boston...issued a season-high tying three walks in the latter contests.

**LAST START:** He was the winning pitcher in the A's 2-1 win at Houston on July 8...struck out 10 batters in 6.2 innings...it was his second game of 10 or more strikeouts this year and the fifth of his career, which matches Sean Manaea for the most by an A's pitcher over the last 19 years...Oakland scored twice in the first and he shut out the Astros on three hits and a walk over the first six innings...allowed a RBI double to McCormick in the seventh.

**MONTAS vs. CLEVELAND:** Is 1-1 with a 2.82 ERA (22.1 ip, 26 h, 7 r, 7 er, 5 bb, 25 so, 1 hr) in six career appearances, including three starts...is 0-0 with a 1.86 ERA (2 er in 9.2 ip) in three games at Progressive Field and 0-1 with a 3.55 ERA (5 er in 12.2 ip) in three games in his home ballparks...last faced the Indians in 2019 when he went 1-0 with a 1.50 ERA (12.0 ip, 13 h, 2 r, 2 er, 3 bb, 16 so, 0 hr) in two starts...the no decision came in a 4-3 A's win in 12 innings on May 10 in Oakland...the A's scored a run in the first, but he allowed two in the second on a Bauers RBI double and a grounded into double play...Oakland tied the game in the bottom of the second and he did not allow another run...was relieved by Trivino to the start the seventh with the A's leading 3-2 but Trivino allowed a run for the blown save...then picked up the win in a 7-2 A's victory at Cleveland on July 1...tossed 6.0 scoreless innings and allowed five hits while walking two...had runners in scoring position in three of his six innings but was aided by nine strikeouts...was relieved by Petit to start the seventh with the A's leading 7-0.

**2020 RECAP:** Was off to a strong start as he was 2-1 with a 1.57 ERA, .175 opponents batting average and no home runs over his first four starts...was scratched from his scheduled start on Aug. 14 at San Francisco with upper back tightness and went 1-4 with an 8.70 ERA, .321 opponents average and 10 home runs over his final seven starts...went 3-5 with a 5.60 ERA in 11 starts overall...his ERA was eighth highest in the majors among pitchers with at least 50 innings pitched...had career highs in losses (5) and earned runs (33) and matched his high in home runs (10), runs (35) and walks (23)...led the A's in strikeouts (60), losses, runs, home runs and walks...his opponents batting average broke down to .198 (22-for-111) against right-handed hitters compared to .350 (35-for-100) against left-handers...surrendered six of his 10 home runs and issued 15 of his 23 walks to lefties for a 1.061 OPS (.572 against right-handers).

- Tossed a scoreless ninth inning last Thursday at Houston for his seventh save of the season...it was his first since May 26 and the seven saves match his career total entering the season.
- Last Saturday was the 500th appearance of his career...is now one of 20 active pitchers with 500 or more games pitched.
- Has a 2.84 ERA (4 er in 12.2 ip) and .205 (9-for-44) opponents batting average over his last 14 games dating back to June 4.
- Has held right-handed hitters to a .181 (15-for-83) average but they have hit five of the career-high six home runs he has allowed.
- Has a 5.63 ERA (5 er in 8.0 ip) and .303 (10-for-33) opponents batting average in nine outings on no days rest, a 1.98 ERA (6 er in 27.1 ip) and .158 (15-for-95) opponents average in 29 appearances on one day of rest or more.
- Has a 1.59 ERA (2 er in 11.1 ip) over 11 career outings against Cleveland.
