OAKLAND ATHLETICS (53-41) VS. CLEVELAND INDIANS (46-43)

SUNDAY, JULY 18, 2021 — OAKLAND COLISEUM — 1:07 PDT

ABOUT THE A'S: Had their three-game winning streak snapped yesterday... have won four of the last six games but are 9-14 over the last 23 contests... are 53-41 (.564) overall, which is the fifth best record in the American League...are in second place in the AL West for the 23rd consecutive day and trail first place Houston by 3½ games...are in second place in the AL Wild Card, two games behind Tampa Bay and 3¼ games ahead of the third place team, Seattle...have spent 58 days alone in first place in the West, three days tied for first, 24 days in second, one day tied for second, three days in third, two days in fourth, three days tied for fourth and 10 days in fifth...held at least a share of first for 61 of 62 days from April 20 to June 20...won two of three at Texas in the final series before the All-Star Break for their first series win since sweeping a three-game series from Los Angeles (AL) from June 14-16...had gone 0-5-1 over the previous six series, which was the first time the A's went winless over six consecutive series in a single season since they went 0-5-1 over a six-series stretch from June 3-22, 2016.

ONE-RUN GAMES AND OTHER CLOSE CALLS: Each of the first two games of this series and eight of the A's last 11 games have been decided by one run...are 15-15 (.500) in one-run games...lead the American League in one-run games (30), have the second most losses and are tied for third in wins...are 22-22 (.500) in games decided by two runs or fewer compared to 31-19 (.620) in games decided by three runs or more...had their eighth walk-off win of the season Friday night, which is second most in the majors to the Rockies (9)...now have 91 walk-off wins in the Bob Melvin era, which are the most in the majors over that span...the win Friday was the A's sixth when trailing after seven innings and third when trailing after eight, both of which are tied for the most in the majors...are 4-3 in extra innings and the seven extra inning games are tied for third fewest in the AL...are 12-6 in games decided in the last at bat.

BOB MELVIN: A's manager Bob Melvin has 1,313 career wins, which is tied with Hall of Famer Ned Hanlon for 34th in Major League history according to Baseball Reference...Joe Maddon (1,324) is 33rd and Chuck Tanner (1,352) is 32nd...Melvin has 820 wins with the A's, which is the most in Oakland history and second most in franchise history to Connie Mack's 3,582.

AGAINST THE CENTRAL: The A's are 13-3 (.813) against American League Central teams, which is the best record in the majors...are batting .258 (133-for-515) and are averaging 5.5 runs per game (88 runs in 16 games) against teams from the Central compared to .228 with an average of 4.2 runs per game against all other teams...have a 3.02 ERA (47 er in 140.0 ip) against the Central, 3.95 against everyone else...went 25-8 against the AL Central in 2019 after going 26-8 in 2018...are now 78-23 (.772) against AL Central foes dating back to June 23, 2017.

OFFENSE: The A's are batting .212 (124-for-585) with 62 runs scored (3.6 per game) over the last 17 games...are 0-for-11 with a sacrifice fly and two RBI with the bases loaded over that span...have the fifth lowest batting average in the American League (.233) but have the lowest mark with the bases loaded (.214)...the A's lead the American League in hit by pitches (52), rank second in sacrifice flies (30), third in stolen base percentage (80.9%) and fewest grounded into double plays (55), tied for fourth in triples (13) and fifth in walks (319)...A's pinch hitters lead the AL in hits (19), RBI (14), sacrifice flies (3) and plate appearances (93) and are tied for second in extra base hits (4).

PITCHING: The A's have a 3.27 ERA (143 er in 394.0 ip) over the last 44 games after logging a 4.27 ERA over the first 50 contests...have a 3.79 ERA for the season, which is fourth lowest in the American League...have the fifth lowest opponents on-base percentage (.303), slugging percentage (.391) and OPS (.695)...have issued the fewest walks (250), rank second in fewest pitches per inning (15.9), third in fewest home runs (104) and tied for third in shutouts (7).

STARTING PITCHING: A's starting pitchers have compiled a 3.03 ERA (39 er in 115.2 ip) and .216 (92-for-426) opponents batting average over the last 19 games but have a 5-7 record over that span...are 35-32 with a 3.72 ERA (223 er in 539.0 ip) for the season...rank third in the American League in ERA and tied for third in wins (35)...lead the majors in innings pitched (539.0) and are tied for second in complete games (3)...have used just seven starting pitchers, which is second fewest in the majors to the Red Sox (6).

BULLPEN: The A's bullpen has four blown saves in the last five games and has three saves, eight blown saves and a 3-5 record over the last 23 contests...is tied for third in the American League in most blown saves (15) but has just nine losses, which is the fewest in the majors...has a 1.73 ERA (7 er in 36.1 ip) and .158 (19-for-120) opponents batting average over the last 11 contests...now has a 3.92 ERA for the season, which is fifth lowest in the AL...has the third lowest opponents on-base percentage (.307)...has the highest slugging

percentage against first batters faced in the AL (.484) and the third highest batting average (.274).

DEFENSIVE DOINGS: The A's have not committed an error in the last six games and have just seven over the last 29 contests...have 41 errors for the season, which is second fewest in the American League (Astros, 39)...A's pitchers have five pickoffs, which is tied for fourth most...A's outfielders have seven assists, which is tied for second fewest.

HOME AND AWAY: The A's are 1-1 on this five-game homestand against Cleveland (1-1) and Los Angeles-AL (two games)...this is one of two five-game homestands over a stretch from July 6 to Aug. 19 where the A's are scheduled to play 26 of 36 games on the road...went 2-4 on the last homestand against Texas (1-2) and Boston (1-2) and are 28-23 (.549) at home...the 51 home games are second most in the majors (Padres, 52)...went 3-3 on the last road trip to Houston (1-2) and Texas (2-1) and are 25-18 (.581) on the road, which is the third best road record in the AL.

THIS AND THAT: The A's are 23-13 (.639) in games in which the opponent starts a left-handed pitcher compared to 30-28 (.517) when they start a right-hander...the mark against lefties is second best in the American League (White Sox, 18-8/.692) and the 36 games are tied for third most...are 32-7 (.821) when out-homer the opposition, 7-24 (.226) when they are out-homered...have used a different lineup in each of the last 31 games and have 91 different lineups over the first 94 contests.

THE INJURED LIST: The A's have used the injured list 18 times this year...used it just eight times last year, which was second fewest in the majors to Cleveland (4), and 18 times in 2019, which tied for second fewest...currently have three players on the IL (Fiers, Pinder, Rosenthal).

THE ALL-STAR BREAK: The A's went into the All-Star Break with a 52-40 record, marking their third consecutive season with a winning record at the break (51-41 in 2019, 55-42 in 2018)...the last time the A's had three straight winning records at the break was from 2000-06 when they had seven straight...it is the first time the A's have been at least 10 games over .500 at the break in three straight years since 1988-90...were in second place and trailed first place Houston by 3½ games, which is the closest they have been to first at the break since 2014 when they were in first with a 1½ game lead...the pitching staff set an Athletics record with 755 strikeouts (previous: 728 in 2014)...had a 3.80 ERA, which was their lowest since 2015 (3.37)...the offense hit .232, which was third lowest in Oakland history (.225 in 2012, .231 in 1982).

A's vs. INDIANS: The A's have split the first two games of the season series...won the season series in 2019, 5-1...went 2-1 in Oakland and 3-0 in Cleveland...have won eight of the last 10 games and 13 of the last 17...have won 10 of the last 13 in Oakland and have a five-game winning streak at Progressive Field...have won five of the previous six season series and are 24-16 against the Indians dating back to the start of the 2014 season...since moving to Oakland in 1968, the A's are 284-243 against the Indians...that breaks down to 151-107 in Oakland and 133-136 in Cleveland...including 49-67 at Progressive Field...all-time, the A's are 919-1036 against the Indians.

TODAY'S TIDBITS

Elvis Andrus is a .365 (105-for-288) career hitter against Cleveland, which is the best mark ever against the Indians by a player with at least 300 plate appearances...**Matt Chapman** has a career-high 52-game errorless streak and leads Major League third basemen with a .989 fielding percentage...**Matt Olson** ranks third in the American League in OPS (.955) and slugging (.577), tied for fourth in home runs (23) and extra base hits (46), tied for fifth in doubles (23), tied for eighth in sacrifice flies (5) and ninth in RBI (60) and on-base percentage (.378)...**Sergio Romo** has not allowed a run in 17 of his last 19 games for a 1.02 ERA (17.2 ip, 9 h, 2 r, 2 er, 2 bb, 20 so, 1 hr)...**Lou Trivino** has a 0.34 ERA (1 er in 26.2 ip) and .182 (16-for-88) opponents batting average over his last 26 games dating back to May 8...has converted 9-of-10 save opportunities over that span and stranded all nine of his inherited runners.

THIS DATE IN ATHLETICS HISTORY

In **1927** Ty Cobb, who spent most of his career with Detroit, collects his 4000th career hit in an A's uniform against the Tigers...he doubles off Sam Gibson in the A's 5-3 loss...in **1983** the A's turn the fifth triple play in Oakland history vs. Detroit when John Wockenfluss hits into a Ricky Peters to Tony Phillips to Bill Almon to Wayne Gross triple play...in **1988** Stan Javier collects five hits in five at bats in the A's 7-2 victory over Cleveland...in **2004** Mark Mulder extends his winning streak to 11 games in the A's 5-3 win over Chicago...the streak, which would end in his next start, is third longest in Oakland history.

TODAY'S STARTING PITCHER: Chris Bassitt (10-2, 3.28 ERA)

10-GAME WINNING STREAK: Lost each of his first two starts this year but is 10-0 with a 3.04 ERA (36 er in 106.2 ip) and .209 (82-for-392) opponents batting average in 17 starts since then...the winning streak is an on-going career high, tied for the longest streak in the majors this year (Hendricks, CHI) and tied for fourth longest in Oakland history...has left with the lead in three of his seven no decisions only to have the bullpen blow the save...the 10 wins match his career high from 2019...the A's are 14-5 (.737) in his starting assignments.

AMERICAN LEAGUE ALL-STAR: Was named to the American League All-Star Team for the first time on July 10 as a replacement...pitched the sixth inning in a 5-2 AL win (1.0 ip, 1 h, 1 r, 0 er, 2 bb, 1 so)...became the first A's starting pitcher to be named to the AL All-Star Team since Sonny Gray in 2015 and the first starter to pitch in the game since Scott Kazmir in 2014.

AT THE BREAK: Went into the All-Star Break with a 10-2 record and a 3.28 ERA in 19 starts...had 118 strikeouts in 118.0 innings...the 10 wins tied Cleveland's Aaron Civale for the most in the American League and he became the first A's pitcher with 10 wins at the break since Sonny Gray had 10 in 2015...the 118 strikeouts ranked seventh in the AL and fourth in Athletics history before the break...they were the most since Vida Blue had 120 in 1975...also led the AL in innings pitched (118.0), tied for second in winning percentage (.833), ranked fifth in opponents OPS (.628) and eighth in ERA.

AMONG THE LEADERS: Is tied for the American League lead in wins (10) and games started (19), ranks second in innings pitched (118.0), tied for second in winning percentage (.833), third in opponents OPS (.628) and slugging percentage (.348), fifth in ERA (3.28) and opponents batting average (.217), sixth in opponents on-base percentage (.281) and eighth in strikeouts (118)...has allowed 11 home runs and his average of 0.84 home runs per nine innings is fourth lowest...has hit 11 batters, which is the most in the AL and two short of the Oakland record of 13...he also hit 13 batters in 2019, which tied the record set by Barry Zito (2001, 2005 and 2006)...ranks fourth in the AL in fewest pitches per inning (15.1).

HOME AND AWAY: Is 4-2 with a 2.55 ERA (15 er in 53.0 ip) and .197 (38-for-193) opponents average in eight starts at home compared to 6-0 with a 3.88 ERA (28 er in 65.0 ip) and .234 (57-for-244) opponents batting average in 11 starts on the road...ranks sixth in the American League in home ERA but is tied for the lead in road wins...has a 13-12 career record in the Coliseum, but has a 2.46 ERA (66 er in 241.1 ip), which is fifth lowest in Coliseum history among pitchers with 200 or more innings pitched.

OPPONENTS BATTING: Has held left-handed hitters to a .194 (41-for-211) batting average, which is fifth lowest in the American League...however, has surrendered nine of his 11 home runs this year and 27 of 38 over the last three years to lefties...opponents are hitting .194 (19-for-98) with runners in scoring position, which ranks fourth in the AL...has a .140 opponents average with two strikes, which is sixth best...has held the opponents number one hitter in the batting order to a .148 (8-for-54) average.

AGAINST THE CENTRAL: Is 1-0 with a 4.32 ERA (8 er in 16.2 ip) in three starts against American League Central teams...now has a seven-game winning streak against the Central dating back to June 27, 2018 and has a 2.39 ERA (19 er in 71.2 ip) and .213 (57-for-267) opponents average over that 13 game, 12-start stretch...his last loss to a Central team was at Chicago on June 22, 2018.

THE LAST THREE YEARS: Is 25-9 (.735) with a 3.32 ERA (120 er in 325.0 ip) in 58 games (55 starts) over the last three years...based on a minium of 250 innings pitched, he ranks second in the American League in winning percentage over that span, fourth in ERA and fifth in opponents OPS (.666)...is seventh in wins...the A's are 37-18 (.673) in his starting assignments over the last three years...was 4-14 (.222) with a 3.86 ERA in 40 games (30 starts) over his first four seasons.

2021 HIGHLIGHTS: Was the A's Opening Day starting pitcher and took the loss in an 8-1 decision to Houston on April 1 in Oakland...became the A's 14th different Opening Day starting pitcher over the last 16 years...went 0-2 with a 5.56 ERA over his first two starts...then allowed exactly two runs in each of his next six starts to become the second pitcher in Athletic history to allow exactly two runs in six consecutive games (Bob Davis, Aug. 8-26, 1960)...

went 3-0 with a 2.92 ERA over that stretch which ran from April 12 to May 11...tied an Oakland record with three hit batters April 29 at Tampa Bay...left his start on May 5 against Toronto with a 3-2 lead but ended up win a no decision in the A's 9-4 loss...Trivino allowed five runs in the eighth inning for the blown save...it was the first of three times he left with a lead only to have the bullpen blow the save (also May 16 at Minnesota and June 19 at New York-AL)...struck out a season-high 10 batters in a 3-2 win at Boston on May 11...it was his third career game of 10 or more strikeouts...did not walk a batter, the second time he has fanned 10 or more without issuing a free pass...is one of nine pitchers in Oakland history with two such games...tossed his first career complete game and shutout May 27 against Los Angeles (AL), a two-hitter in the A's 5-0 win...it came in his 77th career start, his 72nd with the A's...the 71 consecutive starts without a complete game is the second longest streak in Athletics history (113, Barry Zito, Aug. 22, 2003-Sept. 28, 2006)...finished May with a 3-0 record, a 2.52 ERA and .175 opponents batting average in five starts...then went 4-0 with a 2.70 ERA in six starts in June...it was the first time in his career he won four games in a month...was one of four American League pitchers to win four games in June and his ERA tied for fifth...allowed two runs or fewer in five consecutive starts from June 8 to 30 and was 4-0 with a 1.93 ERA and .197 opponents batting average over that span...went over the 500 career innings pitched mark June 30 against Texas when he tossed 7.0 scoreless innings...allowed a season-high six runs on July 6 at Houston, marking the first time he allowed more than four runs in a start over the last two years...it snapped a streak of 28 consecutive games with four runs or fewer and 3.0 innings pitched or more, which is the longest such streak in Athletics history (previous: 25 by Vida Blue from April 9-July 30, 1971)...went 14-4 with a 2.76 ERA over that span.

LAST START: He was the winning pitcher in the A's 4-1 win at Texas a week ago today...shut out the Rangers on two hits and a hit by pitch over the first four innings and had a 3-0 lead when he allowed a RBI double to Solak in the fifth inning...that was the only run he would allow in seven innings of work.

BASSITT vs. CLEVELAND: Is 0-1 with a 4.24 ERA (17.0 ip, 16 h, 8 r, 8 er, 8 bb, 15 so, 3 hr) in three career appearances, all starts...is 0-1 with a 3.86 ERA (3 er in 7.0 ip) in one start in Oakland and 0-0 with a 4.50 ERA (5 er in 10.0 ip) in two starts in Cleveland...last faced the Indians in 2019 and had a no decision in the A's 5-3 win at Cleveland on May 21...walked a career-high six batters in 3.2 innings...allowed a leadoff home run to Lindor in the first...had a 3-1 lead when he allowed a solo home run to Santana in the third...had a 4-2 lead when he allowed a RBI double to Mercado in the fourth...was relieved by Hendricks with two outs and runners on first and second in the fourth.

TOMORROW'S PROBABLE STARTING PITCHER
LHP Cole Irvin (6-8, 3.65 ERA): Had his career high three-game winning streak snapped in his final start before the All-Star Break... is now 3-1 with a 2.95 ERA over his last seven starts after going 3-7 with a 4.12 ERA over his first 11 starts...has walked two batters or fewer in each of his 18 starts, including nine starts with one walk and four starts with no walks...has issued just 19 free passes in 106.0 innings and his average of 1.61 walks per nine innings is second lowest in the American League (Yarbrough, TB 1.59)...is 2-5 with a 4.30 ERA in 10 starts at home compared to 4-3 with a 2.85 ERA in eight starts on the road...is 5-1 with a 2.13 ERA in nine starts on five days rest or more compared to 1-6 with a 5.01 ERA in eight starts on four days rest...was the losing pitcher in his last start, a 3-2 A's loss at Texas on July 9 (5.0 ip, 3 h, 3 r, 3 er, 0 bb, 5 so)...is 0-1 with a 6.17 ERA (11.2 ip, 15 h, 8 r, 8 er, 2 bb, 5 so, 2 hr) in two career starts against Los Angeles (AL), both this year in Oakland.

- Tossed a scoreless ninth inning last Thursday at Houston for his seventh save of the season...it was his first since May 26 and the seven saves match his career total entering the season.
