OAKLAND ATHLETICS (53-42) VS. LOS ANGELES ANGELS (46-46)

ABOUT THE A'S: Lost two of three to Cleveland in the first series after the All-Star Break and are now 1-6-1 over the last eight series...are 9-15 (.375) over the last 24 games but are 53-42 (.558) for the season, which is the fifth best record in the American League...are in second place in the AL West for the 24th consecutive day and trail first place Houston by 3½ games for the fifth consecutive day...are in second place in the AL Wild Card, three games behind Tampa Bay and 2½ games ahead of the third place teams, Seattle and Toronto...have spent 58 days alone in first place in the West, three days tied for first, 25 days in second, one day tied for second, three days in third, two days in fourth, three days tied for fourth and 10 days in fifth...held at least a share of first for 61 of 62 days from April 20 to June 20.

CLOSE CALLS: Each the A's three games against Cleveland were decided by two runs or fewer...the A's are 22-23 (.489) in games decided by two runs or fewer compared to 31-19 (.620) in games decided by three runs or more...eight of the A's last 12 games have been decided by one run and Oakland is 15-15 (.500) in one-run games...lead the American League in one-run games (30), have the second most losses and are tied for third in wins...had their eighth walk-off win of the season Friday night, which is second most in the majors to the Rockies (10)...now have 91 walk-off wins in the Bob Melvin era, which are the most in the majors over that span...the win Friday was the A's sixth when trailing after seven innings and third when trailing after eight, both of which are tied for the most in the majors...are 4-3 in extra innings and the seven extra inning games are tied for third fewest in the AL...are 12-6 in games decided in the last at bat.

AGAINST THE WEST: The A's are scheduled to play 13 of their next 17 games against American League West teams with the lone exceptions being a pair of two-game series against San Diego...are 19-20 (.487) against AL West competition compared to 34-22 (.607) against all other teams...have a 4.36 ERA (168 er in 346.2 ip) against AL West clubs, a 3.38 ERA against all other teams.

BOB MELVIN: A's manager Bob Melvin has 1,313 career wins, which is tied with Hall of Famer Ned Hanlon for 34th in Major League history according to Baseball Reference...Joe Maddon (1,324) is 33rd and Chuck Tanner (1,352) is 32nd...Melvin has 820 wins with the A's, which is the most in Oakland history and second most in franchise history to Connie Mack's 3,582.

OFFENSE: The A's are batting .208 (128-for-615) with 64 runs scored (3.6 per game) over the last 18 games...are 0-for-11 with a sacrifice fly and two RBI with the bases loaded over that span...have the fifth lowest batting average in the American League (.232)...have the lowest mark with the bases loaded (.214) but are seventh in batting with runners in scoring position (.258)...the A's lead the AL in hit by pitches (53), rank second in sacrifice flies (30), third in fewest grounded into double plays (55), fourth in stolen base percentage (80.9%), fifth in walks (320) and tied for fifth in triples (13) and home runs (118)...A's pinch hitters lead the AL in hits (19), RBI (15), sacrifice flies (3) and plate appearances (93) and are tied for second in extra base hits (4).

PITCHING: The A's have compiled a 3.26 ERA (146 er in 403.0 ip) over the last 45 games dating back to May 26...that is the lowest in the American League and third lowest in the majors over that span...are .662 OPS...now have a 3.79 ERA for the season, which is fifth lowest in the American League...also have the fifth lowest opponents on-base percentage (.303), slugging percentage (.391) and OPS (.695)...have issued the fewest walks (252), rank second in fewest pitches per inning (15.9), third in fewest home runs (106) and tied for third in shutouts (7).

STARTING PITCHING: A's starting pitchers have compiled a 3.08 ERA (42 er in 122.2 ip) and .216 (98-for-453) opponents batting average over the last 20 games but have a 5-8 record over that span...are 35-33 with a 3.73 ERA (226 er in 546.0 ip) for the season...rank third in the American League in ERA, tied for third in wins (35)...lead the majors in innings pitched (546.0) and are tied for second in complete games (3)...the A's have used just seven starting pitchers, which is second fewest in the majors to the Red Sox (6).

BULLPEN: The A's bullpen has three saves, eight blown saves and a 3-5 record over the last 24 games...is tied for third in the American League in most blown saves (15) but has just nine losses, which is the fewest in the majors...has a 1.64 ERA (7 er in 38.1 ip) and .169 (22-for-130) opponents batting average over the last 12 contests...now has a 3.90 ERA for the season, which is fifth lowest in the AL...has the third lowest opponents on-base percentage (.308)...has the highest slugging percentage against first batters faced in the AL (.478) and the third highest batting average (.271).

DEFENSIVE DOINGS: The A's had their six-game errorless streak snapped yesterday...have committed just eight errors over the last 30 games and have 42 for the season, which is second fewest in the American League (Astros,

39)...A's pitchers have five pickoffs, which is tied for fourth most...A's outfielders have seven assists, which is tied for second fewest.

HOME AND AWAY: The A's are 1-2 on this five-game homestand against Cleveland (1-2) and Los Angeles-AL (two games)...this is one of two five-game homestands over a stretch from July 6 to Aug. 19 where the A's are scheduled to play 26 of 36 games on the road...went 2-4 on the last homestand against Texas (1-2) and Boston (1-2) and are 28-24 (.538) at home...the 52 home games are tied with the Padres for the most in the majors...went 3-3 on the last road trip to Houston (1-2) and Texas (2-1) and are 25-18 (.581) on the road, which is the third best road record in the AL...leave following the game tomorrow for a 10-game road trip to Seattle (four games), San Diego (two games) and Los Angeles-AL (four games)...it is the second of three 10-game road trips this year.

HOME AND AWAY SPLITS: The A's are batting .220 (360-for-1637) and are averaging 4.10 runs per game at home (213 runs in 52 games) compared to .246 with an average of 4.74 runs per game on the road...have the second lowest home batting average in the American League and fourth lowest OPS (.693)...have the fourth best road OPS (.740) and fifth best batting average...have 59 home runs in 52 games at home, 59 in 43 on the road.

THIS AND THAT: The A's are 23-13 (.639) in games in which the opponent starts a left-handed pitcher compared to 30-29 (.508) when they start a right-hander...the mark against lefties is second best in the American League (White Sox, 19-8/.704) and the 36 games are tied for third most...are 5-8 in the month of July after posting a winning record in each of the first three months (16-11 in April, 15-14 in May, 17-9 in June)...have a streak of 10 consecutive months with a winning record (min. 10 games) and have just one losing month dating back to 2018 (11-15 in April of 2019)...are 32-7 (.821) when out-homer the opposition, 7-25 (.219) when they are out-homered...have used a different lineup in each of the last 32 games and have 92 different lineups over the first 95 contests.

THE INJURED LIST: The A's have used the injured list 18 times this year...used it just eight times last year, which was second fewest in the majors to Cleveland (4), and 18 times in 2019, which tied for second fewest...currently have three players on the IL (Fiers, Pinder, Rosenthal).

THE ALL-STAR BREAK: The A's went into the All-Star Break with a 52-40 record, marking their third consecutive season with a winning record at the break (51-41 in 2019, 55-42 in 2018)...the last time the A's had three straight winning records at the break was from 2000-06 when they had seven straight...it is the first time the A's have been at least 10 games over .500 at the break in three straight years since 1988-90...were in second place and trailed first place Houston by 3½ games, which is the closest they have been to first at the break since 2014 when they were in first with a 1½ game lead...the pitching staff set an Athletics record with 755 strikeouts (previous: 728 in 2014)...had a 3.80 ERA, which was their lowest since 2015 (3.37)...the offense hit .232, which was third lowest in Oakland history (.225 in 2012, .231 in 1982).

A's vs. ANGELS: The A's lead the season series 7-3...are 5-2 in Oakland and 2-1 in Anaheim...won the season series in each in the previous two seasons and are 26-13 (.667) against the Angels over the last three years...since moving to Oakland in 1968, the A's are 463-389 against the Angels...that includes 245-184 in Oakland and 218-205 in Anaheim...all-time, the A's are 512-465 against the Angels.

TODAY'S TIDBITS

Matt Chapman had his career-high 52-game errorless streak snapped yesterday but still leads Major League third basemen in fielding percentage (.986)...**Matt Olson** ranks third in the American League in OPS (.944) and slugging (.570), tied for fourth in home runs (23) and extra base hits (46), tied for fifth in doubles (23), tied for ninth in sacrifice flies (5) and tied for 10th in RBI (60)...**Sergio Romo** has not allowed a run in 18 of his last 20 games for a 1.00 ERA (18.0 ip, 9 h, 2 r, 2 er, 2 bb, 21 so, 1 hr)...**Lou Trivino** has a 0.34 ERA (1 er in 26.2 ip) and .182 (16-for-88) opponents batting average over his last 26 games dating back to May 8...has converted 9-of-10 save opportunities over that span and stranded all nine of his inherited runners.

THIS DATE IN ATHLETICS HISTORY

In **1992** Carney Lansford ties an Oakland record with three doubles in the A's 6-2 win against Detroit...he adds a single to finish the day a perfect 4 for 4...in **1999** Buddy Groom ties an Oakland record by pitching in his sixth consecutive game...he retires the only batter he faces in the A's 10-5 win over Colorado...in **2002** Cory Lidle tosses a one-hitter in the A's 10-0 win over Texas...it is his first of two one-hitters in 2002.

Saves/Opportunities: 7-12

Inherited Runners/Scored: 8/4 **First Hitters:** 8-33, 5 bb, 2 hbp

- Tossed a scoreless ninth inning last Thursday at Houston for his seventh save of the season...it was his first since May 26 and the seven saves match his career total entering the season.
- July 10 was the 500th appearance of his career...is now one of 20 active pitchers with 500 or more games pitched.
- Has a 2.70 ERA (4 er in 13.1 ip) and .213 (10-for-47) opponents batting average over his last 15 games dating back to June 4.
- Has held right-handed hitters to a .190 (16-for-84) average but they have hit five of the career-high six home runs he has allowed.
- Has a 5.63 ERA (5 er in 8.0 ip) and .303 (10-for-33) opponents batting average in nine outings on no days rest, a 1.93 ERA (6 er in 28.0 ip) and .163 (16-for-98) opponents average in 30 appearances on one day of rest or more.

Last Year: Allowed just two runs in 21 appearances and only one was earned for a 0.42 ERA...ranked second among Major League relievers in ERA and opponents slugging percentage (.157), fifth in batting average (.114) and seventh in OPS (.410)

Inherited Runners/Scored: 6/1 **First Hitters:** 6-24, bb, hbp

- Has allowed four runs over his last seven games (6.1 ip, 5.68 ERA) after six straight scoreless appearances, May 24-June 25 (8.1 ip, 1 h, 1 bb, 6 so).
- Has a .178 opponents batting average, which breaks down to .113 (6-for-53) against left-handed hitters compared to .231 (15-for-65) against right-handers...has issued nine of his 11 walks and yielded two of his three homers to righties for a .674 OPS...has a .368 OPS against lefties.
- Opponents are batting .143 (3-for-21) with runners in scoring position.
- Was selected from the A's alternate site April 8.

Last Year: Was on the Opening Day roster and appeared in nine games for Philadelphia in 2020 and went 1-3 with an 8.59 ERA (7 er in 7.1 ip)...struck out eight batters and walked two.

- Was acquired from Arizona July 2 in exchange for cash considerations in a minor league deal...was selected from Triple-A Las Vegas on July 3.
- Yesterday, made his first Major League appearance since Sept. 30, 2017 against Texas (0.2 ip, 2 h, 1 r, 1 er, 1 so).
- Made his ML debut with Oakland in 2017, appearing in 11 games...compiled a 10.80 ERA.
- Was signed by the Diamondbacks to a minor league contract following the 2020 season and spent the entire year at Triple-A Reno prior to the trade...had a .226 opponents batting average with the Aces, which broke down to .116 (5-for-43) against left-handed hitters compared to .341 (14-for-41) with all three of his home runs against right-handed hitters...had 23 of his 30 strikeouts against lefties...his complete 2021 stats with Reno:

Inherited Runners/Scored: 28/9 **First Hitters:** 13-43, 3 bb, sf, e

- Has a 5.06 ERA (15 er in 26.2 ip) and .264 (28-for-106) opponents batting average over his last 27 games dating back to May 15...had a 0.79 ERA and .198 opponents average over his first 20 contests.
- Leads the Major Leagues in games pitched (47) and leads American League relievers in innings pitched (49.1).
- Has seven wins, which is tied for the most among AL relievers and tied for 14th among all AL pitchers.
- Opponents are hitting .189 (10-for-53) with runners in scoring position.
- Has a 6.14 ERA (10 er in 14.2 ip) and .311 (19-for-61) opponents batting average in 14 games against AL West competition, a 1.82 ERA (7 er in 34.2ip) and .198 (25-for-126) average against all other teams.
- Struck out two batters July 3 against Boston, snapping a career-high 10-game streak without a strikeout (10.0 ip)...it doubled the previous longest streak of his career and was the longest streak by an A's reliever since Jay Marshall had a 14-game streak from May 19-June 17, 2007.

Last Year: Compiled a career-low 1.66 ERA in a team-leading 26 relief appearances...opponents hit .232 and he walked just five batters for a .273 on-base percentage...yielded four runs, three of which scored on solo home runs.

- Has not allowed a run in 18 of his last 20 games for a 0.95 ERA (19.0 ip, 8 h, 2 r, 2 er, 1 bb, 19 so, 1 hr)...has a .148 (9-for-61) opponents batting average over that span.
- Has a 2.16 ERA (4 er in 16.2 ip) in 17 games on zero or one day of rest, a 6.32 ERA (11 er in 15.2 ip) in 19 outings on two days rest or more.
- First batters faced are hitting .371, which is fifth highest in the American League.

- Has a 3.75 ERA (5 er in 12.0 ip) in nine day games, a 7.11 ERA (10 er in 12.2 ip) in 11 contests at night.
- Was on the A's Opening Day roster appeared in just two games before he was placed on the 10-day injured list April 6 retroactive to April 4 with a strained right groin...was reinstated May 8.

Last Year: Made the A's Opening Day roster and was 2-0 with a save, a 2.25 ERA and .163 opponents batting average in six relief appearances before his season was cut short in mid-August with a forearm injury.

- Ranks fourth in the American League in save percentage (87.5%), seventh in saves (14) and is tied for seventh in games pitched (42)...ranks sixth among AL relievers in ERA (1.84) and seventh in innings pitched (44.0).
- Has a .144 (13-for-90) opponents batting average against right-handed hitters compared to .274 (17-for-62) against left-handers.
- Has not allowed an earned run in 17 games on the road (19.0 ip).

- Was placed on the 10-day IL May 2 with a strained left oblique and had a four-game rehab assignment with Triple-A Las Vegas from June 17-28 (5.0 ip, 2 h, 2 r, 2 er, 1 bb, 1 so, 1 hr, 3.60 ERA)...missed 52 games.
- Has allowed a .188 (9-for-48) average against right-handed hitters, .378 (14-for-37) against left-handers.
- Has a career 5.68 ERA (4 er, 6.1 ip) in seven outings against the Angels.

- Is batting .278 (60-for-216) over his last 61 games dating back to May 7 after hitting .143 over his first 31 contests.
- Has the second lowest OPS (.592) and slugging percentage (.318) in the American League and the third lowest on-base percentage (.274)...is tied for third in games (92).
- Is hitting .271 (57-for-210) with both of his home runs against right-handed pitchers, .162 (18-for-111) against left-handers.
- Has homered twice in his last 12 games after going homerless over his first 80 contests.
- Is 6-for-31 (.194) against Los Angeles this year but is a .293 (232-for-793) career hitter against the Angels with 12 home runs, 74 RBI and 52 stolen bases...the stolen bases are his most against any team, the home runs match his most (A's) and the RBI are tied for second most (A's, 77).
- Leads active players with 313 career stolen bases (Hamilton, CWS 311).

Last Year: Was hampered by a back injury for much of the season and batted .194 with three home runs and seven RBI in 29 games with Texas...had two stints on the 10-day injured list with the back injury (Aug. 20-30 and Sept. 12-end of season).

15 SETH BROWN

Current Streak: 2 games (3 for 7)
Cleveland Series: 3-8, r, hr, ri, so, sb
Last Road Trip: 2-11, r, 2b, hr, rbi, 2 bb, 3 so, sb

- Is 5-for-12 (.417) with two home runs and two RBI over his last five games but is batting .159 (13-for-82) over his last 35 contests.
- Ranks fourth among American League rookies in home runs (11).
- Has made 46 of his 47 starts this year and 63 of 65 in his career in games in which the opponent starts a right-handed pitcher.
- Is 3-for-15 (.200) with three RBI, a walk and a sacrifice fly as a pinch hitter... leads American League pinch hitters in plate appearances (17), is tied for fourth in hits and tied for fifth in RBI.
- Is batting .253 (25-for-99) at home, .134 (11-for-82) on the road.
- More than half of his hits are for extra bases (19-of-36, 52.8%)...29 of his 58 (50.0%) career hits are extra base hits.
- Was recalled from the A's alternate site on April 6 and has started games at four different positions (33 in right field, nine in left field, three at designated hitter, two at first base).

Last Year: Went 0-for-5 with two strikeouts in seven games over three stints with Oakland...all five of his plate appearances came against right-handed pitchers...made just one start and went 0-for-2 as the A's designated hitter.

20 MARK CANHA

Current Streak: 2 games (2 for 7)
Cleveland Series: 2-7, so, 2 hbp
Homestand: 2-7, so, 2 hbp

- Was reinstated from the injured list Saturday and is 2-for-7 (.286) with two hit by pitches in two starts in left field since his return...was placed on the 10-day IL June 25 with a strained left hip...did not have a rehab assignment.
- Has been hit by a pitch 15 times, which is tied for the most in the majors (France, SEA) and tied for fifth most in one season in Oakland history...his career high is 18 in 2019...holds the Oakland career record for hit by pitches (68).
- Is tied for second in the American League in triples (4) and ranks seventh in on-base percentage (.377).
- Has a .388 on-base percentage over the last three years, which is eighth best in the majors (min. 800 PA).
- Has made 73 of his 74 starts batting leadoff...the As are 43-30 (.589) when he hits leadoff, 10-12 (.455) when he doesn't.
- Is batting .322 (19-for-59) with runners in scoring position.
- Has started games at four different positions (44 in left field, 21 in center field, five in right field, four at designated hitter)...has also appeared in two games at first base.
- Has a career high in triples (4) and has matched his best in stolen bases (7).

Last Year: Batted .246 in 59 games but walked 37 times and was hit by a pitch 10 times for a .387 on-base percentage...tied for fourth in the majors in hit by pitches, tied for 12th in walks and ranked 15th in on-base percentage.

26 MATT CHAPMAN

- Is 1-for-18 with two walks over his last five games and is now batting .196 (9-for-46) with one double and no RBI in 12 games in July.
- His error yesterday was his first since May 13 at Boston...that snapped a 52-game errorless streak, which was a career high and seventh longest in Oakland history by a third baseman...it was the longest since Jack Hannahan set the Athletics record with a 72-game streak from Aug. 10, 2008-June 11, 2009.
- Leads Major League third basemen in fielding percentage (.986), total chances (282) and putouts (103), ranks second in double plays (28) and is third in assists (175).
- Leads the American League in strikeouts (116), ranks third with a career-high eight sacrifice flies, tied for third in games (92), tied for seventh in triples (3), tied for ninth in go-ahead RBI (15) and tied for 10th in walks (46).
- Nine of his 11 home runs have been solo shots.
- Has reached base safely in each of his 10 games against Los Angeles and is 5-for-29 (.172) with 10 walks, a hit by pitch and sacrifice fly (.390 on-

base percentage)...has 46 career RBI against the Angels, which are his most against any team.

Last Year: Was batting .232 with 10 home runs and 25 RBI in 37 games before going on the injured list Sept. 12 with a strained right hip...underwent surgery that day and missed the remainder of the season.

- Is batting .287 (29-for-101) as a second baseman, .203 (16-for-79) as a left fielder...is also 0-for-5 as a pinch hitter.
- Is 7-for-23 (.304) with six runs scored in eight games against the Angels.
- Has appeared in 49 games at second base and 30 in left field...has not committed an error in the outfield since May 25, 2016 against Baltimore for a 198-game errorless streak.
- Has a career-high in walks (36) and has matched his best in hit by pitches (4).

Last Year: Spent the entire season with Oakland and batted .247 with five doubles and four RBI in 49 games...his 15 walks fueled a career-high .363 on-base percentage...made 31 of his 32 starts in games started by a right-handed pitcher.

- Is tied for sixth in the AL in hit by pitches (8).
- Is 8-for-23 (.348) in five games against the Angels.
- Has three stolen bases over his last 10 games...had eight stolen bases over his first nine games and none in 55 games in between...the 11 stolen bases are two short of his career high of 13 in 2019.
- Is batting .196 (20-for-102) in 26 games since he was reinstated from the injured list June 16...was batting .257 when he was placed on the 10-day IL June 1 retroactive to May 28 with a strained right hip.

- Has committed just one error in 57 games at second base (.994 fielding percentage) and has a 43-game errorless streak.
- Has started 56 games at second base and 22 at designated hitter.
- Hit the game-ending two-run home run in the bottom of the ninth inning Friday night against Cleveland...it was his third career "walk-off" home run (last: May 28, 2017 vs. Los Angeles-AL) and his sixth career "walk-off" RBI (last: Sept. 8, 2017 vs. Houston)...it extended his streak of consecutive games with a home run to a career-high tying three (June 7-9, 2012).
- Played in his 774th game in an A's uniform Friday night, which moves him past Marcus Semien for the most games played by an Athletic over the last 16 years (now has 776).
- Has 12 career home runs against the Angels, which matches his most against any team (Mariners).

Last Year: Spent the entire season on the injured list for the Mets...was placed on the 10-day injured list July 20 with left knee inflammation...was transferred to the 45-day IL Aug. 2 and did not play in 2020.
