OAKLAND ATHLETICS (53-42) VS. LOS ANGELES ANGELS (46-46)

MONDAY, JULY 19, 2021 — OAKLAND COLISEUM — 6:40 PDT LHP COLE IRVIN (6-8, 3.65) VS. RHP SHOHEI OHTANI (4-1, 3.49) NBCSCA — A'S CAST ON IHEART RADIO — A'S RADIO NETWORK (960 AM, 103.7 FM HD2, 1140 AM)

ABOUT THE A'S: Lost two of three to Cleveland in the first series after the All-Star Break and are now 1-6-1 over the last eight series...are 9-15 (.375) over the last 24 games but are 53-42 (.558) for the season, which is the fifth best record in the American League...are in second place in the AL West for the 24th consecutive day and trail first place Houston by 3½ games for the fifth consecutive day...are in second place in the AL Wild Card, three games behind Tampa Bay and 2½ games ahead of the third place teams, Seattle and Toronto...have spent 58 days alone in first place in the West, three days tied for first, 25 days in second, one day tied for second, three days in third, two days in fourth, three days tied for fourth and 10 days in fifth...held at least a share of first for 61 of 62 days from April 20 to June 20.

CLOSE CALLS: Each the A's three games against Cleveland were decided by two runs or fewer...the A's are 22-23 (.489) in games decided by two runs or fewer compared to 31-19 (.620) in games decided by three runs or more... eight of the A's last 12 games have been decided by one run and Oakland is 15-15 (.500) in one-run games...lead the American League in one-run games (30), have the second most losses and are tied for third in wins...had their eighth walk-off win of the season Friday night, which is second most in the majors to the Rockies (10)...now have 91 walk-off wins in the Bob Melvin era, which are the most in the majors over that span...the win Friday was the A's sixth when trailing after seven innings and third when trailing after eight, both of which are tied for the most in the majors...are 4-3 in extra innings and the seven extra inning games are tied for third fewest in the AL...are 12-6 in games decided in the last at bat.

AGAINST THE WEST: The A's are scheduled to play 13 of their next 17 games against American League West teams with the lone exceptions being a pair of two-game series against San Diego...are 19-20 (.487) against AL West competition compared to 34-22 (.607) against all other teams...have a 4.36 ERA (168 er in 346.2 ip) against AL West clubs, a 3.38 ERA against all other teams.

BOB MELVIN: A's manager Bob Melvin has 1,313 career wins, which is tied with Hall of Famer Ned Hanlon for 34th in Major League history according to Baseball Reference...Joe Maddon (1,324) is 33rd and Chuck Tanner (1,352) is 32nd...Melvin has 820 wins with the A's, which is the most in Oakland history and second most in franchise history to Connie Mack's 3,582.

OFFENSE: The A's are batting .208 (128-for-615) with 64 runs scored (3.6 per game) over the last 18 games...are 0-for-11 with a sacrifice fly and two RBI with the bases loaded over that span...have the fifth lowest batting average in the American League (.232)...have the lowest mark with the bases loaded (.214) but are seventh in batting with runners in scoring position (.258)...the A's lead the AL in hit by pitches (53), rank second in sacrifice flies (30), third in fewest grounded into double plays (55), fourth in stolen base percentage (80.9%), fifth in walks (320) and tied for fifth in triples (13) and home runs (118)...A's pinch hitters lead the AL in hits (19), RBI (15), sacrifice flies (3) and plate appearances (93) and are tied for second in extra base hits (4).

PITCHING: The A's have compiled a 3.26 ERA (146 er in 403.0 ip) over the last 45 games dating back to May 26...that is the lowest in the American League and third lowest in the majors over that span as is their .662 OPS...now have a 3.79 ERA for the season, which is fifth lowest in the American League... also have the fifth lowest opponents on-base percentage (.303), slugging percentage (.391) and OPS (.695)...have issued the fewest walks (252), rank second in fewest pitches per inning (15.9), third in fewest home runs (106) and tied for third in shutouts (7).

STARTING PITCHING: A's starting pitchers have compiled a 3.08 ERA (42 er in 122.2 ip) and .216 (98-for-453) opponents batting average over the last 20 games but have a 5-8 record over that span...are 35-33 with a 3.73 ERA (226 er in 546.0 ip) for the season...rank third in the American League in ERA, tied for third in wins (35)...lead the majors in innings pitched (546.0) and are tied for second in complete games (3)...the A's have used just seven starting pitchers, which is second fewest in the majors to the Red Sox (6).

BULLPEN: The A's bullpen has three saves, eight blown saves and a 3-5 record over the last 24 games...is tied for third in the American League in most blown saves (15) but has just nine losses, which is the fewest in the majors... has a 1.64 ERA (7 er in 38.1 ip) and .169 (22-for-130) opponents batting average over the last 12 contests...now has a 3.90 ERA for the season, which is fifth lowest in the AL...has the third lowest opponents on-base percentage (.308)...has the highest slugging percentage against first batters faced in the AL (.478) and the third highest batting average (.271).

DEFENSIVE DOINGS: The A's had their six-game errorless streak snapped yesterday...have committed just eight errors over the last 30 games and have 42 for the season, which is second fewest in the American League (Astros,

39)...A's pitchers have five pickoffs, which is tied for fourth most...A's outfielders have seven assists, which is tied for second fewest.

HOME AND AWAY: The A's are 1-2 on this five-game homestand against Cleveland (1-2) and Los Angeles-AL (two games)...this is one of two five-game homestands over a stretch from July 6 to Aug. 19 where the A's are scheduled to play 26 of 36 games on the road...went 2-4 on the last homestand against Texas (1-2) and Boston (1-2) and are 28-24 (.538) at home...the 52 home games are tied with the Padres for the most in the majors...went 3-3 on the last road trip to Houston (1-2) and Texas (2-1) and are 25-18 (.581) on the road, which is the third best road record in the AL...leave following the game tomorrow for a 10-game road trip to Seattle (four games), San Diego (two games) and Los Angeles-AL (four games)...it is the second of three 10-game road trips this year.

HOME AND AWAY SPLITS: The A's are batting .220 (360-for-1637) and are averaging 4.10 runs per game at home (213 runs in 52 games) compared to .246 with an average of 4.74 runs per game on the road...have the second lowest home batting average in the American League and fourth lowest OPS (.693)...have the fourth best road OPS (.740) and fifth best batting average... have 59 home runs in 52 games at home, 59 in 43 on the road.

THIS AND THAT: The A's are 23-13 (.639) in games in which the opponent starts a left-handed pitcher compared to 30-29 (.508) when they start a right-hander...the mark against lefties is second best in the American League (White Sox, 19-8/.704) and the 36 games are tied for third most...are 5-8 in the month of July after posting a winning record in each of the first three months (16-11 in April, 15-14 in May, 17-9 in June)...have a streak of 10 consecutive months with a winning record (min. 10 games) and have just one losing month dating back to 2018 (11-15 in April of 2019)...are 32-7 (.821) when out-homering the opposition, 7-25 (.219) when they are out-homered...have used a different lineup in each of the last 32 games and have 92 different lineups over the first 95 contests.

THE INJURED LIST: The A's have used the injured list 18 times this year...used it just eight times last year, which was second fewest in the majors to Cleveland (4), and 18 times in 2019, which tied for second fewest...currently have three players on the IL (Fiers, Pinder, Rosenthal).

THE ALL-STAR BREAK: The A's went into the All-Star Break with a 52-40 record, marking their third consecutive season with a winning record at the break (51-41 in 2019, 55-42 in 2018)...the last time the A's had three straight winning records at the break was from 2000-06 when they had seven straight... it is the first time the A's have been at least 10 games over .500 at the break in three straight years since 1988-90...were in second place and trailed first place Houston by 3½ games, which is the closest they have been to first at the break since 2014 when they were in first with a 1½ game lead...the pitching staff set an Athletics record with 755 strikeouts (previous: 728 in 2014)... had a 3.80 ERA, which was their lowest since 2015 (3.37)...the offense hit .232, which was third lowest in Oakland history (.225 in 2012, .231 in 1982).

A's vs. ANGELS: The A's lead the season series 7-3...are 5-2 in Oakland and 2-1 in Anaheim...won the season series in each in the previous two seasons and are 26-13 (.667) against the Angels over the last three years...since moving to Oakland in 1968, the A's are 463-389 against the Angels...that includes 245-184 in Oakland and 218-205 in Anaheim...all-time, the A's are 512-465 against the Angels.

TODAY'S TIDBITS

Matt Chapman had his career-high 52-game errorless streak snapped yesterday but still leads Major League third basemen in fielding percentage (.986)...Matt Olson ranks third in the American League in OPS (.944) and slugging (.570), tied for fourth in home runs (23) and extra base hits (46), tied for fifth in doubles (23), tied for ninth in sacrifice flies (5) and tied for 10th in RBI (60)...Sergio Romo has not allowed a run in 18 of his last 20 games for a 1.00 ERA (18.0 ip, 9 h, 2 r, 2 er, 2 bb, 21 so, 1 hr)...Lou Trivino has a 0.34 ERA (1 er in 26.2 ip) and .182 (16-for-88) opponents batting average over his last 26 games dating back to May 8...has converted 9-of-10 save opportunities over that span and stranded all nine of his inherited runners.

THIS DATE IN ATHLETICS HISTORY

In **1992** Carney Lansford ties an Oakland record with three doubles in the A's 6-2 win against Detroit...he adds a single to finish the day a perfect 4 for 4...in **1999** Buddy Groom ties an Oakland record by pitching in his sixth consecutive game...he retires the only batter he faces in the A's 10-5 win over Colorado...in **2002** Cory Lidle tosses a one-hitter in the A's 10-0 win over Texas...it is his first of two one-hitters in 2002.

TODAY'S STARTING PITCHER: Cole Irvin (6-8, 3.65 ERA)

THREE-GAME WINNING STREAK SNAPPED: Had his career high three-game winning streak snapped in his final start before the All-Star Break... is now 3-1 with a 2.95 ERA (14 er in 42.2 ip) over his last seven starts after going 3-7 with a 4.12 ERA over his first 11 starts...has eight losses, which are tied for fifth most in the American League.

DON'T WALK: Has walked two batters or fewer in each of his 18 starts, including nine starts with one walk and four starts with no walks...has issued just 19 free passes in 106.0 innings and his average of 1.61 walks per nine innings is second lowest in the American League (Yarbrough, TB 1.59)...is averaging the fourth fewest strikeouts per nine innings (6.62)...has walked one batter or fewer in 15 of his 21 career starts and has walked just 33 batters in 151.1 career innings (1.96 per nine innings).

HOME AND AWAY: Is 2-5 with a 4.30 ERA (28 er in 58.2 ip) in 10 starts at home compared to 4-3 with a 2.85 ERA (15 er in 47.1 ip) in eight starts on the road...is tied for fourth in the American League in home losses...has the fifth lowest road ERA...has allowed seven of his 10 home runs at home.

DAYS REST: Is scheduled to start on nine days rest today...is 5-1 with a 2.13 ERA (13 er in 55.0 ip) in nine starts on five days rest or more compared to 1-6 with a 5.01 ERA (26 er in 46.2 ip) in eight starts on four days rest...eight of the 10 home runs he has allowed have come on four days rest.

AGAINST THE WEST: Is 1-6 with a 6.80 ERA (31 er in 41.0 ip) and .318 (55-for-173) opponents batting average in eight starts against American League West competition, 5-2 with a 1.66 ERA (12 er in 65.0 ip) and .213 (51-for-239) opponents average in 10 starts against everyone else

THIS AND THAT: Is averaging 14.5 pitches per nine innings, which is the fewest in the American League and second fewest in the majors (DeGrom, NYM 13.3)...is tied for fourth in hit by pitches (8) and tied for 10th in innings pitched (106.0)...eight of the 10 home runs he has allowed have been solo shots...opponents are hitting .318 (27-for-85) with runners in scoring position, which is fourth highest in the AL...is 6-1 in nine starts with more than two runs of support, 0-7 in nine starts with support of two runs or fewer... has allowed one run or fewer in six of his 17 starts...the A's are 9-9 (.500) in his starting assignments.

2021 HIGHLIGHTS: Was on the A's Opening Day roster and lost each of his first two starts, allowing four runs in each contest for a 7.45 ERA...tossed 4.1 innings in his first start on April 3 against Houston, which was the shortest start of his career...also faced the Astros in his second start on April 8 but did not pitch again until April 17 against Detroit when he combined with Wendelken, Guerra and Weems on a five-hit shutout in a 7-0 win...it was his first win since May 17, 2019 against Colorado and it snapped a career-high fourgame losing streak...that began a four-start stretch where he went 3-1 with a 1.42 ERA and .232 opponents batting average through May 4...tossed 6.0 scoreless innings in his start against the Tigers and then blanked the Orioles over the first five innings on April 23 for a career-high 11.0 inning scoreless streak...lost on April 28 at Tampa Bay but then picked up his third win on May 4 against Toronto...had career highs in innings pitched (8.0), strikeouts (9) and pitches (102) against the Blue Jays...then went 0-4 with a 5.40 ERA and .284 opponents batting average over his next five starts from May 9 to 30... the losing streak matched his career high (also May 22, 2019-April 8, 2021)... left with a 4-1 lead on May 15 at Minnesota but the pen allowed four runs in the eighth inning for the blown save...it was the first of three times the pen blew a save in one of his starts (June 11 vs. Kansas City, July 9 at Texas)... allowed a season-high five runs in an 8-4 loss to Houston on May 20...allowed a career-high 10 hits in 4.2 innings of work in a 4-3 loss to Seattle on May 25...went 1-4 with a 4.46 ERA in six starts in May...tied for second in the American League in losses in May...then compiled a 3-0 record and a 2.64 ERA in five starts in the month of June...the ERA was fourth lowest in the American League and the three-game winning streak was the longest of his career...allowed a run in the first inning on June 5 at Colorado and did not allow another run until the seventh inning of his next start on June 11 against Kansas City for a career-high tying 11.0-inning scoreless streak...tossed a career-high tying 8.0 innings and did not allow a run in a 6-2 win at San Francisco on June 27...did not allow a run over the first three innings of his next start on July 3 against Boston for another 11.0-inning scoreless streak.

LAST START: He was the losing pitcher in the A's 3-2 loss at Texas on July 9... tied an Oakland record with three hit batters (13th time, last: Bassitt, April 29, 2021 at Tampa Bay)...retired each of the first nine batters before hitting two batters in the fourth inning...did not allow a hit over the first five innings and had a 2-0 lead when he yielded a RBI single to Ibanez in the sixth...was relieved by Romo with the bases loaded and no outs in the sixth inning and Romo allowed two of the base runners to score for the blown save.

2020 RECAP: Had two stints with Philadelphia and was 0-1 with a 17.18 ERA in three relief appearances...opponents went 11-for-21 (.524) but he walked just one and struck out four in 3.2 innings...allowed a .438 (7-for-16) average against right-handed hitters compared to .800 (4-for-5) against left-handers...was 2-0 with a 4.50 ERA in four spring training appearances... was optioned to Lehigh Valley March 26 but was recalled on July 23 and was on the Phillies Opening Day roster...made his 2020 debut on July 26 against Miami and allowed four runs on five hits in an inning of relief and was the losing pitcher in an 11-6 decision...tossed a scoreless inning of relief Aug. 9 against Atlanta but was optioned to Philadelphia's alternate site on Aug. 9...was recalled for a second time Aug. 20, pitched the next day at Atlanta (1.2 ip, 4 h, 3 r, 3 er, 1 bb, 3 so) and was optioned Aug. 22...did not pitch the remainder of the season.

TOMORROWS'S PROBABLE STARTING PITCHER

RHP James Kaprielian (4-3, 2.90 ERA): Was recalled from Triple-A Las Vegas May 12 and is scheduled to make his 12th start of the season and his career...has allowed two runs or fewer in eight of his 11 starts and has a 2.90 ERA, which is second lowest in the American League among rookies with 45 or more innings and ninth lowest among all AL pitchers with 60 or more innings...his four wins are tied for sixth among AL rookies...ranks seventh among AL rookies in strikeouts (66)... has allowed six hits or fewer in each of his 11 starts and has held the opposition to a .200 batting average...that is eighth lowest among AL pitchers with 60 or more innings...had a no decision in his last start, an 8-4 A's win in 11 innings at Texas on July 10 (5.0 ip, 4 h, 2 r, 2 er, 4 bb, 4 so)...had a no decision in his only career appearance against the Angels, a start in the A's 8-4 win at Los Angeles (AL) earlier this year on May 21 (5.2 ip, 4 h, 2 r, 2 er, 1 bb, 9 so).

- Tossed a scoreless ninth inning last Thursday at Houston for his seventh save of the season...it was his first since May 26 and the seven saves match his career total entering the season.
- July 10 was the 500th appearance of his career...is now one of 20 active pitchers with 500 or more games pitched.
- Has a 2.70 ERA (4 er in 13.1 ip) and .213 (10-for-47) opponents batting average over his last 15 games dating back to June 4.
- Has held right-handed hitters to a .190 (16-for-84) average but they have hit five of the career-high six home runs he has allowed.
- Has a 5.63 ERA (5 er in 8.0 ip) and .303 (10-for-33) opponents batting average in nine outings on no days rest, a 1.93 ERA (6 er in 28.0 ip) and .163 (16-for-98) opponents average in 30 appearances on one day of rest or more.

Last Year: Allowed just two runs in 21 appearances and only one was earned for a 0.42 ERA...ranked second among Major League relievers in ERA and opponents slugging percentage (.157), fifth in batting average (.114) and seventh in OPS (.410)
