



## OAKLAND ATHLETICS (54-42) VS. LOS ANGELES ANGELS (46-47)

TUESDAY, JULY 20, 2021 — OAKLAND COLISEUM — 12:37 PDT

**ABOUT THE A'S:** Are 2-2 since the All-Star Break and have won four of the last six games...are 1-6-1 over the previous eight series and are 10-15 (.400) over the last 25 games...are 54-42 (.563) for the season, which is the fifth best record in the American League...are in second place in the AL West for the 25th consecutive day and trail first place Houston by 3½ games for the sixth consecutive day...are in second place in the AL Wild Card, two games behind Tampa Bay and three games ahead of the third place team, Seattle... have spent 58 days alone in first place in the West, three days tied for first, 26 days in second, one day tied for second, three days in third, two days in fourth, three days tied for fourth and 10 days in fifth...held at least a share of first for 61 of 62 days from April 20 to June 20.

**BOB MELVIN:** The win last night was the 1,314th of Bob Melvin's career, which moves him past Hall of Famer Ned Hanlon for 34th in Major League history according to Baseball Reference...Joe Maddon (1,324) is 33rd and Chuck Tanner (1,352) is 32nd...Melvin has 821 wins with the A's, which is the most in Oakland history and second most in franchise history to Connie Mack's 3,582.

**AGAINST THE WEST:** This series with the Angels begins a stretch where the A's are scheduled to play 13 of 17 games against American League West teams... the lone exceptions are a pair of two-game series against San Diego...are 20-20 (.500) against AL West competition compared to 34-22 (.607) against all other teams...have a 4.28 ERA (169 er in 355.2 ip) against AL West clubs, a 3.38 ERA against all other teams.

**OFFENSE:** The A's are batting .209 (135-for-646) with 68 runs scored (3.6 per game) over the last 19 games...are 0-for-11 with a sacrifice fly and two RBI with the bases loaded over that span...have the fifth lowest batting average in the American League (.232)...have the second lowest mark with the bases loaded (.214) but are ninth in batting with runners in scoring position (.257)...the A's lead the AL in hit by pitches (53), rank second in sacrifice flies (30), third in fewest grounded into double plays (55), fourth in stolen base percentage (81.3%) and fifth in home runs (120) and walks (323)...A's pinch hitters lead the AL in hits (19), RBI (15), sacrifice flies (3) and plate appearances (93) and are tied for second in extra base hits (4).

**PITCHING:** The A's have compiled a 3.21 ERA (147 er in 412.0 ip) over the last 46 games dating back to May 26...that is the lowest in the American League and third lowest in the majors over that span as is their .661 OPS...now have a 3.76 ERA for the season, which is fourth lowest in the American League... also have the fifth lowest opponents on-base percentage (.303), slugging percentage (.391) and OPS (.694)...have issued the fewest walks (254), rank second in fewest pitches per inning (15.9) and tied for third in shutouts (7) and fewest home runs (106).

**STARTING PITCHING:** A's starting pitchers have compiled a 2.92 ERA (42 er in 129.2 ip) and .220 (105-for-478) opponents batting average over the last 21 games but have a 6-8 record over that span...are 36-33 with a 3.68 ERA (226 er in 553.0 ip) for the season...rank third in the American League in ERA and tied for third in wins (36)...lead the majors in innings pitched (553.0) and are tied for second in complete games (3)...the A's have used just seven starting pitchers, which is second fewest in the majors to the Red Sox (6).

**BULLPEN:** The A's bullpen has four saves, eight blown saves and a 3-5 record over the last 25 games...is tied for third in the American League in most blown saves (15) but has just nine losses, which is the fewest in the majors... has a 1.79 ERA (8 er in 40.1 ip) and .167 (23-for-138) opponents batting average over the last 13 contests...now has a 3.90 ERA for the season, which is fifth lowest in the AL...has the third lowest opponents on-base percentage (.308)...has the highest slugging percentage against first batters faced in the AL (.477) and the third highest batting average (.270).

**DEFENSIVE DOINGS:** The A's have committed an error in each of the last two games but have just nine over the last 31 contests...have 43 for the season, which is tied with the Orioles for second fewest in the American League (Astros, 39)...A's pitchers have five pickoffs, which is tied for fourth most...A's outfielders have eight assists, which is tied for third fewest.

**CLOSE CALLS:** The A's are 15-15 (.500) in one-run games...lead the American League in one-run games (30), have the second most losses and are tied for third in wins...are 22-23 (.489) in games decided by two runs or fewer compared to 32-19 (.627) in games decided by three runs or more...had their eighth walk-off win of the season Friday night, which is second most in the majors to the Rockies (10)...now have 91 walk-off wins in the Bob Melvin era, which are the most in the majors over that span...the win Friday was the A's sixth when trailing after seven innings and third when trailing after eight,

both of which are tied for the most in the majors...are 4-3 in extra innings and the seven extra inning games are tied for third fewest in the AL...are 12-6 in games decided in the last at bat.

**HOME AND AWAY:** The A's are 2-2 on this five-game homestand against Cleveland (1-2) and Los Angeles-AL (1-0)...this is one of two five-game home-stands over a stretch from July 6 to Aug. 19 where the A's are scheduled to play 26 of 36 games on the road...went 2-4 on the last homestand against Texas (1-2) and Boston (1-2) and are 29-24 (.548) at home...the 53 home games are the most in the majors...went 3-3 on the last road trip to Houston (1-2) and Texas (2-1) and are 25-18 (.581) on the road, which is the third best road record in the AL...leave following the game today for a 10-game road trip to Seattle (four games), San Diego (two games) and Los Angeles-AL (four games)...it is the second of three 10-game road trips this year.

**HOME AND AWAY SPLITS:** The A's are batting .220 (367-for-1668) and are averaging 4.10 runs per game at home (217 runs in 53 games) compared to .246 with an average of 4.74 runs per game on the road...have the second lowest home batting average in the American League and third lowest OPS (.695)...have the third best road OPS (.740) and fourth best batting average... have 61 home runs in 53 games at home, 59 in 43 on the road.

**THIS AND THAT:** The A's are 23-13 (.639) in games in which the opponent starts a left-handed pitcher compared to 31-29 (.517) when they start a right-hander...the mark against lefties is second best in the American League (White Sox, 19-8/.704) and the 36 games are tied for third most...are 6-8 in the month of July after posting a winning record in each of the first three months (16-11 in April, 15-14 in May, 17-9 in June)...have a streak of 10 consecutive months with a winning record (min. 10 games) and have just one losing month dating back to 2018 (11-15 in April of 2019)...are 33-7 (.825) when out-homer the opposition, 7-25 (.219) when they are out-homered...have used a different lineup in each of the last 33 games and have 93 different lineups over the first 96 contests.

**THE INJURED LIST:** The A's have used the injured list 18 times this year...used it just eight times last year, which was second fewest in the majors to Cleveland (4), and 18 times in 2019, which tied for second fewest...currently have three players on the IL (Fiers, Pinder, Rosenthal).

**THE ALL-STAR BREAK:** The A's went into the All-Star Break with a 52-40 record, marking their third consecutive season with a winning record at the break (51-41 in 2019, 55-42 in 2018)...the last time the A's had three straight winning records at the break was from 2000-06 when they had seven straight... it is the first time the A's have been at least 10 games over .500 at the break in three straight years since 1988-90...were in second place and trailed first place Houston by 3½ games, which is the closest they have been to first at the break since 2014 when they were in first with a 1½ game lead.

**A's vs. ANGELS:** The A's lead the season series 8-3...are 6-2 in Oakland and 2-1 in Anaheim...won the season series in each in the previous two seasons and are 27-13 (.675) against the Angels over the last three years...since moving to Oakland in 1968, the A's are 464-389 against the Angels...that includes 246-184 in Oakland and 218-205 in Anaheim...all-time, the A's are 513-465 against the Angels.

### TODAY'S TIDBITS

**Matt Olson** ranks third in the American League in OPS (.953) and slugging (.578), tied for third in home runs (24), tied for fourth in extra base hits (47), tied for sixth in doubles (23), 10th in on-base percentage (.375) and tied for 10th in RBI (61), runs (61) and sacrifice flies (5)...**Sergio Romo** has not allowed a run in 18 of his last 20 games for a 1.00 ERA (18.0 ip, 9 h, 2 r, 2 er, 2 bb, 21 so, 1 hr)...**Lou Trivino** has a 0.63 ERA (2 er in 28.2 ip) and .177 (17-for-96) opponents batting average over his last 27 games dating back to May 8...has converted 10-of-11 save opportunities over that span and stranded all 10 of his inherited runners.

### THIS DATE IN ATHLETICS HISTORY

In **1969**, at the age of 19 years, 357 days, Vida Blue becomes the first Oakland teenage pitcher to start a game...he takes the loss in the A's 7-3 decision at California...in **1973** Jim Hunter becomes the first Oakland Athletic to win 100 games as he defeats the Cleveland Indians 6-5 in the Coliseum...in **2009** the A's trail Minnesota 12-2 entering the bottom of the third inning but come back to win 14-13, setting an Oakland record for biggest come-from-behind victory...in **2011** Hideki Matsui homers at Detroit for the 500<sup>th</sup> home run in professional career...the total includes 332 in the Japanese Leagues.

## TODAY'S STARTING PITCHER: James Kaprielian (4-3, 2.90 ERA)

**FOR STARTERS:** Was recalled from Triple-A Las Vegas May 12 and is scheduled to make his 12th start of the season and his career...has allowed two runs or fewer in eight of his 11 starts and has a 2.90 ERA, which is second lowest in the American League among rookies with 45 or more innings (Whitlock, BOS 1.38) and ninth lowest among all American League pitchers with 60 or more innings...is tied for sixth among AL rookies in wins (4) and ranks seventh in strikeouts (66)...has left with the lead in three of his four no decisions only to have the bullpen blow the save.

**SIX HITS OR FEWER:** Has allowed six hits or fewer in each of his 11 starts and has held the opposition to a .200 (45-for-225) batting average...that is eighth lowest among American League pitchers with 60 or more innings...has not allowed more than six hits in 13 career appearances...his shortest career outing is 1.2 innings and his career-opening streak of 13 consecutive games with six hits or fewer and 1.2 innings pitched or more is the longest in Athletics history.

**OPPONENTS BATTING:** His opponents batting average breaks down to .164 (20-for-122) with a .517 OPS against right-handed hitters compared to .243 (25-for-103) with an .851 OPS against left-handers...has issue 17 of his 24 walks to lefties...has allowed a .158 (6-for-38) batting average with runners in scoring position and opponents are 0-for-9 with the bases loaded...eight of the 10 home runs he has allowed have been solo shots...has a .124 (11-for-89) opponents average the first time through the lineup, .294 (25-for-85) the second time and .176 (9-for-51) after that...has not allowed a run in the second inning (11.0 ip).

**HOME AND AWAY:** Is 2-2 with a 1.38 ERA (4 er in 26.0 ip) and .161 (15-for-93) opponents average in four starts at home compared to 2-1 with a 4.00 ERA (16 er in 36.0 ip) and .227 (30-for-132) opponents batting average in seven starts on the road...has yielded eight of his 10 home runs on the road.

**2021 HIGHLIGHTS:** Began the year at Triple-A Las Vegas and went 0-1 with a 3.86 ERA in one start...was the Aviators Opening Day starter on May 6 at Las Vegas and was the losing pitcher in an 8-1 loss to Sacramento (4.2 ip, 8 h, 2 r, 2 er, 1 bb, 5 so, 0 hr, 76 pitches)...was recalled by Oakland on May 12 and made his first Major League start that day at Boston...allowed a run on four hits in 5.0 innings to earn his first ML win in the A's 4-1 victory over the Red Sox...struck out nine batters in 5.2 innings in his second start on May 21 at Los Angeles (AL) but had a no decision in an 8-4 A's win...left with a 3-2 lead and two outs in the bottom of the sixth but Petit allowed a run for the blown save...it was the first of three starts in which he left with the lead only to have the bullpen blow the save (June 23 at Texas and July 10 at Texas)...tossed 7.0 scoreless innings May 26 against Seattle for his second win...that matched his longest outing as a professional...also tossed 7.0 innings for Single-A Tampa at Charlotte on April 16, 2016, his second professional appearance...logged a season-low 3.2 innings May 31 at Seattle but had a no decision in the A's 6-5, 10-inning loss...allowed a career-high four runs...was charged with the first loss of his career when he allowed two runs in 5.0 innings on June 6 at Colorado, a 3-1 A's loss...pitched 6.0 scoreless innings and allowed just two hits on June 12 to defeat Kansas City 11-2...walked a career-high four...allowed a career-high six hits and tossed 105 pitches, which were his most as a professional, in a 5-4 loss to Texas on June 29...struck out a career-high 10 batters in a career-high tying 7.0 innings on July 4 against Boston but was the losing pitcher in the A's 1-0 loss...it was the first 10-strikeout game by an A's rookie since Chris Bassitt on Aug. 9, 2015 against Houston (also 10).

**LAST START:** He had a no decision in the A's 8-4, 11-inning win at Texas on July 10...issued a career-high tying four walks in 5.0 innings...allowed back-to-back solo home runs to Garcia and Gallo in the first inning but the A's came back with two in the second and one in the fourth...did not allow a run over his final four innings of work and was relieved by Guerra to start the sixth inning with the A's leading 3-2...Diekman allowed a run in the eighth for the blown save.

**KAPRIELIAN vs. LOS ANGELES:** He had a no decision in his only career appearance, a start in the A's 8-4 win at Los Angeles (AL) earlier this year on May 21...Oakland scored once in the third and he allowed a solo home run to Iglesias in the bottom of the third...the A's then scored twice in the top of the sixth and he struck out the first two batters in the bottom of the sixth before allowing a solo home run to Walsh...was relieved by Petit following the home run with the A's leading 3-2 and Petit allowed a run for the blown save.

**2020 RECAP:** Made his Major League debut and had two relief appearances over five stints with Oakland...compiled a 7.36 ERA and .267 opponents batting average...allowed two home runs in 3.2 innings, walked two and struck out four...was recalled for the first time Aug. 4 but did not pitch before he was optioned back to the A's alternate site on Aug. 6...joined the club a second time Aug. 16 and made his ML debut that day at San Francisco (2.0 ip, 1 h, 1 r, 1 er, 1 bb, 1 so)...relieved Fiers to start the seventh inning with the A's leading 13-2 and allowed a home run to the first batter he faced (Crawford)...walked the next batter (Dubon) before retiring each of the final six batters he faced...struck out Solano to end the seventh inning for his first strikeout...was optioned on Aug. 19...was recalled as the 29th man for doubleheaders on Sept. 8 and Sept. 14 but did not pitch...recalled for his fifth stint on Sept. 24 and made one appearance in the second game of the Sept. 26 doubleheader against Seattle (1.2 ip, 3 h, 2 r, 2 er, 1 bb, 3 so)...inherited a bases loaded situation in the third inning with the A's trailing 4-1 and allowed all three runs to score...was on the Taxi Squad for the postseason...was rated as the A's number 10 prospect by *Baseball America* following the season.

**CAREER NOTES:** Made his Major League debut with Oakland in 2020 after pitching in just 27 games over his first five professional seasons due to elbow problems...compiled a 7.36 ERA and .267 opponents batting average in two relief appearances with the A's...is 6-6 with a 3.00 ERA (34 er in 102.0 ip) in 28 games, including 23 starts, as a minor leaguer...has 116 strikeouts in 102.0 innings (10.24 per nine innings)...was the New York Yankees first round draft pick in 2015 but pitched in just eight games over his first four years as a professional...missed most of 2016 with an elbow injury and then missed the entire 2017 and 2018 seasons following April 18, 2017 "Tommy John" surgery...was traded to the A's at the 2017 trading deadline in the Sonny Gray deal and is the last remaining player from that deal that also netted the A's Dustin Fowler and Jorge Mateo...pitched for Scottsdale in the Arizona Fall League in 2016...was rated by *Baseball America* as the Yankees No. 4 prospect following the 2015 season and No. 5 following 2016...was the A's No. 8 prospect after the 2017 season and No. 10 following 2020.

**TOMORROW'S PROBABLE STARTING PITCHER**  
**LHP Sean Manaea (6-6, 3.28 ERA):** Is 0-4 with a 4.13 ERA and .234 opponents batting average over his last five starts...the four-game losing streak is a career-high...ranks sixth in the American League in ERA (3.28) and strikeout-to-walk ratio (4.60) and seventh in innings pitched (109.2)...has not walked a batter in his last two starts and has walked just 25 batters in 109.2 innings for an average of 2.05 walks per nine innings, which is ninth lowest in the AL...has allowed a .184 batting average against left-handed hitters compared to .272 against right-handers...the mark against lefties is fifth lowest in the AL...had a no decision in his last start, a 5-4 A's win over Cleveland on Friday in Oakland (5.1 ip, 7 h, 3 r, 3 er, 7 so)...is 7-5 with a 3.42 ERA (81.2 ip, 64 h, 33 r, 31 er, 23 bb, 63 so, 6 hr) in 13 career starts against Seattle...was the winning pitcher in his only start this year on June 2 at Seattle...tossed a four-hit shutout in the A's 6-0 win (9.0 ip, 2 bb, 8 so).

- Tossed a scoreless ninth inning last Thursday at Houston for his seventh save of the season...it was his first since May 26 and the seven saves match his career total entering the season.
- July 10 was the 500th appearance of his career...is now one of 20 active pitchers with 500 or more games pitched.
- Has a 2.70 ERA (4 er in 13.1 ip) and .213 (10-for-47) opponents batting average over his last 15 games dating back to June 4.
- Has held right-handed hitters to a .190 (16-for-84) average but they have hit five of the career-high six home runs he has allowed.
- Has a 5.63 ERA (5 er in 8.0 ip) and .303 (10-for-33) opponents batting average in nine outings on no days rest, a 1.93 ERA (6 er in 28.0 ip) and .163 (16-for-98) opponents average in 30 appearances on one day of rest or more.

**Last Year:** Allowed just two runs in 21 appearances and only one was earned for a 0.42 ERA...ranked second among Major League relievers in ERA and opponents slugging percentage (.157), fifth in batting average (.114) and seventh in OPS (.410)

- Has allowed four runs over his last seven games (6.1 ip, 5.68 ERA) after six straight scoreless appearances, May 24-June 25 (8.1 ip, 1 h, 1 bb, 6 so).
- Has a .178 opponents batting average, which breaks down to .113 (6-for-53) against left-handed hitters compared to .231 (15-for-65) against right-handers...has issued nine of his 11 walks and yielded two of his three homers to righties for a .674 OPS...has a .368 OPS against lefties.
- Opponents are batting .143 (3-for-21) with runners in scoring position.
- Has faced the Angels twice in his career, both this season...is 0-1 with a 3.86 ERA (1 er, 2.1 ip).
- Was selected from the A's alternate site April 8.
