



OAKLAND ATHLETICS (55-42) VS. SEATTLE MARINERS (51-45)

ABOUT THE A'S: Swept a two-game series from the Angels to start the week and are now 3-2 since the All-Star Break...the sweep was the A's first since sweeping a three-game series from the Angels from June 14-16...it was just their second series win over the last nine series (2 wins, 6 losses, 1 split)...are 11-15 (.423) over the last 26 games but are 55-42 (.567) for the season, which is the fifth best record in the American League...are in second place in the AL West for the 27th consecutive day and trail first place Houston by three games...are in second place in the AL Wild Card, 2½ games behind Tampa Bay and 3½ games ahead of the third place teams, Seattle and New York...have spent 58 days alone in first place in the West, three days tied for first, 28 days in second, one day tied for second, three days in third, two days in fourth, three days tied for fourth and 10 days in fifth...held at least a share of first for 61 of 62 days from April 20 to June 20.

AGAINST THE WEST: The A's went 2-0 against the Angels to start this stretch where they are scheduled to play 13 of 17 games against American League West teams...the lone exceptions are a pair of two-game series against San Diego (July 27-28 and Aug. 3-4)...are 21-20 (.512) against AL West competition compared to 34-22 (.607) against all other teams...have a 4.17 ERA (169 er in 364.2 ip) against AL West clubs, a 3.38 ERA against all other teams.

PITCHING: The A's had their eighth shutout of the season on Tuesday, their first since June 9...seven of the eight shutouts have come at home...rank third in the American League in shutouts...now have a 3.14 ERA (147 er in 421.0 ip) over the last 47 games dating back to May 26, which is second lowest in the majors over that span (Brewers, 2.93)...have the third lowest OPS (.657)...now have a 3.72 ERA for the season, which is fourth lowest in the American League...have the fifth lowest opponents on-base percentage (.303), slugging percentage (.389) and OPS (.692)...have issued the fewest walks (257) and rank second in fewest home runs (106) and fewest pitches per inning (15.9).

STARTING PITCHING: A's starting pitchers have not allowed a run in back-to-back games for the fourth time this year...have compiled a 2.79 ERA (42 er in 135.2 ip) and .220 (110-for-501) opponents batting average over the last 22 games but have a 7-8 record over that span...are 37-33 with a 3.64 ERA (226 er in 559.0 ip) for the season...rank third in the American League in ERA and tied for third in wins (36)...lead the majors in innings pitched (559.0) and are tied for second in complete games (3)...the A's have used just seven starting pitchers, which is second fewest in the majors to the Red Sox (6).

BULLPEN: The A's bullpen has four saves, eight blown saves and a 3-5 record over the last 26 games...is tied for fourth in the American League in most blown saves (15) but has just nine losses, which is the fewest in the majors...has a 1.66 ERA (8 er in 43.1 ip) and .168 (25-for-149) opponents batting average over the last 14 contests...now has a 3.86 ERA for the season, which is fifth lowest in the AL...has the third lowest opponents on-base percentage (.308)...has the highest slugging percentage against first batters faced in the AL (.471) and the third highest batting average (.266).

OFFENSE: The A's are batting .212 (143-for-676) with 74 runs scored (3.7 per game) over the last 20 games...are 0-for-11 with two sacrifice flies and three RBI with the bases loaded over that span...have the fifth lowest batting average in the American League (.233)...have the second lowest mark with the bases loaded (.214) but are eighth in batting with runners in scoring position (.259)...the A's lead the AL in hit by pitches (54), rank second in sacrifice flies (31), third in fewest grounded into double plays (55), fourth in stolen base percentage (81.3%) and fifth in walks (324)...A's pinch hitters lead the AL in hits (19), RBI (15), sacrifice flies (3) and plate appearances (93) and are tied for second in extra base hits (4).

DEFENSIVE DOINGS: The A's have committed an error in three consecutive games (three errors total)...however, have just 44 for errors for the season, which is second fewest in the American League (Astros, 40)...A's pitchers have five pickoffs, which is tied for fourth most...A's outfielders have eight assists, which is tied for second fewest.

CLOSE CALLS: The A's are 15-15 (.500) in one-run games...lead the American League in one-run games (30), are tied for the second most losses and are tied for third in wins...are 22-23 (.489) in games decided by two runs or fewer compared to 33-19 (.635) in games decided by three runs or more...are 4-3 in extra innings and the seven extra inning games are tied for third fewest in the AL...are 12-6 in games decided in the last at bat...have eight walk-off wins, which is second most in the majors to the Rockies (10)...now have 91 walk-off wins in the Bob Melvin era, which are the most in the majors over that span.

HOME AND AWAY: The A's begin a 10-game road trip to Seattle (four games), San Diego (two games) and Los Angeles-AL (four games) tonight...this is the second of three 10-game road trips this year and it is part of a stretch from July 6 to Aug. 19 where the A's are scheduled to play 26 of 36 games on the road...are 6-5 over the first 11 games of that stretch (3-3 on the road, 3-2 at home)...went 3-3 on the last road trip to Houston (1-2) and Texas (2-1) and are 25-18 (.581) on the road, which is the third best road record in the American League...the 43 road games are tied with the Braves, Rockies and Nationals for the fewest in the majors...went 3-2 on the last homestand against Cleveland (1-2) and Los Angeles-AL (2-0) and are 30-24 (.556) at home.

HOME AND AWAY SPLITS: The A's are batting .246 (368-for-1495) and are averaging 4.74 runs per game on the road (368 runs in 43 games) compared to .221 with an average of 4.13 runs per game at home...have the fourth best road batting average and OPS (.740) in the American League...have the second lowest home batting average and third lowest OPS (.695)...have a 3.68 ERA (153 er in 374.0 ip) on the road, which is second lowest in the AL (Astros, 3.54)...have 62 home runs in 54 games at home, 59 in 43 on the road

THIS AND THAT: The A's are 10-2 (.833) following a day off, which is the best record in the majors...the 12 games are tied for the fewest in the majors...are 24-13 (.649) in games in which the opponent starts a left-handed pitcher compared to 31-29 (.517) when they start a right-hander...the mark against lefties is second best in the American League (White Sox, 19-8/.704) and the 37 games are third most...are 7-8 in the month of July after posting a winning record in each of the first three months (16-11 in April, 15-14 in May, 17-9 in June)...have a streak of 10 consecutive months with a winning record (min. 10 games) and have just one losing month dating back to 2018 (11-15 in April of 2019)...are 34-7 (.829) when out-homer the opposition, 7-25 (.219) when they are out-homered...have used a different lineup in each of the last 34 games and have 94 different lineups over the first 97 contests.

THE INJURED LIST: The A's have used the injured list 18 times this year...used it just eight times last year, which was second fewest in the majors to Cleveland (4), and 18 times in 2019, which tied for second fewest...currently have three players on the IL (Fiers, Pinder, Rosenthal).

THE ALL-STAR BREAK: The A's went into the All-Star Break with a 52-40 record, marking their third consecutive season with a winning record at the break (51-41 in 2019, 55-42 in 2018)...the last time the A's had three straight winning records at the break was from 2000-06 when they had seven straight...it is the first time the A's have been at least 10 games over .500 at the break in three straight years since 1988-90...were in second place and trailed first place Houston by 3½ games, which is the closest they have been to first at the break since 2014 when they were in first with a 1½ game lead.

A's vs. MARINERS: The season series is even at three games each...the A's won two of three in Seattle from May 31-June 2 but lost two of three in Oakland from May 24-26...won the season series last year, 6-4...went 2-2 in Oakland and 4-2 in Seattle...were 10-9 in 2019 and have won back-to-back season series against the Mariners for the first time since winning three straight from 2004-06...are 19-16 against Seattle over the last three years but are 65-84 dating back to the start of the 2013 season...all-time, the A's are 369-308 against the Mariners...that includes 198-138 in Oakland, 170-167 in Seattle and 1-3 in Tokyo...are 94-103 at T-Mobile Park.

TODAY'S TIDBITS

Matt Olson ranks third in the American League in home runs (25), OPS (.967) and slugging (.588), tied for third in home runs (24), fourth in on-base percentage (.379), fifth in extra base hits (48), tied for seventh in doubles (23) and tied for eighth in RBI (63) and runs (63)...**Sergio Romo** has also not allowed a run in 19 of his last 21 games for a 0.95 ERA (19.0 ip, 10 h, 2 r, 2 er, 2 bb, 23 so, 1 hr) and .179 opponents batting average (10-for-65)...**Lou Trivino** has a 0.63 ERA (2 er in 28.2 ip) and .177 (17-for-96) opponents batting average over his last 27 games dating back to May 8...ranks fourth among AL relievers in save percentage (88.2%), fifth in ERA (1.96) and tied for sixth in saves (15).

THIS DATE IN ATHLETICS HISTORY

In **1905** Weldon Henley no hits the St. Louis Browns, 6-0...it is one of just four wins for Henley all year...in **1996** Mark McGwire singles off Kevin Tapani in the second inning of the A's 6-5 win at Chicago for his 1000th career hit...he becomes the eighth Oakland Athletic to reach the 1000 mark...in **2012** Coco Crisp has a RBI single in the bottom of the 12th inning to lead the A's to a 5-4 win over New York...the win completes the A's second four-game series sweep of the Yankees since 1914.

TODAY'S STARTING PITCHER: Sean Manaea (6-6, 3.28 ERA)

FOUR-GAME LOSING STREAK: Is 0-4 with a 4.13 ERA (13 er in 28.1 ip) and .234 (26-for-111) opponents batting average over his last five starts...has received seven runs of support total in those five starts, including no runs twice and one run once...the four-game losing streak is a career-high (previous: 3, Aug. 1-18, 2017)...has allowed five home runs during the losing streak after yielding just eight home runs over his first 14 starts.

AMONG THE LEADERS: Ranks fifth in the American League in strikeout-to-walk ratio (4.60), sixth in ERA (3.28), ninth in innings pitched (109.2) and 10th in opponents OPS (.682)...has allowed 13 home runs in 109.2 innings and his average of 1.07 home runs per nine innings is eighth lowest...is one of two pitchers in the majors with two shutouts (DeSclafani, SF) and one of five with two or more complete games...is the first A's pitcher with two complete games in a season since Kendall Graveman in 2016 (2) and the first with two shutouts since Sonny Gray in 2015 (2)...has three of the A's seven complete games and shutouts over the last four years.

DON'T WALK: Has not walked a batter in his last two starts...has walked two batters or fewer in 16 of his 19 starts, including six starts with one walk and five with no walks...has walked just 25 batters in 109.2 innings for an average of 2.05 walks per nine innings, which is ninth lowest in the American League...over the last four years, he has walked two batters or fewer in 55 of his 62 starts (19 with no walks, 23 with one)...has 72 walks in 354.0 innings over that span, an average of 1.83 per nine innings.

JUNE AND JULY: Is 0-3 with a 5.29 ERA (10 er in 17.0 ip) over his first three starts in July after going 3-2 with a 1.13 ERA and .181 opponents batting average in five starts in June...is now 2-7 with a 4.04 ERA (54 er in 120.1 ip) in 20 career games in July compared to 11-4 with a 2.68 ERA in 19 career starts in June...the June wins are his most in any month and his June ERA is second lowest to his 2.17 in September...earned American League Pitcher of the Month honors this June.

LEFT AND RIGHT: Has allowed a .184 (19-for-103) batting average against left-handed hitters compared to .272 (88-for-323) against right-handers...the mark against lefties is fourth lowest in the American League...has surrendered six home runs in 103 at bats against lefties and seven in 323 at bats against righties...has issued 20 of his 25 walks to righties.

SUPPORT: Has received one run of support or fewer in eight of his 19 starts and is 0-5 in those starts...is 6-1 in 11 starts with two runs of support or more...has seven no decisions and has allowed just one run in four of the no decisions...has received one run of support in three of his no decisions and the bullpen blew the save in two of his other no decisions...the A's are 6-1 in his no decisions and are 12-7 (.632) in his starting assignments...are 23-12 (.657) when he starts over the last three years.

DAYS REST: Is scheduled to start on five days rest...is 3-1 with a 1.38 ERA (9 er in 58.2 ip) and .228 (50-for-219) opponents batting average in nine starts on four days rest compared to 2-4 with a 5.91 ERA (23 er in 35.0 ip) and .288 (42-for-146) opponents average in seven starts on five days rest...over the last three years, he is 7-2 with a 2.37 ERA (26 er in 98.2 ip) in 17 starts on four days rest, 3-5 with a 5.60 ERA (28 er in 45.0 ip) in nine starts on five days rest.

2021 HIGHLIGHTS: Took the loss in his first start but then went 3-0 with a 1.50 ERA over his next four starts...picked up his first win of the season in the 100th game of his career, an 8-4 victory over Detroit on April 15...tossed a six-hit, seven-inning shutout in the A's 7-0 win over Minnesota in the first game of the doubleheader April 20...it was the 11th complete game shutout of fewer than eight innings in Oakland history and his second career complete game and shutout...the start was the 100th of his career and he became the 25th pitcher in Oakland history to make 100 starts...had 10 strikeouts on May 7 against Tampa Bay, but had a no decision in the A's 2-1 win...retired each of the first 18 batters he faced before walking Arozarena to start the seventh...allowed one run or fewer in five consecutive starts from May 23 to June 14 and went 3-0 with a 0.84 ERA over that span...became the first A's pitcher with five consecutive games of one run or fewer and five innings pitched or more since Trevor Cahill (April 17-May 9, 2011)...had a no decision in the A's 6-5 loss at Los Angeles (AL) on May 23...left with a 4-1 lead but the bullpen blew the save...it was the first of two times the pen blew the save in one of his starts (July 16 vs. Cleveland)...struck out Justin Upton to lead off the game for the 50,000th strikeout in Oakland history...fanned Taylor Ward to end the fourth inning for his 500th career strikeout...tossed a four-hit shutout in the A's 6-0 win at Seattle on June 2...it was his third career complete game and shutout, his second this year...logged a season-high 111 pitches, which are his most in a game over the last four years...then tossed 111 pitches in his next start on June 9 against Arizona when he combined with Petit, Trivino and Diekmann on a two-hit shutout in the A's 4-0 win...it was the second time in his career he did not allow a run in back-to-back starts (Sept. 14-20, 2016)...had a career-high 16.0-inning scoreless streak from June 2 to 14...struck out a career-high 11 batters in 5.1 innings June 20 at New York

(AL) but was the losing pitcher in the A's 2-1 loss...the 11 strikeouts match the most in Athletics history by a pitcher with fewer than six innings pitched (Kirk Saarloos on Sept. 19, 2006 and Tim Hudson on June 8, 1999)...it was his second game of 10 or more strikeouts this year and the fifth of his career...went 2-for-2 with a double June 25 at San Francisco...it was the first extra base hit by an A's pitcher since Joe Kennedy doubled on June 12, 2007 at Houston...was named American League Pitcher of the Month for June after going 3-2 with a 1.13 ERA and .181 opponents batting average in five starts...struck out 34 batters in 32.0 innings and allowed just one home run...it was the second time he was named Pitcher of the Month (April, 2018)...based on a minimum of 30 innings, his ERA was the lowest by an A's pitcher in June since Lefty Grove had a 0.51 ERA in June of 1926...had the lowest ERA in the majors in June...had the lowest opponents OPS (.496), slugging percentage (.250), on-base percentage (.246) and batting average in the AL

LAST START: He had a no decision in the A's 5-4 win over Cleveland last Friday in Oakland...did not walk a batter for the second consecutive start...had a 3-0 lead when he allowed a home run to Perez to start the fifth inning...also yielded a RBI single to Reyes in the sixth and was relieved by Petit with out in the sixth, runners on first and third, and a 3-2 lead...Petit allowed a sacrifice fly to Ramirez for the blown save.

MANAEA vs. SEATTLE: Is 7-5 with a 3.42 ERA (81.2 ip, 64 h, 33 r, 31 er, 23 bb, 63 so, 6 hr) in 13 career starts...is 3-0 with a 3.65 ERA (10 er in 24.2 ip) in four starts in Oakland and 4-5 with a 3.32 ERA (21 er in 57.0 ip) in ninth starts in Seattle...was the winning pitcher in his only start this year on June 2 at Seattle...tossed a four-hit shutout in the A's 6-0 win...it was his third career complete game and shutout, his second this year...logged a season-high 111 pitches, which are his most in a game over the last four years...blanked the Mariners on one walk over the first four innings and did not allow a hit until Murphy singled to lead off the fifth...loaded the bases in the fifth inning, but that was the only time Seattle would get a runner in scoring position.
