ABOUT THE A'S: Have a three-game winning streak, are 4-2 since the All-Star Break and have won six of the last eight games...however, are 2-6-1 over the previous nine series and are 12-15 (.444) over the last 27 games...are 56-42 (.571) for the season, which is the fifth best record in the American League... are in second place in the AL West for the 28th consecutive day and trail first place Houston by 2½ games...are in second place in the AL Wild Card, 2½ games behind Tampa Bay and 4½ games ahead of the third place teams, Seattle and New York...have spent 58 days alone in first place in the West, three days tied for first, 29 days in second, one day tied for second, three days in third, two days in fourth, three days tied for fourth and 10 days in fifth.

PITCHING: The A's have allowed one run or fewer in each of the last three games (2 er in 27.0 ip, 0.67 ERA)...now have a 3.10 ERA (148 er in 430.0 ip) over the last 48 games dating back to May 26, which is second lowest in the majors over that span (Brewers, 2.93)...have the third lowest OPS (.653)...overall, rank fourth in the American League in ERA (3.69) and fifth in opponents on-base percentage (.302), slugging percentage (.387) and OPS (.689)...have issued the fewest walks (260), rank second in fewest home runs (107) and fewest pitches per inning (15.9) and third in shutouts (8).

STARTING PITCHING: A's starting pitchers have allowed just one run in the last three games (1 er in 20.0 ip, 0.45 ERA) and now have a 2.71 ERA (43 er in 142.2 ip) and .215 (113-for-525) opponents batting average over the last 23 games dating back to June 23...are 38-33 with a 3.61 ERA (227 er in 566.0 ip) for the season...rank third in the American League in ERA and wins (36)...lead the majors in innings pitched (566.0) and are tied for second in complete games (3)...the A's have used just seven starting pitchers, which is second fewest in the majors to the Red Sox (6).

BULLPEN: The A's bullpen has allowed one earned run or fewer in 14 of the last 15 games and has a 1.59 ERA (8 er in 45.1 ip) and .167 (26-for-156) opponents batting average over that span...however, has five saves, eight blown saves and a 3-5 record over the last 27 contests...has 15 blown saves for the season, which is tied for fourth most in the American League, but has just nine losses, which is the fewest in the majors...ranks fifth in the AL in ERA (3.84)...has the highest slugging percentage against first batters faced in the AL (.471) and the third highest batting average (.268).

OFFENSE: The A's are batting .250 (49-for-196) since the All-Star Break, which is fifth best in the American League, but have scored just 23 runs in six games, which is third fewest...are batting .234 overall, which is fifth lowest in the AL...have the second lowest average with the bases loaded (.224) but rank eighth in batting with runners in scoring position (.259)...lead the AL in hit by pitches (55), rank second in sacrifice flies (32), third in fewest grounded into double plays (55), fourth in stolen base percentage (82.0%) and sacrifice hits (13) and fifth in walks (330)...A's pinch hitters lead the AL in hits (19), RBI (15), sacrifice flies (3) and plate appearances (94) and are tied for second in extra base hits (4).

DEFENSIVE DOINGS: The A's have committed three errors in the last four games but have just 44 errors for the season, which is second fewest in the American League (Astros, 40)...A's pitchers have five pickoffs, which is tied for fourth most...A's outfielders have eight assists, which is tied with the Mariners, Angels and Tigers for the fewest.

AGAINST THE WEST: The A's are 3-0 in this stretch from July 19 to Aug. 8 where they are scheduled to play 13 of 17 games against American League West teams...the lone exceptions are a pair of two-game series against San Diego (July 27-28 and Aug. 3-4)...have won six of their last seven games against division foes and have a 1.41 ERA (10 er in 64.0 ip) in those games...are 22-20 (.524) against AL West competition overall compared to 34-22 (.607) against all other teams.

HOME AND AWAY: The A's are 1-0 on this 10-game road trip to Seattle (1-0), San Diego (two games) and Los Angeles-AL (four games) ...this is the second of three 10-game road trips this year and it is part of a stretch from July 6 to Aug. 19 where the A's are scheduled to play 26 of 36 games on the road...are 7-5 over the first 12 games of that stretch (4-3 on the road, 3-2 at home)...

went 3-3 on the last road trip to Houston (1-2) and Texas (2-1) and are 26-18 (.591) on the road...have the second best road record in the American League (Red Sox, 30-19/.692) and third best in the majors (Brewers, 29-18/.617)... the 44 road games are tied with the White Sox for the fewest in the AL...went 3-2 on the last homestand against Cleveland (1-2) and Los Angeles-AL (2-0) and are 30-24 (.556) at home.

HOME AND AWAY SPLITS: The A's are batting .248 (379-for-1531) and are averaging 4.73 runs per game on the road (208 runs in 44 games) compared to .221 with an average of 4.13 runs per game at home...have the fourth best road batting average and OPS (.742) in the American League...have the second lowest home batting average and third lowest OPS (.695)...have a 3.62 ERA (154 er in 383.0 ip) on the road, which is second lowest in the AL (Astros, 3.54)...have 62 home runs in 54 games at home, 59 in 44 on the road.

CLOSE CALLS: The A's are 15-15 (.500) in one-run games...lead the American League in one-run games (30), are tied for the second most losses and are tied for third in wins...are 22-23 (.489) in games decided by two runs or fewer compared to 34-19 (.642) in games decided by three runs or more...are 4-3 in extra innings and the seven extra inning games are tied for third fewest in the AL...are 12-6 in games decided in the last at bat...have eight walk-off wins, which is second most in the majors to the Rockies (10)...now have 91 walk-off wins in the Bob Melvin era, which are the most in the majors over that span.

A'S IN JULY: The A's are 8-8 (.500) in the month of July...posted a winning record in each of the first three months (16-11 in April, 15-14 in May, 17-9 in June)...have a streak of 10 consecutive months with a winning record (min. 10 games) and have just one losing month dating back to 2018 (11-15 in April of 2019)...have a 2.82 ERA (46 er in 147.0 ip), which is second lowest in the majors (Brewers, 2.38)...have not had an ERA under 3.00 in July since 2001 (2.81)...have scored just 60 runs, which is third fewest in the AL...have the fourth lowest batting average (.225) and fifth lowest OPS (.678).

THIS AND THAT: The A's are 24-13 (.649) in games in which the opponent starts a left-handed pitcher compared to 32-29 (.525) when they start a right-hander...the mark against lefties is second best in the American League (White Sox, 19-8/.704) and the 37 games are third most...are 34-7 (.829) when out-homering the opposition, 8-25 (.242) when they are out-homered...have used a different lineup in each of the last 35 games and have 95 different lineups over the first 98 contests.

THE INJURED LIST: The A's have used the injured list 18 times this year...used it just eight times last year, which was second fewest in the majors to Cleveland (4), and 18 times in 2019, which tied for second fewest...currently have three players on the IL (Fiers, Pinder, Rosenthal), which matches the A's fewest players on the IL since the third game of the season.

A'S vs. MARINERS: The A's lead the season series, 4-3...are 3-1 in Seattle and 1-2 in Oakland...won the season series last year, 6-4...went 2-2 in Oakland and 4-2 in Seattle...were 10-9 in 2019 and have won back-to-back season series against the Mariners for the first time since winning three straight from 2004-06...are 20-16 against Seattle over the last three years but are 66-84 dating back to the start of the 2013 season...all-time, the A's are 370-308 against the Mariners...that includes 198-138 in Oakland, 171-167 in Seattle and 1-3 in Tokyo...are 95-103 at T-Mobile Park.

Matt Olson ranks third in the American League in home runs (25), OPS (.960) and slugging (.583), fifth in extra base hits (48), tied for seventh in RBI (64) and doubles (23), tied for ninth in runs (63) and 10th in on-base percentage (.377)...**Sergio Romo** has not allowed a run in his last 10 games (9.2 ip, 2 h, 1 bb, 13 so) and opponents are 2-for-30 (.067) over that span... has a 0.90 ERA (20.0 ip, 10 h, 2 r, 2 er, 2 bb, 24 so, 1 hr) and .147 (10-for-68) opponents batting average over his last 22 contests...**Lou Trivino** has converted each of his last nine save opportunities dating back to June 5 and has a 0.84 ERA (2 er in 21.1 ip) and .192 (14-for-73) opponents batting average in 20 games over that span

THIS DATE IN ATHLETICS HISTORY

In **1964** Bert Campaneris homers twice in his major league debut as the A's defeat Minnesota, 4-3...the first home run comes on the first pitch he sees from Jim Kaat...in **1976** Vida Blue tosses a six-hit shutout and strikes out 13 in the A's 2-0 win over Kansas City to record his 100th career victory... he would go on to win 124 games in an Oakland uniform, second only to Catfish Hunter's 131...in **1996** Terry Steinbach hits his eighth career grand slam in the A's 8-4 win at Chicago...it was his fifth homer in three days.

- Has a 2.70 ERA (4 er in 13.1 ip) and .213 (10-for-47) opponents batting average over his last 16 games dating back to June 4.
- Has held right-handed hitters to a .190 (16-for-84) average but they have hit five of the career-high six home runs he has allowed.
- Has a 4.58 ERA (9 er in 17.2 ip) and .246 (17-for-69) opponents batting average in 20 outings on one day rest or fewer, a 0.98 ERA (2 er in 18.1 ip) and .145 (9-for-62) opponents average in 19 appearances on two days of rest or more.
- Has a save in three appearances against Seattle (3.1 ip, 3 h, 2 r, 2 er, 2 bb, 3 so)...has a 2.37 ERA (8 er in 30.1 ip) in 33 career appearances against the Mariners.
- Had his seventh save of the season July 8 at Houston, which is an on-going career high.

- Has not allowed a run in his last six games (5.2 ip, 3 h, 1 bb, 7 so) nor in 12 of his last 14 (4 er in 15.2 ip, 2.30 ERA).
- Has a .174 opponents batting average, which breaks down to .111 (6-for-54) against left-handed hitters compared to .224 (15-for-67) against right-handers...has issued nine of his 11 walks and yielded two of his three homers to righties for a .655 OPS...has a .362 OPS against lefties.
- Ranks fourth among American League relievers in opponents batting average (.174), sixth in OPS (.527) and on-base percentage (.246) and 10th in slugging percentage (.281).

- His appearance last Saturday against Cleveland was his first in the majors since Sept. 30, 2017 against Texas (0.2 ip, 2 h, 1 r, 1 er, 1 so).
- Has made four of his 11 career appearances against Seattle (3.2 ip, 2 h, 1 r, 1 er, 2 bb, 2 so, 2.45 ERA).
- Was signed by the Diamondbacks to a minor league contract following the 2020 season and spent the entire year at Triple-A Reno prior to the trade...had a .226 opponents batting average with the Aces, which broke down to .116 (5-for-43) against left-handed hitters compared to .341 (14-for-41) with all three of his home runs against right-handed hitters...had 23 of his 30 strikeouts against lefties...his complete 2021 stands with Reno:

- Has a 3.75 ERA (5 er in 12.0 ip) in nine day games, a 7.11 ERA (10 er in 12.2 ip) in 11 contests at night.
- Faced the Mariners once this year on May 25 (1.1 ip, 1 h, 1 bb, 2 so)...has not allowed a run in four career appearances against Seattle (4.1 ip, 3 h, 2 bb, 5 so).

- Has converted each of his last nine save opportunities dating back to June 5 and has a 0.84 ERA (2 er in 21.1 ip) and .192 (14-for-73) opponents batting average in 20 games over that span.
- Is 16-for-18 (88.9%) in save opportunities...ranks fourth in the American League in save percentage and sixth in saves.
- Has a 0.61 ERA (2 er in 29.2 ip) over his last 28 games and now has a 1.91 ERA for the season, which ranks fifth among AL relievers.
- Is tied for third among AL relievers in innings pitched (47.0) and tied for seventh in games (44).
- Has a .149 (14-for-94) opponents batting average against right-handed hitters compared to .257 (18-for-70) against left-handers.
- Opponents are hitting .167 (8-for-48) with runners in scoring position.
- Allowed both of his inherited runners to score in his second game on April 3 but has stranded all 12 of his inherited runners since then.
- Has allowed just one home run over his last 33 games (34.0 innings).
- Has a .149 (14-for-94) opponents batting average against right-handed hitters compared to .257 (18-for-70) against left-handers.
- Opponents are hitting .167 (8-for-48) with runners in scoring position.
- Had his first career two-inning save on Monday against Los Angeles-AL...it was his third career save of more than one inning.

Last Year: Compiled a 3.86 ERA in 20 relief appearances and held the opposition to a career-low .193 batting average...issued 10 walks in 23.1 innings for a career-low .280 on-base percentage...struck out 26 for a career-best 10.03 strikeouts per nine innings.

- Is batting .274 (62-for-226) over his last 64 games dating back to May 7 after hitting .143 over his first 31 contests.
- Has the second lowest OPS (.588) in the American League, the second lowest slugging percentage (.314) and the third lowest on-base percentage (.274)... is tied for third in games (95).
- Is hitting .273 (59-for-216) with both of his home runs against right-handed pitchers, .157 (18-for-115) against left-handers.
- Has homered twice in his last 15 games after going homerless over his first 80 contests.
- Committed his 11th error of the season Monday night, which is tied for third most among AL shortstops.
- Is 9-for-20 (.450) with two walks and three strikeouts against Seattle this season and is a career .264 (105-for-397) hitter at T-Mobile Park.
- Leads active players with 314 career stolen bases (Hamilton, CWS 313).

Last Year: Was hampered by a back injury for much of the season and batted .194 with three home runs and seven RBI in 29 games with Texas...had two stints on the 10-day injured list with the back injury (Aug. 20-30 and Sept. 12-end of season).

15 SETH BROWN

Last Homestand: 3-9, 2 r, hr, rbi, 2 so, sb

- Is 6-for-16 (.375) with two home runs and two RBI over his last seven games but is batting .163 (14-for-86) over his last 37 contests.
- Ranks fifth among American League rookies in home runs (11).
- Has made 47 of his 48 starts this year and 64 of 66 in his career in games in which the opponent starts a right-handed pitcher.
- Is 3-for-15 (.200) with three RBI, a walk and a sacrifice fly as a pinch hitter... leads AL pinch hitters in plate appearances (17), is tied for fourth in hits and tied for fifth in RBI.
- Is batting .250 (25-for-100) at home, .141 (12-for-85) on the road.
- More than half of his hits are for extra bases (19-of-37, 51.4%)...29 of his 59 (49.2%) career hits are extra base hits.
- Was recalled from the A's alternate site on April 6 and has started games at four different positions (34 in right field, nine in left field, three at designated hitter, two at first base).

Last Year: Went 0-for-5 with two strikeouts in seven games over three stints with Oakland...all five of his plate appearances came against right-handed pitchers...made just one start and went 0-for-2 as the A's designated hitter.
