ABOUT THE A'S: Are 4-3 since the All-Star Break and have won six of the last nine games...however, are 2-6-1 over the previous nine series and are 12-16 (.429) over the last 28 games...are 56-43 (.566) for the season, which is the fifth best record in the American League...are in second place in the AL West for the 29th consecutive day and trail first place Houston by 3½ games...are in second place in the AL Wild Card, 3½ games behind Tampa Bay and 3½ games ahead of Seattle...have spent 58 days alone in first place in the West, three days tied for first, 30 days in second, one day tied for second, three days in third, two days in fourth, three days tied for fourth and 10 days in fifth.

PITCHING: The A's have allowed one run or fewer in three of the last four games (6 er in 35.0 ip, 1.03 ERA)...now have a 3.12 ERA (152 er in 438.0 ip) over the last 49 games dating back to May 26, which is second lowest in the majors over that span (Brewers, 2.89)...have the third lowest OPS (.655)...overall, rank fourth in the American League in ERA (3.70) and fifth in opponents on-base percentage (.302), slugging percentage (.388) and OPS (.690)... have issued the fewest walks (262), are tied for second in fewest home runs (109), have the second fewest pitches per inning (15.9) and are third in shutouts (8).

STARTING PITCHING: A's starting pitchers have allowed one run or fewer in three of their last four games (4 er in 26.0 ip, 1.38 ERA) and now have a 2.78 ERA (46 er in 148.2 ip) and .214 (117-for-547) opponents batting average over the last 24

games dating back to June 23...are 38-33 with a 3.62 ERA (230 er in 572.0 ip) for the season...rank third in the American League in ERA and wins (38)...lead the majors in innings pitched (572.0) and are tied for second in complete games (3)...the A's have used just seven starting pitchers, which is second fewest in the majors to the Red Sox (6).

BULLPEN: The A's bullpen has allowed one earned run or fewer in 15 of the last 16 games and has a 1.71 ERA (9 er in 47.1 ip) and .176 (29-for-165) opponents batting average over that span...however, has five saves, eight blown saves and a 3-6 record over the last 28 contests...has 15 blown saves for the season, which is tied for fourth most in the American League, but has just 10 losses, which is the fewest in the majors...ranks fifth in the AL in ERA (3.84)... has the highest slugging percentage against first batters faced in the AL (.471) and the third highest batting average (.270).

OFFENSE: The A's are batting .246 (56-for-228) since the All-Star Break, which is sixth best in the American League, but have scored just 26 runs in seven games, which tied for second fewest...are batting .233 overall, which is fifth lowest in the AL...have the second lowest average with the bases loaded (.220) but rank eighth in batting with runners in scoring position (.258)...lead the AL in hit by pitches (56), rank second in sacrifice flies (32), third in fewest grounded into double plays (56), fourth in stolen base percentage (80.4%) and sacrifice hits (13) and fifth in walks (333)...A's pinch hitters lead the AL in hits (20), sacrifice flies (3) and plate appearances (96), are tied for first in RBI (15), and are third in extra base hits (4).

**DEFENSIVE DOINGS:** The A's have committed three errors in the last five games but have just 44 errors for the season, which is second fewest in the American League (Astros, 40)...A's pitchers have five pickoffs, which is tied for fourth most...A's outfielders have eight assists, which is tied with the Mariners, Angels and Tigers for the fewest.

AGAINST THE WEST: The A's are 3-1 in this stretch from July 19 to Aug. 8 where they are scheduled to play 13 of 17 games against American League West teams...the lone exceptions are a pair of two-game series against San Diego (July 27-28 and Aug. 3-4)...have won six of their last eight games against divison foes and have a 1.75 ERA (14 er in 72.0 ip) in those games...are 22-21 (.512) against AL West competition overall compared to 34-22 (.607) against all other teams.

HOME AND AWAY: The A's are 1-1 on this 10-game road trip to Seattle (1-1), San Diego (two games) and Los Angeles-AL (four games)...this is the second of three 10-game road trips this year and it is part of a stretch from July 6 to Aug. 19 where the A's are scheduled to play 26 of 36 games on the road...are 7-6 over the first 13 games of that stretch (4-4 on the road, 3-2 at home)... went 3-3 on the last road trip to Houston (1-2) and Texas (2-1) and are 26-19 (.578) on the road...have the fourth best road record in the American League and sixth best in the majors...the 45 road games are tied with the White Sox for the fewest in the AL...went 3-2 on the last homestand against Cleveland (1-2) and Los Angeles-AL (2-0) and are 30-24 (.556) at home.

HOME AND AWAY SPLITS: The A's are batting .247 (386-for-1563) and are averaging 4.69 runs per game on the road (211 runs in 45 games) compared to .221 with an average of 4.13 runs per game at home...have the fourth best road batting average and OPS (.742) in the American League...have the second lowest home batting average and third lowest OPS (.695)...have a 3.64 ERA (158 er in 391.0 ip) on the road, which is second lowest in the AL (Astros, 3.54)...have 62 home runs in 54 games at home, 61 in 45 on the road.

CLOSE CALLS: The A's are 15-16 (.484) in one-run games...lead the American League in one-run games (31), are tied for the most losses and are tied for third in wins...are 22-24 (.478) in games decided by two runs or fewer compared to 34-19 (.642) in games decided by three runs or more...are 4-3 in extra innings and the seven extra inning games are tied for third fewest in the AL...are 12-6 in games decided in the last at bat...have eight walk-off wins, which is second most in the majors to the Rockies (10)...now have 91 walkoff wins in the Bob Melvin era, which are the most in the majors over that

A's IN JULY: The A's are 8-9 (.471) in the month of July...posted a winning record in each of the first three months (16-11 in April, 15-14 in May, 17-9 in June)...have a streak of 10 consecutive months with a winning record (min. 10 games) and have just one losing month dating back to 2018 (11-15 in April of 2019)...have a 2.90 ERA (50 er in 155.0 ip), which is second lowest in the majors (Brewers, 2.30)...have not had an ERA under 3.00 in July since 2001 (2.81)...have scored just 63 runs, which is second fewest in the AL...have the fourth lowest batting average (.225) and fifth lowest OPS (.678).

THIS AND THAT: The A's are 24-14 (.632) in games in which the opponent starts a left-handed pitcher compared to 32-29 (.525) when they start a right-hander...the mark against lefties is second best in the American League (White Sox, 19-8/.704) and the 38 games are third most...are 34-7 (.829) when out-homering the opposition, 8-25 (.242) when they are out-homered...have used a different lineup in 35 of the last 36 games and have 95 different lineups over the first 99 contests.

THE INJURED LIST: The A's have used the injured list 18 times this year...used it just eight times last year, which was second fewest in the majors to Cleveland (4), and 18 times in 2019, which tied for second fewest...currently have three players on the IL (Fiers, Pinder, Rosenthal), which matches the A's fewest players on the IL since the third game of the season.

A's vs. MARINERS: The season series is tied, 4-4...are 3-2 in Seattle and 1-2 in Oakland...won the season series last year, 6-4...went 2-2 in Oakland and 4-2 in Seattle...were 10-9 in 2019 and have won back-to-back season series against the Mariners for the first time since winning three straight from 2004-06...are 20-17 against Seattle over the last three years but are 66-85 dating back to the start of the 2013 season...all-time, the A's are 370-309 against the Mariners...that includes 198-138 in Oakland, 171-168 in Seattle and 1-3 in Tokyo...are 95-104 at T-Mobile Park.

#### TODAY'S TIDBITS

Matt Olson is tied for first among Major League first basemen in home runs (26) and is third in RBI (65) and ranks second in the AL in go-ahead home runs (12) and go-ahead RBI (20)... Mark Canha is 7-for-20 (.350) with three hit by pitches in six starts since his return from the IL on Saturday.. Ramón Laureano is batting .333 (6-for-18) with three walks against the Mariners this season and has a .295 (43-for-146) career mark against Seattle... Chris Bassitt will appear in his 100th career game.

### THIS DATE IN ATHLETICS HISTORY

In 1990 Dave Henderson, Mark McGwire and Mike Gallego each homer in the sixth inning of the A's 5-3 win against California...it is the third time in 1990 that the A's hit three homers in one inning...in 1999 Jason Giambi hits a pair of three-run home runs in a game at Kansas City and has six RBI...he hit a grand slam against the Royals the night before...in 2018, the A's trail 10-2 after six innings at Texas but come back to win 13-10 in 10 innings...Jed Lowrie, Khris Davis, Stephen Piscotty and Mark Canha homer, giving the A's a Major League record tying three consecutive games with four or more home runs...in 2020 Matt Olson hits a walk-off grand slam in the 10th inning as the A's defeat Los Angeles 7-3 in the latest Opening Day in Athletics history...the game is the first in Major League history in which extra innings start with a runner on second base.

# TODAY'S STARTING PITCHER: Chris Bassitt (10-3, 3.31 ERA)

10-GAME WINNING STREAK SNAPPED: Took the loss in his last start on Sunday against Cleveland to snap his career-high 10-game winning streak...the streak tied for fourth longest in Oakland history and is tied for the longest in the majors this year (Hendricks, CHI)...posted a 3.04 ERA and .209 opponents batting average during the streak, which spanned 17 starts from April 12 to July 11.

AMONG THE LEADERS: Is tied for the American League lead in wins (10) and games started (20), ranks second in innings pitched (125.0), second in winning percentage (.769), fourth in opponents OPS (.631), opponents batting average (.218) and slugging percentage (.353), sixth in ERA (3.31), sixth in opponents on-base percentage (.278) and eighth in strikeouts (126)...has allowed 13 home runs and his average of 0.94 home runs per nine innings is sixth lowest...has hit 11 batters, which is the most in the AL and two short of the Oakland record of 13...he also hit 13 batters in 2019, which tied the record set by Barry Zito (2001, 2005 and 2006)...ranks fourth in the AL in fewest pitches per inning (15.0).

HOME AND AWAY: Is 6-0 with a 3.88 ERA (28 er in 65.0 ip) and .234 (57-for-244) opponents batting average in 11 starts on the road compared to 4-3 with a 2.70 ERA (18 er in 60.0 ip) and .200 (44-for-220) opponents average in nine starts at home...is tied for the American League lead in road wins and ranks sixth in home ERA...now has a seven-game winning streak on the road dating back to Sept. 12, 2020 and has a 3.68 ERA (29 er in 71.0 ip) over that stretch, which spans 12 starts...the road winning streak matches the longest by an A's pitcher over the last 31 years...the only longer road winning streaks in Oakland history are nine by Bob Welch (Sept. 21, 1989-June 30, 1990) and eight by Diego Segui (Aug. 29, 1970-Aug. 12, 1971)...has not lost on the road since Aug. 29, 2020 at Houston.

*OPPONENTS BATTING*: Has allowed a .194 (20-for-103) batting average with runners in scoring position, which ranks fifth in the American League...has allowed just two home runs in 241 at bats against right-handed hitters... has surrendered 11 of his 13 home runs this year and 29 of 40 over the last three years to lefties...has a .144 opponents average with two strikes, which is seventh lowest in the AL.

FIVE DAYS REST: Is scheduled to start on five days rest today...is 5-0 with a 3.21 ERA (20 er in 56.0 ip) in nine starts on exactly five days rest and now has a 10-game winning streak in those games dating back to July 19, 2019... has a 3.02 ERA (34 er in 101.1 ip) in 17 starts over that span...according to TruMedia, that matches the longest winning streak in starts on five days rest in Oakland history...the others are Mike Fiers (May 7-Aug. 27, 2019) and Mark Mulder (June 18, 2002-July 10, 2003)...has not lost when pitching on five days rest since July 6, 2019.

AMERICAN LEAGUE ALL-STAR: Was named to the American League All-Star Team for the first time on July 10 as a replacement...pitched the sixth inning in a 5-2 AL win (1.0 ip, 1 h, 1 r, 0 er, 2 bb, 1 so)...became the first A's starting pitcher to be named to the AL All-Star Team since Sonny Gray in 2015 and the first starter to pitch in the game since Scott Kazmir in 2014.

AT THE BREAK: Went into the All-Star Break with a 10-2 record and a 3.28 ERA in 19 starts...had 118 strikeouts in 118.0 innings...the 10 wins tied Cleveland's Aaron Civale for the most in the American League and he became the first A's pitcher with 10 wins at the break since Sonny Gray had 10 in 2015... the 118 strikeouts ranked seventh in the AL and fourth in Athletics history before the break...they were the most since Vida Blue had 120 in 1975...also led the AL in innings pitched (118.0), tied for second in winning percentage (.833), ranked fifth in opponents OPS (.628) and eighth in ERA.

THIS AND THAT: Is scheduled to make the 100th appearance of his career today...the A's are 14-6 (.700) in his starting assignments...has left with the lead in three of his seven no decisions only to have the bullpen blow the save (May 5 vs. Toronto, May 16 at Minnesota, June 19 at New York-AL)...has tossed at least seven innings in nine of his starts...has allowed two runs or fewer 14 times and six hits or fewer 17 times...has matched his career high in wins (10) and wild pitches (5).

THE LAST THREE YEARS: Is 25-10 (.714) with a 3.33 ERA (123 er in 332.0 ip) in 59 games (56 starts) over the last three years...based on a minium of 250 innings pitched, he ranks third in the American League in winning percentage over that span, fourth in ERA and fifth in opponents OPS (.666)...is tied for seventh in wins...the A's are 37-19 (.661) in his starting assignments over the last three years...was 4-14 (.222) with a 3.86 ERA in 40 games (30 starts) over his first four seasons.

**2021 HIGHLIGHTS:** Was the A's Opening Day starting pitcher and took the loss in an 8-1 decision to Houston on April 1 in Oakland...became the A's 14th different Opening Day starting pitcher over the last 16 years...allowed exactly two runs in six consecutive starts from April 12 to May 11 to become the second pitcher in Athletic history to allow exactly two runs in six consecu-

tive games (Bob Davis, Aug. 8-26, 1960)...went 3-0 with a 2.92 ERA over that stretch which ran from April 12 to May 11...struck out a season-high 10 batters in a 3-2 win at Boston on May 11...it was his third career game of 10 or more strikeouts...did not walk a batter, the second time he has fanned 10 or more without issuing a free pass...is one of nine pitchers in Oakland history with two such games...tossed his first career complete game and shutout May 27 against Los Angeles (AL), a two-hitter in the A's 5-0 win...it came in his 77th career start, his 72nd with the A's...the 71 consecutive starts without a complete games is the second longest streak in Athletics history (113, Barry Zito, Aug. 22, 2003-Sept. 28, 2006)...finished May with a 3-0 record, a 2.52 ERA and .175 opponents batting average in five starts...then went 4-0 with a 2.70 ERA in six starts in June...it was the first time in his career he won four games in a month...was one of four American League pitchers to win four games in June and his ERA tied for fifth...allowed two runs or fewer in five consecutive starts from June 8 to 30 and was 4-0 with a 1.93 ERA and .197 opponents batting average over that span.

LAST START: He had his 10-game winning streak snapped in the A's 4-2 loss to Cleveland last Sunday in Oakland...allowed a first pitch home run to Zimmer to start the game but the A's tied the game with a run in the second...yielded a RBI single to Zimmer in the fifth but Oakland came back with a run in the bottom of the sixth to make the score 2-2...then allowed a solo home run to Johnson in the seventh inning for the loss.

#### TOMORROW'S PROBABLE STARTING PITCHER
