ABOUT THE A'S: Are 4-4 since the All-Star Break and have won six of the last 10 games...however, are 2-6-1 over the previous nine series and are 12-17 (.414) over the last 29 games...are 56-44 (.560) for the season, which is the fifth best record in the American League...are in second place in the AL West for the 30th consecutive day and trail first place Houston by 4½ games...are in second place in the AL Wild Card, 4½ games behind Tampa Bay and Boston and 2½ games ahead of Seattle...have spent 58 days alone in first place in the West, three days tied for first, 31 days in second, one day tied for second, three days in third, two days in fourth, three days tied for fourth and 10 days in fifth.

PITCHING: The A's have allowed four or more runs in two straight games after holding opponents to one run or fewer in their previous three (11 er in 43.2 ip, 2.27 ERA)...now have a 3.16 ERA (157 er in 446.2 ip) over the last 50 games dating back to May 26, which is second lowest in the majors over that span (Brewers, 2.85)...have the third lowest OPS (.657)...overall, rank fourth in the American League in ERA (3.71) and fifth in opponents on-base percentage (.302), slugging percentage (.388) and OPS (.690)...have issued the fewest walks (267), are tied for second in fewest home runs (111), have the second fewest pitches per inning (15.9) and are third in shutouts (8).

STARTING PITCHING: A's starting pitchers have allowed one run or fewer in three of their last five games (8 er in 31.0 ip, 2.32 ERA) and now have a 2.93 ERA (50 er in 153.2 ip) and .215 (122-for-567) opponents batting average over the last 25 games dating back to June 23...are 38-33 with a 3.65 ERA (234 er in 577.0 ip) for the season...rank third in the American League in ERA and wins (38)...lead the majors in innings pitched (577.0) and are tied for second in complete games (3)...the A's have used just seven starting pitchers, which is second fewest in the majors to the Red Sox (6).

BULLPEN: The A's bullpen has allowed one earned run or fewer in 16 of the last 17 games and has a 1.76 ERA (10 er in 51.0 ip) and .175 (31-for-177) opponents batting average over that span...however, has five saves, eight blown saves and a 3-7 record over the last 29 contests...has 15 blown saves for the season, which is tied for fourth most in the American League, but has just 11 losses, which is the fewest in the majors...ranks fifth in the AL in ERA (3.82)...has the highest slugging percentage against first batters faced in the AL (.470) and the third highest batting average (.271).

OFFENSE: The A's are batting .238 (62-for-261) since the All-Star Break, which is seventh best in the American League...have scored just 30 runs in eight games, which is third fewest...are batting .233 overall, which is fourth lowest in the AL...have the second lowest average with the bases loaded (.220) but rank eighth in batting with runners in scoring position (.258)...lead the AL in hit by pitches (56), rank second in sacrifice flies (32), third in fewest grounded into double plays (57), fourth in stolen base percentage (80.4%) and sacrifice hits (13) and fifth in walks (335)...A's pinch hitters lead the AL in hits (20), sacrifice flies (3) and plate appearances (96), are tied for first in RBI (15), and are tied for third in extra base hits (4).

DEFENSIVE DOINGS: The A's have committed three errors in the last six games but have just 44 errors for the season, which is second fewest in the American League (Astros, 40)...A's pitchers have five pickoffs, which is tied for fourth most...A's outfielders have eight assists, which is tied with the Mariners, Angels and Tigers for the fewest.

AGAINST THE WEST: The A's are 3-2 in this stretch from July 19 to Aug. 8 where they are scheduled to play 13 of 17 games against American League West teams...the lone exceptions are a pair of two-game series against San Diego (July 27-28 and Aug. 3-4)...have won six of their last nine games against division foes and have a 2.12 ERA (19 er in 80.2 ip) in those games...are 22-22 (.500) against AL West competition overall compared to 34-22 (.607) against all other teams.

HOME AND AWAY: The A's are 1-2 on this 10-game road trip to Seattle (1-2), San Diego (two games) and Los Angeles-AL (four games)...this is the second of three 10-game road trips this year and it is part of a stretch from July 6 to Aug. 19 where the A's are scheduled to play 26 of 36 games on the road...are

7-7 over the first 14 games of that stretch (4-5 on the road, 3-2 at home)...went 3-3 on the last road trip to Houston (1-2) and Texas (2-1) and are 26-20 (.565) on the road...have the fourth best road record in the American League and sixth best in the majors...the 45 road games are tied with the White Sox and Astros for the fewest in the AL...went 3-2 on the last homestand against Cleveland (1-2) and Los Angeles-AL (2-0) and are 30-24 (.556) at home.

HOME AND AWAY SPLITS: The A's are batting .246 (392-for-1596) and are averaging 4.67 runs per game on the road (215 runs in 46 games) compared to .221 with an average of 4.13 runs per game at home...have the fifth best road batting average and OPS (.737) in the American League...have the second lowest home batting average and third lowest OPS (.695)...have a 3.67 ERA (163 er in 399.2 ip) on the road, which is second lowest in the AL (Astros, 3.54)...have 62 home runs in 54 games at home, 62 in 46 on the road.

CLOSE CALLS: The A's are 15-17 (.469) in one-run games...lead the American League in one-run games (32), have the most losses and are tied for fifth in wins...are 22-24 (.478) in games decided by two runs or fewer compared to 34-19 (.642) in games decided by three runs or more...are 4-3 in extra innings and the seven extra inning games are tied for third fewest in the AL...are 12-7 in games decided in the last at bat...have eight walk-off wins, which is tied with the Mariners for second most in the majors to the Rockies (10)...now have 91 walk-off wins in the Bob Melvin era, which are the most in the majors over that span.

A'S IN JULY: The A's are 8-10 (.444) in the month of July...posted a winning record in each of the first three months (16-11 in April, 15-14 in May, 17-9 in June)...have a streak of 10 consecutive months with a winning record (min. 10 games) and have just one losing month dating back to 2018 (11-15 in April of 2019)...have a 3.02 ERA (55 er in 163.2 ip), which is second lowest in the majors (Brewers, 2.22)...have not had an ERA under 3.00 in July since 2001 (2.81)...have scored just 67 runs, which is second fewest in the AL...have the fourth lowest batting average (.222) and third lowest OPS (.673).

THIS AND THAT: The A's are 24-14 (.632) in games in which the opponent starts a left-handed pitcher compared to 32-30 (.516) when they start a right-hander...the mark against lefties is second best in the American League (White Sox, 19-8/.704) and the 38 games are third most...are 34-7 (.829) when out-homering the opposition, 8-26 (.235) when they are out-homered...have used a different lineup in 35 of the last 36 games and have 96 different lineups over the first 100 contests.

THE INJURED LIST: The A's have used the injured list 18 times this year...used it just eight times last year, which was second fewest in the majors to Cleveland (4), and 18 times in 2019, which tied for second fewest...currently have three players on the IL (Fiers, Pinder, Rosenthal), which matches the A's fewest players on the IL since the third game of the season.

A'S vs. MARINERS: The A's trail in the season series, 4-5...are 3-3 in Seattle and 1-2 in Oakland...won the season series last year, 6-4...went 2-2 in Oakland and 4-2 in Seattle...were 10-9 in 2019 and have won back-to-back season series against the Mariners for the first time since winning three straight from 2004-06...are 20-18 against Seattle over the last three years but are 66-86 dating back to the start of the 2013 season...all-time, the A's are 370-310 against the Mariners...that includes 198-138 in Oakland, 171-169 in Seattle and 1-3 in Tokyo...are 95-105 at T-Mobile Park.

TODAY'S TIDBITS

Mark Canha has reached base safely in each of his last 21 games against Seattle dating back to Sept. 28, 2019 and is batting .317 with a .511 on-base percentage during the streak...**Tony Kemp** is 10-for-24 (.417) with two doubles, a home run, two walks, and eight RBI against Seattle this season...is a career .304 (34-for-112) hitter against the Mariners, including a .344 (21-for-61) mark at T-Mobile Park...**Sergio Romo** has not allowed a run in his last 11 games (11.2 ip, 2 h, 1 bb, 14 so) and opponents are 2-for-35 (.057) over that span.

THIS DATE IN ATHLETICS HISTORY

In 1930 the A's have two triple steals in the same game...Al Simmons, Bing Miller and Dib Williams turn the trick in the first inning and Mickey Cochrane, Simmons and Jimmie Foxx steal together in the fourth inning...in 1936 Frankie Hayes ties a major league record with four doubles in a game against Cleveland...in 1996 Mark McGwire hits a 488 foot home run into the fifth deck at SkyDome...at the time it was the longest home run in the majors since all home runs have been measured starting in 1992...in 2001 the A's acquire Jermaine Dye from Kansas City in a three-team trade.

TODAY'S STARTING PITCHER: Cole Irvin (7-8, 3.42 ERA)

FOR STARTERS: Is 4-1 with a 2.54 ERA (14 er in 49.2 ip) in eight starts in June and July after going 3-7 with a 4.12 ERA in 11 starts in April and May...ranks fourth in the American League in fewest home runs per nine innings (0.80), tied for fourth in hit by pitches (8), eighth in ERA (3.42), opponents slugging percentage (.378) and innings pitched (113.0) and is ninth in OPS (.680) is averaging 14.3 pitches per inning, which is the fewest in the majors...his eight losses are tied for fifth most in the AL.

DON'T WALK: Has walked two batters or fewer in each of his 19 starts, including 10 starts with one walk and four starts with no walks...has issued just 20 free passes in 113.0 innings and his average of 1.59 walks per nine innings is third lowest in the majors (Eflin, PHI 1.36; Burnes, MIL 1.59)...has walked one batter or fewer in 16 of his 22 career starts and has walked just 34 batters in 158.1 career innings (1.93 per nine innings).

HOME AND AWAY: Is 4-3 with a 2.85 ERA (15 er in 47.1 ip) in eight starts on the road compared to 3-5 with a 3.84 ERA (28 er in 65.2 ip) in 11 starts at home...has the fifth lowest road ERA in the American League but is tied for fourth in the AL in home losses...has allowed seven of his 10 home runs at home.

DAYS REST: Is scheduled to start on five days rest today...is 6-1 with a 1.88 ERA (13 er in 62.0 ip) in 10 starts on five days rest or more compared to 1-6 with a 5.01 ERA (26 er in 46.2 ip) in eight starts on four days rest...eight of the 10 home runs he has allowed have come on four days rest.

AGAINST THE WEST: Is 2-6 with a 5.81 ERA (31 er in 48.0 ip) and .313 (62-for-198) opponents batting average in nine starts against American League West competition, 5-2 with a 1.66 ERA (12 er in 65.0 ip) and .213 (51-for-239) opponents average in 10 starts against everyone else.

THIS AND THAT: Eight of the 10 home runs he has allowed have been solo shots...opponents are hitting .307 (27-for-88) with runners in scoring position, which is fourth highest in the AL...has a .242 (78-for-322) opponents batting average the first two times through the order, a .304 (35-for-115) mark after that...is 7-1 in 10 starts with more than two runs of support, 0-7 in nine starts with support of two runs or fewer...has allowed one run or fewer in seven of his 18 starts...the A's are 10-9 (.526) in his starting assignments.

2021 HIGHLIGHTS: Was on the A's Opening Day roster and lost each of his first two starts, allowing four runs in each contest for a 7.45 ERA...tossed 4.1 innings in his first start on April 3 against Houston, which was the shortest start of his career...also faced the Astros in his second start on April 8 but did not pitch again until April 17 against Detroit when he combined with Wendelken, Guerra and Weems on a five-hit shutout in a 7-0 win...it was his first win since May 17, 2019 against Colorado and it snapped a career-high four-game losing streak...that began a four-start stretch where he went 3-1 with a 1.42 ERA and .232 opponents batting average through May 4...tossed 6.0 scoreless innings in his start against the Tigers and then blanked the Orioles over the first five innings on April 23 for a career-high 11.0 inning scoreless streak...lost on April 28 at Tampa Bay but then picked up his third win on May 4 against Toronto...had career highs in innings pitched (8.0), strikeouts (9) and pitches (102) against the Blue Jays...then went 0-4 with a 5.40 ERA and .284 opponents batting average over his next five starts from May 9 to 30...the losing streak matched his career high (also May 22, 2019-April 8, 2021)...left with a 4-1 lead on May 15 at Minnesota but the pen allowed four runs in the eighth inning for the blown save...it was the first of three times the pen blew a save in one of his starts (June 11 vs. Kansas City, July 9 at Texas)...allowed a season-high five runs in an 8-4 loss to Houston on May 20...allowed a career-high 10 hits in 4.2 innings of work in a 4-3 loss to Seattle on May 25...went 1-4 with a 4.46 ERA in six starts in May...tied for second in the American League in losses in May...then compiled a 3-0 record and a 2.64 ERA in five starts in the month of June...the ERA was fourth lowest in the American League and the three-game winning streak was the longest of his career...allowed a run in the first inning on June 5 at Colorado and did not allow another run until the seventh inning of his next start on June 11 against Kansas City for a career-high tying 11.0-inning scoreless streak...tossed a career-high tying 8.0 innings and did not allow a run in a 6-2 win at San Francisco on June 27...did not allow a run over the first three innings of his next start on July 3 against Boston for another 11.0-inning scoreless streak...tied an Oakland record with three hit batters (13th time, last: Bassitt, April 29, 2021 at Tampa Bay) in a 3-2 loss at Texas on July 9.

LAST START: He was the winning pitcher in the A's 4-1 win over Los Angeles (AL) last Monday in Oakland...tossed 7.0 scoreless innings and allowed seven hits while walking one...retired the side in order just once...Ohtani shut out the A's over the first six innings but Oakland scored three times off the Angels bullpen in the seventh and Irvin was relieved by Trivino after allowing a leadoff single to Eaton in the eighth.

IRVIN vs. SEATTLE: Was the losing pitcher in his only career appearance, a start in the A's 4-3 loss in Oakland earlier this year on May 25...allowed a career-high 10 hits in 4.2 innings of work...yielded two runs in the first inning on RBI singles by France and Crawford...the A's tied the game with two runs in the second but he allowed two runs in the third on a RBI double by Murphy and a RBI single by Kelenic...was relieved by Smith with runners on first and second and two outs in the fifth and the A's trailing 4-2.

2020 RECAP: Had two stints with Philadelphia and was 0-1 with a 17.18 ERA in three relief appearances...opponents went 11-for-21 (.524) but he walked just one and struck out four in 3.2 innings...allowed a .438 (7-for-16) average against right-handed hitters compared to .800 (4-for-5) against left-handers...was 2-0 with a 4.50 ERA in four spring training appearances...was optioned to Lehigh Valley March 26 but was recalled on July 23 and was on the Phillies Opening Day roster...made his 2020 debut on July 26 against Miami and allowed four runs on five hits in an inning of relief and was the losing pitcher in an 11-6 decision...tossed a scoreless inning of relief Aug. 9 against Atlanta but was optioned to Philadelphia's alternate site on Aug. 9...was recalled for a second time Aug. 20, pitched the next day at Atlanta (1.2 ip, 4 h, 3 r, 3 er, 1 bb, 3 so) and was optioned Aug. 22...did not pitch the remainder of the season.

TUESDAY'S PROBABLE STARTING PITCHER
RHP James Kaprielian (5-3, 2.65 ERA): Was recalled from Triple-A Las Vegas May 12 and is scheduled to make his 13th start of the season and his career...has allowed two runs or fewer in nine of his 12 starts and has a 2.65 ERA, which ranks fourth in the American League among pitchers with 60 or more innings pitched...is tied for fifth among AL rookies in wins (5), ranks sixth in strikeouts (73) and innings pitched (68.0) and tied for sixth in games started (12)...was the winning pitcher in his last start, a 6-0 A's win over Los Angeles (AL) on Tuesday in Oakland (6.0 ip, 5 h, 2 bb, 7 so)...has never faced San Diego in his career...made one interleague appearance this year, a start and loss in the A's 3-1 loss at Colorado on June 6 (5.0 ip, 5 h, 2 r, 2 er, 3 bb, 6 so)...had a sacrifice hit and a strikeout in two plate appearances that day, his first two as a professional.
