ABOUT THE A'S: Lost each of the final three games in Seattle and are now 2-7-1 over the last 10 series...are 4-5 since the All-Star Break and 12-18 (.400) over the last 30 games...however, are 56-45 (.554) for the season, which is the fifth best record in the American League...are in second place in the AL West for the 32nd consecutive day and trail first place Houston by five games...that is ½-game short of the season high of 5½ (April 8, July 7 and July 25)...are in second place in the AL Wild Card, 4½ games behind Tampa Bay and one game ahead of the third place team, Seattle...have spent 58 days alone in first place in the West, three days tied for first, 33 days in second, one day tied for second, three days in third, two days in fourth, three days tied for fourth and 10 days in fifth.

INTERLEAGUE PLAY: The A's are 8-5 (.615) in interleague play, which is the eighth best record in the majors...have four games remaining with San Diego (today and tomorrow plus Aug. 3-4 in Oakland) and three home games with San Francisco (Aug. 20-22)...went 10-10 (.500) in interleague play last year and finished with a .500 record or better against the National League for the third consecutive season and 17th time in 24 years of interleague play...are 246-211 (.538) all-time in interleague games, which is fourth best in Major League history.

PITCHERS HITTING: A's pitchers are 3-for-16 (.188) with a run, double, RBI, nine strikeouts and three sacrifice hits...are now batting .097 (43-for-445) with five doubles, 14 RBI, 14 walks and 207 strikeouts since interleague play began in 1997...the batting average is second lowest in the majors over that span (New York-AL, .078)...the last home run by an A's pitcher in the regular season was by Blue Moon Odom on Sept. 4, 1972 against California (Ken Holtzman homered in Game 4 of the 1974 World Series)...that is the longest active pitcher homerless drought by any team...Odom also had the last triple on Aug. 22, 1971 against Boston.

IN THE PINCH: A's pinch hitters are 3-for-5 (.600) with a walk and a home run on the road trip...have 22 pinch hits overall, which is the most in the American League and more than one National League team (Cardinals, 21)...also lead the AL in RBI (16), sacrifice flies (3) and plate appearances (98), are tied for the lead in home runs (3) and tied for second in extra base hits (5).

GAME #162: Today will be the A's 162nd game over the last two years...are 92-69 (.571) over that span, which is the third best record in the American League and sixth best in the majors...also rank third in the AL in ERA (3.74) and opponents OPS (.691)...are hitting .230 with 197 home runs and 715 runs scored (4.44 runs per game)...have been hit by a pitch an AL leading 96 times...individually, Matt Olson is hitting .252 with 41 home runs and 108 RBI in 155 games...is tied for second in the AL in home runs (Ohtani, 42) and ranks fourth in RBI...Chris Bassitt is 15-5 with a 3.08 ERA in 32 starts...is tied for third in the AL in wins and ranks fourth in ERA.

ONE-RUN GAMES AND OTHER CLOSE CALLS: Each of the A's final three games in Seattle were one-run losses...have lost each of their last four one-run games, 11 of the last 14 and are 15-18 (.455) overall...lead the American League in one-run games (33) and losses...are 22-26 (.458) in games decided by two runs or fewer compared to 34-19 (.642) in games decided by three runs or more...are 4-3 in extra innings and the seven extra inning games are tied for third fewest in the AL...are 12-7 in games decided in the last at bat...have eight walk-off wins, which is tied with the Mariners for the most in the AL...now have 91 walk-off wins in the Bob Melvin era, which are the most in the majors over that span.

PITCHING: The A's have a 3.19 ERA (161 er in 454.2 ip) over the last 51 games dating back to May 26, which is second lowest in the majors over that span (Brewers, 2.86)...have the third lowest opponents OPS (.655)...overall, rank fourth in the American League in ERA (3.72) and fifth in opponents on-base percentage (.302), slugging percentage (.387) and OPS (.689)...are tied for the fewest walks (271), rank second in fewest pitches per inning (15.9) tied for second in fewest home runs (111) and third in shutouts (8).

STARTING PITCHING: A's starting pitchers have allowed at least three runs in each of the last three games (11 er in 15.0 ip, 6.60 ERA), which marks the first time they have allowed at least three runs since May 29-June 1 when they did it in four straight games...are 38-34 with a 3.69 ERA (238 er in 581.0 ip) for the season...rank third in the American League in ERA and wins and fifth in opponents OPS (.694)...lead the majors in innings pitched (581.0) and are tied for second in complete games (3)...the A's have used just seven starting pitchers, which is second fewest in the majors to the Red Sox (6)...have used the same five starting pitchers dating back to May 7.

BULLPEN: The A's bullpen has allowed one earned run or fewer in each of the last 14 games and has a 1.35 ERA (6 er in 40.0 ip) and .167 (23-for-138) opponents batting average over that span...however, is 2-2 with four saves

and four blown saves...has converted 25-of-40 (62.5%) save opportunities for the season, which is the fifth best percentage in the American League...has 11 losses, which is the fewest in the majors...ranks fourth in the AL in opponents OPS (.681) and fifth in ERA (3.78)...has the second highest slugging percentage against first batters faced in the AL (.463) and the third highest batting average (.267).

OFFENSE: The A's are batting .215 (174-for-810) with 88 runs scored over the last 24 games dating back to June 25 (3.67 runs per game)...have a .220 (40-for-182) average with runners in scoring position over that span...are hitting .233 overall, which is fourth lowest in the American League, but rank eighth in batting with RISP (.257)...lead the AL in hit by pitches (57), are tied for second in sacrifice flies (32), rank third in fewest grounded into double plays (57) and stolen base percentage (80.8%), fourth in sacrifice hits (13) and fifth in walks (337).

DEFENSIVE DOINGS: The A's did not commit an error in the four-game series at Seattle and have just 44 errors for the season, which is second fewest in the American League (Astros, 41)...A's pitchers have five pickoffs, which is tied for fourth most...A's outfielders have eight assists, which is tied with the Angels for the fewest.

HOME AND AWAY: The A's are 1-3 on this 10-game road trip to Seattle (1-3), San Diego (two games) and Los Angeles-AL (four games)...this is the second of three 10-game road trips this year and it is part of a stretch from July 6 to Aug. 19 where the A's are scheduled to play 26 of 36 games on the road...are 7-8 over the first 15 games of that stretch (4-6 on the road, 3-2 at home)...are 26-21 (.553) on the road compared to 30-24 (.556) at home...went 3-2 on the last homestand against Cleveland (1-2) and Los Angeles-AL (2-0).

A'S IN JULY: The A's are 8-11 (.421) in the month of July with five games remaining...need to win each of those games to finish with a winning record...have a streak of 10 consecutive months with a winning record (min. 10 games) dating back to May of 2019...last had a losing record in April of 2019 when they went 11-15...have a 3.09 ERA (59 er in 171.2 ip), which is second lowest in the majors (Brewers, 2.26)...also have the second lowest opponents OPS (.634) to the Brewers (.591)...rank second to last in the American League in runs (70) and OPS (.675) to the Rangers (59, .605).

THIS AND THAT: The A's are 11-2 (.846) following a day off, which is the best record in the majors...only the Padres, with 12, have fewer games...are 24-15 (.615) in games in which the opponent starts a left-handed pitcher compared to 32-30 (.516) when they start a right-hander...the mark against lefties is second best in the American League (White Sox, 19-9/.679) and the 39 games are third most...are 34-8 (.810) when out-homering the opposition, 8-25 (.242) when they are out-homered...have used a different lineup in each of the last 38 games and have 98 different lineups over the first 101 contests.

A'S vs. PADRES: The A's lost two of three to San Diego last year in Oakland for their first season series loss to the Padres since 2006 when they also lost two of three...are 12-5 against San Diego dating back to 2009 and have a four-game winning streak at Petco Park...have not lost here since June 21, 2009...lead the all-time series 24-12 (.667), which matches the A's best record against any team (12-6, .667 vs. Pirates)...are 12-6 in Oakland and 12-6 in San Diego...including 7-3 at Petco Park.

TODAY'S TIDBITS

Matt Olson ranks third in the American League in OPS (.962) and slugging percentage (.588), tied for third in home runs (27), fifth in extra base hits (50), eighth in RBI (66), ninth in on-base percentage (.373), tied for ninth in runs (65) and tied for 10th in doubles (23)...**Sergio Romo** has not allowed a run in his last 11 games (11.2 ip, 2 h, 2 bb, 13 so) and opponents are 2-for-35 (.057) over that span...has also not allowed a run in 21 of his last 23 games for a 0.82 ERA (22.0 ip, 10 h, 2 r, 2 er, 2 bb, 25 so, 1 hr) and .137 (10-for-73) opponents batting average...**Lou Trivino** has converted each of his last nine save opportunities dating back to June 5 and has a 1.23 ERA (3 er in 22.0 ip) and .197 (15-for-76) opponents batting average in 21 games over that span.

THIS DATE IN ATHLETICS HISTORY

In **1956** Hector Lopez and Vic Power have five hits each but the A's lose 10-9 to New York in 14 innings...in **1996** Geronimo Berroa and Matt Stairs homer in the A's 6-4 loss at Toronto...it is the 23rd consecutive game in which the A's hit a homer, a club record which ended the following day...in **2008** Brad Ziegler tosses 2.0 scoreless innings to extend his career opening scoreless streak to a Major League record 27.0 innings, breaking the previous mark of 25 set by George McQuillian of the 1907 Philadelphia Phillies...the streak would reach 39.0 innings before he allowed his first run.

TODAY'S STARTING PITCHER: James Kaprielian (5-3, 2.65 ERA)

FOR STARTERS: Was recalled from Triple-A Las Vegas May 12 and is scheduled to make his 13th start of the season and his career...has allowed two runs or fewer in nine of his 12 starts and has a 2.65 ERA, which ranks fourth in the American League among pitchers with 60 or more innings pitched...using the same minimum, he ranks eighth in opponents batting average (.202)...has left with the lead in three of his four no decisions only to have the bullpen blow the save.

ROOKIE LEADERS: Is tied for fifth among American League rookies in wins (5), ranks sixth in innings pitched (68.0), seventh in strikeouts (73) and tied for seventh in games started (12)...based on a minimum of 0.5 innings per team game, his 2.65 ERA is second lowest in the majors among rookies (Rogers, MIA 2.37) as is his .202 opponents batting average (McKenzie, CLE .196).

SIX HITS OR FEWER: Has allowed six hits or fewer in each of his 12 starts and has not allowed more than six hits in 14 career appearances...his shortest career outing is 1.2 innings and his career-opening streak of 14 consecutive games with six hits or fewer and 1.2 innings pitched or more is the longest in Athletics history.

OPPONENTS BATTING: His opponents batting average breaks down to .173 (23-for-133) with a .519 OPS against right-handed hitters compared to .235 (27-for-115) with an .809 OPS against left-handers...has issued 19 of his 26 walks to lefties...has allowed a .136 (6-for-44) batting average with runners in scoring position and opponents are 0-for-9 with the bases loaded...eight of the 10 home runs he has surrendered have been solo shots...has a .134 (13-for-97) opponents average the first time through the lineup, .298 (28-for-94) the second time and .158 (9-for-57) after that...has allowed four of his 10 home runs to the opponents clean-up hitter but has held the five hitter to a .071 (2-for-28) batting average...has not allowed a run in the second inning (12.0 ip).

INTERLEAGUE PLAY: Has made one interleague appearance this year, a start and loss in the A's 3-1 loss at Colorado on June 6 (5.0 ip, 5 h, 2 r, 2 er, 3 bb, 6 so)...had one appearance in relief last year is 0-1 with a 3.86 ERA (3 er in 7.0 ip) in two career interleague appearances.

WITH THE BAT: Batted for the first time as a professional or college player on June 6 at Colorado...had a strikeout and a sacrifice hit in two plate appearances.

HOME AND AWAY: Is 2-1 with a 4.00 ERA (16 er in 36.0 ip) and .227 (30-for-132) opponents batting average in seven starts on the road compared to 3-2 with a 1.13 ERA (4 er in 32.0 ip) and .172 (20-for-116) opponents average in five starts at home...has yielded eight of his 10 home runs on the road for a .792 OPS...has a .499 opponents OPS in Oakland.

2021 HIGHLIGHTS: Began the year at Triple-A Las Vegas and went 0-1 with a 3.86 ERA in one start...was the Aviators Opening Day starter on May 6 at Las Vegas and was the losing pitcher in an 8-1 loss to Sacramento (4.2 ip, 8 h, 2 r, 2 er, 1 bb, 5 so, 0 hr, 76 pitches)...was recalled by Oakland on May 12 and made his first Major League start that day at Boston...allowed a run on four hits in 5.0 innings to earn his first ML win in the A's 4-1 victory over the Red Sox...struck out nine batters in 5.2 innings in his second start on May 21 at Los Angeles (AL) but had a no decision in an 8-4 A's win...left with a 3-2 lead and two outs in the bottom of the sixth but Petit allowed a run for the blown save...it was the first of three starts in which he left with the lead only to have the bullpen blow the save (June 23 at Texas and July 10 at Texas)...tossed 7.0 scoreless innings May 26 against Seattle for his second win...that matched his longest outing as a professional...also tossed 7.0 innings for Single-A Tampa at Charlotte on April 16, 2016, his second professional appearance...logged a season-low 3.2 innings May 31 at Seattle but had a no decision in the A's 6-5, 10-inning loss...allowed a career-high four runs...was charged with the first loss of his career when he allowed two runs in 5.0 innings on June 6 at Colorado, a 3-1 A's loss...pitched 6.0 scoreless innings and allowed just two hits on June 12 to defeat Kansas City 11-2...walked a career-high four...allowed a career-high six hits and tossed 105 pitches, which were his most as a professional, in a 5-4 loss to Texas on June 29...struck out a career-high 10 batters in a career-high tying 7.0 innings on July 4 against Boston but was the losing pitcher in the A's 1-0 loss...it was the first 10-strikeout game by an A's rookie since Chris Bassitt on Aug. 9, 2015 against Houston (also 10)...issued a career-high tying four walks in 5.0 innings in a no decision at Texas on July 10.

LAST START: He combined with Romo, Moll and Guerra on a seven-hit shut-out in the A's 6-0 win over Los Angeles (AL) a week ago today in Oakland...tossed six of the innings and allowed five of the hits...now has a career-high tying 10.0 inning scoreless streak...retired the side in order in just one inning, the fifth...had runners in scoring position in three of his six innings but the Angels went 0-for-6 with RISP against him.

2020 RECAP: Made his Major League debut and had two relief appearances over five stints with Oakland...compiled a 7.36 ERA and .267 opponents batting average...allowed two home runs in 3.2 innings, walked two and struck out four...was recalled for the first time Aug. 4 but did not pitch before he was optioned back to the A's alternate site on Aug. 6...joined the club a second time Aug. 16 and made his ML debut that day at San Francisco (2.0 ip, 1 h, 1 r, 1 er, 1 bb, 1 so)...relieved Fiers to start the seventh inning with the A's leading 13-2 and allowed a home run to the first batter he faced (Crawford)...walked the next batter (Dubon) before retiring each of the final six batters he faced...struck out Solano to end the seventh inning for his first strikeout...was optioned on Aug. 19...was recalled as the 29th man for doubleheaders on Sept. 8 and Sept. 14 but did not pitch...recalled for his fifth stint on Sept. 24 and made one appearance in the second game of the Sept. 26 doubleheader against Seattle (1.2 ip, 3 h, 2 r, 2 er, 1 bb, 3 so)...inherited a bases loaded situation in the third inning with the A's trailing 4-1 and allowed all three runs to score...was on the Taxi Squad for the postseason...was rated as the A's number 10 prospect by *Baseball America* following the season.

CAREER NOTES: Made his Major League debut with Oakland in 2020 after pitching in just 27 games over his first five professional seasons due to elbow problems...compiled a 7.36 ERA and .267 opponents batting average in two relief appearances with the A's...is 6-6 with a 3.00 ERA (34 er in 102.0 ip) in 28 games, including 23 starts, as a minor leaguer...has 116 strikeouts in 102.0 innings (10.24 per nine innings)...was the New York Yankees first round draft pick in 2015 but pitched in just eight games over his first four years as a professional...missed most of 2016 with an elbow injury and then missed the entire 2017 and 2018 seasons following April 18, 2017 "Tommy John" surgery...was traded to the A's at the 2017 trading deadline in the Sonny Gray deal and is the last remaining player from that deal that also netted the A's Dustin Fowler and Jorge Mateo...pitched for Scottsdale in the Arizona Fall League in 2016...was rated by *Baseball America* as the Yankees No. 4 prospect following the 2015 season and No. 5 following 2016...was the A's No. 8 prospect after the 2017 season and No. 10 following 2020.

LHP Sean Manaea (7-6, 3.16 ERA): Is 4-4 with a 2.26 ERA and .214 opponents batting average over his last 11 starts dating back to May 23...ranks sixth in the American League in ERA (3.16) and eighth in opponents OPS (.673), strikeouts (128) and innings pitched (116.2)...has allowed a .175 batting average against left-handed hitters compared to .268 against right-handers...the mark against lefties is third lowest in the American League...struck out a career-high 13 batters in a 4-1 win in his last start on Thursday at Seattle (7.0 ip, 3 h, 1 r, 1 er, 3 bb)...is 1-0 with a 2.25 ERA (12.0 ip, 8 h, 3 r, 3 er, 3 bb, 6 so, 1 hr) in two career starts against San Diego...is 1-1 with a 0.75 ERA in two interleague starts this year and is 3-2 with a 2.38 ERA over his last six interleague starts dating back to Aug. 20, 2020...went 2-for-2 with a double on June 25 at San Francisco...now has three hits in his last three at bats after starting his career 0-for-9.

- Has not allowed a run in 39 of his 43 appearances and ranks 12th among ML relievers in ERA (2.06).
