OAKLAND ATHLETICS (56-46) VS. SAN DIEGO PADRES (59-44)

WEDNESDAY, JULY 28, 2021 — PETCO PARK — 1:10 PDT

ABOUT THE A'S: Lost each of the final three games in Seattle and are now 2-7-1 over the last 10 series...are 4-6 since the All-Star Break and 12-19 (.387) over the last 31 games...however, are 56-46 (.549) for the season, which is the fifth best record in the American League...are in second place in the AL West for the 33rd consecutive day and trail first place Houston by six games, a new season high)...are in second place in the AL Wild Card, 4½ games behind Tampa Bay and one game ahead of the third place team, Seattle...have spent 58 days alone in first place in the West, three days tied for first, 34 days in second, one day tied for second, three days in third, two days in fourth, three days tied for fourth and 10 days in fifth.

INTERLEAGUE PLAY: The A's are 8-6 (.571) in interleague play, which is the 11th best record in the majors...have three games remaining with San Diego (today plus Aug. 3-4 in Oakland) and three home games with San Francisco (Aug. 20-22)...went 10-10 (.500) in interleague play last year and finished with a .500 record or better against the National League for the third consecutive season and 17th time in 24 years of interleague play...are 246-212 (.537) all-time in interleague games, which is fourth best in Major League history.

PITCHERS HITTING: A's pitchers are 4-for-18 (.222) with two runs, a double, RBI, 10 strikeouts and three sacrifice hits...are now batting .099 (44-for-443) with five doubles, 14 RBI, 14 walks and 208 strikeouts since interleague play began in 1997...the last home run by an A's pitcher in the regular season was by Blue Moon Odom on Sept. 4, 1972 against California (Ken Holtzman homered in Game 4 of the 1974 World Series)...that is the longest active pitcher homerless drought by any team...Odom also had the last triple on Aug. 22, 1971 against Boston.

IN THE PINCH: A's pinch hitters are 4-for-8 (.500) with a walk, a double and a home run on the road trip...have 23 pinch hits overall, which is the most in the American League and more than one National League team (Cardinals, 21)...also lead the AL in RBI (16), sacrifice flies (3) and plate appearances (101), are tied for the lead in home runs (3) and are second in extra base hits (6).

GAME #162: Yesterday was the A's 162nd game over the last two years...went 92-70 (.568) over that span, which is the third best record in the American League and sixth best in the majors...also rank third in the AL in ERA (3.76) and opponents OPS (.692)...are hitting .231 with 198 home runs and 719 runs scored (4.44 runs per game)...have been hit by a pitch an AL leading 96 times...individually, Matt Olson is hitting .251 with 41 home runs and 109 RBI in 156 games...is tied for second in the AL in home runs (Ohtani, 42) and ranks fourth in RBI...Chris Bassitt is 15-5 with a 3.08 ERA in 32 starts...is tied for third in the AL in wins and ranks fifth in ERA.

ONE-RUN GAMES AND OTHER CLOSE CALLS: Each of the A's final three games in Seattle were one-run losses...have lost each of their last four one-run games, 11 of the last 14 and are 15-18 (.455) overall...lead the American League in one-run games (33) and losses...are 22-26 (.458) in games decided by two runs or fewer compared to 34-20 (.630) in games decided by three runs or more...are 4-3 in extra innings and the seven extra inning games are tied for third fewest in the AL...are 12-7 in games decided in the last at bat...have eight walk-off wins, which is tied with the Mariners for the most in the AL...now have 91 walk-off wins in the Bob Melvin era, which are the most in the majors over that span.

PITCHING: The A's have a 3.27 ERA (167 er in 459.0 ip) over the last 52 games dating back to May 26, which is second lowest in the majors over that span (Brewers, 2.80)...have the third lowest opponents OPS (.661)...overall, rank fourth in the American League in ERA (3.75) and fifth in opponents on-base percentage (.303), slugging percentage (.389) and OPS (.692)...have issued the fewest walks (273), rank second in fewest pitches per inning (15.9), rank third in fewest home runs (113) and in shutouts (8).

STARTING PITCHING: A's starting pitchers have allowed at least three runs in each of the last four games (17 er in 19.1 ip, 7.91 ERA), which marks the first time they have allowed at least three runs since May 29-June 1 when they did it in four straight games...are 38-35 with a 3.75 ERA (244 er in 585.1 ip) for the season...rank third in the American League in ERA and wins and fifth in opponents OPS (.696)...lead the majors in innings pitched (585.1) and are tied for second in complete games (3)...the A's have used just seven starting pitchers, which is second fewest in the majors to the Red Sox (6)...have used the same five starting pitchers dating back to May 7.

BULLPEN: The A's bullpen has allowed one earned run or fewer in each of the last 15 games and has a 1.44 ERA (7 er in 43.2 ip) and .183 (28-for-153) opponents batting average over that span...however, is 2-2 with four saves and four blown saves...has converted 25-of-40 (62.5%) save opportunities for the season, which is the seventh best percentage in the American League...has 11 losses, which is the fewest in the majors...ranks fourth in the AL in opponents OPS (.683) and fourth in ERA (3.76)...has the highest slugging percentage against first batters faced in the AL (.473) and the third highest batting average (.267).

OFFENSE: The A's are batting .219 (185-for-845) with 92 runs scored over the last 25 games dating back to June 25 (3.68 runs per game)...have a .222 (43-for-195) average with runners in scoring position over that span...are hitting .233 overall, which is fifth lowest in the American League, but rank eighth in batting with RISP (.257)...lead the AL in hit by pitches (57), rank second in sacrifice flies (33), are tied for third in fewest grounded into double plays (59) and stolen base percentage (80.8%), tied for fourth in sacrifice hits (13) and fifth in walks (338).

DEFENSIVE DOINGS: The A's did not commit an error last night or in the four-game series at Seattle and have just 44 errors for the season, which is second fewest in the American League (Astros, 41)...A's pitchers have five pickoffs, which is tied for fourth most...A's outfielders have nine assists, which is tied with the Tigers for the second fewest (Angels, 8).

HOME AND AWAY: The A's are 1-4 on this 10-game road trip to Seattle (1-3), San Diego (0-1 + today) and Los Angeles-AL (four games)...this is the second of three 10-game road trips this year and it is part of a stretch from July 6 to Aug. 19 where the A's are scheduled to play 26 of 36 games on the road...are 7-9 over the first 15 games of that stretch (4-7 on the road, 3-2 at home)...are 26-22 (.542) on the road compared to 30-24 (.556) at home...went 3-2 on the last homestand against Cleveland (1-2) and Los Angeles-AL (2-0).

A'S IN JULY: The A's are 8-12 (.400) in the month of July with four games remaining...will finish with a losing record, snapping a streak of 10 consecutive months with a winning record (min. 10 games) dating back to May of 2019...last had a losing record in April of 2019 when they went 11-15...have a 3.31 ERA (66 er in 179.2 ip), which is second lowest in the majors (Brewers, 2.15)...also have the second lowest opponents OPS (.649) to the Brewers (.579)...rank last in the American League in runs (73) and are second to last in OPS (.649) to the Yankees (.649).

THIS AND THAT: The A's are 11-3 (.786) following a day off...are 24-15 (.615) in games in which the opponent starts a left-handed pitcher compared to 32-31 (.508) when they start a right-hander...the mark against lefties is second best in the American League (White Sox, 19-9/.679) and the 39 games are third most...are 34-8 (.810) when out-homering the opposition, 8-26 (.235) when they are out-homered...have used a different lineup in each of the last 39 games and have 99 different lineups over the first 102 contests.

A'S vs. PADRES: The A's lost two of three to San Diego last year in Oakland for their first season series loss to the Padres since 2006 when they also lost two of three...are 12-6 against San Diego dating back to 2009 and snapped a four-game winning streak at Petco Park with last night's loss...had not lost here since June 21, 2009...lead the all-time series 24-13 (.649)...are 12-6 in Oakland and 12-7 in San Diego, including 7-4 at Petco Park.

TODAY'S TIDBITS

Sean Murphy is 4-for-10 with two home runs in three career games against San Diego...**Jed Lowrie** is batting .323 (30-for-93) with six home runs and 18 RBI over his last 25 games...is batting .395 (34-for-86) with runners in scoring position, the second best mark in the majors...**Matt Olson** is hitting .388 (54-for-139) with 16 home runs and 37 RBI in 39 day games... leads the majors in batting, RBI, on-base percentage (.473) and home runs during the day...leads the AL in slugging (.806) and OPS (1.278) during the day.

THIS DATE IN ATHLETICS HISTORY

In **1989**, after both teams score a run in the 10th inning, Carney Lansford's 11th inning single scores Stan Javier with the winning run in the A's 8-7 victory over Seattle...in **2002** Miguel Tejada has six RBI, David Justice hits his 300th career home run and the A's score 11 times in their final two at bats to win at Texas, 12-2...in **2009** Adam Kennedy goes 5 for 7 in the A's 9-8 win at Boston...it is the first of two five-hit games for Kennedy in 2009.

TODAY'S STARTING PITCHER: Sean Manaea (7-6, 3.16 ERA)

FOR STARTERS: Is 4-4 with a 2.26 ERA (17 er in 67.2 ip) and .214 (54-for-252) opponents batting average over his last 11 starts dating back to May 23... has received a total of four runs of support in his four losses over that span and the bullpen has blown the save in two of the three no decisions...went 3-2 with a 4.41 ERA and .283 opponents average over his first nine starts... has allowed one run or fewer in 11 of his 20 starts...the A's are 6-1 in his no decisions and are 13-7 (.650) in his starting assignments...are 24-12 (.667) when he starts over the last three years.

AMONG THE LEADERS: Ranks fifth in the American League in ERA (3.16), tied for sixth in games started (20), seventh in opponents OPS (.673), eighth in innings pitched (116.2) and 10th in opponents slugging percentage (.380)... has allowed 14 home runs in 116.2 innings and his average of 1.08 home runs per nine innings is 10th lowest...is one of two pitchers in the majors with two shutouts (DeSclafani, SF) and one of five with two or more complete games.

STRIKEOUTS AND WALKS: Struck out a career-high 13 batters in his last start last Thursday at Seattle...it was his third game of 10 or more strikeouts this year, which matches Rich Hill (2016) and Frankie Montas (2021) for the most by an A's pitcher in a single season over the last 19 years...it was his sixth career 10-strikeout game, which is tied for sixth most in Oakland history and matches Montas for the most over the last 20 years...now has 128 strikeouts for the season, which ranks eighth in the American League...has walked just 28 for an average of 2.16 per nine innings, which is ninth lowest in the AL... his strikeout-to-walk ratio of 4.57 is fourth best in the AL...has more strikeouts than innings pitched in 10 of his 20 starts...has walked two batters or fewer 16 times, including six starts with one walk and five with no walks.

LEFT AND RIGHT: Has allowed a .175 (20-for-114) batting average against left-handed hitters compared to .268 (90-for-336) against right-handers... the mark against lefties is third lowest in the American League...has surrendered six home runs in 114 at bats against lefties and eight in 336 at bats against righties...has issued 21 of his 28 walks to righties.

INTERLEAGUE PLAY: Is 1-1 with a 0.75 ERA (12.0 ip, 5 h, 1 r, 1 er, 5 bb, 10 so) in two interleague starts this year and is 3-2 with a 2.38 ERA (9 er in 34.0 ip) over his last six interleague starts dating back to Aug. 20, 2020...is now 6-9 with a 3.69 ERA (47 er in 114.2 ip) in 21 career starts against the National League compared to 40-28 with a 3.73 ERA (228 er in 549.2 ip) in 96 games against the American League.

WITH THE BAT: Went 2-for-2 with a double on June 25 at San Francisco...the double was the first extra base hit by an A's pitcher since Joe Kennedy doubled on June 12, 2007 at Houston and it was the sixth multiple hit game by an A's pitcher in the designated hitter era (last: Homer Bailey, Aug. 14, 2019 at San Francisco)...now has three hits in his last three at bats after starting his career 0-for-9... is 3-for-12 (.250) with a double, walk, three strikeouts and a sacrifice hit in his career.

JUNE AND JULY: Is 1-3 with a 4.13 ERA (11 er in 24.0 ip) in four starts in July after going 3-2 with a 1.13 ERA and .181 opponents batting average in five starts in June...is now 3-7 with a 3.89 ERA (55 er in 127.1 ip) in 21 career games in July compared to 11-4 with a 2.68 ERA in 19 career starts in June.

DAYS REST: Is scheduled to start on five days rest...is 3-1 with a 1.38 ERA (9 er in 58.2 ip) and .228 (50-for-219) opponents batting average in nine starts on four days rest compared to 3-4 with a 5.14 ERA (24 er in 42.0 ip) and .265 (45-for-170) opponents average in seven starts on five days rest...over the last three years, he is 7-2 with a 2.37 ERA (26 er in 98.2 ip) in 17 starts on four days rest, 4-5 with a 5.02 ERA (29 er in 52.0 ip) in 10 starts on five days rest.

2021 HIGHLIGHTS: Took the loss in his first start but then went 3-0 with a 1.50 ERA over his next four starts...picked up his first win of the season in the 100th game of his career, an 8-4 victory over Detroit on April 15...tossed a six-hit, seven-inning shutout in the A's 7-0 win over Minnesota in the first game of the doubleheader April 20...it was the 11th complete game shutout of fewer than eight innings in Oakland history and his second career complete game and shutout...the start was the 100th of his career and he became the 25th pitcher in Oakland history to make 100 starts...had 10 strikeouts on May 7 against Tampa Bay, but had a no decision in the A's 2-1 win...retired each of the first 18 batters he faced before walking Arozarena to start the seventh...allowed one run or fewer in five consecutive starts from May 23 to June 14 and went 3-0 with a 0.84 ERA over that span...became the first A's pitcher with five consecutive games of one run or fewer and five innings pitched or more since Trevor Cahill (April 17-May 9, 2011)...had a no decision in the A's 6-5 loss at Los Angeles (AL) on May 23...left with a 4-1 lead but the bullpen blew the save...it was the first of two times the pen blew the save in one of his starts (July 16 vs. Cleveland)...struck out Justin Up-

ton to lead off the game for the 50,000th strikeout in Oakland history...fanned Taylor Ward to end the fourth inning for his 500th career strikeout...tossed a four-hit shutout in the A's 6-0 win at Seattle on June 2...it was his third career complete game and shutout, his second this year...then combined with Petit, Trivino and Diekmann on a two-hit shutout in the A's 4-0 win on June 9 against Arizona...it was the second time in his career he did not allow a run in back-to-back starts (Sept. 14-20, 2016)...had a career-high 16.0-inning scoreless streak from June 2 to 14...struck out 11 batters in 5.1 innings June 20 at New York (AL) but was the losing pitcher in the A's 2-1 loss...the 11 strikeouts match the most in Athletics history by a pitcher with fewer than six innings pitched (Kirk Saarloos on Sept. 19, 2006 and Tim Hudson on June 8, 1999)... went 2-for-2 with a double June 25 at San Francisco...it was the first extra base hit by an A's pitcher since Joe Kennedy doubled on June 12, 2007 at Houston...was named American League Pitcher of the Month for June after going 3-2 with a 1.13 ERA and .181 opponents batting average in five starts... struck out 34 batters in 32.0 innings and allowed just one home run...it was the second time he was named Pitcher of the Month (April, 2018).

LAST START: He snapped his career high four-game losing streak in the A's 4-1 win at Seattle last Thursday...struck out a career-high 13 batters in 7.0 innings...matched the most strikeouts in Athletics history by a pitcher with seven innings or fewer (Montas, Sept. 27, 2020 vs. Seattle; Blue, April 9, 1971 vs. Kansas City) and equaled the seventh highest single-game total in Oakland history...Vida Blue is the only other Oakland lefty to fan 13 or more (five times, last: July 23, 1976 vs. Kansas City (13)...it was his third game of 10 or more strikeouts this year and the sixth of his career...walked a season-high tying three batters...shut out the Mariners on two hits and three walks over the first six innings and had a 2-0 lead when he allowed his only run on a leadoff home run by Murphy in the seventh.

RHP Frankie Montas (8-8, 4.34 ERA): Is 3-4 with a 3.81 ERA, .236 opponents average and five home runs allowed over his last 10 starts dating back to May 29 after going 5-4 with a 4.92 ERA, .274 opponents average and 11 home runs over his first 10 starts...is tied for ninth in the American League in wins but is tied for seventh in losses...has had a roller coaster season with his ERA as he posted a mark of 6.20 in April, 3.18 in May and 5.28 in June... currently has a 2.96 ERA in four starts in July...has a .206 opponents batting average the first time through the order, .282 with 11 of his 16 home runs after that...had a no decision in his last start, a 4-3 A's loss at Seattle last Friday (6.0 ip, 4 h, 3 r, 3 er, 1 bb, 10 so)...is 3-1 with a 2.96 ERA (48.2 ip, 44 h, 20 r, 16 er, 17 bb, 48 so, 4 hr) in 11 career appearances, including eight starts, against Los Angeles (AL)...is 1-1 with a 1.42 ERA (12.2 ip, 11 h, 6 r, 2 er, 2 bb, 15 so, 0 hr) in two starts this year.
