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OAKLAND ATHLETICS (58-46) VS. LOS ANGELES ANGELS (51-51)

ABOUT THE A'S: Have won two straight after losing four in a row and are now 6-6 since the All-Star Break...are 2-7-2 over the previous 11 series and have a 14-19 (.424) record over the last 33 games...are 58-46 (.558) overall, which is the fifth best record in the American League...are in second place in the AL West for the 35th consecutive day and trail first place Houston by 5½ games...that is one-half game short of the season high of six (July 27 and 28)...are in second place in the AL Wild Card, 3½ games behind Tampa Bay and 2½ games ahead of the third place team, Seattle...have spent 58 days alone in first place in the West, three days tied for first, 36 days in second, one day tied for second, three days in third, two days in fourth, three days tied for fourth and 10 days in fifth.

SHUT OUT: The A's tossed their second shutout in the last eight games last night, both of which have come against the Angels...have shut outs in back-to-back games against the Angels for the first time since June 28-July 26, 1994 when they had three straight...now have nine shutouts for the season, which is tied with the White Sox for second most in the American League (Yankees, 10).

AGAINST THE WEST: The A's are in a stretch from July 19 to Aug. 8 where they are scheduled to play 13 of 17 games against American League West teams... are 4-3 against the West during the stretch...are now 23-23 (.500) against AL West competition overall compared to 35-23 (.603) against all other teams... have never made the playoffs with a losing record against the West.

A's IN JULY: The A's are 10-12 (.455) in the month of July with two games remaining...that snaps a streak of streak of 10 consecutive months with a winning record (min. 10 games) dating back to May of 2019...need to win each of the next two games to avoid their first losing month since April of 2019 when they went 11-15...the A's .455 winning percentage in July is fifth lowest in the American League but their 3.19 ERA (70 er in 197.2 ip) is second lowest in the majors (Brewers, 2.18)...have a .632 OPS, which is also second lowest to Milwaukee (.572)...have 206 strikeouts, which is one short of the Athletics record for July (207 in 2016)...on offense, the A's have the second lowest OPS in the AL (.679), the third lowest batting average (.226) and are tied for the fourth fewest runs scored (88)...have outscored the opposition 88-77.

PITCHING: The A's have a 3.22 ERA (172 er in 480.2 ip) over the last 54 games dating back to May 26, which is second lowest in the majors over that span (Brewers, 2.79)...have the third lowest opponents OPS (.653)...overall, rank fourth in the American League in ERA (3.72) and fifth opponents on-base percentage (.302), slugging percentage (.385) and OPS (.687)...have issued the fewest walks (280) and rank second in fewest home runs (113) and fewest pitches per inning (15.9).

STARTING PITCHING: A's starting pitchers have not allowed a run in the last two games (13.0 ip) and four of the last nine...are 5-2 with a 3.10 ERA (16 er in 52.1 ip) over the last nine games...are 40-35 with a 3.67 ERA (244 er in 598.1 ip) for the season...rank third in the American League in ERA and wins and fifth in opponents OPS (.688)...lead the majors in innings pitched (598.1) and are tied for second in complete games (3)...have used the same five starting pitchers over the last 71 games dating back to May 7...over the last 17 years, the only time the A's have used the same five starting pitchers over a span of at least 71 games was April 25-Aug. 9, 2013 when they did it over a 92-game stretch (Colon, Griffin, Milone, Parker, Straily)...have employed just seven starting pitchers overall, which is second fewest in the majors to the Red Sox (6)...have four pitchers with 20 or more starts for the first time since 2013 when they had five.

BULLPEN: The A's bullpen has a 2.03 ERA (11 er in 48.2 ip) and .200 (35-for-175) opponents batting average over the last 17 games but is 2-2 with four saves and four blown saves...has converted 25-of-40 (62.5%) save opportunities for the season...has 11 losses, which is the fewest in the majors... ranks fourth in the American League in ERA (3.81) and fifth in opponents OPS (.686)...has the highest slugging percentage against first batters faced (.471), the third highest batting average (.270) and fifth highest on-base percentage (.331).

OFFENSE: The A's are batting .219 (200-for-912) with 106 runs scored over the last 27 games (3.9 runs per game)...are hitting .233 overall, which is fifth lowest in the American League...however, rank seventh in batting with runners in scoring position (.259) and ninth in runs scored (459)...lead the AL in hit by pitches (59), rank second in sacrifice flies (34), third in fewest grounded into double plays (59), fourth in stolen base percentage (80.4%) and sacrifice hits (14) and fifth in walks (348)...A's pinch hitters lead the AL in hits (23), RBI (16), sacrifice flies (3) and plate appearances (102), are tied for the lead in home runs (3), rank second in extra base hits (6) and tied for second in doubles (3).

DEFENSIVE DOINGS: The A's have a seven-game errorless streak and have made just three errors over the last 16 games...have 44 for the season, which is second fewest in the American League (Astros, 41)...are tied for the fourth fewest double plays (75)...A's pitchers have five pickoffs, which is tied for fourth most...A's outfielders have nine assists, which is tied for second fewest to the Angels (8).

ONE-RUN GAMES AND OTHER CLOSE CALLS: The A's have lost each of their last four one-run games, 11 of the last 14 and are 15-18 (.455) overall...lead the American League in one-run games (33) and losses...are 22-26 (.458) in games decided by two runs or fewer compared to 36-20 (.643) in games decided by three runs or more...are 4-3 in extra innings and the seven extra inning games are tied for third fewest in the AL...are 12-7 in games decided in the last at bat...have eight walk-off wins, which is tied with the Mariners for the most in the AL...now have 91 walk-off wins in the Bob Melvin era, which are the most in the majors over that span.

HOME AND AWAY: The A's are 3-4 on this 10-game road trip to Seattle (1-3), San Diego (1-1) and Los Angeles-AL (1-0)...are now 9-13 on the road dating back to June 19 after starting the year 19-9 in away games...this is the second of three 10-game road trips this year and it is part of a stretch from July 6 to Aug. 19 where the A's are scheduled to play 26 of 36 games on the road...are 9-9 over the first 18 games of that stretch (6-7 on the road, 3-2 at home)...are 28-22 (.560) on the road compared to 30-24 (.556) at home... went 3-2 on the last homestand against Cleveland (1-2) and Los Angeles-AL (2-0)...return home following the game Sunday for a five-game homestand against San Diego (two games) and Texas (three games).

HOME AND AWAY SPLITS: The A's are batting .246 (425-for-1731) and are averaging 4.72 runs per game on the road (236 runs in 50 games) compared to .221 with an average of 4.13 runs per game at home...have the fourth best road batting average in the American League and the fifth best OPS (.735)... have the second lowest home batting average and third lowest OPS (.695)... have a 3.69 ERA (178 er in 433.2 ip) on the road, which is the lowest in the AL and fourth lowest in the majors...have 62 home runs in 54 games at home, 66 in 50 on the road.

THIS AND THAT: The A's are 25-15 (.625) in games in which the opponent starts a left-handed pitcher compared to 33-31 (.516) when they start a right-hander...the mark against lefties is second best in the American League (White Sox, 19-10/.655) and the 40 games are third most...are 35-8 (.814) when out-homering the opposition, 8-26 (.235) when they are out-homered...have used a different lineup in each of the last 41 games and have 101 different lineups over the first 104 contests.

A's vs. ANGELS: The A's have won the season series for the third consecutive season as they are 10-3 with six games remaining...have a six-game winning streak, which matches the A's longest against the Angels over the last 19 years...last won more than six straight from Sept. 25, 2001-April 13, 2002 when they had a nine-game winning streak...are 29-13 (.690) against the Angels over the last three years...this year, the A's are 3-1 in Anaheim and went 7-2 in Oakland...the seven home wins matched the A's most home wins against the Angels ...have a 2.41 ERA (31 er in 116.0 ip) and have outscored the Angels 65-35...since moving to Oakland in 1968, the A's are 466-389 against the Angels...that includes 247-184 in Oakland and 219-205 in Anaheim...all-time, the A's are 515-465 against the Angels.

TODAY'S TIDBITS

Matt Olson ranks third in the American League in OPS (.954), tied for third in home runs (27), fourth in slugging percentage (.581), tied for fourth in extra base hits (51), tied for seventh in RBI (67) and runs (68), ninth in on-base percentage (.373), tied for ninth in doubles (24) an tied for 10th in walks (49)...*Starling Marte* is tied for second in the majors in stolen bases (23)...based on a minimum of 250 plate appearances, he ranks fifth in onbase percentage (.406) and 14th in batting average (.305)...*Sergio Romo* has not allowed a run in his last 12 games dating back to June 29 (12.2 ip, 2 h, 3 bb, 13 so) and opponents are 2-for-38 (.053) over that span...*Lou Trivino* has converted each of his last nine save opportunities dating back to June 5 and has a 1.17 ERA (3 er in 23.0 ip) and .190 (15-for-79) opponents batting average in 22 games over that span.

THIS DATE IN ATHLETICS HISTORY

In **1901** Napoleon Lajoie becomes the second player in American League history to hit for the cycle, following teammate Harry Davis who was the first 20 days earlier...in **2000** Sal Fasano has a career high five RBI and drives in every run in the A's 5-2 win over Boston.

TODAY'S STARTING PITCHER: Chris Bassitt (10-3, 3.46 ERA)

LAST TWO, FIRST TWO AND IN BETWEEN: Is 0-1 with a 5.25 ERA (7 er in 12.0 ip) and .234 (11-for-47) opponents batting average over his last two starts... went 0-2 with a 5.56 ERA and .289 opponents average over his first two starts and was 10-0 with a 3.04 ERA and .209 opponents average in 17 starts in between from April 12 to July 11...the 10-game winning streak is a careerhigh, tied for fourth longest in Oakland history and tied for the longest in the majors this year (Hendricks, CHI).

AMONG THE LEADERS: Is tied for the American League lead in wins (10), winning percentage (.769) and games started (21), ranks second in innings pitched (130.0), sixth in opponents OPS (.644), batting average (.219), on-base percentage (.281) and slugging percentage (.364), tied for seventh in strikeouts (132) and ninth in ERA (3.46)...has allowed 15 home runs and his average of 1.04 home runs per nine innings is 10th lowest...has hit 11 batters, which is the most in the AL and two short of the Oakland record of 13... he also hit 13 batters in 2019, which tied the record set by Barry Zito (2001, 2005 and 2006)...ranks third in the AL in fewest pitches per inning (15.0).

CAREER BESTS: Has matched his career high in wins (10) and wild pitches (5)...his 132 strikeouts are nine short of his high of 141 in 2019...currently has the lowest opponents batting average (.219) and on-base percentage (.281) of his career.

HOME AND AWAY: Is 6-0 with a 4.11 ERA (32 er in 70.0 ip) in 12 starts on the road compared to 4-3 with a 2.70 ERA (18 er in 60.0 ip) in nine starts at home...is tied for the American League lead in road wins and tied for seventh in home ERA...now has a seven-game winning streak on the road dating back to Sept. 12, 2020 and has a 3.91 ERA (33 er in 76.0 ip) over that stretch, which spans 13 starts...the road winning streak matches the longest by an A's pitcher over the last 31 years...the only longer road winning streaks in Oakland history are nine by Bob Welch (Sept. 21, 1989-June 30, 1990) and eight by Diego Segui (Aug. 29, 1970-Aug. 12, 1971)...has not lost on the road since Aug. 29, 2020 at Houston.

OPPONENTS BATTING: Has allowed a .198 (21-for-106) batting average with runners in scoring position, which ranks sixth in the American League...has allowed just four home runs in 251 at bats against right-handed hitters...has surrendered 11 of his 15 home runs this year and 29 of 42 over the last three years to lefties...10 of his 15 home runs have come with the bases empty... has a .146 opponents average with two strikes, which is eighth lowest in the AL.

FIVE DAYS REST: Is scheduled to start on five days rest today...is 5-0 with a 3.54 ERA (24 er in 61.0 ip) in 10 starts on exactly five days rest and now has a 10-game winning streak in those games dating back to July 19, 2019...has a 3.22 ERA (38 er in 106.1 ip) in 18 starts over that span...according to Tru-Media, that matches the longest winning streak in starts on five days rest in Oakland history...the others are Mike Fiers (May 7-Aug. 27, 2019) and Mark Mulder (June 18, 2002-July 10, 2003)...has not lost when pitching on five days rest since July 6, 2019.

AMERICAN LEAGUE ALL-STAR: Was named to the American League All-Star Team for the first time on July 10 as a replacement...pitched the sixth inning in a 5-2 AL win (1.0 ip, 1 h, 1 r, 0 er, 2 bb, 1 so)...became the first A's starting pitcher to be named to the AL All-Star Team since Sonny Gray in 2015 and the first starter to pitch in the game since Scott Kazmir in 2014.

THIS AND THAT: The A's are 14-7 (.667) in his starting assignments...has left with the lead in three of his seven no decisions only to have the bullpen blow the save (May 5 vs. Toronto, May 16 at Minnesota, June 19 at New York-AL)... has tossed at least seven innings in nine of his starts...has allowed two runs or fewer 14 times and six hits or fewer 18 times.

THE LAST THREE YEARS: Is 25-10 (.714) with a 3.39 ERA (127 er in 337.0 ip) in 60 games (57 starts) over the last three years...based on a minium of 275 innings pitched, he ranks second in the American League in winning percentage over that span, fourth in ERA and fifth in opponents OPS (.670)...is eighth in wins...the A's are 37-20 (.649) in his starting assignments over the last three years...was 4-14 (.222) with a 3.86 ERA in 40 games (30 starts) over his first four seasons.

2021 HIGHLIGHTS: Was the A's Opening Day starting pitcher and took the loss in an 8-1 decision to Houston on April 1 in Oakland...became the A's 14th different Opening Day starting pitcher over the last 16 years...allowed exactly two runs in six consecutive starts from April 12 to May 11 to become the second pitcher in Athletic history to allow exactly two runs in six consecutive games (Bob Davis, Aug. 8-26, 1960)...went 3-0 with a 2.92 ERA over that stretch which ran from April 12 to May 11...struck out a season-high 10 batters in a 3-2 win at Boston on May 11...it was his third career game of 10 or more without issuing a free pass...is one of nine pitchers in Oakland history with two such games...tossed his first career complete game and shutout

May 27 against Los Angeles (AL), a two-hitter in the A's 5-0 win...it came in his 77th career start, his 72nd with the A's...the 71 consecutive starts without a complete games is the second longest streak in Athletics history (113, Barry Zito, Aug. 22, 2003-Sept. 28, 2006)...finished May with a 3-0 record, a 2.52 ERA and .175 opponents batting average in five starts...then went 4-0 with a 2.70 ERA in six starts in June...it was the first time in his career he won four games in a month...was one of four American League pitchers to win four games in June and his ERA tied for fifth...allowed two runs or fewer in five consecutive starts from June 8 to 30 and was 4-0 with a 1.93 ERA and .197 opponents batting average over that span.

LAST START: He had a no decision in the A's 5-4 loss at Seattle last Saturday... it was the 100th appearance of his career...allowed a RBI single to France in the first inning but Oakland scored three times in the third to take a 3-1 lead...he allowed a solo home run to Haniger in the bottom of the third and two-run home run to Haniger in the fifth...was relieved by Guerra to start the sixth with the A's trailing 4-3, but Oakland scored once in the seventh to get him off the hook.

BASSITT vs. LOS ANGELES: Is 5-3 with a 3.88 ERA (53.1 ip, 49 h, 29 r, 23 er, 10 bb, 54 so, 5 hr) in 11 career appearances, including nine starts...is 3-1 with an 5.32 ERA (14 er in 23.2 ip) in five games in Anaheim and 2-2 with a 2.73 ERA (9 er in 29.2 ip) in six games in Oakland...is 2-0 with a 1.08 ERA (16.2 ip, 7 h, 2 r, 2 er, 2 bb, 17 so) in two starts this year...the first win came in a 6-2 A's victory in Anaheim on May 22... shutout the Angels on two hits and a

TOMORROW'S PROBABLE STARTING PITCHER

LHP Cole Irvin (7-9, 3.62 ERA): Is 4-2 with a 3.02 ERA with three home runs allowed in nine starts in June and July after going 3-7 with a 4.12 ERA with seven home runs in 11 starts in April and May...ranks 10th in the American League in opponents OPS (.680) and slugging percentage (.374)...is averaging 14.5 pitches per inning, which are the fewest in the majors (Kershaw, LAD 14.7)...his average of 1.62 walks per nine innings is the lowest in the American League and third lowest in the majors...is tied for eighth in the AL in strikeout-to-walk ratio (4.00) but is averaging the third fewest strikeouts per nine innings (6.46)...was the losing pitcher in his last start, a 4-3 A's loss at Seattle on Sunday (4.0 ip, 5 h, 4 r, 4 er, 1 bb, 3 so)...is 1-1 with a 3.86 ERA (18.2 ip, 22 h, 8 r, 8 er, 3 bb, 8 so, 2 hr) in three career starts against Los Angeles, all this year in Oakland...is 2-7 with a 6.06 ERA and .312 opponents batting average in 10 starts against AL West competition.

- Was acquired from the Chicago Cubs Monday along with cash considerations for Greg Deichmann and minor leaguer Daniel Palencia...made his A's debut Wednesday at San Diego (0.2 ip, 1 h, 1 so)...allowed both of his inherited runners to score.
- Ranks thir among Major League relievers in opponents OPS (.466), fifth in slugging percentage (.230) and 10th in batting average (.158).
- Has not allowed a run in 40 of his 44 appearances and ranks 12th among ML relievers in ERA (2.03).
