OAKLAND ATHLETICS (58-46) VS. LOS ANGELES ANGELS (51-51)

ABOUT THE A'S: Have won two straight after losing four in a row and are now 6-6 since the All-Star Break...are 2-7-2 over the previous 11 series and have a 14-19 (.424) record over the last 33 games...are 58-46 (.558) overall, which is the fifth best record in the American League...are in second place in the AL West for the 35th consecutive day and trail first place Houston by 5½ games...that is one-half game short of the season high of six (July 27 and 28)...are in second place in the AL Wild Card, 3½ games behind Tampa Bay and 2½ games ahead of the third place team, Seattle...have spent 58 days alone in first place in the West, three days tied for first, 36 days in second, one day tied for second, three days in third, two days in fourth, three days tied for fourth and 10 days in fifth.

SHUT OUT: The A's tossed their second shutout in the last eight games last night, both of which have come against the Angels...have shut outs in back-to-back games against the Angels for the first time since June 28-July 26, 1994 when they had three straight...now have nine shutouts for the season, which is tied with the White Sox for second most in the American League (Yankees, 10).

AGAINST THE WEST: The A's are in a stretch from July 19 to Aug. 8 where they are scheduled to play 13 of 17 games against American League West teams...are 4-3 against the West during the stretch...are now 23-23 (.500) against AL West competition overall compared to 35-23 (.603) against all other teams...have never made the playoffs with a losing record against the West.

A'S IN JULY: The A's are 10-12 (.455) in the month of July with two games remaining...that snaps a streak of streak of 10 consecutive months with a winning record (min. 10 games) dating back to May of 2019...need to win each of the next two games to avoid their first losing month since April of 2019 when they went 11-15...the A's .455 winning percentage in July is fifth lowest in the American League but their 3.19 ERA (70 er in 197.2 ip) is second lowest in the majors (Brewers, 2.18)...have a .632 OPS, which is also second lowest to Milwaukee (.572)...have 206 strikeouts, which is one short of the Athletics record for July (207 in 2016)...on offense, the A's have the second lowest OPS in the AL (.679), the third lowest batting average (.226) and are tied for the fourth fewest runs scored (88)...have outscored the opposition 88-77.

PITCHING: The A's have a 3.22 ERA (172 er in 480.2 ip) over the last 54 games dating back to May 26, which is second lowest in the majors over that span (Brewers, 2.79)...have the third lowest opponents OPS (.653)...overall, rank fourth in the American League in ERA (3.72) and fifth opponents on-base percentage (.302), slugging percentage (.385) and OPS (.687)...have issued the fewest walks (280) and rank second in fewest home runs (113) and fewest pitches per inning (15.9).

STARTING PITCHING: A's starting pitchers have not allowed a run in the last two games (13.0 ip) and four of the last nine...are 5-2 with a 3.10 ERA (16 er in 52.1 ip) over the last nine games...are 40-35 with a 3.67 ERA (244 er in 598.1 ip) for the season...rank third in the American League in ERA and wins and fifth in opponents OPS (.688)...lead the majors in innings pitched (598.1) and are tied for second in complete games (3)...have used the same five starting pitchers over the last 71 games dating back to May 7...over the last 17 years, the only time the A's have used the same five starting pitchers over a span of at least 71 games was April 25-Aug. 9, 2013 when they did it over a 92-game stretch (Colon, Griffin, Milone, Parker, Straily)...have employed just seven starting pitchers overall, which is second fewest in the majors to the Red Sox (6)...have four pitchers with 20 or more starts for the first time since 2013 when they had five.

BULLPEN: The A's bullpen has a 2.03 ERA (11 er in 48.2 ip) and .200 (35-for-175) opponents batting average over the last 17 games but is 2-2 with four saves and four blown saves...has converted 25-of-40 (62.5%) save opportunities for the season...has 11 losses, which is the fewest in the majors...ranks fourth in the American League in ERA (3.81) and fifth in opponents OPS (.686)...has the highest slugging percentage against first batters faced (.471), the third highest batting average (.270) and fifth highest on-base percentage (.331).

OFFENSE: The A's are batting .219 (200-for-912) with 106 runs scored over the last 27 games (3.9 runs per game)...are hitting .233 overall, which is fifth lowest in the American League...however, rank seventh in batting with runners in scoring position (.259) and ninth in runs scored (459)...lead the AL in hit by pitches (59), rank second in sacrifice flies (34), third in fewest grounded into double plays (59), fourth in stolen base percentage (80.4%) and sacrifice hits (14) and fifth in walks (348)...A's pinch hitters lead the AL in hits (23), RBI (16), sacrifice flies (3) and plate appearances (102), are tied for the lead in home runs (3), rank second in extra base hits (6) and tied for second in doubles (3).

DEFENSIVE DOINGS: The A's have a seven-game errorless streak and have made just three errors over the last 16 games...have 44 for the season, which is second fewest in the American League (Astros, 41)...are tied for the fourth fewest double plays (75)...A's pitchers have five pickoffs, which is tied for fourth most...A's outfielders have nine assists, which is tied for second fewest to the Angels (8).

ONE-RUN GAMES AND OTHER CLOSE CALLS: The A's have lost each of their last four one-run games, 11 of the last 14 and are 15-18 (.455) overall...lead the American League in one-run games (33) and losses...are 22-26 (.458) in games decided by two runs or fewer compared to 36-20 (.643) in games decided by three runs or more...are 4-3 in extra innings and the seven extra inning games are tied for third fewest in the AL...are 12-7 in games decided in the last at bat...have eight walk-off wins, which is tied with the Mariners for the most in the AL...now have 91 walk-off wins in the Bob Melvin era, which are the most in the majors over that span.

HOME AND AWAY: The A's are 3-4 on this 10-game road trip to Seattle (1-3), San Diego (1-1) and Los Angeles-AL (1-0)...are now 9-13 on the road dating back to June 19 after starting the year 19-9 in away games...this is the second of three 10-game road trips this year and it is part of a stretch from July 6 to Aug. 19 where the A's are scheduled to play 26 of 36 games on the road...are 9-9 over the first 18 games of that stretch (6-7 on the road, 3-2 at home)...are 28-22 (.560) on the road compared to 30-24 (.556) at home...went 3-2 on the last homestand against Cleveland (1-2) and Los Angeles-AL (2-0)...return home following the game Sunday for a five-game homestand against San Diego (two games) and Texas (three games).

HOME AND AWAY SPLITS: The A's are batting .246 (425-for-1731) and are averaging 4.72 runs per game on the road (236 runs in 50 games) compared to .221 with an average of 4.13 runs per game at home...have the fourth best road batting average in the American League and the fifth best OPS (.735)...have the second lowest home batting average and third lowest OPS (.695)...have a 3.69 ERA (178 er in 433.2 ip) on the road, which is the lowest in the AL and fourth lowest in the majors...have 62 home runs in 54 games at home, 66 in 50 on the road.

THIS AND THAT: The A's are 25-15 (.625) in games in which the opponent starts a left-handed pitcher compared to 33-31 (.516) when they start a right-hander...the mark against lefties is second best in the American League (White Sox, 19-10/.655) and the 40 games are third most...are 35-8 (.814) when out-homering the opposition, 8-26 (.235) when they are out-homered...have used a different lineup in each of the last 41 games and have 101 different lineups over the first 104 contests.

A'S vs. ANGELS: The A's have won the season series for the third consecutive season as they are 10-3 with six games remaining...have a six-game winning streak, which matches the A's longest against the Angels over the last 19 years...last won more than six straight from Sept. 25, 2001-April 13, 2002 when they had a nine-game winning streak...are 29-13 (.690) against the Angels over the last three years...this year, the A's are 3-1 in Anaheim and went 7-2 in Oakland...the seven home wins matched the A's most home wins against the Angels...have a 2.41 ERA (31 er in 116.0 ip) and have outscored the Angels 65-35...since moving to Oakland in 1968, the A's are 466-389 against the Angels...that includes 247-184 in Oakland and 219-205 in Anaheim...all-time, the A's are 515-465 against the Angels.

TODAY'S TIDBITS

Matt Olson ranks third in the American League in OPS (.954), tied for third in home runs (27), fourth in slugging percentage (.581), tied for fourth in extra base hits (51), tied for seventh in RBI (67) and runs (68), ninth in on-base percentage (.373), tied for ninth in doubles (24) and tied for 10th in walks (49)...**Starling Marte** is tied for second in the majors in stolen bases (23)...based on a minimum of 250 plate appearances, he ranks fifth in on-base percentage (.406) and 14th in batting average (.305)...**Sergio Romo** has not allowed a run in his last 12 games dating back to June 29 (12.2 ip, 2 h, 3 bb, 13 so) and opponents are 2-for-38 (.053) over that span...**Lou Trivino** has converted each of his last nine save opportunities dating back to June 5 and has a 1.17 ERA (3 er in 23.0 ip) and .190 (15-for-79) opponents batting average in 22 games over that span.

THIS DATE IN ATHLETICS HISTORY

In **1901** Napoleon Lajoie becomes the second player in American League history to hit for the cycle, following teammate Harry Davis who was the first 20 days earlier...in **2000** Sal Fasano has a career high five RBI and drives in every run in the A's 5-2 win over Boston.

39 LHP ANDREW CHAFIN

Last Outing: 7/28 at San Diego (ND, 0.2 ip, 1 h, 0 r, 0 er, 0 bb, 1 so)
Saves/Opportunities: 0-1
Inherited Runners/Scored: 22/7 **First Hitters:** 7-42 (2 bb)

- Was acquired from the Chicago Cubs Monday along with cash considerations for Greg Deichmann and minor leaguer Daniel Palencia...made his A's debut Wednesday at San Diego (0.2 ip, 1 h, 1 so)...allowed both of his inherited runners to score.
- Ranks thir among Major League relievers in opponents OPS (.466), fifth in slugging percentage (.230) and 10th in batting average (.158).
- Has not allowed a run in 40 of his 44 appearances and ranks 12th among ML relievers in ERA (2.03).
- Has not allowed a home run in his last 34 games (31.0 innings) and has yielded just one home run in 40.0 innings overall...his average of 0.23 home runs per nine innings is ninth lowest among ML relievers.
- Has a 0.86 ERA (2 er in 21.0 ip) in 23 appearances on one day of rest or fewer, a 3.44 ERA (7 er in 18.1 ip) in 20 games on two days rest or more.
- Has not allowed a run in the eighth inning (21.2 ip).
- Last faced the Angels on Aug. 21, 2018 while pitching for Arizona (0.0 ip, 1 h, 1 r, 1 er).
- Allowed three runs on two hits and two walks in his final outing with the Cubs last Saturday against Arizona without retiring a batter to snap a career-high 24.1-inning scoreless streak dating back to May 8...opponents went 9-for-79 (.114) with five walks during the streak.
- Was 0-2 with a 2.06 ERA in 43 relief appearances for Chicago...at the time of the trade, he ranked third among National League relievers in opponents OPS (.461), fifth in slugging percentage (.228), seventh in ERA, eighth in batting average (.154), ninth in on-base percentage (.233) and tied for ninth in games.

Last Year: Combined for a 1-2 record, one save and a 6.52 ERA in 15 relief appearances with the Diamondbacks and Cubs...missed a month of the season from Aug. 19 to Sept. 18 with a sprained left finger.

- Has a 2.93 ERA (5 er in 15.1 ip) and .222 (12-for-54) opponents batting average over his last 18 games dating back to June 4.
- Has held right-handed hitters to a .193 (17-for-88) average but they have hit five of the career-high six home runs he has allowed.
- Has a 4.34 ERA (9 er in 18.2 ip) and .250 (18-for-72) opponents batting average in 21 outings on one day rest or fewer, a 1.40 ERA (3 er in 19.1 ip) and .152 (10-for-66) opponents average in 20 appearances on two days of rest or more.
- Has not allowed a run in 11 appearances against the Angels in three seasons with the A's (10.2 ip, 3 h, 7 bb, 16 so).

Last Year: Allowed just two runs in 21 appearances and only one was earned for a 0.42 ERA...ranked second among Major League relievers in ERA and opponents slugging percentage (.157), fifth in batting average (.114) and seventh in OPS (.410)

Inherited Runners/Scored: 6/1 **First Hitters:** 6-28, bb, hbp

- Allowed three runs Wednesday at San Diego after an eight-game, 7.2-inning scoreless streak...has not allowed a run in 14 of his last 17 games but has allowed at least two runs in the three games with a run (7 er in 19.0 ip, 3.32 ERA).
- Has a .197 opponents batting average, which breaks down to .159 (10-for-63) against left-handed hitters compared to .230 (17-for-74) against right-handers...has issued nine of his 11 walks and yielded two of his three homers to righties for a .647 OPS...has a .451 OPS against lefties.
- Ranks ninth among American League relievers in opponents OPS (.559).
- Opponents are batting .174 (4-for-23) with runners in scoring position.
- Has a 1.96 ERA (4 er in 18.1 ip) in 14 games at night, a 5.31 ERA (12 er in 20.1 ip) in 16 day games.
- Has faced the Angels three times in his career, all this year (3.1 ip, 2 h, 1 r, 1 er, 2 bb, 4 so, 2.70 ERA).

Last Year: Was on the Opening Day roster and appeared in nine games for Philadelphia in 2020 and went 1-3 with an 8.59 ERA (7 er in 7.1 ip)...struck out eight batters and walked two.

- Has a 2.19 ERA (3 er in 12.1 ip) over his last 13 games but has allowed 5-of-7 (71.4%) inherited runners to score over that span.
- Ranks second in the American League in games pitched (50)...is tied for the lead among AL relievers in innings pitched (52.0) and wins (7), ranks second in fewest walks per nine innings (1.38) and tied for fourth in most inherited runners (30)...is averaging the fewest strikeouts per nine innings in the majors among relievers (4.33).
- Allowed his fourth home run to his first batter faced on Tuesday, which is tied for the most in the majors.
- Opponents are hitting .190 (11-for-58) with runners in scoring position.

Last Year: Compiled a career-low 1.66 ERA in a team-leading 26 relief appearances...opponents hit .232 and he walked just five batters for a .273 on-base percentage...yielded four runs, three of which scored on solo home runs.

- Has not allowed a run in his last 12 games dating back to June 29 (12.2 ip, 2 h, 3 bb, 13 so) and opponents are 2-for-38 (.053) over that span...has also not allowed a run in 22 of his last 24 games for a 0.78 ERA (23.0 ip, 10 h, 2 r, 2 er, 3 bb, 25 so, 1 hr) and .132 (10-for-76) opponents batting average.
- Has a 1.74 ERA (4 er in 20.2 ip) in 21 games on zero or one day of rest, a 5.94 ERA (11 er in 16.2 ip) in 20 outings on two days rest or more.
- First batters faced are 1-for-15 (.067) with eight strikeouts over his last 15 games after going 12-for-24 (.500) with a walk and two hit by pitches over his first 27 contests.

- His last outing on Tuesday against San Diego was his first since July 6, a span of 14 games and 20 days.
- Has a 7.94 ERA (11.1 ip, 16 h, 11 r, 10 er, 4 bb, 6 so) and .327 (16-for-49) opponents batting average over his last 10 games after logging a 2.93 ERA and .232 opponent average over his first 11 contests.
- Has a 3.75 ERA (5 er in 12.0 ip) in nine day games, a 6.14 ERA (10 er in 14.2 ip) in 12 contests at night.
- Has a win in four appearances against the Angels (4.1 ip, 5 h, 5 r, 5 er, 2 bb, 6 so, 1 hr, 10.38 ERA)
- Was on the A's Opening Day roster appeared in just two games before he was placed on the 10-day injured list April 6 retroactive to April 4 with a strained right groin...was reinstated May 8.

- Has converted each of his last nine save opportunities dating back to June 5 and has a 1.17 ERA (3 er in 23.0 ip) and .190 (15-for-79) opponents batting average in 22 games over that span.
- Is 16-for-18 (88.9%) in save opportunities...ranks fourth in the American League in save percentage and tied for sixth in saves.
- Has a 0.86 ERA (3 er in 31.1 ip) over his last 30 games and now has a 2.03 ERA for the season, which ranks sixth among AL relievers.
- Ranks seventh among AL relievers in innings pitched (48.2) and opponents slugging percentage (.276) and tied for eighth in games (46).
- Has a .155 (15-for-97) opponents batting average against right-handed hitters compared to .247 (18-for-73) against left-handers.
- Opponents are hitting .160 (8-for-50) with runners in scoring position.

- Is hitting .265 (61-for-230) with both of his home runs against right-handed pitchers, .171 (21-for-123) against left-handers.
- Has homered twice in his last 21 games after going homerless in his first 80.
- Committed his 11th error of the season last Monday night, which is tied for fourth most among AL shortstops.
- Is a career .290 hitter (233-for-804) with 40 doubles, three triples, 12 home runs and 75 RBI against the Angels...is batting .293 (110-for-376) in his career at Angel Stadium.
- Leads active players with 314 career stolen bases (Hamilton, CWS 313).

Last Year: Was hampered by a back injury for much of the season and batted .194 with three home runs and seven RBI in 29 games with Texas...had two stints on the 10-day injured list with the back injury (Aug. 20-30 and Sept. 12-end of season).

- Ranks fifth among American League rookies in home runs (12).
- Has made 48 of his 49 starts this year and 65 of 67 in his career in games in which the opponent starts a right-handed pitcher.
- Is 4-for-17 (.235) with four RBI, a homer, a walk and a sacrifice fly as a pinch hitter...leads AL pinch hitters in plate appearances (19), is tied for fourth in hits and tied for third in RBI.
- Is batting .250 (25-for-100) at home, .143 (13-for-91) on the road.
- More than half of his hits are for extra bases (20-of-38, 52.6%)...30 of his 60 (50.0%) career hits are extra base hits.
- Was recalled from the A's alternate site on April 6 and has started games at four different positions (35 in right field, nine in left field, three at designated hitter, two at first base).

Last Year: Went 0-for-5 with two strikeouts in seven games over three stints with Oakland...all five of his plate appearances came against right-handed pitchers...made just one start and went 0-for-2 as the A's designated hitter.
