ABOUT THE A'S: Have won three straight after losing four in a row and are now 7-6 since the All-Star Break...are 2-7-2 over the previous 11 series and have a 15-19 (.441) record over the last 34 games...are 59-46 (.562) overall, which is the fifth best record in the American League...are in second place in the AL West for the 36th consecutive day and trail first place Houston by 5½ games...that is one-half game short of the season high of six (July 27 and 28)...are in second place in the AL Wild Card, 3½ games behind Tampa Bay and 2½ games ahead of the third place team, Seattle...have spent 58 days alone in first place in the West, three days tied for first, 37 days in second, one day tied for second, three days in third, two days in fourth, three days tied for fourth and 10 days in fifth.

SHUT OUT: The A's tossed their third shutout in the last nine games last night, all three of which have come against the Angels...have shut outs in three straight games against the Angels for the first time since June 28-July 26, 1994...now have 10 shutouts for the season, which is tied with the Yankees for most in the American League (10)...the Major League lead is 12 (Brewers, Braves, Giants).

AGAINST THE WEST: The A's are in a stretch from July 19 to Aug. 8 where they are scheduled to play 13 of 17 games against American League West teams...are 5-3 against the West during the stretch...are now 24-23 (.511) against AL West competition overall compared to 35-23 (.603) against all other teams...have never made the playoffs with a losing record against the West.

A'S IN JULY: The A's are 11-12 (.478) in the month of July with one game remaining...that snaps a streak of streak of 10 consecutive months with a winning record (min. 10 games) dating back to May of 2019...need to win today to avoid their first losing month since April of 2019 when they went 11-15...the A's .478 winning percentage in July is fifth lowest in the American League but their 3.05 ERA (70 er in 206.2 ip) is second lowest in the majors (Brewers, 2.31)...have a .626 OPS, which is also second lowest to Milwaukee (.581)...have 213 strikeouts, which is the Athletics record for July (207 in 2016)...on offense, the A's have the second lowest OPS in the AL (.675), the second lowest batting average (.224), and have the third fewest runs scored (90)...have outscored the opposition 90-77.

PITCHING: The A's have a 3.16 ERA (172 er in 489.2 ip) over the last 55 games dating back to May 26, which is second lowest in the majors over that span (Brewers, 2.79)...have the third lowest opponents OPS (.651)...overall, rank third in the American League in ERA (3.68) and fifth opponents on-base percentage (.302), slugging percentage (.384) and OPS (.686)...have issued the fewest walks (281) and rank second in fewest home runs (113) and fewest pitches per inning (15.9).

STARTING PITCHING: A's starting pitchers have not allowed a run in the last three games (20.0 ip) and five of the last 10...are 6-2 with a 2.43 ERA (16 er in 59.1 ip) over the last 10 games...are 41-35 with a 3.63 ERA (244 er in 605.1 ip) for the season...rank third in the American League in ERA and wins and fourth in opponents OPS (.687)...lead the majors in innings pitched (605.1) and are tied for second in complete games (3)...have used the same five starting pitchers over the last 72 games dating back to May 7...over the last 17 years, the only time the A's have used the same five starting pitchers over a span of at least 72 games was April 25-Aug. 9, 2013 when they did it over a 92-game stretch (Colon, Griffin, Milone, Parker, Straily)...have employed just seven starting pitchers overall, which is second fewest in the majors to the Red Sox (6)...have four pitchers with 20 or more starts for the first time since 2013 when they had five.

BULLPEN: The A's bullpen has a 1.95 ERA (11 er in 50.2 ip) and .198 (36-for-182) opponents batting average over the last 18 games but is 2-2 with five saves and four blown saves...has converted 26-of-41 (63.4%) save opportunities for the season...has 11 losses, which is the fewest in the majors...ranks fourth in the American League in ERA (3.79) and fifth in opponents OPS (.684)...has the highest slugging percentage against first batters faced (.471), the third highest batting average (.270) and fifth highest on-base percentage (.331).

OFFENSE: The A's are batting .218 (206-for-945) with 108 runs scored over the last 28 games (3.86 runs per game)...are hitting .233 overall, which is fourth lowest in the American League...however, rank eighth in batting with runners in scoring position (.259) and ninth in runs scored (461)...lead the AL in hit by pitches (59), rank tied for second in sacrifice flies (34), third in fewest grounded into double plays (59), fourth in stolen base percentage (80.4%), tied for fourth in sacrifice hits (14), and fifth in walks (354)...A's pinch hitters lead the AL in hits (23), RBI (16), sacrifice flies (3) and plate appearances (102), are tied for the lead in home runs (3), rank second in extra base hits (6) and tied for second in doubles (3).

DEFENSIVE DOINGS: The A's have an eight-game errorless streak and have made just three errors over the last 17 games...have 44 for the season, which is second fewest in the American League (Astros, 42)...are tied for the fourth fewest double plays (75)...A's pitchers have five pickoffs, which is tied for fourth most...A's outfielders have nine assists, which is tied for second fewest to the Angels (8).

ONE-RUN GAMES AND OTHER CLOSE CALLS: The A's have lost each of their last four one-run games, 11 of the last 14 and are 15-18 (.455) overall...lead the American League in one-run games (33) and losses...are 23-26 (.469) in games decided by two runs or fewer compared to 36-20 (.643) in games decided by three runs or more...are 4-3 in extra innings and the seven extra inning games are tied for third fewest in the AL...are 12-7 in games decided in the last at bat...have eight walk-off wins, which is tied with the Mariners for the most in the AL...now have 91 walk-off wins in the Bob Melvin era, which are the most in the majors over that span.

HOME AND AWAY: The A's are 4-4 on this 10-game road trip to Seattle (1-3), San Diego (1-1) and Los Angeles-AL (2-0)...are now 10-13 on the road dating back to June 19 after starting the year 19-9 in away games...this is the second of three 10-game road trips this year and it is part of a stretch from July 6 to Aug. 19 where the A's are scheduled to play 26 of 36 games on the road...are 10-9 over the first 19 games of that stretch (7-7 on the road, 3-2 at home)...are 29-22 (.569) on the road compared to 30-24 (.556) at home...went 3-2 on the last homestand against Cleveland (1-2) and Los Angeles-AL (2-0)...return home following the game Sunday for a five-game homestand against San Diego (two games) and Texas (three games).

HOME AND AWAY SPLITS: The A's are batting .244 (431-for-1764) and are averaging 4.67 runs per game on the road (238 runs in 51 games) compared to .221 with an average of 4.13 runs per game at home...have the fifth best road batting average in the American League and the fifth best OPS (.732)...have the second lowest home batting average and third lowest OPS (.695)...have a 3.62 ERA (178 er in 442.2 ip) on the road, which is the lowest in the AL and fourth lowest in the majors...have 62 home runs in 54 games at home, 66 in 51 on the road.

THIS AND THAT: The A's are 26-15 (.634) in games in which the opponent starts a left-handed pitcher compared to 33-31 (.516) when they start a right-hander...the mark against lefties is second best in the American League (White Sox, 19-10/.655) and the 41 games are third most...are 36-8 (.818) when out-homering the opposition, 8-26 (.235) when they are out-homered...have used a different lineup in each of the last 42 games and have 102 different lineups over the first 105 contests.

A'S vs. ANGELS: The A's have won the season series for the third consecutive season as they are 11-3 with five games remaining...have a seven-game winning streak, which is the A's longest against the Angels over the last 19 years...last won more than six straight from Sept. 25, 2001-April 13, 2002 when they had a nine-game winning streak...are 30-13 (.698) against the Angels over the last three years...this year, the A's are 4-1 in Anaheim and went 7-2 in Oakland...the seven home wins matched the A's most home wins against the Angels...have a 2.23 ERA (31 er in 125.0 ip) and have outscored the Angels 67-35...since moving to Oakland in 1968, the A's are 467-389 against the Angels...that includes 247-184 in Oakland and 220-205 in Anaheim...all-time, the A's are 516-465 against the Angels.

TODAY'S TIDBITS

Matt Olson ranks third in the American League in OPS (.946), tied for third in home runs (27), fourth in slugging percentage (.574), tied for fourth in extra base hits (51), tied for seventh in RBI (67) and runs (68), 10th in on-base percentage (.371), and tied for 10th in doubles (24) and walks (49)...**Starling Marte** is tied for second in the majors in stolen bases (23)...based on a minimum of 250 plate appearances, he ranks seventh in on-base percentage (.399) and 17th in batting average (.299)...**Sergio Romo** has not allowed a run in his last 13 games dating back to June 29 (13.2 ip, 2 h, 3 bb, 13 so) and opponents are 2-for-41 (.049) over that span...**Lou Trivino** has converted each of his last 10 save opportunities dating back to June 5 and has a 1.13 ERA (3 er in 24.0 ip) and .193 (16-for-83) opponents batting average in 23 games over that span.

TODAY'S STARTING PITCHER: Cole Irvin (7-9, 3.62 ERA)

FOR STARTERS: Is 4-2 with a 3.02 ERA (18 er in 53.2 ip) with three home runs allowed in nine starts in June and July after going 3-7 with a 4.12 ERA with seven home runs in 11 starts in April and May...ranks 10th in the American League in opponents OPS (.680) and slugging percentage (.374)...has allowed just 10 home runs in 117.0 innings and his average of 0.77 home runs per nine innings is third lowest...is tied for third in hit by pitches (9) and tied for fifth in losses (9).

KEEPING THE PITCH COUNT DOWN: Is averaging 14.5 pitches per inning, which are the fewest in the majors (Kershaw, LAD 14.7)...has walked two batters or fewer in each of his 20 starts, including 11 starts with one walk and four starts with no walks...has issued just 21 free passes in 117.0 innings and his average of 1.62 walks per nine innings is the lowest in the American League and third lowest in the majors...is tied for eighth in the AL in strikeout-to-walk ratio (4.00) but is averaging the third fewest strikeouts per nine innings (6.46)...has walked one batter or fewer in 17 of his 23 career starts and has walked just 35 batters in 162.1 career innings (1.94 per nine innings).

DAYS REST: Is scheduled to start on five days rest today...is 6-2 with a 2.32 ERA (17 er in 66.0 ip) in 11 starts on five days rest or more compared to 1-6 with a 5.01 ERA (26 er in 46.2 ip) in eight starts on four days rest...eight of the 10 home runs he has allowed have come on four days rest.

AGAINST THE WEST: Is 2-7 with a 6.06 ERA (35 er in 52.0 ip) and .312 (67-for-215) opponents batting average in 10 starts against American League West competition, 5-2 with a 1.66 ERA (12 er in 65.0 ip) and .213 (51-for-239) opponents average in 10 starts against everyone else...his seven intradivision losses are the most in the majors and match the most by an A's pitcher over the last 28 years (Witt had 8 in 1993)...his 6.06 ERA is third highest in the majors.

EARLY AND LATE: Has a 3.04 ERA (27 er in 80.0 ip) over the first four innings of a game and a 4.86 ERA (20 er in 37.0 ip) from the fifth inning on...has a .231 (40-for-173) opponents batting average the first times through the order, .261 (43-for-165) the second time and .302 (35-for-116) after that.

NIGHT AND DAY: Is 5-4 with a 3.09 ERA (20 er in 58.1 ip) in 10 starts at night compared to 2-5 with a 4.14 ERA (27 er in 58.2 ip) in 10 starts during the day.

THIS AND THAT: Eight of the 10 home runs he has allowed have been solo shots...seven have come at home...opponents are hitting .326 (30-for-92) with runners in scoring position, which is second highest in the AL...is 7-1 in 10 starts with more than two runs of support, 0-8 in 10 starts with support of two runs or fewer...the A's are 10-10 (.500) in his starting assignments.

2021 HIGHLIGHTS: Was on the A's Opening Day roster and lost each of his first two starts, allowing four runs in each contest for a 7.45 ERA...went 0-2 with a 7.45 ERA over his first two starts on April 3 and 8, both against Houston...did not pitch again until April 17 against Detroit when he combined with Wendelken, Guerra and Weems on a five-hit shutout in a 7-0 win...it was his first win since May 17, 2019 against Colorado and it snapped a career-high four-game losing streak...that began a four-start stretch where he went 3-1 with a 1.42 ERA and .232 opponents batting average through May 4...tossed 6.0 scoreless innings in his start against the Tigers and then blanked the Orioles over the first five innings on April 23 for a career-high 11.0 inning scoreless streak...lost on April 28 at Tampa Bay but then picked up his third win on May 4 against Toronto...had career highs in innings pitched (8.0), strikeouts (9) and pitches (102) against the Blue Jays...then went 0-4 with a 5.40 ERA and .284 opponents batting average over his next five starts from May 9 to 30...the losing streak matched his career high (also May 22, 2019-April 8, 2021)...left with a 4-1 lead on May 15 at Minnesota but the pen allowed four runs in the eighth inning for the blown save...it was the first of three times the pen blew a save in one of his starts (June 11 vs. Kansas City, July 9 at Texas)...allowed a season-high five runs in an 8-4 loss to Houston on May 20...allowed a career-high 10 hits in 4.2 innings of work in a 4-3 loss to Seattle on May 25...went 1-4 with a 4.46 ERA in six starts in May...tied for second in the American League in losses in May...then compiled a 3-0 record and a 2.64 ERA in five starts in the month of June...the ERA was fourth lowest in the American League and the three-game winning streak was the longest of his career...allowed a run in the first inning on June 5 at Colorado and did not allow another run until the seventh inning of his next start on June 11 against Kansas City for a career-high tying 11.0-inning scoreless streak...tossed a career-high tying 8.0 innings and did not allow a run in a 6-2 win at San Francisco on June 27...did not allow a run over the first three innings of his next start on July 3 against Boston for another 11.0-inning scoreless streak...tied an Oakland record with three hit batters (13th time, last: Bassitt, April 29, 2021 at Tampa Bay) in a 3-2 loss at Texas on July 9.

LAST START: He was the losing pitcher in the A's 4-3 loss at Seattle last Sunday...tossed 4.0 innings, which was the shortest start of his career...retired eight of the first nine batters and had a 2-0 lead with two outs and the bases

empty in the third inning...the next six batters went single, walk, hit by pitch, two-run single, RBI single and RBI single...left after four innings with the A's trailing 4-2.

by Fletcher an a RBI single by Gosselin...those were the only runs he would allow in six innings of work...retired each of the final nine batters and 14 of the last 15...then had a no decision in the A's 8-4 win on June 16...allowed three runs in the first inning on RBI singles by Stassi, Ward and Gosselin, and one more run in the second on a solo home run by Ohtani...then retired 12 of the final 16 batters he faced and was relieved by Smith with two outs in the sixth inning, runners on first and third, and the A's trailing 4-2...Oakland scored six times in the bottom of the sixth for the win...the win came in the A's 4-1 victory on July 19...tossed 7.0 scoreless innings and allowed seven hits while walking one...retired the side in order just once...Ohtani shut out the A's over the first six innings but Oakland scored three times off the Angels bullpen in the seventh and Irvin was relieved by Trivino after allowing a lead-off single to Eaton in the eighth.

RHP James Kaprielian (5-4, 3.24 ERA): Was recalled from Triple-A Las Vegas May 12 and is scheduled to make his 14th start of the season and his career...is 1-3 with a 3.67 ERA and .246 opponents batting average over his last six starts after going 4-1 with a 2.84 ERA and .182 opponents average over his first seven starts...ranks sixth among American League rookies in innings pitched (72.1) and strikeouts (79) and is tied for sixth in wins (5) and games started (13)...based on a minimum of 0.5 innings per team game, his 3.24 ERA is second lowest in the AL (Garcia, HOU 3.19)...has a 1.04 ERA and .144 opponents batting average over the first two innings of a game, a 4.47 ERA and .256 opponents average from the third inning on...was the losing pitcher in his last start, a 7-4 A's loss at San Diego on Tuesday (4.1 ip, 7 h, 6 r, 6 er, 1 bb, 6 so)...is 1-0 with a 1.54 ERA (11.2 ip, 9 h, 2 r, 2 er, 3 bb, 16 so, 2 hr) in two career appearances against Los Angeles (AL), both start this year.

- Has not allowed a home run in his last 34 games (31.0 innings) and has yielded just one home run in 40.0 innings overall...his average of 0.23 home runs per nine innings is ninth lowest among ML relievers.
