OAKLAND ATHLETICS (59-47) VS. LOS ANGELES ANGELS (52-52)

SUNDAY, AUGUST 1, 2021 — ANGEL STADIUM — 1:07 PDT RHP DAULTON JEFFERIES (0-0, -.--) VS. LHP REID DETMERS (0-0, -.--) NBCSCA — A'S CAST ON IHEART RADIO — A'S RADIO NETWORK (960 AM, 103.7 FM HD2, 1140 AM)

ABOUT THE A'S: Snapped a three-game winning streak last night and are now 7-7 since the All-Star Break...are 2-7-2 over the previous 11 series and have a 15-20 (.429) record over the last 35 games...are 59-47 (.557) overall, which is the fifth best record in the American League...are in second place in the AL West for the 37th consecutive day and trail first place Houston by 5½ games...that is one-half game short of the season high of six (July 27 and 28)...are in second place in the AL Wild Card, 4 games behind Boston and 2½ games ahead of the third place teams, Seattle & New York-AL...have spent 58 days alone in first place in the West, three days tied for first, 38 days in second, one day tied for second, three days in third, two days in fourth, three days tied for fourth and 10 days in fifth.

SHUT OUT: The A's were shut out for the fifth time of the year yesterday... tossed their third shutout in nine games Friday night, all three of which have come against the Angels...had shut outs in three straight games against the Angels for the first time since June 28-July 26, 1994...now have 10 shutouts for the season, which is tied with the Yankees for most in the American League (10)...the Major League lead is 12 (Brewers, Braves, Giants).

AGAINST THE WEST: The A's are in a stretch from July 19 to Aug. 8 where they are scheduled to play 13 of 17 games against American League West teams... are 5-4 against the West during the stretch...are now 24-24 (.500) against AL West competition overall compared to 35-23 (.603) against all other teams... have never made the playoffs with a losing record against the West.

A's IN JULY: The A's went 11-13 (.458) in the month of July...that snaps a streak of streak of 10 consecutive months with a winning record (min. 10 games) dating back to May of 2019...it is their first losing month since April of 2019 when they went 11-15...the A's .458 winning percentage in July was fifth lowest in the American League but their 2.98 ERA (71 er in 214.2 ip) was second lowest in the majors (Brewers, 2.56)...had a .618 OPS, which was also second lowest to Milwaukee (.599)...had 221 strikeouts, which is the Athletics record for July (207 in 2016)...on offense, the A's had the second lowest OPS in the AL (.668), the second lowest batting average (.223), and have the second fewest runs scored (90)...outscored the opposition 90-78.

PITCHING: The A's have a 3.13 ERA (173 er in 497.2 ip) over the last 56 games dating back to May 26, which is second lowest in the majors over that span (Brewers, 2.93)...have the second lowest opponents OPS (.647)...overall, rank third in the American League in ERA (3.66), fourth opponents on-base percentage (.301), and fifth in slugging percentage (.383) and OPS (.683)...have issued the fewest walks (282) and rank second in fewest home runs (113) and fewest pitches per inning (15.9).

STARTING PITCHING: A's starting pitchers have allowed one run in the last four games (26.1 ip) and have been scoreless in five of the last 11...are 6-3 with a 2.33 ERA (17 er in 65.2 ip) over the last 11 games...are 41-36 with a 3.60 ERA (245 er in 611.2 ip) for the season...rank third in the American League in ERA and wins and fourth in opponents OPS (.684)...lead the majors in innings pitched (611.2) and are tied for second in complete games (3)... have used the same five starting pitchers over the last 73 games dating back to May 7...over the last 17 years, the only time the A's have used the same five starting pitchers over a span of at least 73 games was April 25-Aug. 9, 2013 when they did it over a 92-game stretch (Colon, Griffin, Milone, Parker, Straily)...have employed just seven starting pitchers overall, which is second fewest in the majors to the Red Sox (6)...have four pitchers with 20 or more starts for the first time since 2013 when they had five.

BULLPEN: The A's bullpen has a 1.89 ERA (11 er in 52.1 ip) and .193 (36-for-187) opponents batting average over the last 19 games but is 2-2 with five saves and four blown saves...has converted 26-of-41 (63.4%) save opportunities for the season...has 11 losses, which is the fewest in the majors...ranks fourth in the American League in ERA (3.77) and fourth in opponents OPS (.682).

OFFENSE: The A's are batting .217 (212-for-978) with 108 runs scored over the last 29 games (3.72 runs per game)...are hitting .232 overall, which is fourth lowest in the American League...however, rank eighth in batting with runners in scoring position (.257) and ninth in runs scored (461)...lead the AL in hit by pitches (60), rank tied for second in sacrifice flies (34), tied for third in fewest grounded into double plays (60), fourth in stolen base percentage (80.4%), tied for fourth in sacrifice hits (14), and fifth in walks (355)...A's pinch hitters lead the AL in hits (23), RBI (16), sacrifice flies (3) and plate appearances (103), are tied for the lead in home runs (3), rank second in extra base hits (6) and tied for second in doubles (3).

DEFENSIVE DOINGS: The A's snapped an eight-game errorless streak and have made just four errors over the last 18 games...have 45 for the season, which is second fewest in the American League (Astros, 43)...are tied for the fourth fewest double plays (75)...A's pitchers have five pickoffs, which is tied

for fourth most...A's outfielders have nine assists, which is tied for second fewest to the Angels (8).

ONE-RUN GAMES AND OTHER CLOSE CALLS: The A's have lost each of their last five one-run games, 12 of the last 15 and are 15-19 (.441) overall...lead the American League in one-run games (34) and losses...are 23-27 (.460) in games decided by two runs or fewer compared to 36-20 (.643) in games decided by three runs or more...are 4-3 in extra innings and the seven extra inning games are tied for third fewest in the AL...are 12-7 in games decided in the last at bat...have eight walk-off wins, which is tied with the Mariners for the most in the AL...now have 91 walk-off wins in the Bob Melvin era, which are the most in the majors over that span.

HOME AND AWAY: The A's are 4-5 on this 10-game road trip to Seattle (1-3), San Diego (1-1) and Los Angeles-AL (2-1)...are now 10-14 on the road dating back to June 19 after starting the year 19-9 in away games...this is the second of three 10-game road trips this year and it is part of a stretch from July 6 to Aug. 19 where the A's are scheduled to play 26 of 36 games on the road...are 10-10 over the first 20 games of that stretch (7-8 on the road, 3-2 at home)...are 29-23 (.558) on the road compared to 30-24 (.556) at home... went 3-2 on the last homestand against Cleveland (1-2) and Los Angeles-AL (2-0)...return home following the game Sunday for a five-game homestand against San Diego (two games) and Texas (three games).

HOME AND AWAY SPLITS: The A's are batting .243 (437-for-1797) and are averaging 4.58 runs per game on the road (238 runs in 52 games) compared to .221 with an average of 4.13 runs per game at home...have the fifth best road batting average in the American League and the fifth best OPS (.728)... have the second lowest home batting average and third lowest OPS (.695)... have a 3.57 ERA (179 er in 450.2 ip) on the road, which is the lowest in the AL and fourth lowest in the majors...have 62 home runs in 54 games at home, 66 in 52 on the road.

THIS AND THAT: The A's are 26-15 (.634) in games in which the opponent starts a left-handed pitcher compared to 33-32 (.508) when they start a right-hander...the mark against lefties is second best in the American League (White Sox, 19-10/.655) and the 41 games are third most...are 36-8 (.818) when out-homering the opposition, 8-26 (.235) when they are out-homered...have used a different lineup in each of the last 43 games and have 103 different lineups over the first 106 contests.

A's vs. ANGELS: The A's have won the season series for the third consecutive season as they are 11-4 with four games remaining...snapped a seven-game winning streak, which was the A's longest against the Angels over the last 19 years...last won more than six straight from Sept. 25, 2001-April 13, 2002 when they had a nine-game winning streak...are 30-14 (.682) against the Angels over the last three years...this year, the A's are 4-2 in Anaheim and went 7-2 in Oakland...the seven home wins matched the A's most home wins against the Angels...have a 2.17 ERA (32 er in 133.0 ip) and have outscored the Angels 67-36...since moving to Oakland in 1968, the A's are 467-390 against the Angels...that includes 247-184 in Oakland and 220-206 in Anaheim...all-time, the A's are 516-466 against the Angels.

TODAY'S TIDBITS

Matt Olson ranks third in the American League in OPS (.944), tied for third in home runs (27), fourth in slugging percentage (.573), tied for fourth in extra base hits (52), tied for seventh in RBI (67) and runs (68), 11th in onbase percentage (.370), and tied for eighth in doubles (25) and is 11th in walks (50)...Starling Marte is tied for second in the majors in stolen bases (23)...based on a minimum of 250 plate appearances, he ranks seventh in on-base percentage (.401) and 17th in batting average (.299)...Sergio Romo has not allowed a run in his last 13 games dating back to June 29 (13.2 ip, 2 h, 3 bb, 13 so) and opponents are 2-for-41 (.049) over that span... Lou Trivino has converted each of his last 10 save opportunities dating back to June 5 and has a 1.13 ERA (3 er in 24.0 ip) and .193 (16-for-83) opponents batting average in 23 games over that span.

THIS DATE IN ATHLETICS HISTORY

In 1976 the A's steal a club record 12 bases in an 8-7, 12 inning loss in the first game of a doubleheader at Minnesota...in that game, Craig Kusick's eighth inning homer off Vida Blue snaps Blue's club record string of 140.2 innings without a home run...in 1988 Jose Canseco hits his 100th career home run off Melido Perez in the A's 10-2 win at Chicago...in 1999 Miguel Tejada, Eric Chavez, Jason Giambi and John Jaha all homer in the fourth inning of the A's 10-6 win over Tampa Bay...the four home runs in an inning ties the Oakland record...in 2009 Rickey Henderson becomes the fifth player in Athletics history to have his uniform retired when the A's retire #24.

FOR STARTERS: Was recalled from Triple-A Las Vegas today and will be making his 2021 debut...it will be the second start and appeance of his career as he made his Major League debut last year as the 29th man for a double-header vs. Texas on Sept. 12.

LAST MINOR LEAGUE START: Did not factor into the decision in his last minor league start in a 5-6 Las Vegas loss to Salt Lake on July 26...allowed four runs on 10 hits, including two home runs...issued zero walks and struck out four batters...with the game tied at four apiece, was relieved by Ben Bracewell to open the sixth...Salt Lake went on to win with a walk-off single off of Reymin Guduan.

SPRING TRAINING: Made six spring training appearances (four starts), going 3-0 with a 1.50 ERA (3 er in 18.0 ip)...three of his six outings were scoreless and did not allow an earned run in four of six...allowed just one run in 12.0 innings as a starter...earned the win in his final start of the spring on March 28 at San Francisco (5.0 ip, 3 h, r, er, 3 bb, 4 so)...was optioned to the A's Alternate Site on April 1.

MINOR LEAGUE HIGHLIGHTS: Is 3-1 with a 5.19 ERA (34 er in 59.0 ip) over 12 starts with Triple-A Las Vegas this season...four of his last five outings dating back to July 9 have been quality starts and he is 1-0 with a 3.75 ERA (10 er in 24.0 ip) over that span...among Triple-A West pitchers with 40.0 ip at the time of his promotion, his 1.37 walks per nine innings ranked first and his nine total walks were tied for second fewest...also led Triple-A West pitchers with a 6.00 strikeout-to-walk ratio and ranked 13th with 54 strikeouts...did not allow a walk in seven of his 12 starts...pitched a career-high 7.0 innings on July 15, 2021 against El Paso (W, 7.0 ip, 3 h, r, er, bb, 3 so, 86 p)...struck out a career-high nine batters in two starts in July (July 3, 2021 vs. Sacramento; July 20, 2021 vs. El Paso)...threw a career-high 91 pitches in each of those games...has issued more than two walks in an outing just once in his career (June 14, 2021 vs. Reno) and has allowed more than one free pass in just four career minor league outings...was on the 7-day injured list May 6-21 with right biceps tendinitis.

2020 RECAP: Made his Major League debut as the 29th man for a double-header at Texas on Sept. 12 (L, 2.0 ip, 5 h, 5 r, 5 er, 2 bb, so, 2 hr)...allowed five runs in the first inning on a three-run home run by Odor and a two-run home run by Guzman then retired three of four batters int he second... was on the A's Taxi Squad for each of the final two road trips of the regular season and the postseason...made one Spring Training appearance (0.2 ip, 3 h, 3 r, 3 er, 1 bb) before he was optioned to Triple-A Las Vegas March 6...was added to the A's 60-man player pool June 29.

CAREER: Was a Competitive Balance Round A selection of the A's in the 2016 First-Year Player Draft (37th selection overall) but pitched in just eight games over his first three seasons due to April 26, 2017 "Tommy John" surgery... has made 12 appearances in 2021 and is now 5-3 with a 3.92 ERA in 46 career minor league appearances, including 34 starts...in 158.1 innings, he has struck out 175 (9.95 per nine innings) and walked just 21 (1.19 per nine innings)...was rated as the A's number four prospect by Baseball America following the 2019 season.
