OAKLAND ATHLETICS (60-47) VS. SAN DIEGO PADRES (61-47)

TUESDAY, AUGUST 3, 2021 — OAKLAND COLISEUM — 6:40 PDT LHP SEAN MANAEA (8-6, 3.01) VS. LHP BLAKE SNELL (4-4, 5.44)

ABOUT THE A'S: Have won four of the last five games after losing four straight and are now 8-7 since the All-Star Break...are 3-7-2 over the previous 12 series and have a 16-20 (.444) record over the last 36 games...are 60-47 (.561) overall, which is the fifth best record in the American League...are in second place in the AL West for the 39th consecutive day and trail first place Houston by 4½ games...are in second place in the AL Wild Card, three games behind Boston and three games ahead of the third place teams, Seattle and New York...have spent 58 days alone in first place in the West, three days tied for first, 40 days in second, one day tied for second, three days in third, two days in fourth, three days tied for fourth and 10 days in fifth.

DAYS OFF: Yesterday was the first of three off days over an eight-day stretch for the A's...have Thursday off following this two-game series with the Padres and Monday off before beginning a stretch of 15 games in 15 days...the A's are 11-3 (.786) following a day off, which is the best record in the majors... only the Cubs and Padres, with 13, have fewer games.

INTERLEAGUE PLAY: The A's are 9-6 (.600) in interleague play, which is tied for the eighth best record in the majors...following this two-game series with San Diego, the A's will conclude interleague play by hosting San Francisco in a three-game series from Aug. 20-22...need one more win to clinch at least a .500 record against the National League...went 10-10 (.500) in interleague play last year and finished with a .500 record or better against the NL for the third consecutive season and 17th time in 24 years of interleague play...are 247-212 (.538) all-time in interleague games, which is fourth best in Major League history.

A NEW STARTER: Daulton Jefferies started for the A's on Sunday, ending a 73-game streak that ran from May 7 to July 31 where the A's used the same five starting pitchers...that was the second longest such streak by an A's team over the last 17 years (92, April 25-Aug. 9, 2013)...Jefferies is just the eighth starting pitcher the A's have employed this year, which is tied with the Reds and Astros for second fewest in the majors (Red Sox, 6)...are the only team in the majors with four pitchers with 21 or more starts.

PITCHING: The A's allowed just four runs and 20 hits in the four-game series at Los Angeles (AL) over the weekend for a 1.03 ERA (4 er in 35.0 ip) and .163 (20-for-123) opponents batting average...had back-to-back shutouts on Thursday and Friday and now have 10 for the season, which is tied with the Yankees for the most in the American League...now have a 3.13 ERA (176 er in 506.2 ip) over the last 57 games dating back to May 26, which is second lowest in the majors over that span (Brewers, 2.88)...also have the second lowest opponents OPS (.645) over that stretch to the Brewers (.627)...overall, rank third in the AL in ERA (3.66) and fourth opponents on-base percentage (.300), slugging percentage (.382) and OPS (.682)...have issued the fewest walks (285) and rank second in fewest home runs (114) and fewest pitches per inning (15.9).

STARTING PITCHING: A's starting pitchers have not allowed a run in five of the last 12 games and are 7-3 with a 2.80 ERA (22 er in 70.2 ip) and .207 (54-for-261) opponents batting average over that span...are 42-36 with a 3.62 ERA (248 er in 616.2 ip) for the season...rank second in the American League in wins, third in ERA and fourth in opponents OPS (.684)...lead the majors in innings pitched (616.2) and are tied for second in complete games (3).

BULLPEN: The A's bullpen did not allow a run in the four-game series at Los Angeles-AL (9.2 ip, 3 h, 1 bb, 9 so)...has converted each of its three save opportunities over the last 13 games and has a 2.06 ERA (8 er in 35.0 ip) over that span...is 26-for-41 (63.4%) in save opportunities for the season, which is the fifth best percentage in the American League...ranks third in opponents OPS (.678) and fourth in ERA (3.73) ...has 11 losses, which is the fewest in the majors...has the highest slugging percentage against first batters faced in the AL (.465) and the third highest batting average (.266).

OFFENSE: The A's have the fifth lowest batting average in the American League (.233) but rank seventh in batting with runners in scoring position (.258) and ninth in runs scored (469)...lead the AL in hit by pitches (62), rank third in stolen base percentage (81.4%), sacrifice flies (34) and fewest grounded into double plays (60) and fifth in walks (358) and sacrifice hits (14)...A's pinch hitters lead the AL in hits (23), RBI (16), sacrifice flies (3) and plate appearances (103), are tied for the lead in home runs (3), rank second in extra base hits (6) and tied for second in doubles (3).

DEFENSIVE DOINGS: The A's have committed just one error in the last 10 games and have 45 for the season, which is second fewest in the American League (Astros, 43)...have the fifth fewest double plays (77)...A's pitchers have five pickoffs, which is tied for fourth most...A's outfielders have nine assists, which is tied with the Angels and Tigers for the fewest.

HOME AND AWAY: The A's begin a five-game homestand against San Diego (two games) and Texas (three games) tonight...went 3-2 on the last homestand against Cleveland (1-2) and Los Angeles-AL (2-0)...are in a stretch from July 6 to Aug. 19 where they are scheduled to play 26 of 36 games on the road...are 11-10 over the first 21 games of that stretch (8-8 on the road, 3-2 at home)...overall, are 30-24 (.556) at home compared to 30-23 (.566) on the road...went 5-5 on the last road trip to Seattle (1-3), San Diego (1-1) and Los Angeles-AL (3-1).

HOME AND AWAY SPLITS: The A's are batting .221 (375-for-1698) and are averaging 4.13 runs per game at home (223 runs in 54 games) compared to .245 with an average of 4.64 runs per game on the road...have the second lowest home batting average in the American League and third lowest OPS... have the fourth best road batting average and fifth best OPS.

ONE-RUN GAMES AND OTHER CLOSE CALLS: The A's have lost each of their last five one-run games, 12 of the last 15 and are 15-19 (.441) overall...lead the American League in one-run games (34) and losses...are 23-27 (.460) in games decided by two runs or fewer compared to 37-20 (.649) in games decided by three runs or more...have eight walk-off wins, which is tied with the Mariners for the most in the AL...now have 91 walk-off wins in the Bob Melvin era, which are the most in the majors over that span...are 4-3 in extra innings and the seven extra inning games are third fewest in the AL...are 12-7 in games decided in the last at bat

THIS AND THAT: The A's are 27-15 (.643) in games in which the opponent starts a left-handed pitcher compared to 33-32 (.508) when they start a right-hander...the mark against lefties is second best in the American League (White Sox, 19-10/.655) and the 42 games are third most...are 37-8 (.822) when out-homering the opposition, 8-27 (.229) when they are out-homered...have used a different lineup in each of the last 44 games and have 104 different lineups over the first 107 contests.

A's IN JULY: The A's went 11-13 (.458) in July, which was the fifth worst record in the American League...it was the A's first losing record in a month of 10 or more games since they went 11-15 in April of 2019, snapping a streak of 10 consecutive months with a winning record...however, had the second lowest ERA (2.98) and OPS (.618) in July in the majors (Brewers, 2.56 and .599)...A's pitchers set a franchise record for July strikeouts (221)...had the second lowest opponents batting average (.219) and on-base percentage (.282) in July in Oakland history, the fourth lowest OPS slugging percentage (.335) and seventh lowest ERA...on offense, the A's had the second lowest batting average (.223) and OPS (.668) and the second fewest runs scored (90) in the majors to Texas (.198, .615, 76)...had the second lowest July batting average in Oakland history and the third lowest on-base percentage (.294) but were hit by a pitch 15 times, which tied for the most (2018)...outscored the opposition 90-78.

A's vs. PADRES: The season series is even at one game each as the A's split a two-game series in San Diego last week...lost two of three to San Diego last year in Oakland for their first season series loss to the Padres since 2006 when they also lost two of three...are 13-6 against San Diego dating back to 2009...lead the all-time series 25-13 (.658)...are 12-6 in Oakland and 13-7 in San Diego...including 8-4 at Petco Park.

TODAY'S TIDBITS

Matt Olson ranks third in the American League in OPS (.953) and home runs (28), fourth in slugging percentage (.580), tied for fourth in extra base hits (53) and sacrifice flies (7), seventh in runs (69) and RBI (70), eighth in on-base percentage (.373), tied for eighth in doubles (25) and tied for 10th in walks (51)...Starling Marte ranks second in the majors in stolen bases (26)...Sergio Romo has not allowed a run in his last 14 games dating back to June 29 (14.2 ip, 3 h, 2 bb, 16 so) and opponents are 3-for-45 (.067) over that span...Lou Trivino has converted each of his last 10 save opportunities dating back to June 5 and has a 1.13 ERA (3 er in 24.0 ip) and .193 (16-for-83) opponents batting average in 23 games over that span.

THIS DATE IN ATHLETICS HISTORY

In 1933 Lefty Grove became the first pitcher since August 2, 1931, a span of 308 games, to shutout the New York Yankees, winning 7-0...in 1991 Dave Henderson hits three home runs and the A's blast a total of six, but all are solo shots as the A's lose 8-6 to Minnesota...the Twins score seven runs in the eighth and add an insurance run in the ninth...in 2002 Mark Ellis ties an Oakland record with two triples in an 8-4 win over Detroit...in 2018 Ramón Laureano becomes the first player in Athletics history with a walk-off RBI for his first Major League hit when he singles in the bottom of the 13th inning of the A's 1-0 win over Detroit.

TODAY'S STARTING PITCHER: Sean Manaea (8-6, 3.01 ERA)

FOR STARTERS: Has allowed one run or fewer in eight of his last 12 starts dating back to May 23 and has a 2.08 ERA (17 er in 73.2 ip) and .203 (55-for-271) opponents batting average over that span...however, has a 5-4 record... has received a total of four runs of support in his four losses over that span and the bullpen has blown the save in two of the three no decisions...went 3-2 with a 4.41 ERA and .283 opponents average over his first nine starts... has allowed one run or fewer in 12 of his 21 starts...the A's are 6-1 in his no decisions and are 14-7 (.667) in his starting assignments...are 25-12 (.676) when he starts over the last three years.

AMONG THE LEADERS: Ranks third in the American League in ERA (3.01), tied for sixth in games started (21), seventh in opponents OPS (.652) and slugging percentage (.367), eighth in on-base percentage (.285) and ninth in innings pitched (122.2)...has allowed 14 home runs in 122.2 innings and his average of 1.03 home runs per nine innings is ninth lowest...is one of two pitchers in the majors with two shutouts (DeSclafani, SF) and one of six with two or more complete games.

STRIKEOUTS AND WALKS: Had 41 strikeouts and just five walks in five starts and 30.0 innings in July...the strikeouts tied for third in the American League in July and tied Mike Moore (1989) for the third highest total in July in Oakland history behind Vida Blue (55 in 1971, 42 in 1976)...now has 137 strikeouts for the season, which ranks seventh in the American League and is three short of his career high of 140 in 2017...has walked just 29 for an average of 2.13 per nine innings, which is eighth lowest in the AL...his strikeout-to-walk ratio of 4.72 is third best in the AL...has three games of 10 or more strikeout this year and six in his career...the six 10-strikeout games are tied for seventh most in Oakland history...has more strikeouts than innings pitched in 11 of his 21 starts...has walked two batters or fewer 17 times, including seven starts with one walk and five with no walks.

INTERLEAGUE PLAY: Is 2-1 with a 0.50 ERA (18.0 ip, 6 h, 1 r, 1 er, 6 bb, 19 so) in three interleague starts this year and is 4-2 with a 2.03 ERA (9 er in 40.0 ip) over his last seven interleague starts dating back to Aug. 20, 2020...is now 7-9 with a 3.51 ERA (47 er in 120.2 ip) in 22 career starts against the National League compared to 40-28 with a 3.73 ERA (228 er in 549.2 ip) in 96 games against the American League.

LEFT AND RIGHT: Has allowed a .174 (21-for-121) batting average against left-handed hitters compared to .259 (90-for-348) against right-handers... the mark against lefties is second lowest in the American League (Kikuchi, SEA .109)...has surrendered six home runs in 121 at bats against lefties and eight in 348 at bats against righties...has issued 22 of his 29 walks to righties.

DAYS REST: Is scheduled to start on five days rest...is 3-1 with a 1.38 ERA (9 er in 58.2 ip) in nine starts on four days rest compared to 4-4 with a 4.50 ERA (24 er in 48.0 ip) in nine starts on five days rest...over the last three years, he is 7-2 with a 2.37 ERA (26 er in 98.2 ip) in 17 starts on four days rest, 5-5 with a 4.50 ERA (29 er in 58.0 ip) in 11 starts on five days rest.

2021 HIGHLIGHTS: Took the loss in his first start but then went 3-0 with a 1.50 ERA over his next four starts...picked up his first win of the season in the 100th game of his career, an 8-4 victory over Detroit on April 15...tossed a six-hit, seven-inning shutout in the A's 7-0 win over Minnesota in the first game of the doubleheader April 20...it was the 11th complete game shutout of fewer than eight innings in Oakland history and his second career complete game and shutout...the start was the 100th of his career and he became the 25th pitcher in Oakland history to make 100 starts...had 10 strikeouts on May 7 against Tampa Bay, but had a no decision in the A's 2-1 win...retired each of the first 18 batters he faced before walking Arozarena to start the seventh...allowed one run or fewer in five consecutive starts from May 23 to June 14 and went 3-0 with a 0.84 ERA over that span...became the first A's pitcher with five consecutive games of one run or fewer and five innings pitched or more since Trevor Cahill (April 17-May 9, 2011)...had a no decision in the A's 6-5 loss at Los Angeles (AL) on May 23...left with a 4-1 lead but the bullpen blew the save...it was the first of two times the pen blew the save in one of his starts (July 16 vs. Cleveland)...struck out Justin Upton to lead off the game for the 50,000 strikeout in Oakland history...fanned Taylor Ward to end the fourth inning for his 500th career strikeout...tossed a four-hit shutout in the A's 6-0 win at Seattle on June 2...it was his third career complete game and shutout, his second this year...then combined with Petit, Trivino and Diekman on a two-hit shutout in the A's 4-0 win on June 9 against Arizona...it was the second time in his career he did not allow a run in back-to-back starts (Sept. 14-20, 2016)...had a career-high 16.0-inning scoreless streak from June 2 to 14...struck out 11 batters in 5.1 innings June 20 at New York (AL) but was the losing pitcher in the A's 2-1 loss...the 11 strikeouts match the most in Athletics history by a pitcher with fewer than six innings pitched (Kirk Saarloos on Sept. 19, 2006 and Tim Hudson on June 8, 1999)... went 2-for-2 with a double June 25 at San Francisco...it was the first extra base hit by an A's pitcher since Joe Kennedy doubled on June 12, 2007 at Houston...was named American League Pitcher of the Month for June after

going 3-2 with a 1.13 ERA and .181 opponents batting average in five starts... struck out 34 batters in 32.0 innings and allowed just one home run...it was the second time he was named Pitcher of the Month (April, 2018)...struck out a career-high 13 batters in 7.0 innings in a 4-1 win at Seattle on July 22...matched the most strikeouts in Athletics history by a pitcher with seven innings or fewer (Montas, Sept. 27, 2020 vs. Seattle; Blue, April 9, 1971 vs. Kansas City) and equaled the seventh highest single-game total in Oakland history.

LAST START: He won his second consecutive start in the A's 10-4 win at San Diego last Wednesday...retired each of the first 16 batters before walking Profar with one out in the sixth...Hosmer followed with a single to break up the no-hitter...those were the only two base runners he would allow in six innings of work and he left with a 10-0 lead...it was his third career start where he was perfect through at least five innings (Sept. 10, 2020 vs. Houston, 5.0; May 7, 2021 vs. Tampa Bay, 6.0)...according to the Elias Sports Bureau, he is the second pitcher in Oakland history with three or more starts where he was perfect through five innings (Barry Zito).

RHP Frankie Montas (9-8, 4.08 ERA): Is 4-4 with a 3.41 ERA, .225 opponents average and five home runs allowed over his last 11 starts dating back to May 29 after going 5-4 with a 4.92 ERA, .274 opponents average and 11 home runs over his first 10 starts...went 2-1 with a 2.30 ERA and .204 opponents batting average in five starts in July...struck out 40 in 31.1 innings and walked just nine while surrendering two home runs...his strikeouts ranked fifth in the American League and fifth in Oakland history in the month of July...also ranked seventh in the AL in ERA and opponents batting average, ninth in slugging percentage (.310) and 10th in OPS (.588)...was the winning pitcher in his last start, a 4-0 A's win at Los Angeles (AL) last Thursday (7.0 ip, 3 h, 3 bb, 10 so)...was the winning pitcher in his only career appearance, a start in the A's 12-4 win at San Diego on June 20, 2018 (6.2 ip, 5 h, 1 r, 1 er, 3 bb, 6 so)...is 1-1 with an 8.53 ERA in three interleague starts this year.
