OAKLAND ATHLETICS (60-48) VS. SAN DIEGO PADRES (62-47)

WEDNESDAY, AUGUST 4, 2021 — OAKLAND COLISEUM — 12:37 PDT RHP FRANKIE MONTAS (9-8, 4.08) VS. RHP JOE MUSGROVE (7-7, 2.94) NBCSCA — A'S CAST ON IHEART RADIO — A'S RADIO NETWORK (960 AM, 103.7 FM HD2, 1140 AM)

ABOUT THE A'S: Have won four of the last six games after losing four straight and are now 8-8 since the All-Star Break...are 3-7-2 over the previous 12 series and have a 16-21 (.432) record over the last 37 games...are 60-48 (.556) overall, which is the fifth best record in the American League...are in second place in the AL West for the 40th consecutive day and trail first place Houston by 5½ games...that is one-half game short of the season high of six (July 27 and 28)...are in second place in the AL Wild Card, three games behind Boston and two games ahead of the third place teams, Seattle and New York... have spent 58 days alone in first place in the West, three days tied for first, 41 days in second, one day tied for second, three days in third, two days in fourth, three days tied for fourth and 10 days in fifth.

ON THE BASES: The A's stole a season-high tying four bases last night (April 20 vs. Minnesota, Game 1) after swiping three bags on Sunday...it is the first time Oakland has stolen at least three bases in back-to-back games since April 21-22, 2012...are 52-for-63 (82.5%) in stolen base attempts for the season...have the second best stolen base percentage in the American League and the 52 steals are the most by an A's team since 2017 (57).

INTERLEAGUE PLAY: The A's are 9-7 (.563) in interleague play, which is tied for the 10th best record in the majors...after today, the A's will conclude interleague play by hosting San Francisco in a three-game series from Aug. 20-22...need one more win to clinch at least a .500 record against the National League...went 10-10 (.500) in interleague play last year and finished with a .500 record or better against the NL for the third consecutive season and 17th time in 24 years of interleague play...are 247-213 (.537) all-time in interleague games, which is fourth best in Major League history.

PITCHING: The A's allowed eight runs on 14 hits last night after allowing just four runs and 20 hits in the four-game series at Los Angeles (AL) over the weekend...have a 3.21 ERA (184 er in 515.2 ip) over the last 58 games dating back to May 26, which is second lowest in the majors over that span (Brewers, 2.93)...also have the second lowest opponents OPS (.649) over that stretch to the Brewers (.628)...overall, rank fourth in the AL in ERA (3.70) and opponents on-base percentage (.301) and fifth in slugging percentage (.383) and OPS (.684)...have issued the fewest walks (288), are tied for the lead in shutouts (10) and rank second in fewest home runs (115) and fewest pitches per inning (15.9).

STARTING PITCHING: Sean Manaea allowed five runs last night after A's starting pitchers allowed just four runs over the previous five games...starters have not allowed a run in five of the last 13 games and are 7-4 with a 3.24 ERA (27 er in 75.0 ip) and .220 (62-for-282) opponents batting average over that span...are 42-37 with a 3.67 ERA (253 er in 621.0 ip) for the season...are tied for second in the American League in wins, rank third in ERA and fourth in opponents OPS (.687)...lead the majors in innings pitched (621.0) and are tied for second in complete games (3)...have used just eight starting pitchers this year, which is tied with the Reds and Astros for second fewest in the majors (Red Sox, 6)...are one of two teams in the majors with four pitchers with 21 or more starts (Red Sox).

BULLPEN: The A's bullpen has converted each of its three save opportunities over the last 14 games and has a 2.50 ERA (11 er in 39.2 ip) over that span... is 26-for-41 (63.4%) in save opportunities for the season...ranks fourth in the American League in ERA (3.75) and opponents OPS (.679)...has 11 losses, which is the fewest in the majors...has the second highest slugging percentage against first batters faced in the AL (.462) and the third highest batting average (.264).

OFFENSE: The A's went 0-for-13 with runners in scoring position last night, which were their most hitless at bats with RISP since May 13, 2015 when the went 0-for-14 in a 2-0 loss to Boston...are hitting .254 with RISP for the season, which ranks eighth in the American League...are hitting .233 overall, which is fourth lowest in the AL...lead the AL in hit by pitches (62), rank third in sacrifice flies (34) and fewest grounded into double plays (60) and fifth in walks (361) and sacrifice hits (14)...A's pinch hitters lead the AL in hits (23), RBI (16), sacrifice flies (3) and plate appearances (103), are tied for the lead in home runs (3), rank second in extra base hits (6) and tied for second in doubles (3).

DEFENSIVE DOINGS: The A's have committed just one error in the last 11 games and have 45 for the season, which is tied with the Astros for the fewest in the majors...have the fifth fewest double plays in the American League (77)...A's pitchers have five pickoffs, which is tied for fourth most in the AL... A's outfielders have nine assists, which is tied with the Angels and Tigers for the fewest in the AL.

HOME AND AWAY: The A's are 0-1 on this five-game homestand against San Diego (0-1) and Texas (three games)...went 3-2 on the last homestand against Cleveland (1-2) and Los Angeles-AL (2-0)...are in a stretch from July 6 to Aug. 19 where they are scheduled to play 26 of 36 games on the road... are 11-11 over the first 22 games of that stretch (8-8 on the road, 3-3 at home)...overall, are 30-25 (.545) at home compared to 30-23 (.566) on the road...went 5-5 on the last road trip to Seattle (1-3), San Diego (1-1) and Los Angeles-AL (3-1).

HOME AND AWAY SPLITS: The A's are batting .221 (382-for-1731) and are averaging 4.07 runs per game at home (224 runs in 55 games) compared to .245 with an average of 4.64 runs per game on the road...have the second lowest home batting average in the American League and third lowest OPS (.695)...have the fourth best road batting average and fifth best OPS (.731).

ONE-RUN GAMES AND OTHER CLOSE CALLS: The A's have lost each of their last five one-run games, 12 of the last 15 and are 15-19 (.441) overall...lead the American League in one-run games (34) and losses...are 23-27 (.460) in games decided by two runs or fewer compared to 37-21 (.638) in games decided by three runs or more...have eight walk-off wins, which is tied with the Mariners for the most in the AL...now have 91 walk-off wins in the Bob Melvin era, which are the most in the majors over that span...are 4-3 in extra innings and the seven extra inning games are third fewest in the AL...are 12-7 in games decided in the last at bat

THIS AND THAT: The A's are 27-16 (.628) in games in which the opponent starts a left-handed pitcher compared to 33-32 (.508) when they start a right-hander...the mark against lefties is second best in the American League (White Sox, 20-10/.667) and the 43 games are tied for second most...have the day off tomorrow, the second of three off days over an eight-day stretch from Monday to next Monday...are 37-8 (.822) when out-homering the opposition, 8-27 (.229) when they are out-homered...have used a different lineup in each of the last 45 games and have 105 different lineups over the first 108 contests.

A's IN JULY: The A's went 11-13 (.458) in July, which was the fifth worst record in the American League...it was the A's first losing record in a month of 10 or more games since they went 11-15 in April of 2019, snapping a streak of 10 consecutive months with a winning record...however, had the second lowest ERA (2.98) and OPS (.618) in July in the majors (Brewers, 2.56 and .599)...A's pitchers set a franchise record for July strikeouts (221)...had the second lowest opponents batting average (.219) and on-base percentage (.282) in July in Oakland history, the fourth lowest OPS slugging percentage (.335) and seventh lowest ERA...on offense, the A's had the second lowest batting average (.223) and OPS (.668) and the second fewest runs scored (90) in the majors to Texas (.198, .615, 76)...had the second lowest July batting average in Oakland history and the third lowest on-base percentage (.294).

A's vs. PADRES: The A's are 1-2 against San Diego...lost the first game in Oakland last night after splitting a two-game series in San Diego last week... lost two of three to San Diego last year in Oakland for their first season series loss to the Padres since 2006 when they also lost two of three...are 13-7 against San Diego dating back to 2009...lead the all-time series 25-14...are 12-7 in Oakland and 13-7 in San Diego...including 8-4 at Petco Park.

TODAY'S TIDBITS

Matt Olson ranks third in the American League in OPS (.943) and home runs (28), fourth in slugging percentage (.573), tied for fourth in extra base hits (53) and sacrifice flies (7), seventh in RBI (70), tied for seventh in runs (69), tied for eighth in doubles (25), 10th in on-base percentage (.370) and tied for 10th in walks (51)...Starling Marte is batting a Major League leading .443 (27-for-61) since the All-Star Break...also leads the majors in steals since the break (10) and ranks second in on-base percentage (.507). Sergio Romo has not allowed a run in his last 14 games dating back to June 29 (14.2 ip, 3 h, 2 bb, 16 so) and opponents are 3-for-45 (.067) over that span...Lou Trivino has converted each of his last 10 save opportunities dating back to June 5 and has a 1.13 ERA (3 er in 24.0 ip) and .193 (16-for-83) opponents batting average in 23 games over that span.

In **1910** Jack Coombs and Ed Walsh of the Chicago White Sox duel 16 innings to a scoreless tie...Coombs allows just three hits...in **1992** Jose Canseco ties an Oakland record when he walks five times in the A's 9-0 win at Texas...in **2002** Miguel Tejada hits a three-run home run in the A's 4-0 win over Detroit to extend his hitting streak to 24 games...he falls one short of Jason Giambi's Oakland record of 25.

FOR STARTERS: Is 4-4 with a 3.41 ERA (25 er in 66.0 ip), .225 (56-for-249) opponents average and five home runs allowed over his last 11 starts dating back to May 29 after going 5-4 with a 4.92 ERA, .274 opponents average and 11 home runs over his first 10 starts...is tied for eighth in the American League in wins (9) but is tied for ninth in losses (8).

CAREER BESTS: Picked up his ninth win of the season in his last start, which matches his career high established in 2019...already has career highs in nearly every other category including games started (21), innings pitched (119.0), strikeouts (132), losses (8), hits (116), runs (59), earned runs (54), walks (33) and home runs (16).

STRIKEOUTS: Has 10 strikeouts in each of his last two starts and is the first A's pitcher with back-to-back 10 strikeout games since Brandon McCarthy (Aug. 29-Sept. 3, 2011)...the only pitcher in Athletics history with three straight 10-strikeout games is Vida Blue (Aug. 24-Sept. 3, 1971)...has three 10-strikeout games over his last four starts and his 37 strikeouts over that span are the most by an A's pitcher over a four-game span since Todd Stottlemyre also had 37 from Sept. 10-26, 1995...ranks ninth in the American League in strikeouts (132)... has four games of 10 or more strikeouts this year and seven in his career.

BY MONTH: Went 2-1 with a 2.30 ERA and .204 opponents batting average in five starts in July...struck out 40 in 31.1 innings and walked just nine while surrendering two home runs...his strikeouts ranked fifth in the American League and fifth in Oakland history in the month of July...also ranked seventh in the AL in ERA and opponents batting average, ninth

in slugging percentage (.310) and 10th in OPS (.588)...has had a roller coaster season with his ERA as he posted a mark of 6.20 in April, 3.18 in May, 5.28 in June and 2.30 in July...his 2-1 record in July was his first month this year that was not .500 as he went 2-2 in April, 3-3 in May and 2-2 in June.

INTERLEAGUE PLAY: Is 1-1 with an 8.53 ERA (12.2 ip, 15 h, 12 r, 12 er, 7 bb, 11 so, 2 hr) in three interleague starts this year...snapped a five-game interleague losing streak on June 4 at Colorado and is now 3-5 with a 7.58 ERA (41 er in 48.2 ip) in 13 career games (10 starts) in interleague play...is 24-17 with a 3.67 ERA (135 er in 331.1 ip) in 78 games (51 starts) against American League competition.

OPPONENTS BATTING: Has a .202 (34-for-168) opponents batting average the first time through the order, .273 (82-for-300) with 11 of his 16 home runs after that...has held the opponents three hitter to a .185 (10-for-54) average and the four hitter to a mark of .196 (11-for-56).

THAT'S ODD: Has a 5.23 ERA (37 er in 63.2 ip) and .273 (71-for-260) opponents batting average in odd numbered innings compared to a 2.77 ERA (17 er in 55.1 ip) and .216 (45-for-208) opponents average in even numbered innings...has allowed just two runs in the fourth inning for a 0.90 ERA (2 er in 20.0 ip).

THIS AND THAT: Has four no decisions this year, three of which have come in extra inning games...the A's won one of those games and are 10-11 (.476) in his starting assignments...has tossed seven innings or fewer in all 21 of his starts, including six innings or fewer 17 times...has received two runs of support or fewer in 11 of his 21 starts, including nine of his last 13.

2021 HIGHLIGHTS: Took the loss in his first start on April 5 against Los Angeles (NL)...allowed seven runs in a season-low 2.2 innings and walked a season-high three batters...tossed 90 pitches, which were the most by an A's pitcher in an outing of fewer than three innings since pitch counts were tracked beginning in 1988...the loss extended his losing streak to a careerhigh three games dating back to Sept. 13, 2020...then picked up the win in each of his next two starts and allowed just one run on eight hits in 12.0 innings...won 7-3 at Houston on April 10 and then combined with Romo, Diekman and Wendelken on a four-hit shutout in the A's 3-0 victory over Detroit on April 16...allowed six runs on a season-high nine hits in 4.0 innings against Minnesota on April 21 but had a no decision in the A's 13-12, 10-inning win...allowed three home runs in a start for the second time in his career (Sept. 22, 2020 vs. Los Angeles-NL)...finished April 2-2 with a 6.20 ERA in five starts...then went 3-3 with a 3.18 ERA in six starts in May...the three wins matched his most ever in a month and he had 38 strikeouts, which tied for eighth in the American League...won each of his first three starts in May and posted a 3.12 ERA over that stretch from May 3-14...then went 0-3 with a 3.24 ERA over his next three starts from May 19-29...the losing streak matched his career high...struck out 11 batters in 6.0 innings in a 4-2 loss to Seattle on May 24...it was one of four games with 10 or more strikeouts (10,

July 8 at Houston; 10, July 23 at Seattle; 10, July 29 at Los Angeles-AL) and the second highest single-game total of his career to his 13 against the Mariners in the final game of the 2020 season...now has seven career 10-strike-out games...walked a season-high tying three...tossed a season-high 7.0 innings June 15 against Los Angles (AL) and allowed just two runs for the win... then surrendered a season-high eight runs on a season-high tying nine hits in 5.2 innings at Texas on June 21 for the loss...is 2-1 with a 2.48 ERA (10 er in 36.1 ip) in six starts since then...started consecutive games that went extra innings on June 26 at San Francisco and July 2 against Boston...issued a season-high tying three walks in each contests.

LAST START: He combined with Romo and Trivino on a three-hit shutout in the A's 4-0 win at Los Angeles (AL) last Thursday...tossed a season-high tying 7.0 innings and allowed all three of the hits...struck out 10, issued a season-high tying three walks and logged a season-high 109 pitches...now has an 11.0-inning scoreless streak, which is four shy of his career best (15.0, June 1-8, 2018)...allowed just three base runners as far as second base.

2020 RECAP: Was off to a strong start as he was 2-1 with a 1.57 ERA, .175 opponents batting average and no home runs over his first four starts...was scratched from his scheduled start on Aug. 14 at San Francisco with upper back tightness and went 1-4 with an 8.70 ERA, .321 opponents average and 10 home runs over his final seven starts...went 3-5 with a 5.60 ERA in 11 starts overall...his ERA was eighth highest in the majors among pitchers with at least 50 innings pitched...had career highs in losses (5) and earned runs (33) and matched his high in home runs (10), runs (35) and walks (23)...led the A's in strikeouts (60), losses, runs, home runs and walks...his opponents batting average broke down to .198 (22-for-111) against right-handed hitters compared to .350 (35-for-100) against left-handers...surrendered six of his 10 home runs and issued 15 of his 23 walks to lefties for a 1.061 OPS (.572 against right-handers).

FRIDAY'S PROBABLE STARTING PITCHER

RHP Chris Bassitt (11-3, 3.28 ERA): Picked up his career-high 11th win of the season in his last start to become the first 11-game winner in the American League...leads the AL in winning percentage (.786) and innings pitched (137.0), is tied for the lead in wins (11) and games started (22), ranks fourth in opponents OPS (.638) and on-base percentage (.280), fifth in batting average (.220), sixth in slugging percentage (.359) and seventh in ERA (3.28) and strikeouts (139)...his 139 strikeouts are two short of his high of 141 in 2019 and his 137.0 innings pitched are 7.0 away from his best of 144.0 in 2019... was the winning pitcher in his last start, a 2-0 A's win at Los Angeles (AL) last Friday (7.0 ip, 6 h, 1 bb, 7 so)...is 5-2 with a 3.31 ERA (51.2 ip, 43 h, 20 r, 19 er, 18 bb, 50 so, 4 hr) in 12 career appearances, including eight starts, against Texas...is 4-0 with a 1.00 ERA in four starts over the last two years...is 3-0 with a 0.86 ERA (21.0 ip, 12 h, 2 r, 2 er, 5 bb, 14 so, 0 hr) in three starts this year.

- Was acquired from the Chicago Cubs Monday along with cash considerations for Greg Deichmann and minor leaguer Daniel Palencia...made his A's debut Wednesday at San Diego (0.2 ip, 1 h, 1 so)...allowed both of his
- Has not allowed a run in 42 of his 46 appearances and ranks eighth among ML relievers in ERA (1.93).
- Has not allowed a home run in his last 36 games (33.0 innings) and has yielded just one home run in 42.0 innings overall...his average of 0.21 home runs per nine innings is ninth lowest among ML relievers.
- Has a 0.82 ERA (2 er in 22.0 ip) in 24 appearances on one day of rest or fewer, a 3.26 ERA (7 er in 19.1 ip) in 21 games on two days rest or more.
- Has not allowed a run in the eighth inning (23.2 ip).
- Allowed three runs on two hits and two walks in his final outing with the Cubs last Saturday against Arizona without retiring a batter to snap a career-high 24.1-inning scoreless streak dating back to May 8...opponents went 9-for-79 (.114) with five walks during the streak.
