OAKLAND ATHLETICS (60-48) VS. SAN DIEGO PADRES (62-47)

ABOUT THE A'S: Have won four of the last six games after losing four straight and are now 8-8 since the All-Star Break...are 3-7-2 over the previous 12 series and have a 16-21 (.432) record over the last 37 games...are 60-48 (.556) overall, which is the fifth best record in the American League...are in second place in the AL West for the 40th consecutive day and trail first place Houston by 5½ games...that is one-half game short of the season high of six (July 27 and 28)...are in second place in the AL Wild Card, three games behind Boston and two games ahead of the third place teams, Seattle and New York...have spent 58 days alone in first place in the West, three days tied for first, 41 days in second, one day tied for second, three days in third, two days in fourth, three days tied for fourth and 10 days in fifth.

ON THE BASES: The A's stole a season-high tying four bases last night (April 20 vs. Minnesota, Game 1) after swiping three bags on Sunday...it is the first time Oakland has stolen at least three bases in back-to-back games since April 21-22, 2012...are 52-for-63 (82.5%) in stolen base attempts for the season...have the second best stolen base percentage in the American League and the 52 steals are the most by an A's team since 2017 (57).

INTERLEAGUE PLAY: The A's are 9-7 (.563) in interleague play, which is tied for the 10th best record in the majors...after today, the A's will conclude interleague play by hosting San Francisco in a three-game series from Aug. 20-22...need one more win to clinch at least a .500 record against the National League...went 10-10 (.500) in interleague play last year and finished with a .500 record or better against the NL for the third consecutive season and 17th time in 24 years of interleague play...are 247-213 (.537) all-time in interleague games, which is fourth best in Major League history.

PITCHING: The A's allowed eight runs on 14 hits last night after allowing just four runs and 20 hits in the four-game series at Los Angeles (AL) over the weekend...have a 3.21 ERA (184 er in 515.2 ip) over the last 58 games dating back to May 26, which is second lowest in the majors over that span (Brewers, 2.93)...also have the second lowest opponents OPS (.649) over that stretch to the Brewers (.628)...overall, rank fourth in the AL in ERA (3.70) and opponents on-base percentage (.301) and fifth in slugging percentage (.383) and OPS (.684)...have issued the fewest walks (288), are tied for the lead in shutouts (10) and rank second in fewest home runs (115) and fewest pitches per inning (15.9).

STARTING PITCHING: Sean Manaea allowed five runs last night after A's starting pitchers allowed just four runs over the previous five games...starters have not allowed a run in five of the last 13 games and are 7-4 with a 3.24 ERA (27 er in 75.0 ip) and .220 (62-for-282) opponents batting average over that span...are 42-37 with a 3.67 ERA (253 er in 621.0 ip) for the season...are tied for second in the American League in wins, rank third in ERA and fourth in opponents OPS (.687)...lead the majors in innings pitched (621.0) and are tied for second in complete games (3)...have used just eight starting pitchers this year, which is tied with the Reds and Astros for second fewest in the majors (Red Sox, 6)...are one of two teams in the majors with four pitchers with 21 or more starts (Red Sox).

BULLPEN: The A's bullpen has converted each of its three save opportunities over the last 14 games and has a 2.50 ERA (11 er in 39.2 ip) over that span...is 26-for-41 (63.4%) in save opportunities for the season...ranks fourth in the American League in ERA (3.75) and opponents OPS (.679)...has 11 losses, which is first in the majors...has the second highest slugging percentage against first batters faced in the AL (.462) and the third highest batting average (.264).

OFFENSE: The A's went 0-for-13 with runners in scoring position last night, which were their most hitless at bats with RISP since May 13, 2015 when the went 0-for-14 in a 2-0 loss to Boston...are hitting .254 with RISP for the season, which ranks eighth in the American League...are hitting .233 overall, which is fourth lowest in the AL...lead the AL in hit by pitches (62), rank third in sacrifice flies (34) and fewest grounded into double plays (60) and fifth in walks (361) and sacrifice hits (14)...A's pinch hitters lead the AL in hits (23), RBI (16), sacrifice flies (3) and plate appearances (103), are tied for the lead in home runs (3), rank second in extra base hits (6) and tied for second in doubles (3).

DEFENSIVE DOINGS: The A's have committed just one error in the last 11 games and have 45 for the season, which is tied with the Astros for the fewest in the majors...have the fifth fewest double plays in the American League (77)...A's pitchers have five pickoffs, which is tied for fourth most in the AL...A's outfielders have nine assists, which is tied with the Angels and Tigers for the fewest in the AL.

HOME AND AWAY: The A's are 0-1 on this five-game homestand against San Diego (0-1) and Texas (three games)...went 3-2 on the last homestand against Cleveland (1-2) and Los Angeles-AL (2-0)...are in a stretch from July 6 to Aug. 19 where they are scheduled to play 26 of 36 games on the road...are 11-11 over the first 22 games of that stretch (8-8 on the road, 3-3 at home)...overall, are 30-25 (.545) at home compared to 30-23 (.566) on the road...went 5-5 on the last road trip to Seattle (1-3), San Diego (1-1) and Los Angeles-AL (3-1).

HOME AND AWAY SPLITS: The A's are batting .221 (382-for-1731) and are averaging 4.07 runs per game at home (224 runs in 55 games) compared to .245 with an average of 4.64 runs per game on the road...have the second lowest home batting average in the American League and third lowest OPS (.695)...have the fourth best road batting average and fifth best OPS (.731).

ONE-RUN GAMES AND OTHER CLOSE CALLS: The A's have lost each of their last five one-run games, 12 of the last 15 and are 15-19 (.441) overall...lead the American League in one-run games (34) and losses...are 23-27 (.460) in games decided by two runs or fewer compared to 37-21 (.638) in games decided by three runs or more...have eight walk-off wins, which is tied with the Mariners for the most in the AL...now have 91 walk-off wins in the Bob Melvin era, which are the most in the majors over that span...are 4-3 in extra innings and the seven extra inning games are third fewest in the AL...are 12-7 in games decided in the last at bat

THIS AND THAT: The A's are 27-16 (.628) in games in which the opponent starts a left-handed pitcher compared to 33-32 (.508) when they start a right-hander...the mark against lefties is second best in the American League (White Sox, 20-10/.667) and the 43 games are tied for second most...have the day off tomorrow, the second of three off days over an eight-day stretch from Monday to next Monday...are 37-8 (.822) when out-homered the opposition, 8-27 (.229) when they are out-homered...have used a different lineup in each of the last 45 games and have 105 different lineups over the first 108 contests.

A'S IN JULY: The A's went 11-13 (.458) in July, which was the fifth worst record in the American League...it was the A's first losing record in a month of 10 or more games since they went 11-15 in April of 2019, snapping a streak of 10 consecutive months with a winning record...however, had the second lowest ERA (2.98) and OPS (.618) in July in the majors (Brewers, 2.56 and .599)...A's pitchers set a franchise record for July strikeouts (221)...had the second lowest opponents batting average (.219) and on-base percentage (.282) in July in Oakland history, the fourth lowest OPS slugging percentage (.335) and seventh lowest ERA...on offense, the A's had the second lowest batting average (.223) and OPS (.668) and the second fewest runs scored (90) in the majors to Texas (.198, .615, 76)...had the second lowest July batting average in Oakland history and the third lowest on-base percentage (.294).

A'S vs. PADRES: The A's are 1-2 against San Diego...lost the first game in Oakland last night after splitting a two-game series in San Diego last week...lost two of three to San Diego last year in Oakland for their first season series loss to the Padres since 2006 when they also lost two of three...are 13-7 against San Diego dating back to 2009...lead the all-time series 25-14...are 12-7 in Oakland and 13-7 in San Diego...including 8-4 at Petco Park.

TODAY'S TIDBITS

Matt Olson ranks third in the American League in OPS (.943) and home runs (28), fourth in slugging percentage (.573), tied for fourth in extra base hits (53) and sacrifice flies (7), seventh in RBI (70), tied for seventh in runs (69), tied for eighth in doubles (25), 10th in on-base percentage (.370) and tied for 10th in walks (51)...**Starling Marte** is batting a Major League leading .443 (27-for-61) since the All-Star Break...also leads the majors in steals since the break (10) and ranks second in on-base percentage (.507). **Sergio Romo** has not allowed a run in his last 14 games dating back to June 29 (14.2 ip, 3 h, 2 bb, 16 so) and opponents are 3-for-45 (.067) over that span...**Lou Trivino** has converted each of his last 10 save opportunities dating back to June 5 and has a 1.13 ERA (3 er in 24.0 ip) and .193 (16-for-83) opponents batting average in 23 games over that span.

In **1910** Jack Coombs and Ed Walsh of the Chicago White Sox duel 16 innings to a scoreless tie...Coombs allows just three hits...in **1992** Jose Canseco ties an Oakland record when he walks five times in the A's 9-0 win at Texas...in **2002** Miguel Tejada hits a three-run home run in the A's 4-0 win over Detroit to extend his hitting streak to 24 games...he falls one short of Jason Giambi's Oakland record of 25.

39 LHP ANDREW CHAFIN

Last Outing: 8/1 at Los Angeles-AL (ND, 1.0 ip, h)

Saves/Opportunities: 0-1

Inherited Runners/Scored: 22/7 **First Hitters:** 7-44 (2 bb)

- Was acquired from the Chicago Cubs Monday along with cash considerations for Greg Deichmann and minor leaguer Daniel Palencia...made his A's debut Wednesday at San Diego (0.2 ip, 1 h, 1 so)...allowed both of his inherited runners to score.
- Has not allowed a run in 42 of his 46 appearances and ranks eighth among ML relievers in ERA (1.93).
- Has not allowed a home run in his last 36 games (33.0 innings) and has yielded just one home run in 42.0 innings overall...his average of 0.21 home runs per nine innings is ninth lowest among ML relievers.
- Has a 0.82 ERA (2 er in 22.0 ip) in 24 appearances on one day of rest or fewer, a 3.26 ERA (7 er in 19.1 ip) in 21 games on two days rest or more.
- Has not allowed a run in the eighth inning (23.2 ip).
- Allowed three runs on two hits and two walks in his final outing with the Cubs last Saturday against Arizona without retiring a batter to snap a career-high 24.1-inning scoreless streak dating back to May 8...opponents went 9-for-79 (.114) with five walks during the streak.
- Was 0-2 with a 2.06 ERA in 43 relief appearances for Chicago...at the time of the trade, he ranked third among National League relievers in opponents OPS (.461), fifth in slugging percentage (.228), seventh in ERA, eighth in batting average (.154), ninth in on-base percentage (.233) and tied for ninth in games.

Last Year: Combined for a 1-2 record, one save and a 6.52 ERA in 15 relief appearances with the Diamondbacks and Cubs...missed a month of the season from Aug. 19 to Sept. 18 with a sprained left finger.

35 LHP JAKE DIEKMAN

Inherited Runners/Scored: 8/4 **First Hitters:** 8-36, 5 bb, 2 hbp

- Has a 2.76 ERA (5 er in 16.1 ip) and .211 (12-for-57) opponents batting average over his last 19 games dating back to June 4.
- Has held right-handed hitters to a .189 (17-for-90) average but they have hit five of the career-high six home runs he has allowed.
- Has a 4.34 ERA (9 er in 18.2 ip) and .250 (18-for-72) opponents batting average in 21 outings on one day rest or fewer, a 1.33 ERA (3 er in 20.1 ip) and .145 (10-for-69) opponents average in 21 appearances on two days of rest or more.
- Has faced San Diego 10 times in his career and is 0-1 with a 3.24 ERA (3 er, 8.1 ip) including 10 strikeouts and two walks.

Last Year: Allowed just two runs in 21 appearances and only one was earned for a 0.42 ERA...ranked second among Major League relievers in ERA and opponents slugging percentage (.157), fifth in batting average (.114) and seventh in OPS (.410)

Saves/Opportunities: 0-0

Inherited Runners/Scored: 7/2 **First Hitters:** 6-28, 2 bb, hbp

- Allowed three runs Wednesday at San Diego after an eight-game, 7.2-inning scoreless streak...has not allowed a run in 14 of his last 18 games but has allowed at least two runs in the three of the four games with a run (8 er in 19.2 ip, 3.366 ERA).
- Has a .200 opponents batting average, which breaks down to .154 (10-for-65) against left-handed hitters compared to .240 (18-for-75) against right-handers...has issued 10 of his 12 walks and yielded two of his three homers to righties for a .686 OPS...has a .437 OPS against lefties.
- Ranks 17th among American League relievers in opponents OPS (.573).
- Opponents are batting .192 (5-for-26) with runners in scoring position.
- Has a 2.37 ERA (5 er in 19.0 ip) in 15 games at night, a 5.31 ERA (12 er in 20.1 ip) in 16 day games.

Last Year: Was on the Opening Day roster and appeared in nine games for Philadelphia in 2020 and went 1-3 with an 8.59 ERA (7 er in 7.1 ip)...struck out eight batters and walked two.

Inherited Runners/Scored: 31/11 **First Hitters:** 15-48, 3 bb, sf

- Has a 1.93 ERA (3 er in 14.0 ip) over his last 15 games but has allowed 5-of-8 (62.5%) inherited runners to score over that span.
- Ranks tied for first in the American League in games pitched (52)...leads AL relievers in innings pitched (53.2) and is tied for the lead in wins (7), ranks second in fewest walks per nine innings (1.34) and is fifth in most inherited runners (31)...is averaging the second fewest strikeouts per nine innings in the majors among relievers (4.53).
- Allowed his fourth home run to his first batter faced last Tuesday, which is tied for the most in the majors.
- Opponents are hitting .190 (11-for-58) with runners in scoring position.

Last Year: Compiled a career-low 1.66 ERA in a team-leading 26 relief appearances...opponents hit .232 and he walked just five batters for a .273 on-base percentage...yielded four runs, three of which scored on solo home runs.

Inherited Runners/Scored: 20/9 **First Hitters:** 13-41, bb, 2 hbp

- Has not allowed a run in his last 14 games dating back to June 29 (14.2 ip, 3 h, 3 bb, 15 so) and opponents are 3-for-44 (.068) over that span...has also not allowed a run in 24 of his last 26 games for a 0.72 ERA (25.0 ip, 11 h, 2 r, 2 er, 3 bb, 27 so, 1 hr) and .127 (10-for-79) opponents batting average.
- Has a 1.59 ERA (4 er in 22.2 ip) in 23 games on zero or one day of rest, a 5.94 ERA (11 er in 16.2 ip) in 20 outings on two days rest or more.
- First batters faced are 1-for-17 (.059) with eight strikeouts over his last 17 games after going 12-for-24 (.500) with a walk and two hit by pitches over his first 27 contests.

Inherited Runners/Scored: 6/0 **First Hitters:** 7-21, bb

- Has pitched twice against San Diego in the last week after not pitching since July 6, a span of 14 games and 20 days between appearances.
- Has a 7.53 ERA (14.1 ip, 20 h, 13 r, 12 er, 5 bb, 7 so) and .323 (20-for-62) opponents batting average over his last 11 games after logging a 2.93 ERA and .232 opponent average over his first 11 contests.
- Has a 3.75 ERA (5 er in 12.0 ip) in nine day games, a 6.11 ERA (12 er in 17.2 ip) in 13 contests at night.
- Was on the A's Opening Day roster appeared in just two games before he was placed on the 10-day injured list April 6 retroactive to April 4 with a strained right groin...was reinstated May 8.

Last Year: Made the A's Opening Day roster and was 2-0 with a save, a 2.25 ERA and .163 opponents batting average in six relief appearances before his season was cut short in mid-August with a forearm injury.

- Has converted each of his last 10 save opportunities dating back to June 5 and has a 1.13 ERA (3 er in 24.0 ip) and .193 (16-for-83) opponents batting average in 23 games over that span.
- Is 17-for-19 (89.4%) in save opportunities...ranks fourth in the American League in save percentage and sixth in saves.
- Has a 0.84 ERA (3 er in 32.1 ip) over his last 31 games and now has a 1.99 ERA for the season, which ranks sixth among AL relievers.
- Ranks eighth among AL relievers in innings pitched (49.2), 11th in opponents slugging percentage (.282) and tied for 11th in games (47).
- Has a .160 (16-for-100) opponents batting average against right-handed hitters compared to .243 (18-for-74) against left-handers.
- Opponents are hitting .151 (8-for-53) with runners in scoring position.

- Has a .390 on-base percentage over the last three years, which is eighth best in the majors (min. 900 PA).
- Has made 86 of his 87 starts batting leadoff...the A's are 50-36 (.581) when he hits leadoff, 10-12 (.455) when he doesn't.
- Is batting .319 (22-for-69) with runners in scoring position.
- Has not homered since June 4 and his 32-game homerless is the second longest of his career (35, June 12-Aug. 16, 2015).

- Leads the majors in strikeouts (138)...ranks third in the American League with a career-high eight sacrifice flies and tied for fourth in games (105)...has the third lowest batting average (.214).
- Has committed just one error in his last 66 games and leads Major League third basemen with a .987 fielding percentage...also leads ML third basemen in total chances (316) and putouts (118), is tied for the lead in double plays (31) and ranks third in assists (194).
