### OAKLAND ATHLETICS (61-48) VS. TEXAS RANGERS (39-70)

FRIDAY, AUGUST 6, 2021 — OAKLAND COLISEUM — 6:40 PDT

**ABOUT THE A'5:** Have won five of the last seven games after losing four straight and are now 9-8 since the All-Star Break...are 3-7-3 over the previous 13 series and have a 17-21 (.447) record over the last 38 games...are 61-48 (.560) overall, which is the fifth best record in the American League...are in second place in the AL West for the 42nd consecutive day dating back to June 21 and trail first place Houston by four games...are in second place in the AL Wild Card, 2½ games behind Boston and 1½ games ahead of the third place team, New York...have spent 58 days alone in first place in the West, three days tied for first, 42 days in second, one day tied for second, three days in third, two days in fourth, three days tied for fourth and 10 days in fifth.

**ONE-RUN GAMES AND OTHER CLOSE CALLS:** The A's scored twice in the ninth and twice in the 10th on Wednesday to defeat San Diego, 5-4...it was the A's ninth walk-off win, which is the most in the American League and tied with the Phillies for second most in the majors (Rockies, 10)...now have 92 walk-off wins in the Bob Melvin era, which are the most in the majors over that span...snapped a five-game losing streak in one-run games on Wednesday... have lost 12 of the last 16 one-run decisions and are 16-19 (.457) overall... lead the AL in one-run games (35) and losses...are 24-27 (.471) in games decided by two runs or fewer compared to 37-21 (.638) in games decided by three runs or more...are now 5-3 in extra innings and the eight extra inning games are tied for third fewest in the AL...are 13-7 in games decided in the last at bat.

DAYS OFF: Yesterday was the second of three off days over an eight-day stretch from Aug. 2-9...had Monday off and will have next Monday off before beginning a stretch of 15 games in 15 days...the A's are 11-4 (.733) following a day off, which is the second best record in the majors (Giants, 14-3/.824)... only the Cubs and Padres, with 14, have fewer games.

AGAINST THE WEST: This three-game series with Texas concludes a stretch that began on July 19 where they are scheduled to play 13 of 17 games against American League West teams...are 6-4 against the West during the stretch...are now 25-24 (.510) against AL West competition overall compared to 36-24 (.600) against all other teams...have never made the playoffs with a losing record against the West...following this series, are scheduled to play 26 of their next 34 games against non-division foes before concluding the season with 16 straight games against the West.

**DEFENSIVE DOINGS:** The A's have committed just one error in the last 12 games and have 45 for the season, which is the fewest in the majors (Astros, 48)...have the fourth fewest double plays in the American League (79)...are tied for fifth in the AL in pickoffs (5) and caught stealing (15)...outfielders have 10 assists, which is tied for third fewest in the AL.

**PITCHING:** The A's have a 3.20 ERA (187 er in 525.2 ip) over the last 59 games dating back to May 26, which is second lowest in the majors over that span (Brewers, 2.91)...also have the second lowest opponents OPS (.650) over that stretch to the Brewers (.628)...overall, rank third in the American League in ERA (3.69), fourth in opponents on-base percentage (.301) and OPS (.684) and fifth in slugging percentage (.383)...have issued the fewest walks (288), allowed the fewest home runs (115), are tied for the lead in shutouts (10) and rank second in fewest pitches per inning (15.9).

**STARTING PITCHING:** A's starting pitchers have compiled a 3.18 ERA (72 er in 203.2 ip) over the last 34 games dating back to June 23 but are 12-12 over that span...are 42-37 with a 3.67 ERA (256 er in 627.0 ip) overall...are tied for second in the American League in wins, rank third in ERA and fourth in opponents OPS (.688)...lead the majors in innings pitched (627.0) and are tied for second in complete games (3)...have used just eight starting pitchers, which is tied with the Reds and Astros for second fewest in the majors (Red Sox, 6).

**BULLPEN:** The A's bullpen has converted each of its three save opportunities over the last 15 games and has a 2.27 ERA (11 er in 43.2 ip) over that span... has a 3.71 ERA overall, which is fourth lowest in the American League...has the third lowest opponents OPS (.677)...is 26-for-41 (63.4%) in save opportunities...has 11 losses, which is the fewest in the majors...has the highest slugging percentage against first batters faced in the AL (.457) and the third highest batting average (.261).

**OFFENSE:** The A's rank 11th in the American League in batting average (.233)... are seventh in batting with runners in scoring position (.256) and 14th in batting with the bases loaded (.203)...are ninth in runs scored (475)...lead the AL in hit by pitches (64), rank second in stolen base percentage (82.5%), third in fewest grounded into double plays (62), tied for third in sacrifice flies (34), fifth in sacrifice hits (14) and tied for fifth in walks (366)...A's pinch hitters lead the AL in hits (24), RBI (17), sacrifice flies (3) and plate appearances

(104), are tied for the lead in home runs (3), rank second in extra base hits (6) and tied for second in doubles (3).

HOME AND AWAY: The A's are 1-1 on this five-game homestand against San Diego (1-1) and Texas (three games)...went 3-2 on the last homestand against Cleveland (1-2) and Los Angeles-AL (2-0)...are in a stretch from July 6 to Aug. 19 where they are scheduled to play 26 of 36 games on the road... are 12-11 over the first 23 games of that stretch (8-8 on the road, 4-3 at home)...overall, are 31-25 (.554) at home compared to 30-23 (.566) on the road...leave following the game Sunday for a 10-game road trip to Cleveland (three games), Texas (three games) and Chicago-AL (four games) that begins on Tuesday...it is the A's second consecutive 10-game road trip...went 5-5 on the last road trip to Seattle (1-3), San Diego (1-1) and Los Angeles-AL (3-1).

HOME AND AWAY SPLITS: The A's are batting .221 (389-for-1763) and are averaging 4.09 runs per game at home (229 runs in 56 games) compared to .245 with an average of 4.64 runs per game on the road...have the second lowest home batting average in the American League and third lowest OPS (.696)...have the fourth best road batting average and fifth best OPS (.731).

**THIS AND THAT:** The A's are 27-16 (.628) in games in which the opponent starts a left-handed pitcher compared to 34-32 (.515) when they start a right-hander...the mark against lefties is second best in the American League (White Sox, 20-11/.645) and the 43 games are tied for second most...are 38-8 (.826) when out-homering the opposition, 8-27 (.229) when they are out-homered...have used a different lineup in each of the last 46 games and have 106 different lineups over the first 109 contests.

**THE INJURED LIST:** The A's have used the injured list 19 times this year...used it just eight times last year, which was second fewest in the majors to Cleveland (4), and 18 times in 2019, which tied for second fewest...currently have four players on the IL (Fiers, Kaprielian, Pinder, Rosenthal).

*A's IN JULY*: The A's went 11-13 (.458) in July, which was the fifth worst record in the American League...it was the A's first losing record in a month of 10 or more games since they went 11-15 in April of 2019, snapping a streak of 10 consecutive months with a winning record...however, had the second lowest ERA (2.98) and OPS (.618) in July in the majors (Brewers, 2.56 and .599)...A's pitchers set a franchise record for July strikeouts (221)...had the second lowest opponents batting average (.219) and on-base percentage (.282) in July in Oakland history...on offense, the A's had the second lowest batting average (.223) and OPS (.668) and the second fewest runs scored (90) in the majors to Texas (.198, .615, 76)...had the second lowest July batting average in Oakland history and the third lowest on-base percentage (.294).

*A's vs. RANGERS:* The A's and Rangers have split the first 10 games of the season series...the A's are 1-2 in Oakland and 4-3 in Texas...won the season series last year, 7-3...it was their fourth consecutive season series victory over the Rangers, which is just the second time the A's have won four consecutive season series against Texas (2002-05)...have won 19 of the last 28 games and are 34-15 over the last 49 contests...have won eight of the last 11 and 26 of the last 34 in Oakland...are 49-28 (.636) against the Rangers over the last five years...are 390-381 all-time against the Texas Rangers...that breaks down to 204-178 in Oakland and 186-203 in Texas...are 8-6 at Globe Life Field...have an all-time record of 487-465 against the Rangers/Senators franchise.

#### TODAY'S TIDBITS

**Starling Marte** is batting a Major League leading .424 (28-for-66) since the All-Star Break...also leads the majors in steals since the break (10) and ranks third in on-base percentage (.486)...*Matt Olson* ranks third in the American League in OPS (.944), slugging percentage (.574) and home runs (28), tied for fourth in extra base hits (54) and sacrifice flies (7), seventh in RBI (72), eighth in doubles (26), tied for eighth in runs (69), ninth in onbase percentage (.370) and tied for 10th in walks (51)...*Sergio Romo* has not allowed a run in his last 14 games dating back to June 29 (14.2 ip, 3 h, 2 bb, 16 so) and opponents are 3-for-45 (.067) over that span...*Lou Trivino* has converted each of his last 10 save opportunities dating back to June 5 and has a 1.08 ERA (3 er in 25.0 ip) and .193 (17-for-88) opponents batting average in 24 games over that span.

#### THIS DATE IN ATHLETICS HISTORY

In **1923** Joe Hauser has five hits and Sammy Hale and Bing Miller add four each as the A's collect 22 hits in a 14-4 win over Chicago...in **1933** Pinky Higgins hits for the cycle in the A's 12-8 win over the Washington Senators...in **2001** the A's defeat the Tigers 6-3 to complete a four-game sweep of Detroit, their first four-game sweep of the Tigers since July 1-3, 1955.

### TODAY'S STARTING PITCHER: Chris Bassitt (11-3, 3.28 ERA)

AMONG THE LEADERS: Picked up his 11th win of the season in his last start to become the first 11-game winner in the American League...leads the AL in winning percentage (.786) and innings pitched (137.0) and is tied for the lead in wins (11) and games started (22)...the A's have not had a pitcher lead the league in innings since Dave Stewart in 1990 (267.0) and have not had a pitcher lead the league in wins since Barry Zito in 2002 (23)...also ranks third in the AL in opponents OPS (.638) and on-base percentage (.280), fourth in batting average (.220) and slugging percentage (.359), seventh in ERA (3.28) and eighth in strikeouts (139)...has allowed 15 home runs and his average of 0.99 home runs per nine innings is seventh lowest...is seventh in strikeout-to-walk ratio (4.21) and ninth in fewest walks per nine innings (2.17)...has hit 11 batters, which is tied for the most in the AL and two short of the Oak-land record of 13...he also hit 13 batters in 2019, which tied the record set by Barry Zito (2001, 2005 and 2006)...ranks third in the AL in fewest pitches per inning (15.1) to teammate Cole Irvin (14.5).

**CAREER BESTS:** Has career highs in wins (11) and wild pitches (5)...his 139 strikeouts are two short of his high of 141 in 2019 and his 137.0 innings pitched are 7.0 away from his best of 144.0 in 2019...currently has the lowest opponents batting average (.220) and on-base percentage (.280) of his career.

**OPPONENTS BATTING:** Has allowed a .191 (21-for-110) batting average with runners in scoring position, which ranks third in the American League...has allowed just four home runs in 268 at bats against right-handed hitters...has surrendered 11 of his 15 home runs this year and 29 of 42 over the last three years to lefties...10 of his 15 home runs have come with the bases empty... has a .151 opponents average with two strikes, which is seventh lowest in the AL...has allowed a .194 (12-for-62) average to the opponents three hitter.

HOME AND AWAY: Is 4-3 with a 2.70 ERA (18 er in 60.0 ip) in nine starts at home compared to 7-0 with a 3.74 ERA (32 er in 77.0 ip) in 13 starts on the road... has the seventh lowest home ERA in the American League but is tied for the lead in road wins...has a 13-13 career record in the Coliseum, but has a 2.50 ERA (69 er in 248.1 ip), which is fifth lowest in Coliseum history among pitchers with 200 or more innings pitched...has an eight-game road winning streak, which is one short of the Oakland record of nine (Bob Welch, Sept. 21, 1989-June 30, 1990).



**10-GAME WINNING STREAK:** Went 10-0 with a 3.04 ERA and .209 opponents average in 17 starts from April 12 to July 11...the 10-game winning streak is a career-high, tied for fourth longest in Oakland history and second longest in the majors this year (Hendricks, CHI 11).

**AMERICAN LEAGUE ALL-STAR:** Was named to the American League All-Star Team for the first time on July 10 as a replacement...pitched the sixth inning in a 5-2 AL win (1.0 ip, 1 h, 1 r, 0 er, 2 bb, 1 so)...became the first A's starting pitcher to be named to the AL All-Star Team since Sonny Gray in 2015 and the first starter to pitch in the game since Scott Kazmir in 2014.

*THIS AND THAT:* Has a 3.49 ERA (196 er in 505.2 ip) in 95 career appearances with the A's, which is the 10th lowest ERA in Oakland history (min. 500 ip)... the A's are 15-7 (.682) in his starting assignments this year...has left with the lead in three of his eight no decisions only to have the bullpen blow the save (May 5 vs. Toronto, May 16 at Minnesota, June 19 at New York-AL)...has tossed at least seven innings in 10 of his 22 starts...has allowed two runs or fewer 15 times and six hits or fewer 19 times.

THE LAST THREE YEARS: IS 26-10 (.722) with a 3.32 ERA (127 er in 344.0 ip) in 61 games (58 starts) over the last three years...based on a minium of 275 innings pitched, he ranks second in the American League in winning percentage over that span, fourth in ERA and fifth in opponents OPS (.667)...is tied for sixth in wins...the A's are 38-20 (.655) in his starting assignments over the last three years...was 4-14 (.222) with a 3.86 ERA in 40 games (30 starts) over his first four seasons.

**2021 HIGHLIGHTS:** Was the A's Opening Day starting pitcher and took the loss in an 8-1 decision to Houston on April 1 in Oakland...became the A's 14th different Opening Day starting pitcher over the last 16 years...allowed exactly two runs in six consecutive starts from April 12 to May 11 to become the second pitcher in Athletic history to allow exactly two runs in six consecutive games (Bob Davis, Aug. 8-26, 1960)...went 3-0 with a 2.92 ERA over that stretch which ran from April 12 to May 11...struck out a season-high 10 batters in a 3-2 win at Boston on May 11...it was his third career game of 10 or more without issuing a free pass...is one of nine pitchers in Oakland history with two such games...tossed his first career complete game and shutout May 27 against Los Angeles (AL), a two-hitter in the A's 5-0 win...it came in

his 77th career start, his 72nd with the A's...the 71 consecutive starts without a complete games is the second longest streak in Athletics history (113, Barry Zito, Aug. 22, 2003-Sept. 28, 2006)...finished May with a 3-0 record, a 2.52 ERA and .175 opponents batting average in five starts...then went 4-0 with a 2.70 ERA in six starts in June...it was the first time in his career he won four games in a month...was one of four American League pitchers to win four games in June and his ERA tied for fifth...allowed two runs or fewer in five consecutive starts from June 8 to 30 and was 4-0 with a 1.93 ERA and .197 opponents batting average over that span.

*LAST START:* He combined with Romo and Trivino on a seven-hit shutout in the A's 2-0 win at Los Angeles (AL) a week ago today...tossed seven innings and allowed six of the hits for his career-high 11th win of the season... yielded a leadoff single to Fletcher but then retired 10 straight...allowed just three base runners as far as second base.

**BASSITT vs. TEXAS:** Is 5-2 with a 3.31 ERA (51.2 ip, 43 h, 20 r, 19 er, 18 bb, 50 so, 4 hr) in 12 career appearances, including eight starts...is 4-0 with a 1.00 ERA (3 er in 27.0 ip) in four starts over the last two years...is 2-1 with a 2.05 ERA (5 er in 22.0 ip) in six games in Oakland and 3-0 with a 1.35 ERA (3 er in 20.0 ip) in three starts at Globe Life Field...went 0-1 with a 10.24 ERA (11 er in 9.2 ip) in three games at Globe Life

Park...is 3-0 with a 0.86 ERA (21.0 ip, 12 h, 2 r, 2 er, 5 bb, 14 so, 0 hr) in three starts this year...the first win came in a 5-1 decision at Texas on June 24... Oakland scored three times in the first inning and he allowed a run in the second on a Solak RBI ground out...that would be the only run he would surrender in seven innings of work...was relieved by Diekman to start the eighth with the A's leading 5-1...then picked up the win in his next start on June 30 in Oakland, a 3-1 A's victory...logged 7.0 scoreless innings...allowed just two base runners to advance into scoring position...his third win came in a 4-1 decision at Texas on July 11...shut out the Rangers on two hits and a hit by pitch over the first four innings and had a 3-0 lead when he allowed a RBI double to Solak in the fifth inning...that was the only run he would allow in seven innings of work.
