## OAKLAND ATHLETICS (61-48) VS. TEXAS RANGERS (39-70)

FRIDAY, AUGUST 6, 2021 — OAKLAND COLISEUM — 6:40 PDT

**ABOUT THE A'S:** Have won five of the last seven games after losing four straight and are now 9-8 since the All-Star Break...are 3-7-3 over the previous 13 series and have a 17-21 (.447) record over the last 38 games...are 61-48 (.560) overall, which is the fifth best record in the American League...are in second place in the AL West for the 42nd consecutive day dating back to June 21 and trail first place Houston by four games...are in second place in the AL Wild Card, 2½ games behind Boston and 1½ games ahead of the third place team, New York...have spent 58 days alone in first place in the West, three days tied for first, 42 days in second, one day tied for second, three days in third, two days in fourth, three days tied for fourth and 10 days in fifth.

**ONE-RUN GAMES AND OTHER CLOSE CALLS:** The A's scored twice in the ninth and twice in the 10th on Wednesday to defeat San Diego, 5-4...it was the A's ninth walk-off win, which is the most in the American League and tied with the Phillies for second most in the majors (Rockies, 10)...now have 92 walk-off wins in the Bob Melvin era, which are the most in the majors over that span...snapped a five-game losing streak in one-run games on Wednesday...have lost 12 of the last 16 one-run decisions and are 16-19 (.457) overall...lead the AL in one-run games (35) and losses...are 24-27 (.471) in games decided by two runs or fewer compared to 37-21 (.638) in games decided by three runs or more...are now 5-3 in extra innings and the eight extra inning games are tied for third fewest in the AL...are 13-7 in games decided in the last at bat.

**DAYS OFF:** Yesterday was the second of three off days over an eight-day stretch from Aug. 2-9...had Monday off and will have next Monday off before beginning a stretch of 15 games in 15 days...the A's are 11-4 (.733) following a day off, which is the second best record in the majors (Giants, 14-3/.824)...only the Cubs and Padres, with 14, have fewer games.

**AGAINST THE WEST:** This three-game series with Texas concludes a stretch that began on July 19 where they are scheduled to play 13 of 17 games against American League West teams...are 6-4 against the West during the stretch...are now 25-24 (.510) against AL West competition overall compared to 36-24 (.600) against all other teams...have never made the playoffs with a losing record against the West...following this series, are scheduled to play 26 of their next 34 games against non-division foes before concluding the season with 16 straight games against the West.

**DEFENSIVE DOINGS:** The A's have committed just one error in the last 12 games and have 45 for the season, which is the fewest in the majors (Astros, 48)...have the fourth fewest double plays in the American League (79)...are tied for fifth in the AL in pickoffs (5) and caught stealing (15)...outfielders have 10 assists, which is tied for third fewest in the AL.

**PITCHING:** The A's have a 3.20 ERA (187 er in 525.2 ip) over the last 59 games dating back to May 26, which is second lowest in the majors over that span (Brewers, 2.91)...also have the second lowest opponents OPS (.650) over that stretch to the Brewers (.628)...overall, rank third in the American League in ERA (3.69), fourth in opponents on-base percentage (.301) and OPS (.684) and fifth in slugging percentage (.383)...have issued the fewest walks (288), allowed the fewest home runs (115), are tied for the lead in shutouts (10) and rank second in fewest pitches per inning (15.9).

**STARTING PITCHING:** A's starting pitchers have compiled a 3.18 ERA (72 er in 203.2 ip) over the last 34 games dating back to June 23 but are 12-12 over that span...are 42-37 with a 3.67 ERA (256 er in 627.0 ip) overall...are tied for second in the American League in wins, rank third in ERA and fourth in opponents OPS (.688)...lead the majors in innings pitched (627.0) and are tied for second in complete games (3)...have used just eight starting pitchers, which is tied with the Reds and Astros for second fewest in the majors (Red Sox, 6).

**BULLPEN:** The A's bullpen has converted each of its three save opportunities over the last 15 games and has a 2.27 ERA (11 er in 43.2 ip) over that span...has a 3.71 ERA overall, which is fourth lowest in the American League...has the third lowest opponents OPS (.677)...is 26-for-41 (63.4%) in save opportunities...has 11 losses, which is the fewest in the majors...has the highest slugging percentage against first batters faced in the AL (.457) and the third highest batting average (.261).

**OFFENSE:** The A's rank 11th in the American League in batting average (.233)...are seventh in batting with runners in scoring position (.256) and 14th in batting with the bases loaded (.203)...are ninth in runs scored (475)...lead the AL in hit by pitches (64), rank second in stolen base percentage (82.5%), third in fewest grounded into double plays (62), tied for third in sacrifice flies (34), fifth in sacrifice hits (14) and tied for fifth in walks (366)...A's pinch hitters lead the AL in hits (24), RBI (17), sacrifice flies (3) and plate appearances

(104), are tied for the lead in home runs (3), rank second in extra base hits (6) and tied for second in doubles (3).

**HOME AND AWAY:** The A's are 1-1 on this five-game homestand against San Diego (1-1) and Texas (three games)...went 3-2 on the last homestand against Cleveland (1-2) and Los Angeles-AL (2-0)...are in a stretch from July 6 to Aug. 19 where they are scheduled to play 26 of 36 games on the road...are 12-11 over the first 23 games of that stretch (8-8 on the road, 4-3 at home)...overall, are 31-25 (.554) at home compared to 30-23 (.566) on the road...leave following the game Sunday for a 10-game road trip to Cleveland (three games), Texas (three games) and Chicago-AL (four games) that begins on Tuesday...it is the A's second consecutive 10-game road trip...went 5-5 on the last road trip to Seattle (1-3), San Diego (1-1) and Los Angeles-AL (3-1).

**HOME AND AWAY SPLITS:** The A's are batting .221 (389-for-1763) and are averaging 4.09 runs per game at home (229 runs in 56 games) compared to .245 with an average of 4.64 runs per game on the road...have the second lowest home batting average in the American League and third lowest OPS (.696)...have the fourth best road batting average and fifth best OPS (.731).

**THIS AND THAT:** The A's are 27-16 (.628) in games in which the opponent starts a left-handed pitcher compared to 34-32 (.515) when they start a right-hander...the mark against lefties is second best in the American League (White Sox, 20-11/.645) and the 43 games are tied for second most...are 38-8 (.826) when out-homering the opposition, 8-27 (.229) when they are out-homered...have used a different lineup in each of the last 46 games and have 106 different lineups over the first 109 contests.

**THE INJURED LIST:** The A's have used the injured list 19 times this year...used it just eight times last year, which was second fewest in the majors to Cleveland (4), and 18 times in 2019, which tied for second fewest...currently have four players on the IL (Fiers, Kaprielian, Pinder, Rosenthal).

**A'S IN JULY:** The A's went 11-13 (.458) in July, which was the fifth worst record in the American League...it was the A's first losing record in a month of 10 or more games since they went 11-15 in April of 2019, snapping a streak of 10 consecutive months with a winning record...however, had the second lowest ERA (2.98) and OPS (.618) in July in the majors (Brewers, 2.56 and .599)...A's pitchers set a franchise record for July strikeouts (221)...had the second lowest opponents batting average (.219) and on-base percentage (.282) in July in Oakland history...on offense, the A's had the second lowest batting average (.223) and OPS (.668) and the second fewest runs scored (90) in the majors to Texas (.198, .615, 76)...had the second lowest July batting average in Oakland history and the third lowest on-base percentage (.294).

**A'S vs. RANGERS:** The A's and Rangers have split the first 10 games of the season series...the A's are 1-2 in Oakland and 4-3 in Texas...won the season series last year, 7-3...it was their fourth consecutive season series victory over the Rangers, which is just the second time the A's have won four consecutive season series against Texas (2002-05)...have won 19 of the last 28 games and are 34-15 over the last 49 contests...have won eight of the last 11 and 26 of the last 34 in Oakland...are 49-28 (.636) against the Rangers over the last five years...are 390-381 all-time against the Texas Rangers...that breaks down to 204-178 in Oakland and 186-203 in Texas...are 8-6 at Globe Life Field...have an all-time record of 487-465 against the Rangers/Senators franchise.

### TODAY'S TIDBITS

**Starling Marte** is batting a Major League leading .424 (28-for-66) since the All-Star Break...also leads the majors in steals since the break (10) and ranks third in on-base percentage (.486)...**Matt Olson** ranks third in the American League in OPS (.944), slugging percentage (.574) and home runs (28), tied for fourth in extra base hits (54) and sacrifice flies (7), seventh in RBI (72), eighth in doubles (26), tied for eighth in runs (69), ninth in on-base percentage (.370) and tied for 10th in walks (51)...**Sergio Romo** has not allowed a run in his last 14 games dating back to June 29 (14.2 ip, 3 h, 2 bb, 16 so) and opponents are 3-for-45 (.067) over that span...**Lou Trivino** has converted each of his last 10 save opportunities dating back to June 5 and has a 1.08 ERA (3 er in 25.0 ip) and .193 (17-for-88) opponents batting average in 24 games over that span.

### THIS DATE IN ATHLETICS HISTORY

In 1923 Joe Hauser has five hits and Sammy Hale and Bing Miller add four each as the A's collect 22 hits in a 14-4 win over Chicago...in 1933 Pinky Higgins hits for the cycle in the A's 12-8 win over the Washington Senators...in 2001 the A's defeat the Tigers 6-3 to complete a four-game sweep of Detroit, their first four-game sweep of the Tigers since July 1-3, 1955.

# ATHLETICS BULLPEN BRIEFS

## 39 LHP ANDREW CHAFIN

**Last Outing:** 8/4 vs. San Diego (ND, 1.0 ip, h, so)

**Saves/Opportunities:** 0-1

**Inherited Runners/Scored:** 22/7 **First Hitters:** 7-45 (2 bb)

- Was acquired from the Chicago Cubs July 26 along with cash considerations for Greg Deichmann and minor leaguer Daniel Palencia.
- Has not allowed a run in 43 of his 47 appearances and ranks 11th among ML relievers in ERA (1.88).
- Has not allowed a home run in his last 37 games (34.0 innings) and has yielded just one home run in 43.0 innings overall...his average of 0.21 home runs per nine innings is ninth lowest among ML relievers.
- Has a 0.82 ERA (2 er in 22.0 ip) in 24 appearances on one day of rest or fewer, a 3.10 ERA (7 er in 20.1 ip) in 22 games on two days rest or more.
- Has not allowed a run in the eighth inning (23.2 ip).
- Allowed three runs on two hits and two walks in his final outing with the Cubs on July 24 against Arizona without retiring a batter to snap a career-high 24.1-inning scoreless streak dating back to May 8...opponents went 9-for-79 (.114) with five walks during the streak.
- Was 0-2 with a 2.06 ERA in 43 relief appearances for Chicago...at the time of the trade, he ranked third among National League relievers in opponents OPS (.461), fifth in slugging percentage (.228), seventh in ERA, eighth in batting average (.154), ninth in on-base percentage (.233) and tied for ninth in games.

**Last Year:** Combined for a 1-2 record, one save and a 6.52 ERA in 15 relief appearances with the Diamondbacks and Cubs...missed a month of the season from Aug. 19 to Sept. 18 with a sprained left finger.

## 35 LHP JAKE DIEKMAN

**Last Outing:** 8/4 vs. San Diego (ND, 1.0 ip, so)

**Saves/Opportunities:** 7-12

**Inherited Runners/Scored:** 8/4 **First Hitters:** 8-36, 5 bb, 3 hbp

- Has a 2.60 ERA (5 er in 17.1 ip) and .203 (12-for-59) opponents batting average over his last 20 games dating back to June 4.
- Has held right-handed hitters to a .187 (17-for-91) average but they have hit five of the career-high six home runs he has allowed.
- Has a 4.34 ERA (9 er in 18.2 ip) and .250 (18-for-72) opponents batting average in 21 outings on one day rest or fewer, a 1.27 ERA (3 er in 21.1 ip) and .141 (10-for-71) opponents average in 22 appearances on two days of rest or more.
- Has faced Texas 10 times in his career, logging a 8.64 ERA (8 er, 8.1 ip) with 16 strikeouts and 11 walks.

**Last Year:** Allowed just two runs in 21 appearances and only one was earned for a 0.42 ERA...ranked second among Major League relievers in ERA and opponents slugging percentage (.157), fifth in batting average (.114) and seventh in OPS (.410)

## 65 RHP DEOLIS GUERRA

**Last Outing:** 8/3 vs. San Diego (ND, 0.2 ip, h, r, er, bb, 2 so)

**Saves/Opportunities:** 0-0

**Inherited Runners/Scored:** 7/2 **First Hitters:** 6-28, 2 bb, hbp

- Allowed three runs July 28 at San Diego after an eight-game, 7.2-inning scoreless streak...has not allowed a run in 14 of his last 18 games but has allowed at least two runs in the three of the four games with a run (8 er in 19.2 ip, 3.366 ERA).
- Has a .200 opponents batting average, which breaks down to .154 (10-for-65) against left-handed hitters compared to .240 (18-for-75) against right-handers...has issued 10 of his 12 walks and yielded two of his three homers to righties for a .686 OPS...has a .437 OPS against lefties.
- Ranks 13th among American League relievers in opponents OPS (.573).
- Opponents are batting .192 (5-for-26) with runners in scoring position.
- Has a 2.37 ERA (5 er in 19.0 ip) in 15 games at night, a 5.31 ERA (12 er in 20.1 ip) in 16 day games.

**Last Year:** Was on the Opening Day roster and appeared in nine games for Philadelphia in 2020 and went 1-3 with an 8.59 ERA (7 er in 7.1 ip)...struck out eight batters and walked two.

## 36 RHP YUSMEIRO PETIT

**Last Outing:** 8/4 vs. San Diego (ND, 1.0 ip, h)

**Saves/Opportunities:** 2-6

**Inherited Runners/Scored:** 31/11 **First Hitters:** 15-49, 3 bb, sf

- Has a 1.80 ERA (3 er in 15.0 ip) over his last 15 games but has allowed 5-of-8 (62.5%) inherited runners to score over that span.
- Ranks second in the American League in games pitched (53)...is second among AL relievers in innings pitched (54.2) and is tied for second in wins (7), ranks second in fewest walks per nine innings (1.32) and is fifth in most inherited runners (31)...is averaging the second fewest strikeouts per nine innings in the majors among relievers (4.45).
- Allowed his fourth home run to his first batter faced on July 27, which is tied for the most in the majors.
- Opponents are hitting .186 (11-for-59) with runners in scoring position.

**Last Year:** Compiled a career-low 1.66 ERA in a team-leading 26 relief appearances...opponents hit .232 and he walked just five batters for a .273 on-base percentage...yielded four runs, three of which scored on solo home runs.

## 54 RHP SERGIO ROMO

**Last Outing:** 8/1 at Los Angeles-AL (ND, 1.0 ip, h, 2 so)

**Saves/Opportunities:** 0-1

**Inherited Runners/Scored:** 20/9 **First Hitters:** 13-41, bb, 2 hbp

- Has not allowed a run in his last 14 games dating back to June 29 (14.2 ip, 3 h, 3 bb, 15 so) and opponents are 3-for-44 (.068) over that span...has also not allowed a run in 24 of his last 26 games for a 0.72 ERA (25.0 ip, 11 h, 2 r, 2 er, 3 bb, 27 so, 1 hr) and .127 (10-for-79) opponents batting average.
- Has a 1.59 ERA (4 er in 22.2 ip) in 23 games on zero or one day of rest, a 5.94 ERA (11 er in 16.2 ip) in 20 outings on two days rest or more.
- First batters faced are 1-for-17 (.059) with eight strikeouts over his last 17 games after going 12-for-24 (.500) with a walk and two hit by pitches over his first 27 contests.
- Has faced the Rangers 10 times in his career, logging a 1.00 ERA (1 er, 9.0 ip) with eight strikeouts and four walks.
- Pitched a season-high 2.0 scoreless innings July 24 at Seattle...it marked his longest outing since May 17, 2019 with the Marlins against the Mets.

**Last Year:** Was 1-2 with five saves, a 4.05 ERA and .211 opponents batting average in 24 relief appearances with Minnesota...had 10 holds, which tied for third most in the majors...was the only reliever in the majors with at least 10 holds and at least five saves.

## 46 RHP BURCH SMITH

**Last Outing:** 8/3 vs. San Diego (ND, 3.0 ip, 4 h, 2 r, 2 er, bb, so)

**Saves/Opportunities:** 0-1

**Inherited Runners/Scored:** 6/0 **First Hitters:** 7-21, bb

- Has pitched twice against San Diego in the last week after not pitching since July 6, a span of 14 games and 20 days between appearances.
- Has a 7.53 ERA (14.1 ip, 20 h, 13 r, 12 er, 5 bb, 7 so) and .323 (20-for-62) opponents batting average over his last 11 games after logging a 2.93 ERA and .232 opponent average over his first 11 contests.
- Has a 3.75 ERA (5 er in 12.0 ip) in nine day games, a 6.11 ERA (12 er in 17.2 ip) in 13 contests at night.
- Was on the A's Opening Day roster appeared in just two games before he was placed on the 10-day injured list April 6 retroactive to April 4 with a strained right groin...was reinstated May 8.

**Last Year:** Made the A's Opening Day roster and was 2-0 with a save, a 2.25 ERA and .163 opponents batting average in six relief appearances before his season was cut short in mid-August with a forearm injury.

## 62 RHP LOU TRIVINO

**Last Outing:** 8/4 vs. San Diego (W, 1.0 ip, h, r)

**Saves/Opportunities:** 17-19

**Inherited Runners/Scored:** 14/2 **First Hitters:** 10-44, 4 bb

- Has converted each of his last 10 save opportunities dating back to June 5 and has a 1.08 ERA (3 er in 25.0 ip) and .193 (17-for-88) opponents batting average in 24 games over that span.
- Is 17-for-19 (89.4%) in save opportunities...ranks fifth in the American League in save percentage and sixth in saves.
- Has a 0.81 ERA (3 er in 33.1 ip) over his last 32 games and now has a 1.95 ERA for the season, which ranks sixth among AL relievers.
- Ranks seventh among AL relievers in innings pitched (50.2), 10th in opponents slugging percentage (.279) and tied for 10th in games (48).
- Has a .165 (17-for-103) opponents batting average against right-handed hitters compared to .237 (18-for-76) against left-handers.
- Opponents are hitting .143 (8-for-56) with runners in scoring position.
- Allowed both of his inherited runners to score in his second game on April 3 but has stranded all 12 of his inherited runners since then.
- Has allowed just one home run over his last 37 games (37.2 innings).

**Last Year:** Compiled a 3.86 ERA in 20 relief appearances and held the opposition to a career-low .193 batting average...issued 10 walks in 23.1 innings for a career-low .280 on-base percentage...struck out 26 for a career-best 10.03 strikeouts per nine innings.

**Inherited Runners/Scored:** 11/3 **First Hitters:** 3-21, 4 bb

- Was reinstated from the injured list June 29 and has two wins and a loss in 10 appearances since his return (11.2 ip, 11 h, 7 r, 5 er, 8 bb, 11 so, 3.86 ERA).
- Has allowed a .211 (12-for-57) average against right-handed hitters, .341 (14-for-41) against left-handers.
- Has a 2.84 ERA (4 er in 12.2 ip) at home, a 5.56 ERA (7 er in 11.1 ip) on the road.
- Has faced the Angles 12 times in his career, going 2-0 with a 1.26 ERA (2 er, 14.1 ip) with 12 strikeouts and six walks.
- Was on the 10-day IL from May 2 to June 28 with a strained left oblique.

**Last Year:** Was 1-1 with a 1.80 ERA and .183 opponents batting average in 21 relief appearances...struck out 31 batters in 25.0 innings and tied for sixth among relievers in the West divisions in strikeouts...his ERA ranked seventh.

- Is hitting .256 (62-for-242) with both of his home runs against right-handed pitchers, .181 (23-for-127) against left-handers.
- Committed his 12th error of the season last Saturday, which is fifth most among AL shortstops.
- Is 10-for-41 (.244) wit three doubles and two RBI in 10 games against the Rangers...spent the first 12 seasons of his career with Texas...left as the Rangers all-time leader in stolen bases (305), ranked second in games (1652), at bats (6366) and triples (48), third in runs (893) and hits (1743), fifth in doubles (303) and walks (519), seventh in RBI (636) and eighth in extra base hits (427).

**Last Year:** Was hampered by a back injury for much of the season and batted .194 with three home runs and seven RBI in 29 games with Texas...had two stints on the 10-day injured list with the back injury (Aug. 20-30 and Sept. 12-end of season).

- Was reinstated from the injured list July 17 and has reached base safely in all 16 games since his return...is 14-for-56 (.250) with 10 walks and six hit by pitches (.417 on-base percentage) since his return.
- Leads the majors in hit by pitches (19) and pitches per plate appearance (4.32)...is tied for third in the American League in triples (4) and ranks fourth in on-base percentage (.383).
- Has a .390 on-base percentage over the last three years, which is eighth best in the majors (min. 900 PA).
- Has made 87 of his 88 starts batting leadoff...the A's are 51-36 (.586) when he hits leadoff, 10-12 (.455) when he doesn't.
- Is batting .314 (22-for-70) with runners in scoring position.
- Is 4-for-13 (.308) against Texas.
- Has not homered since June 4 and his 33-game homerless is the second longest of his career (35, June 12-Aug. 16, 2015).
- Has started games at four different positions (56 in left field, 21 in center field, seven in right field, four at designated hitter)...has also appeared in two games at first base.
- Has career highs in hit by pitches (19), triples (4) and stolen bases (10).

**Last Year:** Batted .246 in 59 games but walked 37 times and was hit by a pitch 10 times for a .387 on-base percentage...tied for fourth in the majors in hit by pitches, tied for 12th in walks and ranked 15th in on-base percentage.
