OAKLAND ATHLETICS (62-48) VS. TEXAS RANGERS (39-71)

ABOUT THE A'S: Have won six of the last eight games after losing four straight and are now 10-8 since the All-Star Break...are 3-7-3 over the previous 13 series and have an 18-21 record over the last 39 games...are 62-48 (.564) overall, which is the fifth best record in the American League...are in second place in the AL West for the 43rd consecutive day (dating back to June 21) and trail first place Houston by three games...are in second place in the AL Wild Card, 1½ games behind Boston and 1½ games ahead of the third place team, New York...have spent 58 days alone in first place in the West, three days tied for first, 43 days in second, one day tied for second, three days in third, two days in fourth, three days tied for fourth and 10 days in fifth.

ONE-RUN GAMES AND OTHER CLOSE CALLS: The A's have back-to-back walk-off wins and now have 10 for the season, which ties the Rockies for the most in the majors...have 93 walk-off wins in the Bob Melvin era, which are the most in the majors over that span...have played back-to-back extra inning games for the second time this year (July 2-3) and are 6-3 (.667) in extra innings, which is tied for the second best record in the American League...are 14-7 in games decided in the last at bat...snapped a five-game losing streak in one-run games on Wednesday...have lost 12 of the last 16 one-run decisions and are 16-19 (.457) overall...are 11-7 at home, 5-12 on the road...lead the AL in one-run losses and are tied with Seattle for the lead in one-run games (35)...are 24-27 (.471) in games decided by two runs or fewer compared to 38-21 (.644) in games decided by three runs or more.

DON'T WALK: The A's have not walked a batter in the last two games, both extra innings...the only other American League or National League team over the last 96 years to play back-to-back extra inning games without issuing a walk is the Minnesota Twins (May 27-28, 2008)...it is the first time it has happened in Athletics history...have walked just 288 batters for the season, which is the fewest in the majors.

DEFENSIVE DOINGS: The A's have committed just one error in the last 13 games and have 45 for the season, which is the fewest in the majors (Astros, 48)...have the fourth fewest double plays in the American League (79)...are tied for fourth in the AL in caught stealing (16) and tied for fifth in pickoffs (5)...outfielders have 10 assists, which is tied for second fewest in the AL.

PITCHING: The A's have a 3.15 ERA (188 er in 536.2 ip) over the last 60 games dating back to May 26, which is second lowest in the majors over that span (Brewers, 2.88)...also have the second lowest opponents OPS (.645) over that stretch to the Brewers (.624)...overall, rank second in the American League in ERA (3.65) and opponents slugging percentage (.381) and fourth in OPS (.681) and on-base percentage (.300)...have issued the fewest walks (288), allowed the fewest home runs (115), are tied for the lead in shutouts (10) and rank second in fewest pitches per inning (15.9).

STARTING PITCHING: A's starting pitchers have compiled a 3.12 ERA (73 er in 210.2 ip) over the last 35 games dating back to June 23 but are 12-12 over that span...are 42-37 with a 3.65 ERA (257 er in 634.0 ip) overall...are tied for second in the American League in wins, rank third in ERA and fourth in opponents OPS (.686)...lead the majors in innings pitched (634.0) and are tied for second in complete games (3)...have used just eight starting pitchers, which is tied with the Reds and Astros for second fewest in the majors (Red Sox, 6).

BULLPEN: The A's bullpen has converted each of its three save opportunities over the last 16 games and has a 2.08 ERA (11 er in 47.2 ip) over that span...has a 3.67 ERA overall, which is third lowest in the American League...also has the third lowest opponents OPS (.672)...is 26-for-41 (63.4%) in save opportunities...has 11 losses, which is the fewest in the majors...has the highest slugging percentage against first batters faced in the AL (.451) and the third highest batting average (.258).

OFFENSE: The A's are batting .188 (18-for-96) with 10 runs scored in three games on the homestand but have won two of those games...are hitting .232 overall, which is fourth lowest in the American League...have been hit by a pitch 17 times in the last 17 games and 67 times for the season, which is the most in the AL and tied for fourth most in the majors...ranks third in the AL in stolen base percentage (82.5%), tied for third in fewest grounded into double plays (64), fourth in sacrifice flies (34) and fifth in walks (370) and sacrifice hits (14)...A's pinch hitters lead the AL in hits (24), RBI (17), sacrifice flies (3) and plate appearances (106), are tied for the lead in home runs (3), rank second in extra base hits (6) and tied for second in doubles (3).

HOME AND AWAY: The A's are 2-1 on this five-game homestand against San Diego (1-1) and Texas (1-0)...went 3-2 on the last homestand against Cleveland (1-2) and Los Angeles-AL (2-0)...are in a stretch from July 6 to Aug. 19 where they are scheduled to play 26 of 36 games on the road...are 13-11 over the first 24 games of that stretch (8-8 on the road, 5-3 at home)...overall, are 32-25 (.561) at home compared to 30-23 (.566) on the road...leave follow-

ing the game tomorrow for a 10-game road trip to Cleveland (three games), Texas (three games) and Chicago-AL (four games) that begins on Tuesday...it is the A's second consecutive 10-game road trip...went 5-5 on the last road trip to Seattle (1-3), San Diego (1-1) and Los Angeles-AL (3-1).

HOME AND AWAY SPLITS: The A's are batting .219 (393-for-1794) and are averaging 4.09 runs per game at home (233 runs in 57 games) compared to .245 with an average of 4.64 runs per game on the road...have the second lowest home batting average in the American League and third lowest OPS (.693)...have the fifth best road batting average and OPS (.731).

AGAINST THE WEST: This three-game series with Texas concludes a stretch that began on July 19 where the A's are scheduled to play 13 of 17 games against American League West teams...are 7-4 against the West during the stretch...are now 26-24 (.520) against AL West competition overall compared to 36-24 (.600) against all other teams...have never made the playoffs with a losing record against the West...following this series, are scheduled to play 26 of their next 34 games against non-division foes before concluding the season with 16 straight games against the West.

THIS AND THAT: The A's are 27-16 (.628) in games in which the opponent starts a left-handed pitcher compared to 35-32 (.522) when they start a right-hander...the mark against lefties is second best in the American League (White Sox, 20-11/.645) and the 43 games are tied for second most...have used a different lineup in each of the last 47 games and have 107 different lineups over the first 110 contests...Thursday was the second of three off days over an eight-day stretch from Aug. 2-9...had Monday off and will have next Monday off before beginning a stretch of 15 games in 15 days.

THE INJURED LIST: The A's have used the injured list 19 times this year...used it just eight times last year, which was second fewest in the majors to Cleveland (4), and 18 times in 2019, which tied for second fewest...currently have four players on the IL (Fiers, Kaprielian, Pinder, Rosenthal)...have missed just 527 games to IL placements, an average of 27.7 games per stint.

A'S IN JULY: The A's went 11-13 (.458) in July, which was the fifth worst record in the American League...it was the A's first losing record in a month of 10 or more games since they went 11-15 in April of 2019, snapping a streak of 10 consecutive months with a winning record...however, had the second lowest ERA (2.98) and OPS (.618) in July in the majors (Brewers, 2.56 and .599)...A's pitchers set a franchise record for July strikeouts (221)...had the second lowest opponents batting average (.219) and on-base percentage (.282) in July in Oakland history.

A'S vs. RANGERS: The A's lead the season series, 6-5...are 2-2 in Oakland and 4-3 in Texas...won the season series last year, 7-3...it was their fourth consecutive season series victory over the Rangers, which is just the second time the A's have won four consecutive season series against Texas (2002-05)...have won 20 of the last 29 games and are 35-15 over the last 50 contests...have won nine of the last 12 and 27 of the last 35 in Oakland...are 50-28 (.641) against the Rangers over the last five years...are 391-381 all-time against the Texas Rangers...that breaks down to 205-178 in Oakland and 186-203 in Texas...are 8-6 at Globe Life Field...have an all-time record of 488-465 against the Rangers/Senators franchise.

TODAY'S TIDBITS

Mark Canha was hit by a pitch for the 20th time last night, which ties the Athletics record for hit by pitches in a season (Don Baylor, 1976; Jason Kendall, 2005)...leads the majors in hit by pitches...**Starling Marte** is batting a Major League leading .423 (30-for-71) since the All-Star Break...also leads the majors in steals since the break (10) and ranks third in on-base percentage (.481)...**Matt Olson** ranks third in the American League in OPS (.946), slugging percentage (.574) and home runs (28), tied for fourth in extra base hits (55) and sacrifice flies (7), tied for seventh in RBI (72), doubles (27) and runs (70), eighth in on-base percentage (.371) and 10th in walks (52)...**Sergio Romo** has not allowed a run in his last 15 games dating back to June 29 (15.2 ip, 3 h, 2 bb, 16 so) and opponents are 3-for-48 (.063) over that span...**Lou Trivino** has converted each of his last 10 save opportunities dating back to June 5 and has a 1.04 ERA (3 er in 26.0 ip) and .196 (18-for-92) opponents batting average in 25 games over that span.

THIS DATE IN ATHLETICS HISTORY

In **1968** Joe Keough homers in his first major league at bat off New York's Lindy McDaniel at Yankee Stadium...in **1971** Vida Blue becomes Oakland's first 20-game winner when he shuts out the White Sox 1-0 on a five hitter at the Coliseum...he would go on to win 24 games and the American League MVP and Cy Young awards.

ATHLETICS BULLPEN BRIEFS

39 LHP ANDREW CHAFIN

Last Outing: 8/6 vs. Texas (ND, 1.0 ip, 2 so)

Saves/Opportunities: 0-1

Inherited Runners/Scored: 22/7 **First Hitters:** 7-46 (2 bb)

- Was acquired from the Chicago Cubs July 26 along with cash considerations for Greg Deichmann and minor leaguer Daniel Palencia.
- Has not allowed a run in 44 of his 48 appearances and ranks seventh among ML relievers in ERA (1.84).
- Has not allowed a home run in his last 38 games (35.0 innings) and has yielded just one home run in 44.0 innings overall...his average of 0.20 home runs per nine innings is eighth lowest among ML relievers.
- Has a 0.78 ERA (2 er in 23.0 ip) in 25 appearances on one day of rest or fewer, a 3.10 ERA (7 er in 20.1 ip) in 22 games on two days rest or more.
- Has not allowed a run in the eighth inning (23.2 ip).
- Allowed three runs on two hits and two walks in his final outing with the Cubs on July 24 against Arizona without retiring a batter to snap a career-high 24.1-inning scoreless streak dating back to May 8...opponents went 9-for-79 (.114) with five walks during the streak.
- Was 0-2 with a 2.06 ERA in 43 relief appearances for Chicago...at the time of the trade, he ranked third among National League relievers in opponents OPS (.461), fifth in slugging percentage (.228), seventh in ERA, eighth in batting average (.154), ninth in on-base percentage (.233) and tied for ninth in games.

Last Year: Combined for a 1-2 record, one save and a 6.52 ERA in 15 relief appearances with the Diamondbacks and Cubs...missed a month of the season from Aug. 19 to Sept. 18 with a sprained left finger.

35 LHP JAKE DIEKMAN

Last Outing: 8/4 vs. San Diego (ND, 1.0 ip, so)

Saves/Opportunities: 7-12

Inherited Runners/Scored: 8/4 **First Hitters:** 8-36, 5 bb, 3 hbp

- Has a 2.60 ERA (5 er in 17.1 ip) and .203 (12-for-59) opponents batting average over his last 20 games dating back to June 4.
- Has held right-handed hitters to a .187 (17-for-91) average but they have hit five of the career-high six home runs he has allowed.
- Has a 4.34 ERA (9 er in 18.2 ip) and .250 (18-for-72) opponents batting average in 21 outings on one day rest or fewer, a 1.27 ERA (3 er in 21.1 ip) and .141 (10-for-71) opponents average in 22 appearances on two days of rest or more.
- Has faced Texas 10 times in his career, logging a 8.64 ERA (8 er, 8.1 ip) with 16 strikeouts and 11 walks.

Last Year: Allowed just two runs in 21 appearances and only one was earned for a 0.42 ERA...ranked second among Major League relievers in ERA and opponents slugging percentage (.157), fifth in batting average (.114) and seventh in OPS (.410)

65 RHP DEOLIS GUERRA

Last Outing: 8/3 vs. San Diego (ND, 0.2 ip, h, r, er, bb, 2 so)

Saves/Opportunities: 0-0

Inherited Runners/Scored: 7/2 **First Hitters:** 6-28, 2 bb, hbp

- Allowed three runs July 28 at San Diego after an eight-game, 7.2-inning scoreless streak...has not allowed a run in 14 of his last 18 games but has allowed at least two runs in the three of the four games with a run (8 er in 19.2 ip, 3.366 ERA).
- Has a .200 opponents batting average, which breaks down to .154 (10-for-65) against left-handed hitters compared to .240 (18-for-75) against right-handers...has issued 10 of his 12 walks and yielded two of his three homers to righties for a .686 OPS...has a .437 OPS against lefties.
- Ranks 13th among American League relievers in opponents OPS (.573).
- Opponents are batting .192 (5-for-26) with runners in scoring position.
- Has a 2.37 ERA (5 er in 19.0 ip) in 15 games at night, a 5.31 ERA (12 er in 20.1 ip) in 16 day games.

Last Year: Was on the Opening Day roster and appeared in nine games for Philadelphia in 2020 and went 1-3 with an 8.59 ERA (7 er in 7.1 ip)...struck out eight batters and walked two.

36 RHP YUSMEIRO PETIT

Last Outing: 8/6 vs. Texas (W, 1.0 ip, so)

Saves/Opportunities: 2-6

Inherited Runners/Scored: 31/11 **First Hitters:** 15-50, 3 bb, sf

- Has a 1.69 ERA (3 er in 16.0 ip) over his last 16 games but has allowed 5-of-8 (62.5%) inherited runners to score over that span.
- Is tied for first in the American League in games pitched (54)...is second among AL relievers in innings pitched (55.2) and is tied for first in wins (8), ranks second in fewest walks per nine innings (1.29) and is tied for fifth in most inherited runners (31)...is averaging the fewest strikeouts per nine innings in the majors among relievers (4.53).
- Allowed his fourth home run to his first batter faced on July 27, which is tied for the most in the majors.
- Opponents are hitting .186 (11-for-59) with runners in scoring position.

Last Year: Compiled a career-low 1.66 ERA in a team-leading 26 relief appearances...opponents hit .232 and he walked just five batters for a .273 on-base percentage...yielded four runs, three of which scored on solo home runs.

Last Outing: 8/6 vs. Texas (ND, 1.0 ip, so)

Saves/Opportunities: 0-1

Inherited Runners/Scored: 20/9 **First Hitters:** 13-42, bb, 2 hbp

- Has not allowed a run in his last 15 games dating back to June 29 (15.2 ip, 3 h, 3 bb, 16 so) and opponents are 3-for-47 (.064) over that span...has also not allowed a run in 25 of his last 27 games for a 0.69 ERA (26.0 ip, 11 h, 2 r, 2 er, 3 bb, 27 so, 1 hr) and .122 (10-for-82) opponents batting average.
- Has a 1.59 ERA (4 er in 22.2 ip) in 23 games on zero or one day of rest, a 5.60 ERA (11 er in 17.2 ip) in 21 outings on two days rest or more.
- First batters faced are 1-for-18 (.056) with nine strikeouts over his last 18 games after going 12-for-24 (.500) with a walk and two hit by pitches over his first 27 contests.
- Has faced the Rangers 11 times in his career, logging a 0.90 ERA (1 er, 10.0 ip) with nine strikeouts and four walks.
- Pitched a season-high 2.0 scoreless innings July 24 at Seattle...it marked his longest outing since May 17, 2019 with the Marlins against the Mets.

Last Year: Was 1-2 with five saves, a 4.05 ERA and .211 opponents batting average in 24 relief appearances with Minnesota...had 10 holds, which tied for third most in the majors...was the only reliever in the majors with at least 10 holds and at least five saves.

46 RHP BURCH SMITH

Last Outing: 8/3 vs. San Diego (ND, 3.0 ip, 4 h, 2 r, 2 er, bb, so)

Saves/Opportunities: 0-1

Inherited Runners/Scored: 6/0 **First Hitters:** 7-21, bb

- Has pitched twice against San Diego in the last week after not pitching since July 6, a span of 14 games and 20 days between appearances.
- Has a 7.53 ERA (14.1 ip, 20 h, 13 r, 12 er, 5 bb, 7 so) and .323 (20-for-62) opponents batting average over his last 11 games after logging a 2.93 ERA and .232 opponent average over his first 11 contests.
- Has a 3.75 ERA (5 er in 12.0 ip) in nine day games, a 6.11 ERA (12 er in 17.2 ip) in 13 contests at night.
- Was on the A's Opening Day roster appeared in just two games before he was placed on the 10-day injured list April 6 retroactive to April 4 with a strained right groin...was reinstated May 8.

Last Year: Made the A's Opening Day roster and was 2-0 with a save, a 2.25 ERA and .163 opponents batting average in six relief appearances before his season was cut short in mid-August with a forearm injury.

62 RHP LOU TRIVINO

Last Outing: 8/6 vs. Texas (ND, 1.0 ip, h, so)

Saves/Opportunities: 17-19

Inherited Runners/Scored: 14/2 **First Hitters:** 10-45, 4 bb

- Has converted each of his last 10 save opportunities dating back to June 5 and has a 1.04 ERA (3 er in 26.0 ip) and .196 (18-for-92) opponents batting average in 25 games over that span.
- Is 17-for-19 (89.5%) in save opportunities...ranks eighth in the American League in save percentage and sixth in saves.
- Has a 0.79 ERA (3 er in 34.1 ip) over his last 33 games and now has a 1.92 ERA for the season, which ranks fifth among AL relievers.
- Ranks seventh among AL relievers in innings pitched (51.2), ninth in opponents slugging percentage (.279) and tied for ninth in games (49).
- Has a .163 (17-for-104) opponents batting average against right-handed hitters compared to .241 (19-for-79) against left-handers.
- Opponents are hitting .140 (8-for-57) with runners in scoring position.
- Allowed both of his inherited runners to score in his second game on April 3 but has stranded all 12 of his inherited runners since then.
- Has allowed just one home run over his last 38 games (38.2 innings).

Last Year: Compiled a 3.86 ERA in 20 relief appearances and held the opposition to a career-low .193 batting average...issued 10 walks in 23.1 innings for a career-low .280 on-base percentage...struck out 26 for a career-best 10.03 strikeouts per nine innings.

Saves/Opportunities: 0-1

Inherited Runners/Scored: 11/3 **First Hitters:** 3-21, 4 bb

- Was reinstated from the injured list June 29 and has two wins and a loss in 10 appearances since his return (11.2 ip, 11 h, 7 r, 5 er, 8 bb, 11 so, 3.86 ERA).
- Has allowed a .211 (12-for-57) average against right-handed hitters, .341 (14-for-41) against left-handers.
- Has a 2.84 ERA (4 er in 12.2 ip) at home, a 5.56 ERA (7 er in 11.1 ip) on the road.
- Has thrown 4.0 scoreless innings across three outings against the Rangers this season...overall is 2-0 with a 1.26 ERA (2 er in 14.1 ip) in 12 career appearances vs. Texas.
- Was on the 10-day IL from May 2 to June 28 with a strained left oblique.

Last Year: Was 1-1 with a 1.80 ERA and .183 opponents batting average in 21 relief appearances...struck out 31 batters in 25.0 innings and tied for sixth among relievers in the West divisions in strikeouts...his ERA ranked seventh.

- Is hitting .255 (62-for-243) with both of his home runs against right-handed pitchers, .181 (23-for-127) against left-handers.
- Committed his 12th error of the season a week ago today, which is fifth most among AL shortstops.
- Is 10-for-42 (.238) with three doubles and two RBI in 11 games against the Rangers...spent the first 12 seasons of his career with Texas...left as the Rangers all-time leader in stolen bases (305), ranked second in games (1652), at bats (6366) and triples (48), third in runs (893) and hits (1743), fifth in doubles (303) and walks (519), seventh in RBI (636) and eighth in extra base hits (427).

- Was recalled from Triple-A Las Vegas yesterday for his second stint with the A's this year...hit .199 with 12 home runs and 30 RBI in 79 games during his first stint from April 6 to July 31.
- Went 4-for-14 (.286) with a double, triple and RBI in three games with the Aviators following his Aug. 1 option...appeared in one game in left field, one at designated hitter and one at right field.
- Is tied for fifth among American League rookies in home runs (12).
- Is batting .205 (36-for-176) against right-handed pitchers, .133 (2-for-15) against left-handers...has made 48 of his 49 starts this year and 65 of 67 in his career in games in which the opponent starts a right-handed pitcher.
- Is 4-for-17 (.235) with a double, home run, four RBI, a walk and a sacrifice fly as a pinch hitter...is tied for the lead among AL pinch hitters in plate appearances (19), is tied for third in RBI and tied for fourth in hits.
- Is batting .250 (25-for-100) at home, .143 (13-for-91) on the road.
- More than half of his hits are for extra bases (20-of-38, 52.6%)...30 of his 60 (50.0%) career hits are extra base hits.
- Has started games at four different positions (35 in right field, nine in left field, three at designated hitter, two at first base).

Last Year: Went 0-for-5 with two strikeouts in seven games over three stints with Oakland...all five of his plate appearances came against right-handed pitchers...made just one start and went 0-for-2 as the A's designated hitter.

20 MARK CANHA

Texas Series: 0-4, r, hbp
Homestand: 1-11, 2 r, bb, so, 2 hbp

- Was hit by a pitch for the 20th time last night, which ties the Athletics record for hit by pitches in a season (Don Baylor, 1976; Jason Kendall, 2005)...leads the majors in hit by pitches.
- Was reinstated from the injured list July 17 and has reached base safely in all 17 games since his return...is 14-for-60 (.233) but has 10 walks and seven hit by pitches for a .403 on-base percentage.
- In addition to hit by pitches, he also leads the majors in pitches per plate appearance (4.32)...is tied for third in the American League in triples (4) and ranks fifth in on-base percentage (.381).
- Has a .389 on-base percentage over the last three years, which is eighth best in the majors (min. 900 PA).
- Has made 88 of his 89 starts batting leadoff...the A's are 52-36 (.591) when he hits leadoff, 10-12 (.455) when he doesn't.
- Is batting .314 (22-for-70) with runners in scoring position.
- Has not homered since June 4 and his 34-game homerless is the second longest of his career (35, June 12-Aug. 16, 2015).
- Has started games at four different positions (57 in left field, 21 in center field, seven in right field, four at designated hitter)...has also appeared in two games at first base.
