## OAKLAND ATHLETICS (63-48) VS. TEXAS RANGERS (39-72)

SUNDAY, AUGUST 8, 2021 — OAKLAND COLISEUM — 1:07 PDT

**ABOUT THE A'S:** Have won three straight and seven of the last nine games and are now 11-8 since the All-Star Break...are 19-21 dating back to June 19 but are 63-48 (.568) overall, which is the fifth best record in the American League...are 15 games over .500 for the first time since June 24 (46-31)...are in second place in the AL West for the 44th consecutive day (dating back to June 21) and trail first place Houston by three games...are in second place in the AL Wild Card, one game behind Boston and 1½ games ahead of the third place team, New York...have spent 58 days alone in first place in the West, three days tied for first, 44 days in second, one day tied for second, three days in third, two days in fourth, three days tied for fourth and 10 days in fifth.

**DEFENSIVE DOINGS:** The A's have committed just one error in the last 14 games and have 45 for the season, which is the fewest in the majors (Astros, 48)...are tied for the third fewest double plays in the American League (79)...are tied for fourth in the AL in caught stealing (16) and tied for fifth in pick-offs (5)...outfielders have 10 assists, which is tied for second fewest in the AL.

**PITCHING:** The A's have a 3.15 ERA (191 er in 545.2 ip) over the last 61 games dating back to May 26, which is second lowest in the majors over that span (Brewers, 2.93)...also have the second lowest opponents OPS (.644) over that stretch to the Brewers (.630)...overall, rank third in the American League in ERA (3.65) and opponents slugging percentage (.380) and fourth in OPS (.680) and on-base percentage (.300)...have issued the fewest walks in the majors (291)...have allowed the fewest home runs in the AL (116), are tied for the lead in shutouts (10) and rank second in fewest pitches per inning (15.9)...Cole Irvin won his eighth game of the season yesterday and the A's are the only team in the majors with five pitchers with eight or more wins.

**STARTING PITCHING:** A's starting pitchers have compiled a 3.10 ERA (75 er in 217.2 ip) over the last 36 games dating back to June 23 but are 13-12 over that span...are 43-37 with a 3.64 ERA (259 er in 641.0 ip) overall...are tied for second in the American League in wins, rank third in ERA and fourth in opponents OPS (.684)...lead the majors in innings pitched (641.0) and are tied for second in complete games (3)...have used just eight starting pitchers, which is tied with the Reds and Astros for second fewest in the majors (Red Sox, 6)...are the only team in the majors with four pitchers with 22 or more starts.

**BULLPEN:** The A's bullpen has converted each of its three save opportunities over the last 17 games and has a 2.17 ERA (12 er in 49.2 ip) over that span...has a 3.67 ERA overall, which is fifth lowest in the American League...has the third lowest opponents OPS (.672)...is 26-for-41 (63.4%) in save opportunities...has 11 losses, which is the fewest in the majors...has the highest slugging percentage against first batters faced in the AL (.448) and the third highest batting average (.256).

**OFFENSE:** The A's had 12 runs on a season-high 16 hits yesterday after scoring 10 runs on 18 hits over the first three games of the homestand...are now hitting .234 overall, which is fourth lowest in the American League...have been hit by a pitch 18 times in the last 18 games and 68 times for the season, which is the most in the AL, tied for third most in the majors and tied for fifth most in Oakland history (88 in 2001, 87 in 2019, 76 in 2018, 71 in 1999)...rank second in the AL in stolen base percentage (82.8%), tied for third in fewest grounded into double plays (65), fourth in sacrifice flies (34) and fifth in walks (375) and sacrifice hits (14)...A's pinch hitters lead the AL in hits (24), RBI (17), sacrifice flies (3) and plate appearances (106), are tied for the lead in home runs (3), rank second in extra base hits (6) and tied for second in doubles (3).

**WALK-OFFS AND OTHER CLOSE CALLS:** The A's had back-to-back walk-off wins on Wednesday and Friday and now have 10 for the season, which ties the Rockies for the most in the majors...have 93 walk-off wins in the Bob Melvin era, which are the most in the majors over that span...are 6-3 (.667) in extra innings, which is tied for the third best record in the American League...are 14-7 in games decided in the last at bat...snapped a five-game losing streak in one-run games on Wednesday...have lost 12 of the last 16 one-run decisions and are 16-19 (.457) overall...are 11-7 at home, 5-12 on the road...lead the AL in one-run losses and rank second in one-run games (35)...are 24-27 (.471) in games decided by two runs or fewer compared to 39-21 (.650) in games decided by three runs or more.

**HOME AND AWAY:** The A's are 3-1 on this five-game homestand against San Diego (1-1) and Texas (2-0)...went 3-2 on the last homestand against Cleveland (1-2) and Los Angeles-AL (2-0)...are in a stretch from July 6 to Aug. 19 where they are scheduled to play 26 of 36 games on the road...are 14-11 over the first 25 games of that stretch (8-8 on the road, 6-3 at home)...overall, are 33-25 (.569) at home compared to 30-23 (.566) on the road...leave following the game today for a 10-game road trip to Cleveland (three games), Texas

(three games) and Chicago-AL (four games) that begins on Tuesday...it is the A's second consecutive 10-game road trip...went 5-5 on the last road trip to Seattle (1-3), San Diego (1-1) and Los Angeles-AL (3-1)...are now 11-14 on the road dating back to June 19 after starting the year 19-9 in away games.

**HOME AND AWAY SPLITS:** The A's are batting .223 (409-for-1832) and are averaging 4.22 runs per game at home (245 runs in 58 games) compared to .245 with an average of 4.64 runs per game on the road...have the second lowest home batting average in the American League and third lowest OPS (.703)...have the fifth best road batting average and OPS (.731)...have a 3.56 ERA (182 er in 459.2 ip) on the road, which is the lowest in the AL and fourth lowest in the majors.

**AGAINST THE WEST:** This three-game series with Texas concludes a stretch that began on July 19 where the A's are scheduled to play 13 of 17 games against American League West teams...are 8-4 against the West during the stretch...are now 27-24 (.529) against AL West competition overall compared to 36-24 (.600) against all other teams...beginning Tuesday, the A's are scheduled to play 26 of their next 34 games against non-division foes before concluding the season with 16 straight games against the West.

**THIS AND THAT:** The A's are 27-16 (.628) in games in which the opponent starts a left-handed pitcher compared to 36-32 (.529) when they start a right-hander...the mark against lefties is second best in the American League (White Sox, 20-11/.645) and the 43 games are tied for third most...have used a different lineup in each of the last 48 games and have 108 different lineups over the first 111 contests...have tomorrow off for their third off-day over an eight-day stretch from Aug. 2-9...begin a stretch of 15 games in 15 days on Tuesday...are 40-8 (.833) when out-homer the opposition, 8-27 (.229) when they are out-homered...went 11-13 (.458) in July, which was the A's first losing record in a month of 10 or more games since they went 11-15 in April of 2019.

**THE INJURED LIST:** The A's have used the injured list 19 times this year...used it just eight times last year, which was second fewest in the majors to Cleveland (4), and 18 times in 2019, which tied for second fewest...currently have three players on the IL (Fiers, Pinder, Rosenthal)...have missed just 531 games to IL placements, an average of 27.9 games per stint.

**A's vs. RANGERS:** The A's lead the season series, 7-5...are 3-2 in Oakland and 4-3 in Texas...won the season series last year, 7-3...it was their fourth consecutive season series victory over the Rangers, which is just the second time the A's have won four consecutive season series against Texas (2002-05)...have won 21 of the last 30 games and are 36-15 over the last 51 contests...have won 10 of the last 13 and 28 of the last 36 in Oakland...are 51-28 (.646) against the Rangers over the last five years...are 392-381 all-time against the Texas Rangers...that breaks down to 206-178 in Oakland and 186-203 in Texas...are 8-6 at Globe Life Field...have an all-time record of 489-465 against the Rangers/Senators franchise.

### TODAY'S TIDBITS

**Mark Canha** was hit by a pitch for the 20th time Friday night, which ties the Athletics record for hit by pitches in a season (Don Baylor, 1976; Jason Kendall, 2005)...leads the majors in hit by pitches...**Starling Marte** is batting a Major League leading .421 (30-for-76) since the All-Star Break...also leads the majors in steals since the break (11) and ranks third in on-base percentage (.476)...**Matt Olson** ranks third in the American League in OPS (.956), slugging percentage (.580) and home runs (28), fourth in extra base hits (56), tied for fourth in sacrifice flies (7), tied for fifth in doubles (28), sixth in on-base percentage (.376), seventh in RBI (74), tied for seventh in runs (73) and tied for 10th in walks (52)...**Sergio Romo** has not allowed a run in his last 15 games dating back to June 29 (15.2 ip, 3 h, 2 bb, 16 so) and opponents are 3-for-48 (.063) over that span...**Lou Trivino** has converted each of his last 10 save opportunities dating back to June 5 and has a 1.04 ERA (3 er in 26.0 ip) and .196 (18-for-92) opponents batting average in 25 games over that span.

### THIS DATE IN ATHLETICS HISTORY

In **1986** Dave Kingman's eighth inning homer in the A's 5-2 win over Minnesota gives him homers in five consecutive games, an Oakland A's record at the time...in **2004** the A's defeat Minnesota 6-5 in 18 innings in the longest A's game since 1972...Oakland scores three times in the top of the 18<sup>th</sup> on RBI singles by Jermaine Dye, Erubiel Durazo and Damian Miller before the Twins score twice in the bottom of the 18<sup>th</sup>...in **2006** Nick Swisher hits his 24<sup>th</sup> home run of the season in the A's 7-6 win over Texas, setting an all-time Athletics record for home runs by a switch hitter.

## TODAY'S STARTING PITCHER: James Kaprielian (5-4, 3.24 ERA)

**FOR STARTERS:** Was reinstated from the injured list today and is scheduled to make his 14th start of the season and his career...was placed on the 10-day IL July 31 retroactive to July 28 with a right shoulder impingement...missed just one start...began the year at Triple-A Las Vegas and was recalled by the A's on May 12...is 1-3 with a 3.67 ERA (14 er in 34.1 ip) and .246 (32-for-130) opponents batting average over his last six starts after going 4-1 with a 2.84 ERA and .182 opponents average over his first seven starts...has allowed two runs or fewer in nine of his 13 starts...has left with the lead in three of his four no decisions only to have the bullpen blow the save...the A's are 7-6 (.538) in his starting assignments.

**ROOKIE LEADERS:** Ranks seventh among American League rookies in innings pitched (72.1), tied for seventh in wins (5) and strikeouts (79) and eighth in games started (13)...based on a minimum of 0.5 innings per team game, his 3.24 ERA is the lowest in the AL and third lowest in the majors...has the third lowest opponents batting average in the AL (.213).

**OPPONENTS BATTING:** His opponents batting average breaks down to .179 (25-for-140) with a .555 OPS against right-handed hitters compared to .252 (32-for-127) with an .810 OPS against left-handers...has issued 19 of his 27 walks to lefties...has allowed a .167 (8-for-48) batting average with runners in scoring position...eight of the 11 home runs he has surrendered have been solo shots...has a .132 (14-for-106) opponents average the first time through the lineup, .314 (32-for-102) the second time and .186 (11-for-59) after that...has allowed four of his 11 home runs to the opponents clean-up hitter but has held the five hitter to a .067 (2-for-30) batting average.

**NIGHT AND DAY:** Is 3-2 with a 2.04 ERA (9 er in 39.2 ip) and .196 (28-for-143) opponents batting average in seven starts during the day compared to 2-2 with a 4.68 ERA (17 er in 32.2 ip) and .234 (29-for-124) opponents average in six starts at night...has yielded eight of his 11 home runs at night.

**HOME AND AWAY:** Is 2-2 with a 4.91 ERA (22 er in 40.1 ip) and .245 (37-for-151) opponents batting average in eight starts on the road compared to 3-2 with a 1.13 ERA (4 er in 32.0 ip) and .172 (20-for-116) opponents average in five starts at home...has yielded nine of his 11 home runs on the road for an .815 OPS...has a .499 opponents OPS in Oakland.

**BY INNING:** Has not allowed a run in the second inning (13.0 ip) and has a 1.04 ERA (3 er in 26.0 ip) and .144 (13-for-90) opponents batting average over the first two innings of a game...has a 4.47 ERA (23 er in 46.1 ip) and .256 (44-for-172) opponents average from the third inning on.

**2021 HIGHLIGHTS:** Began the year at Triple-A Las Vegas and went 0-1 with a 3.86 ERA in one start...was the Aviators Opening Day starter on May 6 at Las Vegas and was the losing pitcher in an 8-1 loss to Sacramento (4.2 ip, 8 h, 2 r, 2 er, 1 bb, 5 so, 0 hr, 76 pitches)...was recalled by Oakland on May 12 and made his first Major League start that day at Boston...allowed a run on four hits in 5.0 innings to earn his first ML win in the A's 4-1 victory over the Red Sox...struck out nine batters in 5.2 innings in his second start on May 21 at Los Angeles (AL) but had a no decision in an 8-4 A's win...left with a 3-2 lead and two outs in the bottom of the sixth but Petit allowed a run for the blown save...it was the first of three starts in which he left with the lead only to have the bullpen blow the save (June 23 at Texas and July 10 at Texas)...tossed 7.0 scoreless innings May 26 against Seattle for his second win...that matched his longest outing as a professional...also tossed 7.0 innings for Single-A Tampa at Charlotte on April 16, 2016, his second professional appearance...logged a season-low 3.2 innings May 31 at Seattle but had a no decision in the A's 6-5, 10-inning loss...was charged with the first loss of his career when he allowed two runs in 5.0 innings on June 6 at Colorado, a 3-1 A's loss...pitched 6.0 scoreless innings and allowed just two hits on June 12 to defeat Kansas City 11-2...walked a career-high four...tossed 105 pitches, which were his most as a professional, in a 5-4 loss to Texas on June 29...struck out a career-high 10 batters in a career-high tying 7.0 innings on July 4 against Boston but was the losing pitcher in the A's 1-0 loss...it was the first 10-strikeout game by an A's rookie since Chris Bassitt on Aug. 9, 2015 against Houston (also 10)...issued a career-high tying four walks in 5.0 innings in a no decision at Texas on July 10...combined with Romo, Moll and Guerra on a seven-hit shutout in the A's 6-0 win over Los Angeles (AL) on July 20 as part of a career-high 12.0-inning scoreless streak from July 10 to 27.

**LAST START:** He was the losing pitcher in the A's 7-4 loss at San Diego on July 27...allowed a career-high six runs on a career-high seven hits in 4.1 innings...it snapped a career-opening 14-game streak of 1.2 innings or more and six hits or fewer, which was the longest such streak in Athletics history...singled off Chris Paddock in the third inning for his first Major League hit...retired eight of the first nine batters and had a 3-0 lead when he allowed two runs in the third inning on a Tatis two-run homer...was charged with four of the Padres five runs in the fifth.

**KAPRIELIAN vs. TEXAS:** Is 0-1 with a 3.71 ERA (17.0 ip, 15 h, 7 r, 7 er, 6 bb, 14 so, 5 hr) in three career starts, all this year...the first no decision came in the A's 5-3 loss at Texas on June 23...blanked the Rangers on two hits and a walk over the first four innings before

allowing a RBI double to Heim with two outs in the fifth...also surrendered a solo home run to Garcia in the sixth to give Texas a 2-0 lead...Oakland then scored three times in the seventh and he was relieved by Petit to start the bottom of the seventh...Petit allowed two runs for the blown save...then took the loss in a 5-4 A's loss in Oakland on June 29...tossed 105 pitches, which were his most as a professional...the A's scored a run in the first and he retired 11 of the first 12 batters before allowing a two-out solo home run to Gallo in the fourth...Oakland regained the lead with a run in the bottom of the fourth but he allowed a RBI double to Heim in the sixth and another solo home run to Gallo in the sixth...had a no decision in the A's 8-4, 11-inning win at Texas on July 10...issued a career-high tying four walks in 5.0 innings...allowed back-to-back solo home runs to Garcia and Gallo in the first inning but the A's came back with two in the second and one in the fourth...did not allow a run over his final four innings of work and was relieved by Guerra to start the sixth inning with the A's leading 3-2...Diekmann allowed a run in the eighth for the blown save.

**2020 RECAP:** Made his Major League debut and had two relief appearances over five stints with Oakland...compiled a 7.36 ERA and .267 opponents batting average...allowed two home runs in 3.2 innings, walked two and struck out four...was recalled for the first time Aug. 4 but did not pitch before he was optioned back to the A's alternate site on Aug. 6...joined the club a second time Aug. 16 and made his ML debut that day at San Francisco (2.0 ip, 1 h, 1 r, 1 er, 1 bb, 1 so)...relieved Fiers to start the seventh inning with the A's leading 13-2 and allowed a home run to the first batter he faced (Crawford)...walked the next batter (Dubon) before retiring each of the final six batters he faced...struck out Solano to end the seventh inning for his first strikeout...was optioned on Aug. 19...was recalled as the 29th man for doubleheaders on Sept. 8 and Sept. 14 but did not pitch...recalled for his fifth stint on Sept. 24 and made one appearance in the second game of the Sept. 26 doubleheader against Seattle (1.2 ip, 3 h, 2 r, 2 er, 1 bb, 3 so)...inherited a bases loaded situation in the third inning with the A's trailing 4-1 and allowed all three runs to score...was on the Taxi Squad for the postseason...was rated as the A's number 10 prospect by *Baseball America* following the season.
