OAKLAND ATHLETICS (64-48) VS. CLEVELAND INDIANS (55-55)

ABOUT THE A'S: Swept a three-game series from Texas over the weekend for their first sweep of a series of three or more games since June 14-16 against the Angels...now have a four-game winning streak, which is the A's longest since winning seven straight from June 11-18...have won eight of the last 10 games and are 16 games over .500 at 64-48 (.571)...that is one short of the season high of 17 over on June 18 (44-27)...have the fourth best winning percentage in the American League...are in second place in the AL West for the 46th consecutive day (dating back to June 21) and trail first place Houston by two games...that is the closest the A's have been to first place in the West since July 1 when they were 1½ back...are in a virtual tie for the first AL Wild Card with Boston and are two games ahead of the third place team, New York...have spent 58 days alone in first place in the West, three days tied for first, 46 days in second, one day tied for second, three days in third, two days in fourth, three days tied for fourth and 10 days in fifth.

DAYS OFF AND THE SCHEDULE: Yesterday was the A's third day off over an eight-day stretch from Aug. 2-9...are 12-4 (.750) following a day off, which is the second best record in the majors (Giants, 14-3/.824)...are scheduled to play 15 games in the next 15 days starting today...also begin a stretch where they are scheduled to play 26 of their next 34 games against nondivision foes today...conclude the season with 16 straight games against the West...this road trip concludes a stretch that began on July 6 where the A's are scheduled to play 26 of 36 games on the road...after this trip, the A's have 22 home games and 18 road games remaining.

AGAINST THE CENTRAL: The A's are 13-4 (.765) against American League Central teams, which is the best record in the majors...are batting .251 (137-for-545) and are averaging 5.3 runs per game (90 runs in 17 games) against teams from the Central compared to .232 with an average of 4.3 runs per game against all other teams...have a 3.02 ERA (50 er in 149.0 ip) against the Central, 3.75 against everyone else...went 25-8 against the AL Central in 2019 after going 26-8 in 2018...are now 78-24 (.765) against AL Central foes dating back to June 23, 2017.

DEFENSIVE DOINGS: The A's have committed just two errors in the last 15 games and have 46 for the season, which is the fewest in the majors (Astros, 48)...are on pace for 67 errors, which would shatter the Athletics record for fewest errors in a season (80 in 2019)...are tied for the third fewest double plays in the American League (79)...are tied for fifth in the AL in caught stealing (16) and pickoffs (5)...outfielders have 10 assists, which is tied for second fewest in the AL.

PITCHING: The A's have a 3.15 ERA (194 er in 554.2 ip) and .643 OPS over the last 62 games dating back to May 26, both of which are second lowest in the majors to the Brewers (2.93 and .630)...overall, rank third in the American League in ERA (3.64) and opponents slugging percentage (.380) and fourth in OPS (.679) and on-base percentage (.299)...have issued the fewest walks in the majors (295)...have the fewest home runs (117) and fewest pitches per inning (15.9) in the AL and are tied for the lead in shutouts (10).

STARTING PITCHING: A's starting pitchers are 6-2 with a 2.48 ERA (17 er in 61.2 ip) and .204 (46-for-225) opponents batting average over the last 10 games...are 44-37 with a 3.63 ERA (261 er in 647.0 ip) overall...ranks third in the American League in ERA and wins and fourth in opponents OPS (.683)... lead the majors in innings pitched (647.0) and are tied for third in complete games (3)...have used just eight starting pitchers, which is tied with the Reds and Astros for second fewest in the majors (Red Sox, 6)...the A's and Red Sox are the only teams in the majors with four pitchers with 22 or more starts... no other team has more than two.

BULLPEN: The A's bullpen has converted each of its four save opportunities over the last 18 games and has a 2.22 ERA (13 er in 52.2 ip) and .216 (43-for-199) opponents batting average over that span...is 27-for-42 (64.3%) for the season, which is the fifth best save percentage in the American League... ranks third in opponents OPS (.672) and fourth in ERA (3.67)...has 11 losses, which is the fewest in the majors...has the second highest slugging percentage against first batters faced in the AL (.442) and the third highest batting average (.252).

OFFENSE: The A's are batting an American League leading .284 (59-for-208) in August...also have the best OPS (.836) and on-base percentage (.379) this month, the fewest strikeouts (44) and are tied for the most stolen bases (10)...overall, are batting .235, which is fifth lowest in the AL...hit .225 last year but the lowest batting average in a full season in Oakland history is .236 in 1982...have been hit by a pitch 18 times in the last 19 games and 68 times for the season, which is the most in the AL, tied for third most in the majors and tied for fifth most in Oakland history (88 in 2001, 87 in 2019, 76 in 2018, 71 in 1999)...are tied for the AL lead in stolen base percentage (83.3%), rank

fourth in fewest grounded into double plays (67) and fifth in walks (379), sacrifice flies (34) and sacrifice hits (14)...A's pinch hitters lead the AL in hits (24), RBI (17), sacrifice flies (3) and plate appearances (107), are tied for the lead in home runs (3), rank second in extra base hits (6) and tied for second in doubles (3).

CLOSE CALLS: The A's have lost 12 of their last 16 one-run games and are 16-19 (.457) overall...that breaks down to 11-7 at home and 5-12 on the road... lead the American League in one-run losses (19) and are tied for second in games (35)...are 24-27 (.471) in games decided by two runs or fewer compared to 40-21 (.656) in games decided by three runs or more...are 6-3 (.667) in extra innings, which is the third best record in the AL...are 14-7 in games decided in the last at bat...are tied with Colorado for the most walk-off wins in the majors (10) and have 93 walk-off wins in the Bob Melvin era, which are the most in the majors over that span.

HOME AND AWAY: The A's begin their second consecutive 10-game road trip tonight, a three-city trip to Cleveland (three games), Texas (three games) and Chicago-AL (four games)...went 5-5 on the last road trip to Seattle (1-3), San Diego (1-1) and Los Angeles-AL (3-1)...are now 11-14 on the road dating back to June 19 after starting the year 19-9 in away games...are 30-23 (.566) on the road compared to 34-25 (.576) at home...went 4-1 on the last homestand against San Diego (1-1) and Texas (3-0) and have won six of their last seven home games.

HOME AND AWAY SPLITS: The A's are batting .245 (450-for-1837) with a .731 OPS on the road compared to .226 with a .707 OPS at home...rank fifth in the American League in road batting average and sixth in OPS...have the second lowest home batting average and third lowest OPS...have a 3.56 ERA (182 er in 459.2 ip) on the road, which is the lowest in the AL and fourth lowest in the majors.

THIS AND THAT: The A's are 27-16 (.628) in games in which the opponent starts a left-handed pitcher compared to 37-32 (.536) when they start a right-hander...the mark against lefties is second best in the American League (White Sox, 20-11/.645) and the 43 games are tied for fourth most...have used a different lineup in each of the last 49 games and have 109 different lineups over the first 112 contests...went 11-13 (.458) in July, which was the A's first losing record in a month of 10 or more games since they went 11-15 in April of 2019,.

A's vs. INDIANS: The A's lost two of three in Oakland from July 16-18 to open the season series...make their first visit to Cleveland since May 22, 2019, a span of 811 days...won the season series in 2019, 5-1...went 2-1 in Oakland and 3-0 in Cleveland...have won eight of the last 11 games and 13 of the last 18...have a five-game winning streak at Progressive Field and have won 10 of the last 14 in Oakland...have won five of the previous six season series and are 24-17 against the Indians dating back to the start of the 2014 season... since moving to Oakland in 1968, the A's are 284-244 against the Indians... that breaks down to 151-108 in Oakland and 133-136 in Cleveland...including 49-67 at Progressive Field...all-time, the A's are 919-1037 against the Indians.

TODAY'S TIDBITS

Mark Canha lead the majors and has tied an Athletics record with 20 hit by pitches...*Starling Marte* is batting a Major League leading .444 (36-for-81) since the All-Star Break...also leads the majors in steals since the break (12) and ranks third in on-base percentage (.494)...*Matt Olson* ranks third in the American League in OPS (.954), slugging percentage (.577) and home runs (28), fourth in extra base hits (56), sixth in on-base percentage (.376), tied for sixth in doubles (28), tied for seventh in RBI (74) and runs (73) and 10th in walks (54)...*Sergio Romo* has not allowed a run in his last 15 games dating back to June 29 (15.2 ip, 3 h, 2 bb, 17 so) and opponents are 3-for-48 (.063) over that span..*Lou Trivino* has a 1.00 ERA (3 er in 27.0 ip) and .189 (18-for-95) opponents batting average in 26 games over that span

THIS DATE IN ATHLETICS HISTORY

In **1972**, in a game completed the next day, the A's defeat the Chicago White Sox 5-3 in 19 innings...the game was suspended after 17 innings and ended the next day when Joe Rudi hit a two-run homer in the bottom of the 19th...in **1976** Joe Rudi singles for his 1000th career hit in the A's 2-1 victory over Milwaukee...in **1985** Dave Kingman hits his 400th career home run in the A's 11-5 win at Seattle...in **2009** Mark Ellis is a perfect 5 for 5 and drives in four runs in the A's 9-1 win at Baltimore.

TODAY'S STARTING PITCHER: Sean Manaea (8-7, 3.26 ERA)

FOR STARTERS: Has allowed one run or fewer in eight of his last 13 starts dating back to May 23 and has a 2.54 ERA (22 er in 78.0 ip) and .216 (63-for-292) opponents batting average over that span...however, has a 5-5 record... has received a total of four runs of support in his five losses over that span and the bullpen has blown the save in two of the three no decisions...went 3-2 with a 4.41 ERA and .283 opponents average over his first nine starts... has allowed one run or fewer in 12 of his 22 starts...the A's are 6-1 in his no decisions and are 14-8 (.636) in his starting assignments...are 25-13 (.658) when he starts over the last three years.

AMONG THE LEADERS: Ranks seventh in the American League in ERA (3.26) and opponents on-base percentage (.289), tied for eighth in games started (22) and ninth in opponents OPS (.664), slugging percentage (.376) and innings pitched (127.0)...is one of three pitchers in the majors with two shutouts (DeSclafani, SF and Wheeler, PHI) and one of six with two or more complete games.

STRIKEOUTS AND WALKS: Has 45 strikeouts and just five walks over his last six starts and 34.1 innings...now has a career-high 141 strikeouts for the season, which ranks seventh in the American League...has walked just 29 for an average of 2.06 per nine innings, which is eighth lowest in the AL... his strikeout-to-walk ratio of 4.86 is third best...has three games of 10 or more strikeout this year and six in his career...the six 10-strikeout games are tied for seventh most in Oakland history...has more strikeouts than innings pitched in 11 of his 22 starts...has walked two batters or fewer 18 times, including seven starts with one walk and six with no walks.

AGAINST THE CENTRAL: IS 2-0 with a 2.45 ERA (5 er in 18.1 ip) in three starts against American League Central teams this year and now has a 10-game winning streak against the Central dating back to Aug. 23, 2016...has a 1.76 ERA (15 er in 76.2 ip) and .198 (55-for-278) opponents batting average during the streak, which spans 12 starts...his last loss came on July 5, 2016 at Minnesota...is 11-2 with a 2.40 ERA (25 er in 93.2 ip) in 15 career starts vs. AL Central teams.

HOME AND AWAY: Is 4-4 with a 2.64 ERA (17 er in 58.0 ip) and .198 (42-for-212) opponents batting average in 10 starts on the road compared to 4-3 with a 3.78 ERA (29 er in 69.0 ip) and .277 (77-for-278) opponents average in 12 starts at home...has the third lowest road ERA in the American League... also has the second lowest road batting average (.198) and OPS (.565)...has surrendered 10 of his 15 home runs at home.

LEFT AND RIGHT: Has allowed a .180 (23-for-128) batting average against left-handed hitters compared to .265 (96-for-362) against right-handers... the mark against lefties is second lowest in the American League (Kikuchi, SEA .125)...has surrendered six home runs in 128 at bats against lefties and nine in 362 at bats against righties...has issued 22 of his 29 walks to righties.

DAYS REST: Is scheduled to start on six days rest...is 3-1 with a 1.38 ERA (9 er in 58.2 ip) in nine starts on four days rest compared to 5-5 with a 4.52 ERA (32 er in 63.2 ip) in 12 starts on five days rest or more...over the last three years, he is 9-2 with a 2.28 ERA (28 er in 110.2 ip) in 19 starts on four days rest, 10-6 with a 3.70 ERA (45 er in 109.1 ip) in 20 starts on five days rest or more.

2021 HIGHLIGHTS: Took the loss in his first start but then went 3-0 with a 1.50 ERA over his next four starts...picked up his first win of the season in the 100th game of his career, an 8-4 victory over Detroit on April 15...tossed a six-hit, seven-inning shutout in the A's 7-0 win over Minnesota in the first game of the doubleheader April 20...it was the 11th complete game shutout of fewer than eight innings in Oakland history and his second career complete game and shutout...the start was the 100th of his career and he became the 25th pitcher in Oakland history to make 100 starts...had 10 strikeouts on May 7 against Tampa Bay, but had a no decision in the A's 2-1 win...retired each of the first 18 batters he faced before walking Arozarena to start the seventh...allowed one run or fewer in five consecutive starts from May 23 to June 14 and went 3-0 with a 0.84 ERA over that span...became the first A's pitcher with five consecutive games of one run or fewer and five innings pitched or more since Trevor Cahill (April 17-May 9, 2011)...had a no decision in the A's 6-5 loss at Los Angeles (AL) on May 23...left with a 4-1 lead but the bullpen blew the save...it was the first of two times the pen blew the save in one of his starts (July 16 vs. Cleveland)...struck out Justin Upton to lead off the game for the 50,000 strikeout in Oakland history...fanned Taylor Ward to end the fourth inning for his 500th career strikeout...tossed a four-hit shutout in the A's 6-0 win at Seattle on June 2...it was his third career complete game and shutout, his second this year...then combined with Petit, Trivino and Diekman on a two-hit shutout in the A's 4-0 win on June 9 against Arizona...it was the second time in his career he did not allow a run in back-to-back starts (Sept. 14-20, 2016)...had a career-high 16.0-inning scoreless streak from June 2 to 14...struck out 11 batters in 5.1 innings June 20 at New York (AL) but was the losing pitcher in the A's 2-1 loss...the 11 strikeouts

match the most in Athletics history by a pitcher with fewer than six innings pitched (Kirk Saarloos on Sept. 19, 2006 and Tim Hudson on June 8, 1999).. went 2-for-2 with a double June 25 at San Francisco...it was the first extra base hit by an A's pitcher since Joe Kennedy doubled on June 12, 2007 at Houston...was named American League Pitcher of the Month for June after going 3-2 with a 1.13 ERA and .181 opponents batting average in five starts... struck out 34 batters in 32.0 innings and allowed just one home run...it was the second time he was named Pitcher of the Month (April, 2018) ... struck out a career-high 13 batters in 7.0 innings in a 4-1 win at Seattle on July 22...matched the most strikeouts in Athletics history by a pitcher with seven innings or fewer (Montas, Sept. 27, 2020 vs. Seattle; Blue, April 9, 1971 vs. Kansas City) and equaled the seventh highest single-game total in Oakland history...went 2-2 with a 3.30 ERA and .211 opponents batting average in five starts in July...struck out 41 and walked just five in 30.0 innings... the strikeouts tied for third in the American League in July and tied Mike Moore (1989) for the third highest total in July in Oakland history behind Vida Blue (55 in 1971, 42 in 1976).

LAST START: He was the losing pitcher in the A's 8-1 loss to San Diego a week ago today in Oakland...allowed a leadoff home run to Pham to start the game and yielded three more runs in the second inning on RBI singles by Marisnick, Pham and Cronenworth...was relieved by Guerra with one out in the fifth inning, a runner on second and the A's trailing 4-0...Guerra allowed that base runner to score.

RHP Frankie Montas (9-8, 4.10 ERA): Is 2-1 with a 2.76 ERA, .216 opponents batting average and three home runs allowed over his last seven starts dating back to June 26 after going 7-7 with a 4.79 ERA, .269 opponents average and 13 home runs over his first 15 starts...struck out eight batters in his last start and has now fanned seven or more in each of his last five starts...has 45 strikeouts and just six walks in 31.2 innings over that span...those are the most strikeouts are the most by an A's pitcher over a five-game span since Todd Stottlemyre in 1995 (46, June 16-July 6)...ranks eighth in the American League in strikeouts (140)...had a no decision in his last start, a 5-4 A's win over San Diego in 10 innings last Wednesday in Oakland (6.0 ip, 8 h, 3 r, 3 er, 8 so)...is 1-2 with a 2.86 ERA (28.1 ip, 32 h, 9 r, 9 er, 6 bb, 32 so, 1 hr) in seven career appearances, including four starts, against Cleveland...including a loss in his only start this year on July 17 in Oakland (6.0 ip, 6 h, 2 r, 2 er, 1 bb, 7 so)

- Has not allowed a run in 32 of his last 33 appearances (3 er in 30.0 ip, 0.90 ERA) and 45 of 49 overall.
- Ranks third among Major League relievers in opponents OPS (.444), sixth in slugging percentage (.219) and batting average (.155) and seventh in on-base percentage (.225) and ERA (1.80).
- Has not allowed a home run in his last 39 games (36.0 innings) and has yielded just one home run in 45.0 innings overall...his average of 0.20 home runs per nine innings is eighth lowest among ML relievers.
