OAKLAND ATHLETICS (65-48) VS. CLEVELAND INDIANS (55-56)

WEDNESDAY, AUGUST 11, 2021 — PROGRESSIVE FIELD — 7:10 EDT RHP FRANKIE MONTAS (9-8, 4.10) VS. RHP CAL QUANTRILL (3-2, 3.14) NBCSCA — A'S CAST ON IHEART RADIO — A'S RADIO NETWORK (960 AM, 103.7 FM HD2, 1140 AM)

ABOUT THE A'S: The A's extended their winning streak to five games last night and are a season-high tying 17 games over .500 at 65-48 (also 44-27 on June 18)...it is the first time the A's have won more than three in a row since a seven-game winning streak from June 11-18...are 6-1 (.857) in August, which is the second best record in the majors to the Phillies (8-1, .889)... have now won nine of the last 11 games after going 12-19 over the previous 31 contests...have the fourth best record in the American League and seventh best in the majors...are in second place in the AL West for the 47th consecutive day (dating back to June 21) and trail first place Houston by two games for the third consecutive day...have not been closer to first in the West since July 1 when they were 1½ back...are in first place in the AL Wild Card, one game ahead of the second Wild Card (Red Sox) and three games ahead of the third place team (Yankees)...have spent 58 days alone in first place in the West, three days tied for first, 47 days in second, one day tied for second, three days in third, two days in fourth, three days tied for fourth and 10 days in fifth...swept a three-game series from Texas last the weekend for their first sweep of a series of three or more games since June 14-16 against the Angels.

EXTRA INNING GAMES AND OTHER CLOSE CALLS: The A's played their third extra inning game in their last five games last night and now have a five-game winning streak in extra inning contests...are 7-3 (.700) overall, which is tied with the Red Sox for the second best record in the American League (Mariners, 10-4/.714)...are now 13-4 (.765) in extra innings over the last two years...are 15-7 in games decided in the last at bat...have won each of their last two one-run games but have lost 12 of their last 17...are 17-19 (.472) in one-run games, which includes 11-7 at home and 6-12 on the road...lead the AL in one-run losses (19) and rank second in games (36)...are 25-27 (.481) in games decided by two runs or fewer compared to 40-21 (.656) in games decided by three runs or more...are tied with Colorado for the most walk-off wins in the majors (10) and have 93 walk-off wins in the Bob Melvin era, which are the most in the majors over that span.

AGAINST THE CENTRAL: The A's are 14-4 (.778) against American League Central teams, which is the best record in the majors...are batting .250 (145-for-581) and are averaging 5.2 runs per game (94 runs in 18 games) against teams from the Central compared to .232 with an average of 4.3 runs per game against all other teams...have a 3.00 ERA (53 er in 159.0 ip) against the Central, 3.75 against everyone else...went 25-8 against the AL Central in 2019 after going 26-8 in 2018...are now 79-24 (.767) against AL Central foes dating back to June 23, 2017.

DEFENSIVE DOINGS: The A's have committed just 47 errors, which is the fewest in the majors (Astros, 48)...are on pace for 67 errors, which would shatter the Athletics record for fewest errors in a season (80 in 2019)...are tied for the third fewest double plays in the American League (81)...A's outfielders have 10 assists, which is tied for second fewest in the AL.

PITCHING: The A's have a 3.14 ERA (197 er in 564.2 ip) and .641 OPS over the last 63 games dating back to May 26, both of which are second lowest in the majors to the Brewers (2.94 and .632)...overall, rank third in the American League in ERA (3.63) and opponents slugging percentage (.379) and fourth in OPS (.678) and on-base percentage (.299)...have issued the fewest walks (301), allowed the fewest home runs (117) and averaged the fewest pitches per inning (15.9) in the AL...are tied for second in shutouts (10).

STARTING PITCHING: Sean Manaea tossed 1.2 innings last night, which was the shortest outing by an A's starter this year...A's starting pitchers are 6-2 with a 2.84 ERA (20 er in 63.1 ip) and .218 (51-for-234) opponents batting average over the last 11 games...are 44-37 with a 3.66 ERA (264 er in 648.2 ip) overall...rank third in the American League in ERA and wins and fourth in opponents OPS (.686)...lead the majors in innings pitched (648.2) and are tied for third in complete games (3)...have used just eight starting pitchers, which is tied with the Reds and Astros for second fewest in the majors (Red Sox, 6).

BULLPEN: The A's bullpen tossed 8.1 scoreless innings last night, which was their longest scoreless outing since July 30, 2017 against Minnesota (also 8.1)...has a 1.75 ERA (16 er in 82.1 ip) and .182 (53-for-291) opponents batting average dating back to July 7...has a 3.58 ERA overall, which is third lowest in the American League...has the second lowest opponents OPS (.663)... has converted each of its five save opportunities dating back to July 19 and is 28-for-43 (65.1%) for the season, which is the fourth best save percentage in the AL...has 11 losses, which is the fewest in the majors...has the second highest slugging percentage against first batters faced in the AL (.435) and the third highest batting average (.248).

OFFENSE: The A's are batting .275 (67-for-244) in August, which is second best in the American League (Blue Jays, .276)...have the best OPS (.817) and on-base percentage (.370) this month, the fewest strikeouts (51) and are tied for the most stolen bases (12)...overall, are batting .235, which is fourth lowest in the AL...hit .225 last year but the lowest batting average in a full season in Oakland history is .236 in 1982...have been hit by a pitch 19 times in the last 20 games and 69 times for the season, which is the most in the AL, tied for third most in the majors and fifth most in Oakland history (88 in 2001, 87 in 2019, 76 in 2018, 71 in 1999)...rank third in the AL in stolen base percentage (82.6%), fourth in fewest grounded into double plays (68) and fifth in walks (383), sacrifice flies (34) and sacrifice hits (14)...A's pinch hitters lead the AL in hits (24), sacrifice flies (3) and plate appearances (107), are tied for the lead in home runs (3), rank second in RBI (17) and extra base hits (6) and tied for second in doubles (3).

HOME AND AWAY: The A's are 1-0 on this 10-game road trip to Cleveland (1-0), Texas (three games) and Chicago-AL (four games)...it is the their second consecutive 10-game road trip as they went 5-5 on the last trip to Seattle (1-3), San Diego (1-1) and Los Angeles-AL (3-1)...this trip concludes a stretch that began on July 6 where the A's are scheduled to play 26 of 36 games on the road...after this trip, the A's have 22 home games and 18 road games remaining...are now 12-14 on the road dating back to June 19 after starting the year 19-9 in away games...are 31-23 (.574) on the road compared to 34-25 (.576) at home...went 4-1 on the last homestand against San Diego (1-1) and Texas (3-0) and have won six of their last seven home games...the A's have a 3.55 ERA (185 er in 469.2 ip) on the road, which is the lowest in the AL and fourth lowest in the majors...are batting .245 (458-for-1873) with a .731 OPS on the road compared to .226 with a .707 OPS at home.

THIS AND THAT: The A's are 27-16 (.628) in games in which the opponent starts a left-handed pitcher compared to 38-32 (.543) when they start a right-hander...the mark against lefties is second best in the American League (White Sox, 20-11/.645) and the 43 games are tied for fourth most...are 1-0 in this stretch of 15 games in 15 days from Aug. 10-24...are scheduled to play 25 of their next 33 games against non-division foes before concluding the season with 16 straight games against the West...have used a different lineup in each of the last 50 games and have 110 different lineups over the first 113 contests.

A's vs. INDIANS: The season series is even at two games each...the A's are 1-0 in Cleveland and went 1-2 in Oakland...now have a six-game winning streak at Progressive Field, which is their longest ever in this ballpark...since moving to Oakland in 1968, the A's longest road winning streak against the Indians is seven from July 31, 1971-Aug. 18, 1972...have won each of the previous three season series, which marks the first time the A's have won more than two straight seasons series from Cleveland since 1987-91 when they won five straight...have won nine of the last 12 games and 14 of the last 19...since moving to Oakland in 1968, the A's are 285-244 against the Indians...that breaks down to 151-108 in Oakland and 134-136 in Cleveland...including 50-67 at Progressive Field...all-time, the A's are 920-1037 against the Indians.

TODAY'S TIDBITS

Mark Canha leads the majors and has tied an Athletics record with 20 hit by pitches...Andrew Chafin ranks second among Major League relievers in opponents OPS (.436), fourth in batting average (.152) and on-base percentage (.221), fifth in slugging percentage (.215) and sixth in ERA (1.76)... Starling Marte is batting a ML leading .430 (37-for-86) since the All-Star Break...also leads the majors in steals since the break (13) and ranks third in on-base percentage (.479)...Matt Olson ranks third in the American League in OPS (.956) and slugging percentage (.576), tied for fourth in home runs (28) and extra base hits (56), sixth in on-base percentage (.379), tied for seventh in RBI (74), runs (73) and doubles (28) and tied for ninth in walks (55)...Sergio Romo has not allowed a run in his last 16 games dating back to June 29 (16.2 ip, 3 h, 4 bb, 17 so) and opponents are 3-for-50 (.060) over that span...Lou Trivino has converted each of his last 11 save opportunities dating back to June 5 and has a 0.96 ERA (3 er in 28.0 ip) and .186 (18-for-97) opponents batting average in 27 games over that span

THIS DATE IN ATHLETICS HISTORY

In **1920** the A's score 10 times in the seventh inning to defeat Detroit 13-4...In **1978** Rick Langford tosses a three-hit shutout in the first game of a doubleheader at Minnesota in a 2-0 A's victory...in **2003** Tim Hudson tosses a complete game two-hit shutout and needs just 93 pitches to defeat Boston, 4-0.

TODAY'S STARTING PITCHER: Frankie Montas (9-8, 4.10 ERA)

FOR STARTERS: Is 2-1 with a 2.76 ERA (13 er in 42.1 ip), .216 (33-for-153) opponents batting average and three home runs allowed over his last seven starts dating back to June 26 after going 7-7 with a 4.79 ERA, .269 opponents average and 13 home runs over his first 15 starts...is tied for eighth in the American League in wins (9) but is tied for 10th in losses (8).

STRIKEOUTS: Struck out eight batters in his last start and has now fanned seven or more in each of his last five starts...is the second A's pitcher this year with five consecutive starts of seven or more strikeouts (Bassitt, April 18-May 11)...the Oakland record is six by Vida Blue (April 18-May 9, 1971)...has 45 strikeouts and just six walks in 31.2 innings over his last five starts...his 45 strikeouts are the most by an A's pitcher over a five-game span since Todd Stotlemyre had 46 from June 16-July 6, 1995...ranks eighth in the American League in strikeouts (140)... has four games of 10 or more strikeouts this year and seven in his career.

CAREER BESTS: Picked up his ninth win of the season July 29, which matches his career high established in 2019...already has career highs in nearly every other category including games started (22), innings pitched (125.0), strikeouts (140), losses (8), hits (124), runs (62), earned runs (57), walks (33) and home runs (16).

BY MONTH: Went 2-1 with a 2.30 ERA and .204 opponents batting average in five starts in July...struck out 40 in 31.1 innings and walked just nine while surrendering two home runs...his strikeouts ranked fifth in the American League and fifth in Oakland history in the month of July...also ranked seventh in the AL in ERA and opponents batting average, ninth in slugging percentage (.310) and 10th in OPS (.588)...has had a roller coaster season with his ERA as he posted a mark of 6.20 in April, 3.18 in May, 5.28 in June and 2.30 in July...his 2-1 record in July was his first month this year that was not .500 as he went 2-2 in April, 3-3 in May and 2-2 in June.

OPPONENTS BATTING: Has a .210 (37-for-176) opponents batting average the first time through the order, .276 (87-for-315) with 11 of his 16 home runs after that...has held the opponents three hitter to a .175 (10-for-57) average and the four hitter to a mark of .186 (11-for-59)...the mark against the three hitter is third lowest in the American League and his average against the four hitter is fourth lowest.

THAT'S ODD: Has a 5.13 ERA (38 er in 66.2 ip) and .273 (74-for-271) opponents batting average in odd numbered innings compared to a 2.93 ERA (19 er in 58.1 ip) and .227 (50-for-220) opponents average in even numbered innings.

THIS AND THAT: Has five no decisions this year, four of which have come in extra inning games...the A's won two of those games and are 11-11 (.500) in his starting assignments...has tossed seven innings or fewer in all 22 of his starts, including six innings or fewer 18 times...has received two runs of support or fewer in 12 of his 22 starts, including 10 of his last 14.

2021 HIGHLIGHTS: Took the loss in his first start on April 5 against Los Angeles (NL)...allowed seven runs in a season-low 2.2 innings and walked a season-high three batters...tossed 90 pitches, which were the most by an A's pitcher in an outing of fewer than three innings since pitch counts were tracked beginning in 1988...the loss extended his losing streak to a careerhigh three games dating back to Sept. 13, 2020...then picked up the win in each of his next two starts and allowed just one run on eight hits in 12.0 innings...won 7-3 at Houston on April 10 and then combined with Romo, Diekman and Wendelken on a four-hit shutout in the A's 3-0 victory over Detroit on April 16...allowed six runs on a season-high nine hits in 4.0 innings against Minnesota on April 21 but had a no decision in the A's 13-12, 10-inning win...allowed three home runs in a start for the second time in his career (Sept. 22, 2020 vs. Los Angeles-NL)...finished April 2-2 with a 6.20 ERA in five starts...then went 3-3 with a 3.18 ERA in six starts in May...the three wins matched his most ever in a month and he had 38 strikeouts, which tied for eighth in the American League...won each of his first three starts in May and posted a 3.12 ERA over that stretch from May 3-14...then went 0-3 with a 3.24 ERA over his next three starts from May 19-29...the losing streak matched his career high...struck out 11 batters in 6.0 innings in a 4-2 loss to Seattle on May 24...it was one of four games with 10 or more strikeouts (10, July 8 at Houston; 10, July 23 at Seattle; 10, July 29 at Los Angeles-AL) and the second highest single-game total of his career to his 13 against the Mariners in the final game of the 2020 season...now has seven career 10-strikeout games...walked a season-high tying three...tossed a season-high 7.0 innings June 15 against Los Angles (AL) and allowed just two runs for the win...

then surrendered a season-high eight runs on a season-high tying nine hits in 5.2 innings at Texas on June 21 for the loss...is 2-1 with a 2.76 ERA (13 er in 42.1 ip) in seven starts since then...started consecutive games that went extra innings on June 26 at San Francisco and July 2 against Boston...issued a season-high tying three walks in each contests...struck out 10 batters in back-to-back starts on July 23 at Seattle and July 29 at Los Angeles (AL) to become the first A's pitcher with consecutive games of 10 or more strike-outs since Brandon McCarthy (Aug. 29-Sept. 3, 2011)...combined with Romo and Trivino on a three-hit shutout in the latter contest against the Angels, a 4-0 win...tossed a season-high tying 7.0 innings and allowed all three of the hits...struck out 10, issued a season-high tying three walks and logged a season-high 109 pitches

LAST START: He had a no decision in the A's 5-4, 10-inning win over San Diego a week ago today in Oakland...it was his fourth start this year to go into extra innings...had a 1-0 lead when he allowed a RBI single to Frazier in the third inning...yielded two more runs in the fourth on a Grisham RBI double and a Caratini RBI single...was relieved by Chafin after six innings with the A's trailing 3-1.

RHP Chris Bassitt (11-3, 3.19 ERA): Is 2-1 with a 2.45 ERA over his last five starts...has 32 strikeouts and just five walks over that span...leads the American League in winning percentage (.786) and innings pitched (144.0) and is tied for the lead in wins (11) and games started (22)...the A's have not had a pitcher lead the league in innings since Dave Stewart in 1990 (267.0) and have not had a pitcher lead the league in wins since Barry Zito in 2002 (23)... is 7-0 with a 3.74 ERA in 13 starts on the road and now has an eight-game road winning streak dating back to Sept. 12, 2020...that is one short of the Oakland record of nine (Welch, 1989-90)...had a no decision in his last start, a 4-1 A's win over Texas in 11 innings last Friday in Oakland (7.0 ip, 5 h, 1 r, 1 er, 8 so)...is 0-2 with a 4.13 ERA (24.0 ip, 22 h, 11 r, 11 er, 8 bb, 23 so, 5 hr) in four career appearances, all starts, against Cleveland...was the losing pitcher in his only start this year, a 4-2 A's loss on July 18 (7.0 ip, 6 h, 3 r, 3 er, 0 bb, 8 so).
