OAKLAND ATHLETICS (65-48) VS. CLEVELAND INDIANS (55-56)

ABOUT THE A'S: The A's extended their winning streak to five games last night and are a season-high tying 17 games over .500 at 65-48 (also 44-27 on June 18)...it is the first time the A's have won more than three in a row since a seven-game winning streak from June 11-18...are 6-1 (.857) in August, which is the second best record in the majors to the Phillies (8-1, .889)...have now won nine of the last 11 games after going 12-19 over the previous 31 contests...have the fourth best record in the American League and seventh best in the majors...are in second place in the AL West for the 47th consecutive day (dating back to June 21) and trail first place Houston by two games for the third consecutive day...have not been closer to first in the West since July 1 when they were 1½ back...are in first place in the AL Wild Card, one game ahead of the second Wild Card (Red Sox) and three games ahead of the third place team (Yankees)...have spent 58 days alone in first place in the West, three days tied for first, 47 days in second, one day tied for second, three days in third, two days in fourth, three days tied for fourth and 10 days in fifth...swept a three-game series from Texas last the weekend for their first sweep of a series of three or more games since June 14-16 against the Angels.

EXTRA INNING GAMES AND OTHER CLOSE CALLS: The A's played their third extra inning game in their last five games last night and now have a five-game winning streak in extra inning contests...are 7-3 (.700) overall, which is tied with the Red Sox for the second best record in the American League (Mariners, 10-4/.714)...are now 13-4 (.765) in extra innings over the last two years...are 15-7 in games decided in the last at bat...have won each of their last two one-run games but have lost 12 of their last 17...are 17-19 (.472) in one-run games, which includes 11-7 at home and 6-12 on the road...lead the AL in one-run losses (19) and rank second in games (36)...are 25-27 (.481) in games decided by two runs or fewer compared to 40-21 (.656) in games decided by three runs or more...are tied with Colorado for the most walk-off wins in the majors (10) and have 93 walk-off wins in the Bob Melvin era, which are the most in the majors over that span.

AGAINST THE CENTRAL: The A's are 14-4 (.778) against American League Central teams, which is the best record in the majors...are batting .250 (145-for-581) and are averaging 5.2 runs per game (94 runs in 18 games) against teams from the Central compared to .232 with an average of 4.3 runs per game against all other teams...have a 3.00 ERA (53 er in 159.0 ip) against the Central, 3.75 against everyone else...went 25-8 against the AL Central in 2019 after going 26-8 in 2018...are now 79-24 (.767) against AL Central foes dating back to June 23, 2017.

DEFENSIVE DOINGS: The A's have committed just 47 errors, which is the fewest in the majors (Astros, 48)...are on pace for 67 errors, which would shatter the Athletics record for fewest errors in a season (80 in 2019)...are tied for the third fewest double plays in the American League (81)...A's outfielders have 10 assists, which is tied for second fewest in the AL.

PITCHING: The A's have a 3.14 ERA (197 er in 564.2 ip) and .641 OPS over the last 63 games dating back to May 26, both of which are second lowest in the majors to the Brewers (2.94 and .632)...overall, rank third in the American League in ERA (3.63) and opponents slugging percentage (.379) and fourth in OPS (.678) and on-base percentage (.299)...have issued the fewest walks (301), allowed the fewest home runs (117) and averaged the fewest pitches per inning (15.9) in the AL...are tied for second in shutouts (10).

STARTING PITCHING: Sean Manaea tossed 1.2 innings last night, which was the shortest outing by an A's starter this year...A's starting pitchers are 6-2 with a 2.84 ERA (20 er in 63.1 ip) and .218 (51-for-234) opponents batting average over the last 11 games...are 44-37 with a 3.66 ERA (264 er in 648.2 ip) overall...rank third in the American League in ERA and wins and fourth in opponents OPS (.686)...lead the majors in innings pitched (648.2) and are tied for third in complete games (3)...have used just eight starting pitchers, which is tied with the Reds and Astros for second fewest in the majors (Red Sox, 6).

BULLPEN: The A's bullpen tossed 8.1 scoreless innings last night, which was their longest scoreless outing since July 30, 2017 against Minnesota (also 8.1)...has a 1.75 ERA (16 er in 82.1 ip) and .182 (53-for-291) opponents batting average dating back to July 7...has a 3.58 ERA overall, which is third lowest in the American League...has the second lowest opponents OPS (.663)...has converted each of its five save opportunities dating back to July 19 and is 28-for-43 (65.1%) for the season, which is the fourth best save percentage in the AL...has 11 losses, which is the fewest in the majors...has the second highest slugging percentage against first batters faced in the AL (.435) and the third highest batting average (.248).

OFFENSE: The A's are batting .275 (67-for-244) in August, which is second best in the American League (Blue Jays, .276)...have the best OPS (.817) and on-base percentage (.370) this month, the fewest strikeouts (51) and are tied for the most stolen bases (12)...overall, are batting .235, which is fourth lowest in the AL...hit .225 last year but the lowest batting average in a full season in Oakland history is .236 in 1982...have been hit by a pitch 19 times in the last 20 games and 69 times for the season, which is the most in the AL, tied for third most in the majors and fifth most in Oakland history (88 in 2001, 87 in 2019, 76 in 2018, 71 in 1999)...rank third in the AL in stolen base percentage (82.6%), fourth in fewest grounded into double plays (68) and fifth in walks (383), sacrifice flies (34) and sacrifice hits (14)...A's pinch hitters lead the AL in hits (24), sacrifice flies (3) and plate appearances (107), are tied for the lead in home runs (3), rank second in RBI (17) and extra base hits (6) and tied for second in doubles (3).

HOME AND AWAY: The A's are 1-0 on this 10-game road trip to Cleveland (1-0), Texas (three games) and Chicago-AL (four games)...it is their second consecutive 10-game road trip as they went 5-5 on the last trip to Seattle (1-3), San Diego (1-1) and Los Angeles-AL (3-1)...this trip concludes a stretch that began on July 6 where the A's are scheduled to play 26 of 36 games on the road...after this trip, the A's have 22 home games and 18 road games remaining...are now 12-14 on the road dating back to June 19 after starting the year 19-9 in away games...are 31-23 (.574) on the road compared to 34-25 (.576) at home...went 4-1 on the last homestand against San Diego (1-1) and Texas (3-0) and have won six of their last seven home games...the A's have a 3.55 ERA (185 er in 469.2 ip) on the road, which is the lowest in the AL and fourth lowest in the majors...are batting .245 (458-for-1873) with a .731 OPS on the road compared to .226 with a .707 OPS at home.

THIS AND THAT: The A's are 27-16 (.628) in games in which the opponent starts a left-handed pitcher compared to 38-32 (.543) when they start a right-hander...the mark against lefties is second best in the American League (White Sox, 20-11/.645) and the 43 games are tied for fourth most...are 1-0 in this stretch of 15 games in 15 days from Aug. 10-24...are scheduled to play 25 of their next 33 games against non-division foes before concluding the season with 16 straight games against the West...have used a different lineup in each of the last 50 games and have 110 different lineups over the first 113 contests.

A's vs. INDIANS: The season series is even at two games each...the A's are 1-0 in Cleveland and went 1-2 in Oakland...now have a six-game winning streak at Progressive Field, which is their longest ever in this ballpark...since moving to Oakland in 1968, the A's longest road winning streak against the Indians is seven from July 31, 1971-Aug. 18, 1972...have won each of the previous three season series, which marks the first time the A's have won more than two straight seasons series from Cleveland since 1987-91 when they won five straight...have won nine of the last 12 games and 14 of the last 19...since moving to Oakland in 1968, the A's are 285-244 against the Indians...that breaks down to 151-108 in Oakland and 134-136 in Cleveland...including 50-67 at Progressive Field...all-time, the A's are 920-1037 against the Indians.

TODAY'S TIDBITS

Mark Canha leads the majors and has tied an Athletics record with 20 hit by pitches...**Andrew Chafin** ranks second among Major League relievers in opponents OPS (.436), fourth in batting average (.152) and on-base percentage (.221), fifth in slugging percentage (.215) and sixth in ERA (1.76)...**Starling Marte** is batting a ML leading .430 (37-for-86) since the All-Star Break...also leads the majors in steals since the break (13) and ranks third in on-base percentage (.479)...**Matt Olson** ranks third in the American League in OPS (.956) and slugging percentage (.576), tied for fourth in home runs (28) and extra base hits (56), sixth in on-base percentage (.379), tied for seventh in RBI (74), runs (73) and doubles (28) and tied for ninth in walks (55)...**Sergio Romo** has not allowed a run in his last 16 games dating back to June 29 (16.2 ip, 3 h, 4 bb, 17 so) and opponents are 3-for-50 (.060) over that span...**Lou Trivino** has converted each of his last 11 save opportunities dating back to June 5 and has a 0.96 ERA (3 er in 28.0 ip) and .186 (18-for-97) opponents batting average in 27 games over that span

39 LHP ANDREW CHAFIN

Last Outing: 8/10 at Cleveland (S, 1.0 ip, 1 so)

Saves/Opportunities: 1-2

Inherited Runners/Scored: 22/7 **First Hitters:** 7-48 (2 bb)

- Retired the side in order in the 10th inning last night for his fourth career save, his first since Sept. 27, 2020 against the White Sox.
- Was acquired from the Cubs on July 26 and has not allowed a run in seven games with the A's (6.2 ip, 3 h, 0 bb, 8 so).
- Has not allowed a run in 33 of his last 34 appearances (3 er in 31.0 ip, 0.88 ERA) and 46 of 50 overall.
- Ranks second among Major League relievers in opponents OPS (.436), fourth in batting average (.152) and on-base percentage (.221), fifth in slugging percentage (.215) and sixth in ERA (1.76).
- Has not allowed a home run in his last 40 games (37.0 innings) and has yielded just one home run in 46.0 innings overall...his average of 0.20 home runs per nine innings is seventh lowest among ML relievers.
- Has a 0.72 ERA (2 er in 25.0 ip) in 27 appearances on one day of rest or fewer, a 3.10 ERA (7 er in 20.1 ip) in 22 games on two days rest or more.
- Has not allowed a run in the eighth inning (23.2 ip).
- Has a save in three outings against Cleveland this year (4.0 ip, 3 so) and has not allowed an earned run in five career appearances against the Indians (9.0 ip, 4 h, 1 r, 0 er, 3 bb, 6 so).
- Was 0-2 with a 2.06 ERA in 43 relief appearances for Chicago (NL) when he was traded to Oakland along with cash considerations for Greg Deichmann and minor leaguer Daniel Palencia.

Last Year: Combined for a 1-2 record, one save and a 6.52 ERA in 15 relief appearances with the Diamondbacks and Cubs...missed a month of the season from Aug. 19 to Sept. 18 with a sprained left finger.

35 LHP JAKE DIEKMAN

Saves/Opportunities: 7-12

Inherited Runners/Scored: 9/4 **First Hitters:** 8-37, 5 bb, 3 hbp

- Has a 2.55 ERA (5 er in 17.2 ip) and .200 (12-for-60) opponents batting average over his last 21 games dating back to June 4.
- Has held right-handed hitters to a .187 (17-for-91) average but they have hit five of the career-high six home runs he has allowed.
- Has a 4.34 ERA (9 er in 18.2 ip) and .250 (18-for-72) opponents batting average in 21 outings on one day rest or fewer, a 1.25 ERA (3 er in 21.2 ip) and .139 (10-for-72) opponents average in 23 appearances on two days of rest or more.
- Has not allowed a run in two outings against Cleveland (1.2 ip, 1 h, 2 bb, 3 so)... has a 1.50 ERA (2 er in 12.0 ip) in 12 career appearances against the Indians.

Last Year: Allowed just two runs in 21 appearances and only one was earned for a 0.42 ERA...ranked second among Major League relievers in ERA and opponents slugging percentage (.157), fifth in batting average (.114) and seventh in OPS (.410)

- Has allowed at least one run in each of his last two appearances (2.0 ip, 5 h, 4 r, 4 er, 1 bb, 3 so) after an eight-game, 7.2-inning scoreless streak.
- Ranks 10th among American League relievers in opponents OPS (.573).
- Has a .154 (10-for-65) opponents batting average against left-handed hitters compared to .240 (18-for-75) against right-handers...has issued 10 of his 12 walks and yielded two of his three homers to righties for a .686 OPS...has a .437 OPS against lefties.
- Opponents are batting .192 (5-for-26) with runners in scoring position.
- Has 35 strikeouts, which is one short of his career high of 36 in 2016.
- Has a 2.37 ERA (5 er in 19.0 ip) in 15 games at night, a 5.31 ERA (12 er in 20.1 ip) in 16 day games.

- Leads the majors in games pitched (56)...leads American League relievers in innings pitched (57.1), is tied for the lead in wins (8), ranks second in fewest walks per nine innings (1.41) and eighth in most inherited runners (31)...is averaging the fewest strikeouts per nine innings in the majors among relievers (4.40).
- Opponents are hitting .177 (11-for-62) with runners in scoring position.
- Has allowed seven home runs, four of which have come to his first batter faced in an outing, which is tied for the most in the majors.
- Has faced Cleveland three times (3.2 ip, 3 h, 2 r, 1 er, 0 bb, 1 so, 1 hr).

Last Year: Compiled a career-low 1.66 ERA in a team-leading 26 relief appearances...opponents hit .232 and he walked just five batters for a .273 on-base percentage...yielded four runs, three of which scored on solo home runs.

- Was recalled from Triple-A Las Vegas yesterday for his second stint with the A's this year and retired the side in order in the sixth inning.
- Was first recalled from the A's alternate site on April 5, pitched in relief that day against the Dodgers (3.1 ip, 1 h, 3 bb, 4 so), and was placed on the 10-day injured list April 8 retroactive to April 6 with a strained left biceps.
- Had a five-game rehab assignment with the Aviators from May 11 to 27 (5.0 ip, 11 h, 8 r, 8 er, 1 bb, 9 so, 3 hr) before he was reinstated from the IL and optioned to Las Vegas May 28.
- Had a 1.64 ERA (4 er in 22.0 ip) over his final 13 games at Triple-A dating back to June 26.
- Last night was his first career appearance against Cleveland.
- Allowed a .308 opponents batting average with the Aviators, including .231 (18-for-78) against left-handed hitters and .374 (34-for-91) against right-handers...surrendered seven of his 10 home runs to righties...his complete 2021 stats with Las Vegas:

- Has not allowed a run in his last 16 games dating back to June 29 (16.2 ip, 3 h, 4 bb, 17 so) and opponents are 3-for-50 (.060) over that span...the scoreless streak is his longest since his career-high 21.2-inning streak from June 30-Sept. 23, 2011.
- Has a 0.67 ERA (2 er in 27.0 ip) and .125 (11-for-88) opponents batting average over his last 28 games dating back to May 25 after compiling a 7.63 ERA and .290 opponents average over his first 18 contests.
- Ranks sixth among American League relievers in opponents OPS (.545) and eighth in slugging percentage (.280).

- Has stranded all eight of his inherited runners this year and each of his last 14 dating back to Sept. 11, 2019...last allowed an inherited runner to score on Sept. 5, 2019.
- Last night was his first outing against Cleveland since Sept. 28, 2018.

Last Year: Made the A's Opening Day roster and was 2-0 with a save, a 2.25 ERA and .163 opponents batting average in six relief appearances before his season was cut short in mid-August with a forearm injury.

- Has converted each of his last 11 save opportunities dating back to June 5 and has a 0.96 ERA (3 er in 28.0 ip) and .186 (18-for-97) opponents batting average in 27 games over that span.
- Is 18-for-20 (90.0%) in save opportunities...ranks fourth in the American League in save percentage and tied for fifth in saves.
- Has a 0.74 ERA (3 er in 36.1 ip) over his last 35 games and now has a 1.84 ERA for the season, which fourth fifth among AL relievers.
- Ranks sixth among AL relievers in opponents slugging percentage (.271), seventh in innings pitched (53.2), ninth in OPS (.563) and tied for ninth in games (51).
- Has a .159 (17-for-107) opponents batting average against right-handed hitters compared to .235 (19-for-81) against left-handers.

- Was recalled from Triple-A Las Vegas Friday for his second stint with the A's this year...hit .199 with 12 home runs and 30 RBI in 79 games during his first stint from April 6 to July 31.
- Went 4-for-14 (.286) with a double, triple and RBI in three games with the Aviators following his Aug. 1 option...appeared in one game in left field, one at designated hitter and one at right field.
- Is fifth among American League rookies in home runs (14).
- Is batting .214 (39-for-182) against right-handed pitchers, .133 (2-for-15) against left-handers...has made 50 of his 51 starts this year and 67 of 69 in his career in games in which the opponent starts a right-handed pitcher.
- Is batting .252 (26-for-103) at home, .160 (15-for-94) on the road.
- More than half of his hits are for extra bases (22-of-41, 53.7%)...32 of his 63 (50.8%) career hits are extra base hits.
