## OAKLAND ATHLETICS (66-48) VS. CLEVELAND INDIANS (55-57)

THURSDAY, AUGUST 12, 2021 — PROGRESSIVE FIELD — 1:10 EDT

ABOUT THE A'S: The A's extended their winning streak to six games last night and are a season-high 18 games over .500 at 66-48 (were 17 games over at 44-27 on June 18)...it is the first time the A's have won more than three in a row since a seven-game winning streak from June 11-18...are 7-1 (.875) in August, which is the best record in the majors...have now won 10 of the last 12 games after going 12-19 over the previous 31 contests...have the fourth best record in the American League and seventh best in the majors...are in second place in the AL West for the 48th consecutive day (dating back to June 21) and trail first place Houston by two games for the fourth consecutive day...have not been closer to first in the West since July 1 when they were 1½ back...are in first place in the AL Wild Card, one game ahead of the second Wild Card (Red Sox) and three games ahead of the third place team (Yankees)...have spent 58 days alone in first place in the West, three days tied for first, 48 days in second, one day tied for second, three days in third, two days in fourth, three days tied for fourth and 10 days in fifth...swept a threegame series from Texas last the weekend for their first sweep of a series of three or more games since June 14-16 against the Angels.

**EXTRA INNING GAMES AND OTHER CLOSE CALLS:** The A's played their third extra inning game in their last five games Tuesday night and now have a five-game winning streak in extra inning contests...are 7-3 (.700) overall, which is tied with the Red Sox for the second best record in the American League (Mariners, 10-4/.714)...are now 13-4 (.765) in extra innings over the last two years...are 15-7 in games decided in the last at bat...have won each of their last two one-run games but have lost 12 of their last 17...are 17-19 (.472) in one-run games, which includes 11-7 at home and 6-12 on the road...lead the AL in one-run losses (19) and rank second in games (36)...are 25-27 (.481) in games decided by two runs or fewer compared to 41-21 (.661) in games decided by three runs or more...are tied with Colorado for the most walk-off wins in the majors (10) and have 93 walk-off wins in the Bob Melvin era, which are the most in the majors over that span.

**AGAINST THE CENTRAL:** The A's are 15-4 (.789) against American League Central teams, which is the best record in the majors...are batting .250 (154-for-615) and are averaging 5.26 runs per game (100 runs in 19 games) against teams from the Central compared to .232 with an average of 4.3 runs per game against all other teams...have a 2.95 ERA (55 er in 168.0 ip) against the Central, 3.75 against everyone else...went 25-8 against the AL Central in 2019 after going 26-8 in 2018...are now 80-24 (.769) against AL Central foes dating back to June 23, 2017.

**DEFENSIVE DOINGS:** The A's have committed just 48 errors, which is tied for the fewest in the majors (Astros)...are on pace for 68 errors, which would shatter the Athletics record for fewest errors in a season (80 in 2019)...are tied for the fourth fewest double plays in the American League (83)...A's outfielders have 10 assists, which is tied for second fewest in the AL.

**PITCHING:** The A's have a 3.12 ERA (199 er in 573.2 ip) and .639 OPS over the last 64 games dating back to May 26, both of which are second lowest in the majors to the Brewers (2.94 and .627)...overall, rank second in the American League in ERA (3.62) and opponents slugging percentage (.377), third in OPS (.676) and fourth in on-base percentage (.299)...have issued the fewest walks (306), allowed the fewest home runs (117) and averaged the fewest pitches per inning (15.9) in the AL...are tied for second in shutouts (10).

**STARTING PITCHING:** Frankie Montas allowed just two hits and one earned run in 6.0 innings pitched last night...A's starting pitchers are 6-2 with a 2.73 ERA (21 er in 69.1 ip) and .210 (55-for-262) opponents batting average over the last 12 games...are 44-37 with a 3.64 ERA (265 er in 654.2 ip) overall... rank third in the American League in ERA and wins and fourth in opponents OPS (.684)...lead the majors in innings pitched (654.2) and are tied for third in complete games (3)...have used just eight starting pitchers, which is tied with the Reds and Astros for second fewest in the majors (Red Sox, 6).

**BULLPEN:** The A's bullpen tossed 8.1 scoreless innings Tuesday night, which was their longest scoreless outing since July 30, 2017 against Minnesota (also 8.1)...has a 1.79 ERA (17 er in 85.1 ip) and .182 (55-for-302) opponents batting average dating back to July 7...has a 3.58 ERA overall, which is third lowest in the American League...has the third lowest opponents OPS (.663)... has converted each of its six save opportunities dating back to July 19 and is 29-for-44 (65.9%) for the season, which is the fourth best save percentage in the AL...has 11 losses, which is the fewest in the majors...has the second highest slugging percentage against first batters faced in the AL (.435) and the third highest batting average (.248).

**OFFENSE:** The A's are batting .273 (76-for-278) in August, which is third best in the American League...have the best OPS (.816) and on-base percentage

(.367) this month, the fewest strikeouts (59) and are tied for the most stolen bases (14)...overall, are batting .235, which is fourth lowest in the AL... hit .225 last year but the lowest batting average in a full season in Oakland history is .236 in 1982...have been hit by a pitch 20 times in the last 2a games and 70 times for the season, which is the most in the AL, third most in the majors and fifth most in Oakland history (88 in 2001, 87 in 2019, 76 in 2018, 71 in 1999)...rank third in the AL in stolen base percentage (81.9%), fourth in fewest grounded into double plays (69) and fifth in walks (388), sacrifice flies (34) and sacrifice hits (14)...A's pinch hitters lead the AL in hits (24), sacrifice flies (3) and plate appearances (107), are tied for the lead in home runs (3), rank second in RBI (17) and extra base hits (6) and tied for second in doubles (3).

**HOME AND AWAY:** The A's are 2-0 on this 10-game road trip to Cleveland (2-0), Texas (three games) and Chicago-AL (four games)...it is the their second consecutive 10-game road trip as they went 5-5 on the last trip to Seattle (1-3), San Diego (1-1) and Los Angeles-AL (3-1)...this trip concludes a stretch that began on July 6 where the A's are scheduled to play 26 of 36 games on the road...after this trip, the A's have 22 home games and 18 road games remaining...are now 13-14 on the road dating back to June 19 after starting the year 19-9 in away games...are 32-23 (.582) on the road compared to 34-25 (.576) at home...went 4-1 on the last homestand against San Diego (1-1) and Texas (3-0) and have won six of their last seven home games...the A's have a 3.52 ERA (187 er in 478.2 ip) on the road, which is the lowest in the AL and fourth lowest in the majors...are batting ...245 (467-for-1907) with a .732 OPS on the road compared to .226 with a .707 OPS at home.

THIS AND THAT: The A's are 27-16 (.628) in games in which the opponent starts a left-handed pitcher compared to 39-32 (.549) when they start a right-hander...the mark against lefties is second best in the American League (White Sox, 20-11/.645) and the 43 games are tied for fourth most...are 2-0 in this stretch of 15 games in 15 days from Aug. 10-24...are scheduled to play 24 of their next 32 games against non-division foes before concluding the season with 16 straight games against the West...have used a different lineup in each of the last 51 games and have 111 different lineups over the first 114 contests.

**A's vs. INDIANS:** The A's lead the season series 3-2...the A's are 2-0 in Cleveland and went 1-2 in Oakland...now have a seven-game winning streak at Progressive Field, which is their longest ever in this ballpark...since moving to Oakland in 1968, the A's longest road winning streak against the Indians is seven from July 31, 1971-Aug. 18, 1972...have won each of the previous three season series, which marks the first time the A's have won more than two straight seasons series from Cleveland since 1987-91 when they won five straight...have won 10 of the last 13 games and 15 of the last 20...since moving to Oakland in 1968, the A's are 286-244 against the Indians...that breaks down to 151-108 in Oakland and 135-136 in Cleveland...including 51-67 at Progressive Field...all-time, the A's are 921-1037 against the Indians.

#### TODAY'S TIDBITS

*Mark Canha* leads the majors and has set an Athletics record with 21 hit by pitches...*Andrew Chafin* ranks second among Major League relievers in opponents OPS (.436), fourth in batting average (.152), on-base percentage (.221), andslugging percentage (.215) and sixth in ERA (1.76)...*Starling Marte* is batting a ML leading .429 (39-for-91) since the All-Star Break... also leads the majors in steals since the break (14) and ranks third in onbase percentage (.475)...*Matt Olson* ranks third in the American League in OPS (.950) and slugging percentage (.572), tied for fourth in home runs (28) and extra base hits (56), sixth in on-base percentage (.378), tied for eighth in RBI (74), tied for 10th runs (73), tied for seventh doubles (28) and tied for eighth in walks (56)...*Sergio Romo* has not allowed a run in his last 17 games dating back to June 29 (17.2 ip, 3 h, 4 bb, 19 so) and opponents are 3-for-53 (.057) over that span...*Lou Trivino* has converted each of his last 12 save opportunities dating back to June 5 and has a 0.93 ERA (3 er in 29.0 ip) and .188 (19-for-101) opponents batting average in 28 games over that span

#### THIS DATE IN ATHLETICS HISTORY

In **1996** Geronimo Berroa has his second three-homer game of the season in the A's 11-1 win over Minnesota...the two three-homer games tie a Major League record...Mark McGwire adds two home runs, giving him 40 for the season in just 294 at bats, the fewest at bats ever to 40 home runs...in **2001** Jason Giambi hits his first career "walk-off" home run for his 1000<sup>th</sup> career hit as the A's defeat the Yankees, 4-2, for their 11<sup>th</sup> consecutive win.

## TODAY'S STARTING PITCHER: Chris Bassitt (11-3, 3.19 ERA)

**FOR STARTERS:** Is 2-1 with a 2.45 ERA (9 er in 33.0 ip) over his last five starts... has 32 strikeouts and just five walks over that span...now has 11 wins for the season, which is a career high...also has a career-high in strikeouts (147) and has matched his high in innings pitched (144.0)...his 23 starts are two short of his high of 25 in 2019...currently has the lowest opponents batting average (.219) and on-base percentage (.276) of his career...has 492 career strikeouts and needs eight more for 500 career.

AMONG THE LEADERS: Leads the American League in winning percentage (.786) and innings pitched (144.0) and is tied for the lead in wins (11) and games started (22)...the A's have not had a pitcher lead the league in innings since Dave Stewart in 1990 (267.0) and have not had a pitcher lead the league in wins since Barry Zito in 2002 (23)...also ranks third in the AL in opponents OPS (.631) and on-base percentage (.276), fourth in batting average (.219), slugging percentage (.355), and ERA (3.19) and sixth in strikeouts (147)...has allowed 15 home runs and his average of 0.94 home runs per nine innings is fifth lowest...is seventh in strikeout-to-walk ratio (4.45) and ninth in fewest walks per nine innings (2.06)...has hit 11 batters, which is tied for the most in the AL and two short of the Oakland record of 13...he also hit 13 batters in 2019, which tied the record set by Barry Zito (2001, 2005 and 2006)...ranks third in the AL in fewest pitches per inning (15.0).

**OPPONENTS BATTING:** Has allowed a .188 (22-for-117) batting average with runners in scoring position, which ranks fourth in the American League...has held left-handed hitters to a .195 (50-for-256) average, which is fourth lowest...has allowed just four home runs in 279 at bats against right-handed hitters...has surrendered 11 of his 15 home runs this year and 29 of 42 over the last three years to lefties...10 of his 15 home runs have come with the bases empty...has a .146 opponents average with two strikes, which is sixth lowest in the AL...has allowed a .185 (12-for-65) average to the opponents three hitter.

HOME AND AWAY: IS 7-0 with a 3.74 ERA (32 er in 77.0 ip) in 13 starts on the road compared to 4-3 with a 2.55 ERA (19 er in 67.0 ip) in 10 starts at home...now has an eight-game road winning streak dating back to Sept. 12, 2020 and has a 3.58 ERA (33 er in 83.0 ip) over that stretch, which spans 14 starts...has not lost on

the road since Aug. 29, 2020 at Houston...is tied for the American League lead in road wins but has the seventh lowest home ERA.

*FIVE DAYS REST:* Is scheduled to start on five days rest today...is 6-0 with a 3.18 ERA (24 er in 68.0 ip) in 11 starts on exactly five days rest and now has an 11-game winning streak in those games dating back to July 19, 2019...has a 3.02 ERA (38 er in 113.1 ip) in 19 starts over that span...according to TruMedia, that is the longest winning streak in starts on five days rest in Oakland history...broke the previous mark of 10 by Mike Fiers (May 7-Aug. 27, 2019) and Mark Mulder (June 18, 2002-July 10, 2003)...has not lost when pitching on five days rest since July 6, 2019.

**AMERICAN LEAGUE ALL-STAR:** Was named to the American League All-Star Team for the first time on July 10 as a replacement...pitched the sixth inning in a 5-2 AL win (1.0 ip, 1 h, 1 r, 0 er, 2 bb, 1 so)...became the first A's starting pitcher to be named to the AL All-Star Team since Sonny Gray in 2015 and the first starter to pitch in the game since Scott Kazmir in 2014.

THIS AND THAT: Has a 3.46 ERA (197 er in 512.2 ip) in 96 career appearances with the A's, which is the 10th lowest ERA in Oakland history (min. 500 ip)... the A's are 16-7 (.696) in his starting assignments this year...has left with the lead in three of his nine no decisions only to have the bullpen blow the save (May 5 vs. Toronto, May 16 at Minnesota, June 19 at New York-AL)...has tossed at least seven innings in 11 of his 23 starts...has allowed two runs or fewer 16 times and six hits or fewer 20 times.

**THE LAST THREE YEARS:** Is 26-10 (.722) with a 3.28 ERA (127 er in 351.0 ip) in 62 games (59 starts) over the last three years...based on a minium of 275 innings pitched, he ranks second in the American League in winning percentage over that span, fourth in ERA and fifth in opponents OPS (.667)...is tied for sixth in wins...the A's are 39-20 (.661) in his starting assignments over the last three years...was 4-14 (.222) with a 3.86 ERA in 40 games (30 starts) over his first four seasons.

**2021 HIGHLIGHTS:** Was the A's Opening Day starting pitcher and took the loss in an 8-1 decision to Houston on April 1 in Oakland...became the A's 14th different Opening Day starting pitcher over the last 16 years...went 10-0 with a 3.04 ERA and .209 opponents average over a 17-start stretch from April 12 to July 11...the 10-game winning streak is a career-high, tied for fourth longest in Oakland history and tied for the longest in the majors in 2021 (Hendricks, CHI)...struck out a season-high 10 batters in a 3-2 win at

Boston on May 11...it was his third career game of 10 or more strikeouts... did not walk a batter, the second time he has fanned 10 or more without issuing a free pass...is one of nine pitchers in Oakland history with two such games...tossed his first career complete game and shutout May 27 against Los Angeles (AL), a two-hitter in the A's 5-0 win...it came in his 77th career start, his 72nd with the A's...the 71 consecutive starts without a complete games is the second longest streak in Athletics history (113, Barry Zito, Aug. 22, 2003-Sept. 28, 2006)...finished May with a 3-0 record, a 2.52 ERA and .175 opponents batting average in five starts...then went 4-0 with a 2.70 ERA in six starts in June...it was the first time in his career he won four games in a month...was one of four American League pitchers to win four games in June and his ERA tied for fifth...allowed two runs or fewer in five consecutive starts from June 8 to 30 and was 4-0 with a 1.93 ERA and .197 opponents batting average over that span.

**LAST START:** He had a no decision in the A's 4-1, 11-inning win over Texas last Friday in Oakland...blanked the Rangers on three hits over the first four innings and had a 1-0 lead when he allowed a RBI single to Kiner-Falefa in the fifth...retired each of the final six batters he faced and was relieved by Romo to start the eighth with the score tied 1-1.

#### TOMORROW'S PROBABLE STARTING PITCHER

LHP Cole Irvin (8-10, 3.45 ERA): Is 5-3 with a 2.82 ERA and four home runs allowed over his last 11 starts dating back to June 5 after going 3-7 with a 4.12 ERA and seven home runs over his first 11 starts...ranks seventh in the American League in opponents slugging percentage (.365), eighth in ERA (3.45) and seventh in OPS (.662) but is tied for fourth in most losses (10)... has walked two batters or fewer in each of his 22 starts, which matches the second longest such streak by a starting pitcher in Oakland history...has is sued just 24 free passes in 130.1 innings, an average of 1.66 walks per nine innings...that is the second lowest mark in the majors (Yarbrough, TB 1.59)... is averaging 14.4 pitches per inning, which are the fewest in the majors (Wainwright, STL 14.7)...was the winning pitcher in his last start, a 12-3 A's win over Texas last Saturday in Oakland (7.0 ip, 4 h, 2 r, 2 er, 2 bb, 4 so)...is 2-1 with a 4.24 ERA (17.0 ip, 14 h, 9 r, 8 er, 3 bb, 13 so, 1 hr) in three career starts against the Rangers, all this year.

- Retired the side in order in the 10th inning last night for his fourth career save,
- his first since Sept. 27, 2020 against the White Sox. Was acquired from the Cubs on July 26 and has not allowed a run in seven games with the A's (6.2 ip, 3 h, 0 bb, 8 so).
