## OAKLAND ATHLETICS (67-48) VS. TEXAS RANGERS (40-75)

FRIDAY, AUGUST 13, 2021 — GLOBE LIFE FIELD — 7:05 CDT

**ABOUT THE A'S:** The A's have won seven straight and 11 of the last 13 games to improve to a season-high 19 games over .500 at 67-48 (.583)...that is the fourth best record in the American League and seventh best in the majors...are 8-1 (.889) in August, which is the best record in the majors...are in second place in the AL West for the 49th consecutive day (dating back to June 21) and trail first place Houston by 1½ games...that is the closest the A's have been to first place in the West since July 1 when they were also 1½ back...were ½-game back on June 30...are in first place in the AL Wild Card, two games ahead of the second Wild Card (Red Sox) and four games ahead of the third place team (Yankees)...have spent 58 days alone in first place in the West, three days tied for first, 49 days in second, one day tied for second, three days in third, two days in fourth, three days tied for fourth and 10 days in fifth.

**A RECORD SETTING DAY:** The A's shutout Cleveland 17-0 yesterday for the largest margin of victory in a shutout in Athletics history...the previous mark was 16-0 six times (three in Oakland, one in Kansas City, two in Philadelphia), most recently on June 1, 2018 at Kansas City...Matt Chapman walked five times to tie the Athletics record for walks in a game (eighth time, last: Mark McGwire vs. Kansas City, April 26, 1997).

**SEVEN-GAME WINNING STREAK:** The A's have a seven-game winning streak, which matches their second longest winning streak of the season (June 11-18)...the season high is 13 (April 9-24)...this is the sixth time in Oakland history the A's have at least three winning streaks of seven or more games in one season (1971, 2001, 2002, 2003, 2005)...have outscored the opposition 54-17 during the streak...are batting .286 (70-for-245) with 16 doubles, 10 home runs, 35 walks, 11 hit by pitches (2 sf, .397 on-base percentage) and seven stolen bases...have a 2.01 ERA (15 er in 67.0 ip) and .179 (41-for-229) opponents batting average.

**PITCHING:** The A's had their third shutout in the last 12 game yesterday and their 11th of the season, which is tied with the Blue Jays for the most in the American League...have a 2.19 ERA (27 er in 111.0 ip) over the last 12 games and now have a 3.59 ERA for the season, which is the lowest in the AL and fourth lowest in the majors...also have the lowest opponents slugging percentage in the AL (.376), the second lowest OPS (.674) and fourth lowest on-base percentage (.298)...have issued the fewest walks (309), allowed the fewest home runs (117) and averaged the fewest pitches per inning (15.8).

**STARTING PITCHING:** A's starting pitchers are 7-2 with a 2.51 ERA (21 er in 75.1 ip) and .207 (56-for-271) opponents batting average over the last 13 games...are 45-37 with a 3.61 ERA (265 er in 660.2 ip) overall...are tied for second in the American League in wins, rank third in ERA and fourth in opponents OPS (.682)...lead the majors in innings pitched (660.2) and are tied for third in complete games (3)...have used just eight starting pitchers, which is tied with the Reds and Astros for second fewest in the majors (Red Sox, 6).

**BULLPEN:** The A's bullpen has a 1.73 ERA (17 er in 88.1 ip) and .177 (55-for-310) opponents batting average over the last 28 games dating back to July 7...has a 3.55 ERA overall, which is second lowest in the American League...also has the second lowest opponents OPS (.660)...has converted each of its six save opportunities dating back to July 19 and is 29-for-44 (65.9%) for the season, which is the fifth best save percentage in the AL...is tied for fifth in saves...has 11 losses, which is the fewest in the majors...has the second highest slugging percentage against first batters faced in the AL (.426) and the third highest batting average (.244).

**OFFENSE:** The A's are batting .283 (90-for-318) in August, which is second best in the majors (Rockies, .294)...have the highest on-base percentage (.386) and fewest strikeouts (63) in the majors this month, are tied for the lead in stolen bases (14) and rank third in OPS (.851)...are now batting .237 overall, which is fifth lowest in the American League but one point shy of the season high of .238 (last on June 25)...hit .225 last year but the lowest batting average in a full season in Oakland history is .236 in 1982...have been hit by a pitch 23 times in the last 22 games and 73 times for the season, which is the most in the AL, third most in the majors and fourth most in Oakland history (88 in 2001, 87 in 2019, 76 in 2018)...rank third in the AL in stolen base percentage (81.9%), fourth in fewest grounded into double plays (70), tied for fourth in sacrifice flies (35) and fifth in walks (396) and sacrifice hits (14)...A's pinch hitters lead the AL in hits (24), sacrifice flies (3) and plate appearances (108), are tied for the lead in home runs (3), rank second in RBI (17) and extra base hits (6) and tied for second in doubles (3).

**DEFENSIVE DOINGS:** The A's have committed one error in each of the last four games but have just 49 for the season, which is second fewest in the majors to the Astros (48)...are on pace for 69 errors, which would break the Athletics record for fewest errors in a season (80 in 2019)...are tied for the second few-

est outfield assists in the American League (10) and have the fourth fewest double plays (85).

**CLOSE CALLS AND NOT SO CLOSE:** Five of the A's seven wins during the current winning streak have been by three or more runs...are 42-21 (.667) in games decided by three runs or more compared to 25-27 (.481) in games decided by two runs or fewer... are 17-19 (.472) in one-run games, which includes 11-7 at home and 6-12 on the road...lead the American League in one-run losses (19) and are tied for second in games (36)...have played three extra inning games in the last five games and have a five-game winning streak in extra inning contests...are 7-3 (.700) overall, which is tied with the Red Sox for the second best record in the American League (Mariners, 10-4/.714)...are 13-4 (.765) in extra innings over the last two years...are 15-7 in games decided in the last at bat...are tied with Colorado for the most walk-off wins in the majors (10) and have 93 walk-off wins in the Bob Melvin era, which are the most in the majors over that span.

**HOME AND AWAY:** The A's are 3-0 on this 10-game road trip to Cleveland (3-0), Texas (three games) and Chicago-AL (four games)...have a four-game road winning streak and are now 33-23 (.589) in away games, which is the second best record in the American League...this is the A's second consecutive 10-game road trip as they went 5-5 on the last trip to Seattle (1-3), San Diego (1-1) and Los Angeles-AL (3-1)...this trip concludes a stretch that began on July 6 where the A's are scheduled to play 26 of 36 games on the road...after this trip, the A's have 22 home games and 18 road games remaining...went 4-1 on the last homestand against San Diego (1-1) and Texas (3-0) and have won six of their last seven home games...are 34-25 (.576) at home.

**HOME AND AWAY SPLITS:** The A's have a 3.45 ERA (187 er in 487.2 ip) on the road, which is the lowest in the American League and fourth lowest in the majors...are batting .247 (481-for-1947) with a .740 OPS on the road compared to .226 with a .707 OPS at home...have the third best road batting average and fourth best road OPS in the AL but the second lowest home batting average and third lowest home OPS.

**FRIDAY THE 13th:** The A's have a 20-26 record on Friday the 13th since moving to Oakland in 1968...are 12-10 on the road and 8-16 at home...the A's last Friday the 13th game was a 14-9 win at Texas in September of 2019...are 2-3 against the Rangers on Friday the 13th.

**A's vs. RANGERS:** The A's lead the season series, 8-5...are 4-2 in Oakland and 4-3 in Texas...have a five-game winning streak...won the season series last year, 7-3...it was their fourth consecutive season series victory over the Rangers, which is just the second time the A's have won four consecutive season series against Texas (2002-05)...are 52-28 (.650) against the Rangers over the last five years...are 22-9 (.710) dating back to July 27, 2019, including 11-3 (.786) in Oakland...are 393-381 all-time against the Texas Rangers...that breaks down to 207-178 in Oakland and 186-203 in Texas...are 8-6 at Globe Life Field...have an all-time record of 490-465 against the Rangers/Senators franchise.

### TODAY'S TIDBITS

**Andrew Chafin** ranks third among Major League relievers in opponents OPS (.436), fifth in batting average (.152), on-base percentage (.221) and slugging percentage (.215) and seventh in ERA (1.76)...**Starling Marte** is batting a ML leading .436 (41-for-94) since the All-Star Break...also leads the majors in steals since the break (14) and ranks third in on-base percentage (.486)...**Matt Olson** ranks third in the American League in OPS (.941), fourth in slugging percentage (.566), tied for fourth in home runs (28) and extra base hits (56), sixth in on-base percentage (.376), tied for seventh in doubles (28), eighth in RBI (76), tied for ninth in walks (56) and tied for 10th in runs (73)...**Sergio Romo** has not allowed a run in his last 17 games dating back to June 29 (17.2 ip, 3 h, 4 bb, 19 so) and opponents are 3-for-53 (.057) over that span...**Lou Trivino** has converted each of his last 12 save opportunities dating back to June 5 and has a 0.93 ERA (3 er in 29.0 ip) and .188 (19-for-101) opponents batting average in 28 games over that span.

### THIS DATE IN ATHLETICS HISTORY

In **1977** Mitchell Page steals his 26th consecutive base without being caught, setting an American League record...the record comes to an end two days later when he is picked off by Cleveland's Rick Waits...in **1989** Dave Parker's first inning home run off California's Bert Blyleven is the 3000th home run in Oakland A's history...in **2005** Dennis Eckersley becomes the fourth player in Oakland history to have his number retired when the A's honor him by retiring number 43.

## ATHLETICS BULLPEN BRIEFS

### 39 LHP ANDREW CHAFIN

**Last Outing:** 8/10 at Cleveland (S, 1.0 ip, 1 so)

**Saves/Opportunities:** 1-2

**Inherited Runners/Scored:** 22/7    **First Hitters:** 7-48 (2 bb)

- Retired the side in order in the 10th inning Tuesday night at Cleveland for his fourth career save, his first since Sept. 27, 2020 against the White Sox.
- Was acquired from the Cubs on July 26 and has not allowed a run in seven games with the A's (6.2 ip, 3 h, 0 bb, 8 so).
- Has not allowed a run in 33 of his last 34 appearances (3 er in 31.0 ip, 0.88 ERA) and 46 of 50 overall.
- Ranks third among Major League relievers in opponents OPS (.436), fifth in batting average (.152), on-base percentage (.221) and slugging percentage (.215) and seventh in ERA (1.76).
- Has not allowed a home run in his last 40 games (37.0 innings) and has yielded just one home run in 46.0 innings overall...his average of 0.20 home runs per nine innings is eighth lowest among ML relievers.
- Has a 0.72 ERA (2 er in 25.0 ip) in 27 appearances on one day of rest or fewer, a 3.10 ERA (7 er in 20.1 ip) in 22 games on two days rest or more.
- Has not allowed a run in the eighth inning (23.2 ip).
- Has not allowed a run in two outings against the Rangers this year (2.0 ip, 4 so), but has a 10.61 ERA (11 er in 9.1 ip) in 11 career outings against Texas.
- Was 0-2 with a 2.06 ERA in 43 relief appearances for Chicago (NL) when he was traded to Oakland along with cash considerations for Greg Deichmann and minor leaguer Daniel Palencia.

**Last Year:** Combined for a 1-2 record, one save and a 6.52 ERA in 15 relief appearances with the Diamondbacks and Cubs...missed a month of the season from Aug. 19 to Sept. 18 with a sprained left finger.

### 35 LHP JAKE DIEKMAN

**Last Outing:** 8/12 at Cleveland (ND, 1.0 ip)

**Saves/Opportunities:** 7-12

**Inherited Runners/Scored:** 9/4    **First Hitters:** 8-39, 5 bb, 3 hbp

- Has a 2.75 ERA (6 er in 19.2 ip) and .194 (13-for-67) opponents batting average over his last 23 games dating back to June 4.
- Has held right-handed hitters to a .184 (18-for-98) average but they have hit five of the career-high six home runs he has allowed.
- Has a 4.12 ERA (9 er in 19.2 ip) and .240 (18-for-75) opponents batting average in 22 outings on one day rest or fewer, a 1.59 ERA (4 er in 22.2 ip) and .145 (11-for-76) opponents average in 24 appearances on two days of rest or more.
- Has a blown save in four appearances against Texas (2.1 ip, 3 h, 2 r, 2 er, 4 bb, 6 so) and now has a 8.31 ERA (8 er in 8.2 ip) in 11 career appearances against the Rangers.

**Last Year:** Allowed just two runs in 21 appearances and only one was earned for a 0.42 ERA...ranked second among Major League relievers in ERA and opponents slugging percentage (.157), fifth in batting average (.114) and seventh in OPS (.410)

### 65 RHP DEOLIS GUERRA

**Last Outing:** 8/12 at Cleveland (ND, 1.0 ip)

**Saves/Opportunities:** 0-0

**Inherited Runners/Scored:** 7/2    **First Hitters:** 6-29, 2 bb, hbp

- Has allowed four runs in his last three games (3.0 ip, 5 h, 4 r, 4 er, 1 bb, 3 so) after an eight-game, 7.2-inning scoreless streak.
- Ranks ninth among American League relievers in opponents OPS (.562).
- Has a .152 (10-for-66) opponents batting average against left-handed hitters compared to .234 (18-for-77) against right-handers...has issued 10 of his 12 walks and yielded two of his three homers to righties for a .669 OPS...has a .431 OPS against lefties.
- Opponents are batting .192 (5-for-26) with runners in scoring position.
- Has 35 strikeouts, which is one short of his career high of 36 in 2016.
- Has a 2.37 ERA (5 er in 19.0 ip) in 15 games at night, a 5.06 ERA (12 er in 21.1 ip) in 17 day games.
- Has faced the Rangers five times (5.0 ip, 1 h, 2 r, 2 er, 2 bb, 2 so, 1 hr).

**Last Year:** Was on the Opening Day roster and appeared in nine games for Philadelphia in 2020 and went 1-3 with an 8.59 ERA (7 er in 7.1 ip)...struck out eight batters and walked two.

### 36 RHP YUSMEIRO PETIT

**Last Outing:** 8/10 at Cleveland (ND, 1.0 ip)

**Saves/Opportunities:** 2-6

**Inherited Runners/Scored:** 31/11    **First Hitters:** 15-52, 3 bb, sf

- Has not allowed a run in five of his last six games (5.1 ip, 2 h, 1 r, 1 er, 1 bb, 3 so).
- Leads the majors in games pitched (56)...is tied for the lead among American League relievers in wins (8), ranks second in innings pitched (57.1) and fewest walks per nine innings (1.41) and eighth in most inherited runners (31)...is averaging the fewest strikeouts per nine innings in the majors among relievers (4.40).
- Opponents are hitting .177 (11-for-62) with runners in scoring position.
- Has allowed seven home runs, four of which have come to his first batter faced in an outing, which is tied for the most in the majors.
- Has a win, a loss and a blown save in six games against Texas (5.2 ip, 5 h, 3 r, 3 er, 1 bb, 1 so)

**Last Year:** Compiled a career-low 1.66 ERA in a team-leading 26 relief appearances...opponents hit .232 and he walked just five batters for a .273 on-base percentage...yielded four runs, three of which scored on solo home runs.

**Last Outing:** 8/12 at Cleveland (ND, 1.0 ip, bb)

**Saves/Opportunities:** 0-0

**Inherited Runners/Scored:** 2/0    **First Hitters:** 0-3

- Was recalled from Triple-A Las Vegas Tuesday for his second stint with the A's this year and has pitched twice since his return (2.0 ip, 1 bb, 2 so).
- Has faced the Rangers twice in his career, both times in 2019 (3.0 ip 3 h, 2 r, 2 er, 2 so).
- Was first recalled from the A's alternate site on April 5, pitched in relief that day against the Dodgers (3.1 ip, 1 h, 3 bb, 4 so), and was placed on the 10-day injured list April 8 retroactive to April 6 with a strained left biceps...had a five-game rehab assignment before he was reinstated from the IL and optioned to Las Vegas May 28.
- Had a 1.64 ERA (4 er in 22.0 ip) over his final 13 games at Triple-A dating back to June 26...allowed a .308 opponents batting average with the Aviators overall, including .231 (18-for-78) against left-handed hitters and .374 (34-for-91) against right-handers...surrendered seven of his 10 home runs to righties...his complete 2021 stats with Las Vegas:

**Last Year:** Made two starts during the spring and did not allow a run before he was shut down with a shoulder injury...began the season on the IL and eventually underwent surgery on the left shoulder on Sept. 16.

### 54 RHP SERGIO ROMO

**Last Outing:** 8/11 at Cleveland (ND, 1.0 ip, 2 so)

**Saves/Opportunities:** 0-1

**Inherited Runners/Scored:** 20/9    **First Hitters:** 13-44, bb, 2 hbp

- Has not allowed a run in his last 17 games dating back to June 29 (17.2 ip, 3 h, 4 bb, 19 so) and opponents are 3-for-53 (.057) over that span...the scoreless streak is his longest since his career-high 21.2-inning streak from June 30-Sept. 23, 2011.
- Has a 0.64 ERA (2 er in 28.0 ip) and .121 (11-for-91) opponents batting average over his last 29 games dating back to May 25 after compiling a 7.63 ERA and .290 opponents average over his first 18 contests.
- Ranks fifth among American League relievers in opponents OPS (.535) and ninth in slugging percentage (.275) and on-base percentage (.260).
- Has a 1.52 ERA (4 er in 23.2 ip) in 24 games on zero or one day of rest, a 5.30 ERA (11 er in 18.2 ip) in 22 outings on two days rest or more.
- Has a 1.82 ERA (5 er in 24.2 ip) and .146 (12-for-82) opponents batting average at night, 4.82 (10 er in 18.2 ip) and .239 (17-for-71) during the day.
- First batters faced are 1-for-20 (.050) with nine strikeouts over his last 19 games after going 12-for-24 (.500) with a walk and two hit by pitches over his first 27 contests.
- Has a blown save in four appearances against Texas (4.0 ip, 2 h, 1 r, 1 er, 1 bb, 4 so)...has a 0.90 ERA (1 er in 10.0 ip) in 11 career regular season appearances against the Rangers.

**Last Year:** Was 1-2 with five saves, a 4.05 ERA and .211 opponents batting average in 24 relief appearances with Minnesota...had 10 holds, which tied for third most in the majors...was the only reliever in the majors with at least 10 holds and at least five saves.

**Inherited Runners/Scored:** 8/0    **First Hitters:** 7-23, bb

- Tossed 3.1 scoreless innings Tuesday night and has pitched at least two innings in eight of his 24 outings.
- Has not allowed a run in four his last five outings (10.1 ip, 7 h, 2 r, 2 er, 3 bb, 4 so, 1.74 ERA).
- Has stranded all eight of his inherited runners this year and each of his last 14 dating back to Sept. 11, 2019...last allowed an inherited runner to score on Sept. 5, 2019.
- Has faced the Rangers three times (4.0 ip, 3 h, 1 r, 1 er, 2 bb, 1 so) and has a 0.96 ERA (1 er in 9.1 ip) in five career outings against Texas.

**Last Year:** Made the A's Opening Day roster and was 2-0 with a save, a 2.25 ERA and .163 opponents batting average in six relief appearances before his season was cut short in mid-August with a forearm injury.

### 62 RHP LOU TRIVINO

**Saves/Opportunities:** 19-21

**Inherited Runners/Scored:** 14/2    **First Hitters:** 10-47, 5 bb

- Has converted each of his last 12 save opportunities dating back to June 5 and has a 0.93 ERA (3 er in 29.0 ip) and .188 (19-for-101) opponents batting average in 28 games over that span.
- Is 19-for-21 (90.5%) in save opportunities...ranks fourth in the American League in save percentage and fifth in saves.
- Has a 0.72 ERA (3 er in 37.1 ip) over his last 36 games and now has a 1.81 ERA for the season, which ranks fifth among AL relievers.
- Is tied for fifth among AL relievers in innings pitched (54.2), tied for seventh in games (52) and ranks eighth in opponents OPS (.562) and slugging percentage (.275).
- Has a .164 (18-for-110) opponents batting average against right-handed hitters compared to .232 (19-for-82) against left-handers.
- Opponents are hitting .136 (8-for-59) with runners in scoring position.
- Has a 0.36 ERA (1 er in 24.2 ip) on the road, a 0.76 ERA (2 er in 23.2 ip) during the day and a 0.73 ERA (3 er in 37.0 ip) in the ninth inning.
- Allowed both of his inherited runners to score in his second game on April 3 but has stranded all 12 of his inherited runners since then.
- Has allowed just one home run over his last 41 games (41.2 innings).
- Last night was his first outing against Cleveland since May 22, 2019 (1.0 ip, 1 so).
- Tossed a scoreless ninth inning on Sunday against Texas for the save in his 200th career appearance.

**Last Year:** Compiled a 3.86 ERA in 20 relief appearances and held the opposition to a career-low .193 batting average...issued 10 walks in 23.1 innings for a career-low .280 on-base percentage...struck out 26 for a career-best 10.03 strikeouts per nine innings.

- Was recalled from Triple-A Las Vegas Friday for his second stint with the A's this year...hit .199 with 12 home runs and 30 RBI in 79 games during his first stint from April 6 to July 31.
- Went 4-for-14 (.286) with a double, triple and RBI in three games with the Aviators following his Aug. 1 option...appeared in one game in left field, one at designated hitter and one at right field.
- Is fifth among American League rookies in home runs (14).
- Is batting .206 (39-for-189) against right-handed pitchers, .176 (3-for-17) against left-handers...has made 52 of his 53 starts this year and 69 of 71 in his career in games in which the opponent starts a right-handed pitcher.
- Is batting .252 (26-for-103) at home, .155 (16-for-103) on the road.
- More than half of his hits are for extra bases (22-of-42, 52.4%)...32 of his 64 (50.0%) career hits are extra base hits.
